



Everyone is welcome on the day and if you cannot make it you can still donate by calling into the office or buying a raffle ticket to be in with a chance to win a prize!





BRASSIL PROPOSES ALTERNATIVE SOLUTION TO PUNITIVE PENALTY POINTS PROPOSAL

- Driving licence app could help drivers avoid penalties -

Fianna Fáil TD for Kerry has written to the Road Safety Authority to establish if the agency can devise a driving licence app which would override the need for people to carry their driving licence with them at all times. Deputy Brassil put forward the idea in response to a proposal from Minister Shane Ross, which would see drivers automatically receiving 3 penalty points for failing to produce their driving licence if stopped by a Garda.

The current law allows Gardaí to use discretion and in the majority of cases drivers are given 10 days to present to a Garda station with their licence without incurring a fine.

"Shane Ross's proposal is completely over the top and will penalise drivers unnecessarily. There could a range of simple explanations for a driver not having their licence on them, but this blanket penalty will needlessly punish drivers. It's just another example of Minister Ross making legislation on the hoof, without thinking it through", said Deputy Brassil. "We should be making life simpler for good drivers and I believe we should be looking at alternative solutions to the current hard copy driving licence. In this digital age, I believe it should be possible for the RSA in conjunction with the National Driver Licence Service to devise an app that people can have on their phones – in essence a digital version of their driving licence.

"Most people carry their phones with them when out and about so it makes sense to be that a driving licence app could be used, which would make it much easier for drivers to ensure that they have their licence with them. "I have written to the Road Safety Authority and look forward to engaging with them on this issue".

Fountain unveiled at the Courthouse

Adrinking water fountain has been unveiled at the Courthouse in Killarney, as part of a pilot project by Kerry County Council which is aimed at helping to reduce plastic waste. Cathaoirleach of Killarney Municipal District and member of the Looking Good Committee Councillor Michael Gleeson welcomed the installation of the water fountain.

"A sad legacy of the last century is that so many of our streams, rivers, lakes and oceans are so badly polluted", Cllr. Gleeson said.

"It is my hope that this water fountain will not only help to quench thirsts

but will also help us all to realise how precious a gift clean and safe drinking water really is.

It is also to be hoped that using this fountain will encourage us all to use fewer plastic bottles and non recyclable cups.

The Council will closely monitor this fountain and if it proves successful there will hopefully be more provided over the coming years.

"My thanks to all involved in providing this facility for the benefit of locals and tourists", ClIr. Gleeson added.

Students enjoy memorable Science trip to London



The launch of A Ranger's View – Killarney National Park took place last Saturday 30th November, 2019 at 7pm in Killarney House and Gardens - the new visitor centre and gateway to Killarney National Park.

This exhibition which will run for a few months showcases the work of Peter O'Toole recently retired Killarney National Park ranger. He captured his love of nature in the photographs he took during his 40 career.


Meet-Santa at The Killarney Oullet Centre







MUNSTER GAA HALL OF FAME AWARD

for Donie O'Sullivan

Pormer Spa, East Kerry and Kerry player
Donie O'Sullivan is to be honoured with
the Football Hall of Fame Award by
Munster GAA at their awards night in Limerick
on this coming Saturday night.

The 1970 All Ireland winning captain and twotime All Star is a worthy recipient having won almost every honour in the game. He made his senior championship debut for Kerry as a 19 year old in the 1962 Munster Final against Cork but missed out on All Ireland glory that year having returned to college before the final against Roscommon. Defeat was to be his lot in the 1964, '65 and '68 All Ireland Finals before he finally got back to winning ways in 1969 when Kerry won their 21st All Ireland title.


In 1970 he captained Kerry to victory over Meath in the first 80 minute final but two years later in 1972 Kerry were defeated by Offaly after a replayed final. The Spa man was a sub on the 1975 Kerry team winning a 4th All Ireland medal and bringing the curtain down on an outstanding career that saw him play 35 championship games for the Kingdom.

O'Sullivan played in 6 National League Finals winning all 6 including 4-in-a-Row between 1971 and 1974 and in all played 68 League games for his county.

He also had the distinction of being a member of the Kerry Under-21 that won the inaugural All Ireland title in that grade in 1964.

