

MOLONEY WELCOMES COMPENSATION FUND FOR SYMPHYSIOTOMY SURVIVORS

Labour Senator Marie Moloney has welcomed today's government announcement of a compensation fund of 34 million euro for the survivors of symphysiotomy.

"One of the first issues I raised on being elected to the Seanad was the plight of all the women who had been subjected to this barbaric practice between 1920 and as late as 1984. Symphysiotomy was a horrendous procedure carried out on women before or after labour which increased the size of the pelvic area to allow easier delivery of a baby. Many of the women who had the procedure suffer from incontinence, prolapsed organs, walking difficulties and chronic pain. They have fought a long and lonely campaign for

"I have had a number of women in my constituency who have approached me about this matter in recent years and I have rarely, if ever, come across such distressing cases. Having closely monitored this matter and having raised the issue several times I am relieved that a compensation fund of 34 million has been offered to survivors. Over 1500 women had this procedure carried out on them of which there are only 230 women still with us today."

"Although each case and circumstance is

different and the level of compensation for each will differ I am very pleased that there will be an approximate payment of €147,000 per survivor. I have just spoken to survivor Olivia Kearney from Louth who has worked tirelessly with other survivors and Patient Focus, and she has welcomed this announcement. Olivia told me that she will meet with government representatives today to discuss this further."



Katie is now hoping to visit Killarney to meet up with her new found relatives - something she didn't thing would happen so fast!



Named after their son, Liams Lodge will be located on a 10 acre green field site in Blennerville, Tralee, Co. Kerry. As well as being Ireland's first NATIONAL respite Centre for children suffering from genetic and rare disorders, Liam's Lodge will also be Irelands 2nd Children's hospice predominately serving Munster and the Mid-West.

Kerry will be seeking their 76th Munster Crown, while the Rebels will be seeking their 38th Munster Senior title.

Kerry last tasted Provincial Success 12 months ago, defeating Cork 1-16 to 0-17 in a nail-biting Provincial final only to lose the All-Ireland semifinal to Dublin. Cork also lost to the Dubs at the quarter-final stage.

The record books show that Cork's last Provincial Final success over Kerry came back in 2008 on a 1-15 to 1-11 scoreline. Cork's last success in Killarney came back in 1995.

Brian Cuthbert has taken over as Rebels manager this year succeeding Conor Counihan

He has guided the Cork team through a transition period, introducing many young players who have already made their mark in the National League.

Newcomer Brian Hurley absolutely shone in the League game in Tralee back in April, when



he helped himself to eight points, seven from play, leading Kerry full-back Mark Griffin a merry dance. Cork comprehensively defeated the Kingdom 2-18 to 1-11.

Kerry will have to keep a special watch on

Cork also has potent forwards in Paul Kerrigan, a son of the great Jimmy Kerrigan, and veteran Donnacha O'Connor. The return of Colm O'Neill from a career-threatening cruciate injury gives Cuthbert an added attacking force.

Kerry, meanwhile, will be looking forward to Sunday's final with trepidation. The Kingdom have lost stalwarts Tomas O'Se and Paul Galvin to retirement this year.

Colm Cooper's cruciate injury robs the Kingdom of the most potent forward in the game's history.

The absence of James O'Donoghue from the starting line-up against Clare was felt but despite this the Kingdom clung on to a narrow victory.

Kerry manager Eamonn Fitzmaurice is pleased O'Donoghue will be ready to fill his usual corner-forward spot.

Fitzmaurice confirmed that Kerry's marquee forward took part in a full training session behind closed doors last Sunday and showed no ill-effects of the shoulder injury which ruled him out against Clare.

O'Donoghue's return will be a massive boost to the Kingdom, as he is Kerry's leading forward in the absence of the injured Colm Cooper.

Johnny Buckley is also expected to return to the side following the injury which ruled the Dr Crokes man out of the provincial semi-final win with Donnchadh Walsh returning in place of Michael Geaney.

Kerry's heroes against Clare were Paul Geaney, who shot six points from play, goal-scorer and

corner-back Paul Murphy from Rathmore, and Kenmare's Stephen O'Brien, both newcomers to the inter-county set-up this year.

Sunday's game will be incredibly close. Cork will undoubtedly be favourites on home soil and would love to lower the Kingdom's colours. Can Kerry produce an unexpected win, only time will tell! It will be close.

