



## **BUSINESS LEADERS COME TOGETHER TO** MAINTAIN KERRY TO DUBLIN FLIGHT

A host of business leaders, hoteliers, community activists and representative groups from across Kerry have come together to call on the Government to maintain its support for the renewal of the Kerry to Dublin flights operating under a State PSO and which are coming up to an end of a fixed 3 year term this November 2014. The move comes as the Minister for Transport and Tourism, Leo Varadkar TD finalises the Government's new aviation policy, which will include recommendations about the future structures of regional airports like Kerry Airport.

The Government currently supports services to and from Kerry Airport through the State funded Public Service Obligation (PSO) contract. Under the current contract, which is set to expire later this year, 2 return services per day operate between Kerry and **Dublin Airports.** 

A decision whether or not to maintain the current PSO structure is due to be made in the coming weeks.

Passenger number for the route, which is operated by Aer Lingus Regional, are up 22 percent in the last six months of 2013.

The campaign is supported by a variety of interest groups and business throughout Kerry, including: Dingle, Kenmare, Killarney, Listowel and Tralee Chambers of Commerce, the Irish Hotels Federation, Kerry Group, Fexco,

## **Know Your Rights:**

## **INVALIDITY PENSION CHANGES**

### QUESTION

I am getting Invalidity Pension. Will my payment be increased when I reach 65 years of age later this year?

### **ANSWER**

No. As a result of changes announced in Budget 2014, the higher payment at age 65 is no longer made.

Invalidity Pension is a weekly payment for people who cannot work because of a long-term illness or disability and who are covered by social insurance (PRSI). From 2 January 2014, in line with the abolition of the State Pension (Transition), the higher weekly Invalidity Pension rate of €230.30, paid when claimants reached age 65, has been discontinued. Previously, at age 65 the rate of payment increased to the same rate as the State Pension (Transition).

The rate now payable to people aged 65 (and under) is €193.50 per week. This change applies to those claiming Invalidity Pension who reach their 65th birthday on 2 January 2014 or later. Existing 65-year-old claimants are not affected by the change.

People who are getting Invalidity Pension (existing and new recipients) will continue to be automatically transferred to State Pension (Contributory) at age 66 and they will then receive a weekly rate of €230.30.

There is also a change to the weekly rate payable to some qualified adults of those claiming Invalidity Pension. For those qualified adults who reach their 66th birthday on or after 2 January 2014, the weekly rate payable has been standardised at €138.10 per week. Existing qualified adults who reached the age of 66 before 2 January 2014 are not affected by the change.

## COULD YOU BE ELIGIBLE FOR HEAR & DARE APPLICATION ROUTES INTO HIGHER EDUCATION IN 2014?

The CAO deadline of February 1st has now past and the attention of Leaving Cert students is focused on the "pre" Leaving Cert exams. The Kerry Branch of Guidance Counsellors urges students who have applied to CAO 2014 to check if they are eligible for the HEAR or the DARE schemes and if so, to apply for them before the deadline of the 1st of March at 5.15p.m. If you are a school leaver under the age of 23 you may be eligible to apply for one or both schemes on www.cao.ie under "My Application".

HEAR (the Higher Education Access Route) is a third-level admissions scheme for school leavers from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds. To be deemed eligible for the

HEAR scheme students must meet certain criteria. All this information can be found on www.cao.ie. Supporting documentation must be sent by post to CAO by the 1st of April at 5.15pm. Ensure that you allow plenty of time for them to reach CAO and send photocopies as students can appeal the decision once notified of eligibility in late June.

DARE (Disability Access Route to Education) is a supplementary admissions scheme for school leavers with disabilities, specific learning difficulties, ongoing significant illnesses or mental health conditions. There are 3 parts to the DARE application process. Students are required to fill up a Supplementary Information form online at www.cao.ie by the 1st of March

at 5.15pm. Students must also submit a Secondlevel Reference and Evidence of Disability Form to CAO by post by April 1st at 5.15pm.

Supports available to students include: Reduced points places, orientation programmes, study skills and extra tuition if needed, one to one meetings with support staff and mentoring. In the case of HEAR bursaries are available. DARE students can avail of access to assistive technology and training and exam support. For all details on both schemes and the list of participating 3rd level institutions see www. accesscollege.ie and seek the help of the guidance counsellor in your school.






### STATEMENT CLLR SEAN COUNIHAN ON TRANSITION PENSION



Workers who's contract of employment states that they must retire at age 65 have to make themselves avalible for jobseekers allowance now as a result of repesentations by this council. This has been altered to leave such persons stay on jobseekers benefit for twelve months. Now it's ironic that a person forced to retire at 65 will still have to comply under the