In 1971 he was Kerry's first and only All Star at number 4 on the inaugural team and would win another in the same position a year later in the company of Mick O'Connell.

A dedicated club and district player, he had the distinction of winning 4 County Championship titles with East Kerry (1965, '68, '69 and '70) and was a member of the Divisional side to claim the first All Ireland Club Championship title in 1971 – the first and only time divisional sides



were allowed participate in the

competition. Above all, O'Sullivan's heart and soul was in his club and though he started his career with Dr Crokes, winning 3 O'Donoghue Cup medals with the town side, he threw in his lot with Spa when the club was reformed in 1966. The fledgling club went on to establish itself as one of the best in the county and the experienced defender helped his club to a Senior Football League Division 1 title,

a county Intermediate title and 7 O'Donoghue Cup titles. Renowned for the length and accuracy of his dead ball kicking, which incidentally brought him to the attention of the New York Jets during a sojourn in college in America in 1967, he was also one of the last great exponents of the drop-kick, a skill seldom seen in the modern era.

A Kerry County Councillor has called on the Local Authority to acquire additional lands for a Burial Ground in Beaufort. Speaking at a recent meeting of the Council, Councillor Michael Cahill asked Senior Management to take into consideration the fact that the number of Burial Plots available are very quickly running out in Churchtown Burial Ground. The Fianna Fail Councillor asked

the Council to also take into consideration the fact that Beaufort is a very large Parish with a large population. "Residents are becoming increasingly concerned that their loved ones may have to be buried outside the Parish," stated Mr Cahill. The Rossbeigh Councillor proposed that the Council prioritises the acquisition of lands in Beaufort for a new Burial Ground or an extension to the existing Burial Ground in Churchtown.

Reply: Based on current burial rates there are approximately 5 years remaining in Churchtown Burial Ground, Beaufort. Kerry County Council have had discussions with a number of landowners with a view to both extending the existing Burial Ground and purchasing a site for a new Burial Ground in the area. We have been

unsuccessful to date in these discussions.





HANDY HINTS

*Cloudy or dull glassware will come out of your dishwasher crystal clear and sparkling if you add approximately one tablespoon of Epsom salts to your next wash cycle.

*Place an empty paper bag over an electric light bulb before removing it from its socket. If the globe should shatter, the bag will hold the pieces and avoid what could be a nasty accident.

THIS MAN HAS FOSTERED MORE THAN 50 YOUNG MEN OVER THE LAST 12 YEARS

Guy Bryant didn't plan this route for his life, but after growing up in a household with parents who were constantly looking out for neighbourhood children, it was almost fate.

He took his first foster child in while working as a community coordinator for the Administration for Children's Services. While working his case, the two built a strong bond.

"One day he asked me 'would you consider being my dad?" Mr Bryant recalls. "I was hesitant at first due to his own life circumstances, but eventually decided it was the best thing to do. Since then he's taken in more than 50 young men.

"He's the closest thing to a father figure in my life," says Dior Dillon, one of Mr. Bryant's current foster children. "Before I came here I was doing a lot of crazy stuff because I didn't know what to do... When I came here, Mr B. opened another door for me."

INDONESIA LOOKS TO IT'S PAST TO SOLVE MODERN ENERGY TROUBLES

As a nation made up of 17,000 islands, one of Indonesia's most challenging problems in the 21st century has been modernising her electric grid.

But now on the island of Siberut, some electricity-starved hamlets are sustainably developing their own energy by relying on a material that has been part of their lives for thousands of years: bamboo. According to Jaya Wahono, CEO of Clean Power Indonesia (CPI) there are around 50,000 villages that don't have reliable access to electricity. But in 1,200 households in 3 villages on the remote Mentawai Islands where CPI has set up their test bio-electric plants, people are enjoying reliable power for the first time ever.

The Centre for International Forestry Research continues saying that "bamboo harvesting



provides jobs, and also allows farmers to diversify their income streams, reducing their vulnerability to crop failure and helping them adapt to climate change".

Young bamboo shoots are a local staple. Various structures like scaffolding are made of bamboo to protect them from earthquakes, the fibres can be woven together to make everything from clothing to baskets, and dry or dead bamboo is a ready source of firewood. Indigenous Indo-Pacific communities use bamboo for everything—including making spears, rafts, and even pipes.

