

CAPITOL MAN

STEALS THE HEARTS OF THE NATION

e stole the heart of the nation when his documentary aired on RTE on Tuesday night last and has now become a household name both here and in the USA.

Journalist Donie O'Sullivan from Caherciveen hit the headlines last January when he caught the eye of CNN viewers during his calm reporting of the Capitol Hill riots in Washington DC on January 6th last.

The riots occurred when Trump supporters broke into the US Capitol building in protest at the election of Joe Biden as President of the United States

Donie was at the Capitol Building reporting for CNN and shared live updates from the riots which saw four people lose their lives.

The RTE One documentary Donie O'Sullivan: Capitol Man looked back at Donie's story, growing up and going to school in Cahersiveen and continuing his education at UCD and Queen's in Belfast.

It also touched on Donie's mental health struggles during his 20's when he suffered from panic attacks.

The documentary also included interviews with Donie's family and friends and even featured a family from Killarney, The Kimage family who met with Donie on a beach in Caherciveen last summer.

"He was such a lovely fella", Eilish Kimmage told Killarney Outlook "and it was a great surprise to see us all on the documentary on RTE, she added, "They had the cameras running when he came over to us. We knew that we were being filmed and they asked us for our permission to use it. We didn't think that we would actually make the documentary", Louise said.


Walk-in clinics for Covid-19 booster vaccinations will take place at the Kerry vaccination centre this week.

The eight award winners are

Sean O'Laoghaire - from Portmagee he has a herd of goats and he has been keeping people going through lockdown with his daily facebook posts featuring storytelling and folktales

Brid O Connor - a recent interviewee of Ian O Connell on his Standing Out programme Brid O Connor is a breast cancer survivor who lost her mother to the same disease. She has written Spark – a beautiful collection of conversations with people who have suffered pain, loss and life altering events and have had the strength to reset their lives following these trials

Aperee Living Camp (formally Ocean View nursing home) in Camp - The staff and residents at Aperee have been nominated for all they have done to protect and enhance the lives through the pandemic and the last 12 months. The residents for the resilience they have shown not being able to see friends and family for long stretches of time but came through it all smiling- Like many in nursing homes across the county both staff and residents deserve the recognition.

The final survey of 2021 by business group Irish Business Against Litter (IBAL) shows that Killarney is 'Clean to European Norms', gaining the 13th spot with Tralee coming in on 14th in the ranking of 40 towns and cities. Each recorded a jump of 9 places on the previous survey. The study found PPE litter was found to be at its highest level nationwide since the pandemic began.

Naas finished ahead of Portlaoise and Ennis to record its first win in the annual rankings. There was a slight fall in the number of clean towns nationwide, to 22.

The An Taisce report for Killarney stated:

Killarney has consistently been a strong performer over many years of the IBAL litter league – things were no different this time around. The many top ranking sites included Main Street, Kenmare Place, Main Street and Maurice O'Donoghue Memorial Park – the latter is a recently laid out / opened park environment which was attractively presented and maintained. There were no seriously littered sites in Killarney.

The report showed PPE litter at record levels, with an increase in the presence of both masks and gloves. There was a significant rise in other pandemic-related litter, such as coffee cups, while alcohol-related litter remained at previous levels despite hospitality reopening and the survey being conducted in winter.

IBAL has frequently criticised the failure of local authorities to clean up sites identified in its surveys as heavily littered, and this was again the case. Of 89 such sites highlighted in summer last year, only 33% had been addressed by the time of this most recent survey.

2021 was the 19th year of the IBAL Anti-Litter League.

What the judges had to say:

N72 Dr Hans Liebherr Road: Grade A. An

exceptionally clean, well presented and maintained road with all aspects of the area surveyed in very good condition e.g., road surface, markings, signage, pathways and tree planting.

