Organiser of the Responder Group, Damien Baker would like to thank everyone who attended the public meeting and who signed up on the night. The group is now planning to meet in the next two weeks to form a committee to drive the unit forward.

Psychologist Dr Tony Humphreys and Pieta House Founder Joan Freeman will speak at a free Mental Wellness Exhibition in the Malton Hotel, Killarney, next Sunday, March 8th.

Killarney Athlete and Fitness Trainer Neil Kelders will also deliver an inspirational talk on living with depression.

The Mental Wellness Exhibition, organised by the voluntary group, Be Aware Prevent Suicide, will feature over 40 information stands by statutory and non-statutory bodies including Talbot Grove, Console, Living Llnks, South West Counselling, Kerry Rape Crisis and Sexual Abuse Centre and the KDYS.

Workshops on mindfulness, yoga and other therapies will be presented during the day between 12.30pm and 6.30pm.

"Be Aware Prevent Suicide is totally voluntary," Chairperson Deirdre Fee said. "The concept of the exhibition is to make people aware of all the help that is available."

"This year, we are adding practitioners of therapies that are known to reduce stress and, also, courses available to give people experiencing mental unwellness the tools to help themselves," Deirdre said.

There is free admission to the exhibition which will run from 12.30pm to 6.30pm. The times of the main talks are Dr Humphrys, 2pm, Joan Freeman, 3.30pm, and Neil Kelders, 5.30pm.

GLOW 4 CRUMLIN SUPPORT GROUP LAUNCHED

When Oisin was born on June 19th 2004, he was diagnosed with a number of congenital heart defects and when he was one day old, and was transferred from Erinville Maternity Hospital Cork to Our Ladys Hospital Crumlin the same day. He had two operations within a week, For his mum Sinead Malone Walker and his family it was a very traumatic time. The couple were lucky to have great support but were away from their eldest son Cillian.

"We had to adapt to a new lifestyle very quickly, in time it became our norm. With hospital admissions, Gp visits and outpatients appointments in Crumlin, KGH and CUH have been normal for us over the last ten years" said Sinead.

Oisin had open heart surgery in September 2008, and his last heart surgery in June 2014, both were very successful, and he is now doing well thanks to the work of the cardiac team at Crumlin.

Sinead is part of a group of six mothers O from Kerry whose children were born with congenital heart defects, and under went open heart surgery in our ladys childrens hospital in crumlin.

Glowhearts 4 Crumlin was founded by Gillian O'Donoghue from Killarney, who put out a call to a facebook support group for parents of children with CHD to see if other Kerry mothers were interested in fundraising for both the Ronald Mc Donald house which is a facility which allows families to stay near the hospital and The Children's Heart Center in Crumlin.

The Childrens Heart Center in Crumlin opened in 2013, having been built using private funding from parents, sponsers and fundraisers, it received no government funding. As the designers own child was affected by CHD the

facility was built with children in mind. It has 25 rooms for individual children, each equipped with heart and sat monitors, bathrooms, and a bed for parents. It also includes outdoor and indoor play facilities, as many of the patients can be there for several months at a time, and can make it there own place and enjoy comfortable surroundings. Glowhearts 4 Crumlin are holding their first fundraising event on the 26th March when they aim to hold a county wide "Kerry students wear red for Crumlin day" in all Kerry primary and secondary schools. On the day the students will wear red and donate €2 to the Children's heart center Crumlin. Schools interested in participating should send an email to glowhearts4crumlin@gmail.com to register. Their next event is a glow/uv 80s and

90s disco in Mc Sorleys in Killarney, on the 17th of April. According to Gillian, "this is designed to give Mom and Dad a night off to reminisce back to their youth and have a break from their worries. Tickets cost €10 and are available at the door or from any of the glow hearts Moms. The glowhearts4crumlin facebook page was launched two weeks ago and already has almost 2,400 followers, and says they are touched by the support from local businesses and people. The group offers their support to parents during the scary time when their child is diagnosed with CHD.

Selling agent for the mall which runs from Main Street to the New Street car park is Savilles and Tom Spillane.




The group will also continue to feed a number of families on a weekly basis with the help of interpretors who have visited Killarney in the past.

