

The 36th Ring of Kerry cycle is set to take place tomorrow – one of the largest single day charity events in Ireland.

Speaking to the Killarney Outlook this week, one of the organisers Cathal Walshe spoke of the cyce, the challenge and the charities it supports.

"The cycle is looked on as a challenge to many people on two fronts, firstly the distance of 175kms in one day, secondly the target of raising as much sponsorship as possible for their chosen charity. It is testament to their efforts that close to 16million euro has gone to charities in the 36 year history of the event", Cathal said.

"Some cyclists do the cycle in memory of dear friends and family that have passed away, train

for months in advance of the July date. The chosen charities on a given year have special appeal, they would have a particular project in mind, maybe a building, transport, day care facility needing up grading.

"The Ring itself is a brand name all over the world hence people travel from many far flung places to cycle the scenic route and contribute generously to a special charity of their choice", he added.

What makes it special is the wonderful atmosphere on the day with people on the roadway applauding as you pass along the way,the buzz it creates in the towns and villages and the welcome back to Killarney in the afternoon. There have been friendships, engagements, marriages in the past through

meeting on the day. The cycle has the goodwill of the people, the backing of the community how could you have 1400 volunteers helping otherwise. Safe journey to all on 6th of July, Cathal added.

In the past 5 years over €6.575 million euro has been raised for charity, the goal for this year is to continue to raise as much money as possible for our six new charities.

The 36th Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle has an official start time of 7.30am on 6th July and there will be welcome celebrations after the finish line in Beech Road car park with outdoor bar and food stalls, and free live music from Revenge and DJ Donal and much more.

There will be free family fun and the chance to win incredible prizes at the official Cycle Expo on Friday 5th of July from 4pm – 9pm on Plunkett Street, Killarney.

the 36th Annual Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle on Saturday 6th July 2019. Both men are encouraging cyclists to slow down and enjoy the fun and scenery along the way. The inaugural 'Triangle Dance' part of the 'craic' at Coomakista pass - the infamous 'breaking point', is a new addition to the atmosphere on the day.

The National Rehabilitation Hospital (NRH) provides specialist rehabilitation services to patients from throughout Ireland who, as a result of an accident, illness or injury have acquired a physical or cognitive disability and require specialist rehabilitation.

It is 35 years since an accident at work, resulted in Timo O'Sullivan, sustained life changing injuries and leaving him wheelchair bound.

Timo is an avid angler, volunteer with many organisations in Kerry, and a wonderful

advocate for wheelchair accessibility. Timo spent six months in the expert care of the NRH, recuperating from his injuries and being

rehabilitated helped him cope with his new life. Speaking about his time there, he said "The treatment and the

expert care and lifelong friendship I received from staff at the NRH, has enabled me to carry out every aspect of daily life to the fullest extent. 35 years on, and I am involved in many volunteer organisations in Killarney, beekeeping is my new passion"

lan O'Connell, the inspirational Killarney teenager, who sustained serious injuries in a cycle accident two years ago, is currently undergoing rehabilitation at the National Rehabilitation Centre. lan's mantra 'if you can't stand up...stand out' griped the nation, he now has over 42,000 followers on instagram, through which he offers online support to young people and their families with similar issues in their lives.

lan continues to defy the odds, continuing his school and gruelling rehab every day.

Cúnamh Iveragh – Cúnamh Iveragh supports children and young adults with special intellectual needs. Kerry football legend, Maurice Fitzgerald, is a proud ambassador for Cúnamh Iveragh and the Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle this year.

Breakthrough Cancer Research - The primary aim of Breakthrough Cancer research is to implement funding and support for their phenomenal research into cancer treatments in Ireland. Former Olympian David Gillick is their ambassador this year for the Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle


Three chefs from Trigon Hotels in Cork will be

An Equine Science graduate from the University of Limerick and an established trainer, Philip insists there isn't a racecourse in the world that can match the natural beauty of Killarney and he said the team at the Ross Road facility has worked tirelessly to ensure the course is in pristine condition for the July and August racing festivals.






FR TADHG Celebrates **Golden Jubilee**



MONEY MATTERS.

