

Killarney Gardai are preparing for a busy bank holiday weekend which sees the International Rally of the Lakes commence in Killarney today Friday 4th May and continues until Monday the 7th May 2018. This event is incorporated into the May Bank Holiday Weekend Festivities and has proved to be an exceptionally busy weekend for the town of Killarney and the surrounding area.


The competition side of the rally is staged over two days. Eight stages on Saturday from 7am in the morning to 5.50pm in the evening, and a further eight stages on Sunday starting at 7am and concluding on the Ceremonial Grand Stand at The Gleneagle Hotel at 5pm.

Speaking at Killarney Garda Station this week, Sgt Dermot O Connell told The Killarney Outlook "The Rally Weekend creates a significant increase in policing demands for An Garda Síochána. The massive influx of rally supporters, competitors and regular holiday weekenders to the Killarney area is estimated to be in the regions of 60,000 visitors. The entire weekend is there to be enjoyed by the whole family and that is exactly what we want to see, people enjoying themselves'. 'This year's Policing Operation has built on the success of recent years; it sets out the plan of action to deal effectively with all of these policing needs that have been identified following consultation with the many stakeholders. There will be numerous checkpoints set up over the weekend as well as increased high visibility patrols in the Killarney area. Any antisocial behaviour, public drinking or reckless behaviour on the roads will not be tolerated. We are asking anyone who is attending the Rally this weekend to park up the car for the evening if you are having a drink and remember that you may still be over the limit the morning after a night out.'

t was some weekend for Colm Cooper who not only won another another Kerry senior football club championship medal on Sunday as on Friday night he was presented with the 2018 Kerry Person of the Year Award on Friday night in Dublin.

Oiche Chiarraí 2018, the flagship event in the annual calendar of the Kerry Association in Dublin, took place on Friday, 27 April 2018 in the Ballsbridge Hotel in Dublin. The Kerry Person of the Year award, now in its thirty ninth year, recognises an individual who has shown leadership, brought honour to the county, and performed services for the county to such an extent that could be described as being beyond the norm of everyday life.

This award is based on nominations by the public and the final selection is made by the Kerry Association committee. It is something particularly special to the winners that it is an honour bestowed on them, by their own people, the people of Kerry.

During her tribute to Colm Kerry Association Cooper. Chairperson Keelin Kissane, noted that the award was presented in recognition of the enormous contribution he has made to Kerry and for the joy, honour and pride that he has brought to the county by his exceptional ability and humility and good grace on and off the field. He is one of the most admired figures in the history of the GAA and has provided us with many moments of magic.

A large crowd of Colm's family and friends from Killarney and beyond were in attendance on the night.

The five Special Olympics clubs of Kerry were also presented with the Laochra Chiarraí 2018 award on the night by the President of the Kerry Association in Dublin,

Christy McCarthy, while legendary GAA footballer, Colm Cooper, was presented with the 2018 Kerry Person of the Year award by Keelin Kissane, Chairperson of the Association.

On the night, President Christy McCarthy led a round of applause in tribute to the 2017 Kerry Person of the Year, Kerry hospice fundraiser, Ted Moynihan, who sadly passed away in February.

The Laochra Chiarraí Award was introduced just over three years ago, recognises exemplary leadership in community activity in the county.

The Special Olympics Clubs of Kerry, which comprise Kerry Stars, Tralee Together, Skellig Stars, North Kerry Eagles, and the Kerry Fairways Golf Society received the 2018 Laochra Chiarraí award in recognition of their tireless and valuable work in enabling those in our community with an intellectual disability to achieve and win, not only in sport, but also in life.

NEWS DESK Death of a legend... Paudie O'Connor passes away in Las Vegas

Shock and sadness greeted the unexpected death of Killarney Basketball legend Paudie O'Connor in Las Vegas this week. Eamonn Keogh looks back at the sporting career of a man who has been described as the greatest Irish basketball player of all time.

