illarney native, Dr. Tony Murphy rolled the world into town this week. Originally from Glebe Lane, Dr. Murphy is the organiser of the GLOBE confernece and is also current director of GLOBE which is based in Boulder, Colorado.

Over 400 international community members, including 190 Students from 41 countries, arrived in Killarney town and National Park to attend the Global Learning and Observations to Benefit the Environment (GLOBE) Program Learning Expedition. The international science and education program provides students and the public worldwide with the opportunity to participate in data collection and the scientific process, and contribute meaningfully to our understanding of the Earth system and global environment. The Welcome reception & 'Parade of Nations' from Killarney National Park through Killarney town brought the town to a standstill.

The theme of the GLOBE Learning Expeditions (GLEs) was "Mountain, Woods, and Water: Developing a Sense of Place."

GLOBE Learning Expeditions are organized every few years in order to provide students from around the world the opportunity to present their GLOBE research projects to their peers, to GLOBE scientists, and the greater GLOBE community. These conferences also provide students with the opportunity to establish friendships and to

develop collaborative partnerships that will enhance their future GLOBE experiences.

Teachers were provided with an opportunity to share innovative ideas and challenges, to attend protocol and related professional development sessions, and to build connections for research efforts between schools.

At the GLE in Ireland, all students were expected to participate in an oral presentation of their GLOBE research and also had the opportunity to share their culture through song, dance, games, etc. during the GLE Culture Nights.

In addition to giving presentations and sharing culture, students were also in the field collecting data and learning about Killarney National Park.

Lump sum payments

You may receive a lump sum payment from your employer if you retire or have left work. You will only be liable to pay tax on the amount of your payment that is more than either:

basic exemption and increased exemption (if due) or

Standard Capital Superannuation Benefit (SCSB).

Basic exemption

The basic exemption is €10,160, plus €765 for each complete year that you have worked.

The following items can be counted towards a full year's work: time worked before and after a career break

•a period of job-sharing or part-time work •for group companies, all work carried out in Ireland.

If you have taken a career break the length of the break cannot be counted. Increased exemption

You may claim an increased exemption up to €10,000. To claim this, you must not have received a lump sum payment in the past ten years.

You may be due to receive a lump sum payment from your pension scheme. This lump sum will be deducted from the €10,000.

If this payment is not due yet, then the current value of it is deducted from the €10,000. You may have agreed with your pension provider that you will never receive a lump sum payment. You must inform your employer of this agreement in order to receive the increased exemption.

Standard Capital Superannuation Benefit (SCSB)

You may benefit from SCSB if you have high earnings and long service. You calculate SCSB at one fifteenth of the average annual pay for your last 36 months in employment. This is then multiplied by the number of year's service. Any tax free lump sum payments you receive are then taken from this benefit.

FEELING TOO SORE AFTER A NEW **EXERCISE CLASS TO CONTINUE?**

Doms (delayed onset muscle soreness) would be expected especially if you are a total beginner to exercise. - 2. Go for a cold shower after class
- 3. Go for a hot bath with episom salts on day 2 after your class
- 4. Go for a leisurely walk to loosen out
- 5. Get on your foam roller
- 6. Get a massage
- 7. Relax & make sure you are getting sufficient recovery sleep
- 7. Drink plenty of water
- 8. Make sure your eating a well balanced nutritious diet weekly

International Flair

To date Run Killamey has athletes from 18 different countries competing in what is becoming an international festival of running. Many running clubs and groups from all across Ireland are coming to Killamey to take part in Ireland's most beautiful road race. We are looking forward to welcorning more than 2500 athletes for one of the country's biggest running events.



Injury Prevention

At the first sign of injury or niggle most runners have the same reaction - ignore it and keep training thinking it will go away. Taking the time to find and fix an injury before it becomes chronic will give you a better chance to train injury free. There are lots of great physiotherapists in Kerry that are experts in sports injuries especially running. Here are my tips on preventing injury.

Rest

A rest day is extremely important when it comes to avoiding injuries. You should have at least one complete rest day in a week along with a recovery day where you could swim, walk or cycle. Listen to your body, if you feel tired on a day where you're meant to be doing a quicker paced run (speed work or fartlek) then don't. Run very easy or take the day off.

Warm-up / cool-down

By warming up you increase your heart rate gradually and your muscles will be warm and flexible resulting in being less prone to injury. 10 minutes warm up would suffice and prepare you for the training ahead. Equally as important is cooling down, at the end of a run where your heart rate was elevated to aerobic or anaerobic levels you should ideally spend 10 minutes or so running very easy or walking in order to allow your heart rate to decrease slowly back to its normal rate.

Gradual increase mileage

Don't be tempted to increase your running distances or paces too quickly. Stick to your training program. The general rule of thumb is not to increase your running distance by more than 10% a week. After a hard run it's vital that the next day's activities should be an easy day. General rule of thumb is hard run/easy run/hard run/easy run and so on.

Maintain / improve flexibility

A lack of flexibility is a big contributor to injuries. Introducing yoga or Pilates into your training plan can help gain strength and flexibility.

Strength work

Many new runners don't undertake any form of strengthening work for their legs, thinking that all the running they are doing will be sufficient. Strength training is essential for preparing the body for training and racing.

