

Small result for big effort: targeting small tourist operators not working

ust twelve **J** Airbnb and other tourist properties among more than 200 targeted in rent pressure zone Killarney have switched from short longto term letting so far, according to Cllr Brendan Cronin (Ind) figures released by the council.



consistently criticised crackdown in Killarney had already warned short-term In other words, the letters would not enter the long

attempt at forcing term market. small operators

in the tourist industry into long-term letting to ease the lack of public housing had a poor outcome.

More than 200 Airbnbs in Killarney were written to Kerry County Council and warning and planning enforcement letters issued in the majority of cases.

However, the figures released to this column, on request, show that of the 145 files now closed following investigation, 43 properties have ceased to let altogether. 60 have opted to register for limited short-term letting in their principal private residence.

Just one has been granted permission for stand alone tourist letting.

Enforcement issues are outstanding against 56 properties and files are not fully closed, But so far the vast majority of tourist renters have either ceased to let altogether or have registered for short-term limited letting with the council.

Just how that limited 90-day window is to be policed remains to be seen.

The council were "statute barred" and could take no legal action against 18 premises, as the businesses were able to prove their business was in operation with seven years and more.

But the telling figure is how only 12 properties, or six per cent of the total number of cases, have opted to enter the long-term letting market and register with the tenancies board. And that was the whole point of all this costly effort.

(In eleven cases the complaints were without foundation and the premises had permission or duplicate files had opened).

Cllr Brendan Cronin (Ind) who has consistently criticised the crackdown in Killarney had already warned short-term letters would not enter the long term market.

It seems he was overwhelmingly correct.

Big increase in Motorhomes arriving in Kerry

here is a phenomenal rise in the number of campervans and motorhomes arriving in Killarney and along the Ring of Kerry this

The subject came to light during the Kenmare council meeting in Killorglin last week. The campervans are lining up thirty at a time on the Kenmare Pier and there are no facilities for them. Locals and tourists going for a walk by the sea have no place to park, according to Cllr Dan McCarthy who said he was inundated with complaints.

A code of conduct for campervans is being looked at now, thanks to Cllr Norma Moriarty who wants the visitors to enjoy the county, but also preserve the amenities.

We have the same situation in Killarney . Despite having some of the best facilities in the southwest in our camp sites, we have large campers overnighting here, there and everywhere. Some are clogging up viewing points such that no-one else can see the view or get a space.

It has to be said, we have no "aires" or continental style parking areas for motorhomes in Kerry - public parking areas and some private land where motorhomes can stop overnight for a small fee for basic facilities.

Yet Failte Ireland is encouraging camper vans to visit the Ring! The burden is falling on petrol stations and bars with car parks, and viewing points to bring up the slack.

Paul Dunne, operations manager with Rambling Rover Campervans near Slane in Co Meath said the stereotype of the campervanner as "low spend" is anything but true.

His fleet of luxury brand new motor homes is booked solid for the rest of the summer by mostly well-heeled Irish families.

The base price is 250 euro a night and rising to 350, so those renting the camper vans for sometimes up to three weeks are not financially stretched, Dunne says.

These are people who will spend in restaurants and towns and not least on diesel and towns without facilities are losing out.

I had the same information from a dedicated Killarney man who has travelled to the South of Spain and Monaco and all over in his


motor home. Whereas in Waterford towns like Ardmore are hugely benefiting from their "aires" or basic stop over parks, we have none in Kerry, he says.


"The big issue is secure parking overnight to empty toilets etc. The worst facilities in all of Ireland are in Kerry," he said, speaking from Cobh in Co Cork where there is a top class "aire". However it also has to be acknowledged that no matter how many parks and facilities there are, some people will simply blackquard the thing. And while a code of conduct is certainly a good idea, who will police it?

Mary picked up the keys of her new car from Shane Foley & Elma Culloty of Killarney Credit Union this week accompanied by family.



New Mayor of Tralee, Cllr Mikey Sheehy said the festival had become a key event in the calendar in Tralee.







Once operational, the new sewerage scheme will connect into the sewer network in Killarney town, where it will be collected and transferred Killarney wastewater treatment plant (WWTP) for appropriate treatment.

