

Killarney will receive a significant boost this weekend with the arrival of the world's top adventure specialists for the Adventure Travel World Summit 2014 (ATWS) which begins on Monday (6th October). 

DOWN MEMORY LANE FOR FORMER FLESK CASTLE RESIDENT

Nicholas McGillycuddy, the last living resident of Flesk Castle in Killarney returned recently to recount his childhood memories of what was his home until he was 9yrs old. Nicholas was joined by his wife Rose as his recollections brought the now ruined rooms to life, the beauty of the entrance hall where an IRA bullet was accidentally discharged during a War of Independence visit for blankets, the characters of the servants and unwelcome kitchen visits seeking extra helpings. The secret garden and hiding places were vividly recalled alongside the sadness in the house following the death at just 19yrs of Nicholas' only brother Brian early in World War 2.

There was also a reuniting of childhood friends when Killarney resident Maureen O'Reilly joined Nicholas for tea at Flesk,

having last met there for his 8th birthday party over 70yrs ago.

The memorable events which were filmed by Dónal Ó Céilleachair of Anu Pictures for a future documentary coincide with the start on site of conservation works, the first significant works since it was abandoned in the early 1940's. This is Phase 1 of a wider restoration programme being led by local architect Karol O'Mahony with engineering services provided by Reeks Consulting Engineers.

The project team are asking readers for help in collecting the history of this landmark, also known as Coltsmanns Castle. Interior photos which may exist in local private collections are especially being sought. Memories, old photos, personal or family links, information on furniture or contents, or old auction catalogues are all most welcome. TOP WATER SAVING TIPS

With water charges now in, it's important we understand how to use our household water more efficiently and to remember that small adjustments and simple changes in daily habits can have a big impact on reducing our water

Transition year student Adele O'Sullivan from Presentation Seconday School, Milltown has the following tips.

- 1) Wash your fruit & vegetables in a pot: Instead of washing your fruit and vegetable under a running faucet, fill a pot and use this instead. Not only will you accomplish the task of using less water, but the water in the pot can also be conveniently reused to water your houseplants or out in your garden.
- 2) Change your behavior at home: You can also save water at home by simply modifying certain behaviors, for example, leaving the tap run while brushing your teeth, washing your face or cleaning the dishes can waste unreasonable amounts of clean, drinkable water. Running your dishwasher when it isn't full can also waste large sums of water, as well as too many flushes of the toilet. These can all be easily changed.
- 3) Make stock from leftover boiled/steamed water: After steaming or boiling vegetable, use

the leftover water to make a vegetable stock for soup rather than getting rid of it down the

- 4) Keep a bottle or jug of drinking water in the fridge: Fill a jug or a bottle with tap water and leave in your fridge. This will prevent you from leaving the tap run cold before you fill your glass.
- 5) Use a watering can instead of a hosepipe: By using a watering can you are saving a lot more water than if you were to se a hosepipe. A hosepipe uses 1,000 litres of water an hour, therefore using a watering can is a better option for water conservation.
- 6) Washing dishes: When you wash dishes by hand, don't let the water run the whole time, just use a little water to get your sponge wet and soapy and then switch the tap off until you're ready to use it again.
- 7) Flushing the toilet: If you can't replace your higher volume toilet, put a plastic bottle filled with water in your toilet tank to reduce the amount of water used per flush.
- 8) Fill the kettle with only as much water as you need: We're all guilty of over-filling the kettle when it comes to making a cup of tea and what not, but not only does this waste water, it also wastes energy. By only filling the kettle with as much water as you need, you are



saving a lot of water and energy.

- 9) Check for leaks: It is vital that you ensure that no leaks are present both indoors and outdoors of your home. Leaks can cause a big loss of water, therefore it is wise to regularly check all of your taps.
- 10) Water plants in the morning: If you water plants in the morning when it's relatively cool outside, water can soak in before it evaporates on the surface and it also helps the plant to take up the water during the day.



