# SOUTH KERRY PLOUGHING CHAMPIONSHIPS LAUNCHED

THE South Kerry Ploughing Championships and Harvest Show, a hugely popular charity event that turns back the clock and looks to the future on the same day, will take place on Sunday, September 3. Organised by Killarney Valley Classic and Vintage and now in its fourth year, the day-long event will take place on Fleming's Farm at Grenagh, Fossa, Killarney. This year's show was officially launched at a reception in the Innisfallen Hotel at the weekend by Kerry County Council Chief Executive Moira Murrell and teenage entrepreneur Jack Nagle, a prizewinner at the Young Scientists exhibition with his invention of a safety lock for tractors that engages the handbrake automatically.

Also in attendance were Mayor of Kerry, Cllr John Sheahan and Mayor of Killarney, Cllr Niall Kelleher. Speaking at the launch, Killarney Valley Classic and Vintage Chairman, Tom Leslie, said since it was started in 2014, the event has generated tens of thousands of euro for local charities and, at this stage, the club has contributed close on €100,000 to worthy causes. This year's beneficiaries will be the Kerry branch of the Irish Kidney Association, Down Syndrome Kerry, the Irish Pilgrimage Trust and the Kerry-Cork Health Link Bus.

"A massive attraction this year is that the event will incorporate the National Rally of the Irish Vintage Society, showcasing Ireland's great heritage, and this year's show will also feature a round of the Irish Tractor Pulling Championships which is always a great

spectacle," Tom told the Killarney Outlook.

Several food zones will be on site at this year's South Kerry Ploughing Championships and Harvest Show

The Irish Red Cross is calling for Kerry to celebrate its unpaid Carers by nominating them for the 2017 Irish Red Cross Carer of the Year Award. The award is open to any member of the public currently providing voluntary care.

Previous winners include men and women from around the country who provide care for loved ones that are ill, vulnerable or living with a restrictive disability. Last year's winner, Vincent Callaghan from Roscommon, has cared for his two children all their lives. Whilst in 2015, Bernie O'Reilly from Cavan, has cared for her son Damien who has cerebral palsey for more than 30 years.

Pat Carey, Chairman of the Irish Red Cross, praised Ireland's Carers, "Unpaid Carers offer a standard of living to sick and vulnerable members of the community that would be impossible without their selfless commitment. It is essential that both Carers and care recipients are recognised and supported members of our communities and of society as a whole."

As part of its Health and Social Care programme, the Irish Red Cross offers a range of resources and services for Carer's in Ireland. Services include a Carers Handbook, 'Helping You to Care' course, Therapeutic Hand Care services and free First Aid app. The Irish Red Cross are currently in the process of developing a Carers app, aimed at helping carers and family members care for the most vulnerable.

#### Allocation of funding & Motions from July Killarney MD meeting. **Allocation of Funding**

Cllr. Brendan Cronin wishes to confirm that he have paid €3,500 from his allocations fund, for the provision of a solar powered Speed limit indicator on the R563 on the Milltown side of the Aghadoe junction at the German Flats, in an effort to improve driver awareness of the dangerous junction and location ahead. This will be put in place in the coming weeks.

Cllr B Cronin. To request Irish Water to provide a new water main on the public road at Green Lane, Killarney as the existing supply is under or at the rear of homes in private property which causes major problems when there is a

Reply. There are 6 houses at the far end of the Cul de Sac Green Lane in Killarney which are served by a 75mm asbestos cement pipe, laid in the 40s/50s. The water main is laid in the back garden of the houses, the extensions for which are built over the old pipe. There have been 2 breaks on this pipe to date in 2017. Accordingly, it will be necessary 50mt of new main along the public road in front of the houses and also to reconnect/re-plumb the 13mm service connections to each of the 6 houses from the front. The Council will make a submission for the funding, provisionally estimated between €15,000 and €18,000, to Irish Water.

