WHITE TAILED EAGLES HAVE SPREAD THEIR WINGS

This year's crop of six young White-tailed Sea Eagle chicks are now busy exploring the wider world around them as they break their ties with their parents and learn to fend for themselves. After taking flight for the first time in July, at 11-14 weeks old, the youngsters are now proficient fliers so it came as no surprise when one was spotted by a local farmer on Inis Meáin in the Aran Islands. Others have dispersed to south-west Kerry and east Galway.

Meanwhile the last straggler to leave home, 'Eddie' the Glengarriff chick, is yet to make the move out while his parents continue to feed him. Both parents and chick have been thrilling local boatmen and tourists. Soon however the pair will begin gearing up for the next breeding season so it will be interesting to see when and where Eddie goes to when he finally makes the move away.

The 2016 Killarney chick, a female named 'Danú' named after the Celtic goddess or the nearby Paps of Danú, left her nest in mid-July

but only began to venture away from the lakes of Killarney in late September. She returned to Killarney then finally departed on 1 October when she headed west towards Waterville where she remains. Her satellite tracks show that she even spent the night next to another eagle nest in west Kerry that also produced a chick this year. Time will tell how these young eagles will fare. Some may not make it through their first winter when having to find enough food to survive is a big challenge. Young eagles are especially dependent on carrion - dead animals, they find and scavenge often in the uplands. However, the omens so far are encouraging for this new generation of wild Irish-bred birds. Of 13 young eagles that have flown from nests since 2013, all but one, a young eagle shot on the shore of Lough Derg in Tipperary in 2014, made it through their first winter. Some of these first birds have dispersed as far as Rathlin Island off the Antrim coast and could start nesting themselves in the next few years. These pioneers carry the hopes for the future of the species in Ireland with them.

CLLR. GLEESON RAISES QUESTIONS ON FIRE SAFETY

County Council satisfied that all the Traveller Accommodation in this County is as free as is humanly possible from such risk".

Councillor Gleeson stated that is was

appropriate to address this matter on the 1st anniversary of the Carrickmines Fire Tragedy that claimed 10 lives. He stated that an accommodation assessment by the National Directorate for Fire and Emergency Management following that Carrickmines fire found that very many Units there did not have working fire alarms, carbon monoxide alarms and that a majority had dangerous electrical installations. It also stated that in some locations Units were sited too proximate to each other.

Kerry County Council stated that it continues its pro-active programme of engagement with the Local Traveller Accommodation Consultative Committee, local Traveller advocacy groups and residents of the sites in the development and implementation of ongoing Fire Safety

imitative.

An important element of the overall programme is Fire Safety Awareness and |Kerry Co Co works with resident and stakeholder groups to ensure attendance at fire safety awareness events organised by the Council.

They continue to carry out Pre-Incident Planning and to ensure that Traveller Fire Safety is included in the annual Planning Programme and this has been completed for 2016 in all 4 sites in Kerry. KERRY SOCIAL FARMING INITIATIVE RECEIVES MAJOR BOOST

The Kerry Social Farming initiative, which has been run by South Kerry Development Partnership and the Kerry Social Farming Committee over the last number of years, received a major boost in the last week with the signing of a contract to roll out a National Social Farming Pilot Project in the county. In addition to the contract to roll out the pilot project, SKDP has also been successful as part of a consortium with Leitrim Local Development Company, in securing a contract to develop National Social Farming Network.

Both contract were awarded by the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine and are seen as recognition of the work of SKDP and the Kerry Social Farming Committee over the last three years. This new pilot project will see the number of host farmers throughout Kerry participating in the initiative rise to 15 from a current level of 9 with a corresponding increase in the level of participants from a current number of 26.

The initiative involves people with disabilities being able to spend time with a host farmer in a safe and friendly environment both enjoying the experience of working with the animals on the farm as well as learning farm skills, life skills, connecting with the rural community and build relationships with the family farm members. The Social Farming initiative works in co-operation with many agencies in the county including KCC, disability service providers, the

There are many app's out there to download that will do all the work for you eg. I love "my fitness pal" i often pull it out and see how im getting on with my nutritional goals as it brings up your protein, crabohydrate intake, vitamins iron etc, so it is a great overall health eating tool and guide.

