

# Major Interpretative Exhibition at Killarney House and Gardens Opens

The Interpretative Exhibition in Killarney House – Gateway to The National Park was formally opened at the weekend by Minister of State Brendan Griffin T.D. The opening finalises the Killarney House, Pleasure Grounds and Gardens project which was initiated in 2011.



# Fancy a career in farming?



# College Education Open Day October 12th @11am



Friday, 12th October sees the autumn education open day taking place in Darrara Agricultural College.

This past September has seen the revised education programme for Level 5/6 courses implemented in all six agricultural colleges, including Darrara, the sole college in county Cork. For the new students attending these courses there is a greater emphasis on farm safety, grassland management and sustainability.

For students starting next September, there are a couple of subtle changes to the programme which should help with the learning experience. In year one, a student will go on short 4-week placement early in the course, in October, and return to that farm again in the following spring. During their time in the college between September and May they'll get the foundation training in areas of livestock husbandry, grassland management,

.....

farm business and more specific training in areas such as pesticide application.

In year two which starts the following September the course specialises in either Drystock (Cattle and Sheep) or the longestablished Dairy Herd Management course. Both courses would have longer periods of on-farm training incorporating the calving/ lambing periods on farms but also the breeding season on cattle and dairy farms.

Graduates of Darrara's Level 6 programme have many routes of progression after the two years with us. The Level 6 in its own right is required for applying for jobs with the Department of Agriculture. By 2020 there should be an apprenticeship route in place with a Level 7 qualification.

This will be an important extension to the current programmes as there is an everincreasing demand from farmers in the region to have enthusiastic, forward-thinking young people looking

manage the farms of the next decade. In this respect it is one area of the

to

rural economy where it is a sellers' market. The higher education routes still exist and continue to expand with graduates of Darrara able to gain "advanced entry" to degree courses in agriculture in all of the Institutes of Technology in Munster; including Cork, Tralee and Waterford.

For people who have a non-agricultural qualification there is the option of gaining a Teagasc Green Cert (the Specific Purpose Certificate in Farming) through a part-time route.

The Open Day starts at 11am on the morning of October 12th and all are welcome to explore their options in agricultural education and job prospects that can arise from coming to Darrara in 2019.



# Declan flies the Irish flag

#### SHOULD YOU BE CONSIDERING SWITCHING YOUR MORTGAGE

Yes, because some of the Irish mortgage lenders have much lower mortgage interest rates compared to others. There has been a lot of discussion recently in the media recently as regards mortgage switching this is because there can be a very substantial difference in interest rates and monthly repayments between lenders. For example on a mortgage of €200000 over 30 years based on a property value of €300000 and comparing current fixed interest rates one lenders 2 year fixed rate is as slow as 2.30% (3.90% APR) which costs €770 per month whereas another lenders 2 year fixed rate is as high as 3.30% (APR 3.96%) monthly repayment €876 per month. The monthly repayment for the lender with the higher rate is a staggering €106 per month more expensive. Over the term of the mortgage you would pay €38,271.60 (approx) more in interest based on the above difference in interest rates and based on interest rates not changing. Of course you would need to qualify for the mortgage with the new lender and also there are many other considerations and information you need to know before proceeding further. 



#### **ESB** Networks **Safety Message** for Hedge Cutters


ESB Networks has issued a public safety message warning people about the dangers of coming into contact with power lines when hedge cutting.

Some of the most common dangers include hedge cutters cutting into electricity stays and bringing down poles and wires. There is also the risk of trees or hedges coming down on overhead wires while being cut or the hedge cutter damaging electricity poles."

# **BE ROAD SAFE** and get your Tyres checked

Many drivers do not consider that the only point of contact their vehicle has with the road is the tyres. The condition of those tyres is fundamental to road safety. Damaged and worn tyres can put your life at risk; sudden braking distances are doubled in length; aquaplaning can occur in wet conditions; and even a blow-out can result which could lead to loss of control of the vehicle.

Driving on dangerous or under-inflated tyres puts your life and the lives of other road users at risk. It can also lead to penalty points and a fine of up to  $\in 2,500$ .

Poor tyre conditions are now the leading cause of vehicles failing their NCT Test. Tyre related failures fall into three categories:

• Tyre thread depth below the legal 1.6mm limit

· Cuts or bulges to a tyre

· Mismatched tyres on the same axle.

