



KILLARNEY STUDENTS TO PRESENT €1000 BURSARY TO SR. ORLA TREACY

The Hugh O'Flaherty Memorial Award will be presented to Loreto Sr Orla Treacy at a ceremony in the Killarney Avenue Hotel on Saturday night,

Sr. Orla is Principal of a girls secondary school in South Sudan - one of the poorest nations and most fragile democracies in the world. With continuing violence, civil war, poverty and absolute oppression of women, according to a recent report in the Irish Catholic, it is noteworthy that South Sudan has one medical doctor per 65,000 citizens (the equivalent of two doctors covering all of Kerry) and the frightening statistic that a young girl of 15 years of age is more likely to die in childbirth than she is to finish secondary school. At great risk to themselves, Sr Orla and her Loreto colleagues are performing nothing short of miracles in establishing educational and medical services in the region of Rumbek.

As a significant new element of the Hugh O'Flaherty Humanitarian Award, students from various schools in Killarney Parish will make the Bursary presentation to Sr Orla who will speak at the ceremony about the challenges they face on a daily basis to educate the young people

of South Sudan as a means of achieving liberty and climbing out of poverty and oppression. The Award Ceremony on Saturday evening is open to the public and all are welcome.

What started as a small community running to raise funds for the Kerry/Cork Health Link Bus ended up on the biggest stage of all this weekend as members of Glenflesk ag Rith jogging group who took part in the Dublin City Marathon. The group finished their year of fundraising off in style by finishing the marathon in great time and some even managed to dance a set after the big race. Glenflesk ag Rith have held a number of fundraising events this year for the Kerry/Cork Health Link bus. Each event has been a great success and showed the huge community spirit of local people. The Kerry/Cork Health Link bus takes cancer patients to and from Cork five days a week to receive treatment and follow-up appointments. Funding for the Health Link Bus comes entirely from sponsorship and fundraising events as no Government or HSE funding is received, so it is vital that the Kerry/Cork Health Link Bus gets support from the community.

The driving force behind the campaign are Breda and Diarmuid Lynch from Glenflesk, their daughter Leah was diagnosed with Ewing's Sarcoma and had chemotherapy treatment at Cork University Hospital . Breda, is one of the founding members of the Glenflesk ag Rith jogging group who staged the events. At the end of the marathon, Breda was presented with




a beautiful boat to mark the journey she and the group have taken.

Killarney's Enigmatic Brian Ó Ceallaigh and an tOileánach

THE man handed the responsibility for steering Ryanair out of its current difficulties has been lined up as the keynote speaker at a major tourism conference planned for Killarney.

Peter Bellew, who has just been appointed to the high-profile position of chief operations officer with the airline, will be one of the guest speakers at the second annual Let's Talk Tourism forum on Friday, November 10.

He is leaving his post as chief executive of Malaysia Airlines to join Michael O'Leary in an airline he has worked for in the past.

"I am excited to return home to Ryanair and take up the challenge to grow the operation sustainably," he said.

Mr Bellew, 52, a native of Meath and a graduate of Trinity College, has been living in Fossa, Killarney for several years. He is married to Grainne and they have four children.

He previously worked with Kerry Airport as marketing manager and airport manager and later became director of flight operations with Ryanair before being headhunted by Malaysia Airlines.

TOURISM BOOST FOR THE KINGDOM AS RYANAIR EXTENDS NEW KERRY-BERLIN SERVICE THROUGH SUMMER 2018



RYANAIR EXTENDS NEW KERRY-BERLIN SERVICE THROUGH SUMMER 2018 AT KERRY AIRPORT

Nearly 20,000 passengers are set to fly into Kerry on the new Ryanair service from Berlin Schönefeld after it was announced that the route will continue through the summer of 2018.

Over 150 passengers made the inaugural flight to Kerry on Sunday morning last, while 189 passengers, maximum capacity, were booked on the first outward flight to Berlin.

