This week I met up with contemporary female vocalist Grace Foley who is from Fossa. Grace attended Fossa NS & St Brigid's Presentation College throughout her schooling years in Killarney.

With the support of the Arts Council Ireland, Grace Foley has recorded 'Goodbye to Dublin'. The songs tells of the breakdown of a relationship in the midst of the happiness of Christmas. "I wasn't a writer at all Marie but I really wanted to try. I had many pieces that I had half written but I wasn't happy enough with them. Would you believe it Marie amidst the surreal time that is Covid19, I sat and my piano and 'Together Apart' came out! I have found with writing you truly have to write and sing from the heart.

The words and melody reach right into your heart and provide solace & comfort. The vocal was recorded in my wardrobe. I know, the wardrobe Marie. The quality of recording over zoom or the phone was very poor so Dave McCune sent me a proper voice recorder in the post.

The wardrobe was the best place, for home made acoustics, in a pandemic. The whole accompanying track was recorded and brought together by Dave McCune at Ventry Recording Studio, Balbriggan, Dublin, Ireland. It came together beautifully and I have had amazing feedback.

My concert with Noel at St Mary's was simply wonderful. I have so many connections with the Cathedral and it was unbelievable to be inside those doors when no one else could. Noel was fantastic. I closed my eyes and imagined the Cathedral was packed to capacity and enjoyed every minute of performing. At one point Noel was doing a solo and I stepped aside. There was a white feather on the floor beside me. I knew what it represented so the next song I sang, in my mind, was sang for my grandparents. I have kept the feather. How random and how special". Grace said.

S his two-year term as President of Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce draws to a close, businessman Paul Sherry said Brexit and Covid-19 provided an unfortunate backdrop to his tenure but he focused on ensuring that chamber kept doing what it does best to keep the show on the road.

Despite the major challenges, he said there were a number of key projects worked on during the pandemic that ensured Killarney's great reputation was not only maintained but enhanced.

"We have been engaged in the Wild Atlantic Gateway project with Fáilte Ireland, Kerry County Council, the National Parks and Wildlife Service, hoteliers and vintners and a host of other stakeholders in developing a plan to help further develop Killarney as a world class, sustainable tourist destination into the future," Mr Sherry said.

"The plan is nearing completion and sign-off by all stakeholders is expected prior to

Christmas. This project has the potential to greatly improve Killarney's standing and to remain the world class destination we know it to be," the outgoing president said.

Mr Sherry said joint campaigns with the Kerry Tourism Industry Federation and Fáilte Ireland

S his two-year term as President were contributing factors to a very good of Killarney Chamber of Tourism summer season Killarney managed to salvage and Commerce draws to a close, during the pandemic.

"We were informed by Fáilte Ireland that the top two go-to destinations for staycations following lockdown were Killarney and Galway," he confirmed. Key projects undertaken in 2020 included the formation of the Kerry Tourism Industry Federation which has been a resounding success.

"When we were asked to nominate a representative for the board of the organisation we were fortunate to have Pat O'Leary, the former managing director of Liebherr Container Cranes Ltd, to come forward. He has assumed the role of chairman of the board and is giving us a strong voice within," he said.

Earlier in the year Killarney Chamber obtained a seat at the table of the Irish Tourism Industry Confederation, in association with its partners on the Kerry branch of the Irish Hotels' Federation and Kerry Airport.

"This is the high altar of Irish tourism and it represents an important step for Killarney. We are fortunate to be represented here by Niamh O'Shea who keeps us updated and ensures our voice is heard within this important body," Mr Sherry said. With the onset of Covid-19 and the pandemic, the chamber became involved with the Kerry Business and Economic Stakeholders Forum, set up by Kerry County Council Chief Executive Moira Murrell, to address the challenges the pandemic was presenting for business and to plan for a recovery and exit from the crisis.

"This forum is ongoing and has moved from biweekly meetings to monthly meetings as the challenges have been tackled. During this period, we have continued to work with our partners in Kerry County Council and the Killarney Municipal District," the outgoing president said.

Lobbying has become a very important part of the chamber's role in recent times and members have been consistently meeting with TDs, councillors and all the other groups on behalf of the town.

"Chamber was especially pleased to be able to invest in excess of \in 30,000, supported by Kerry County Council, in the Space marketing campaign – promoting the great outdoors – and it achieved a social media audience reach of nearly 800,000 and the overall campaign had a total online reach of 5.7 million impressions.

The chamber spearheaded two important surveys this year - Let's Talk About Town and the Killarney Visitor Sentiment 2020 - to determine public attitudes in all aspects of Killarney life and the key findings will prove very useful when addressing what the people of Killarney and visitors want and expect from the town. Mr Sherry welcomed the great progress that has been made in the development of the walking trail and car park at Tomies Wood and the fact that work has started on the Flesk cycleway and walkway. In his address at the virtual annual general meeting of the organisation, Mr Sherry remarked: "Becoming President of Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce was never on my radar. It is not something that one seeks out or that you put your hand up for, nor is it something that should be taken lightly.

"Once you are selected you quickly realise that it is a very important role and just how important Killarney is as a business town and at the high altar of tourism, both within the county and nationally.

The new President of Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce is Cllr Niall Kelleher, a Killarney businessman who is also an elected member of Kerry County Council for the Killarney Municipal District.

Mr Kelleher, whose term officially commenced on January 1 next, was proposed by insurance broker John Healy and seconded by hotelier Bernadette Randles.

had been following the updates online at MC Construction and how the renovations at Killarney Race Course were coming along.