Speaking about the works, David Shalloo, Wastewater Regional Delivery Lead with Irish Water, said,

"Today signals a new beginning for the people of Kilcummin and delivering this project for the community is an immense source of pride for Irish Water and Kerry County Council. All new infrastructure has been sized to accommodate future population growth and the project will enhance the local environment and provide a platform for social and economic development well into the future".

The scheme will ensure compliance with wastewater discharge regulations. It will also improve water quality in the River Deenagh and Lough Leane and protect recreational

waters for swimming, fishing, boating and sightseeing, as well as protecting the integrity of the local environment. The new wastewater infrastructure will enhance local amenities and provide a platform for social and economic development.

The new sewerage infrastructure to be constructed as part of this scheme will include a sewer network for Kilcummin village, a pumping station, and approximately 6 kms of sewers. The scheme will reduce the reliance on on-site systems such as septic tanks and package treatment plants.

Works on the project are expected to commence late in 2022, with the entirety of the project due for completion in 2024.

Irish Water and Kerry County Council will continue to update the local community in Kilcummin as we progress our work on this project.

€350,000 INVESTMENT IN 12 KERRY OUTDOOR ADVENTURE PROJECTS ANNOUNCED

. Smoking, and exposure to smoke, significantly increases your chances of developing eye disease and suffering sight loss. It's never too late to benefit from stopping. But the sooner you stop, the better the outcome is likely to be.

macular degeneration (AMD)

AMD is the most common cause of sight loss in Ireland and mainly affects older people. Smokers are up to four times more likely to develop the condition.

4. Uveitis

Smokers are at least twice as likely to develop uveitis – a condition where the middle layer of the eyeball becomes inflamed, causing eye pain and changes to your vision. The condition can also lead to secondary eye conditions, such as glaucoma and cataracts.

5. Diabetic retinopathy

If you suffer from diabetes, smoking increases your risk of developing retinopathy, where the blood vessels in the retina at the back of the eye become damaged. This often causes blurred vision and dark spots and can lead to permanent loss of vision.







LOCAL AUTHORITY HOME LOAN



Local Authority Home Loan Scheme

ianna Fáil Councillor, Michael Cahill has gueried the recently announced statistic, that 76% of applicants to the Local Authority Home Loan scheme in Kerry were declined versus a national figure of 53%. The figures provided by Minister for Housing, Darragh O'Brien, show that 15 of the 21 applications in Kerry between January and the end of May this year were declined, as against a national figure of 545 out of 1,026 unsuccessful.

"I would be worried about the large difference in the percentage of declines locally in Kerry as against nationally, in case the criteria for acceptance is working against rural dwellers here in Kerry" stated Councillor Cahill.

"It would be beneficial to know if there were particular requirements that applicants in Kerry could not fulfil,

that people in other parts could. This kind of information would be very helpful in informing the Council, it's members and applicants, of the direction we need to take to improve the provision of housing in our county" added the Rossbeigh based Councillor.

EV CHARGING AND ACCOMMODATION

ianna Fáil Councillor, Michael Cahill has suggested that if Officials in the **Departments of Tourism and Transport were** seeking initiatives common to both, and supportive of a cleaner environment, they should be looking to introduce additional funding support, other than SEAI grants, to encourage B&B's, Hotel and Guest House owners to install Electric Vehicle Chargers to be availed of by their guests.

"This could be the simple way to extend the network of EV chargers throughout the country, encourage the changeover to EV transport and provide a service to those already driving EVs. Environmentally and business wise, this appears to be the way to go and we need to facilitate it in whatever way possible" stated Councillor Cahill.


"Currently a visitor to Glenbeigh, where I live, driving an EV, will need to travel 13km to Killorglin and queue there to use one of the

two chargers. This is less than ideal, while a charger at the place they are staying would alleviate a lot of the pressure of planning one's road trip" said the Rossbeigh based Councillor.

"If we can encourage many of the proprietors of these B&B's, Hotels and



Guest Houses to install EV chargers, we will help our Tourism business, we will help the Environment, while also reducing queues at our Public charging points" added Councillor Cahill.