PORNOGRAPHY AND TEENAGERS

We now know that young people are first viewing pornography as early as 11 years of age and exposure to this material at a young age can be a confusing and disturbing experience for a child. We also know from research that parents, when given the skills, are the best people to impart sex education to their children. However, most would also say that they need assistance in their role as sex educators. Parents might find the following facts useful in addressing the issue of internet pornography with their teenager.

- In REALITY Internet pornography is highly addictive. It is known as the 'crack cocaine' of sex addiction.
- The more one watches porn, the more the brain will wire itself to associate with that activity - in REALITY you will want what you see on the screen in front of you!
- The REALITY is that we now have younger men presenting with sexual dysfunction due to over use of pornography.
- It's important to remember that porn is a movie; it is fantasy; it is not REALITY. Many young lads are worried about living up to what they are viewing!
- Boys and girls often express a dissatisfaction and anxiety with their physical appearance because of pornography. A lot of surgical enhancement goes on in the porn industry and in REALITY our bodies are very different!
- 99.9% of pornography is made by men for men. Some young people tell us that they 'get ideas' about sexual experimentation from pornography!
- We hear first-hand about the confusion young people have around consent - e.g. '..well a person might say no and not really mean it....' In REALITY 'NO' means 'NO'.
- Women are objectified in pornography. In REALITY women are people with feelings and with boundaries!
- There is no intimacy or love in pornography. In fact pornography is about disconnection. In REALITY relationships are about connection and start hours, days or weeks before sex. Sex is not purely a physical activity happening in an emotional vacuum as we see in pornography!.

Gardai are concerned about the prolific use of pornographic sites on the internet and the ease at which they can be accessed by young people. They highlight the increase in sex crimes in Ireland - from 74 in 2009 to 250 in 2011 - stating that "Each time a young fella looks at these sites he sees all kinds of sexual activity and expects that this is what's going to happen with girls. Girls are also being groomed into this behaviour'

This is worrying information for any parent - next week we will discuss how you can approach this topic with your teen?

Health Matters.... With Dr. Michael Moloney

EXCESSIVE SWEATING (HYPERHIDROSIS) PART 1

Excessive sweating is a common problem especially of the palms, armpits and soles. It can be distressing and can have a serious impact on your life. Normal sweating helps to keep the body temperature steady in hot weather, during a fever, or when exercising. Excessive sweating (hyperhidrosis) means that you sweat much more than normal. Even when you are not hot, anxious, or exercising, you make a lot of sweat.

Although not a medically serious condition, excessive sweating can be distressing and embarrassing. For example: if you have bad palm sweating you tend to have a 'cold sweaty handshake' and sweat may drip from your hands onto work documents, onto computer keyboards, etc. If you have had bad armpit sweating, you may become embarrassed by the frequent 'wet patch' that develops on clothes under your arms. You may need to change clothes during the day. You may avoid social contact or avoid doing sports because of embarrassment about the condition.

INITIAL TREATMENT OPTIONS FOR HYPERHIDROSIS

The following may be all that you need if the condition is mild.

If you find that soaps irritate the affected skin, use a bland soap substitute such as an emollient (moisturiser) ointment or cream.

If possible, avoid triggers which can make things worse such as heat or spicy food.

If you have armpit sweating:

- Try using 'normal' antiperspirants regularly. (Note; there is a difference between antiperspirants and deodorants. Antiperspirants reduce the release of sweat, deodorants mask unpleasant smells.
- Avoid clothes that more easily show up sweat marks. As a rule, white and black coloured clothes are less noticeable when wet than other colours.
- Wear loose clothing under the armpits. Avoid clothes made with manmade fibres such as Lycra and Nylon.
- Consider using dress shields (also known as armpit or sweat shields) to absorb excess sweat and protect delicate or expensive clothing. These can be obtained via the internet or the Hyperhidrosis Support Group.

If you have excessive feet sweating, it can help to:

- Change your socks at least twice a day
- Use an absorbent foot powder twice daily
- Wear a different pair of shoes on alternate days. This allows shoes to dry fully.
- Avoid sport shoes or boots.
















WHY LOVING YOURSELF ISN'T SELFISH!

