



RAILINGS TO BE RESTORED AT ST. MARY'S CHURCH

OF IRELAND

The next phase of the restoration works at St. Mary's Church of Ireland, Killarney; also known as The Church of the Sloes took place this week.

"This is a very exciting development as it sees the Killarney Town community putting their full support into restoring the external railings of St. Mary's Church", Andrew Eadie, a spokesperson for the Church, told The Killarney Outlook.

Located next to the footpath on one of Killarney's main tourist walking routes the church railings run from Kenmare Place to Main Street. In recent years two sections of the railings have been replaced. While this has improved these sections appearance, it has only served to highlight the complete dilapidation of the remainder. For Killarney as a premier tourism venue this eyesore is unacceptable. A combined initiative of Killarney Chamber of Tourism & Commerce, Killarney Looking Good and the Church of Ireland parishioners have resolved to complete the renewal of the railings to the exact same design as before using top quality materials. In a "leap of faith" in community generosity the decision has been taken to start works in January 2016 with completion planned before St. Patrick's Day. Materials have been ordered and contractors appointed.

victories included: Kilgarvan U12 topping the Division 2 Co. League: Phase 1 and the South Kerry League; St. Pat's, East Kerry U12 topping the Division 3 Co. League: Phase 2; Rathmore U14 winning the South Kerry Championship; and Kenmare/Kilgarvan reaching the U16 Co. League Division 1 Final. The highlight of the year was the combined South Kerry U16 team who won the Co. Championship for the first time. He praised the players who wore the green and gold of Kerry in the various divisional squads and also noted the hurlers who displayed equal skill on the football field winning the All-Ireland Minor Football Championship; John Mark Foley, Daniel O'Brien and Gavin White.



As part of the course Daniel undertook a Work Experience module which he excelled at and eventually gained part-time work with a local roofing contractor. Daniel was a model trainee, he was always polite and diligent and his timekeeping and attendance were impeccable which considering he was travelling in from Annascaul every day was even more creditable. These qualities were recognised by his employer who has now given him full-time work and agreed to sponsor him on a Carpentry apprenticeship at the Kerry ETB Training Centre in Tralee.

Tralee Community Training Centre is a community based project that supports young people between the ages of 16 and 21 who have

either not completed mainstream education or who did not realise their full potential and want the opportunity to get better recognised qualifications. The centre runs four courses which are: - Catering, Construction Skills, Hairdressing and Technology. All courses work towards Q.Q.I. (formerly FETAC) Major Awards at Junior Cert and Leaving Cert equivalent levels. Trainees also study Communications, Mathematics, Personal Effectiveness, Work Experience, Health Related Fitness etc as part of their training. The centre also provides those trainees that require it extra support in literacy and numeracy as well as professional counselling if they wish.





















CRANBERRY FRUIT AND NUT UPSIDE-DOWN CAKE Delicious cake full of festive flavours

This is a delicious cake with the combination of fruit, nuts, spices and almonds - in fact all the flavours of the festive season.

INGREDIENTS - Serves 15 Adults Fruit Topping: 4 large pears - 115g / 4 oz. of cranberries

½ teaspoon of cinnamon powder Rind of ½ an orange - 55g / 2 oz. of low-fat

50g / 2 oz. of castor sugar - 55g / 2 oz. of hazelnuts **Sponge cake:** 115g / 4 oz. of low-fat margarine - 170g / 60 oz. of caster sugar - 2 medium eggs separated - 1/2 teaspoon of cinnamon powder - 55g

/ 2 oz. of ground almonds - 170g / 6 oz. of selfraising cake flour 1/4 teaspoon of vanilla extract/essence - 1 teaspoon

of baking powder - 6 dessertspoons of low-fat milk **METHOD**

Fruit Topping: Peel core and quarter the pears Dust the cranberries with orange peel and cinnamon powder.In a heavy based ovenproof pan, heat the margarine until melted, add the sugar and cook until golden. Arrange the pears, cranberries and nuts around the base of the dish and allow to cool slightly


Sponge cake: Beat together the margarine and sugar until light and creamy. Carefully fold in the egg yolks, vanilla extract/essence and cinnamon powder. Fold in the ground almonds, flour and baking powder until well mixed. Then add milk and mix well


Finally add the well beaten egg whites and fold in gently until smooth. Pour over the fruit and bake in the oven at 180°C / 350°F / Gas Mark 4 for 25 minutes approximately until well risen and golden. When set and cool, remove from the tin and turn upside-down with the caramelized pears and cranberries on top


The rally starts on Friday evening with a ceremonial start in main street Killarney at 7.30pm.