USING YOUR PENSION TO PAY LESS TAX:

Pension contributions provide a way of paying less income tax. Up to Revenue Limits, contributions to a pension qualify for relief from income tax. This effectively means that, where the higher rate of income tax is 40% and you are a higher rate taxpayer, a €100 contribution to a pension will only have a net cost to you of €60 (had you not made the contribution, the other €40 would have gone to the government as income tax).

Pensions carry another tax benefit: they grow free of tax, unlike deposit accounts in Banks etc (which are generally subject to tax on interest in the form of DIRT) or investment in property or shares (where rent or dividends are liable to income tax and gains in value are subject to Capital Gains Tax).

When pension benefits are drawn down, a Retirement Lump Sum can usually be taken either completely free of tax or subject to a beneficial rate. The rest of the benefit, is usually taken in the form of a retirement fund or a pension for life, is taxable. However many people will find themselves in a lower tax bracket in retirement than when they were working and making pension contributions, and so will often not pay a lot of tax on their pension income when they retire.



For example, there will never be any hidden charges or admin fees with our loans, nor will there be any stressful balloon payment at the end of the loan term. We will work with borrowers to ensure the loan repayments are structured in a way that best suits their financial circumstances. With PCP agreements however, the contract terms are fixed, so consumers can neither extend the term of the loan, nor increase their monthly repayments. Other limitations include sticking to an agreed mileage limit and committing to certain car services. Not to mention the fact that the consumer never actually owns the car until they pay off the balloon payment.

"We would really urge those opting for the electric or hybrid cars to seriously consider the benefits of a credit union car loan. They have already made the best choice for the environment, now they need to make the best choice for their personal finances. Credit unions are not-for-profit, so our main concern when we are lending is the financial wellbeing of the borrower.

BLACK VALLEY BIDS FAREWELL TO ONE OF THEIR OWN

he death took place this week of well known Black Valley resident Eileen Tangney - here is an extract Valerie O'Sullivan's book - Macgillycuddy's Reeks People and Places (in which she writes about the Tangney family and their lives in the Black Valley. Michael (Dyke) and Eileen Tangney, The Black Valley Hostel, or 'The Hall' as its known to the locals. Eileen moved into the Valley in 1961, originally from Beaufort. She and Michael set up the Black Valley Hostel in 1964. Eileen recalls when she moved in the Valley their were no phones or electricity, so washing and providing for six children was no easy undertaking. When electricity finally arrived in 1978, - the last place in Ireland! The first thing the Tangneys bought was a washing machine. Eileen recalls "Siobhán was the only one that was born when we had electricity so she had a great time because we'd be able to get

clothes dry. The electricity was a great asset to the valley, It was 1985 before we got the phone, before that, we'd have to go 5 or 6 miles to the nearest telephone, if somebody got sick suddenly, you would have to travel over the Gap of Dunloe to Kate Kearney's Cottage to get to send for an ambulance or a priest" Michael and Eileen have six children, Mary Rose, Gene, Derry, Mike, Irene, Susan, Siobhan, and seven Grandchildren, Gary, Christina, Claire, Michelle, Feidhlin, Sinead and Fiadhna.

Michael and Eileen have very fond memories of the Biddies with their dear friends Sheila and Sonny O'Sullivan. "St Brigid's day the 1st of February, we'd celebrate by going out "on the Biddy". We'd all dress up with white shirts and pants, straw hats and wear masks on their faces. Many's the time we went to Kenmare on the Biddy, we used to have great fun,



dancing in every house and then we'd have a Biddy ball and dance till morning...There was always plenty of tea and braic" Michael is now retired as one of the Gap Pony men, Their daughter Susan now runs the iconic Hostel, a favourite refuge for visitors on the Kerry

Way 200Km trek. The Tangney House is always open..The kettle i always on the boil, as Eileen says "You'd never be lonesome in the Valley".

