




























EDITOR'S NOTE

SPECIAL NEEDS EDUCATION MUST BE TREATED WITH THE PRIORITY IT DESERVES

Fianna Fáil TD for Kerry John Brassil has slammed Fine Gael for failing to ensure that pupils with special needs have places in schools.

It comes after the Education Minister last week ordered six schools to open special classes to cater for children with special educational needs. However, resources for these classes have not been allocated.

Deputy Brassil said, "Fianna Fáil has been flagging the serious gap in school places for children with special needs for months. Earlier this year we brought a specific motion before the Dáil to address the shortfalls in special

needs education – and this was unanimously accepted. However, the school term has started and there are children who still don't have a school place.


"The issues go further than that. There are children who have been granted a school place but who have reduced timetables. This is deeply unfair. Each and every child has a right to education to enable them to live a full life and to realise his or her potential. We know that for some, this hasn't been the reality.

"This last-minute attempt by Minister Joe McHugh is deeply disingenuous. Not only has it come too late in the day for many families, he has failed to allocate the resources or training necessary to enable the roll out of these classes.

"Children with special

needs are being treated appallingly by this Government, which is more concerned with optics than delivery", he concluded.



SHOWCASED IN NEW TOURISM BROCHURE



USING YOUR PENSION TO PAY LESS TAX:

If your loved ones depend on your financial support for their livelihood, Pension contributions provide a way of paying less income tax. Up to Revenue Limits, contributions to a pension qualify for relief from income tax. This effectively means that, where the higher rate of income tax is 40%and you are a higher rate taxpayer, a €100 contribution to a pension will only have a net cost to you of €60 (had you not made the contribution, the other €40 would have gone to the government as income tax).

Pensions carry another tax benefit: they grow free of tax, unlike deposit accounts in Banks etc (which are generally subject to tax on interest in the form of DIRT Tax) or investment in property or shares (where rent or dividends are liable to income tax and gains in value are subject to Capital Gains Tax).

When your pension benefits are drawn down, a Retirement Lump Sum of normally at least 25% of the value of your pension can usually be taken either completely free of tax. The rest of the benefit, is usually taken in the form of a retirement fund or a pension for life, is taxable. However many people will find themselves in paying much less tax in retirement than when they were working and making pension contributions, and so will often not pay a lot of tax on their pension income when they retire.

Lifetime ACHIEVEMENT AWARD FOR Kerry's John O'Keeffe

ast Saturday, on the eve of the _All-Ireland Football Final, one of Gaelic Football's all-time greats was celebrated in Croke Park with a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Gaelic Players Association (GPA). Former Kerry footballer, John O'Keeffe, received the award at the seventh annual GPA Football Legends Lunch. The aim of this popular networking event is to honour football legends for their contribution to Gaelic Games and Irish society.

O'Keeffe was a member of the Kerry senior inter-county team from 1969 until 1984. He was a highly talented midfielder, and one of the most stylish and accomplished full-backs in Gaelic football history. O'Keeffe won seven All-Ireland Senior Football Championship medals and 12 Munster Championship medals. Other honours he won include seven National Football League medals and eight Railway Cup medals between Munster and the Combined Universities. He also won a Munster Junior Championship

medal in 1969. He is among the leading recipients of GAA All Stars Awards, with five awards from 1973, 1975, 1976, 1978, and 1979. He was also named the Texaco Footballer of the Year in 1975.

As one of football's greatest full backs, John has a long list of achievements including: seven All-Ireland Senior Football Championship medals; 12 Munster Championship medals; seven National Football League medals; eight Railway Cup medals, and five GAA All Stars Awards. He was also named the Texaco Footballer of the Year in 1975.

After retirement, John then went on to manage both Clare and Limerick at county level, and he was part of Kerry's All-Ireland winning management team in 2000. He has also been a valued contributor for The Irish Times. The Gaelic Players Association honoured John with the award to celebrate his long-standing career and contribution to football as a player, manager and champion.

Third level students must be given access to better mental health services

Fianna Fáil TD for Kerry John Brassil says a recent study which revealed that more than one third of college students experiencing anxiety and mental health issues underlines the importance of government funding in this

The Union of Students of Ireland report found that 38% of students experienced severe levels of anxiety.