I later read the announcement in the Killarney Outlook of the 12 performances funded by the Department of Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport & Media set to take place at the Gleneagle INEC Arena in December. It came as no surprise to me that our very own Celtic Steps was one of the gigs, so I took some time this week to catch up with David Rae.

Dying for nosey I arrived at Killarney Race Course complete with mask. I don't know about you but I'm finding myself returning to the car less often these days to retrieve the forgotten mask. Isn't it strange how we adapt so quickly? I can't wait to adapt in reverse can you??

"We've spent over €300,000 in here Marie and to look at it you wouldn't see a cent of that. The venue for Celtic Steps is now entirely sound proof, new windows, new doors, the works Marie" David explained. I did notice a huge difference. Fair enough not in appearance but definitely a less hollow feel which could only mean an improvement in acoustics too. "It'd make a great nite club David". He laughed but I was half serious. Oh to be on a dance floor anywhere!

"Let's start from the very beginning David. Of you go" I said. "I'm dancing 50 years come next May Marie. I began when I was 4. My sister Annette used to dance so I did too and I never stopped. I suppose I got lucky really. Usually by the time you'd hit your 30's you'd graduate to Sean Nós or Set Dancing. I used to teach for 15 years which is something I gave great thought to returning to during the pandemic as I have been without work for over 9 months now" David said.

Performing arts has been hit so badly. I wondered how the cast of Celtic Steps were getting on. "So many of our great dancers at Celtic Steps have been with us since the word 'Go' Marie We have a fantastic dancer with us called Sean Dows from Motherwell. A 7 time World Irish Dancing Champion. I bring the comedy element to Celtic Steps Marie. You won't see me dancing along side the likes of Sean for the night, oh no. The old fat guy makes an appearance for 30 second bursts. It's like riding a bike, you never forget" David laughed. "From the age of 16 I had some amazing years dancing abroad. This was all pre Riverdance. We used to travel with Comhaltas world wide. I have the best memories of that. It continued into my 20's and on occasion since. I remember well that night the famous Riverdance performance took place at the Eurovision in 1994. I was working at Killarney Manor (1990-2001) entertaining the tourist who had booked in. No one could ever have imagined Irish dancing with your arms out. Only Michael Flatley could have carried it off. He made Irish dancing so cool, especially for boys. What was there not to like.... lots of girls and you were getting paid too!!" David laughed. "It's a pity he wasn't around to make it cool when I attended The Green CBS in Tralee. I might have won the biggest competition with the biggest trophy ever but I'd go to school praying it wouldn't be printed in the local papers for the boys to see. I'd be destroyed. You see Marie now a days the men wear slim fit chinos when dancing. Back in my day we all wore kilts. Do you understand where I'm coming from?? Oh stop it, the whistles and screams I'd get if walking through the town on my way to work at whatever venue was hilarious. The laugh was on the other side of their faces though when they'd be asking me to give them a few tips on waltzing for their weddings" David joked.

"So how did Celtic Steps begin David"? I asked. "Myself & Sean Murphy from Abbeyfeale set up Celtic Steps in 2011. We began doing shows at the Gleneagle Hotel in the Mangerton Suite, now called the Acoustic Club. All our dancers & musicians were Kerry based. We succeeded in testing the market and we were delighted with the outcome. The management at the hotel saw potential in us I suppose and asked us to move venue to the INEC. I won't lie to you Marie it was a night I will never forget. Can you imagine 49 people in the INEC and I was the narrator. That was the first and last time there was 49 people at a Celtic Steps performance. The next night there were 450 people in attendance. The hotel saw potential in us and we grew from there".

"And what have you been up to for the last 9 months David? It can't have been easy"? I tried the housework, cooking & cleaning etc but I'm not one for staying at home Marie. I walk into town most days for a coffee at Lír and meet up with Billy Tangney. Our paths cross regularly with all our tour bookings pre Covid" David said. We both agreed that Billy Tangney had done an amazing job on the Christmas Tree lights at the Cathedral this year. "I hadn't played golf in over 10 years Marie so I took that up again too. I really don't think the golf courses should have been closed this time round. I can see from Ross Golf Course here that its a major outlet for the members" David continued.

As we got ready for David's snap he told me that he was heading off after, to meet up with the tech crew at the Gleneagle, for the new gig which was due to take place this month and how great it was to have something to look forward to. "We're a 9 piece band Marie and we have combined the people from both our Killarney & Tralee shows for our performance on Saturday. I'm really looking forward to the buzz again".

The subject of taking the vaccine for Covid 19 arose as I left. "Would you take it David" I asked. "I surely would Marie. I'm not going to wait to see if someone grows a third ear resulting the vaccine. I think going forward it will be a stamp on our health passport and will assist greatly in opening up the world again. And before you put away your notebook Marie can I just say thank you. To say Sean & I were humbled by the astounding response we had from the people of Killarney when the possibility arose of Celtic Steps being no more. We are forever grateful. We did not seek that but I can tell you from the bottom of my heart, thank you to the supportive people of Killarney. We hope we will always remain a cog in the tourism wheel of the community of Killarney".

Luxurious Kerry castle sells for €4.5 million

One of the largest country residential property sales in Ireland this year took place in Kerry.

Marie chats with An Post staff in their Christmas Hut

'And if we have a minute why don't we go? Talk about it somewhere only we know. So why don't we go... somewhere only we know?' ~ Lily Allen, John Lewis Christmas advert.

This week, I bring you an exclusive viewing of the An Post Christmas Hut. For the eyes of An Post personnel normally but there is nothing normal about 2020 which actually went in my favour this time!