ROYAL FLUSH FOR KERRY LADIES

ALL IRELAND FINAL: MEATH 3-10 KERRY 1-7



Prior to the game, I was reading a lot of predictions that were describing Kerry as very much underdogs, and I was questioning why. I felt that Kerry had a great chance. In fact, I had Kerry as slight favourites after their performances; I thought Meath were lucky enough to get over the line against Donegal in particular. The LGFA are absolutely brilliant at promotion (much better than the GAA, not least because Lidl are very proactive sponsors and TG4 put great effort into their coverage) and it means that you can see and access an awful lot of the previous action when previewing a game like this.

I got a hard lesson - Kerry, unfortunately, got a much harder one. That Meath team are experienced at pulling games out of the fire, but they didn't need to in this one. Once they took over, they did so completely. In fact, Kerry did well just to stay in touch as long as they did.

Kerry made a fantastic start. Ciara Murphy kicked over a great score off her left. Louise Ní Muircheartaigh missed her first free but soon made amends to double our tally after Niamh Carmody was fouled. Louise followed up with one of the best goals of the season, turning over the kick-out and beautifully lobbing the best current keeper in the game, Monica McGuirk. 1-2 to 0-0.

Unfortunately, kick-out turnovers were to become a major feature of the game, and not in a good way for Kerry. The fact is that Meath pressed very hard on our kick-ours, winning six out of eleven in the first half alone (they destroyed on breaking ball), and then dropped back deep to choke off any space for our attackers to operate. Kerry played into their hands a bit by slow, careful

build-up rather than direct kicks. By the time we got the ball into the danger area, Meath had bodies back to snuff out any danger and Kerry were repeatedly robbed off possession. Meath's speed off the counter-attack was reminiscent of the Tyrone mens' team of the early millennium – it was more transformation than transition. Aoibhín Cleary got huge praise for her speed breaking out and Niamh O'Sullivan was awarded Player of the Game at the receiving end, but the key player for me was once again Emma Duggan. A huge amount of Meath's play went through her and she never put a foot wrong.

Stacey Grimes opened Meath's account from a free after nine minutes. That opened the floodgates. A great run by Kelsey Nesbitt was offloaded to Emma Troy coming through the centre and she finished brilliantly. Straight from the kick-out, Vikki Wall, another Royal dynamo, levelled matters at 1-2 apiece with a free and added another. Meath were in front after thirteen minutes and would never relinquish it. Stacey Grimes added her second. Emma Duggan was wide with her first free but once again Meath pounced on the kick-out and Emma Duggan and Megan Thynne combined for Emma Troy to split the posts. Great defending by Eilís Lynch prevented another one, but this was one way traffic, with absolutely nothing sticking up front for Kerry. It reminded me of the second quarter of the Munster Final when Cork took over completely, as Vikki Wall made it 1-6 to

Siofra O'Shea kicked a fine point from outside that defensive blanket to relieve the pressure slightly. Niamh Carmody almost got in for another after good work by Emma Costello,

but Shauna Ennis made a brilliant last-ditch tackle. Niamh O'Sullivan stretched Meath's lead from distance, but Paris McCarthy replied smartly.

Vikki Wall won a free put over by Stacey Grimes and then appeared to have added another. Bizarrely, referee Maggie Farrelly called the play back for a free. This is a little bugbear of mine. A point is much more advantageous than a free, so why bring it back? This happens a lot in mens' football as well - how often do you see an apparent penalty called back for an earlier free by a defender? It's an advantage rule, not a disadvantage rule.

Instead Kerry went direct with a beautiful passage of play that saw Lorraine Scanlon, whom I thought was Kerry's best player on the day, close out the first half scoring.

Half-time Meath 1-8 Kerry 1-5. Similar to the mens' All Ireland Final, I wasn't too worried at this stage. Meath had completely dominated the first half after that initial Kerry burst. I 'knew' that we had a lot more in the tank and a three point lead (with three scoreable wides and two dropped short) was scant enough and plenty manageable.

My confidence looked justified early on as Siofra O'Shea sent over a fine point after the Kerry defence did well to clear their lines. Louise Ó Muircheartaigh won and converted a free. Back to a one point game.