Cllr B Cronin. To ask that all Group Schemes

supplied by Irish Water in the Killarney Municipal District be taken over by Irish Water. Reply. There are 62 such Group Schemes in Kerry, 6 of which are in the Killarney MD, which have applied (prior to the introduction of Irish Water in 2014) for take over by Kerry County Council. Irish Water has recently developed a protocol to facilitate the take over of Group Schemes. Among the impediments to any such takeovers are the generally poor states of the ageing pipe networks of these group schemes. It was agreed to support the group schemes that wish to be taken over by IW.

Cllr B Cronin. Have the drawings for the proposed wheelchair accessible extensions to the public toilets in the High Street Car Park been examined by representatives of the disability sector and when will the works be put out to tender.

Reply. This extension has bee designed in accordance with the required standards for accessibility and will be constructed in consultation with representatives of the disability sector. The procurement process has commenced.

Cllr B Cronin. What steps have Kerry County Council taken to solve the disgraceful dumping of rubbish in Aghadoe Cemetery.

Reply. Kerry County Council have temporarily removed the skip from Aghadoe Cemetery, and has replaced this with a large wheelie bin which is currently being emptied on a much more

regular basis. Consultation is taking place with the Graveyard Committee to establish the best method for catering for waste generated from the graveyard. However any illegal dumping will be investigated in the normal manner by the Environment Section. If dumping is ongoing, surveillance measures

will be considered at this location.

Cllr B Cronin. When will a caretaker be appointed for Aglish Cemetery as it is almost 5 months since the retirement of the previous caretaker. Reply. Interviews were held recently for the position of caretaker for Aglish Cemetery and it is anticipated that the successful applicant will be appointed shortly.

# MULTI LINGUAL WALKERS ENJOY THE FOLKLORE AND HERITAGE ALONG THE KERRY WAY

Anyone walking along the stretch of the Kerry Way between Lord Brandon's Cottage and the Bride Valley on Saturday last could be forgiven for wondering which country exactly they were in given the multi-lingual tones that were to be heard along the route.

This was all to do with a walk organised by the Kerry Folklore Group (Béaloideas Chiarraí) aimed at promoting the multilingual Kerry Way Folklore & Heritage App but also coincided with a major announcement in relation to the next phase of this project. The app, which currently covers the stretch of the Kerry Way between Lord Brandon's Cottage and Glencar, provides users with the opportunity to learn about the heritage and important archaeological sites along the route. SKDP chairperson Gloria O'Driscoll said that the partnership was delighted to support the project through the RDP (LEADER) Programme as well as through the INTERREG Rural Alliances project while Frank Heffernan of the Department of Social Protection said they were delighted to have supported the project development through having their CE scheme workers involved. The Kerry Folklore (Béaloideas Chiarraí) initiative is

also supported by the Kerry County Council's Heritage Department and by the Trustees of Muckross house. Before the walkers set off on the route, SKDP CEO Noel Spillane broke the excellent news that the Kerry Folklore project application for circa €20,000 in funding under the 2014-2020 Rural Development (LEADER) Programme to enable the app cover the remaining sections of the Kerry Way had been successful. Kerry Group's Frank Hayes then announced that they would again be delighted to provide the match funding to enable the completion of the project. This news added a spring to the step of all the walkers in attendance.

# FOOD FESTIVAL LAUNCH "SALTED GRASS" BEEF AND LAMB

A local initiative launched in Dingle this week aims to establish a lucrative market for locally raised "salted grass" beef and lamb. The project draws together a number of special attributes that are found in West Kerry and no where else. These include Dingle's status as the Foodie town capital of Ireland, the extraordinarily high calibre of chefs who work in Dingle, the native expertise of local farmers and not least the unique flavour imparted to meat by grass that is well salted by the Atlantic. The project grew out of the farmer's Forum meetings held during the annual Dingle Food festival. Chef's Martin and Mark along with progressive farmer Colum Murphy, John Benny Moriarty, Louis Murchan and Joan Maguire put together a strategy for developing and marketing the unique salted grass fed quality of West Kerry Beef and Lamb. The objective of this project is to try and reconnect the farmer with the customer again and hopefully he too can feel the benefit of tourism. it's also to encourage the bar, butcher and restaurant owner to source their beef and/or lamb locally. The success of "Blasket Island Lamb"