ITIA President, Paddy Murphy who represents all sectors in the tyre industry in Ireland said: "Few people realise the impact that faulty tyres have on your safety and we all need to be aware that lives can be saved by regular tyre management. During our Tyre Thursday campaign this Summer, all tyres on that date, coming into our members outlets were inspected. We found that 25% of all tyres inspected were at or below the legal limit of 1.6mm which shows that not enough motorists are taking care of their tyres. The benefits of proper tyre maintenance include improved safety; improved car handling and braking; longer tyre life and a reduction in CO2 emissions which helps the environment. We are therefore asking all motorists to avail of the ITIA members offer this coming week and check that their tyres are in order before winter comes in".

Ms. Moyagh Murdock, Chief Executive, Road Safety Authority, recommended: "Drivers really do need to take the issue of tyre safety more seriously. Our own analysis of Garda fatal investigation files between 2008 and 2012 shows that an average of 14 people died annually in crashes where defective tyres were a significant pre-crash factor. It is important vital to ensure your tyres are fit for purpose. This means checking that all tyres are inflated to the correct pressure and that the thread depth has not fallen below the legal limit of 1.6mm. To highlight just how serious an issue tyre safety is, the recent introduction of new EU wide regulations now means that defective tyres are deemed a fail dangerous at the annual NCT and CVRT roadworthiness tests."

The message is clear – Be Safe on the Road and avail of the FREE tyre checks in any ITIA dealership this coming week.



# TAX FOR SELF-EMPLOYED PEOPLE

As a self-employed person you pay income tax under the self-assessment system. You pay Preliminary Tax (an estimate of tax due for your current trading year) on or before 31 October each year and make a tax return for the previous year not later than 31 October.

For example, if your accounting year is from 1 January to 31 December each year, you pay Preliminary Tax for 2018 by 31 October 2018, based on an estimate of your liability for the full year. At the same time, you make a tax return for 2017 and pay any taxes outstanding for that year. If you file your tax return online using the Revenue Online Service (ROS), the due date is 14 November 2018. You are entitled to the normal income tax credits and reliefs. For 2018, you may claim an Earned Income Tax Credit of €1,150 (increased from €550 in 2016 and €950 in 2017). However, if you also qualify for the Employee Tax Credit (formerly known as the PAYE tax credit), the combined value of these 2 tax credits cannot exceed €1,650.

You must keep proper records which include:

- All purchases and sales of goods and services and
- · All amounts received and all amounts paid out

You must keep supporting records (for example, invoices, bank and building society statements, cheque stubs and receipts). You can claim certain business expenses against tax, such as purchase of goods for re-sale, wages, rent, rates, repairs, lighting and heating, running costs of vehicles or machinery used in the business, accountancy fees, interest paid on business loans, leasing payments on vehicles or machinery used in the business as well as contributions to your personal pension (up to certain limits).

If you are working from home you may be able to claim a proportion of household bills such as telephone, heating, lighting etc.

Universal Social Charge, PRSI and VAT

USC: Everyone is liable to pay the Universal Social Charge (USC) if their gross income is over €13,000 in a year.

PRSI: Self-employed people pay Class S PRSI on their income.

#### Value Added Tax (VAT)

You must register for Value Added Tax (VAT) if your annual turnover is more than or is likely to be more than €75,000 for supply of goods or €37,500 for supply of service. As a trader you pay VAT on goods and services acquired for the business and charge VAT on goods and services supplied by the business.



My daughter is repeating a year at college and both the Student Contribution and tuition fees are due this year. Can I claim any tax relief for her third-level course?

#### **ANSWER**

You may be able to claim tax relief on tuition fees (including the Student Contribution) that you pay for your daughter's course.

Tax relief is given at the standard rate of 20%. You can claim it as long as you have actually paid the fees, either for yourself or for another person. There is no limit on the number of people you can claim for.

The maximum amount of fees (including the Student Contribution) that qualify for tax relief is  $\in$ 7,000 per person per course. However, there is no tax relief on the first  $\in$ 3,000 spent on tuition fees, including the Student Contribution ( $\in$ 1,500 for part-time students). If you are claiming for more than one student, you get full tax relief on tuition fees (including the Student Contribution) for the second and subsequent students.

For both undergraduates and postgraduates, the approved course can be full or part-time in a private or publiclyfunded third-level college in Ireland or in any other EU member state. (Postgraduate students can also claim for approved courses in non-EU countries.)