KERRY TYRE DEALERS MARK ROAD SAFETY WEEK AS MOTORISTS LEAVE IT TOO LATE TO CHANGE TYRES

Tyre dealers in Kerry are inviting motorists to have their tyres checked as part of Road Safety Week, as research by the Irish Tyre Industry Association (ITIA) shows motorists are leaving it too late in replacing their tyres. In support of this safety initiative, An Garda Síochána will be out checking tyres for tread depth and general condition as part of Road Safety Week, which starts October 6.

The ITIA survey of over 600 tyres on cars which came into tyre outlets last month showed 27% of them to be below the legal tread depth limit of 1.6mm, with almost 1 in 5 having only 1mm of tread or less. The ITIA recommends that motorists change their tyres when the tread depth reaches 3mm, but only 40% of tyres assessed were found to be compliant with this recommendation.

As part of the RSA's Road Safety Week, ITIA member outlets nationwide are offering free tyre checks to motorists who drop in this week, among them is Castleisland Tyre Centre. According to Niall Murphy from Castleisland Tyre Centre no appointment is necessary. Thursday, 9 October, has been deemed Tyre Safety Day, when Gardai will be specifically concentrating their roadside checks on tyres. "A majority of motorists are failing to replace their tyres at the point where their stopping performance dips significantly, and one quarter are even letting their tyres wear beyond the 1.6mm legal limit," said Kevin Farrell, President of the ITIA. Industryresearch indicates that a car on tyres just below the[u1] 1.6mm limit can take twice as long to stop as a car on new tyres. "Worn tyres can cost lives. A simple 5-minute visit to a local ITIA tyre outlet this week is all it takes to ensure your tyres are fit for purpose in advance of the Garda drive," continues Farrell. Commenting on tyre safety Mr. Michael Rowland, Director Road Safety, Driver Education and Research said, "Tyres should be checked regularly for condition both in the tread and sidewall areas. There should be no cuts or gouges in the sidewall particularly where the carcass is exposed. Small stones should be removed from the tread as they can work their way through the rubber and cause a puncture. There should be no bulges in the sidewall as this indicates a weakness in the carcass." Advising on the use of part worn tyres Mr. Rowland added, "There has been a

noticeable increase recently in the number of outlets offering 'part worn' tyres for sale. Use of these tyres can be risky as there is no history of how they have been used. There may be damage internally from hitting road hazards or kerbs. They may have been underinflated or overloaded causing heatbuild-up damage in the tyre. In addition, part-worn tyres may actually cost more per millimetre than a new tyre and so the "good deal" may not be as good as anticipated."

Assistant Commissioner John Twomey, head of the Traffic Corps said: "Although the minimum legal tyre tread depth is 1.6mm for cars and 1mm for motorcycles, the simple fact is the more tread depth you have, the more grip you have on the road. Considering we are moving into wetter weather, this fact is all the more relevant. We appeal to all drivers and riders to specifically check the tread depth and condition of their tyres, and if necessary arrange for them to be changed. WHAT IS STREETSMART?

StreetSmart is an exciting initiative set up by the Road Safety Authority which aims to bring issues of road safety to life for young school children. StreetSmart is designed for three distinct age groups: 4-5, 5-8 and 8-12 years. There is a combination of interactive activities available for each age group.

StreetSmart also involves a streetscape mat which invites children to carry out typical, everyday cycling or pedestrian tasks. They can dress up and adopt various roles such as a nurse, doctor, fire officer or ambulance driver. The Road Safety Authority representatives are on hand to coordinate the activities with the help of teachers at the school. It is an action packed, fun filled day that enhances the student's knowledge of the rules of the road.

What will your child/student learn?

Road Safety

Cycle Safety

Travelling safely in a car/bus

How will your students learn these lessons? Step Left, Step Right quiz

This will test the child's knowledge on a range of common road safety issues, educating them as to the right way of doing things through fun and engaging exercises.

This will allow children to sit behind the wheel of a toy car, letting them see the traffic conditions from the perspective of a motorist and illustrating how it can be difficult to see pedestrians.

Road Safety DVD

CHANGE TO DRIVING LICENCE SYSTEM

The Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport has announced changes to the driver licensing system that apply to newly qualified novice drivers and first time learner permit holders.