ARE YOU REACTING FROM THE PAST?

Do you find yourself repeating the same old reactions to things that happen in your life? When something goes wrong do you automatically think the same old thoughts about what has happened? The next time you are tempted to react – for instance when someone cuts across you in their car making you brake hard, take a deep breath, notice how you want to re-act but instead of getting angry or shouting something rude at the other driver, just be aware of what happened. Notice your body, your breath and observe what you are doing and how you are feeling. Take a breath in and exhale in a long sigh out. Then think of the most positive thing you can say to yourself, for example "Well, no –one got hurt. That person must be in a rush – I hope they get there safely." Then let it go! Don't go on talking about it. Direct your focus back into what gives you more joy! The result is that will have changed an automatic reaction into a conscious kind response. In doing this you will have also calmed your nervous system and created a new neural pathway to use again in the future. This is powerful because it puts you back into conscious control of your life.

GARDENING DURING THE HEATWAVE

With the heatwave set to continue, here are some tips to get you through the hose pipe ban.

* Don't water plants during the day as the water evaporates in the heat. Do it early in the morning or late in the evening. You can use any left over water from washing dishes etc. to water plants, the soap suds won't do any harm.

* Sprinklers waste water by spraying nearby paths and fences so it is best not to use them.

* Position plants in the shade if possible so they will need less water.

* Don't plant anything new until the weather breaks but if you have new plants in the garden, make a hollow ring around them to store the water.

If you do own a greenhouse, leave the it open 24 hours a day to keep it as cool as possible.

* And finally don't use fertilizer during the hot spell as it will scorch the grass.

Emerging Adulthood is known as the

period of time between the age of 18 years and 28 years of age approximately. Unfortunately little attention is given to this period in an individual's life which is a pity because it can be quite a daunting, challenging and fearful time. They may or may not just be out of school and finishing the tail end of their turbulent adolescent years yet this is given little consideration. While it is healthy to encourage more detachment and autonomy and promote the need for more independence it is equally important to acknowledge the plethora of emotions that come with such a step. The fear of the unknown exists. It is part and parcel of this chapter hence parental guidance and support needs to remain steadfast. Emerging adults rarely confess their fears because the pressure is on to save face. They want and need to achieve independence but secretly harbour a lot of fear and confusion as they branch out. Emerging adulthood can extend into a person's late twenties so discussing this reality with our teenagers is necessary. They may change academic courses before finding the right one, take time out and travel, work different jobs, go through various relationships etc on this journey of discovery ; but one thing is for sure they will grow and evolve as they do so. Being open to receiving them regardless of possible mistakes will make them more emotionally robust. They will more than likely seek you out for guidance or comfort and familiarize you with the context of their new world, be it courses, new friendships, problems etc.. They are unique individuals encountering unique experiences to them ; we, on the other hand, may have forgotten how this feels . We must bear this in mind if they become derailed.

Creating a good foundation, before they eventually fly the nest, will provide a solid base for them to return to. This foundation is achievable via open and honest communication, gentle encouragement, unconditional positive regard and acknowledging the challenges which exist for them. Slowly but surely the need to save face and disguise difficulties fades and the emerging adult can discuss his/her experiences in a more realistic fashion, be it academic pressure, friendship/relationship worries, financial concerns and so on. This is a welcomed moment! Now we can visualize someone who is ready, willing and able to be in touch with their emotions and recognize the need to reach out for support. This can be an uphill struggle for emerging adults who don't want to disappoint. Remember, they remain vulnerable and sensitive to praise and criticism despite this outward appearance of emerging adult. As parents we can do a great deal to help them navigate any obstacles they may encounter without remaining so much in the forefront of their lives! Once they know that your support is consistent they can discover a world full of possibilities and, in turn,

discover themselves!

Welcome back dear reader, last week we looked at the fruit of God's Word changing us from the inside out, bringing healing and transformation. "Christ in you, the hope of glory" (Colossians 1:27) tells of how God makes His home in us after we ask His Son Jesus to be Lord and acknowledge Him as our personal Saviour. He gives us assurance of sharing His glory sealed with the power of His Holy Spirit upon doing this, bringing us into a deeper dimension of intimacy with God, all based upon understanding what Jesus accomplished at the Cross. Jesus did so much more for us than we realise. Pictures of a sad man with a little dribble of blood coming from His head do not reflect the truth and are a false, religious view of what really occurred there. Jesus was brutalised and beaten beyond our comprehension, so that on the Cross He resembled more a hunk of meat than a man by the time His oppressors were finished with Him, and He endured that for you and I friend, so that we could be healed of every sickness, disease and heartache. He understands our pain, grief's and sorrow - that is why He came as a human being - to experience everything that the devil puts people through and defeat him one time for all, yet He never sinned or opened His mouth. As mentioned before, holding unforgiveness or bitterness because of things that happened in the past is akin to drinking poison and opens the door for sickness and torment to enter. The last words Jesus spoke on the Cross were "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34). He released his murderers from their sins and forgave them, so we need to do the same! When we make it a practice to quickly forgive, we become mature in Christ, that is we are changed from the inside out and we will experience miraculous healings and breakthrough as walk in a closer relationship with Jesus, doing His Word, even in difficult circumstances.