The Christmas Hut at the rear of Killarney Post Office is an outdoor sanctuary like no other for these busy bees at Christmas, established in 2015 by Mary O'Shea. I think it's important to note that these girls and their colleagues have worked hard throughout both lockdowns and this lengthy pandemic, giving an essential service daily within our community. It is far more than a sanctuary they deserve. December is usually a very busy time of year at Killarney Post Office outside of Covid19 so I was thrilled with my special invitation to visit the Christmas Hut at Killarney Post Office to Gogglevox and sincerely grateful to the girls for their time.

Our'clickity-click' nature of ordering is something we've become accustomed to. In some ways the pandemic has brought our community closer together. Many of our local business now visit the post office daily to remain trading.

"It all began with a 4 inch Christmas decoration Marie" Anne explained. I was intrigued. "A Christmas tree that Mary made at home whilst practising with her new sewing machine. Can you see there? (photo enlarged) There's a tiny nail on the wall?? Mary hung up the miniature tree on a nail hook and every year since each member of staff has added to our winter wonderland. On a very busy day, it's a delight, especially as the evenings close in and it looks all sparkly. Myself, my husband Donald & daughter Zarah absolutely love Christmas Marie. We update our Christmas decorations at home every year so we add to the outdoor Post Office Christmas Hut as a result" Anne explained.

"It's been crazy busy Marie. People have been great throughout the pandemic, sending care packages to loved ones abroad and relatives in



Ireland who they are missing dearly. So many of our local business are selling online now. We've gotten to know more people in the community because of this. We are missing our pensioners but we are glad everyone is taking precaution. The hut is a gift when the going gets tough. Its a breather to have a cup of coffee and be just be outdoors" Mary said. "And it's good that Anne Clifford doesn't like the heat because some wouldn't stay out here for too long in the winter" Mary laughed. "Oh the heat doesn't suit me Marie. But haven't we the boiler house right beside us here Mary? Isn't that enough heat for you?" Anne replied. "To be fair we don't get to sit here long enough to get cold Marie" Mary joked. Mary O'Shea is 26 years working with Killarney Post Office and Anne Clifford has 16 years under her belt. "So do the postmen get to enjoy the hut over the festive season girls"? I asked. "They don't" Anne replied . "They don't have time anyway Marie". "We better go back in Marie, our break is nearly over" Mary said. "Two more mins there Mary, you're too indispensable to be given a P45 at this time of year" I replied.

"We will be opening at 8:30am for the final 3 Friday's leading up to Christmas Marie and working a full day each Saturday instead of our usual half day too. Stamps are \in 26 for 20 National & 5 International and don't worry we have An Post festive envelopes & boxes for those who are unsure how to send their items. We will look after them." Mary explained. Most informative. Good to know ladies thank you. Before I left, I wanted to ask about Santa's Post Box. He spoke about it in last weeks Gogglevox and checks in with Geraldine, his helper, every week when he returns with the replies to all the letters that he has received from the children of Killarney. "It's so exciting to see the children coming in to post their Santa letters. That's what makes Christmas" Anne said.

"We're all doing extra hours for the month of December Marie but we have three new staff on board so it's all systems go behind the counter" Mary told me. On that note I said I'd better let the girls get back to work.

"Just to let everyone know the deadline for International posting is 7th December" Anne said as she buzzed me out the gate of the An Post Winter Wonderland "But really & truly it's better to get the parcels and letters off early this year.... it's 2020 after all Marie. Anything could happen!!" Anne laughed.

Never a truer word Anne. Thank you for having me Anne Clifford & Mary O'Shea. My pleasure entirely.

Christmas Bonus will be paid to Kerry social welfare and PUP recipients this year - Griffin

Deputy Government Chief Whip, Brendan Griffin TD said: "I am pleased to say that the full Christmas Bonus will be paid to social welfare recipients in Kerry the week beginning 7th December. This year, due to the challenges of COVID-19, the Christmas bonus will also be paid to recipients of the Pandemic Unemployment Payment.

"This was confirmed to me by my colleague the Minister for Social Protection, Heather Humphreys, who has announced the details of the largest ever Christmas Bonus.

"As always, people on long term social welfare benefits such as pensioners, people with disabilities, carers and lone parents will receive the 100% Christmas bonus.

"Those who have been in receipt of the

Pandemic Unemployment Payment (PUP) continuously or otherwise - for at least 4 months (17 weeks) since March will also receive the Christmas Bonus this year.

"Minister Humphreys has also taken care to ensure that anyone returning to work next week as restrictions ease, will not be excluded from the Christmas Bonus. Any person in receipt of PUP for any one day from Friday 27th November to Thursday 3rd December will still receive the Christmas Bonus provided they also meet the 17 week requirement. So anyone returning to work this Monday or Tuesday will still receive the Christmas Bonus as they worked at least one day during the said period. "The same criteria is also being applied to those on Jobseeker's payments, who in previous years would have only received the Bonus if they had been out of work for at least 15 months", Deputy Griffin concluded. Announcing the record Christmas Bonus, Minister Humphreys urged people to spend it locally in order to support small businesses: "Christmas brings many extra financial pressures and I am particularly pleased to provide a 100% Christmas Bonus this year for over 1.6 million people.

"I would strongly encourage people to spend their Christmas Bonus locally this year and support our local shops and businesses in our towns and villages throughout the country. This will be a \in 390 million injection into the Irish economy at a time when many small businesses will be reopening their doors as restrictions are eased." €1.6 million ICT grant funding for Kerry schools

Minister for Education and Kerry TD Norma Foley has this week announced over €1.6 million in Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Grants for Kerry primary and post-primary schools to be paid in early December, 2020.