Alternatively you can use the following equation i have put together for you to figure out your own personal daily calories and if you want to google the foods in your food diary for caloroes you can easily owrk out apporoximately what you are consuming on a daily basis.

CALORIE COUNTER

Question: How many calories should I eat if I want to lose weight? A pound of body fat equates to approximately 3500 calories.

To lose weight: To take off 1 pound per week, you need to create a "deficit" of 500 calories per day. You can do this by eating 250 fewer calories a day (for example, cut out a 20-ounce bottle of regular soda) and burning an extra 250 calories through physical activity (for example, walk for 2.5 miles). Another way to cut back on calories is to watch your portion sizes.

Answer: It's Relative

Technically, there is no magic number of calories we should all eat each day to lose weight. While most people can lose weight eating around 1,500 calories, you can assess your own personal caloric needs with a little math.

RENTAL INCOME WHAT EXPENDITURE CAN BE DEDUCTED?

The following are examples of expenditure that may be deducted:

- Ground Rent
- Rates
- Maintenance
- General Repairs (Capital Expenditure excluded)

A FEW FOODS THAT SHOULD NOT BE KEPT IN THE FRIDGE

• The fridge does keep tomatoes fresh, but it does so by stopping the process of ripeness. Consequently they lose their flavour. In addition the refrigerator also changes the texture of the tomato, making it powdery or floury. Tomatoes are best kept out of cold environments.

• Fresh basil in refrigeration withers very quickly, but before it withers all the way and becomes unusable, it absorbs the taste of the foods kept closest to it. Basil is best kept outside the fridge and in a glass of fresh water, just like flowers.

• The cold temperatures in the fridge turns the starch in the potato into sugar at a faster pace than normal, and we're left with a sweet yet grainy potato. Keep your potatoes in a sealed sack and in a cool and dry place. They should be covered, because being exposed to sunlight makes them grow sprouts.

• One of the most fascinating facts about honey is that it never goes bad. There is no reason to keep it in the fridge; in fact it should be avoided as the cold temperatures will solidify it. Honey is best kept at room temperature.

• The dampness in the fridge makes onions soft and mouldy. The best place to keep onions is in a cool and dry place, outside the fridge. Green onions can be kept in the fridge because of their high percentage of water content. Do not keep onions next to the potatoes, because it will make the potatoes rot quicker.

AN AMAZING CHILD THAT HELPED CHANGE THE WORLD

Alexandra "Alex" Scott was born in Connecticut in 1996, and was diagnosed with neuroblastoma, a type of childhood cancer, shortly before she turned 1. In 2000, just after turning 4 years old, she informed her mother she wanted to start a lemonade stand to raise money for doctors to "help other kids, like they helped me." Her first lemonade stand raised \$2,000 and led to the creation of the Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation. Alex continued her lemonade stands throughout her life, ultimately raising over \$1 million toward cancer research. She passed away in August 2004 at the age of 8. Today, Alex's Lemonade Stand sponsors a national fundraising weekend every June called Lemonade Days. Each year, as many as 10,000 volunteers at more than 2,000 Alex's Lemonade Stands around the U.S.A. make a difference for children with cancer.

TOO GOOD TO BE TRUE

Cape Breton is an island on the north-eastern tip of Nova Scotia. The island has only around 135,000 residents, and the numbers keep dropping. Whycocomagh is a small town in Cape Breton and has fewer than 900 residents. The town is surrounded by gorgeous mountains and the Bras d'Or lake, where kayaks and canoes are much more popular than motorboats. Local businesses include a few petrol stations and several restaurants, and a bakery and general store named 'The Farmer's Daughter' which the owners are trying to expand. But they have run into a problem – they are unable to get staff because they are not enough unemployed people living on the island. So the owners took to social media with a pretty generous offer: Move to Cape Breton and they'll give you a job and two wooded acres. They admit wages won't be high, but they say the acreage will be perfect for a tiny house or cabin. They also will offer access to farmland and other resources. If you're still working there after five years, the land is yours to keep. "Cape Breton is amazing but our population is decreasing. Corporate development has been seen as the solution in the past but that often comes at the expense of our environment. We think there is a better way," the owners write.

To apply, you need some skills in customer service or the food industry and you must be environmentally conscious, but the bad news

is Foreign workers can't apply.