ARTIST EXEMPTION SCHEME



The Artists' Exemption Scheme was introduced to help promote Irish culture and creativity by allowing income earned by writers, composers, visual artists and sculptors from the publication, production, or sale of works to be exempt from income tax in certain circumstances.

To qualify for the Artists' Exemption, the artist's work must be original and creative, and generally recognized as having cultural or artistic merit. Examples of this include:

- Books or other forms of writing
- Plays
- Musical compositions
- Paintings or other small pictures
- Sculptures

Examples of work not considered original or creative:

- · A book to be used primarily by students in study
- Play / jingle written for advertising purposes

The maximum amount of profits or gains earned by artists from the sale of their work which is exempt from income tax is €50,000 per year.

Know Your Rights: BUDGETING FOR CHRISTMAS

QUESTION

This Christmas I will struggle to find money for food and gifts. Is there any help available with budgeting and finding some extra cash for all the additional costs at this time of year?

MABS – the Money Advice and Budgeting Service – supports families with budgeting all year round. They have useful suggestions about how to cope over the festive season on their website, mabs.ie.

First of all, make a list of what you need to buy for Christmas. Divide it into gifts, food, clothes and socialising. You can then decide what things are essential and where you can cut back and save money. You can use the MABS Christmas planner to help you work this out.

Having done this, you may decide that you need to borrow to cover the extra costs over Christmas. However, you should only borrow what you truly need. If possible, try to pay back this loan before the middle of next year, otherwise you will find it difficult to save for next Christmas.

WHEN YOU BORROW YOU SHOULD ALWAYS:

- Work out what the weekly or monthly repayments are going to be and see how this will affect your budget next year - can you afford that amount, and still pay your regular bills and
- When looking for a loan, try to get the best value you can. Generally, loans from a money lender will cost you much more than a loan from your credit union or bank. Using a credit card is also a very expensive way of borrowing money. You can check whether an It Makes Sense loan is available from your local credit union. This is an easy-to-access loan aimed at people on social welfare. It is a pilot scheme so it is not currently available
- Remember to read the terms and conditions of any credit application so you understand what you are getting into. Get advice before you sign.

Before you borrow you can contact MABS to see what options are available to you and look again at your list - is it worth it? Are you sure this is what you and your family need?

SELF ESTEEM I



Self-esteem is determined by how much we value ourselves, and tends to develop from early childhood right into our adult years. Healthy self-esteem is maintained when we achieve a good balance between feeling capable while also feeling loved. Self-judgement or the judgement of others can trigger low self-esteem.

Negative self-talk such as 'I'm no good', 'I'll never succeed', 'nobody like me' can all contribute to our low self-esteem. The more we use this negative self-talk the more we begin to believe its fact. There are many ways in which we can raise our self-esteem and begin to feel better about ourselves. These include:

Positive Self-Talk: Why not change the way you talk to yourself by giving yourself positive statements. Replace the negative thoughts with something positive and create positive affirmations. Look at what you do well or what is working in your life and begin to 'change the recording' in your mind to incorporate these.

Positive Self-Care: When we begin to take care of ourselves we begin to feel good about ourselves. This involves eating healthier food and cutting out and junk. Exercise is also vital to help us feel good about ourselves and feel energised. Talk a walk, run, cycle or dance; do whatever feels good for you.

Do things you enjoy: What do you love to do? Make a list and ensure that you do at least one pleasurable activity each day.

Remember your Success: Look at past successes you have had and draw from these. Reflect on an achievement or a challenge you overcame. Be sure to give yourself credit for this and remember, if you did it once, you can do it again.

Spend time with good people: Be sure to spend time with people who treat you well and try to avoid negative people who put you down.

Don't compare: Comparing ourselves to others can really dent our self-esteem. Instead of focusing on the success of others – we need to focus on ourselves and what we can do better. Comparing ourselves will only bring us down.