Climbing **Plants**



limbing plants are an essential feature of every garden and they can be used to transform a wall, trellis or fence. Alternatively, you can grow climbing plants through other plants, especially shrub varieties that flower early in the season. A climbing plant can add that extra colour later in the year. As well as growing climbing plants simply for the flowers, berries or autumn colour, you can use them to disguise an unsightly oil tank, to screen dustbins or to conceal some other unattractive feature. Planting

Climbing plants will grow for many years so it is essential to prepare the soil well before planting. Dig organic matter deeply into the surrounding soil. Dig the hole deeper and wider than necessary and break up the bottom of the hole. Add some organic matter and lightly fork it into the bottom. When planting close to a wall it is necessary that the plant is at least 30cm away from it, or even a little more. This is because the soil at the base of a wall is often very dry. For the same reason, if you are growing the plant through a bush or tree plant it away from the trunk. When planting a climber, make certain that the level of the soil around the plant stem is the same as it was when the plant was in its container. An exception to this rule is clematis, which should always be planted 3-7cms deeper.


Training and Pruning

Fan young shoots out so that they cover a wide area rather than make a single column. Then tie them into the support if necessary. The amount of pruning required will vary with the plant, from none at all to cutting almost to the ground each year, as with some clematis. Seek advice when purchasing as to the individual climbing plant's pruning requirements.


Tying

The best way of tying the plant to its support is to form a figure-of-eight with the string, crossing it over between the plant and the support. Tie the knot at the back of the support if possible or at the side. Wall Supports Climbing plants are useful for softening the walls of a house or for concealing an eyesore such as a garage or oil tank. In some cases it may be necessary to construct a trellis or screen. In others, the plants can be attached directly to a wall. If the wall has to be painted regularly, use a trellis fixed to a frame. Attach this with hinges at the bottom so that it can be eased away from the wall without breaking the climber, allowing the wall to be painted. Use rotating blocks at the top to hold it in place.



7. Children also benefit from exercise:

even at ages as low as 3-5 years, reports now suggest that they benefit from consistent physical activity. Increases physical activity in children will reduce the risk of increased body weight and adiposity, improve cardiovascular risk factor status, fewer symptoms of depression, and favorable signs of bone health in children aged 3-17. Physical activity that boost bone health include hopping, skipping, jumping, tumbling, and other forms of dynamic high impact, short duration exercise. Children should get 60 mins per day of moderate to vigorous physical activity.

8. Exercise is a must as we grow older: considerable evidence shows the benefits of various modes or combinations of physical activity in the 65-and - older population. Progressive resistance training, multi component exercise, dual - task- training, tai chi, yoga, dance and other activities can improve strength, balance, gait speed and ability to perform activities of daily living. "Multicomponent" programs combine elements of aerobic, muscle strengthening and balance training. Dual - task programs combine cognitive activity (such as counting backwards) with physical movements. Research suggests 150-300 minutes of moderate intensity activities for older adults. Because older adults expend more energy than younger adults for the sane task (eg walking) exercises should progress at an intensity relative to individual fitness levels.

Welcome to our brand-new Run Killarney race column for 2019. Over the coming weeks we'll help you on your journey to the start line in Killarney on 20th July.

About Me

My name is Brian, I run the RunninginIreland.com website and blog. I am not an elite athlete; I don't think I'd consider myself a fast runner either. I just love to run. But I have done a lot of races, including Killarney and I will draw on this experience to help you on your way.



On this, the 4th week of the Run Killarney race column, it's time to talk through the specifics of the course and how to approach it.

Half-marathon

The course is attractive to achieve a personal best (PB) as you start in Molls Gap and run downhill to the National Park. The potential pitfall is if you go out too quickly and burn out before the finish.

Go out slow, there is a slight incline at 1.5 miles and 3 miles, so if you feel yourself taking off, think of about this, Miles 3 to 4 offer the most spectacular views of any race I have ever been in, just enjoy your race then, forget your times and soak up the scenery.

The decline continues until close to mile 7, so you should be able to keep a decent pace without using too much energy. Just be cautious not to 'pound' the road too hard, you could end up hurting your joints. From mile 7 the course closes a bit, there's more tree cover, which can be useful if it's a hot July day. Focus on keeping the pace you had set from early on to maintain momentum and confidence now that you're on the flat.