indicates that the meat produced here is of a high quality and that people will travel to purchase it." As a pilot project the rearing of 6 heifers was put in the capable hands of PobalScoil transition year students, Darragh Murphy, Louis Murchan, Sean Brosnan, Dara May, Gavin Mc Carthy and Maurice Kelliher, guided by farmer Colum Murphy and their teacher Lís Feirtear. With the help of an interest free loan and business support from Comhar Chreidhmheasa Chorca Dhuibhne the lads bought the animals and raised them on Colum's farm. In doing so they showed not only the potential of West Kerry beef but the potential of West Kerry young fellas as progressive farmers. The first of those heifers was slaughtered, the meat aged for 28 days and is now presented to potential buyers.

This event coincides with the launch of the 2017 Dingle Food Festival at which meat from the remaining heifers will be for sale, both as meat and as cooked products. The chefs will work with the young farmers on developing a suitable range of dishes, that will allow them bring their animals

# PARENTS FACE HIGH BACK TO SCHOOL COSTS

As children enjoy their freedom from school, parents are already preparing to shoulder the burden of the back to school spend which has now averaged €1,209 per child. That's according to the Irish League of Credit Unions latest research of its annual Back to School Costs Survey. The nationwide survey again shows clearly that school related costs continue to be a financial burden for the majority (72%) of parents with 29% saying they will get into debt because of it. One in four say they will be forced to deny their children certain Back to School basics this year because they cannot afford them, while a significant 29% say they will get into debt over the back to school spend.

Commenting on this year's findings, Helen Courtney Power Chairperson, Chapter 23 - Kerry and West Limerick Credit Unions Marketing Group said "It is somewhat encouraging to see that more parents than ever are funding the back to school spend through their monthly income, with a fall in the numbers getting into debt. However it's clear that the back to school spend is still so much of a financial burden on parents that they are forced to deny their children some basic items, as well as sacrifice spending on family holidays and even food. While the rise in numbers using moneylenders was marginal, we would find any increase like this concerning and would really encourage parents to instead talk to their local credit union, where interest rates are fair and capped by law. She added "Credit Unions have always been on hand to provide financial assistance to parents as they try to manage these annual costs and ease the financial burden. We encourage parents who know they will need to borrow, to talk to your credit union before considering a credit card or a moneylender, our interest rates are lower and more affordable. We also ensure that the loan terms are structured in a way to suit every individual situation best".

#### **KILLARNEY FRIARY 150 YEARS**

August marks the 150th anniversary of the Friary's first Mass which took place on on the 2nd August 1867 at 11am. They will have Dutch, English, German and Irish Friars coming to Killarney, and they will also welcome national and international Novices as a result of their new status. The friary continues to play a positive role in the town, SouthWest counselling was started back in 1994, and in 1999 the friars handed their old building over to the KDYS which does an enormous amount of good work for young people locally.





King Puck is set to return to his throne this August~

Killorglin's Puck Fair is Ireland's original and oldest 'Gathering Festival'. This year's festival, which runs August 10th, 11th, and 12th, promises as always to be fun-filled and uniquely entertaining. The age-old celebration revolves around the crowning of a wild mountain goat as King in honour of a tradition and heritage that ispurported to be ancient, but can only officially be traced back as far back as 1613 when King James I issued a charter granting legal status to the existing fair in Killorglin. The main coronation ceremony occurs on day one of the festival, otherwise known as 'Gathering Day'. One of the VIP guests at the festival will be this year's Queen of Puck Fair, Caitlin Horgan of Scoil Mhuire in Killorglin. Caitlin will be joined by her Lady-in-Waiting, Lily-Sue Eyers, a pupil of Douglas National School on the outskirts of Killorglin. Following the ceremony, the Puck King and his Queen make their way through Killorglin, granting residents and visitors alike the 'Freedom of the Town' for the duration of the festival and this marks the beginning of three-days of entertainment, music,pageantry and tradition. As for the highlights of the festival's opening day, the 2017 parade promises to be a kaleidoscope of colourful floats and entertainers. Long-running Chairman of Puck Fair Declan Mangan, having worked as Chairman of the voluntary committee for 30 years, was quick to point out why he is hugely proud of his important role, saying: "There's a reason I keep returning to this post year in, year out - it's a hugely important part of Killorglin's past and present and it is a great deal of fun. I get such a thrill out of seeing visitors flock to the town each August to witness the crowning of King Puck and to see what our beautiful town has to offer. It brings locals and tourists together and highlights Killorglin as an important focal point within the Irish