Deputy Brassil said, "The findings of this report will not come as any great shock to anyone in either the health or education sectors. Third level students are experiencing high levels of stress and anxiety and want to get help to

manage it. However, despite the increase in students seeking help, funding for supports for these students is not matching demand.

"We need more than promises from government, we need Ministers to follow through on their commitments. Too often Ministers pay lip service to mental health service providers, without giving them the necessary funding and resources to help them maintain and improve the service.

"Appropriate and timely mental health support for third level students not only addresses their mental health issues, it also helps prevent them from dropping out of college courses. Starting

college can be a difficult time for many young people – it can see them moving out of home for the first time, adjusting to new surroundings and meeting new people. It can be a very overwhelming experience.

"Students who are already attending their local mental health services can find it almost impossible to access mental health services in or near their college. Despite these challenges, funding for students supports including mental health has remained stagnant since 2013.

"This survey highlights the demand for mental health services among college students. We need the government to acknowledge the challenges facing these students and start implementing appropriate mental health plans", Deputy Brassil concluded.



AN EXCITING TIME TO BE A FIRST-YEAR STUDENT AT SECOND LEVEL



Incoming students to second level education will spend a few weeks adjusting to the major changes associated with a new school environment. Post-primary schools are exam focussed and provide a curriculum with a broad range of subjects and extra-curricular activities.

JUNIOR CERT

Currently, the Junior Cert is being replaced by the Junior Cycle Profile of Achievement (JCPA). Six new grade descriptors - Distinction, Higher Merit, Merit, Achieved, Partially Achieved and Not Graded – are replacing the old ABC grades between now and 2021. The JCPA also records student achievements in class room based assessments under five descriptors – exceptional, above expectations, in line with expectations, yet to meet expectations and not reported.

EXCITED

Students are usually more excited than anxious about second level and adapt seamlessly to the transition. From being senior students in primary school, they start again on the bottom rung of the ladder in second level. They arrive into a big school, with a large student population, from the familiar primary school where they were secure. They must adjust to a subject specialist teaching system where the subject and teacher changes and movement to different classrooms is involved.

ADJUSTMENT

They must adjust from the single class teacher system of primary education. At second level, students are taught by nine or ten different teachers, each with a different style and personality. Students, who have been class mates in primary school, often find themselves in different classes in first year. They initially miss their close friends and look forward to meeting them at mid-morning break, at lunch time and at extra-curricular activities. While the separation does inevitable cause concern for some students, most of them take it in their stride and enjoy making new friends. By now, new students will have had an Induction Day when they were given a tour of the facilities and a chance to find their bearings. The rules and timetable were clarified. Many schools also have a mentoring system where a senior student assists a first-year student.

ADAPT

First years quickly come to terms with the demands of secondary education. They adapt to the class period system, the new subjects, the formal house exams and the sheer size of population and physical infrastructure. The long busy school day causes fatigue during the initial weeks and students look forward to the home comforts in the evening. Many students have to travel longer distances to school. That means an early start and a late return.

TIME MANAGEMENT

First year is one for developing time management and study skills. The ROCAR system works well in first year. Establish a daily ROUTINE for studying at home. ORGANISE your books and materials, your study room and your study time. CONCENTRATE on your study by removing any distractions such as mobile phone. APPLICATION means devoting two and a half hours per night on the five week nights to your study. REVISION means regularly going back over material which you have covered earlier in the year.

PARENTS

Parents play a key role in their child's move into second level. Provide a secure home environment with plenty of psychological and emotional support. Invest time in your child and be there when you're needed. Let your child know that s/he is loved and valued irrespective of her/his shortcomings. Give your child lots of encouragement and set realistic targets that s/he can reach. Avoid comparisons with siblings, cousins or neighbours' children. Take interest in your own child's work and praise the effort not just the performance!

STUDY FACILITIES

Provide good study facilities for your child. Check her/his homework diary from time to time to confirm that the work is done. Help out where you can but never do your child's homework. Keep the channels of communication

with your child open. Dialogue and an occasional expression of interest maintain a good relationship.

MEETINGS

Attend the information meetings at the school. Most school have a parents' association, which organises activities to support the school. Join up, get involved and make a contribution. With the school, the parents and the student working in harmony, transition from Primary to Post-Primary can be very smooth indeed!

of competence at oral Irish. Based in Macroom, Grett has been working with Leaving Cert students over the past two years to prepare them for the oral Irish exam. This autumn she is beginning a sixmonth programme to give students the grounding they need to do an excellent oral.