1951 was a momentous year for Killarney basketball. Local historians recall that the very first game of basketball took place in November of that year in the old Killarney Town Hall featuring the likes of Eamon O'Donoghue, Ben Campion, Johnny Culloty and Paddy Culligan. September 1951 was also a very significant month that year which marked the birth of Paudie O'Connor, a basketball player who went on to revolutionise the game in Ireland and set high standards for everybody else to follow.

The son of Dan and Mai O'Connor, Paudie grew up at No. 1 O'Sullivans Place, Killarney.

Former neighbour and friend Weeshie Fogarty recalls an interesting story about the small green area in the neighbourhood with one timber telegraph pole in the centre where Paudie and his brothers Seamie, Mike and Benny erected a hoop on the pole. Paudie climbed on top of his brother Seamie's shoulders and attached the hoop to the pole and it was there that he honed and polished his amazing shooting and scoring skills. Facilities improved when St. Mary's Parish Hall opened with a proper indoor basketball hall and a young Paudie O'Connor soon emerged as the most exciting talent on the Killarney and Kerry basketball circuit during the 1960s. In his late teens and early twenties Paudie spent his summers in the USA

attending basketball camps under the guidance of former NBA player 'Pistol' Pete Maravich and American coaching legend Dean Smith.

Paudie won various county championships with the Busby Babes in the late 1960s while in 1969 he starred for the he Kerry Senior and minor Basketball teams that won All-Ireland titles.

Following Paudie's death this week, Seamie O'Connor recalled some of his proudest moments playing alongside his brother on the basketball court. One was on a St. Vincent's Killarney team that defied all the odds to beat a star studded US Navy team at a tournament in Sligo in 1972. Killarney were led Lawrence O'Donoghue (RIP), Sean Coleman (RIP), Paudie and Seamie O'Connor, Billy Healy, Tom Looney, Tim Regan, Rory O'Flaherty and James O'Connor. Another fond memory that Seamie recalled was when the Kerry senior basketball team defeated Cork in the 1974 Munster final in The Parochial Hall with three O'Connor brothers lining out for Kerry. The late Cork Examiner photographer and Killarney native Louis MacMonagle captured the historic photo after the match of Seamie, Paudie and Mike O'Connor.

In Irish basketball circles, Paudie O'Connor is best remembered for leading the Killarney initiative that brought the first professional American players to play in the national league.

By this time Killarney were playing their home games under the Gleneagle banner in the new St. Brendan's Gym and were also participating in the Federation Cup, a competition for British and Irish clubs. Crowds of 800 people squeeezed into St. Brendan's at the time to see Killarney dominate and

bring Irish basketball to a new level in the early 1980s.

With other teams following the lead set by Paudie and investing heavily to recruit top quality American players, Killarney's dominance at the top was challenged and began to decline in the mid 80s. Paudie retired in 1986 and moved to the USA shortly afterwards with his American born wife Marty and daughter Morgan.

A few years in New York was followed by a move to Las Vegas where Paudie set up O'Connor Golf Tourism bringing high profile tours to Ireland and to Scotland every year including Basketball legend Michael Jordan.

Paudie never lost touch with Killarney returning home once or twice every year. His brother Seamie confirmed that he was due to return again in the next few weeks. During their regular phone conversations Paudie loved to hear the sporting news from Killarney, particularly the exploits of Dr Crokes and Kerry while he also had a keen interest in the fortunes of Scotts Lakers, who were captained by his nephew Philip this season.

Outside his sporting interests, Paudie was also well known in Killarney as the youngest ever Mayor and member of Killarney Urban District Council and was also a member of Kerry County Council.

Paudie O'Connor's funeral is due to take place in Las Vegas on Monday May 7th. A memorial service will take place in Killarney at a later date. Predeceased by his parents Mai (1987) and Dan (2001) and brother Benny (2009), Paudie is survived by his daughter Morgan O'Connor Marro and her mother Marty, brothers Seamie and Mike, grandson Luciano, son-in-law Marcello Mauro, sisters-inlaw Fidelma and Peggy and nephews Patrick, Richard and Philip O'Connor.





Health and Safety Authority campaign to focus on vehicle and machinery safety

he Health and Safety Authority (HSA) will begin a two-week

long intensive farm inspection campaign on Tuesday 8th May. Approximately 200 inspections are planned with the focus on safe working with vehicles and machinery.