These changes are important road safety measures that form part of the Graduated Driver Licensing (GDL) system, one of the key actions in the current and previous Government Road Safety Strategies aimed at improving how we train, test and licence learner and novice drivers.

The changes are as follows:

A person granted a first full driving licence on or after 1st August 2014 must display N-plates on the vehicle for a period of 2 years, and during that period display N-plates on any other vehicle in respect of which they get a driving licence. Where the vehicle is a motorcycle, the rider must wear an N – tabard. The novice period applies only once ie someone who holds a driving licence for a category of vehicle and who after a period of two years becomes entitled to drive another category, does not become a novice in respect of the new category.

Non-display of N plates is an offence under traffic law and is punishable by a fine not exceeding €1,000 for a first offence. On becoming a fixed change the failure to display an N-plate will carry 2 penalty points on payment of a fixed charge, or 4 on conviction.

A lower threshold of seven penalty points leading to disqualification will apply to any driver who is granted their first learner permit on or after 1 August 2014 while they drive under



a learner permit, and subsequently during the first two years while they drive under their first driving licence.

There is no requirement for novice drivers to have an accompanying driver – this is still only the case for learner drivers. However, a novice driver may not act as an accompanying driver for someone who holds a learner permit

The purpose of the GDL system is to reduce the number of collisions, deaths and injuries among learner and novice drivers, particularly among the high risk 17 to 24 year olds, during the learning to drive period and period immediately after they pass their test.

Research tells us that novice drivers are most likely to be killed on our roads in the first two years after passing their test due to their inexperience.

In fact, UK research has revealed that 1 in 5 newly qualified novice drivers has crashed in the first six months after passing their test. Furthermore, available evidence suggests that a driver is considered to be inexperienced until s/he has driven 100,000 kilometres.

Therefore, these measures are designed to protect our most vulnerable road-users so that they can become safe, competent and confident drivers, helping to ensure we have fewer collisions, fatalities and injuries on our

Novice plates, or similar systems, are in place in many other EU countries, and these measures will help to bring Ireland closer into line with Northern Ireland, the UK and other EU jurisdictions.



KERRY TD QUESTIONS MINISTER ON VITAL ISSUES

Kerry TD Tom Fleming tables a Dail question this week asking: "To ask the Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine if he will ensure that no commonage farmer will be excluded from access to GLAS by the 50% threshold and that all commonage land will qualify for the €120.00 per hectare payment and if he will ensure that GLAS is open for application at an early date to ensure that farmers are eligible for a full years payment in 2015; and if he will make a statement on the matter." The Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine Simon Coveney answered: preservation and restoration of commonages, and the continuation of suitable and environmentally friendly farming practices on the hills, is a core element of GLAS and part of Ireland's overall plan for halting biodiversity loss. In recognition of the importance of commonages, hill farmers will get priority access into GLAS but I think it is accepted by all that the most effective management of these hills is achieved when those who are actively farming it work together. That is why the creation of a Commonage Management Plan, that encourages the shareholders themselves to take control of the grazing of their commonage, is the model we have chosen for GLAS. In addition in order to qualify for an agri-environment payment, the actions undertaken by farmers must be above the baseline for the Basic Payment Scheme, and it is the actions in the Commonage Management Plan which demonstrate this. The only requirement for commonage farmers joining GLAS is for 50% of active farmers to sign up to a GLAS commonage plan or sufficient

farmers to bring in at least 50% of the land. There is no imposition of minimum or maximum stocking densities, and smaller commonages of less than ten hectares in size will not be subject to any minimum participation requirement. On commonages of that size, farmers can enter GLAS in their own right. I do not believe that a minimum participation requirement based on this model is insurmountable and there are ways in which the application process can be structured that might assist. However, where real difficulties are being encountered the farmers concerned can make a case to the Commonage Implementation Committee for entry to the scheme. If it is clear that the farmer or farmers have made every effort to meet the requirement but have failed through no fault of their own, they will not be locked out of GLAS. As regards the rate of payment, I have fixed this at €120 per hectare, which is a major increase

over what was payable under the previous programme, which was €75 per hectare. There is an overall ceiling for payments under GLAS of €5,000 per annum so the rate proposed is payable up to that ceiling, If, however, a commonage farmer has other Priority Environmental Assets on his privately-owned land, he may qualify for GLAS+ if the combination of these with his commonage actions pushes him over the €5,000 ceiling. The new Scheme is currently with the European Commission for approval, as part of the Rural Development Programme 2014 - 2020. Once such approval is granted, my Department will move to open the Scheme for applications. I would hope to be able to do so before the end of the year, but this is entirely dependent on approval being secured in time from the EU. I can only make final decisions in this regard when I have EU approval to hand."