Minister Foley said: "We are all aware of the importance of digital learning and skills in our modern world, and I am delighted to announce this funding to equip our schools for this purpose. This funding will allow Kerry schools to purchase the digital devices and technologies that their students need. Approximately 162 schools in Kerry will benefit from this funding.

"This funding can be used to purchase equipment such as projectors and tablets or to support the use of online learning platforms. These grants will be automatically issued to all primary, special and post-primary schools in early December. Grants are paid on the basis of school type and enrollment.

"For example, a 60 pupil primary school will receive €4,365 and a 300 pupil school will receive up to €12,475.

"In the case of a post-primary school this will consist of a €2,000 basic grant plus €43.26 per mainstream student and €47.58 per student in DEIS schools (as of 30 September 2019).

"A 500 student school will receive up to €36,880 and a 1,000 student school would receive up to €62,560.

"This year's extended period of school closure has served to underscore the immense value of education and its power in our children and young people's lives. Funding of this scale can really make a difference to a school and its students.

NEW ISSUE OF **SLIABH LUACHRA JOURNAL** ON SALE

The annual Sliabh Luachra journal, which is compiled by Donal Hickey and is sent to exiles in many parts of the world is now on sale. The journal is published by the local history society, Cumann Luachra.

It contains a wide range of articles covering the life and lore of historic Sliabh Luachra and is on sales in shops throughout the area as well as in Killarney and surrounding towns.

Stories of how a visitor from New Zealand to his mother's birthplace in the Gneeveguilla area, in 1959, found himself at the Stations in a local house is one of many outlined in the latest issue of the Sliabh Luachra Journal.

About 60 people were in the house, from babies to ninety-year-olds. He could get no further than the porch where he sank to his knees, chilled from head to toe.

After returning to New Zealand, Michael O'Leary wrote about his experience in his local newspaper. Describing himself as a "warm-weather Christian", he was moved by the piety of the folk at the Station Mass.

"I wondered what sins were committed in this corner of rural Kerry; what would be known of pornographic magazines, suggestive films, colour bars, abortions, business frauds, immoral books or atheism?" he mused.

When the priests left the house, fiddles were produced, drink started to flow and set dancers were on the floor. "When one (polka) set was puffed out, another eight took the floor and the house rocked to the dancing of reels, jigs, sets and hornpipes," O'Leary recalled.

Still on matters musical, winning the senior fiddle competition at Scartaglen Feile Cheoil, in 1968, was the beginning of close ties with the traditional music of Sliabh Luachra for Matt Cranitch.

Now regarded as a foremost authority on the music of the region, especially that of the renowned fiddle master, Padraig O'Keeffe, he is also a leading musician on the national scene.

On the day Matt won the fiddle competition in Scartaglen, Jackie Daly won the senior accordion competition. "Little did we realise at the time that, many years later, we would go on to form a music partnership which, indeed, would bring us back to Scartaglen many times," Matt recalls in an article headed My Life and Music.

A native of Rathduff, Co Cork, Cranitch went on to win All-Ireland Fleadh Cheoil titles and



numerous

other awards and has performed widely at home and abroad. He also received a PhD from the University of Limerick for his study of the fiddle-playing of Sliabh Luachra. The 112page journal is now on sale in Killarney and surrounding towns for \in 12.

CALL FOR ADDITIONAL COVID TESTING CENTRES

Kerry County Councillor has renewed his call for additional Covid Testing Centres to be rolled out around the county.

Councillor Michael Cahill said this week "If we are to defeat this horrible threat to our lives and livelihoods, we must track down all cases of the infection that we can physically possibly do". "If people, who own their own transport, find it difficult to organise themselves and their families to do a three to four hour round trip to attend for a three minute test, then many cases of this disease will be missed and lockdown will drag on and on" said a clearly determined Councillor Cahill.

"This is in our own hands and our Health Authorities need to step up and unveil Covid Testing Centres that are accessible to the vast majority of our citizens, not just those in our Councillor.

"There are also many people who depend on Public Transport to get about, to whom attending the present Testing Centre is indeed testing or almost impossible " stated the Rossbeigh based Councillor.

"I would ask officials to imagine that they are living in Lauragh or Kenmare or anywhere in Iveragh such as Caherdaniel, Ballinskelligs, Waterville, Dromid, Cahersiveen or Valentia for example or in West Kerry and that they, or one of their loved ones are showing symptoms of Covid-19, Imagine the logistics involved in organising a three hour plus round trip for the test, with or without your own transport" asked Councillor Cahill.

"A Test Centre in Tralee is not sufficient for the needs of everybody in Kerry". "We need to increase and roll out as a matter of priority large towns and cities" stated the Fianna Fáil the number of Test Centres to all towns in



our county inclusive of Tralee, Killarney, Cahersiveen, Dingle, Kenmare, Killorglin, Castleisland and Listowel" added Councillor Cahill.

EP votes to make Covid 19 vaccines and testing kits VAT free until 2022⁻ MEP Kelleher

Fianna Fáil MEP Billy Kelleher has welcomed the recent European Parliament vote to allow member states to apply a zero VAT rate on Covid 19 vaccines and testing kits until 2022. The Ireland South MEP was commenting following the European Parliament's green light to the European Commission's proposal. They will now go to the European Council for final approval.

"This is a common sense, but important, change, and one which I was proud to support when the proposal came before MEPs today.

"No effort should be spared to ensure that vaccinations reach every single citizen in the European Union as quickly as possible. This means keeping costs low, ensuring fast distribution, and coordinating all public authorities.