'I found that the students had plenty of Irish, they knew all the words, they knew the grammar, but they couldn't get it out,' she said. 'They just weren't sure if they were pronouncing things properly. Also, they were saying things that they had learned off – general statements about their schools, their local areas... stuff that everyone in their class had learned. I worked with them to put together the Irish version of their real life

stories – the things they loved, the unique experiences they had which brought a sparkle to their eyes, the things that set them apart.'

One of her 2019 students got 99.1% in her oral Irish exam. The examiner asked her which Gaelscoil she had attended, but she had done all her education through English! Another student who achieved a H1 grade was asked by the examiner if his family spoke Irish at home, even though his parents don't have a word of Irish. Grett says that's the level of competence she's aiming for with all her students.

Her programme will involve oneto-one sessions using online technology called Zoom which allows note taking and audio recording, giving students a permanent study resource. She will also run group sessions once a month (at weekends or during school holidays) in locations that are convenient for students.

IS SEPTEMBER A PAIN IN THE

NECK?

With children returning to school this week, many people choose this time of year to return to sport and fitness activities. Regularly, when we take up a new physical activity or return to it from a break, it is followed by a little soreness. This is completely normal and is a sign of adaptation to demands put on your body and crucially that you're pushing yourself outside your comfort zone.

Daily physical exercise whether the goals are improvements in strength, stamina or weight loss should


always include flexibility. Inflexibility can contribute to restricted movement, fatigue and overuse injuries. But it doesn't have to be that way. Flexibility is the easiest aspect of health fitness to improve. There are many reasons why a movement becomes inflexible.

Muscle length is in large part regulated by our central nervous system and if we don't move our joints, we simply lose our range. Exercise improves the availability of oxygenated blood to meet the demands of some muscles and helps prevent trigger points. Trigger points can initiate pain or changes in sensation and are responsible for most pain, ¾ of which is usually experienced away from the affected muscles, whether it is back pain, neck pain or shoulder pain. Movement should also keep muscle and fascia free to glide passed each other and helps prevent adhesion and stiffness. Stiff movement can greatly contribute to feelings of fatigue.

It doesn't take much to tease out our flexibility again. The muscle doesn't go anywhere, it's still there! Gentle stretching, foam rolling, and the odd sports massage can do the trick. A monthly movement screening with your therapist or instructor so you know where you need to spend your time will help as a guide as you go along. You don't need to stretch a muscle that is already flexible.



AMBLYOPIA

Lazy eye or amblyopia may be caused if a young child needs very strong glasses, has one eye that is significantly more short-sighted or long-sighted than the other, or has a squint (where the eyes are not looking in the same direction). This means that the sight in the affected eye or eyes does not develop properly.

Who is affected by amblyopia?

About 2%-3% of all children develop lazy eye, clinically known as amblyopia, when they are a few years old. Children with learning difficulties are ten times more likely to have problems with their vision, including amblyopia

What are the symptoms of amblyopia (lazy eye)?

Lazy eye is not always easy for parents to spot, and children assume that the way they see is normal and so will not tell you that there is a problem. Symptoms include:

- one eye turning in or out. This may be more noticeable if the child is tired or unwell
- •being clumsy or having poor hand to eve coordination
- •screwing up their eyes or shutting
- •complaining about double vision, or having unexplained headaches.

How do you treat amblyopia (lazy eye)?

It is more difficult to treat lazy eye once the eyesight has finished developing (usually around the age of seven), but it may still be possible to significantly improve the vision in the weaker eve. The aim of treatment is to stimulate the vision to develop in the lazy eye by enabling the child to use the eye

The treatment depends on what is causing the lazy eye:

- wearing glasses if the cause of the amblyopia is fully corrected by glasses, the vision in the amblyopic eye may improve over time simply by the child wearing glasses, and no further treatment is needed
- patching covering your child's good eye can encourage them to use the lazy eye, and so improve vision in that eye
- eye drops these are put into the good eye to blur the vision in that eye. They act like patching.
- surgery if glasses do not fully correct a child's squint, the child may need an operation to straighten their eyes to help them use both together. This can be done as early as a few months of age.