GEARING UP FOR THE RING OF KERRY CYCLE

(By Cora Carrigg, Kerry Recreation and Sports Partnership)

WEEK 12 - Week Beginning June 30th -Day of Cycle: What to Bring

Hey Hey!! The Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle is just around the corner waiting for us to enjoy the experience!! I truly mean enjoy the experience as opposed to the experience daunting you! It's important to be in the right state of mind, as the event is possibly 60% mental and 40% physical. As long as you drink and eat enough, you can almost always continue riding slowly, if your mind is up to it.

So as a means of continuing on from last week's theme "what to bring — day of cycle", I'd now like to look at nutrition.

NUTRITION: Since you will be burning so many calories on the day, you will need to plan appropriately and bring food to refuel, otherwise you may hit the wall, and you don't want that to happen. So here are some tips.... **EVENING BEFORE EVENT:** It is vital that your main meal is carbohydrate based, such as a pasta meal, so as to increase the energy stores, that will be required.

MORNING OF EVENT: A pre-ride breakfast is essential, so don't even tempt of skipping this meal. Ideally the breakfast should entail porridge, weetabix or toast.

DURING EVENT: Plenty of eating and drinking throughout the ride, is essential, so don't forget! It's not a day for loosing calories! Ideally each hour a nutri grain bar should be consumed, so as to keep the required energy store levels up. A mars bar or snickers will not help the cause. In addition a water bottle should be drunk per hour. These bottles can be filled with a combination of water and a carbohydrate based drink, and drank alternatively, as previously mentioned.

NOTE: If you start to feel hungry or thirsty when you're riding, it's too late to recover. Drink before you're thirsty and eat before you're hungry. It's easy to forget to eat because you don't feel hungry and the thought of eating while riding is often unappealing. Bear in mind that granola bars and dry snacks are hard to eat while exercising due to dry consistency; hence I recommend nutri-grain.

POST EVENT: As opposed to going for the celebratory drink, it is very important to refuel within half an hour to an hour after cycling so as to replace the nutrients used up during the ride. Ideally this should be protein based, so a ham or chicken sandwich will work, and a glass of milk. Once consumed, the body will accept the celebratory drink all the better!

Be Prepared - You don't want any surprises on the day of the ring - everything should be tried and tested on your preparation rides: all food, all drink, all clothing, all gear and the bike pumped and checked the night before!

FINAL FEW WORDS OF WISDOM....

•Eat before you're hungry, drink before you're thirsty.

•Add a layer before you're cold; take one off

before you're hot.

•Stay relaxed & loose - keep your body loose and not locked in, by relaxing your shoulders and bending your elbows slightly and moving your hands on the bars.

•Ride within yourself, especially during first hour & not rush it.

•Keep your stops short and few.

Continued Exercise — So to the big guestion.... Will you continue cycling after the ring or choose to hang up the bike?!! What would persuade you to continue cycling, having fully recovered from the cycling the ring? Perhaps by focusing on the immediate rewards that physical activity provides such as the feeling of well being, happiness and enjoyment might help. Too often people focus on the long term benefits of exercise, such as weight loss, and give up because the poundage is not shifting. The immediate rewards are far more motivating that the distant rewards. Feeling happy and less stress is more motivating than not getting heart disease or cancer, maybe, someday in the future. So that's something to hear in mind

On a personal note, it has been a joy to write these articles over the past 12 weeks. I hope you the reader enjoyed and gained something from it. I would welcome and indeed love to hear feedback, so by all means drop me a line at, cora.carrigg@kerrycoco.ie - remember 2 r's and 2 g's in the name!

Due to the outlook publication being issued on Thursday's, there will be no training programme issued this week. Ideally we should be having rest days Thursday & Friday before the Ring.

I would like to send all readers the very best of wishes there are as you undertake your personal journey around the Ring of Kerry. Please bear in mind this training and event is all for local charities and the funds raised goes towards very beneficial causes.

Know Your Rights:

BACK TO SCHOOL CLOTHING AND FOOTWEAR ALLOWANCE

OUESTION

My daughter will be 18 years old in August. Can I claim the Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance for her?

ANSWER

If she is still in second-level education, you may be eligible for the Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance (BTSCFA) for her but you must apply for the Allowance and supply evidence that she is in second-level education.

The Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance helps you meet the cost of uniforms and footwear for children going to school. Your children must be aged between 4 and 22 on or before 30 September 2014. If they are aged between 18 and 22 they must be in full-time second-level education in a recognised school or college.