"Early on in this pandemic, some questioned the value of the European Union, and while there were difficulties, the Union has risen to the challenges facing it both in coordinating, and in removing obstacles to, the response. "The European Commission has secured hundreds of millions of doses of vaccines,



at cheaper prices than most other countries, due to the size and strength of the Union and its member states.

"Reducing the VAT rate is the next logical step, and one that will make the roll out of a comprehensive vaccine scheme more efficient and cheaper. This is why Ireland's membership of the European Union continues to make sense for our citizens," concluded Kelleher.

Kerry County Councillors seek meeting with Justice Minister to discuss paying of coroner's fees

At Monday's Budget meeting Councillor Michael Cahill proposed that the Council seek an urgent meeting with the Minister for Justice, Helen McEntee in respect of the payment of Coroners salaries, fees and expenses from the carrying out of post-mortems and inquests. Next year this will cost Kerry County Council in excess of €300,000. The Fianna Fail Councillor said the Council should not be liable for this bill as it has nothing to do with Council business and that this funding could and should be spent on the Council's own services such as repairs to Local Authority Houses, heating, roads, etc. "This Council has paid millions of euros over the years for a service that they should not be responsible for and should be reimbursed" stated the Killorglin Councillor. Councillor Cahill's colleagues supported his proposal and the Council agreed to write to Minister McEntee seeking a meeting.

The Community Water Development Fund aims to support the delivery of local projects and initiatives to address issues in water quality, biodiversity loss and climate change.

The fund is administered by the Local Authority Waters Programme (LAWPRO) on behalf of the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage and is available to all community and voluntary groups.

LAWPRO opened the 2021 fund on Saturday 28 November at the annual seminar of Irish Rivers Trusts and Catchment Groups. The seminar saw 246 people gather from across the whole of Ireland to share knowledge and experiences of 'Communities Caring for Water'. Speaking at the event Sheevaun Thompson, Funding lead with LAWPRO said "demand for the Community Water Development Fund has increased year on year since it was first launched in 2018 and it is exciting to announce that the fund has been increased to €360,000 in 2021, up from €225,000 in 2020. This will allow LAWPRO to support even more locally led community projects next year." A link to a recording of the seminar is available at www.lawaters.ie.

Types of projects considered for funding will include:

Capital projects such as: riparian management and restoration of habitat, natural flood mitigation measures, fish passage projects, invasive species control, tree planting, rain garden and Nature Based Solutions, etc.

- Projects that promote public awareness/ education/events: videos; publications; biodiversity days, citizen science, training workshops, surveys and plans etc.

- General amenity (with a water focus) such as: improving amenity areas, river/lake/ coastal walk, bird watching facilities, etc. Grants awarded will range from €500 to

€5,000; up to €10,000 and up to €25,000. For the 2021 Open Call, applicants are asked to complete the application

GOLF CLUB REOPENS UNDER LEVEL 3

Golf Ireland welcomes the Government's decision this week that golf courses can reopen from Tuesday next 1st December. This decision means that golf can resume subject to strict health protection protocols.

Killarney man and Golf Ireland CEO Mark Kennelly said: "The golf community is pleased that courses can reopen from Tuesday next. Golfers welcome the opportunity to resume play on a responsible and safe basis, as they did during the May to October period.

"The governing bodies are issuing renewed guidance to our member clubs today and we strongly urge all golfers to continue to fully adhere to these protocols which are aimed at keeping golf and the wider community safe while the Covid-19 pandemic remains such a serious threat. We also ask golfers to fully comply with the wider public health restrictions, particularly the travel restrictions that will remain in place until 18th December.

"Earlier this year, Irish golf demonstrated how our sport could be enjoyed by women and men of all ages in a safe and secure environment. As golf resumes, we hope that golfers enjoy their play but continue to be vigilant in adhering to the safety protocols".

Following the Irish Government's announcement in relation to Level 3 restrictions due to COVID-19, golf clubs and golfers must adhere to the following:

Golf courses were allowed to reopen from Tuesday 1st December, however golfers must not travel outside their county of residence to play golf. This also means that golfers in counties either side of the border between Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland must adhere to the restrictions that apply in both jurisdictions. Further guidance for golfers and golf clubs is contained in the General Guidance document attached.

From December 18th to January 6th, golfers can travel to another county to play as restrictions are eased over the Christmas period.

There should continue to be no organised social gatherings, of any size, at the facility. All golf activities should be organised on the basis of arrival-play-depart without delay. Shotgun starts are not compatible with this guidance as they create large gatherings.

All retail, including pro shops, can reopen while

DEERPARK PITCH & PUTT CLUB REOPEN FOR PLAY

As of last Tuesday we are re-open to play for members only following the placing of the country into Level 3 Public Health guidelines. Members are reminded they must leave confirmation of entry and exit from the course on club phone (087 7823138) for contract tracing purposes.

Daily timesheets are restricted to a minimum of 8, 9 or 10 minute intervals. Clubs may only choose one interval for each day. If clubs choose 8+ minute intervals, play is restricted to 2 golfers per start time. If clubs choose 9+ minutes, up to 3 golfers may play per start time. If clubs choose 10+ minutes, up to 4 golfers may play per start time.

Tee times are booked in advance online or over the telephone. Clubs must ensure that players names (including members' guests) are recorded on timesheets and timesheets must be kept for a period of at least 6 weeks to assist with contact tracing should the need arise.

All cafes and restaurants, including bars that serve food, can reopen from December 4th while following strict physical distancing and hygiene guidelines (please consult www.gov.ie for details). In the meantime, restaurants can continue to offer a takeaway service only.