tourism industry." Commenting on what visitors can expect, Mr. Mangan added; "Highlights of this year's Puck Fair festival include musical entertainment on the town square stage to be provided by Brass & Co (Thursday 10th August), The Elvis Spectacular Show (Friday 11th August) and The Ultimate Garth Brooks Experience (Saturday 12thAugust). There will also be a wide range of children's entertainment taking place in the town across the three days of the festival as well as market stalls, street performances and a host of activities for all the family. Information and updates on this can be found at www.puckfair.ie in the lead up to the festival and we look forward to having you all there." Now over 400 years old, Puck Fair is one of Ireland's most ancient traditional celebrations. The festival revolves around the coronation of a wild mountain goat, fondly and famously known as 'King Puck', who is crowned by The Queen of Puck; traditionally a young girl from a local primary school. There are many legends surrounding the origins of the Fair, with one particularly popular tale suggesting that it began during the Cromwellian conquest of Ireland in the 17th century, when a wild goat broke away from its herd to warn the people of Killorglin of an impending attack. While the foundations of the historical Fair have remained for centuries, the festival itself has changed and evolved over the years to create the version of Puck Fair as we know it today. From yearly rituals such as the Horse Fair and the all-important public crowning of King Puck to street performances, musical acts and endless children's entertainment, people of all ages visiting the charming Kerry town at this special time of year can expect a truly memorable experience.



# **FOCUS ON BULBS**

Even though it is still early August, you can start thinking about planting bulbs.

Most bulbs are suitable for growing in containers especially the likes of tulips, daffodils, lilies and aliumns. When planting up a container or window box with bulbs plant them at about three times their depth and about one bulb width apart and don't forget to water them especially when the foliage is on and they are growing. When planting bulbs in the garden dig over the area well where you are planting and add some compost. Always plant your bulbs in groups of about six depending on the type of bulbs. If you would like to add some colour to some areas of the garden for Spring and into summer, it would be advisable to grow your bulbs now in small pots and grow them on until early spring. You can then plant them in their pots in the areas you want and after flowering you can dig them up and keep them until next spring. A good dwarf daffodil for this is Tete-a-

#### INCOME TAX EXEMPTION FOR LONG-TERM LAND LEASING

Income derived from leasing land on a long-term lease may be exempt from tax up to certain thresholds. Leases between close relatives do not qualify and to qualify a lease of farm land must be in writing or evidenced in writing and for a definite term of 5 years or more.

#### Qualifying lease taken out from 1 January 2007 to 31 December 2014

For periods up to 31 December 2014 an individual aged 40 years or over, or an individual who is permanently incapacitated by mental or physical infirmity from carrying on a trade of farming, may be entitled to an exemption from income tax of certain income arising from leasing of farm land.

The amount of the relief, (subject to the maximum limit) is allowed as follows:

- €20,000 where the lease / leases are for a term of at least 10 years
- €15,000 where the lease/ leases are for a term of at least 7 years
- €12,000 of annual leasing income where the lease/leases are for a term of at least 5 years

#### ases entered into on or after January 1, 2015

With effect from 1 January 2015 the age restriction and the requirement to be permanently incapacitated were removed, the amount of income that may be exempted under a qualifying long term lease was increased and a fourth threshold introduced for lease periods of 15 or more years with income of up to €40,000 being exempted.