"With an increase of 27c/kg or €100 per head in finished cattle prices in our main export market in the UK since early July, there is major market potential for Irish cattle prices to increase substantially."

Eddie Downey said prices are going to have to increase significantly to cover the costs of production and leave a margin for farmers.

Eddie Downey said factories have

been forced to move the base price up to €3.65/€3.70/kg for both steers and heifers this week. Bull prices have also moved up to €3.70/kg for U grades and cow prices have also lifted by 5c to 10c per kg. The IFA Livestock Chairman Henry Burns said with an additional 126,000 cattle already processed this year and an additional 30,000 animals exported live, the supply of finished cattle to meet increased market demand was tightening and factories agents were actively chasing cattle and offering farmers more to get supplies this week.

FOCUS ON ROSES

Know Your Rights:

GETTING A PPS NUMBER

QUESTION

I've just moved to Ireland and I'm looking for a job. Some potential employers have asked for my PPS Number. What is it and how do I get one?

ANSWER

Your Personal Public Service Number (PPS Number) is a unique reference number that helps you to access public services in Ireland. Sometimes employers say that you must have a PPS Number when applying for a job. What they really mean is that you need to have the right to work in Ireland and they use the PPS Number as shorthand for this. However, in law they are not entitled to do this (and having a PPS Number does not prove that you have the right to work in Ireland).

The legislation that governs the use of PPS Numbers states that the PPS Number can only be used by:

- Any organisation listed in legislation (a public or specified body)
- Any person or body authorised by a public body to do so
- Any person who has a transaction with a public body

This means that private companies or bodies (including potential employers) cannot use the number unless they are carrying out a transaction with a public body such as Revenue. The Personal Public Service Number Code of Practice on the Department of Social Protection's website outlines who can use the PPS Number and for what purposes.

If you have newly arrived in Ireland you cannot get a PPS Number unless you need it for a transaction with a specified body. For

- · Starting work (so you can pay tax, PRSI and Universal Social
- Applying for a driving licence or exchanging your existing one for an Irish driving licence
- Applying for Child Benefit or another social welfare payment
- Setting up an account with Irish Water

Only the Department of Social Protection can provide you with a PPS Number. You can find a list of the social welfare local offices that can allocate PPS Numbers on the Department's website. You will need to fill out an application form (which is only available from one of these PPS allocation centres), provide proof of your identity and evidence of your address. You may also be asked to show why you need a PPS number.







GOVERNMENT LOOKING FOR YOUR OPINION ABOLISHING SECONDARY INSTRUMENTS

The Statute Law Revision Programme is currently seeking comments from all interested parties on the revocation of secondary instruments created up to and including 1820. The instruments identified in the review are divided into two schedules - Schedule 1 lists instruments which it is proposed to retain. Schedule 2 lists instruments it is proposed to revoke. Further information on the proposed Statute Law Revision Bill 2014 is set out on the website per.gov.ie/slrp

Any person with views on the revocation or retention of any instruments dating from pre-1820, including any secondary instruments not included in the published lists, may contact the Department at the contact points set out below. Submissions are requested on or before 15 October 2014. A PRISONER OF CONSCIENCE HELD PURELY FOR **BELIEFS:**

Since 2012, women have been banned from attending volleyball matches in stadiums in Iran. Officials say it is for their own 'protection' from the lewd behaviour of male fans.

Amnesty International tells us that on June the 20th last Ghoncheh Ghavami joined dozens of other women and men who were protesting outside Tehran's Azadi Stadium where Iran were playing Italy in the 2014 International Federation of Volleyball World League games. Police responded violently, arresting several of the protestors. During her arrest Ghoncheh was slapped and dragged along the ground leaving her with bruises down her back and arms.