Golf activities at club level may be resumed, including those which are acceptable for handicapping purposes where such conditions can be met under the World Handicapping System. All participants must abide by the domestic travel restrictions at Level 3 (see first two points above).

In addition, golf clubs and golfers are asked to ensure the following:

Members, visitors and staff with colds or any symptoms of COVID-19 must stay away from the golf course/clubhouse.

Physical distancing rules are observed by all members and their guests at all times in the car park, clubhouse and on the course.

Personnel are on hand to monitor adherence with physical distancing rules and the rules for golfers set out in this document.

Those aged 70 years and over and the medically vulnerable should exercise judgement regarding the extent to which they engage with others and in activities outside home.

Training: Outdoors – non-contact training only in pods of up to 15. Indoors – individual training only.

Players are instructed not to touch the flag or flagstick.

Rakes are removed from the course. Players are requested to smooth bunkers using their feet or a club.

Hire trolleys (electric and pull trolleys) must be sanitised prior to each use.

Caddies are not permitted (exception: where the group of golfers and the caddies are from the same household).

JIMMY O'SULLIVAN-DARCY

takes a look at all things sport...

Things are getting back to a semblance of normality. The timing is good, with the All Ireland competitions nearing a close. I expect no more major shocks in the football – Dublin to beat Mayo in the Final – mind you, Cavan have surprised me hugely twice already and Tipperary once, so best of luck to both. The Kerry hurlers have an All Ireland of their own to look forward to, which is a big boost for everyone. The Irish rugby season played out like a damp squib. The Irish soccer season....Dundalk beating Sligo 11-0 in a cup semi-final? Ah, lads!

Pro Boxing managed to sink to a new low in the past week. And it's pro boxing, which has never exactly encouraged paragons of virtue behind the scenes (unlike amateur, a brilliant sport that I would encourage anyone to take up, it's actually among the best fitness training that you can do). A strange week in a strange year, but it makes for great entertainment.

GAELIC FOOTBALL

The fallout from Kerry's defeat to Cork continues behind closed doors. And it's best that they stay closed. County Convention is approaching rapidly - the only real item of interest in the agenda will be the change of age grade from U20 to U19. Personally I'm opposed, just as I opposed the change from U18 to U17. It was convenient in that it removes any overlap between minor and senior football - unfortunately, it also removes U18s who aren't making their club's first fifteen from any meaningful football. In my opinion, the solution is a lot worse than the original problem. Putting B teams into the County League won't help either, Junior Football was a great way to keep players involved on the Friday night without the intensity .County Convention has been a fairly anodyne affair in recent years, and this year on zoom conference isn't going to be any different. There's no question that mistakes were made by Kerry or that there needs to be better communication between management, players, and the supporting public. The abrupt departure of Donie Buckley came with a big price tag and Kerry paid it. We have some of the best forwards in the country but we don't see them on the pitch. But let's get something clear. Peter Keane has managed Kerry for 24 games. 18 wins, 2 draws (Donegal and Dublin) and 4 losses (Mayo twice in last year's League, and Cork this year). We aren't doing badly at all. Three major Finals, won one (2020 National League, lost two (2019 National League and All Ireland). It's not exactly a bad record; other counties would snap your hand off for it.

I've heard the same stories as you have and

maybe a little bit more than most. It isn't all rumours, there are some flames behind that smoke, but there are very good people who have given enormous effort into representing Kerry as best they can on all sides. They are all adults and they are decent people; I'm going to let them get on with it and hope that everybody can be united in looking forward to a better year. You know what turns small fires into raging infernos? Oxygen – I'm not going to be feeding that particular beast. We all have better things to be doing.

CORK

Cork football supporters are extremely disappointed with Ronan McCarthy's team losing a Munster Final to Tipperary. That's just bizarre ingratitude, to be honest. Ye beat Kerry for the first time in eight years, and ye are complaining? Cork's biggest problem, in my not-at-all humble opinion, is the unrealistic expectations of their supporters. The hurlers are in the same boat. In my opinion, Kieran Kingston is doing a fine job, but Cork just don't have the physical presence to compete with the top guns right now. That's not an easy fix, especially given how many top hurling teams there are right now. In my opinion, Cork are making progress on both fronts. There are no easy fixes, but they are on the right road and, frankly, their County Board seems to be a lot more invested and interactive than previous incarnations. That'll hurt Kerry's chances long term, but I'm delighted to see it; the overall quality in Munster will improve for everyone. Dublin

Good on John Connellan. His letter about the disparity in funding towards Dublin was superbly written, and respectful to Dublin's achievements and attitude. It made a lot of fair points.

There is a problem in the Leinster Championship, no question about it. Dublin simply are too strong. I wasn't too worried in the long term – players like Jack McCaffrey, Brian Fenton, and of course Stephen Cluxton are, in my honest opinion, up among the best ever to play the game. James McCarthy, Paul Flynn, Ciaran Kilkenny, Philly McMahon aren't far behind them. Players like that will stand out in any generation; put several of them on one team and they will inculcate an attitude along with their ability. Jim Gavin's ability to ruthlessly eradicate ego, including his own (Diarmuid Connolly was brilliant – but I'd pick any of the aforementioned ahead of him) was a key ingredient.

The problem is the seamless transition to the likes of Howard, Small, Bugler. Now I am worried about the Leinster Championship. I remember the days when the likes of Meath (uncompromising but compelling; they would chew up teams without salt) and Offaly (despite 1982, we loved them; they never had numbers but always had quality) could always go toe to toe with Dublin. Lifetimes ago. At this stage I do believe that Central Council need to prioritise other Leinster counties for funding. Croke Park pays half the salary for 70 GDAs in Dublin (2018 figures) - in fairness, Dulin can now afford to pay them out of Dublin funds, and Croke Park should start paying for half the salary of GDAs in the weaker counties.