- €40,000 where all the qualifying leases are for 15 years or more,
   €30,000 where all the qualifying leases are for 10 but less than 15 years,

# JOB DONE AS ERRATIC KERRY CLINCH SEMI-FINAL BERTH

KERRY O'SHEA REPORTS FROM KERRYS ALL IRELAND QUARTER FINAL CLASH WITH GALWAY IN CROKE PARK

#### **KERRY 1-18 GALWAY 0-13**

Kerry's remarkable run of results in the All-Ireland SFC Quarter-finals continued when they recorded an easy victory over Galway at Croke Park last Sunday.

Kerry were always expected to win this game but Connacht runners-up Galway, who stunned Donegal the previous week, had high hopes of recording their first win over Kerry in 52 years. However, it was not to be as Eamonn Fitzmaurice's side won comfortably in the finish. Since the quarter-finals began in 2001, Kerry have won on 14 occasions, drawing once and losing just twice, to Down in 2010 and Donegal in 2012.

The game never rose to any great heights and at times, it looked as if we were witnessing a challenge game rather than an All-Ireland quarter-final. Kerry manager Eamonn Fitzmaurice was not happy with some aspects of Kerry's play,

which he described as 'sloppy'

"Any day you win an All-Ireland quarterfinal by eight points and you're still in the championship and going into a semi-final, you have to be happy. There were aspects of our performances, patches where we didn't play well and periods as well when we were sloppy. Overall look it's a case of job done." In an erratic display, Kerry kicked eleven wides, the same as Galway. It was noteworthy too that Kerry conceded four goal scoring opportunities to their opponents who failed to convert any and this is something that Manager Eamon Fitzmaurice will have to address ahead of the semi-final clash with either Mayo or Roscommon who replay on Monday in Croke Park.

Damien Comer, Galway's target man at fullforward, was denied on two occasions, once just before half-time when Fionn Fitzgerald's leg prevented a certain goal while Kerry keeper Brian Kelly denied the Galway number 14 with a fine stop in the second half, one of a number of excellent saves the Legion man made on the day.

The Kerry bench again contributed handsomely to the winning margin, with Barry John Keane, Stephen O'Brien and the returning Jack Savage scoring five points between them.

Kerry's goalkeeper Brian Kelly had a superb game and made a number of fine saves and

timely interventions.

The Killarney Legion man marshalled his defences well and proved why he is number one in the county at the moment with a very solid display between the sticks.

Paul Murphy was eager throughout, ready for work and covered acres of Croke Park and added to his performance by scoring two fine points one in each half.

Kieran Donaghy was outstanding at fullforward despite the close attentions of Galway full-back Declan Kyne and sub David Walsh who could not cope with his huge physique and aerial threat.

Donaghy is super-fit at the moment and he proved it with a fantastic work rate throughout the game. Donaghy's goal in the 14th minute was a thing of beauty when he rose spectacularly to meet a long David Moran ball before firing to the net past a helpless Bernard Power.

James O'Donoghue did not have one of his better days at headquarters. The Legion man was well shackled, scored just one point from a free during the game and was replaced by Jack Savage in the 46th minute.

Eamonn Fitzmaurice conceded afterwards that O'Donoghue carried a knock into the game but was fit enough to start.

Kerry led 1-10 to 0-8 at the break with scores from Kieran Donaghy (1-1), Paul Geaney (3), Paul Murphy and Johnny Buckley (0-2 each) and one each from James O'Donoghue and Donnchadh Walsh.

Galway's total came from Ian Burke (0-4), Sean Armstrong (0-2) and one each from Shane

Walsh and Michael Daly. SECOND HALF Galway resumed in determined fashion and Kerry keeper Brian Kelly had to be alert to deny Damien Comer a second time in the 36th minute. Sean Armstrong landed a point for Galway as the westerners tried to eat into Kerry's lead. However, Kerry were comfortable without ever being stretched too much and when Paul Murphy landed his second score in the 46th minute, the Kingdom led by 1-11 to 0-10. David Moran and Sean Armstrong exchanged points before Kerry stretched away with a string of scores from subs Jack Savage, Stephen O'Brien and Paul Geaney.