The service which will operate every Thursday

and Sunday was due to end in March but there has been a broad welcome from the tourism sector in Kerry to the news that the route will continue through next year's summer season. The incoming flights will depart Berlin Schönefeld SXF at 3pm and land in Kerry at 4.35pm on Thursdays. On Sundays, the flights will depart Germany at 7.45am and land in Kerry at 9.25am. The outbound flight from Kerry on Thursdays will depart at 5pm, arriving

in Berlin at 8.35pm while the Sunday flights will leave Kerry at 9.45am and arrive in Berlin Schönefeld at 1.15pm.

Berlin Schönefeld is only 22 KM from Berlin City Centre, while excellent road and public transport connections link Schönefeld Airport with Berlin and the surrounding region.

Financial Controller at Kerry Airport, Basil Sheerin, said: "We are delighted with the support that the new Kerry-Berlin service has received so far with strong bookings up to the end of the year. The decision to extend the route through the summer of 2018 underlines the importance of Kerry as a destination and gateway for the German tourist market and will ensure increased visitor numbers to the region. Berlin is home to 3.5 million people and a number of high tech firms in the pharmaceutical, biomedical engineering, electronics and media corporations sectors. We will work closely with all sectors in Kerry over the coming months to promote the county as a great tourist destination and a top location in which to do business."

German tourists who visit Kerry and the region are amazed with the scenery, hospitality, and in particular the access to the Wild Atlantic Way. Kerry Airport welcomed over 325,000 passengers in 2016, up approximately 6% on 2015.

NEW 6% RATE OF STAMP DUTY ON NON-RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY -TRANSACTIONS ELIGIBLE FOR 2% RATE UNDER TRANSITIONAL RELIEF MEASURES

The rate of stamp duty on certain property acquisitions was increased from 2% to 6% on 10 October 2017 (Budget night). The provisions were subsequently included in Finance Bill 2017, which was published on October 19th, but these will not become law until the Finance Bill is enacted. This increase was made subject to transitional measures for the retention of the 2% rate in cases where the property acquisition had reached an advanced stage. Revenue has now put arrangements in place for these transitional measures.

The transitional measures apply stamp duty at a rate of 2% on instruments that are executed before 1 January 2018 where there was a contract in place before 11 October 2017 that was binding on the parties to the contract and the instrument contains a certificate to this effect.

A person who files a stamp duty return before the enactment of the Finance Bill and who is satisfied that the transitional measures would apply if the Finance Bill was enacted, has

- 1. File a return through the e-stamping system, pay stamp duty at the rate of 6% and be issued with a stamp certificate. On enactment of the Finance Bill, the filer can then request a refund of the difference in the stamp duty paid between the 2% and 6% rates by amending the return and submitting the relevant documentation to Revenue, or
- 2. File a return through the e-stamping system and pay the stamp duty at the rate of 2%, in which case a stamp certificate will not be issued. On enactment of the Finance Bill, Revenue will publish information on how the postponed stamp certificate can be obtained.



Know Your Rights:

ONLINE SHOPPING AND IMPORT CHARGES

OUESTION

I want to do some of my Christmas shopping on American websites. What are the rules about VAT and customs duties when shopping outside the EU

ANSWER

You are importing goods if you buy goods from abroad online or from a mail order catalogue, or if you get goods that are sent as a gift from abroad. In general, when goods are imported into Ireland from a country outside of the EU, they become liable to import charges. These include VAT, customs duty and excise or other duties where relevant. In some cases, you can get relief from import charges.

If someone sends you a gift from outside the EU, and it is valued at under €45, you do not have to pay customs duty or VAT. To qualify for this relief, the gift must be of an occasional nature and sent from one private individual to another. You can buy some goods from outside the EU up to a value of €22 without paying VAT. The value is calculated on the full value of the item, plus postage and duties. This is also the value that is used to calculate VAT, if it is payable. If you buy goods from outside the EU valued at more than €150, you will have to pay customs duty as well. Customs duty is normally calculated as a percentage of the full value of the goods including the cost of postage, packaging and insurance. VAT, customs duty and excise duty are always charged on excisable products (such as alcohol, tobacco and perfume) from outside the EU, whatever their value.