Farm vehicles and machinery are the main cause of serious and fatal accidents on Irish farms. Over the last 10 years, half of all fatal farm accidents involved vehicles (30%) and machinery (20%). Farm vehicles are generally defined as tractors or quad bikes. In recent years there has been a sharp increase in the number of fatalities involving guad bikes, with 12 reported in the past 10 years (4 in 2017).

Most accidents with farm vehicles or machinery will involve at least one of the following; poor planning, operator error, lack of training and inadequate maintenance of vehicle or machine.

The key message during this



campaign is that preparation is the key to working safely, particularly during busy periods such as the silage season. This involves looking at the suitability of operators, the machinery and how the work is to be done.

On a practical level the HSA are asking farmers to consider the following:

Are handbrakes or parking brakes working on all tractors and machinery?

 Are cabs and doors maintained in working order?

Are tractor mirrors set and maintained correctly (not cracked or twisted)?


 Has the driver ever received formal driver training for tractor or quad bike use?

Pat Griffin, senior inspector for agriculture and forestry safety at the HSA says that good planning and control can prevent serious accidents and fatalities from occurring:

"All farmers should organise their work in a way that is efficient and safe. This means having rules in place in relation to who uses which vehicle or machine, establishing one way systems, safe routes within fields and in and out of gates, care when reversing and who is in overall charge of the work. The person in overall charge must be realistic about how much work can be done and how many hours operators can safely work."

Killarney to Castleisland Road faces 3 month closure

Frequent Killarney motorists to Castleisland are to have their schedule disrupted for up to 3 months following an announcement that Kerry County Council will close the N23 Road for works on Dysert Bridge.

Kerry County Council will close the N23 road National Primary Road, in the townland of Clashganniv, Kilcow and Farran (ED Castleisland), between the junction of the N23 and the L2024 and the junction of the N23 and the L2025 from 7am on Thursday, 24th May 2018 to 6pm on Monday, 20th August 2018, both dates inclusive.

The purpose of the road closure is to avoid major interface between construction plant and road users (General Public) and to facilitate the replacement of Dysert Bridge [KY-N23005] and minor realignment of the N23 Castleisland to Farranfore Road at either side of Dysert Bridge. Concern was raised this week for the €800,000 project, not for the project but for the length of time the main road into Castleisland for mostly Killarney bound traffic would be closed and a number of councillors at the Killarney Municipal Meeting raised the matter.

Locally Patricia Walsh of Castleisland Chamber Alliance said, "We are cognisant of the dangerous bridge at Dysert and see the replacement of this bridge and the widening of the road as a major improvement to the area. Our issue is twofold firstly the lack of communication with Chamber or Castleisland businesses


in relation to the closure of the road and secondly the length of time of the proposed closure. In an effort to explore the possibility of reducing the length of time the road shall remain closed we have requested that KCC meet with TII and the contractors to negotiate the possibility of looking at carrying out works out of hours. We will be meeting with KCC today (Friday) to discuss the outcome of that meeting".

Castleisland Councillor Bobby O'Connell said that "while the project is of course welcome, it is of vital importance that more dialogue between the council and the local businesses take place. I have organised a meeting on Friday morning between the local interests and I would hope that from this more would be known"

Speaking with the Outlook O'Connell added, that while the project is in the hands of the national agency TII and it will be them that ultimately decides if any concessions with regards alternative routes. Senior Executive Engineer Paul Curry told the meeting that the investment would result in a key piece of infrastructure and said that while the road closure is a short-term pain but is a necessary evil to carry out the works quickly and expeditiously.

Meanwhile speaking with the Outlook, Deputy Danny Healy Rae TD while welcoming the works outlined a concern for heavy good vehicles "I think some attempt would be made to open one lane of traffic, so heavy good vehicles would have to go all the way into Ballycarty roundabout. As this is going to add a considerable cost to people who are using it every day." Mr Curry promised that the Camp Rd, which will now see a lot of extra traffic on it, would get extra attention from the council staff to ensure the upkeep and maintenance of the road during this very busy period. A concern which was raised by residents along the road.