Take small steps: Set small achievable goals so you can see your success as it unfolds. This will result in feeling more successful and confident and lead on to greater accomplishments.

Be prepared for setbacks; they are part and parcel of life. However, the way in which we deal with a setback can greatly impact our self-esteem. If you are unable to achieve a goal, try again or change tactic.

Next week we will continue to look at Self Esteem and ways in which we can nurture self-esteem in our Children.





For some, it's careening down rocky mountainsides on two wheels in summer or a flat plank in winter; for others, it might be shopping, reading, writing, painting, gardening or snapping pictures and videos of cute grandchildren or pets.

You can't help but notice, though, that while being happy looks different for everyone, being broke can be a severe impediment. It is a lot easier to enjoy the grandchildren if you can afford the plane fare, or to garden when you can afford some mulch and a few bulbs.

Money is part of life's flow: We all have some crossing our thresholds on a fairly regular basis. Our challenge is to manage that money in a way that facilitates our happiness. The term which comes to mind is "stewardship": If we are good stewards of the money crossing our threshold, we just improve our chances of happiness. As someone once said: A house where the finances are in order generally has more peace.

Money can't guarantee happiness — let's just say that out loud — but it is a tool to help us get there. How well we steward our money, therefore, does affect how much happiness we achieve.

SYRIAN REFUGEE HANDS **OUT FOOD TO GERMANY'S HOMELESS EVERY WEEK TO SAY THANK YOU**

Every Saturday, Alex Assali, a Syrian refugee hands out food to the homeless in Berlin as a way of saying thanks to the people who took him in. A picture of Alex hard at work was posted by Berliner Tabea Bü on Facebook recently.

Tabea goes on to describe how Alex had to leave family behind in Damascus, Syria, because of threats from ISIS. He left with nothing and travelled to Europe, via Lebanon, Cyprus, Egypt, Sudan and Libya, eventually setting up a new life in Germany.

Even though he has very little, she says, he gives away food to the homeless and those in need every Saturday in Berlin's Alexanderplatz. Alex and Tabea met through the Berlin Refugio, a charity which provides shelter and community to those forced to leave their homes and set up a new life.

He cooks Syrian food and often has help from others. But, even when there's no one to help, he goes shopping, cooks the food and serves it alone.

One comment under Tabea's post reads: 'This. This is what humanity should look like.' Another adds: 'I want everything good to happen to this man.'

Tabea has since taken to Facebook to thank people for their kind words. 'Alex and me are really overwhelmed by this feedback, we got messages from people all over the world, she

RETURNED TO THE SHELTER **TWICE**

Cassidy is a senior pit bull who had a hard life. Used as a breeding (and possibly even a bait) dog, she was not in good shape when she was finally rescued. In December 2012, she was transported from an over-crowded Californian shelter to Willamette Humane Society (WHS) in Salem, Oregon.

Martha Russell, a volunteer for WHS, explained her condition: "She had serious ear infections, a ripped ear flap, and the other ear had a badly damaged ear canal; she had old wounds on her body; she showed signs of arthritis in her hips, and she had worn teeth. It was apparent that she had also given birth to many litters of puppies. The vet guessed her age at about seven. To top it off, Cassidy showed no expression in her face."

After over a year of treatment, including surgery to remove her damaged ear canal which left the right side of her face paralyzed - she can't even blink that eye - she was adopted March 2013.

She was brought back to the shelter November 7, 2014, suffering from the same ear infections and some new health concerns. The staff was worried she would not be lucky enough to find another home. But fate had plans for Cassidy. Marianne Fox was a new volunteer at WHS who learned about Cassidy through Ms. Russell. "On November 7, 2014 a staff member called me over to the front desk wanting me to meet her 'favourite dog EVER' who was being surrendered by her owner. I remember being rushed to get to my shift so I gave the sweet dog some love and left the area. The next day, I went to visit her in the back area of the shelter where dogs are held pending release to the adoption floor. The thing that struck me about her was the lack of expression on her face, though she was incredibly sweet. The next time I went to the shelter, she was on the adoption floor and I went and sat in her kennel. Again, I was struck by her sweetness but lack of facial expression. I thought she seemed stressed and since the shelter was closed the next two days, I decided I would take her home for respite and bring her back on the next open day."