All packages received from outside of the EU require a customs declaration, which is usually completed by the sender. The declaration should include a description of the goods, the value and whether they are gifts or commercial items. Some websites offer to undervalue your goods to avoid import charges. This is illegal. You, as the importer of the goods, are responsible for ensuring that the information provided is accurate and that all duties and taxes are paid. Some websites may also promise delivery from within the EU, which would eliminate any import charges, but are in fact shipping their products from outside the EU. If this is the case, you are liable to duties and VAT.

WHEN A RELATIONSHIP **BREAKS UP**

The ending of a relationship can be a very painful time – whether you are the one who has ended the relationship or not. It may have come as a great shock – which can be very upsetting. Even if it had been coming for a while, the grief that accompanies a break up can be devastating. Following a break up we may feel overwhelmed with feelings of loss, grief, anxiety, loneliness, guilt and sadness and it may feel as if our lives will never be the same again. We may find that we have one good day, only to feel flooded with sorrow the next. This is very natural and part of the grieving process. If we were the one to end the relationship we may experience feelings of guilt, loneliness, sadness and/or relief. Whatever you are feeling, it is important to allow yourself time to grieve. Healthy grieving means experiencing our feelings, whatever they may be. Gradually we come to accept the loss and re-adjust to a life without that person. It can be difficult to move that person from being at the centre of your life to somewhere peripheral. This is made all the more challenging if you have children together or work in the same office. Minimal contact - however tough - is advisable.


At times grief can feel like a physical pain – so working with our body can help to release the sadness. Gentle movements such as stretching, walking dancing, yoga, massage or tai chi can all help our mind and body to express our grief.

Although your grief may feel very intense it will change over time. It is important to remind yourself that the heartbreak will heal. Gradually you will begin to notice that you're not checking your phone as much anymore, you have a night out where the sadness isn't present or you're not crying all the time. It is vital to notice these changes - as no matter how small they may seem they signal change and herald a new beginning.

Grief can be a very isolating experience, so it is important to seek support and reach out to others. You may choose to talk to friends or consider speaking to a counsellor to help you through this time. Remember you don't have to go through this alone. Other great sources of support include spending time with family, walks in nature, pets, reading a good book, watching a movie or going to the gym.

4 SIGNS THAT FOOD IS ALREADY GONE BAD

*Bad potatoes are known to contain a toxin that's intended to ward off pests, but can also be harmful to humans. If your potato is green, get rid of it! Otherwise, you'll risk digestive problems and they could even lead to issues with your nervous system.

*Mouldy bread: When it's only partially mouldy, it can be tempting to just scrape it off, but don't! Recent research conducted showed that the bacteria and toxins potentially carried by bread mould can cause an upset stomach and food poisoning.

*Bad eggs can give you an upset stomach or even salmonella. To check, when you crack one open, the whites and the yolk should remain nicely separated.

*If canned goods are past their expiration date, don't risk it, especially if the can is bent or swollen. Such expired products are known to cause botulism.

WONDEFUL NEWS FOR GIRLS IN INDIA

India's top court has ruled that sex with a child is always rape, quashing a clause that allowed men to have sex with underage girls if they were married to them. The Supreme Court's landmark decision closed a legal loophole that has historically allowed perpetrators of rape to escape punishment.

While the age of consent in India is 18, there was a clause in India's rape laws that lowered the age of consent to 15 if the girl was married. But the court has now ruled that the clause is "discriminatory, capricious, and arbitrary", and "violates the bodily integrity of the girl child". Girls under 18 will now be able to report their husbands for rape, as long as they lodge a complaint within a year of it happening. Girls are often seen as an economic burden, particularly in poor, rural areas, and many parents marry off their children in the hope of improving their financial security, there is also a shame associated with pre-marital sex that can lead to girls' parents forcing them to marry their rapists.

India is ranked 10th in the world for child marriage, with an estimated 47% of girls married by the time they turn 18 but hopefully this is the first step on the road to outlawing child marriage.

The police themselves anticipated the powerful fumes and protected themselves by putting on gas masks as they set fire to the drugs.

GREAT BRITAIN IS TAKING ANOTHER STEP TO END THE IVORY TRADE

Great Britain has already introduced a ban on the trade in raw ivory tusks and now new regulations propose the prohibition of sale and export of almost all items made out of ivory but there will be some exemptions – for musical instruments, items of historic, artistic, or cultural value, items with a small proportion of ivory, and for sales between museums.