ENDANGERED SEAL AND SEA LION POPULATIONS TURNED AROUND BY FISHERMEN

In Peru Fur seals had been harvested for their skins, and colonies annihilated for their perceived, and unfounded, impact on fisheries. Dynamite was used on some colonies and mass-shootings were recorded during the 1960s.

In 1969, there were only 100 South American fur seals and sea lions making their homes along the coastline of the capitol of Lima, Peru. Today, around the island of Palomino, as well as the isles of San Lorenzo and Carazcas, alone, there are over 8000 of these charismatic marine animals making their homes.

Fishing interests previously opposed the declaration of marine protected areas. Now, Peru is moving to protect marine areas and adopt Green List standards, and the fishing industry is gradually committing to conservation.

Much of the success of restoring the fur seal and sea lion populations came from local fishermen in the coastal areas of Peru seeing their livelihood through new eyes, recognising the rise of artisanal fisheries and tourism.

It has been five years since Sasha vanished from Viktor Usov's house in Portland, Oregon. The 31-year-old medical student said that he had simply let her outside one night only to have her disappear entirely. Recently, however, she was taken in as a healthy stray in Santa Fe, New Mexico.

Upon scanning her microchip, the staffers at the Santa Fe Animal Shelter were shocked to find that her owner lived so far away—but after they managed to get in contact with Usov, he confirmed that the wily 6-year-old was indeed his missing cat.

"When I got the call, I was ecstatic," Mr. Usov said "but I was not that surprised. This cat loves adventure."

Murad Kirdar, who manages public relations for the animal shelter, was able to escort Sasha home courtesy of American Airlines just days after she was found wandering the Southwest. American Airlines spokesperson Curtis Blessing told the shelter: "At American Airlines, our business is about caring for people on life's journey and connecting them with their loved ones. When we heard Sasha had been found so far from home, we were honoured to be in a position to get her back to her family."

Ms. Kirdar now hopes that Sasha's story will spur other pet owners to get their pets microchipped so their furry friends can always make their way home—no matter how far they have wandered from home.

In their book, 'Depression, an emotion not a disease', Tubridy and Corry describe depression as an emotional state in which one is overwhelmed by feelings ranging from hopelessness to despair and desolation. Many people feeling this way believe that nothing they do can make a difference, which in turn makes change very difficult. However, by focusing less on one's feelings and actively putting in place behaviours which bring about an opposite feeling, we begin to believe that we can do something to make a difference. Doing activities such as exercising, having a massage or yoga can all help to change our old mind-set and lead to feelings of self-mastery, hope and control.

Many of us are all too familiar with the inner judge or critic that enslaves us by constantly beating us up, telling us that we're not good enough or will never amount to anything. From the time we are very young we have been receiving these messages so that eventually we internalise this voice and automatically think 'I'm no good'.

A very helpful exercise can be to begin to rate the severity of your own critic on a scale of 0-10. Counselling can help us to do this. Before we can release ourselves from the stranglehold of the critic, we must first become aware of its presence. Once we become aware and mindful of the critic we can begin to cut ourselves loose from its grip. Having developed this awareness, we begin to be less hard on ourselves and more self-compassionate.

A fundamental law of consciousness is that whatever we give our attention to, will grow in our mind. Thus if you continue to think 'I'm useless, nobody cares, life's too difficult' then these thoughts will grow in your mind, leading you only to seeing what's wrong with your life. Whatever is to the forefront of our mind is what we will perceive in the World around us. In the words of Shelly, The Mind Becomes that which it perceives. Thankfully, the opposite is also true. Thus is you consciously decide to focus what is working in your life, you can begin to change your mind-set.

When we are depressed our mind has foreclosed on any new ideas - and we filter our thoughts, feelings and behaviours through a mind-set that is helpless and bleak. This leads us to repeating the cycle of misery and tormenting thoughts - rather than taking in any new information. When our minds are closed in this way we have only one way of seeing things - we construct the world from behind our eyes.

Next week we will continue to look at how our minds work when we are depressed and ways in which we can change this.

A Word of Victory