Ian Burke from a free landed a rare score for Galway but Kerry

finished strongly with scores from Stephen O'Brien, his second and a brace from Barry John Keane.

Kerry must now await either Mayo or Roscommon who replay their All-Ireland quarter-final in Croke Park next Sunday in the semi-final. The All-Ireland semi-final takes place on Sunday August 19th.

# KERRY JUNIORS FACE MEATH IN THE ALL IRELAND FINAL

#### JOHN O'LEARY, KERRY GAA LOOKS AHEAD PRO TO **TOMORROW'S GAME**

Kerry Junior footballers will hoping to win three All Ireland titles on the trot for their county when they take on Meath in the final at O'Moore Park Portlaoise on Saturday next. Kerry have dominated this competition over the past four years and have now ioined Cork at the top of the roll of honour with seventeen titles. In contrast Meath have won the competition five times the last of which was back in 2003. The Leinster champions have defeated the likes of Kildare. Wexford and Louth in Leinster and then British champions Kilkenny in the semi final and certainly have had a far tougher route to the final than their opponents on Saturday.

Kerry of course were never tested by Limerick in their opening game but they did get a pretty good test of the character and football ability from Cork in Páirc Uí Rinn before they eventually gained another Munster title following an extra time victory. In the semi final in the Gaelic Grounds a couple of weeks back, Kerry had it all their own way for long periods of the game with Leitrim and they never looked like they were going to lose despite a sub-standard performance.

Kerry have plenty players with experience of the big occasion given that seven players have previously won Junior All Ireland medals; James Walsh and Conor Cox won All Irelands in 2012 and 2015 while Jack McGuire, Brendan O'Sullivan, Philip O'Connor, Jeff O'Donoghue and Killian Spillane were also on the 2015 winning side. In addition, five players from the starting fifteen, Michael Foley, Daniel O'Brien, Roibeard Ó Sé, Killian Spillane and Tomás Ó Sé have won All Ireland Minor medals during the last three years. The fact that many of them have played together previously on winning championship teams has to be a big advantage.

Meath footballers are tough and generally do not stand on ceremony and any side that has come through a stern test of their ability thus far will not give in too

easily. The Kerry management team of trainer Jimmy Keane (Brosna) and selectors Pól Ó Cúinn (An Ghaeltacht), John O'Connell (Tarbert) and Niall O'Mahony (Spa) will certainly want more from their charges than the form displayed against Leitrim and a good strong team like Meath is sure to bring the best out of them. Throw-in for the game is 3pm, referee is John Hickey of Carlow and extra time will be played in the event of a draw. The game is the second in a double bill that sees Kerry and Louth minors in action in the All Ireland Minor Ouarter Final.





#### IS THERE ANY HOPE COW URINE REPLACE CHEMICAL FERTILISER IN IRELAND?

In India the cows' uses in dairying and agricultural purposes such as ploughing, transportation, manure and pest repellents are well-known. Dried cow dung (Gobar) is used prolifically in rural India as fuel for fire and a

power resource. Environment friendly Gobar Gas Plants across rural India are helping save the ozone layer and global warming.

Members of a farmers club in Tamil Nadu established in 2010 began collecting Cow urine from their animals that were housed at night for an agricultural trial, the result was so successful that farmers are now selling this bio fertilizer to non cow owning farmers.

The continuous trials proved that at a rate of 100 litres of cow urine to one acre of land that after analysis of the soil it was found that there was no any deficiency of micro nutrients. Colour of leaves was more greenish than with chemical urea application. Residual effect of cow urine is more pronounced in next cropping.. It creates good environment in soil for earthworm growth improving soil texture. 10-12 days after spraying on crops it worked as an insecticide. It helped as growth promoters of plants. Due to use of cow urine in groundnut crops, leaves didn't show yellowish discoloration which is seen every year. As compared to previous year farmers had got good returns in both the size of yield and income. Chili production increased up to 10%.. Maize which was cultivated in waste land showed 15% increased production. A summary of the report states: After regular use of cow urine in the crops farmers have found that soil microorganism has increased along with the crop production. It has also improved the soil texture and structure. There was no occurrence of any insect pest and diseases .Cow urine works as growth promoters.