Two points again, after a great run by Emma Troy was illegally ended and Emma Duggan slotted the free. Both sides left scoring chances behind them at this stage - Duggan was at least as impressive in defence as she had been in attack. We are struggling for scores ourselves, as Paris McCarthy sent a

chance wide, but we are still very much in this game.

Then we aren't. Meath turned over our kick-out (an ongoing theme, I'm afraid) and another burst by Aoibhín Cleary saw her offload to Stacey Grimes, who drew the keeper Ciara Butler before sending across for Bridgetta Lynch to finish. With fifteen minutes left, Kerry introduced Erica McGlynn up front. I'd have inclined towards bringing herself and possibly Louise Galvin earlier on or maybe switching Lorraine Scanlon inside - those are great players for winning long ball and we needed to be more direct to beat Meath's tactic of flooding their defence - arrah, easy for me to talk, it wouldn't take you long to peruse my All Ireland medal collection! Meath were also willing to give away more fouls than chances - that's not me being sanctimonious, I'd have been doing exactly the same thing.

Just to banish any lingering wisps of hope, they add another hammer blow. This time Vikki Wall breaks from halfway with another electrifying burst of pace and offloads to Stacey Grimes. Her shot comes off the post and breaks kindly for Bridgetta Lynch, who still had to show a lot of skill to get the shot off quickly from close range. 3-9 to 1-7, and Niamh O'Sullivan added another point before the final whistle.

Meath are All Ireland champions, and very deservedly so. They were the better side here, even if it took them time to actually show it on the scoreboard. In fact, it looks like

the biggest obstacle to them dominating the game like Kerry did in the '80s, Cork afterwards (probably the best team I have seen play the game, in fairness, they were awesome) and latterly Dublin, is the lure of Aussie Rules.

Kerry will be disappointed at the moment, of course, but this has been a great year for them. The most important thing for me was actually getting out of Division Two we belong in the top tier of the game and it will sharpen us along the way. Cork are still the queens of Munster - having that rivalry doesn't hurt us either. I fully expect Kavleigh Cronin, Emma Costello, Cáit Lynch, and Louise Ní Muircheartaigh to be picking up All Stars. Aishling O'Connell, Loraine Scanlon, and Siofra O'Shea should be in that conversation as well. We also have good players sojourning in the States who should hopefully be back in the fold in the near future.

It has taken a decade for Kerry to get back to an All Ireland Final after that defeat to Cork in 2012. I don't expect that we will be waiting anything like as long for the next one.

INTERMEDIATE DEFEAT FOR BERNIE BREEN

Bernie Breen was one of the great Kerry midfielders. An incredible prodigy, she won two U14 All Irelands with Kerry and a Féile with Beaufort, plus a U16 All Ireland with the county. She won Kerry Junior and Senior titles with Beaufort and another senior with Killarney Legion in 2011. She was nominated for All Stars five times ('10, '12, '13, '14, and '15) and was Munster Player of the Year. She moved to Wexford in 2017 and was soon invited into their county pabel and has played astarringrole with them ever since. Last Sunday she played with them against Laois in the Intermediate Final, but they lost too much ground in the first half, trailing by 1-9 to 0-3 at the break. A great point by Bernie helped to kick-start the revival but they left too many goal chances behind them, the final passing too often lacking crispness, to lose by 1-13 to 1-11. Laois' Aisling Donoher was named Player of the Game. There may have been a bit of a sympathy vote, understandable given that the full back played the final before continuing her fundraising to bring her son to the US for a necessary operation. For the little that it's worth, Laois forward Mo Nerney gave an absolute exhibition.