The park is quite open with not much shelter. There are some ups and downs too so keep your pace until Muckross Abbey, then if you still feel good, this is the time to stretch the legs.

10K

The start of the 10K is really a very slight incline, but it will be good for managing your pace on the day. There are plenty of twists and turns early on, so although there will be a lot of runners, try and maintain a good racing line.

At the turn into the National Park, there is a serious decline; the temptation will be to push your pace there - don't. Keep in mind the description above. There are some small sharp inclines, if you have gone full-tilt, they will take the pace out of your legs. Hold your speed until the last 1 or 2kms and you will have a great finish. There are many ways to break down the race. Find a version that will work for you.

Tip of the Week!

Don't try anything new on race day that you haven't used in training. This applies to race gear, food, drinks, gels, etc.

hree victorious Kerry football teams will be honoured at the Gaelic Player Association's (GPA) Football Legends Lunch on the eve of the All-Ireland Football final. The winning teams from 1969, 1979 and 2009 will be celebrated at a lunch on Saturday 31st August in Croke Park. In 2009, Kerry beat Cork with a score of 0-16 to 1-09, winning their 36th All-Ireland Senior Football title. Kerry's Tadhq Kennelly became the first person to ever hold AFL Premiership

and All-Ireland winning medals in the sports of Australian rules football and Gaelic football. Managed by Jack O'Connor, Colm 'Gooch' Cooper scored six points in the game and later that year, Paul Galvin won an All-Star and the Footballer of the Year award.

In 1979, Kerry defeated Dublin 3-13 to 1-8. Managed by Mick O'Dwyer, Kerry's Mikey Sheehy was the championship's top scorer with an impressive 6 goals and 18 points. He

was also named as the Texaco Footballer of the Year that year.

In 1969, Kerry beat Offaly 0-10 to 0-07 in the first championship meeting between both sides. Mick O'Dwyer was part of the All-Ireland winning team.

RUGBY HERO MOSS KEANE'S ALMA MATER WILL REMEMBER HIM WITH A SCHOLARSHIP



University College Cork will today launch a new student rugby scholarship to honour rugby hero Moss Keane and name UCC Rugby out-half James Taylor as its inaugural recipient. niversity College Cork will today launch a new student rugby scholarship to honour rugby hero Moss Keane and name UCC Rugby out-half James Taylor as its inaugural

UCC President Professor Patrick O' Shea will launch the Moss Keane Rugby Scholarship, a programme designed to give talented young rugby players from across Munster the opportunity of developing their full sporting and academic potential within the University. Professor O'Shea noted that Moss Keane had won 51 caps for Ireland including a Triple Crown in 1981, had toured New Zealand with the British and Irish Lions in 1977 and was a key member of the immortal Munster side to down the All Blacks in 1978.

James Taylor, the inaugural winner of the Moss Keane Rugby Scholarship, has just completed his second year studying Finance in UCC. He was a member of UCC's All Ireland Division 1A team in 2018/19, the leading points scorer for UCC and the AIL division 1 in his first year playing at the top level. He was awarded a UCC Sports Star Award in April of this year and the All Ireland League Rising Star Award by the IRFU at its annual awards at the end of the season. James will receive a monetary award in addition to physio, medical, physiological testing, nutritional advice, strength and conditioning, and all other services required to progress in his sport whilst playing for UCC. The Scholarship will ensure that James is provided with all the backup support required for him to progress in his rugby career and assist with his academic career. Rory Bevan, President of UCC Rugby Club, said that James Taylor was a worthy recipient of the scholarship. He noted that while James had been successfully studying for a Degree in Finance, he had been instrumental in the rise of UCC RFC to the top level of Irish Club Rugby over the last few seasons.

"His abilities had been recognised with selection on the Irish Students team over the last two years and he had been named as the All Ireland League Rising Star Award by the IRFU in 2019."