St. Margaret's Road: Grade B+. The presence of food related litter and face-masks prevented this mixed-use road getting the top litter grade. It was most obvious along the stretch between Ballydowney and Milllwood with no visible items between Millwood and Rock Road. A construction site appears to be well managed from a litter perspective as there was no visible litter associated with it.

Rock Road: Grade B. A more through approach to cleaning the base of the shrubbery, in particular, the hydrangea, based on the volumes of litter items found there. Other scatterings of food related items were present throughout. The Grotto is a lovely feature which was well presented and maintained.

Deerpark Retail Park: Grade A. A very freshly presented retail park environment with substantial parking and paving. There was a virtual absence of litter throughout the area surveyed. The area is well served by litter bins and plenty of warnings about littering and CCTV. Ornamental tree planting is a welcome addition in the vast car park area.

Park Road: Grade A (from Park Road Roundabout to junction with Countess Road) There were no litter issues of note along this route, lined with older residential houses.

Maurice O'Donoghue Memorial Park: Grade A. This newly opened (June 2021) walking and cycle path facility was very much deserving of the top litter grade, just minor litter items at the base of the seating areas. It has been very attractively presented. A lovely feature was the green wrought iron seat.

Car Park at Beech Road: Grade A. A large street level car park, with a 'Bring Facility' within. The car park surface, markings and signage were in very good order and the bring centre was



exceptionally clean. Well done to all concerned. Kenmare Place: Grade A. A very freshly presented and well maintained town centre environment. Visitor information notice board, wooden seating, tree planting, etc. were in very good order. It was excellent with regard to litter. Main Street: Grade A. This attractive main shopping street has frequently been a topranking site – things were no different this time around. As well as the usual street furniture, an area of outdoor seating had been adorned with colourful flower pots.

Barry's Lane: Grade B. Barry's Lane could easily get the top litter grade with a little extra care on behalf of smokers. Significant accumulations were present throughout but most notably near the drain opening. Lower levels of sweet paper and other items were also present.

A School of Photography and Film in Killarney - why not?

Killarney Landscape and travel photographer Teddy Sugrue has had a lovely start to 2022 with the receipt of a Silver Medal from the Pannonia Reflections Photographic Salon in Slovenia for an image titled Kinard Rough Waters.

It is one of several awards and recognitions at home and abroad for Tedddy's stunning photographs. And it struck me Killarney has produced photographers in the way Cahersiveen at the moment is producing writers and journalists - Donie O'Sullivan -Mick Clifford – Micheál Lehane .

We have a longer list in Killarney and of longer standing when it comes to photographic talent

At the moment there can hardly be a town anywhere, in Ireland, the UK or indeed much of Europe that is hosting so many photographers and such photographic talent. Don Mac Monagle, to Valerie O'Sullivan, Michelle Cooper-Galvin, Julien Behal, Bryan O'Brien and now Marie Carroll O'Sullivan are known for their press and book work. But we also have Keith and Evelyn Woodard, Peter O'Toole, Peter Cox, Tim Hartnett, and a host of others in landscape, portraiture, wildlife and creative and wedding and events photography.

What we have always needed in Killarney along side the visual is the visionary. The revelation in this column that plans were advancing for a third level college in the Killarney Pretty Polly site might inspire organisers "to eye up" a course in photography, perhaps?

Especially. when such national and international talent can be harnessed locally many of whom I am sure would be delighted to impart their skills and experience? The Killarney School of Photography and Film sounds just about right for the town which produced The Dawn almost 100 years ago. That's one wing of the new third level college assigned!

Christmas Crackers and Dry January

If there Christmas spirit was somewhat lacking this second Pandemic Christmas, then so were the Christmas crackers. These were so scarce, and so out of sight, I forgot mine for the first time ever and when I went to look there were none to be had. Apparently the run on crackers began early, retailers tell

Thankfully there was no run on Christmas decorations and Muckross café and craft shop centre sported one of the most spectacular sets of displays this year. In aid of the South West Counselling Centre, the urban setting with its railway and snow with the manger to the side, appropriately, drew lots of awe, as did the snowy owls on the Christmas tree.