The trials also proved that if cow urine is used in field continuously for three years then there will be no need of chemical fertilizer.

The composition of Cows Urine used was = Water - 95%: Urea - 2.5%: Minerals, Hormones, Salts & Enzymes - 2.5%. The crops tested were: cotton, groundnut, maize, caster and chilies.

#### THE 'PURRFECT' MAYOR HAS PASSED AWAY

Stubbs the cat, the rusty orange Mayor of Talkeetna in Alaska, died in his sleep on the night of July 20th at the age of just over 20

"No one could imagine the notoriety that Stubbs had," the family said. "Over 75% of visitors asked, 'Where's the Mayor?' or came in saying 'I have an appointment with the mayor', but due to his age he had to begin to slow down in 2015 and more so last year, though he'd still occasionally hop up on the West Rib Bar and Grill counter (also owned by the Spone Family) for his margarita glass full of water and

Over the years, Stubbs survived a BB gun shooting, a dog attack, an unplanned trip on a garbage truck, and a fall into a fryer vat not in use at the time.

Last summer, the family brought home two kittens, including Stubbs' eventual successor as store cat and "mayor," Denali, who is sociable and will pose with anyone for a photo, or just let you carry him around like a baby his carers

#### MAKING ECO-FRIENDLY AND CHEAP FURNITURE USING WEED THAT OTHERWISE DESTROYS **FORESTS**

In the year 2000 Maya Mahajan, a PhD scholar from Coimbatore (also known as Kovai) a city in the south Indian state of Tamil Nadu, was researching the impact of invasive alien weeds on native flora and ecology in various forests. During her research, Maya came to know about lantana camara -, an exotic weed of South American origin - which was invading different forest areas and posing a serious threat to the native vegetation in Western Ghats.

Getting rid of the lantana weed was a little tricky as the use of chemicals to remove the shrub could affect the native species of plants too, and mechanical methods of removal are too expensive. After years of trying to think of a possible solution to remove these plants as well as helping the local community in Siruvani Maya had the idea that as lantana looks exactly like bamboo but was more durable than it, mabey furniture could be made out of it. However, she never had the right support and financial backing.

It was when she joined as an associate professor at the Centre for Sustainable Future at Amrita University, Coimbatore, and wrote a project report about how lantana can be used to make furniture and help the local tribal community with some extra income that the project was fully funded and Maya's idea started to take shape in 2015.

The first and foremost challenge to start the project was to convince the tribal community to get the lantana weeds from the forest as elephant attacks were very common in the area. It was only when V Vellachi, a resident of Chadivayilpathy, along with seven other women volunteered for training, that others followed suit. The next challenge was to get permission from the forest department to cut and get these weeds to the villages, permission was granted when the forest department came to know about this easy way of removing the weed, which was a difficult task for them.

In December 2015 a 3 month project was funded by the department of science and technology to train around 40 residents of three villages in making low- cost furniture, handicraft, toys and other utility articles using lantana wood.

Making furniture out of lantana is quite different from the usual way furniture is made. After the shrub is chopped off, its wood is treated in boiling water with chemicals to make it flexible. The bark is removed and the log is sliced into sticks before it is assembled into furniture pieces.

The furniture looks exactly like the bamboo or cane furniture, but is more durable. The cost of lantana furniture is also much less than bamboo furniture as the raw material is available for free. "Everyone was sceptical about the idea in the beginning. Once the products were ready after so much effort from the villagers, I was worried



about the marketing. But one year down the line we had advance orders and now we are worried about how we will finish the orders,"

#### A MAN BUILT A \$550 STAIRCASE FOR A PARK AFTER CITY ESTIMATED IT WOULD COST \$65,000

When several community members of Etobicoke, Ontario had fallen down or gotten injured on the rocky Tom Riley Park path, local citizens contacted the city for a price estimate on a staircase.