Ghoncheh was released several hours later handing over identification documents and pledging not to engage in similar activities in the future. However, when she returned 10 days later to pick up her mobile phone she was re-arrested and taken to Evin Prison. For the next 41 days Ghoncheh was held in solitary confinement, with no access to her family or lawyer. During this time her interrogators subjected her to psychological pressure and told her'she would not walk out of prison alive', threatening to send her to Gharchak prison, where prisoners convicted of serious criminal offences are held in dismal conditions.

WALKING ON A SUBWAY STATION TILES IN FRANCE GENERATES RENEWABLE **ENERGY:**

Each day for the last six months, approximately 5,000 people passed through the turnstiles of the Saint-Omer subway station in northern France. Chances are that the vast majority of them did not realize that by putting one foot in front of the other they were serving the greater good by producing clean, renewable energy.

In March, 14 flooring tiles from Londonbased clean-tech company Pavegen Systems were installed at the mass-transit depot. The tiles, each roughly 7 by 24 inches, generate renewable electricity from the otherwise wasted energy of footsteps. When a walker's foot makes contact with the tile, it bends inappreciably, depressing an average of five millimeters each step and creating approximately seven watts of converted kinetic energy in the process. The slabs, made from 100 percent recycled rubber, can store energy for up to 72 hours via small built-in batteries. The energy captured by the tiles at the Saint-Omer station has been used to power a LED bench lighting system

and two USB ports installed in nearby benches, allowing commuters to charge their electronic devices as they wait for trains. The concept was conceived in 2009 by Laurence Kemball-Cook, then a graduate student in industrial design at Loughborough University in England. The first Pavegen tiles were installed at a British school in 2010, in January, Pavegen installed eight tiles in a hallway outside the cafeteria at New York City's Riverdale Country School, the first American venue to feature the kinetic units. The captured electricity has been used to power a phone-charging dock and LED information boards that explain the innovation and potential uses of the technology.

In August, officials in Washington, D.C., approved construction on the Connecticut Avenue Overlook Parklet, a \$200,000 makeover of one of the city's main thoroughfares. The 30,000 people projected to use the park each year will annually generate 456 kilowatts of energy from 100 Pavegen tiles. The energy will be stored in batteries and used to power lighting in the park.

US MAJOR RETAILERS KOHL RECALL "FAUX" FUR **JACKETS:**

Consumers who were hoping to sport a fashionable winter look, without supporting a cruel fur trade, got a shock after the Humane Society conducted tests on the "faux" fur on some men's parkas and discovered that the supposedly "fake" trim had actually once belonged to a live animal. Raccoon dogs, which are related to domestic dogs, were determined to be the source for the "fake" trim on an R & O hooded men's parka which was being sold at Kohl's. The Humane Society tested the trim, which was labelled as faux fur from China, and the results showed that it came from the animals which are indigenous to Asia.

The major retailer issued an apology on their website to their customers saying: Kohl's standard vendor terms require that all merchandise must be free of any real animal fur unless expressly authorized in writing by Kohl's. No such authorization was given here. Once aware that the product was made with real fur, Kohl's immediately removed the product from our website. Kohl's has advised those who bought the jackets that they may return the product, with no questions asked. Kohl's Corporation, is an American department store retail chain. The first "Kohl" store was a supermarket founded in 1946, and the first Kohl department store was founded in 1962 in Brookfield, Wisconsin. Sorry readers but the only way you can be sure that an innocent animal was not slaughtered in the most inhumane way to make your jacket, belt, shoes etc is not to buy either real or so called fake fur and leather products.

POACHING STOPPED

If you were an eight-week-old orphaned baby rhino who was left to fend for yourself after poachers killed your mother, what would you do? Just last month, a little female rhino experienced just that. Having just driven through Kruger National Park in South Africa, Liam Burrough found the baby standing on a road severely dehydrated and in search of shade. She found it in the shadow from Mr. Burrough's automobile when he stopped to aid the sorrowful creature. Obviously suffering from severe dehydration and with visible wounds on her body, Mr. Burrough poured water over her in an attempt to cool her off. He then called for assistance and was able to keep the baby rhino with him until help arrived. A helicopter flew the little girl to her new and hopefully temporary home at Care for Wild Africa, a wildlife rehabilitation facility.