You must be getting a social welfare payment or taking part in a training, employment or adult education scheme. In general, you must be getting an Increase for a Qualified Child with your payment. Also, your total family income must be below a certain level for your family size. The allowance is €100 for eligible children aged between 4 and 11 and €200 for those aged between 12 and 22.

The scheme is open from 1 June to 30 September 2014. The Department of Social Protection pays BTSCFA automatically to many customers. This means that they do not have to apply for the payment. If you qualify automatically, you should get a letter stating when and how your Allowance will be paid. If you do not get an automatic payment you must apply for the Allowance. If any of your children are aged 18 or over you must apply for the Allowance for them and supply evidence that they are in second-level education (even if automatic payments have issued for other children in the family).

Application forms are available in all local social welfare offices and Intreo centres, and on the Department's website, welfare. ie. When a decision has been made on your application you will get a letter informing you of this and whether a payment has been awarded. If your application has been successful, you will also be told when and where you can collect the payment. If the Allowance is refused you can ask for a review of the decision.



The Road Safety Authority (RSA) has announced the start of a public consultation process on the future of the driving test in Ireland, 2014 also marks the 50th Anniversary of the first driving test in Ireland. The RSA is asking road-users to use the anniversary as an opportunity to voice their opinion on how the driving to test should be conducted as we reflect on the progress that has been made in road safety in Ireland over the past 50 years, and look to the challenges of the next 50 years of driver testing.

This consultation will seek the views of the public on suggested reforms to the current driving test. The public, and any interested parties, can have their say on the future of the driving test by commenting on the reforms or by making formal submissions by post or email. More details are available on www.rsa.ie. The deadline for submissions is 18th July 2014. Since March 1964, the driving test has been a rite of passage for many people, young and

old, and is today an even more critical stage

of driver education that helps to ensure we all

share the road safely.

Today, the 140,000 driving tests carried out in Ireland annually form part of the Road Safety Authority's broader driver education programme which emphasises responsible behaviour and empowerment of individuals to ensure they, and their friends and family, share the road safely. Since the RSA took charge of the test in 2006, there have been significant reforms. The new Graduated Driver Licensing system introduced mandatory driving lessons, and the driving instruction industry was regulated in 2009, where we now have 1800 Approved Driving Instructors (ADIs).

- In the year 1964, the number of road deaths was 341, compared with the reduction to 190 road deaths in 2014.
- This is despite there being an increase from 400,000 vehicles on Irish roads in 1964, to 2.4 million in 2014.
- The majority of road deaths and injuries in the 1960s were linked to alcohol, either driver

or pedestrian.

- Since then, Ireland has made great strides in changing public attitudes towards all dangerous driving practices, and in lowering the number of road deaths and serious injuries dramatically.
- France was the first country in the world to introduce a driving test in 1893.
- Our neighbours in the UK followed suit in 1935.
- The first Irish driving test took place in Parkgate St, Dublin, in March 1964, and Minister for local government Neil Blaney TD was one of the first to take the test which he passed.
- In 1964, there were five driving testers operating only from Dublin; today we have 104 testers that operate from 49 test centres nationwide.

ROAD SAFETY AUTHORITY STRESSES SAFETY TO KILLARNEY **STUDENTS**

Eileen Cunningham, Road Safety Promotion Officer with the Road Safety Authority for the Kerry and Limerick region recently paid a visit to the students of KDYS Killarney Youthreach based in the charities youth centre in fair hill. Eileen stressed safe road behaviour and positive decision making to the 20 young people in attendance.

Eileen's work is part of the RSA's commitment to bringing road safety into all communities; The new initiative is part of the RSAs Nationwide Road Safety Education Service. The RSA covered a range of topics including drink and drug driving, speeding and preparing for the driving test. These are mostly done through the "Wrecked" sessions which utilises real life stories to tell of the true consequences of the many life changing events that happen on today's roads. It features a DVD which holds 19



testimonials recorded by people who recount their experiences of reckless driving.