Over a week's work went into the displays and it is to be hoped the decorations won't be packed away too early and will be allowed linger.

Christmas dried up too early for some with the push for a dry January, hastened by the huge increases in the bottles of wine and other drink. This was before the 12 days of Christmas were even up.

Sent around the off-licenses, this week I found there is some concern about the impact on the budding local brewing, distilling industry as well as the Irish cider industry, one retailer

In fact in one premises Irish cider took such a hike, certain brands were likely to be discontinued I was told.

January does not seem like a good month to dry anything or to bring in too many changes and yet here we have it and in this year of all years! One wonders if February and the Celtic Spring and the help from longer days is not a better and more natural time to whip us all into shape and make us all more virtuous and abstemious? I was reminded of the lines from Shakespeare – the bard did not like the Puritan spirit that was rising in seventeenth century England and which was to flower under Cromwell.

""Dost thou think that because thou art virtuous, there shall be no more cakes and ale?"

Sir Toby Belch asks the spoilsport Puritan Malvolio when he arrives to break up the all night party in the Christmas play Twelfth Night.

I got something the same from the retailers this week - the hike in prices will probably stop no-one drinking. At least in January!



features in RTE show

A well known Killarney boutique hotel is at the centre of a sketch on RTE which has hit the headlines. Kathleen's Country House was the venue for the "Big Night In" starring the former Circuit Court judge Brian Curtin.

The plot centres on a couple's wedding plans in the hotel and how they turn to disaster after a set up by other actors. Brian Curtin plays Brian the Porter.

The former judge has had a lifetime interest in acting and has appeared in a number of productions but his appearance last week caused a stir. However few people seem to be aware that Kathleen's Country House - the name of the sketch - is the actual Killarney Hotel.

The set uses the mahogany reception desk and features some of the house's huge collection of paintings by Kerry based artists. Apparently Adare Productions had conducted a search for classy boutique hotels and the Killarney Hotel was selected. The filming took place over a whole weekend in the late autumn, at a time when the premises was closed.

It coincides with a Christmas card video received by Kathleen of a Killarney wedding she arranged 20 years ago for a US couple Caroline and Robert. The video shows the couple's marriage at St Mary's Cathedral, a horse and carriage taking them from the church and the champagne reception on the Lower Lake at the Hotel Europe.

At the time there was a Kathleen inspired marketing campaign entitled "Kerry for Lovers" launched by Dick Spring.

And the 2002 wedding probably marks the beginnings of the now huge wedding

> business set in the splendour of Killarney's architecture and scenery.

KERRY MOUNTAIN RESCUE TEAM LOOK BACK ON BUSIEST YEAR TO DATE

 $2^{021\,\text{has been the busiest year in the history Kerry Mountain Rescue}$ Team with the team dealing with 68 callouts up to Christmas Eve.

It follows a quiet year in 2020 with the Covid-19 pandemic casting a shadow over both years; strict lockdowns meaning fewer numbers of people taking to the hills in 2020, and the reverse trend in 2021 with huge numbers of people out and about, particularly over the summer months.

The large increase in visitors to the mountains of the South West this year inevitably resulted in a higher rate of callouts with the majority of incidents occurring in the McGillycuddy's Reeks and a number of others occurring on the Dingle and Beara peninsulas.

Slips, falls and lost parties accounted for the vast majority of incidents with an unfortunately high percentage of serious injuries. Though accidents can and do happen to even the most experienced mountaineers, the main trend in incidents during the year involved a significant number of poorly prepared and ill-equipped parties on the hills.

While it is fantastic to see the increase in popularity of mountain sports in recent years, we would strongly advise people new to the mountains to ensure they research their chosen activity well in advance and employ the services of a guide or join a club to learn the skills required for a safe and enjoyable adventure.