In taking the most important points raised by Peter Bellew on the night, Chamber are looking at www.killarneyie as the central source for all visitor information concerning Killarney while incorporating a comprehensive Events Calendar.

As Chamber President, along with my colleague Paul O'Neill Vice President, we are actively engaging with Paul Nearly and the Municipal Council.

Among the results from the Brainstorming session were the following suggestions

1. Toilets at the Court House are unsightly and need to be upgraded or replaced if necessary. Would make an ideal civic space in a location first seen by those arrive by bus train or from the Cork side of Killarney.

2. High Street/ Muckross Road – Pedestrian Crossings instead of traffic lights.

ALMOST 50% INCREASE IN NUMBER OF TEENAGERS IN DISTRESS CALLING HELPLINE

A record number of almost 20,000 calls were made to Teen-Line, Ireland's only dedicated teenage helpline. This is a 49% increase on the number of calls received in 2013. Teen-Line also established a mobile phone texting service in November 2014 and almost 1,000 texts were received in the 6 weeks the service was open last year.

Teen-Line provides a national, non-directive, free telephone helpline and a mobile phone texting service for teenagers who may be feeling alone, worried or distressed. The helpline and text service is open seven days a week from 8pm to 11pm with an extended service from 4pm to 11pm every Wednesday to cater to the many second level school halfdays. The service is run by volunteers who understand that young people need to be heard, they make no judgments and want to listen.





In cooperation with Kerry Education & Training Board and Kerry Citizens Information Service, SUSI Representatives will host open information sessions in Kerry College of Further Education, Clash, Tralee on Thursday 12th March 2015 at from 4:30-6:30pm to provide information about applying for grants for approved further or higher education courses.

The talk will be repeated three times to maximise public access to the information. You are invited to attend at either 4:30pm or 5:30pm or 6:30pm.

The evening is open to anyone who needs to know how to apply for a student grant, be that for going to a PLC (Post Leaving Certificate) Further Education College, an Institute of Technology or a University. SUSI assess grant applications from prospective students hoping to attend approved further or higher education courses. Applications are made online and the online application system for the 2015/16 academic year will be opening in mid- April this year, which is a month earlier than last year.

COPING WITH LOSS

Loss is considered to be a natural part of life – yet coping with loss is one of the most difficult challenges we will face in our lives. Grief is a natural response to loss and the more significant the loss, the deeper our grieving will be. When a loved one dies, we may experience all kinds of difficult emotions - and it can feel like this pain will never ease. This is a normal reaction. Grieving is a vital process and typically, over time, these intense feelings will diminish in intensity. Everyone reacts differently and there is no right or wrong way to grieve. Equally there is no 'normal' period for someone to grieve - and it may take months or years to come to terms with a loss. For most people, grief doesn't go away – but it fades into the background. Thoughts and memories of our loved one are woven into our minds - and whilst missing our loved one may be part of our life - it doesn't interfere with us living our life. Sometimes however, we can experience what is termed 'Complicated Grief'. This refers to an intense and long-lasting grief that takes hold and doesn't seem to lessen as time goes on. Many people come through the loss on their own - supported by friends and family - others benefit greatly from bereavement counselling. Whilst there are no right ways to grieve - there are however, healthy ways to deal with the pain. People often report that grieving the loss of a loved one gave them a renewed sense of meaning, purpose and direction in their life.

HELPFUL STEPS INCLUDE

1. Accept what you are feeling: If we deny or ignore our feelings it will only make it worse in the long run. For healing to occur, we need to acknowledge and face our feelings.

2. **Talk about the death of your loved one:** Talking to family and friends can help us to understand what has happened and remember our loved one.

3. **Remember and celebrate the life of your loved one:** Honor the individual – perhaps through making a collage of photos, planting a tree in their memory, donating to a favourite charity etc.

4. Be patient and allow the grieving process to naturally unfold. Whilst we may often think of grief resulting from the death of a loved one, any loss can cause grief. Over the coming weeks we will explore grief and loss and ways we can deal with this.

PLANNING TO BECOME PREGNANT-GENERAL ADVICE BY DR MOLONEY

CONTINUED

FOOD POISONING: Various bacteria and other germs can cause food poisoning - that is, a gut infection caused by eating food contaminated by germs. Two germs that are of particular importance to avoid during pregnancy are listeria and toxoplasmosis. It is possible that other food poisoning bacteria may also cause complications during pregnancy. For example, gut infection with bacteria called salmonella and campylobacter may be associated with an increased risk of pregnancy complications. So, it is wise to be extra vigilant about avoiding food poisoning.