The KDYS Killarney Youthreach was set up in 2001 and one of the 4 Youthreach programmes run by the KDYS in partnership with the Kerry Education Training Board, in order to meet the needs of young people in Kerry who have left school early. John Adams, the Killarney programmes Co-ordinator, said; "We are delighted to have had Eileen come and speak with our students. We really hope the messages of safety on our roads will have an impact on our students and their families. The initiative

is an excellent one and we can hopefully look to have Eileen come and speak with the more KDYS programmes including youth clubs around the county"

KDYS Killarney Youthreach is a full-time educational programme offering a range of FETAC subjects allowing students to progress on to further education, training and employment. ENTERPRISE REPORT SHOWS FARM **FAMILIES TO SUFFER FROM TTIP**

IFA President Eddie Downey said farmers will be deeply suspicious about the absence of any sectoral analysis of the TTIP deal by Copenhagen Economics, which has been commissioned by the Department of Jobs and Enterprise. He expressed serious concern about the early conclusions, saying there were real risks for Irish agriculture. Unfortunately, what we have seen so far is strong on optimism, but short on supporting

He said, "The findings of the report, which have not been made available publicly, are very broad and there appears to be a complete lack of any detailed sectoral analysis. It suggests that the beef and dairy sectors would suffer, but this would be compensated for by an increase in processing output. This is shocking and confirms IFA's position that primary agricultural output would suffer, with the potential loss of thousands of jobs in rural Ireland".

Eddie Downey warned that Irish beef and dairy producers have no interest in producing cheaper raw material for the processing sector. Minister Coveney needs to challenge the report's findings. He said the Irish Government and EU negotiators must ensure that the unique standards and production systems that apply on Irish and EU family farms are not compromised in these discussions.


In a meeting with US Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack in Dublin, IFA President Eddie Downey had an open and frank discussion on the real concerns of Irish farmers over the US demands for increased volumes of US beef imports in the TTIP trade negotiations. "Equivalence of standards and end-use control of quotas will have to be strict criteria".

Agriculture cannot become the sacrificial lamb in the EU/US trade negotiations, according to Mr Downey, who said Minister Coveney and our Government must be very strong and forthright in defending the interests of Irish farmers.

The IFA President said Minister Coveney's focus of opening the US market to Irish beef and lamb is very welcome, but cannot come at too high a price on US beef imports, which have the potential to seriously damage the Irish beef sector.

In addition, Eddie Downey said Minister Coveney must also make it abundantly clear to Secretary Vilsack that Irish and European consumers will not accept any US beef produced with the use of hormones and anabolic growth additives such as ractopamine, substances banned as unsafe in the European Union.

Eddie Downey said Minister Coveney has to insist that there can be no imports from the US which fail to meet EU standards on the key issues of traceability, food safety and environmental standards. "Minister Coveney must make it clear that these are red line issues for Ireland and the EU in the TTIP negotiations."





SINN FÉIN TO TACKLE **BEEF CRISIS AT HOME** AND IN EU

Sinn Féin has announced a high-level meeting with farmers and dealers in the beef industry, where its MEPs, TDs and MLAs will discuss solutions to the crisis in the industry.

Announcing the meeting, Sinn Féin agriculture spokesperson, North Kerry TD Martin Ferris said: "The crisis in the beef industry has caused hardship and stress among producers recently and it seems that the government and Minister Simon Coveney are happy to let the market rule. The problem is that the market can be manipulated by the beef barons and by the large multiple retailers who change specification and introduce penalties at will, while the minister sits on his hands." He added: "The trade of cattle across the island is a traditional agricultural activity for centuries. This is particularly true of trade between the Six Counties and the West. Farmers and marts depend on this trade and the consequences of this trade being prevented due to the movement from what is deemed as one member state to another is detrimental for numerous beef farmers.

The only way to solve this issue practically is to secure a derogation from Europe in relation to the EU beef labelling rules, which will allow for our unique circumstances and will open the way to free trade across the island. If the government has abandoned the beef farmer, Sinn Féin has not and will we do all in our power, North and South and in the EU parliament to help Irish farmers."

The meeting with the trade will take place in Ballinasloe on 11 July 2014. Details of the full list of speakers and time and place of the meeting will be issued next week.