Much to their dismay, the city said that eight steps would cost taxpayers anywhere from CA\$65,000 (€44,250) to CA\$150,000 (€102,000). So, Adi Astl who is in his seventies decided to build the installation himself.

With several other neighbours offering to help finance the stairs, Mr. Astl hired a homeless man to assist with the project. Within a matter of hours, they had built eight steps for roughly CA\$550 (€375).

Mayor John Tory emphasised that citizens can't modify public spaces simply because they don't like the way things are and added that the park already has a more accessible path further past the new staircase - visitors simply used the rocky trail as a shortcut at their own risk.

However, city council members are now saying that instead of tearing down the staircase to build a new one, workers will most likely improve upon Mr. Astl's installation for significantly less money than the original official project.

#### LAST SURVIVING CAST MEMBER FROM 'GONE WITH THE WIND' CELEBRATED A VERY IMPORTANT BIRTHDAY

It has almost been 80 years since Vivian Leigh and Clark Gable dazzled Hollywood in the 1939 award-winning film Gone with the Wind. Though the two leads have since died, the actress behind another principle character celebrated her 101st birthday on July 1st.

Ms. De Havilland played Melanie Wilkes in Gone with the Wind, cousin and wife to Scarlett O'Hara's Ashley Wilkes.

Though Ms. de Havilland was a supporting role in Gone with the Wind, she made a name for herself through the film, (which is still the highest-grossing film of all time in both the U.S. and Canada) appearing in 49 feature films, and was one of the leading movie stars during the golden age of Classical Hollywood and won two Academy Awards for best leading actress, the first for To Each His Own (1946) and the second for The Heiress (1949).

The actress was the sister of Joan Fontaine, another Hollywood superstar, who won the Academy Award for best leading actress for her role in Alfred Hitchcock's Suspicion (1941). The women are the only sisters to both win the prestigious award.

Ms. De Havilland's birthday came just one day after the 81st anniversary of the novel Gone with the Wind, on which the film is based was published. The book was written by Margaret Mitchell and released on June 30th, 1936.



Last week we looked at the many ways we can raise our selfesteem and begin to feel better about ourselves. We also identified how these patterns of low self-esteem can start very early in life - and thus it makes sense that we think about developing and promoting self-esteem in childhood. Parents and caregivers can do this by encouraging their children and making sure they feel loved, secure and competent.

Children who are scared to try new things and speak negatively about themselves may have low self-esteem. They tend to give up easily or wait for someone else to do the task for them. They can also be overly critical and easily disappointed in themselves. They tend to view temporary problems as permanent and can be pessimistic. In contrast, children with healthy self-esteem are comfortable in social settings and enjoy interacting with others. They enjoy working independently as well as interacting in groups. They work towards finding a solution when faced with a challenge and don't put themselves down. They are generally more optimistic and know their strengths and weaknesses.

To help build your child's confidence, encourage your child to take healthy risks. Allow them to take (age-appropriate) chances, make choices and take responsibility for them. When children make their own age-appropriate choices this empowers themand gives them a sense of control over their bodies.

Children also need opportunities to demonstrate their competence and feel that they make a valuable contribution. This can mean asking them to help out at home - by setting the table or dusting. Encouraging them to take on tasks that they show particular interest in is a great way to boost their confidence. Teach your child to set goals and take pride in their accomplishments. It is important to ensure that their goals are within reach and at an appropriate level for their ability. However, if your child tries and doesn't succeed, this is a fantastic opportunity for you as parent to help build their self-esteem. Let them know that no matter what the result, your love is unconditional. Encourage them to try and

Overly praising a child is not the way to develop their self-esteem and confidence. Confidence comes from them trying, failing and trying again. If we tell them they are doing a 'terrific job' whatever they do, this confuses children and they learn not to trust their own instincts. However when praise is appropriate, specific and earned it is a valuable self-esteem builder.

(Read it yourself in 1st Timothy 4:1-4) People who call themselves servants of God are actually being used by demons to spread Satan's heresies. This has been his plan from the beginning, it started in Heaven when he rebelled against God, and then to Adam and Eve, and then down to rest of humanity's generations. 