Therefore, be strict about food hygiene, always cook eggs, meat and poultry thoroughly, wash fruit and vegetables, and wash hands after going to the toilet, before handling food, before eating, and after handling raw meat or animals.

INFECTIONS IN PREGNANCY

RUBELLA (GERMAN MEASLES): If you plan to become pregnant for the first time, you should check that you are immune to rubella before becoming pregnant. Most women are immune to rubella, as they have been immunised as a child. However, childhood immunisation does not work in every child and you may not be immune. If you are not immune, you can be immunised. Note: you should not become pregnant for one month after the injection, and ideally until your immunity has been confirmed by a further blood test. The rubella virus causes a mild illness, but can seriously damage an unborn baby, especially in the early stages of growth. So, until you know that you are immune (from the result of the blood test), you should avoid anyone who has rubella, especially in the first 16 weeks of pregnancy.

TOXOPLASMOSIS: This germ is commonly found in raw meat, and sheep, lamb and cat faeces. It can sometimes cause serious harm to an unborn baby. To avoid it:

- Wash your hands after handling raw meat.
- Do not eat raw or undercooked (rare) meat.
- Wash salads and vegetables, as any dirt may have been contaminated by cat faeces.
- Wash your hands after handling pets or animals, especially cats and kittens.
- Get someone else to clean out any cat litter trays when you are pregnant.
- Always wear gloves when gardening.
- Avoid sheep, especially during the lambing season.

CHICKENPOX: Having chickenpox when pregnant can be a nasty illness, and there is some risk to the developing baby. If you are not sure if you have had chickenpox, a blood test can check if you have previously had it.

HEPATITIS B: A mother who is infected with hepatitis B has a high risk of passing it on to her newborn baby. If you are at high risk of catching hepatitis B you should be immunised against this virus before becoming pregnant. People at increased risk and who should be immunised include:

• Those whose job puts them at risk of contracting hepatitis B - for example, healthcare personnel and staff at daycare or residential centres.

- Those who inject street drugs. Those who change sexual partners frequently.
- Those who live in close contact with someone infected with hepatitis B.

SCREENING BLOOD TESTS: Ideally, you should have a blood test before you become pregnant, to screen for hepatitis B, syphilis, and HIV.


CONSIDER YOUR WORKING ENVIRONMENT: If you think that your job may pose a risk to a pregnancy, then ideally **YOU SHOULD** discuss this with your employer before becoming pregnant. For example, if you work with chemicals, fumes, solvents, etc, which may pose a risk, or if you work with animals such as cats or sheep which may be carrying germs.

ANIMALS: Avoid contact with sheep and lambs at lambing time. This is because some lambs are born carrying the germs that cause listeriosis, toxoplasmosis and chlamydia. These may be passed on to you and your unborn baby.

MOTORISTS AND CYCLISTS SURVEY REVEALS MUTUAL DISTRUST

A survey on road users' attitudes by motoring solutions specialist easytrip has revealed that neither motorists nor cyclists believe the other pays enough attention to them on the road. While 56% of cyclists say that drivers don't pay enough attention to them, 69% of motorists make the same claim about cyclists with almost a third of drivers describing cyclists as a "menace" on the road. However more than 40% of drivers say that they do understand the challenges faced by cyclists.

'Offences' by motorists

When cyclists were asked about witnessing 'offences' committed by motorists, the following mishaps were referenced as the top three:

Motorists not using indicators

• Drivers failing to leave enough space between their car and the kerb for the cyclist

• Motorists cutting off a cyclist when taking a left hand turn.

From the motorists' own perspective, more than half of all drivers themselves admitted to witnessing mishaps involving other drivers or car passengers such as opening a door while a cyclist is passing. This was followed by motorists cutting cyclists off when taking a right or left hand turn (26%) and pedestrians stepping out into oncoming traffic without looking whilst glued to their mobile (20%).