MUSLIM COMMUNITY HOLDS ANNUAL BLOOD DRIVE IN HONOUR OF SEPTEMBER11THVICTIMS

For the sixth year in a row since the 10th anniversary of the September 11th attacks, the Islamic Ahmadiyya Community gathered in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania to donate blood in the Muslims For Life Blood Drive. Since it began in 2011, the events have raised over 40,000 pints of blood, which have saved an estimated 100,000 people to date. Founded 127 years ago, the community preaches the abolishment of violent jihadi beliefs. They hope that in donating blood, they can help show the love that they feel for America and their unity with its people. "We all

condemn the attacks and remember that day," Asad Chaudhry, president of the Lehigh Valley chapter of the community says "we want to do something more than words."

CATHEDRALS AND A CELTIC CROSS GROW FROM LIVING TREES

In a remote valley at the foot of Mount Arera, just outside the ancient town of Bergamo, Italy, stands a Tree Cathedral, this dramatic art installation will take decades to complete as nature will do all the work. Man's role is to simply step aside and let time take its course. The Cattedrale in Bergamo stands 21 metres tall, with five aisles and 42 columns. It's 28.5 metres long and 24 metres wide, and has been built from 1800 firs, 600 chestnut branches and 6000 metres of hazel branch that's been weaved into the design, a single beech tree is planted within each column, capable of growing to over 160 feet tall and living more than 300 year, they will grow over time to provide the roof to the structure. In the coming decades, as the man-made structures rot around them, the trees will gradually take on the structure of the five-aisle basilica.

The Cattedrale Vegetale concept was conceived by Italian artist Giuliano Mauri, who spent years perfecting the complicated structure. He completed his first plant cathedral in 2002, composed of three naves and 80 columns, in a clearing in Malga Costa. Sadly, he passed away in 2009, less than one year before the frame of Cattedrale in Bergamo was completed as part of the United Nations' International Year of Biodiversity.

The Cattedral of Lodi, completed this summer, is the largest of Mauri's designs. Occupying an area of 1,618 meters, it contains 108 columns. Instead of the beech used in Bergamo, Lodi's structure will eventually be comprised of towering oaks.

Much nearer home, if you happen to be flying over a certain area in County Donegal you will see a beautiful arrangement of conifer trees in the shape of a Celtic cross growing amidst a forest on the ground below. To pull off the beautiful design, measuring 330 feet long by 210 feet wide on the hill behind his home, two different species of trees were planted by Irish forester Liam Emmery who sadly passed away six years ago at the age of 51.

Every autumn, the Celtic trees (likely composed of Eastern white pine) change their colour, while the surrounding species retains its dark green. The display went viral this fall after a particularly dry stretch made the colours contrast sharply. Airline passengers couldn't resist posting about the mysterious cross on social media.

On December 4th Bonhams of London will be selling by auction one of the most famous Rolls-Royces ever built. This Rolls-Royce Phantom One has an interior inspired by 18th-Century France, and has one of the most lavish interiors ever put into a car. Built in 1926 for American businessman, Clarence Gasque as a gift for his wife, he did not set a budget limit for Rolls-Royce to stick to, the interior work was entrusted to coach builders Charles Clark and Sons, of Wolverhampton, England the spectacular result is more similar to the throne room in the Palace of Versailles than a car's interior and on delivery, the car cost \$8,000, with the interior accounting for \$5,500 of the total amount. Converted into today's money, the purchase price was over \$430,000, while the interior alone was \$300,000.