But that's it. Please forget any nonsense about artificial splits of Dublin; it's not feasible. Kerry would certainly want to think twice about complaining about disproportionate funding, unless they want the other Munster Counties to take another look at how much we get. Our players are not left under-resourced. In 2018, Kerry received GAA grants totalling E1,354,847. Munster as a province got E1,260, 912. Cork did get E2,138, 845, but E1,333,333 went directly to that white elephant called Pairc Uí Caíomh. We put a lot of money into Currans ourselves – that has been a well-intentioned disaster. I'm not so sure that ourselves or Cork can do a lot of fingerpointing at Dublin spending.

KERRY FINANCE

In fairness, Kerry treasurer Tom Keane has done a fantastic job in very tough circumstances. Gate receipts fell by E308,000 (E513,000 to E205,000, 61% of which came from pay per view streaming. There were teething problems, the streaming quality for some of the high profile games was simply not good enough, but it is the future and even when crowds are allowed back, I expect streaming to remain a revenue source.

Commercial income dropped by E300,000, and fundraising dropped by E720,000. All told, overall income up to October 31st fell from E6,397m to E2.141m. The current bank debt

is E2.4m. Team expenses dropped considerably from E1.4m to E780,000.

Frankly, that's still very high. Tom did point out that Kerry training sessions can cost up to E20,000 a week. That sounds huge, but think of travel expenses and good quality meals for up to 60 people (we aren't actually told how many players are training with Kerry or how often) two or three times, plus the amount of professional backroom staff, and the figure is understandable. All in all, Kerry are looking at an

operating loss for the year of E97,5559. That's as good as it could possibly be in this year of years and far better than I felt could reasonably be expected. Kudos to Tom and to everybody else involved.

WOMENS' SPORT

Interesting to see that the Dublin ladies are into their seventh All Ireland Final on the trot and aiming for four in a row. Nobody mentions their funding. That big investment in coaching in Dublin by Seán Kelly back in 2003 has been criticised of late – it was absolutely the right thing to do at the time.

2020 was meant to be the year of 20 x 20 in Womens' Sports. Obviously that needs a do-over, given the year it is, and I have to say that even before the covid pandemic, back in January and early February, I was seeing a lot of lip service, but not a lot of funding. Money where mouths are, please.

The Irish Womens'Team bowed out of European Championship qualification, going down 3-1 to Germany. That's the second best team in the world right now (the US are well on top of the pile; they are a fantastic team). Vrera Pauw's side started their campaign brilliantly but the wheels came off the wagon against the Ukraine (we just couldn't click that night) and Greece. Germany in our last game was always going to be too big an ask, but Ireland bowed out with their heads high. Personally I think that Pauw is a superb manager and a young and talkented team clearly like and trust her; I really hope she stays on.

HURLING

Yet again, it looks like there's going to be better entertainment in the hurling than the football this year. For several years, hurling was basically a monopoly of Kilkenny, Tipperary, Cork, and occasionally Galway. Waterford – my sympathies



But it was mostly a closed shop, whereas football was more open and inclusive. Now it's the opposite. The truth is that Dublin have dominated the football

landscape like no team ever has, and only

Mayo and Kerry are hanging onto their coat-tails, with Donegal and Tyrone a fraction behind. Everybody else is way behind in the slipstream. Hurling? Your guess at the winners in any given year is as good as mine. We have had three different winners and five different finalists in three years. It doesn't get much better than that. And going by this year's semifinals, 2020 could be the most entertaining of them all.

Waterford 2-27 Kilkenny 2-23

After ten minutes, I was just shaking my head. I have a soft spot for Waterford. They are basically the Mayo of hurling. They haven't won it since 1959, but they are always there or thereabouts and they never give up. Their supporters are an absolute howl. Kilkenny are sound, but they are Kilkenny, the aristocrats of the game. I was always going to root for Waterford.

Hence the head-shaking. Because they were absolutely brutal. Their 'passes' were like something out of a pinball machine and their first touch was....well, generally the first of many in trying to get the ball under control. Kilkenny had two goals and looked like getting plenty more. They were seven points clear at half-time and in all honesty it should have been more.

Then Waterford came out in the second half and started playing hurling. A clinical Stephen Bennett and effervescent Austin Gleeson led the line and deserved the plaudits, but for me Tadhg de Burca was the rock that Kilkenny foundered on. They scored 2-17 in 39 minutes of hurling while up against one of the great teams. Kilkenny are not quite what they were in terms of remorseless efficiency and power – but this is a different Waterford as well.

Limerick 0-27 Galway 0-24

It followed a similar pattern to the day before, but with less extremes. Like Waterford, Limerick made a poor start, hitting aimless long balls that were comfortably gathered by Galway's sweeping defence. Galway picked off neat scores to go ahead. The thing is that it was already pretty clear that Limerick were playing below par and being outfoxed tactically by Galway....but were still able to stay in touch. Once they got to grips with it, there was only going to be one winner – though that late rally by Galway was heart-stopping entertainment, it would have been larceny on a grand scale. Look, I hate saying it, but Galway's puck-outs

were just disastrous. Sometimes the flaw is simply so big that you can't look past it. Limerick also hit some incredible long range shooting. Everybody talks about the bursting power of the likes of Cian Lynch, and with good reason, but Gearoid Hegarty's shooting....wow. You simply cannot shut down every shooting chance from that sort of range. Now, he did play on the edge. The absolute best interpretation of that belt on Joe Canning is that it was amazingly clumsy, and I'm being generous. I did think it dominated the analysis far too much - it should have been a red card for me, but it wasn't going to turn the game. The loss of Cathal Mannion was far, far more significant. Limerick versus Waterford in the All Ireland Final. A repeat of the Munster Final and I expect a similar result.