The team continued to train regularly throughout the year, ensuring that essential core skills such as first aid, casualty care and evacuation, technical ropework, navigation, 4x4 and radio communications were refreshed with newer skills and techniques well-practiced in all conditions.

Once again, the team would like to extend a sincere thanks to all those who have donated funds to the team over the year. The team relies heavily on donations to meet their annual running costs and they very much appreciate the effort that donors and fundraisers make in this regard.

KMRT WINTER SAFETY MESSAGE

With the short winter days, cold weather and dark skies, it's more important than ever to plan ahead to ensure you stay safe out on the mountains. As the winter sets in, there are a few key safety considerations for those heading into the mountains.

Be Aware: Make sure you start your walk or climb early enough in the day; be aware of what time it gets dark and allow for rapid changes in the weather too.

Plan: Plan your day and route taking into consideration a reliable mountain weather forecast. Leave a route plan with a responsible person. Don't forget to keep an eye on the weather during the day. Always be prepared to turn back or take a shorter route. The mountains will still be there another day.

Prepare: Whatever your plans, you'll need a good torch and spare batteries in case you get delayed. People sometimes prefer to carry a second lightweight torch so they don't need to change batteries in the cold or the dark if the head torch packs up.

Equipment Checklist (minimum)

- · Sturdy footwear with a good tread
- Food and warm drinks
- Waterproofs
- · Map and compass and ability to navigate
- Hat and gloves
- Torch and batteries
- Extra layers to keep warm and dry
- Fully charged phone and spare battery
- Bivvy bag or group shelter and first aid kit
- Ice axe, crampons and winter skills (when the snow and ice finally arrive!)

If you need to call out mountain rescue, first make a note of all relevant details:

- · Location (with a grid reference if possible)
- Name, gender and age of casualty
- Nature of injuries or emergency
- Number of people in the party
- Your mobile phone number.

Dial 999 or 112, then ask for "Mountain Rescue'.

Give all your prepared details of the incident and STAY WHERE YOU ARE until contacted by the rescue team.

Kerry Mountain Rescue Team is made up of of 35 entirely voluntary members who are on call 24 hours a day 365 days a year to respond to anyone who is in distress in the mountains of southwest Ireland





TIME TO FOCUS ON THE 2022 CAO COLLEGE APPLICATION



As a new year begins with alarming omicron variant uncertainty, college applicants must focus on the CAO form as the deadline looms large. Indeed, it's shaping up to be a very promising year for the 80,000 plus applicants – about 2,500 from Kerry - seeking a third level college course. More than 50,000 college places will be available next August. Applicants have until 5pm on 1st February to submit a completed application form. So, use the remaining weeks wisely. Carefully consider your course choices. Follow your heart but keep an eye on the jobs market.

Since the new Leaving Cert grading system and CAO common points scale were introduced in 2017, points' requirements for many courses have stabilised. As the 'calculated and accredited grades' considerably inflated course points requirements during the past two years, it might be wiser to consult the 2019 cut off points as a guide to likely points requirements in 2022. But keep in mind that points' requirements for courses fluctuate from year to year, so predicting cut off points is an inaccurate science. Each Leaving Cert candidate should aim to achieve her/his best possible result in that exam. Points' requirements for courses will take care of themselves in due course.

The CAO processes applications for admission to undergraduate courses in third level colleges in Ireland. Every public sector university, college and institute in the country, as well as a number of private colleges, participates in the CAO system. An applicant may choose from the entire range of courses in the CAO Handbook 2022. The courses are categorised as 'Level 8' or 'Level 7/6'. The 'Level 8' category contains the Honours Bachelor Degrees while the 'Level 7/6' category contains Ordinary Bachelor Degrees/ Higher Certificates.