STRAY DOG JOINED EXTREME MARATHONER ACROSS THE DESERT

41 year old Australian Dion Leonard who now lives in Edinburgh was surprised to find a stray dog at his heels in the middle of a gruelling 250 kilometre race known as The Gobi March. He was even more surprised when she kept up with a full day's 25 kilometre run. The little dog not only made it, but kept following, and on the pair's second day together, she snuggled up to sleep with her new friend. The race organiser intervened on the hottest days and transported her to the next checkpoint so she could cheer on her new best friend at the finish line. Dion fell in love with the magical little dog and vowed not to desert his "ultramarathon pal", when it was time for him to pack up and return home. A crowd fund was set up to help pay for the newly christened 'Gobi' to get through quarantine and fly to Dion in Scotland. The funding was quickly exceeded, but while Gobi was being looked after by a contact from the race crew in Urumgi waiting for internal paperwork to be completed in China she went missing, probably looking for Dion! Dion and his wife Lucja turned to Beijing animal rescue organisations for help in using their animal search experience and local contacts in Urumqi to help find Gobi. Dion flew from Edinburgh to join the and Gobi was miraculously found after at least 10 days on the run. Dion couldn't bear to either put Gobi in British quarantine or leave her in China for the process and decided to take a 6 month unpaid sabbatical from his role at William Grant & Sons to stay with her through the whole process. Gobi and Dion will arrive back in Edinburgh early January 2017 and not only do they plan to run again but they will donate all remaining funds from #bringgobihome to help other stray dogs like Gobi find their forever homes,

BILLIONAIRE COMMITS \$500M TO HELP REFUGEES AND MIGRANTS

Billionaire philanthropist George Soros is contributing \$500 million to organisations offering relief for migrants and refugees. The announcement follows the 'Call To Action' initiative launched by President Barack Obama asking private sector businesses to allow more work opportunities for asylum-seekers.

Mr. Soros's contribution, however, has gone above and beyond the average donations made by global governments to the crisis – the investment totals the combined \$262 million spent by Great Britain and the \$191 million from the European Union. "We will seek investments in a variety of sectors, among them emerging digital technology, which seems especially promising as a way to

provide solutions to the particular problems that dislocated people often face. Advances in this sector can help people gain access more efficiently to government, legal, financial and health services" he said. Mr. Soros is the founder and chairman of the Soros Fund Management and the Open Society Foundations. Born in Budapest in 1930, he survived the Nazi occupation during World War II and fled communist-dominated Hungary in 1947 for England, where he graduated from the London School of Economics. He then settled in the United States, where he accumulated a large fortune through the international investment fund he founded and managed. The Open Society Foundations now operates in more than 100 countries, with annual expenditures that reached \$835 million in 2011, working to promote the values of open society, human rights, and transparency.

9-YEAR-OLD BOY USED HIS BIRTHDAY MONEY TO SAVE A RACEHORSE ON DEATH ROW

Most children spend their birthday money on toys and games, but 9-year-old Brandon Heyman of Ontario, Canada decided to use it to save a life. Karazan, an aging racehorse, had just been purchased by a meat buyer when his mother came across the 17-year-old chestnut mare on the website Need You Now Equine.

"Nobody seemed interested in her," Brandon's mother, MJ Allen said "My son asked what was I doing, and when I explained it to him, he said, 'Mummy, my birthday's coming up. Just give my birthday money to them. I don't want the horse to die." Ms. Allen and her partner live on a farm with seven horses, a donkey, dogs and cats, and their blended family of six children, so bringing home another mouth to feed was, understandably, the last thing on her mind. Still, she was so touched by her son's display of compassion that she raised the remaining \$650 needed to buy the thoroughbred. Soon after, she surprised Brandon with his new best friend. "It's my first horse," Brandon said "I clean her, wash her, but my sister feeds her." Ms. Allen calls Karazan "queen of the field" and "a real diva." She is, after all, a direct descendent of Canada's greatest racehorse, Northern Dance, and with that kind of pedigree, it's no wonder she already has the respect of her new stable mates. However, the highlight of her new life is her relationship with Brandon, who will help fill her final days with love and affection.

FOCUS ON NOVEMBER GARDENING

Now that November is here, it is a great time of the year for planting bare rooted trees, hedging, fruit bushes, roses and root balled conifers.

The bare rooted planting season lasts from November until March. The reason for this is that the trees and hedging are dormant at this time of year, so you can't really do any damage when you are lifting or planting.

When planting bare rooted, as a general rule, plant about three plants per meter, roses can also be purchased and planted bare rooted as can fruit trees and fruit bushes.

The main thing when planting bare rooted trees and hedging is that when you purchase them and if you are not going to plant them straight away, you will have to heel them into the ground. By this I mean you will have to dig a hole, place the plant in and cover the roots with earth to stop them drying out.

When hedging plants, roses and fruit bushes, they will usually come in bundles and will be tied together, so you don't have to separate them, just put the whole bundle in the ground.