'OFFENCES' BY CYCLISTS'

A staggering 95% of drivers claimed they

ECO-DRIVING ADVICE

How to get the most out of the fuel you buy Car choice plays a big part in the extent to which your motoring affects the environment, but whatever car you've got there's a number of simple things you can do to reduce energy use (fuel consumption), CO2 emissions and pollution. These eco-driving tips are the motoring equivalent of insulating the hot water tank, fitting low energy bulbs and not leaving the tv on standby – simple, common sense tips that really will make a difference. You'll save money on your fuel bills too.

MAINTENANCE

Regular Servicing – Get the car serviced regularly (according to the manufacturer's schedule) to maintain engine efficiency.

Engine oil – Make sure you use the correct specification of engine oil (refer to the handbook)

Tyre pressures – Check tyre pressures regularly and before long journeys. Under-inflated tyres create more rolling resistance and so use more fuel. Getting tyre pressures right is important for safety too. Refer to the handbook as pressures will normally have to be increased for heavier loads.

BEFORE YOU GO: Lose weight – Extra weight means extra fuel so if there's stuff in the boot

had witnessed a cyclist acting illegally or dangerously on the road. The top three incidents were highlighted as:

- A cyclist breaking a red light
- Cycling on the footpath
- A cyclist failing to wear high visibility clothing in dark weather conditions

Meanwhile, 98% of cyclists agreed that the most common 'rule breaker' made by cyclists was breaking the red lights at traffic junctions or pedestrian crossings, followed by cyclists failing to make a hand signal when turning and not having the appropriate lights on their bikes.

ROAD TESTS FOR CYCLISTS

The easytrip road user's survey also revealed that 55% of motorists felt that cyclists should undergo some form of testing, either theory and/or practical before being allowed to cycle on main roads. Whereas cyclists themselves were split on this issue, with 50% saying yes and 50% saying no.

ON-THE-SPOT FINES FOR CYCLISTS

The government is set to introduce on-thespot fines (around \in 50) for cyclists in March this year for offences including breaking red lights, cycling on a footpath or cycling in the wrong direction against traffic flow. A low 33% of cyclists would actually welcome the fines while 59% of Irish drivers say that the fines will be of benefit to all road users.

RULES OF THE ROAD

The easytrip survey also found that more than 64% of motorists claim to have a "reasonable understanding" of the Rules of the Road, however a higher percentage of cyclists, 67%, say they have an "excellent" understanding of the rules of the road.



you don't need on the journey take it out and leave it at home.

Streamline – Roof racks/boxes create extra wind resistance and so increase fuel consumption. If you don't need it take it off, if you do, pack carefully to reduce the extra drag.

Don't get lost – Plan unfamiliar journeys to reduce the chance of getting lost - try the AA Route planner or consider a 'Sat Nav' if you regularly drive unfamiliar routes. Check the traffic news before you go too.

Combine short trips – Cold starts are inefficient so it pays to combine errands such as buying the paper, dropping-off the recycling, or collecting the kids into one trip rather than making multiple short trips.

Consider alternatives – If it's a short journey (a couple of miles or so) consider walking or cycling rather than taking the car – fuel consumption is worse when the engine's cold and pollution will be greater too until the emissions control system gets up to normal temperature.

ON THE WAY: Leave promptly – Don't start the engine until you're ready to go. This avoids fuel wastage due to unnecessary idling and ensures that the engine warms up as quickly as possible. (In winter months, scrape ice rather than leave the car idling for a long period to warm up).

Easy does it – Drive smoothly, accelerate gently and read the road ahead to avoid unnecessary braking.

Decelerate smoothly - When you have to

slow down or to stop, decelerate smoothly by releasing the accelerator in time, leaving the car in gear.

Rolling – If you can keep the car moving all the time, so much the better. Stopping then starting again uses more fuel than keeping rolling.

CHANGE UP EARLIER: Change gear as soon as possible without laboring the engine – try changing up at an engine speed of around 2000 rpm in a diesel car or around 2500 rpm in a petrol car. This can make such a difference to fuel consumption that all cars in the future are likely to be fitted with Gear Shift indicators that light a lamp on the dashboard to indicate the most efficient gear change points.