Use positive stress to motive yourself for the State Exams

With the state exams now just five weeks away, candidates may become anxious about their performance. A level of anxiety is normal and focusses the mind on the challenge ahead. Almost all exam candidates, irrespective of how laid back they appear, feel nervous. It's the body's way of dealing with a stressful experience. How you deal with this nervous energy is the critical issue. If you channel it in a positive direction it will give you the vitality to cope with the demands of the exam.

A positive mental attitude is a considerable aid around exam time. Be confident in your ability to do well. Don't be discouraged by other students appearing to know more than you do. Aim to do perform to your own capability, not to compete with others. Make positive statements about yourself. Banish all negative thoughts from your mind. Think well of yourself and of your readiness to achieve success. Your best effort is more important than your ultimate performance in the exam. Determine to do your best, no more, no less.

Success is a product of positive thinking. By motivating yourself towards your goals, you will redouble your effort and improve your performance. Have items in your study environment to spur you on. Place a statement of your objectives, such as your target grades, in a conspicuous place. An occasional glance in their direction will encourage you.

Exam stress becomes newsworthy every year because of the assessment system used in the state exams. For the most part these exams are terminally assessed. In effect, two years of work is examined by means of written papers in June. Perhaps, not enough credit is given to the candidate for consistent work over the two years. Continuous assessment is not utilised

although project work is becoming a more important part of the exam structure. The major problem with the exam system is the increased level of stress it causes in some students around exam time. Despite all that is written about exam stress, students continue to show that they are excellent exam performers and use stress as a stimulant rather than an affliction.

The stress experienced by the majority of exam candidates is positive stress. It concentrates the mind wonderfully. You realise that the forthcoming exam is making increased demands of you. However, your application to study and revision provides you with the resources to meet these demands. Positive stress provides you with the motivation to prepare for the exam. It will sustain and stimulate this motivation until the exam is over. Properly controlled stress will activate hidden resources of energy and application in you. It's important to control the stress and channel it into positive energy.

It's only when you haven't the resources to meet the demands of the exam that distress or negative stress becomes an issue. Exam distress is a rare occurrence in young people and can easily be confused with normal exam anxiety. The present cohort of young people is highly skilled and well able to cope with the demands of the exam. Distress, when it does occur, is disruptive and may interfere with your performance if it isn't counteracted.

An effective way of managing distress is through utilising your social support network of people who care about you. If you need emotional support approach someone in whom you have confidence. That person may be a teacher, a parent or your guidance counsellor. All you need is the advice of someone who will put the exam in perspective for you and who will help to boost your self-confidence. It all goes back to having positive mental а attitude and to realising

that anxiety and stress should be channelled in vour favour.

Know Your Rights: VOTING IN A REFERENDUM

QUESTION

How do I check if I can vote in the forthcoming referendum? If I'm not in Ireland on polling day, can I still vote?

ANSWER

To vote in a referendum, you must be an Irish citizen and be registered to vote. Every local authority is responsible for compiling and publishing a list of voters in its area. This is called the Register of Electors or the electoral register.

In general, Irish citizens living abroad cannot be entered on the Register of Electors and cannot vote in a referendum. The only exception to this is in the case of Irish officials on duty abroad (and their spouses) who may register on the postal voters list. If you are abroad on holiday on polling day, you cannot have a postal vote.

The current Register of Electors came into force on 15 February 2018. You can check if you are on the register at checktheregister.ie or at your local authority, Garda station, post office or public library.

If you are not on the register, you can apply to be added to the supplement to the register. You use Form RFA2, which is available online at checktheregister.ie or from your local authority, post office or public library. To be included in the supplement used at an election or referendum, your local authority must receive your application at least 15 days before polling day. Sundays, public holidays and Good Friday are not counted as days for this purpose.

Local authorities prepare a postal voters list as part of the electoral register. You can only apply for registration as a postal voter if you cannot vote at a polling station because of illness or disability, your occupation, being in prison, or if you are studying full-time in Ireland but away from the address where you are registered to vote.