Later that evening in an emotional call to get people motivated to fight the poaching industry, Mr. Burrough posted on his Facebook page a description of the baby animal: "Badly dehydrated, covered in wounds and clearly in desperate search of shade, the calf approached my car. She called out into emptiness, looked on for a moment and then rested her chin on my door. Slumping onto her hindquarters and then onto her belly she caught a few moments of peaceful rest in our shadow. With this said, it is our responsibility as humans to protect these animals. The lowlifes fuelling this ridiculous trade have to be stopped. As a continent we need to let these lower forms of human life know that we will not stand for the senseless slaughter of our wildlife. I do hope you will like and share this status but merely spreading awareness is not enough. Change begins with you. I won't be participating in the ice bucket challenge but I will be donating a percentage of my salary every month to a rhino charity in the area starting now. Extinction is forever and it's coming for Africa's rhinos, together we can stop it." The baby rhino has been aptly named Shadow. Care for Wild Africa reports she is doing well and may be able to be released back into the wild. A full assessment will take more time but the hope is to find her a home with another mother rhino. The United Nations released a report in June stating the illegal global wildlife trade brings in close to \$213 billion per year. The demand for ivory from elephants and rhinos is currently heaviest in China and Vietnam where the belief in ivory's medicinal value is coveted despite no scientific evidence. Save the Rhino organization published statistics showing the rise in rhino poaching in South Africa alone has increased from six in the year 2000 to 1,004 in 2013. This year looks to surpass that number with 787 poached rhinos as of September 22. According to the Department of Environmental Affairs from the Republic of South Africa, Kruger National Park - near where Shadow was discovered — has the consistently highest number of rhino poachings in the entire country.

GOOD NEWS

The Ebola crisis is never far from making the headlines at the moment, and with good reason. As the world tries to get a grip on this escalating situation, the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation has pledged \$50 million to fight the viral outbreak of Ebola in West Africa. a donation that is thought to be the most money ever pledged by one foundation to a single cause in a single charitable transaction. That fund includes \$5 million to go to WHO for emergency operations and R&D assessments and \$5 million to the U.S. Fund for UNICEF to provide immediate funds for life saving medicines and infrastructure support. "We are working urgently with our partners to identify the most effective ways to help them save lives now and stop transmission of this deadly disease," Sue Desmond-Hellmann, CEO of the Gates Foundation, is quoted as saying "We also want to accelerate the development of treatments, vaccines and diagnostics that can help end this epidemic and prevent future outbreaks."

WORLD'S OLDEST CAT?

Wadsworth, the golden-eyed tuxedo cat, began life as a sickly kitten who was abandoned at an English pub called Horse and Jockey. The pub landlady Ann Munday found the patheticlooking kitten and brought him home. "He was a tiny and very poor little thing, so it's a miracle he has survived," Ann said. At 27 years old, Wadsworth is likely the oldest cat in the world. Because Waddy, as he is affectionately known, has had only one owner (other than the uncaring people who threw him out as a newborn kitten), and has seen the same vet for the past 27 years, Ms. Munday has the vet records to prove her cat's elderly status.

Acorn House Vets, which sees Wadsworth regularly now due to his advanced age, says he is the oldest cat their practice has ever seen. Waddy was healthy throughout his life despite being a runt, but now he has developed hyperthyroidism, hence his monthly vet visits. "He does not appreciate being blood tested," said the vet, "so we keep these to a minimum, but Ms Munday does a fantastic job of treating him, and he is very stable on the medication. He is a great character and we all enjoy seeing him." Ms. Munday said "I've always had cats, but he is an absolute dream, and he has been a fantastic companion since my husband died 13 years ago."