Moments after his side left the field of Croke Park, Peter Keane was faced by a room full of media types all ready to ask just one question "Have Kerry blown their chance".

In typical Keane fashion, Keane was very insistent that there was a long way to go before that train would pass.

"Ah no, I wouldn't say it's an opportunity missed. At the end of the day, we were not in an All-Ireland final since 2015. You have a young team. What are they going to get only experience out of the game? In terms of learning curve, I said



all year we're on a crash course with a learning curve and sure this is only helping it."

Poked about his team's odds ahead of the final as high as 5/1 in a two horse race Keane added, "While ye might read a lot into it yourselves, we wouldn't read a lot into what ye're thinking. We would not put a whole pile of emphasis on that. We're just thinking about ourselves. Did we think we had a hand coming here today? Sure of course. If you have two dogs in any race, one of the dogs might get a heart attack and the other fella will walk home. You've a chance every time you're out there."

In this year's Senior Football Championship, Conor has refereed the All-Ireland Senior Football Championship semi-final between Dublin and Mayo, the quarter-final between Meath and Donegal, the Ulster Championship meetings of Donegal and Cavan and Cavan and Monaghan, the Connacht Championship clash of New York and Mayo, and in the Leinster Championship, the meeting of Dublin and Kildare.

His umpires on the day will be Kevin Roache, DJ O'Sullivan (both Banteer/Lyre), Ray Hegarty (Bride Rovers) and Pat Kelly (Kilshannig)

Laois' Maurice Deegan will be the standby referee. The other linesman is David Coldrick (Meath) and the sideline official will be Niall Cullen (Fermanagh).







GERMANY'S LAST FUR FARM HAS CLOSED

In 2017, Germany passed a law that tightened regulations on fur farms, essentially making these businesses nonviable.

Farms were given a five-year window to close their facilities, but they all complied guickly. All, that is, except for one mink farm in Rahden/North Rhine Westphalia.

When Care2 member Patricia L. discovered that animals were being held in horrific living conditions before being subjected to a gruesome death from gas poisoning, she created a Care2 petition demanding the farm's closure. Over 1,300 Care2 members agreed with Patricia and signed her petition. Meanwhile, animal activists around the world also been put pressure on German authorities to close this facility. Now the German Veterinary Office has closed the fur farm in Rahden.

By the time you reach your final years in primary school, you will be totally comfortable with your school environment. By sixth class, you are one of the most senior people in your school and you are used to being given responsibility and looked up to by the younger children. However the transition to secondary school means that you have to revert to being the most junior again and have to cope with a brand new environment. Change can be a daunting task for any one of us and can take a lot of adjusting to.

Easily the biggest change when entering secondary school is going from the experience of one teacher all day in one classroom to encountering eight or nine different teachers and subject/classroom changes every forty minutes or so. A tip to help you cope with this is to write down the name of each new teacher beside the name of the subject and write your own version of the class timetable. The second big change is the constant movement between classrooms throughout the day. Depending on your subject choices, you will be moving all around the school. Getting lost during the first few weeks will be inevitable and a good tip is to always stay with at least one other person from the class. Another big adjustment is the number of specific subjects you will be covering. Students in First Year will cover up to sixteen different subjects; many of these will be new to you. Discuss all the subjects at home with your parents and let their own favourites and will excel at certain subjects.

Your timetable will take a lot of getting used to and you may need help initially in the organisation of your schoolbag each day. Each student will also be provided with a locker and be sure to use your locker to avoid 'heavy bag syndrome'

Homework time is obviously going to increase. However not all subjects are covered every day and not all subjects involve homework. Learn how to successfully manage your time and don't rule out the possibility of supervised study. Schools reports may also be a new experience that comes with secondary school games and P.E. is a great way of getting to know more students in your school. Find activities which you and enjoy and try out new activities even if you haven't tried something before, or if you don't know what the activity entails.

He had already seen God's deliverance in the past when God rescued him from wild beasts in the wilderness, so he felt secure in His Love. (3) Action - David did not get distracted by the taunts and intimidation from Goliath, nor the mocking by his own elder brother. He refused the offer of the King's armour, and instead ran out against the giant with the simple tools he had perfected using in the wilderness, believing in the Power of God's Name and submitted to His authority. David was filled up with faith in God's Power alone, and victory was the outcome. What a way to live - it's there for you too friend!