My focus, of course, will be on the Joe McDonagh curtain-raiser more than the Liam McCarthy. That one's gotten under my skin; I'm already jittery.

SPECTATORS

I'm glad to see that full panels will be allowed into the matches. Frankly, I haven't agreed with the complete lock-out of supporters in outdoor stadia from day one; it has never made sense to me.

That said, I was very disappointed at all of the calls for family members and how hard and unfair it all is on them by some prominent GAA figures. There are families who have lost loved ones in the middle of this global pandemic. There are sports that are completely shut down. There are family businesses and livelihoods going to the wall as we speak. We are just getting back to a semblance of normality, with shops and amenities reopening under controlled systems. People need this, and not just economically. Keep pushing too hard and too fast on that door, and you'll be putting that at risk and jeopardising the progress that has been made. Delighted to hear that the U20 and minor competitions have the green light. We are out of the U20 - both teams did very well in my opinion, the footballers reached an All Ireland semi-final and the hurlers gave a strong Cork side a fantastic rattle. The Kerry minor hurlers are also out, but the footballers have yet to commence their competition. Without going into names, I know that Jason Costello has assembled a strong panel. Perhaps more importantly, I know how much work they have done so far behind the scenes and in the tough circumstances of this year. They have character, and I consider it the most important trait in any team. I'm hugely looking forward to it.

BASKETBALL

The 2021 League season had to be shut down. It's a hard decision, and hugely disappointing for those of us who love watching the game, let alone the players and clubs. But I can understand why a semi-pro sport had to make that call; people couldn't keep their futures in limbo indefinitely. I don't really think it was a justifiable risk to open up indoor sports to spectators yet and basketball without door revenue just isn't viable; it's a sport that has difficulty balancing revenue and expenditure

as it is. Hopefully the National Cups will get to go ahead.

RUGBY

IRELAND 23 GEORGIA 10

Ireland have had a bad Nations Cup. No point denying it. Our final game was against Georgia, and we beat them by 23-10. And there was much wailing and gnashing of teeth in Montrose, and tears were shed, and laments for the days when we bestrode the world like giants....or something.

JJ was on fire and Jack came on in the 58th minute and acquitted himself well. We've had worse days!

The addition of South African franchises means that the Pro14 is expected to expand to a Pro16 fairly soon. Not a wise decision in my opinion; there are too many mismatches already. They need to look at quality of games, not quantity, especially while trying to expand international fixtures as well; bodies can only take so much.

ADIOS DIEGO

Pele was better. There, I've said it. You'd win more games with Pele than you would with Maradonna. You'd score more goals with Puskas or Di Stefano. He would dance past Johann Cruyff every single time, but Cruyff's team would win the game every single time.

But he was by far the most iconic soccer player of all time. Nobody could dance with a football like he did. He was as combative and tough as they come, but he absolutely loved playing. It often seemed to me that it was life outside of the rigid certainties of the game where he fashioned magic that he found difficulties.

Kerry GAA has the trope of the 'fear laidir'. The high fielder and accurate distance kicker; the antithesis of blanket defences and tactical play. Quiet and humble, probably a farmer. One of De Valera's dancers at the crossroads. Mad for his bacon and cabbage, wouldn't touch lasagne, assumes avocado toast is a myth. Disdainful of media, isn't on twitter or facebook. Doesn't



Then came 1986. I remember it. And I never have and never will see anything like it again. No player has ever dominated any competition in any code like he did. Not Jordan in basketball, not Woods in golf, not Tyson in boxing. Even Ali, not even Muhammed Ali could match what Maradonna did in 1986. Burrachaga was good, you could see that, but Argentina were not a great team at all. They just had one great player. As for the Hand of God.....look, that would be hilarious even if it wasn't England – and it was England. In fairness, they have been gracious about him – remember how much we whinged about the Henry handball? Sauce for geese, my friends....

My favourite thing about him was Napoli, though. Players like Maradonna don't join Napoli. They join Juventus or AC Milan. Napoli is the poor town with Camorra links (let me sum up the Camorra – the mafia at their height never went near these guys), not the rich Northern Italy with money and fashion. Welcome back dear reader how is your endurance holding up? Endurance is a topic we often link to sport and it is a big part of any athletes training. Our faith is our spiritual muscle and it requires much more attention than our physical muscles do to overcome the trials of life. We exercise our faith when we believe and trust in God. That is all we are required to do in order to be accepted by God - to believe in Him and in His Son Jesus as Lord (John 6:29; John 3:16). "Do not cast away your confidence which has great reward, for you have need of endurance so that after you have done the will of God, you may receive the promise, for yet a little while and He who is coming will come.....now the just shall live by faith; but if anyone draws back My soul has no pleasure in him" (Hebrews 10:35-38). 'The just shall live by faith' – friend, who are the just? Those who have been justified or made right with God through faith in Jesus His Son, who endure the trials the enemy sets up to try to break us.

We are acquitted and declared righteous through our faith in Jesus (Romans 10:9). But we need to leave behind our old ways of being deceived by the lies of the enemy, because time is short and Jesus is coming back! When He comes back He will be looking for faith (Luke 18:1-8). Times may be a bit crazy, but hold fast your confidence in God. He is the Righteous Judge. Do not be overcome by lies, instead pursue and live in the freedom that Jesus won for you! (John 16:33)