You can apply to be added to the supplement to the postal voters list up to 22 days (excluding Sundays and public holidays) before polling day in a referendum. The application form for inclusion in the supplement to the postal voters list is available from your local authority or online at checktheregister.ie.

Last week we looked at the many ways we can raise our self-esteem and begin to feel better about ourselves. We also identified how these patterns of low self-esteem can start very early in life – and thus it makes sense that we think about developing and promoting self-esteem in childhood. Parents and caregivers can promote positive self-esteem in their children by encouraging their children and making sure they feel loved, secure and competent.

Children who are scared to try new things and speak negatively about themselves may have low self-esteem. They tend to give up easily or wait for someone else to do the task for them. They can also be overly critical and easily disappointed in themselves. They tend to view temporary problems as permanent and can be pessimistic. In contrast, children with healthy self-esteem are comfortable in social settings and enjoy interacting with others. They enjoy working independently as well as interacting in groups. They work towards finding a solution when faced with a challenge and don't put themselves down. They are generally more optimistic and know their strengths and weaknesses.

To help build your child's confidence, encourage your child to take healthy risks. Allow them to take (age-appropriate) chances, make choices and take responsibility for them. When children make their own age-appropriate choices this empowers themand gives them a sense of control over their bodies.

Children also need opportunities to demonstrate their competence and feel that they make a valuable contribution. This can mean asking them to help out at home – by setting the table or dusting. Encouraging them to take on tasks that they show particular interest in is a great way to boost their confidence. Teach your child to set goals and take pride in their accomplishments. It is important to ensure that their goals are within reach and at an appropriate level for their ability. However, if your child tries and doesn't succeed, this is a fantastic opportunity for you as parent to help build their self-esteem. Let them know that no matter what the result, your love is unconditional. Encourage them to try and try again.

Overly praising a child is not the way to develop their self-esteem and confidence. Confidence comes from them trying, failing and trying again. If we tell them they are doing a 'terrific job' whatever they do, this confuses children and they learn not to trust their own instincts. However when praise is appropriate, specific and earned it is a valuable self-esteem builder.

PRE-LETTING EXPENDITURE IN RESPECT OF VACANT RESIDENTIAL PREMISES

Expenses incurred on a vacant residential premises prior to it being first let after a period of non-occupancy are allowable as a deduction against rental income from that premises.

The premises must have been vacant for at least 12 months and then let as a residential premises between 25th December 2017 (the date of the passing of the Finance Act 2017) and 31 December 2021.

The expenditure must have been incurred in the 12 months before the premises is let as a residential premises.

The deduction authorised is capped at €5,000 per vacant premises.

If the person who incurs the expenditure ceases to let the property as a residential premises within 4 years of the first letting the deduction will be clawed-back in the year in which the property ceases to be let as a residential premises. This cessation can be either on sale of the property or change of use from rented residential property. The claw-back will be made by deeming the deduction previously allowed to be a Case V profit or gain of the year of cessation.

LOOKING AFTER YOUR SUMMER BEDDING

- If you look after your bedding plants throughout the Summer you will have colour until early autumn or the first early frost.

• A liquid feed of Tomato feed every 2 to 3 weeks is an ideal way to feed your hanging baskets , window boxes and containers.

• Make sure when you are feeding them to do it in the evening time and keep the liquid off the foliage as much as possible.

 As the summer goes on you will notice that some of the flowers will start to go off. All you have to do here is take the dead flowers off, a process called dead heading.

 It only takes a couple of minutes and it will ensure that new flowers will grow.

 Later in the Summer if a plant looks bad in the basket or window box, remove and replace it with something else like a trailing ivy. Otherwise the whole hanging basket, window box or container will look as it its gone off, and a new plant will give it a new lease of life.

Eco-driving advice

HOW TO GET THE MOST OUT OF THE FUEL YOU BUY

Car choice plays a big part in the extent to which your motoring affects the environment, but whatever car you've got there's a number of simple things you can do to reduce energy use (fuel consumption), CO2 emissions and pollution.