All you have to do is submit a single application to compete for one of the available third-level places. The interactive online application system, 'Apply' has made the process very straightforward. 'Apply' is easy to follow, particularly as the CAO provides an 'Interactive Demo' to enable you make a trial application. The CAO Handbook 2022 also contains detailed easy-to-follow information on how to apply for the courses on offer. The interactive online application service will remain open on the CAO website, www.cao.ie until 5pm on 1st February. The fee is €30, if you apply by 20th January and €45 thereafter until the 1st February.





BÓRD PLEANÁLA APPEALS

An Bord Pleanála

The proposed Adare Bypass is a particularly significant project for the county of Kerry, as it is one of the main entry/exit points for the Kingdom, according to the Deputy Mayor of Kerry County Council and Cathaoirleach of Kenmare Municipal District, Councillor Michael Cahill.

"The transit of people and goods in and out of Kerry, is much restricted and delayed by poor traffic conditions at Adare and the proposed bypass would be a godsend. However, An Bórd Pleanála have once again postponed announcing their decision within the planning process" stated the Fianna Fáil man.

"The question must be asked if An Bórd Pleanála is equipped for this task? Is it properly resourced, is it sufficiently staffed? From the number of postponements experienced during the decision on The South Kerry Greenway, and subsequent legal challenges to it, some still pending, is the correct type of professional expertise available to An Bórd Pleanála" demanded Councillor Cahill.

"The likes of the Adare Bypass and the South Kerry Greenway are major

public infrastructure projects being progre

Taking ten and twenty years to complete them because of red tape and slow moving bureaucracy is absolutely unforgivable" stated the Rossbeigh based Councillor.

"It appears to me that An Bórd Pleanála is overdue a total shakeup in personnel and procedures and that legislation in this area requires to be brought up to date and streamlined. Personnel rights and Environmental concerns need to be built in to a robust system which allows depositions from interested parties affected in the locality. All objections must be taken on board and dealt with in a speedy and considerate manner and the decision made should then be final. We have been strung along for far too long with two of the biggest projects ever for our county, the South Kerry Greenway and the Adare Bypass and the time for progress is now. These two massive projects are essential to the economic recovery of County Kerry" added Councillor Cahill.

TESTING RULES FOR VACCINATED PASSENGERS TO BE REMOVED

AS IRELAND SET TO PURCHASE NEW TREATMENTS

Vaccinated passengers no longer need to show a negative Covid-19 test before entering the country. The decision to revise the travel rules for entry into Ireland was decided at a meeting of Cabinet on Wednesday. Late last year the requirement to show a negative PCR was introduced following concerns over the spread of the Omicron variant.

In another move in the fight against the disease, The Minister for Health, Stephen Donnelly TD has confirmed that Ireland is pursuing the purchase of COVID-19 antiviral and monoclonal antibody treatments, following discussions at today's (Wednesday) cabinet meeting.

Ireland will seek to purchase treatments manufactured by Pfizer, Glaxo Smith Kline (GSK), and Merck (MSD).

Minister Donnelly said: "COVID-19 incidence is at unprecedented levels in our communities. Our health service is continuing to deal with increasing levels of people requiring care in hospital as a result of COVID-19 infection. This virus continues to pose a significant risk to the functioning of our economy and wider society.

"In order to protect essential services and the health of those most vulnerable to infection with COVID-19, it is imperative that we are prepared to use all of the tools available. That is why, at my request, my Department and the HSE are working to progress EU joint procurement for these treatments, as well as bilateral channels. The Government has agreed that funding necessary to support the purchase of these treatments will be provided."

Income tax changes will benefit people and families in Kerry in 2022 - Griffin

Income tax changes taking effect from the 1st of January will benefit people and families in Kerry in 2022, Deputy Government Chief Whip, Brendan Griffin TD has said.