HURLING ST. PATS HURLERS CELEBRATE 40 YEARS

COUNTY FINAL

Look, I'm not the only one who thinks that Kerry's domestic hurling scene is drawing to a close far too abruptly. Hurling, far more than football, requires constancy for excellence, and far too many players won't be playing a competitive game until next year. I do have a lot of sympathy for the fixtures committee - the fact that Kerry has both a senior club and a separate county championship that includes divisional teams is, for me, the greatest strength of Kerry football, but it does make for a very tight calendar. Adding dual players to that mix - and Kerry have always had brilliant dual players like the Boyles, the Gouldings, Brandon Barrett, Donal Down O'Sullivan, John Mark Foley, Michael Slattery, Barry O'Mahony, Oisin Maunsell, Jack Sheehan, Luke Crowley, and many more - makes the mix unworkable, but we have to look at allowing space for the hurling to breathe, despite the difficulty. Causeway produced a great comeback to see

off champions Kilmoyley, whose All Ireland

run to Croke Park really lit a Kerry hurling torch last year. They have the great John Mike Dooley in goal, Jason and Joseph Diggins, and Kerry sharpshooters Brandon Barrett, Daniel Goggin, Colum Harty, and Gavin Dooley on board - that's serious firepower. But Ballyduff have been iconic in Kerry hurling ever since the first Hennessy picked up a hurley (I imagine the wheel was being invented around the same time). Pádraig was easily Kerry's best hurler this year - the youngest of the clan (although the next generation are rising fast) was a phenomenal prodigy and has lived uo to all the billing. Mikey is simply an indomitable force. Aidan came off the bench late on in the semifinal. Add in the likes of the Gouldings and Eoin Ross, and you have a powerful cocktail. Ballyduff haven't lifted the Neilus Flynn Cup since 2017 - that's a long time wait by their own standards, and I expect it to end shortly. Ballyduff surrendered their County Minor title after two years to St. Brendans in areal thriller. When talking about great dual players, the likes of Odhrán Ferris and Liam Óg O'Connor for the winners and Evan Boyle and Oisín Healy for the losers are well worth keeping a future eye on, these are serious talents.

Kilgarvan, who put 3-13 past a fancied Parnells and 2-23 past Lady's Walk, will likely go in as favourites against St. Brendans' B team in the Intermediate, but it's far from a foregone conclusion.

ATHLETICS

BASKETBALL

Chances are that if you ask most people to name the best basketball players ever, one name will be conspicuously brilliant. Everybody will have the same name at the top of their list. Michael Jordan – we can take that as a given. He had great foils in Pippen and rebound renegade Rodman, though. Larry Bird will be there - for youngers readers, take the likeable Steve Kerr, and make him twice as good. That was Bird. His greatest rival, and close friend, was Magic Johnson, the point guard who doubled up as a power forward. Isiah Thomas deserves to be there - his exclusion from the original Dream Team was a disgrace that cheapened the sport (some of us feel that including some of the highest-paid professional athletes demeans the Olympics anyway). Hakeem Olujawon and Kareen Abdul-Jabbar. Julius Irving - the phrase 'role model' is thrown around cheaply these days, but it applies, Dr. J was a class act all the way. Love or hate LeBron, he has to be included. Likewise Kobe Bryant - he embellished a winning team and he was inordinately fond of the camera, but the boy could play. Shaq was more big than brilliant, in my opinion, and craved attention more than victory. You can't ignore the first billionaire from the sport, though, and he was occasionally brilliant. Personally I'd have Durant, Harden, or Nowitski first - they don't post the individual numbers, but they selflessly get their teams over the line more often than not. These guys are more Lionel Messi, where Jordan or Kobe were more like Ronaldo. John Stockton was the Vinnie Jones of the NBA, so spare me that conversation. Postman Malone, Garnett, Iversen, Drexler, Wade...no. Sorry, super players, but just not at the level I am talking about. Steph Curry? Sure. I don't know if he epitomised a new long range era in the game or if he created it, but he certainly transformed the entire approach to the game – thankfully, there was a lot less skill in those muscular collisions at the post. I see parallels between modern basketball and modern hurling, to be honest, in regards to long range accuracy.


Young people always assume that the players from their era are the best of all time. Was Mick O'Connell really a better fielder than Paddy Kennedy? Would anyone honestly choose David Beckham over Tom Finney? If I can't watch it on you tube, did it really happen? Remember when soccer was invented, away back in 1992, with the Premiership? Dixie Dean? Never heard of him.