CUT DOWN ON THE AIR-CON – Air conditioning increases fuel consumption at low speeds, but at higher speeds the effects are less noticeable. So if it's a hot day it's more economical to open the windows around town and save the air conditioning for high speed driving. Don't leave aircon on all the time – you should run it at least once a week throughout the year though to maintain the system in good condition.

Turn it off – Any electrical load increases fuel consumption, so turn off your heated rear windscreen, demister blowers and headlights, when you don't need them.



The training camp in Varese, Italy has come to an end, The journey back is always more tiring as the excitement of getting somewhere new is well gone and the training has taken its toll on us all. I have completed a solid block of training which

The focus now is to push on from where I am at and use the next three weeks as a stepping stone for international racing. The training programme for the next few weeks includes a lot of racing pieces combined with long mileage so I would expect that fatigue levels will rise and I will really have to focus on getting adequate recovery. Although, some crews are still being formed and some won't be finalised until later on in the season, we are all on top of our game to ensure that when it comes to crew selection, our name is on the list. Now that we're in the gualifying year for the Olympics the competition amongst the team members increases significantly and so do the stakes. The Olympics only come around every 4 years and everyone wants to race for the qualifying places. And so do If This season will test us all physically as well as mentally.

After the camp I have spent a relaxing weekend at home in Killorglin and since Monday I am back to Cork training with the team. My first international test will take place on the 10th to 12th of April at the Piediluco Regatta in Italy where I got a bronze medal in in 2014. After the Piediluco Regatta I will travel back to Varese for a 10 day training camp.

FOCUS ON HERBACEOUS PERENNIALS

What we mean when we call a plant an Herbaceous Perennial is What we mean when we call a plant an Herbaceous Perennial is that in most of the them the stems are soft, succulent and green as opposed to being brown and woody. With most Herbaceous Perennial they will sprout growth from ground level in Spring and will grow and flower right through the Summer and into the Autumn. With most Herbaceous Perennials in late Autumn and early Winter they start to look a bit ragged. But depending on the severity of the Winter some will hold on until the first real cold snap. The maintenance for most Herbaceous Perennials isn't a lot really. During late Autumn early Winter cut the majority of them down to ground level and mulch over with some compost. Some Herbaceous Perennials such as Lupins and semi hardy Fuchsias will have woody stems because of the milder climate here so when pruning back cut right back to just a couple of inches above ground level.

ground level. Herbaceous Perennials are a valuable plant in the garden for a number of reasons.

1. Because of the length of time they flower for.

2. Because of the short length of time it takes them to grow to the

2. Because of the short length of the fit takes them to grow to the maximum height and spread. When planting a Herbaceous Border always remember to plant the taller ones to the back or middle and the smaller growing ones to the front. When choosing your plants pick one plant that you can repeatedly plant in the border to create a sense of continuity to the planting scheme. Herbaceous Perenaials flower from April can repeatedly plant in the border to create a sense of continuity to the planting scheme. Herbaceous Perennials flower from April until October/November so you have a wide range of flowering times and colour to choose from. The secret to having a good flowering Herbaceous Border is every few years in the Winter to lift and divide the plants that are suitable for this. *Next week I will focus on Roses.*

Heathrow is a busy airport at the best of times but on a Friday evening its just crazy, so after finally squeezing my way through the terminal I was glad to find that the London traffic wasn't too congested which meant that my taxi ride to Muswell Hill in the north of the city didn't take as long as I had feared. As I neared the lovely home of Mark O'Shea, I could see why Muswell Hill was recently voted one of the five most desirable places to live in London by The Sunday Times as many of the buildings still have their original Edwardian facades. Though only 34 years of age, Mark O'Shea has been gone from Killarney for over twelve years having originally moved to Los Angeles in 2003 where he lived for nine years before moving here to London where he lives with his partner, Donegal born Michelle O'Doherty who is a television presenter on RTE fashion programme Expose and their son Max who was born last August. Mark, whose mother Mary is from Kilcummin, tells me he played with Kilcummin until he was 16 when the family moved into Riverside Drive in Killarney town and he hadn't been playing football at the time but after a visit from Willie DF, Mark decided to play for Legion. This decision didn't go down too well with all in his family however as Marks father, Paddy, local musician of renown is a Dr Crokes supporter and his late grandfather, also Paddy, was a vice president of our great local rivals. Marks sister Laura also plays for Dr Crokes but his other sister Emily is married to Brendan Kissane and they have three sons all playing in the green and white, the half back line sorted he smiles. Mark however stuck with his decision and went on to play minor, U21, junior and senior football with the club for the following six years but with the exception of a junior title, medals on the football pitch eluded him. DONAGHY GETS KERRY CAPTAINCY OFF TO WINNING START