GREATER AWARENESS NEEDED OF DANGERS POSED BY SLURRY FUMES

Fine Gael Kerry TD, Brendan Griffin, this week raised with the Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, Simon Coveney TD, the need to take measures to warn farmers of the dangers of slurry gasses. "Already this year, there have been a number farm deaths due to slurry fumes. This is an utter tragedy and the Government needs to do everything possible to prevent any further deaths. The Minister for Agriculture has assured me of his commitment to promoting farm safety and outlined how for the last three years, a farm safety message has been included with the Single Payment application packs, which are distributed each year to over 130,000 farmers. In 2013 that farm safety message, was entirely focused on safe slurry handling with the message that 'one lungful of slurry gas can kill' and also included the list of Safe Agitation Guidelines." Mr. Griffin added: "The pilot Farm Safety Mentor Programme, launched in 2012, enables farmers to become farm safety ambassadors in their own community. This programme includes DVDs which are used by the Farm Safety Mentors and others specifically to help raise awareness of the dangers of slurry gas. There is a Health Safety Authority DVD containing emotional testimonials from individual farmers who tell us about their experiences of farm accidents which led to either fatalities or serious injury. Farms are extremely dangerous environments. Much of the silage has had its first cut at this stage thanks to the fine weather we've been enjoying for the past few weeks. It now prime time for spreading slurry and it is vital that all farmers are aware of the dangers as we do not want any more deaths on our farms."





STRONG GROWTH POTENTIAL FOR HIGH PRICE AND QUALITY IRISH LAMB IN SWEDEN AND DENMARK

IFA National Sheep Committee Chairman John Lynskey visited Sweden and Denmark to review the growth potential of Nordic market for Irish lamb exports with Bord Bia. "The Nordic market is now the third most important export market for Irish sheep meat after France and Britain, accounting for €24m worth of sheep meat exports in 2013, an increase of 20% on 2012. Sweden accounts for 75% of this market and Denmark 20%. The growth potential is substantial with the volume of Irish sheep meat to Sweden growing by 58% from 2011 to 2013." The objective of the study visit was to obtain an overview of the Danish and Swedish markets; to gain an insight into the positioning of Irish sheep meat in supermarkets; and to get the views of the meat distributors who import Irish lamb. John Lynskey said having visited the major retailers stores in both Sweden and Denmark, it is obvious Irish lamb is highly regarded when shelf placing and space allocation in comparison to

lamb from other countries and price is assessed. "Irish lamb is not used by the supermarkets in these countries as a low value/price product. Irish lamb is being sold at the higher end of the price spectrum and treated as a high quality product. This is a clear indication that the Nordic market for Irish lamb is very important in terms of a high value export destination for sheep meat." In meetings with the meat importers and distributors in the region, John Lynskey said they made it clear that consumption of sheep meat is increasing and demand for Irish lamb continues to grow, with their biggest concern being guaranteed consistent supplies from Ireland.

5 WAYS TO PREVENT DOG BITES

If we learn to understand dogs, learn their body language, and empower children with that knowledge, there will be less dog bites.

Dog Owners:

- **1.** Your dog needs to be well socialised and given plenty of exercise and mental stimulation.
- **2.** Your dog needs to receive great, humane force-free education.
- **3.** Teach your family how to be around your dog.
- **4.** Teach visitors, including all children, how to be around your dog.
- **5.** Don't judge a dog by his breed, instead observe his behaviour.

The ASPCA suggests that you have your children recite the following pledges:

- 1. I will not stare into a dog's eyes.
- 2. I will not tease dogs behind fences.
- 3. I will not go near dogs chained up in yards.
- **4.** I will not touch a dog I see loose (off-leash) outside.
- **5.** If I see a loose dog, I will tell an adult immediately.
- **6.** I will not run and scream if a loose dog comes near me.
- **7.** I will stand very still (like a tree), and will be very quiet if a dog comes near me.
- **8.** I will not touch or play with a dog while he or she is eating.
- **9.** I will not touch a dog when he or she is sleeping.
- **10.** I will only pet a dog if I have received permission from the dog's owner.
- **11.** Then I will ask permission of the dog by letting him sniff my closed hand.

ECO-FRIENDLY ACTIVITIES FOR OLDER CHILDREN

Just keep your instruction about environmental topics upbeat and suitable for your child's developmental stage. Then reinforce these ideas with fun green activities based on what kids naturally enjoy doing.

Playing. Introduce kids to online and board

games that promote ecological awareness

Earning. Hand out stickers that will eventually earn a prize to reward youthful efforts in a specific green area.

Thirst for Novelty. Coordinate a "free marketplace" where kids can swap no-longerwanted items such as used toys, books and/or clothing — with permission from their parents or guardians, of course.