Even so, most people will remember the name of Wilt Chamberlain. No-one – not Jordan, not LeBron, not Kobe – no-one has ever put up his kind of shooting numbers. He was dunking the ball before people even had a name for the concept. And he did it all with a smile on his face. When basketball enjoyed its first flush of mainstream popularity in the sixties (Jordan took it into the stratosphere thirty years later), Wilt was the reason why. People forget that he was only the second best player of his own generation.

Michael Jordan won six rings in eight years. Bill Russell won eleven titles in thirteen years with the Boston Celtics.

That was in an America in the sixties, when the conservatism of a war generation was being challenged by young and outspoken liberals. Bill grew up, not just in abject poverty, but in a time and place where segregation was automatic and lynching was not uncommon. I've heard stories that he was a poor player in high school until he got a growth spurt in his late teens. Pure cobblers – he was 6'5" and then grew five inches. He was a starting player in high school in a very competitive outfit and he was a black guy who got a basketball scholarship to San Francisco. Fair enough, it wasn't exactly a basketball mecca, but remember that

basketball was predominantly a white sport back then – Russell was playing the first time a college team sensationally started three black players in a game. Kids on the street, especially in New York urban culture, were starting to pay attention.

Strange as it may seem, you didn't have many players over 6'5"back then. The game was played low and fast. It was almost like stickless lacrosse or netball. Of course you needed height, but too much was considered clumsy. Bill Russell had the size of a big man and the skill and finesse of a small one, a David Clifford

of basketball in a way. He was the first to really play the game in the air, a phenomenal leap supplementing his natural height. He led San Francisco to two NCAA titles before signing for the Celtics and unquestionably leading them to be the most successful team of all time. Pistons, Lakers, Bulls, Warriors....stop. Nobody even comes close.

So why haven't you heard more about Bill Russell? Plain and simple, Bill was unremittingly unfriendly off the court. Not only did he fervently believe in making his teams win because he believed that a black players would be denied individual honours, but he took every opportunity to say so. Not in a hostile fashion, he was both courteous and articulate, but middle class America didn't really want to listen – they had to deal with a lot of new concepts during a socially turbulent sixties already. Remember that Jackie Robinson had played baseball just ten years before Bill Russell played basketball. He was playing in

high school when a woman named Rosa Parks sat on a bus in Montgomery. He called out an America that wasn't ready for uncomfortable questions – remember, this was the generation between World War II and Vietnam and white America had

never been so prosperous. They wanted a Harlem Globetrotter, but Russell always played to the scoreboard rather than the audience. Smiling Wilt Chamberlain was the face of the growing sport – Chamberlain was a genuinely nice guy who understood that the media could popularise the game, he certainly wasn't trying to sell shoes (those of you who think that's a dig at Michael Jordan over his attitude to Strom Thurmond – you are absolutely right). Bill Russell insisted on being a hero on his own terms, and the America of that time didn't like him

I do. Or rather, I did – Bill Russell passed away earlier this week. He left behind a game that he had changed utterly, helping to both urbanise it outside college sports and elevate it to a global game. But I believe that his greatest achievement, similar to Dr. J, was his positive impact and the changes he wrought on the society he grew up in. May he rest in peace.

MAKE THE PRICE AT THE PUMPS GO FURTHER

The cost of fuel is the most talked about issue at the moment and fuel consumption has a lot to do with the car you buy, but whatever you drive there are things you can do to save fuel, save money and cut pollution.

Here are a few tips to help run your car efficiently.

Maintenance

Get your car serviced regularly for best efficiency

Always use the right specification of engine oil (check your handbook)

Check your tyre pressures regularly and before long journeys – under-inflated tyres will make your car use more fuel

Before you go

Save weight – extra weight means extra fuel so if you don't need it, take it out

Cut drag – roof-racks and boxes add to your fuel consumption. Pack carefully to reduce drag, or take it off.

Don't hang around – idling wastes fuel and your engine warms up more quickly when you're moving so don't start the engine until

you're ready to go.

De-icing – scrape ice in the winter rather than leave your car idling to warm up

Plan your journey – getting lost wastes fuel. Check traffic news before you go too.

Combine short trips – cold starts use more fuel so it pays to combine trips if you can.