A native of Currow, County Kerry, 'Mossie' was originally a Gaelic footballer for his county and UCC before being introduced to rugby as a 23-year-old student. Keane embarked on his rugby journey at the University while studying for primary and post-graduate Degrees in Dairy Science and he remained a committed supporter of the University Rugby Club until his untimely death in 2010 aged just 62.

Former University, Munster and Irish teammates of Moss Keane will be in attendance including fellow members of the Munster team, which defeated the All Blacks in 1978, Moss Finn and Christy Cantillon. Moss's daughter Ann Marie Keane will present the inaugural bursary on behalf of the family to James Taylor at a ceremony this evening. Keane expressed sincere thanks on behalf of the family to both the University and the Rugby Club for recognising her father in this manner. His time in UCC, she noted, had to a great degree formed the wonderful man that he became.

CARING FOR ALL ANIMALS URING HOT WEATHER

Never leave animals in hot cars, conservatories, outbuildings or caravans, even if it's just for a short while. Temperatures can quickly rise to 47°C (117°F) which can result in death. ... Ensure pets always have access to shade and fresh drinking water to help keep them cool.

Pets can become dehydrated and overheat quickly, so it is important for owners to be aware of the signs of overheating. These include excessive panting, increased heart rate, dry or pale gums and weakness or if they collapse. To avoid overheating, it is vital not to overexert pets, make sure they always have access to fresh water and are out of the sun.

If your pet is showing signs of overheating, move it to a cooler area immediately, spray with cool, not cold water, and give a small drink of water and contact your vet straight away.

*Ensure pets always have access to shade and fresh drinking water to help keep them cool.

* If you have a rabbit or other small mammals in the garden, keep their living quarters in the shade. You could also cover the front of their living quarters with newspaper as they can heat up very quickly.

*All caged animals, even if they are indoors, should be kept out of direct sunlight. Keep an eye on aviaries or birdcages, which are close to a window.

*Check all birds / animals and their beds etc every day for flystrike.

*Putting ice cubes into your dog or cat's water bowl or making some tasty ice cube treats is another fantastic idea.

*Provide damp towels for your pet to lie on or an ice pack wrapped in a towel. Both could provide a welcome relief from the heat.

Please also be mindful of common chemicals that may be in your home this summer, as these can be toxic to pets and wildlife if ingested. Sun creams, insect repellent, weed killer etc are extremely dangerous if they are ingested and need to be stored securely.

*Turning your outside space into a home for nature by doing simple things like topping up your birdbath, creating a make-shift pond from a shallow dish (or add small stones to a deeper one) or putting down a saucer filled with water could offer a vital lifeline for some of our wildlife.

POLLEN TRACKER FOR HAYFEVER AMID WARNING ASTHMA DEATHS ON THE RISE

Asthma and hayfever sufferers have been warned that pollen levels are on the rise and could lead to potentially fatal asthma attacks.

The Asthma Society issued the advice as they warned that asthma deaths are increasing here and a person dies every six days from the condition. Today they launched a pollen tracker alongside Dyson Ireland to guide people about the pollen levels nationwide and give a forecast for the following day. Sarah O'Connor, CEO of the Asthma Society of Ireland, said: "For the 300,800 people who have asthma and hayfever, hayfever can be particularly dangerous. Hayfever symptoms are capable of escalating an asthma attack, which in some cases can be fatal. In addition, people with hayfever experience symptoms which really compromise their quality of life and ability to enjoy the summer months. As pollen levels soar during the summer months, Asthma Ireland advised people who suffer from Asthma and hayfever to talk to a doctor or pharmacist NOW about taking medication to prevent / reduce your symptoms. Don't wait until you feel unwell. They also said that common hayfever symptoms to look out for include frequent sneezing, red and itchy eyes, headaches, fatigue and skin under the eyes being swollen and blue.

SOME MACBOOK PROS RECALLED

Facing overheating batteries that "may pose a fire safety risk," Apple launched a voluntary recall and replacement program on Thursday for the 15-inch 2015 MacBook Pro with Retina Display.

"If your MacBook Pro is eligible, please stop using it" is the company's advice.