Kerry O'Shea reports from Fitzgerald Stadium Kerry skipper Kieran Donaghy celebrated his birthday with a win over Dublin at Killarney's Fitzgerald Stadium last Sunday afternoon. The underfoot conditions were dangerous and the hail and the snow made for slippery conditions for both teams.

This was Kerry's first victory over the Dubs on home soil in ten years but the team fielded by Jim Gavin was certainly not the Dublin team as we know it. Dublin had a handful of regulars on duty even the selection of goalie Sean Currie raised eyebrows among some of the visiting Dublin supporters, not to mention Kerry. Games between Kerry and Dublin are always full-blooded encounters and this was no different as Laois referee Eddie Kinsella had his hands full issuing four black cards, seven yellows and a straight red to Dublin's Michael Fitzsimons late in the game for a high challenge on Fionn Fitzgerald. Of that total, Kerry received two black cards and three yellow.

Kerry deserved to win because they showed fire, hunger, grit and determination, things which warmed the cockles of the hearts of the Kerry supporters in the estimated attendance of 7,109. With home games to come against Donegal and Monaghan and a Munster derby with Cork to look forward to next on the agenda Kerry's prospects of qualifying for the knockout stages of the league have certainly improved. Kieran Donaghy started in his usual full-forward



berth and had a hand in several Kerry scores. Donaghy highlighted his importance to the team with a terrific catch deep inside his own defence late in the game at a time when Dublin were seeking a winning goal.

TG4 Man of the Match Jack Sherwood has settled into the Number 6 role pretty well. An underage star under Eamon Fitzmauirice, the Firies man had an outstanding game and followed up his steady performance against Derry and has certainly laid down a championship marker. David Moran had a brilliant second half and capped it all with a superbly struck score into the teeth of the elements, while Barry John Keane proved his worth when introduced for Michael Geaney and scored two great points. Tommy Walsh also saw some more valuable game-time in the green and gold jersey which will stand to him in the coming months. 
out on last year's success. With Colm Cooper due

Last summer Time magazine featured butter on its front cover; sadly, it was not for the first time. In 1961, Time also gave top billing to butter but the message was very different on that occasion. It was very simple, animal fats were bad, avoid animal fats in order to improve your heart health, eat the manufactured alternatives. In a strange way by publishing the 2014 article, the rehabilitation of butter was complete.

"The story of how animal fats became the most vilified nutrient in our diet is an interesting one. The demise and demonisation of butter began in earnest in the 1950s, lifestyle studies from around the globe purported to show that diets low in animal fats were healthier than the conventional American diet. Our own region of Sliabh Luachra was included in one such study.

However, despite the longevity and rude health that people in the area enjoyed they were not included in the final survey. Their diet as rich in bacon, butter and other foodstuffs no longer suitable for healthy living. By removing areas such as Sliabh Luachra, the authors could present findings that reflected the views they wished to promote. Studies involving rabbits and poultry fed abnormal diets containing unnatural levels of fat and then examined were included as evidence that heart disease was a consequence of eating animal fat. Butter was quickly set up as public enemy number one.

The medium of television was in its infancy when the debate over the future of butter was in full flow. Panel discussions vied for the nation's attention. In 1956, the American Heart Association wholeheartedly threw its weight behind the campaign to change the nation's diet. Butter and lard were out; margarine and corn oil were in. There was one dissenting voice on its board, Dr Dudley White. As a practising cardiologist since 1921, he had seen heart disease increase as a problem over each of the following four decades, while American consumption of animal fats had fallen consistently over those same decades. His words on one television debate proved very prophetic, the cause of heart disease, he said, was not traditional foods rather it was the alternative processed varieties increasingly available.