Observation. Encourage 11 year-olds and older to keep a green journal, recording one new example of environmental protection (or its opposite) every day for a specific period of time. Or suggest a multi-media approach that combines writing, photos, video and whatever else the author chooses.

Decision making. Allow older children to have a voice in summer vacation and other leisure plans based on environmental impact. This will work best if you present a limited number of options to be decided upon, rather than leaving the field wide open, and are truly prepared to accept the results of a group decision.

GOOD NEWS

It is estimated that more than 110 million active landmines are scattered across 70 countries around the world. An equal number of landmines are stockpiled, waiting to be planted. These landmines remain active for decades and kill thousands of people each month ... most of them women and children. Colombia is at constant war due to antigovernment rebellions and, as a result, a lot of the area is infested with landmines. According to the International Campaign to Ban Landmines (ICBL), Colombia is the second-most mined country in the world after Afghanistan. Lemur Studio, a Bogota, Colombia-based design firm, has designed a life-saving solution called SaveOneLife. The SaveOneLife boot inserts can detect landmines from a distance of 6.5 feet. The design has already received numerous awards.

SaveOneLife is equipped with tiny microprocessors that pick up electromagnetic signals produced by a large metal object like a landmine. Embedded radio transmitters then send a message to a wristband interface.

The wristband interface alerts wearers if they come within a 6.5 foot radius of a landmine by displaying the exact location of the mine on a small screen, ruling out the need for any guesswork.

Lemur Studio is currently trying to gain muchneeded funding for the project by pitching its concept to the military. If successful, this product could soon be saving innocent peoples' lives every day.

DID YOU KNOW...

The yellow cedar is a beautiful, long-lived conifer native to Alaska and common in the Tongass National Forest. Capable of living more than 1,000 years, the cedar is prized by native Alaskan people -- for carving, medicinal and ceremonial purposes -- and by animals like Sitka deer and brown bears.

But over the past century, more than 70%

of yellow cedars have died in many parts of Alaska as climate change has melted the snow that protects the trees' fragile roots from freezing air in winter. And since these ancient trees hold massive amounts of carbon dioxide -- which means they've been helping keep climate change in check even as it has ravaged their population -- the yellow cedar's decline is yet another illustration of climate change's snowball effect.

BABY CRAWLING GEORGIA HIGHWAY SAVED BY ADDICT TURNED HERO

Bryant Collins saw what appeared to be a baby out of the corner of his eye as he was driving along Highway 72 in Carlton, slowed down, stopped and found a 15-month old infant nearly in the street.

The infant had made quite a journey, crawling over 300 yards from her parent's home, through a sloped wooded area, and ended up only a few feet from where traffic was zipping by.

Mr. Collins, who disclosed that he himself has been through quite a bit in life, was happy that he was there at the right place and time to rescue the little airl.

The self-admitted ex-convict and former drug addict called it a miracle - not that he was there to rescue the infant, but that she had crawled all that way without getting seriously injured.

Mr. Collins, an auto mechanic, said he stayed with the baby for approximately two hours while police searched for the parents.

"The baby started crying," Mr. Collins said, "so I turned my phone on and let her listen to some gospel music, and she calmed right down."

The reformed man spoke of his past, and the changes he made: "I did ten years in the federal institution for manufacturing cocaine. When I was in prison, I made a very conscientious effort to change, and I did."

The authorities were told by the girl's mother that she and her husband "left the house and their other children, ages 13, 9 and 5, were supposed to be watching the baby."

The father approached while deputies were investigating and was arrested and charged with child cruelty, reckless conduct and obstruction.

MOOSE MILK

Have an upset stomach? Maybe you should head over to the Russian city of Kostroma about four hours outside of Moscow - and try a glass of warm, salty, moose milk.

Carefully drawn from the teats of these northern giants, this pine-scented delicacy is renowned in the area as a cure for peptic ulcers. High in butterfat (usually coming in at around 10%), loaded with double the amount of essential amino acids as cow's milk and full of lypozyme – an enzyme that kills ulcer-creating bacteria - the slightly acidic milk has been used

by Kostroma's Ivan Susanin Sanatorium as a treatment for an array of diseases and disorders for over 30 years.

The sanatorium – an alternative therapy retreat for people suffering from gastrointestinal diseases – sources their entire milk supply from the nearby Sumarokovo Moose Farm. Originally established in 1966 and designed to house over 800 moose, the government-owned farm is now home to just under 30 animals.