Ms. Fox did bring her back – but just to fill out the adoption forms. And on November 13, 2014, Cassidy became Patience.

"My two small dogs and two adult cats accepted her immediately," Ms. Fox says "She has a calm, completely nonthreatening way about her, and they just knew she could be trusted. I changed her name to Patience because Cassidy didn't seem to fit her."

Now, her days are filled with love, and Fox has finally seen some expression in that "dead pan" face - Patience finally has something to smile about!

"Since that first day, she has been nothing short of amazing," Ms. Fox said. "She loves every person and animal she meets. The neighbourhood children adore her and the feeling is mutual. She is a very happy dog whose entire back end wiggles when she wags her tail."

Ms. Fox takes her on adventures whenever she can – knowing she has never experienced such joys before. One of her favourite places is the Oregon Coast.

But fate wasn't done. Patience had a job to do. The shelter had a desperate need for someone to foster three tiny, three-week-old kittens that had no mother. Ms. Fox took on the job and after about a week and a half, decided to introduce them to her dogs. While her little dogs acted a little too "interested," she says, Patience walked in and something amazing happened.

"Patience walked into the room and her maternal instincts kicked in immediately. They were not afraid of her at all and love her dearly. When they were very tiny, she worried about them whenever she could not see any one of them. They used to get under their enclosure, and she would poke her nose under and whine until they came out. As they have gotten bigger (I've had them for more than 2 months now), she has relaxed. She can sense that they

don't need her as much and are ready to leave the nest. Her mothering has included bathing them with her giant tongue, sleeping with them cuddled against her, letting them climb her, chew on her, and run around and over her when playing with each other."

Not only is Patience an incredible ambassador for her breed, Ms. Fox is quick to say, but for shelter dogs in general and why it is so rewarding to adopt a senior dog.

THE PRAYING MANTISES

Their name refers to the insects' imposing front legs that are bent at an angle as if they are folded in prayer. There are approximately 2,000 different species of praying mantises throughout the world, and their mystique is global.

French folklore suggests a praying mantis can point a lost child back to her home. In Arabic and Turkish cultures, a mantis was thought to point towards Mecca. In Africa, the mantis was fabled to restore life to the dead. And they are used to treat a number of illnesses in China, such as impotence and thyroid enlargement. The vast majority of mantises live in the tropics. They have a unique, flexible joint between their head and prothorax that allows them to swivel their heads. This creepy trait makes a mantis seem even more humanoid when it can turn its head and look at you.

They can see movement up to 60 feet away and they are the only insect known to have the ability to see in three dimensions, the same as humans. They have a huge appetite and have been known to eat up to sixteen crickets per day. Mantises prev on many different types of insects, including beneficial ones like bees and ladybugs, as well as small birds, frogs, lizards, and occasionally other mantises.

Gory details aside, most instances of sexual cannibalization occur in a laboratory setting. In the wild, the adults typically live 6 to 12 months. In colder climates, the females will lay around 100 to 400 eggs in the fall. They lay the eggs in a frothy liquid that hardens to create a solid case for winter protection. The eggs hatch to become nymphs in the spring, which look like miniature versions of the adults without wings. After moulting, the nymph will transform into an adult and get its wings.

Despite their different appearances, praying mantises, termites and cockroaches are all closely related but are not known to infest buildings like their invasive cousins.

On the 5th November, a passionate debate was held in the House of Commons in which the MPs described the dog meat trade as ""inhumane" and "disgusting" and that "other countries' traditions could not be a "smokescreen" for "barbaric" practices".

Following the debate, the government has pledged to write to British embassies in countries where dog meat is consumed urging them to step up efforts to push for an end to the trade. Furthermore, a commitment was made to work with international health agencies such as the World Health Organisation and the World Organisation for Animal Health to investigate the human health implications of the trade - a trade that results in the unimaginable suffering of tens of millions of dogs each year.

If you have a vote in Britain or are living in Britain, please continue to raise your concerns about the dog meat trade to maintain the momentum. Asia For Animals Coalition will keep up the fight and together we can and will end the cruel dog meat trade throughout


FINALLY THIS WEEK