This alternative to traditional foods like butter had one great attraction; it was very cheap to produce. The process of hydrogenation of oils made it possible to create alternatives to butter at a fraction of the cost and huge profits beckoned. Low in fat or made with vegetable oils became a badge of honour. Legislation was changed to

facilitate the introduction of alternatives into all sorts of foodstuffs. White was not alone in his concerns but the wave of support for the alternatives won out and it was the 1990s before the epidemic of obesity, heart disease and diabetes created a grudging retraction of decades of unsubstantiated advice. Twenty years later mainstream media get into line. The evidence for retraction was available decades earlier, particularly from animal studies where calves fed on alternative oils, as a substitute for butter fat, had a range of disorders from bone health right through to heart problems. Still, better late than never as butter reclaims its place as ingredient of choice and hydrogenated vegetable oil skulks off into the night.

IFA CALLS ON DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORT TO AGREE PACKAGE OF MEASURES TO FACILITATE THE DEVELOPMENT OF GREENWAYS

IFA President Eddie Downey has called on Transport Minister Paschal Donohoe to work with IFA to develop a voluntary package of measures that facilitates the development of proposed Greenway projects while protecting farmers' rights.

He said, "The Government plans to develop over 330km of Greenway tracks across the country over the next number of years. These projects have the potential to attract tourists and economic development to many rural areas".

However, the IFA President said they will also significantly impact on farmers and may in some instances divide farm holdings. "This is leading to landowners firmly opposing the use of CPOs, which may have a negative impact on the long-term success of the greenways initiative. Therefore it is essential that a robust package of measures is put in place which recognises the inconvenience, severance and injurious affection caused and goodwill required."

Eddie Downey has also called on local authorities to engage in this process with the Department of Transport and to reconsider plans to impose CPOs on landowners for non-critical infrastructure such as greenways and cycle tracks."All sides must work towards delivering these Greenways based on voluntary agreements with farmers, similar to the successful walkway scheme."



The following are a few guidelines for lovers of animals and parents:

*Never rub a guide dog or an assistance dog without asking the owner for permission first. The owner and the dog have a special bond. The owner will know if the dog is happy being petted by members of the public.

*Please do not feed any titbits or morsels of food to a guide dog or assistance dog as this will disrupt the dog's routine and can make the dog sick. Guide dogs and assistance dogs are on a special diet and are fed at regular intervals.

*Do not distract a guide dog or assistance dog when the dog is working as this may confuse the dog.

Please do not call, pet, whistle or signal to a guide dog or an assistance dog.

*Guide dog owners and assistance dog owners undergo a comprehensive training programme in dog handling. You should not interfere when the owner is working their dog. Do not grab the harness handle or lead away from the owner. Do not give the dog commands. The owner is trained to handle their dog appropriately and any intrusion can distress the dog and its owner.

*Pet dogs are often excitable when they meet a guide dog or assistance dog. They will often sniff, bark at or chase a guide dog or an assistance dog. Pet owners should always keep their pet dog on a leash when they meet a guide dog or an assistance dog, so that, the pet dog will not distract the guide dog or assistance dog from its work. One always needs to consider the safety of the guide or assistance dog first and if pet dogs are excitable and uncontrolled, it can distract the guide or assistance dog and put the owner's safety at risk.

Whatever the exact reason, for years now spiders have been looked at by some humans with fear.

Don't get me wrong: arachnophobia (the fear of spiders) is a very real thing. In no way am I trying to say that it isn't, or that those that suffer from it should for some reason feel ashamed.

In celebration of Save a Spider Day (March 12th), what I hope this list says — what I hope this list proves — is that spiders aren't just something to be screamed at, or squished beneath boot heels, but something to be respected, and even admired.

Myth: On average, us humans swallow eight spiders per year while we're sleeping.

Truth: While we can't say that it has never happened before, the number in this myth is absurd. The only reason a spider would be remotely interested in climbing into bed with you is in search of bed bugs. Not convinced yet? Check out this article further debunking this myth.

1. Spiders Are Ingenious Hunters - Some spiders pounce on their prey. Some ensnare their prey in a web of silk. Some dig trap doors into the dirt and let their pray fall into a very similar ball of silk. And others? There are many others that have their own individual way of hunting — their own techniques, their own schemes, etc.

2. They Call Earth Home - The exact number of spider species is unknown. But, as of 2014, 45,000 different species had been identified. And they span across the planet.