Much like reindeer husbandry in Sweden, Norway and other northern countries, the moose at Sumarokovo farm spend most of their time freely grazing in the forests surrounding the area. During calving season – late May to early June - Sumarokovo's cows return to the farm lured by the promise of tasty oats to have their young.

Within a week of delivery, while the calves are busy frolicking with tourists, (at five days old they can already run faster than the average adult human) Sumarokovo's dairymaids begin harvesting the precious milk. On average, a female moose can produce between 1 and 6 litres of milk per day.

Once a moose becomes comfortable with the dairymaids she will often allow bilateral milking while devouring 2 Buckets of oats in the milking stall.

The farm is the most stable moose-milk provider for medication in Russia, but it is far from economically profitable and remains open largely as a tourist attraction, it is also an ecological education centre and gives the unique opportunity of immediate intercommunication between people and these intelligent forest animals and it is a centre of conservation, it allows reproduction, resettlement and number restoration.

WEARING TROUSERS DATES FROM AT LEAST 3500 YEARS **AGO**

The remains of two men believed to be nomadic herders were recently excavated from tombs in western China dated back to between 3,300 and 3,000 years ago, making their trousers the oldest known examples of this apparel.

With straight-fitting legs and a wide crotch, the ancient wool trousers resemble modern riding pants, says a team led by archaeologists Ulrike Beck and Mayke Wagner of the German Archaeological Institute in Berlin. The discoveries, uncovered in the Yanghai graveyard in China's Tarim Basin, support previous work suggesting that nomadic herders in Central Asia invented pants to provide bodily protection and freedom of movement for horseback journeys and mounted warfare.

Previously, Europeans and Asians wore gowns, robes, tunics, togas or — as observed on the 5,300-year-old body of Ötzi the Iceman — a three-piece combination of loincloth and individual leggings.

A dry climate and hot summers helped

preserve human corpses, clothing and other organic material in the Tarim Basin. More than 500 tombs have been excavated there since the early 1970s.

Earlier research on mummies from several Tarim Basin sites, led by Mair, identified a 2,600-year-old individual known as Cherchen Man who wore burgundy trousers probably made of wool. Trousers of Scythian nomads from West Asia date to roughly 2,500 years ago. The two trouser-wearing men entombed at Yanghai were roughly 40 years old and had probably been warriors as well as herders. One man was buried with a decorated leather bridle, a wooden horse bit, a battle-axe and a leather bracer for arm protection. Among objects placed with the other body were a whip, a decorated horse tail, a bow sheath and a bow.

Each pair of trousers was sewn together from three pieces of brown-coloured wool cloth, one piece for each leg and an insert for the crotch. The tailoring involved no cutting, finished pants included side slits, strings for fastening at the waist and woven designs on the legs.

THE U.S. OUT THROWS BILLION WORTH UNWANTED FISH EVERY YEAR

Not all of the marine creatures that fishermen trap in their nets end up on plates. American fisheries discard about 20 billion pounds of the fish they catch every year. Discarded marine bounty is known as bycatch—fish or other marine species, such as turtles and crabs that are unintentionally caught in fishermen's nets meant for certain other kinds and sizes of fish. Bycatch is either brought to port and thrown out there, or tossed overboard while the fishing vessel is still at sea.

In its report, Oceana estimated the value of certain kinds of fish using the volume discard and the market price of a specific species. In the Southeast U.S. in 2010, fisheries tossed out \$45 million in sea trout, \$27 million in red snapper, \$4.2 million in king mackerel, and \$3.4 million in bluefin tuna. Every year, fisheries in the New England and the Mid-Atlantic region chuck more than \$20 million in sea scallops, \$13.5 million in flounder, and \$7 million in monkfish. In Alaska, fishermen throw out Pacific halibut, cod, and snow and red king crabs when they don't have to meet catch quotas for those species. In California, Oregon, and Washington, fisheries regularly toss spiny lobster, rockfish, and sea bass.

Researchers have long argued that bycatch is a chronic problem with economic consequences for both national and global fishing industries. In 1994, the Food and Agriculture Organisation found that bycatch was costing the U.S. fishing industry billions of dollars. In 2009, the World Bank determined that bycatch mismanagement and overfishing cost the global economy \$50 billion every year