These eco-driving tips are the motoring equivalent of insulating the hot water tank, fitting low energy bulbs and not leaving the tv on standby – simple, common sense tips that really will make a difference. You'll save money on your fuel bills too.

MAINTENANCE

REGULAR SERVICING – Get the car serviced regularly (according to the manufacturer's schedule) to maintain engine efficiency.

ENGINE OIL – Make sure you use the correct specification of engine oil (refer to the handbook)

TYRE PRESSURES – Check tyre pressures regularly and before long journeys. Underinflated tyres create more rolling resistance and so use more fuel. Getting tyre pressures right is important for safety too. Refer to the handbook as pressures will normally have to be increased for heavier loads.

BEFORE YOU GO

LOSE WEIGHT – Extra weight means extra fuel so if there's stuff in the boot you don't need on the journey take it out and leave it at home.

STREAMLINE – Roof racks/boxes create extra wind resistance and so increase fuel consumption. If you don't need it take it off, if you do, pack carefully to reduce the extra drag.

DON'T GET LOST – Plan unfamiliar journeys to reduce the chance of getting lost - try the AA Route planner or consider a 'Sat Nav' if you regularly drive unfamiliar routes. Check the traffic news before you go too.

COMBINE SHORT TRIPS – Cold starts are inefficient so it pays to combine errands such as buying the paper, dropping-off the recycling, or collecting the kids into one trip rather than making multiple short trips.

CONSIDER ALTERNATIVES – If it's a short journey (a couple of miles or so) consider walking or cycling rather than taking the car – fuel consumption is worse when the engine's cold and pollution will be greater too until the emissions control system gets up to normal temperature.



ON THE WAY

Leave promptly – Don't start the engine until you're ready to go. This avoids fuel wastage due to unnecessary idling and ensures that the engine warms up as quickly as possible. (In winter months, scrape ice rather than leave the car idling for a long period to warm up).

Easy does it – Drive smoothly, accelerate gently and read the road ahead to avoid unnecessary braking.

DECELERATE SMOOTHLY – When you have to slow down or to stop, decelerate smoothly by releasing the accelerator in time, leaving the car in gear.

Rolling – If you can keep the car moving all the time, so much the better. Stopping then starting again uses more fuel than keeping rolling.

CHANGE UP EARLIER – Change gear as soon as possible without laboring the engine – try changing up at an engine speed of around 2000 rpm in a diesel car or around 2500 rpm in a petrol car. This can make such a difference to fuel consumption that all cars in the future are likely to be fitted with Gear Shift indicators that light a lamp on the dashboard to indicate the most efficient gear change points.

CUT DOWN ON THE AIR-CON – Air conditioning increases fuel consumption at low speeds, but at higher speeds the effects are less noticeable. So if it's a hot day it's more economical to open the windows around town and save the air conditioning for high speed driving. Don't leave aircon on all the time – you should run it at least once a week throughout the year though to maintain the system in good condition.

TURN IT OFF – Any electrical load increases fuel consumption, so turn off your heated rear windscreen, demister blowers and headlights, when you don't need them.

STICK TO THE LIMITS – Drive at or within the speed limit – the faster you go the greater the fuel consumption and the greater the pollution too.

DON'T BE IDLE – If you do get caught in a queue avoid wasting fuel by turning the engine off if it looks like you could be waiting for more

than three minutes.

COASTING - DOES IT HELP SAVE FUEL?

Coasting - rolling downhill or approaching a junction with the car out of gear - is inadvisable because the driver doesn't have full control of the vehicle, though it used to be quite a common practice to save fuel.

You lose the ability to suddenly accelerate out of tricky situations. You lose engine braking which takes some of the load off the brakes on down hill stretches and helps to avoid brake fade - overheated brakes

require harder pedal pressures to stop the vehicle.

These days, coasting is still inadvisable and changes in vehicle fuel systems mean it won't save you fuel either.

OLD CAR WITH CARBURETOR - take your foot off the accelerator pedal with the car in gear and fuel is still drawn through into the engine. Fuel savings could be made by coasting out of gear.