Deputy Griffin said Fine Gael in Government is supporting average and middle-income earners to meet the rising cost of living through income tax changes. The tax package was announced by Minister for Finance Paschal

Donohoe in October as part of Budget 2022

Deputy Griffin said, "Fine Gael is on the side of the average and middleincome earner who is dealing with the rising cost of living. The tax changes announced by my colleague Minister Paschal Donohoe in the Budget, come into effect on the 1st of January and will benefit everyone who pays income tax, supporting people and families in Kerry.

"These are tangible changes that everyone will feel the benefit of in their pocket throughout 2022. The standard rate band for all earners will rise from €35,300 to €36,800 for single earners, from €39,300 to €40,800 for one-parent families; and from €44,300 to €45,800 for couples. There is also a €50 increase in each of the main tax credits – personal tax credit, employee tax credit and the earned income credit.


"There is also a change to the Universal Social Charge- the 2% rate



band ceiling will increase in line with the increase in the national minimum wage from €10.20 to €10.50 per hour. This was the eighth increase in the minimum wage under Fine Gael in Government and we wanted to ensure that full-time workers benefiting from the increase will remain outside the top rate of USC.

"As well as the tax changes, Fine Gael also prioritised spending measures in Budget 2022 to help combat the cost of living and add to our quality of life. WHEN CAN YOU ACCESS YOUR PENSION& WHAT ARE YOUR OPTIONS WHEN YOU WANT TO RETIRE?

You can normally get access to your pension from age 60, a lot of the rules depend on whether you are an employee or self employed. Approved Retirement Funds: You may be entitled to keep some of your money in an approved retirement fund, money can be taken from the fund to give you a regular income, usually monthly. This is subject to taxation also. Taxation at retirement is often much lower than when you are working.

It is extremely important that you take your time and have all the options explained to you in plain simple English and that you understand all your options clearly before you make your final decision. As well as the above there is much more to be discussed about your pension. 



When was your last Sight Test?

As well as an eve health check, a sight test may detect signs of underlying general health conditions, such as diabetes, high cholesterol, and high blood pressure. It is especially important in early identification of leading causes of preventable blindness such as glaucoma and diabetic retinopathy. Everyone should have a sight test every two years or more often if recommended.

Glaucoma

Glaucoma affects 1-2% of the population, and is a leading cause of sight loss. In the majority of cases, glaucoma is asymptomatic, so regular sight tests are important for detecting glaucoma. The majority of patients with glaucoma are diagnosed following referral from an optometrist. Without regular sight tests, the prevalence of late presentation, sight threatening glaucoma, would rise.

Diabetic retinopathy

People with diabetes are at a high risk of developing retinopathy and possible blindness if untreated. Attending regular sight tests allows signs of developing retinopathy to be identified

Uncorrected vision in older people also increases the risk of falls. Falls are the leading cause of disability and death from injury among people over 75 in the UK

TREES



Trees are beautiful in any garden and their long life makes them a wonderful garden feature. A tree should be the first thing you plant in your garden after the hedging — they can be underplanted afterwards with bulbs and shrubs. Trees are interesting in all four seasons with attractive unfolding of leaves in spring, full foliage in summer, good Autumn colour followed by decorative bark in the Winter. The first and most important thing you need to know when buying a tree is what's the height and spread going to be when it is mature. There are many varieties of trees to choose from and there is a tree suitable for most areas. Trees can be planted all year round but as with hedging, trees can be planted when they are dormant between Novemeber and March.

With these bare-rooted trees you will still have a few weeks left to plant them. If you plant beofre the end of March, it will give the tree a better chance of rooting into the ground that bit quicker. When planting your bare rooted tree, dig the hole big enough, that you can spread out the roots all around the hole. Then drive your stake into the hole roughly about 6 to 8 inches below the bottom of the hole,place your tree and spread the roots out well. If possible place your stake on the side of the prevailing winds as this will ensure that the tree is blo against the stake when the wind is high. Fill in the soil mixed with compost around the roots and firm in with the heel of your foot. Lastly, place your tree ties on one near the top and one at the bottom with a spacer in between to stop the bark being damaged by the