Walk or cycle – if you're only going a couple of miles or so, do you really need to use the car?

Driving

Smooth and gentle – drive smoothly, accelerate gently and read the road ahead to avoid braking unnecessarily. Decelerate smoothly by releasing the accelerator in time, leaving the car in gear.

Keep rolling – stopping then starting again uses more fuel than rolling. Slow early for traffic lights or approaching a queue and you might not have to stop completely.

Change up earlier – don't labour the engine but try changing up at an engine speed of around 2,000 rpm (diesel) or 2,500 (petrol). Since 2014 new car models have been fitted with a gear shift indicator to encourage use of the most efficient gear.

Use your air-con wisely – at low speeds, air-con increases fuel consumption but at higher speeds the effect is less noticeable. Try opening the windows around town and save the air-con for high speed driving. Don't leave it on all the time but running it at least once a week helps keep the system in good condition.

Cut down on the electrics – turn off your rear window heater, demister fan and headlights when you don't need them

Stick to the limit – going faster uses more fuel. Drive at 70mph and you'll use up to 9% more than at 60mph and up to 15% more than at 50mph. Taking it up to 80mph can use up to 25% more fuel than at 70mph.







PLANTS FOR SHADE

Most gardens have a shady spot, a north facing wall, under a tree or in the shadow of the

There is a huge range of plants to suit shaded areas including broad-leaved foliage plants, to spring flowers and ever green flowering shrubs. Ferns are probably the first plant you would think of when it comes to



shade — you can choose from a wide range of ferns from dwarf, medium or large Ferns look very natural when planted under a tree or beside a wall. Most ferns will die back for the winter so if you want all year round foliage you will need to plant something evergreen near the ferns i.e something low growing like the Viburnum Davidii which is a great plant when planted in groups of three. Another good evergreen plant for the shade is the Heuchera which comes in lovely shades including dark to light purple and green to light green.

There is also a wide range of flowering plants for shade. A good example is an Astilbe, an Astilbe has a good range of flower colours and foliage to choose from. An Astilbe has a good range of flower colours and foliage to choose from. Sometimes when an area is shaded, the ground can be quite dry — even in the winter time. A good plant for this would a plant called Vinca Minor which is an evergreen flowering ground cover plant. But remember to water until established.





Now, continuing on our study of healing - last week we saw that feeding on the wrong spiritual food can impair healing, and how the young man Timothy learned from the apostle Paul like an apprentice learns from his or her teacher. The key attribute to learning is listening. We take all our information in through our ear gate and eye gate. Therefore what we watch and what we listen to has an effect upon our lives for good or for bad. Negative news and chatter can drag one down to a low place. But Jesus came to bring Good News! Everywhere He went He preached the same message - repent of your sins and be reconciled to God for His Kingdom is at hand. And everywhere people brought the sick and the tormented to Him and He healed them all (Matthew 15:30; Luke 4:40). But Jesus didn't simply pray for the people. First He taught them the Word of God to build their faith to receive healing. We need this too! Jesus told His followers "My sheep hear My voice and they follow Me" (John


The Scriptures have much to say about hearing God's voice through His Word - not just hearing Him, but actually listening which leads to obedience and receiving God's promises. Many people believe a lie - that they can't hear God. But God is always speaking to us - only we don't pay attention to what He is saying because there are so many things in life that distract us, and even more things amply provided by the devil to prevent us from truly listening to Him! Proverbs tells us that God's wisdom 'shouts' - calling people from the foolishness that ties them up in bondage, but, if we will pay attention to the voice of God the promised result will be.... 'whoever listens to Me will live securely and in confident trust, and will be at ease, without fear or dread of evil disaster' (Proverbs 1:20-33)

The apostle James said "My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires. Therefore, get rid of all moral filth and the evil that is so prevalent and humbly accept the Word planted in you, which can save you. Do not merely listen to the Word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. Anyone who listens to the Word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it - not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it - they will be blessed in what they do." (James 1:19-25 NIV). O Lord God, teach me to hear Your voice and listen to and obey Your Word and let Your Healing Power fill me in Jesus' Name I pray, Amen.