To find out if your machine is impacted, visit Apple's website and check your MacBook Pro's serial number. The affected laptops sold between September 2015 and February 2017 but given the huge used market for Apple wares, if you bought used it might be worth checking out. If

your machine is a 2015 MacBook Pro with Retina Display, it's sent to an Apple Repair Center where its examined and then fixed in a process that can take up to two weeks. This is the second product recall this year for Apple who in April launched a recall and exchange program for international wall plug adapters because the "plug adapters may break and create a risk of electrical shock if touched."

VISITING DUBLIN? - YOUTHS CAN TRAVEL FREE ON LUAS, DART AND BUS SERVICES FOR THE MONTH OF JULY

Child Leap Card holders will be able to travel on Luas, DART and bus services from July 1st to the 28th inclusive on any Child Leap Card (4-15 or 16-18) provided it has at least 1 cent Travel Credit. Commuter rail services in Dublin's 'Short Hop Zone' are also included as are Bus Eireann services in Dublin and surrounding counties, excluding Expressway services.

DID YOU KNOW?

On June 30, 1953, the first Corvette automobile came off the production line in Flint. It was hand-assembled and featured a Polo White exterior and red interior, two-speed Powerglide automatic transmission, a wraparound windshield, whitewall tires and detachable plastic curtains instead of side windows. The earliest Corvettes were designed to be opened from the inside and lacked exterior door handles. Other components included a clock, cigarette lighter and red warning light that activated when the parking brake was applied—a new feature at the time. The car carried an initial price tag of \$3,490 and could go from zero to 60 miles per hour in 11 or 12 seconds, then considered a fairly average speed.

ON THIS DATE - July 5th

1971 - The US voting age was lowered from 21 to 18 years, and certified by President Nixon.

1975 - American professional tennis player Arthur Ashe became the first black man to win Wimbledon singles' championship.

1996 - The first cloning of an animal by scientists was revealed by the Roslin Institute in Scotland when Dolly the Sheep was cloned from tissue taken from a 6 year old ewe's udder.

2000 - Conservationists launched the (then) largest ever airlift of wild birds, when over 18,000 penguins were moved to safety as an oil slick threatened their South African breeding ground during mating season. A third of the entire species of black-footed penguins (found only in Africa and classified as "threatened") lived on the islands. Thousands of volunteers and zoo experts helped with both the airlift, feeding and the cleaning of nearly 20,000 oil-soaked penguins in thirty days.

In an old house, problems with the foundations may not be visible but the symptoms certainly manifest in issues like bulging, cracked or damp walls. Some issues are easily fixed; others can be nasty, creating terrible difficulties. In the Bible God likens a person's life to a house. Jesus taught us about building our lives on the right foundation when He spoke of the wise and foolish builders. The wise ones establish their identity, principles and morals upon their knowledge and understanding of Who Jesus is - the Son of the Living God who created the earth (Isaiah 40:28). Jesus is the Everlasting Rock (Matthew 7:24; Isaiah 26:3). Only a foolish person builds a house on sand, as that foundation will surely give way and the house will crumble, blown down by storms, wind and rain. The things we've gone through in life are the storms; the houses are our lives; and the foundation is the knowledge and understanding that we have of who we are in Christ, Who He is, and what He accomplished for us at the Cross (Ephesians 1:3-12). The spirit behind the world's system - the devil, constantly seeks to destroy and confuse people's identity through trauma and pain (John 10:10). We've spoken previously of the effect that the father has upon his children - from him comes not only their name, but also their security in who they are. Many people have had a wonderful relationship and blessing from their earthly father's, but many also, have not. This can be a root cause of the spirit of rejection entering which attacks that one's identity. As we study the Bible, the Holy Spirit is like the 'Chief Structural Engineer'. He exposes the very foundations of what we believe about God, and about ourselves. He uses the Word of God to highlight areas where we are struggling or thinking wrongly, and, as we obey the Word of God He transforms our worldly 'stinking-thinking' into understanding what God says about us instead, thus bringing healing and wholeness (1st Thessalonians 5:23). Jesus is the greatest holistic Healer friend - He's waiting for you to ask Him in to heal your heart and life!