At 27 - or 125 in human years - Waddy is unsurprisingly slowing down, "he doesn't really play anymore but still clearly still enjoys life, now he is like a little old man and mainly sleeps and eats. He has some ailments but he still gets up on my bed and the table and he still insists on sharing my Fish-n-Chips, I always get him a bit of fish - he doesn't like the chips," shAnn

But Waddy will have to live just over another eleven years, to outlive Cream Puff, the Texan cat that currently holds the world record for oldest cat ever, who died at the age of 38!



TEACHING YOUR CHILD EMOTIONAL INTELLIGENCE

Emotional intelligence can be a key to success in life and the ability to developing good relationships. Therefore EI is a very important skills for parents to teach their children. When parents have it themselves, their child will automatically learn El. Parents with El will naturally attune to their child and understand what their child is feeling. This in turn helps the child to learn how to read and respond to his own feelings and those of others in a healthy way.

However parents who struggle with EI themselves may lack the necessary skills to teach their child. This can set up a cycle of low EI within a family across the generations. When we ignore a child's feelings, don't notice when they are upset or anxious or tell them that their feelings are irrelevant, we are teaching them to ignore their own feelings. The child therefore grows up to believe that feelings are irrelevant. As adults they can struggle with emotions and in their relationships.

The following are ways in which parents can enhance their Child's Emotional Intelligence.

- · Know your child's true nature: Pay attention to see what your child likes, dislikes, gets angry about, is afraid or struggles with. Communicate these observations to your child in a non-judgemental way. This helps your child to begin to see themselves through your eyes - and they can feel how well you know them. Your child will see themselves reflected in your eyes, thus helping them to know who they are. This can boost their confidence and make them resilient to life's challenges.
- · Connect emotionally to your Child: Make an effort to empathise with your child and feel what they are feeling. Your child will feel an instant bond with you when your feel their emotion. This in turn helps your child to learn how to be empathic with others and to form healthy relationships. When your child sees you trying to understand their feelings or feel their feelings, they receive a powerful message.
- Respond non judgementally. When you child is emotional do not judge their feelings as right or wrong - instead look beyond the feelings to the source of this emotion. Help them to name and manage the emotion rather than judging it. This will help your child to develop a healthy relationship with their own emotions. It also teaches them to regulate and manage their emotions.

Health Matters.... With Dr. Michael Moloney

BREAST CANCER WEEK 1

Breast cancer is the second most common cancer in women and most cases occur in women over the age of 50. Around 1 in 9 women develop breast cancer at some stage in their life. Breast cancer can also develop in men but this is rare. If breast cancer is diagnosed early then there is a good chance of a cure. If you notice any lump or change in the breast then you should attend your doctor promptly.

The breast tissue is attached to the chest wall and extends as a 'tail' into the armpit. Many women find that their breasts become tender and lumpy before their periods. They also change in size in shape with age, pregnancy and weight changes. Therefore it is important that you get to know what is normal for your breasts and report any changes immediately.

Breast cancer occurs when an abnormal cell within the breast multiplies out of control. Malignant tumours refers to a group of these cells which has the potential to spread. Spread may occur to nearby organs but can also spread through the blood stream and lymph channels to distant parts of the body unrelated to the breast. If the tumour spreads to distant parts of the body then these are referred to as metastases (secondary tumours).

Breast cancer has many different subtypes. The type of breast cancer determines the treatment options as well as the prognosis. You may hear of the following terms:

Invasive or in situ:

Invasive refers to cancer which has spread from within a particular compartment of the breast whereas in situ cancers are normally contained within a particular duct or area. Invasive cancers are divided into ones which have moved into local blood or lymph vessels. The most common in situ cancer is "Ductal carcinoma in situ" (DCIS) which refers to cancer which has remained within a particular duct. About 1 in 5 new breast cancers are DCIS.

Grade:

This refers to how aggressive the cancer appears. The higher the grade the more aggressive the cancer.

Receptors:

Certain cancers contain receptors which allow proteins and hormones to attach to them. Finding this information out is important in deciding in a particular treatment

Stage:

This is a measure of how much the cancer has spread. In general the earlier the stage the better the outcome.

It is important to realise that identifying the exact type of cancer can take a number of weeks. This allows the specialists to discuss the case at meetings in order to determine the best treatment plan. Although the wait is frustrating, specialised treatment plans improve the overall outcomes.