Undergraduate courses must be of at least two years' duration while postgraduate courses can be between one and four years. For postgraduate courses, students must already have a primary degree or equivalent. Tax relief may also be available for approved foreign language and IT courses that are less than two years' duration and which result in the award of a certificate of competence (the fees paid must be over €315 and under €1,270).

Lists of courses and colleges approved for relief each year are published on the Revenue website.

You can claim tax relief on tuition fees using Revenue's myAccount service. Alternatively you can download an application form from revenue.ie and return the completed form to your Revenue office.

# 10 HELPFUL HINTS THAT MIGHT BE USEFUL IN THE KITCHEN

\*If you have a recipe that calls for powdered sugar - just pulverise granulated sugar in a spice grinder to make your own.

\*Preserve spices by placing them in an ice tray with olive oil or water. Freeze them and take out when you're ready to cook with them.

\*If you have the rest of bottle of wine that you know you're not going to drink within a few days, you can still salvage it. Pour the wine out into an ice cube tray. Use the cubes in a cooking recipe, wine spritzer etc.

\*Pitting Cherries? Place a cherry on top of an empty beer bottle. Use a chopstick to squeeze the pit out of the cherry. The pit will fall into the bottle.

\*Bacteria can build up if you don't properly clean your wooden cutting boards. Cut a lemon in half and dip the cut side with coarse salt. Use it to scrub your cutting board clean, then rinse.

\*Cast iron pans can get rusty if you don't properly care for them. The best way to do that is with salt. Scrub your cast iron pans with salt instead of washing up liquid.

\*Scooping out seeds from your vegetables can take a lot of time. Use an ice cream scooper to perform this task, it makes it a lot easier and faster.

Stainless steel can get dull with a lot of use. Mix vinegar and water together pour into an old spray bottle, spray the solution on your surfaces and wipe it down.

\*Brown sugar can clump up and harden if you don't store it properly. Place an orange peel or apple slice inside the bag and put the bag in an airtight container to prevent this.

\*Don't burn what you're sautéing. If you find that your food is getting too brown too quickly, toss in an ice cube to cool the pan down. The water quickly evaporates and your food won't burn.

\*Plastic wrap is annoying when it sticks to itself or tears. Keep your plastic wrap in the refrigerator. This will make the wrap stretch evenly and properly.

# SOMEONE COMPLAINED ABOUT THIS TEENAGERS BUSINESS VENTURE

Starting a business is a lot harder than it used to be. Regulations are stricter, and various confusing codes make navigating this network a real hassle, especially for young people who haven't learned about the financial world yet. Despite these obstacles, one teen decided to try out his entrepreneurial talent. Jaequan Faulkner, a 13-year-old living in Minneapolis, opened his own summer hot dog stand, called Mr. Faulkner's Old-Fashioned Hot Dogs. He hoped to raise enough money to be able to buy new school clothes.

He originally opened the stand back in the summer of 2016. Jaequan's uncle helped him



get it started, and soon business was booming. The community started to take notice of the unique endeavor, reporting about it in the local news.

Unfortunately, this hot dog stand did not have an official permit. The city of Minneapolis requires that all food-serving businesses pass city health inspections in order to be permitted. As a young teen, Jaequan wasn't familiar with these practices.

Someone complained about the stand, and a health inspection was conducted but rather than shutting the boy's business down, the city health department wanted to help him become legitimate.

The groups came together to help Jaequan update his hot dog stand; this time it would meet regulation standards. The teen got a hand washing station and a tent for overhead protection. The city even gave him a thermometer so that he could check the temperatures of his sausages and hot dogs. The Health Department staff personally chipped in to help Jaequan purchase his \$87 ( $\epsilon$ 75) permit. Now his summer hot dog stand is legitimate.

Luckily, the staff recovered the eggs and placed them in a tank. Not long after that, the eggs started to hatch.

While breaking free from its egg sac, which looked just like a blooming white flower the baby octopuses exhibited a stark change in colour from a translucent white to a brownflecked purple shade.

Matthew Klepeisz, who works at the aquarium, said, "Our team believes it could have been either the stress of the hatch that caused them to change colour or that it may have been related to the immediate instinct to camouflage for protection."

Bare rooted roses can be planted from late autumn until around mid March. 
Welcome back dear reader last week we saw how Abraham is known as the father of faith (Romans 4:16) and that he received right-standing with God for his faith alone, and not because he did good works.