Great Britain is currently the world's leading exporter of legal ivory carvings and antiques, according to an Environmental Investigation Agency report, more than 36,000 ivory items have been exported from GB between 2010 and 2015 – more than three times the number distributed by the next biggest exporter, the U.S. These sales stimulate the demand for ivory products, conservationists point out – and so, cause increased elephant poaching in Africa. The British Government states that the new proposals are driven by concern for the 20,000

proposals are driven by concern for the 20,000 elephants killed every year by poachers and draft legislation covering the ban is likely to be ready in the New Year.

FRANCE TO BAN ALL FOSSIL FUEL POWERED CARS BY 2040:

France has set a target date for 2040 to get rid of all cars dependent on fossil fuels and in order



to make that deadline, large cities will have to make the transition even sooner.

Paris authorities plan to ban all petrol and diesel-fuelled cars from the city and introduce electric vehicles. The ban is set to come into effect by the year 2030 but will not bother most citizens of the city as not many Parisians own cars but rather rely on the extensive public transport systems or use bike, scooter, and hybrid engine car rental networks.

TURTLE **RECOVERING SWALLOWING 4 FEET OF FISHING LINE**

An endangered Kemp's ridley sea turtle with monofilament fishing line wrapped around its head and mouth, and embedded in one of her flippers was pulled from a shipping channel near Charleston, S.C., by a South Carolina Department of Natural Resources crew that was there doing a random sampling of marine life.

After the turtle was transported to the South Carolina Aquarium's Sea Turtle Care Centre, an endoscopy showed she had also swallowed four feet of fishing line, the end of which was stuck in her intestine. The turtle, who the staff named Peach, was dying and may not have survived another week, South Carolina Aquarium veterinarian Dr. Shane Boylan said.To access the fishing line, Mr. Boylan had to make an incision in Peach's groin area, then reach in and grasp part of her intestine and cut through a knot, he then successfully pulled out foot after foot of monofilament.

After spending a few months recovering, Peach was tagged with a satellite transmitter and released on a beach on October 9th and will help with the research project studying the winter migration of these turtles in South Carolina coastal waters.

Fishing line is even deadlier for turtles than fishing hooks, it can actually get so tight the flipper can no longer get blood supply and eventually will cause an amputation, or the line can be swallowed by the animal and once it's swallowed it causes gut impaction, the animal can no longer forage and move food through its digestive system and starve to death.

CHARITY TREKKER DISCOVERED MOUNT KILIMANJARO IS NOT IN WALES

Mount Kilimanjaro is not in Wales and never

has been. But 51 year old Nikki Barnett from Warwickshire in England didn't know that when she signed up for a charity climb to the summit. Nikki, who works as an energy consultant, said she signed up after being sent an email with 'a picture of a mountain' and a message saying it would be the adventure of a lifetime.

"I just thought it was a mountain," she said. "I'm not being funny, but I've always struggled with the pronunciation of names in Wales, so I thought that's where it was.

Nikki only realised her mistake when a neighbour mentioned that Kilimanjaro is the tallest mountain on the African continent and when she investigated further discovered it is 4,000 miles away from Wales.

Despite the mix-up, however, Nikki and her 24-year-old daughter took on the challenge and funded the entire costs of the trip themselves in an effort to raise funds for the Myton Hospice in Coventry

which had cared for her late sister.

TEEN BOYS FILMED GIVING DUVET TO **HOMELESS MAN AND TUCKING HIM IN:**

Last December, Szymon, Wojtek, and Marcin were wandering down a street in Nysa - a city in southern Poland - when they stumbled upon a homeless man.

When the youths asked how they could help the stranger, he asked for a blanket to help keep himself warm on the park bench.

The trio then started searching all over town for a blanket until they eventually found someone who was throwing out old furniture. On top of an old couch was a clean duvet and pillow.

Szymon, Wojtek, and Marcin were then caught on CCTV footage walking back to the homeless man, gently covering him with the blanket, and tucking him in on the park bench.