MODERN CAR WITH ELECTRONIC ENGINE MANAGEMENT - fuel and ignition systems are effectively combined and controlled by one Electronic Control Unit (ECU). Take your foot off the accelerator and the ECU cuts the fuel supply to the injectors anyway so there's nothing to be gained by coasting.

MODERN DIESEL ENGINES - these also have the ability to shut off the fuel when you take your foot off the accelerator.

HOW MUCH CAN YOU SAVE?

The aim is to see how much you can improve on your current average fuel consumption or the 'official', manufacturer's figure by following the advice above.

If your car has an onboard computer that records fuel economy (kilometers per gallon / KPG) then take a note of the overall average fuel consumption you're getting now and then see how much you can improve it by following the 'eco-driving' advice above.

It should be possible to re-set the computer so it starts recording a new average KPG.

With no onboard computer, you'll first need to find out the official, manufacturer quoted fuel consumption for your car. You may see three different figures quoted, 'urban', 'extra-urban' and 'combined' – it's the third, 'combined' figure that you want.





LAUNCH OF THE JOE MCDONAGH CUP AND THE EIRGRID GAA FOOTBALL U20 CHAMPIONSHIP

On Monday, The GAA today launched the 2018 McDonagh, Ring, Rackard and Meagher Cups at Croke Park in the company of players from counties competing in these competitions. The inaugural McDonagh Cup begins next weekend with the meetings of Meath and Antrim, Carlow and Kerry and Laois and Westmeath. The competition is named after former GAA President and Galway hurler Joe McDonagh. The McDonagh Cup final will be played on the same billing as the Leinster hurling final giving all competing players something tangible to aim for.

The newly structured, EirGrid GAA Football U20 All-Ireland Championship was officially launched last week in Croke Park. The Connacht championship commences on June 2nd, with Roscommon and Sligo coming face to face for the first time this year. Limerick and Kerry kick start the Munster campaign when they play on June 15th. Speaking on behalf of the GAA, John Horan, Uachtarán Cumann Lúthchleas Gael said: "2018 is certainly a year of change in the GAA, not least with the alterations to our competition structures. The merits of this championship are well documented, offering as it does an outlet before the senior ranks for players to mature and develop against players of their own age".



Welcome back dear reader last week we looked at the heart of our heavenly Father longing to have His children restored to Him. "Lord, ...so many rise up against me, and say there is no help for me in God. But You.. are a shield for me...the lifter of my head" (Psalm 3:1-3). We saw how the prodigal son feared shame and condemnation when he returned to his Father, but instead experienced acceptance and love, and was re-instated to his place in the family. Shame is a toxic weapon of the devil that makes people feel unsafe regardless of whether they know the Lord or not. Shame is the result of sin – our own sin and the sin others bring on us, and also idolatry (Genesis 3:7; Exodus 32:24-25). Idolatry is the worship of anything or anyone other than God Himself. The first commandment says 'Worship no God but me' (Exodus 20:3); and today people worship many things other than Almighty God. When we put other people, wealth, status, education, gratification or any other false god above our relationship with Him, trouble ensues. Our identity should come from God's love for us and who He says we are we are. If we lean on our own abilities or what the world thinks of us for security this is an open door for the enemy to bring destruction and breakdown. When we humble ourselves before the Lord, He will lift us up (James 4:10). Where life has tried to bring you down, God wants to restore and honour you friend. How this can take place is by seeking Him out through His Word (look up the Scriptures you find here), and talk and listen to Him as you would a trusted friend. He is the 'friend who sticks closer than a brother' (Proverbs 18:24), His greatest desire is that you prosper (succeed) and are in good health even as your soul (your mind, will and emotions) prospers (3 John vs 2). Write out Scriptures that speak to you, personalise them - insert 'l' or 'me', and then speak them out over your life. God promises that through Messiah Jesus, His Son, we will have double honour for the shame of the past (Isaiah 61:7). In Ireland especially, we need a revelation of this Word. We and our generations past have experienced shame and wounding and this visits down family lines, but praise God He wants to bring His joy and recompense as we submit to the truth of His Gospel, making Jesus Lord of all.