MARGARET'S RAMBLINGS



Each continent, even each region, has spiders specific to it. For example, tarantulas — one of the most versatile spiders when it comes to climate — can be found in all continents, save for Antarctica.

3. They Steer Us Clear of Famine - You wouldn't believe how crucial spiders are to organic farms. THEY EAT BUGS. LOTS OF BUGS. They eat insects and other pests who have been proven to be quite detrimental to crops. If they don't eat, we don't eat.

4. The Strength of Silk - Ounce for ounce — silk is actually stronger than steel. And spiders have plenty of it. They also have plenty of uses for it, including prey capture and immobilisation, but also for reproduction, dispersal, and also as nourishment on occasion — on slow hunting days, they'll nibble on their own silk. It can be used as an "alarm line" rather than to capture prey. Or, in the event that a spider wanders too far from its shelter, they could be keeping a line of silk in which they follow back home.

Myth: Daddy-longlegs are a type of spider.

Truth: Yes, they are arachnids, but they are not spiders. Daddy-longlegs, otherwise known as Leatherjackets, have one body section, two eyes, a segmented abdomen, and produce neither silk or venom. Spiders, on the other hand, have two body sections, (typically) eight eyes, an unsegmented abdomen, silk and venom.

5. They Have Superpowers - Some jumping spiders have the ability to de-focus their vision. Meaning: they sense distance by comparing a blurry image to a clear image. It all lies with the colour green. The comparison that they're able to create helps them gauge distances before pouncing on their prey (farther distance = blurry, while nearby = clear, for example). But why green? Well, the why may not be easy to answer. But they noticeably suffer in judgment when under red light.

6. Spiders actually have water-repellent hair that not only can keep them dry, but prevents them from drowning. Those same hairs can capture air bubbles that the spider can take beneath the surface of the water. It's also what allows them to float!

7. Some Species of Spiders Are Deserving of

An Oscar - Over 100 species of spiders commit to the craft of acting to catch their prey. Through evolution, they're able to appear like ants, both to evade certain predators, and to help them catch, well, ants

8. They Have Personality - The majority of spiders live in solitude. They hunt alone. They eat alone. Some spiders will even try to eat each other if they cross paths. Yet, there are 25 species of spiders that live in a much more social atmosphere, where, as studies have shown, the spiders can take on different sorts of roles.

Know Your Rights: RENT-A-ROOM RELIEF

MARCH 2015

QUESTION

I heard that I can get a tax exemption if I rent out a room in my home. How does this work?

ANSWER

If you rent out a room or rooms in your home as residential accommodation, the income you earn is exempt from tax, provided the total paid by the tenant(s) is not more than €12,000 in a tax year (this was €10,000 from 2008 to 2014) and you satisfy the qualifying conditions for the relief (for example, the relief does not apply to rent payable by your child). This is called rent-a-room relief. It applies to a room or rooms in your home which can include a self-contained unit such as a basement flat or a converted garage. The relief does not apply to rooms that are not attached to your home. You must live in your home as your sole or main residence during the tax year for which you are claiming the relief. You do not have to own the property you could be a tenant and be sub-letting to someone else. (In such cases, you would have to check with your own landlord that sub-letting is allowed.) Your tenant(s) must be using the room as residential accommodation. For example, you can claim relief if you are renting a room to a student for the academic year, but not if you are taking in short-term guests. Renting a room in your home is not covered by landlord and tenant legislation so you do not have to register as a landlord with the Private Residential Tenancies Board (PRTB), provide a rent book to the tenant or ensure that the accommodation meets any minimum physical standards. The gross income you receive cannot be more than the relevant limit for the year in question. This includes sums that the tenant pays to you for food, utilities, laundry or similar goods and services. When you are working out whether the gross income is more than the limit, you cannot deduct any costs you incurred in earning that income. If your income from rent and other services is over the limit, the profits from the entire income (not just the amount over the limit) are taxable. If you qualify for rent-a-room relief, the income is not liable to PRSI, the Universal Social Charge or income tax. Claiming rent-a-room relief does not affect your mortgage interest relief or your exemption from Capital Gains Tax (CGT) if you sell your home. You do not have to claim rent-a-room relief as it applies automatically. However, if you are submitting an annual tax return you must record the amount of the exempt income on the return.