After security workers saw the footage they spread the word and the boys were invited to the mayor's office so they could be recognised and rewarded for their good deed.

The Nysa city office also says that the man from the video is no longer homeless.

STREET DOG UNINVITED GUEST AT WEDDING:

Weddings can take a lot of planning. But despite all the planning in the world, you still might end up with a few surprises on the big

day. It might rain. Or an unexpected guest might show up. Both of those things happened to a couple in Brazil and they ended up with a new family member.

Marília Pieroni and Matheus Martins of São Paulo, Brazil, had been planning their wedding for about two years, when the day finally arrived, it began to pour. Guests took cover under a large tent to wait for the ceremony to begin, including a four-legged one with muddy paws who was not on the guest list.

A street dog had crashed the wedding, but guests were able to shoo him away before he caused any trouble.

Just as the bride's music began to play, the same dog appeared, he was removed again and the ceremony continued. But shortly after, as the couple were saying their vows, he showed up a third time and plopped himself down on Marília's long veil.

PORTABLE ROLL-UP SOLAR PANELS:


A mat rolled out in minutes that can give residents the power they need to get by is supplying power to everyone living on Flat Holm Island off the coast of Cardiff.


The system is called Rapid Roll and the solar panels are laid out like a carpet on the ground, taking about two minutes and can provide an average of 11KW of power, a much larger version rolls out solar power from a shipping container in less than an hour for 300 kW of power and a 4×4's trailer can hold enough solar panelling to power a 120-bed mobile clinic.

It's hoped the project will meet electricity needs in times of natural disasters in every part

The spooling system also includes an electric or electro-hydraulic drive system (along with manual backup) which enables the solar field to also be stowed away within a few minutes so that if a very severe storm/hurricane is forecast, the solar field can be stowed away in advance of the storm. The panels have a life span of 10







TOP TIPS FOR HEATING YOUR HOME THIS WINTER WITHOUT COSTING THE EARTH

With the shorter evenings coming in, heralding darker and colder days, the SEAI are urging home owners to get winter ready. Home heating typically accounts for about two thirds of annual household energy bills, with most of the costs occurring during the winter months. The Sustainable Energy Authority of Ireland (SEAI) has ten top tips to stay warm and save money on your energy bills this winter. Reducing the amount of energy you use in your home saves you money, lowers your carbon footprint and contributes to a cleaner, healthier environment.

- 1. 20 degrees Celsius is an ideal temperature for the living areas in a home. Lowering your thermostat by just 1°C could knock up to 10% off your heating bill, saving around €150 in a typical family home.
- **2.** Get your boiler serviced annually to ensure safe and efficient operation. It could save you a further €150, which should cover the costs.
- **3.** Use the 30 minute rule in cold weather:
- **4.** In the morning, set your heating to come on 30 minutes before you wake up and go off 30 minutes before you leave for work.
- **5.** In the evening set it to come on for 30 minutes before you are due home and off 30 minutes before you go to bed.
- **6.** If only one room needs heating, such as a home office, use a space or portable heater instead of the central heating. For free standing heaters, choose ones with thermostat controls and timers for more efficient heating.
- **7.** While open fires look beautiful, they are a real waste of energy with more than 75% of energy



going up the chimney. They are also damaging to air quality, so choose a more energy efficient option.

- **8.** Don't overheat unused rooms. If they are going to be unoccupied for long periods, turn down the thermostat or valve on the radiators but keep a small trickle of heating going. This will help to reduce the risk of condensation.
- **9.** If you are leaving the house unoccupied for an extended period, set the timer and thermostat to allow for a low level of heating each day. This will help to reduce the risk of frost damage.
- **10.** Much of the heat loss from a house goes through the windows, particularly if they are

single-glazed. Keep curtains closed at night and ensure they hang behind radiators.

- **11.** Insulating your attic and walls could save you 30-40% on your home heating bill. Grants for wall and roof insulation, as well as home heating upgrades, are available from SEAI with quick online approval available. Visit www.seai. ie/homeenergygrants
- **12.** Remote heating controls allow you to turn on and off your heating from your phone, tablet or computer and are really useful if you work irregular hours.