terms of jobseekers benefit namly having to be avalible and seeking work. It is important to note any one over the age of 62 is not bound by any of the penailtes of non engagement. The Transition Pension should be looked at again in a more detailed, way if you had for example a person who worked for the private sector and then entered the public sector pre 1995 and paying a modified stamp you could have a person who ends up with no entitlement to jobseekers benefit. Some of these people could be at the lower end of the public service. They would not qualify for a full pension and would have depended on the Transition pension to make up the shortfall in their pension. Now I would also like the department to clarify that under the terms of entitlement to jobseekers that if a person of 65 who has just missed out in Qualifying for the Transition pension will be subject to the rule of non-payment for up to 8 weeks if they decide to give up work. The government must sit down and have a think about this after all a lot of workers at that age right now are the ones who have seen their pensions devastated by the horrors that the last government bestowed on this country [least we forget], there are five thousand people at work caught in this dilemma right now imagine if those people could afford to retire there is the possibility of five thousand jobs being created or even if one third of the people were replaced you create 1701 jobs. This amount of jobs could keep some of our young people at home from foreign lands. It is a fact that the pension situation has to be addressed but by doing it now and to the people retiring right now is a disaster when you think these are the people who were hit with the social charge on their wages while any of them that had private pensions saw them devastated while we continue to shift monies in to the banks it's time to bring fairness to the working people.

### RESOURCE TEACHING **HOURS**

**Statement from Michael Healy Rae** 



Over a long period of time I have raised the issue of children with Down Syndrome and that they should have automatic entitlement to resource teaching hours. I am supporting a bill from Deputy Finian McGrath which will add Down Syndrome to the list of disabilities for which individual resource teaching is automatically provided. I want to thank Down Syndrome Ireland who have campaigned in this issue for a long time. My only hope now is that the bill will pass in time to benefit children from September.

### MINISTER VISITS KERRY

Junior Minister Brian Hayes visited Kerry yesterday to view some of the areas which were hit badly by storm and flood damage.

His visit coincided with a warning from the Environmental Protection Agency to the Government that they must begin to prepare to cope with extreme weather conditions in the future.

Earlier in the week, the Taoiseach admitted that there is not enough funds to provide adequate flood defences around the country as thousands of homes have been left devastated after this weeks flooding.

He said that sections of the Roads within the estate need to be improved.

Councillor Gleeson said in conclusion that this was the Council's last chance to acknowledge the commitment of the residents to their Estate and that every effort should be made to ensure that it is of the highest possible standard when it is handed over to a new authority next June.







# ARDENING



with John O'Sullivar

With Spring upon us, even though the weather is unfavourable for gardeners at the moment there are still certain jobs to be done in the garden.

Before you start work it is essential to complete a good tidy up — however as the weather has been so bad over the past few weeks, try to avoid too much traffic on the lawn.

Following this, its time to start pruning back all deadwood from shrubs and hedges after the winter. A good pair of secateurs is one of the most important tools in the garden and this ensures clean cuts when used properly. Among the most important plants to be pruned at this stage are herbaceous perennials such as Hostas, Day Lillies and Astilbies. These can be pruned by cutting

away the dead foliage and dead wood. It is important to mulch around the plants following the pruning as new growth will be emerging, if it hasn't already. This advice should be followed for all herbaceous perennials.

In the next few weeks you will see primrose and polyanthus flowering. These will flower for 3 to 4 weeks. Following this, to ensure good flowering next spring, it is important to lift and divide the plants and space out accordingly or else to repot. At this time of year it is very important to look after out door container plants to ensure good growth and flowering for the rest of the year.

Firstly remove the first 2 inches of compost, if possible. Then add fresh compost and a slow release fertilizer. If any of your plants are ericaceous (acid-loving) for example azaleas, rhododendron, camellia etc, it would be important to add a compost such as brown gold.

These jobs should keep you busy over the coming week (weather permitting) and next week I will focus on Spring colour.



As Ireland were made wait until Sunday to get their Six nations championship under way, what was witnessed in the Aviva on Sunday was nothing of a surprise. - 1 tomato, sliced
- 50g light cream cheese

# CYBERBULLYING

Cyberbullying refers to bullying which takes place using the internet, mobile phones or other technological devices. This may be in the form of sending nasty or threatening messages, emails or photos, videos or putting such materials up on social media web pages. It can also take the form of setting up fake profiles which say cruel things about an individual or accessing someone's account repeatedly to make trouble for them. Cyberbullying, can be difficult to detect and address and sometimes one may not know who the bully is when they are bullied online. Many people view the internet as 'not reality' - and it gives the illusion of being much more anonymous – thus allowing them to behave in a more aggressive way. Given the wide cyber audience, when a message is posted online, the information can be far-reaching and instantaneous.

If you are being deliberately harassed or bullied online, it is important that you tell someone about it. You can talk to your parents or someone you trust like a teacher or a friend. It can be very upsetting to be deliberately attacked or humiliated online.

The following is a list of some helpful things you can do if this is happening to you

- 1. You can unfriend or block the bully from your site whether it's a mobile phone, social networking site or chat room. No one has to tolerate bullying from another. Online you have the power to unfriend or block people- which removes the bullies power.
- 2. Don't reply. Never reply to a message the bully only gets satisfaction when they receive a response.
- 3. Keep the message. This will give you a record of the messages, dates and times — which may be helpful for reporting.
- 4. **Report Problems** to your Internet Service Provider or mobile phone provider. Look for the "Report Abuse" button or contact Customer Care. If you consider the cyberbullying to be of a serious nature or potentially criminal then you should contact your local Garda office.

For further protection and to prevent the problem happening again it is important to block unwanted contacts, change your password regularly and report any abuse on the site to mobile operators or social networking providers.

# CHILDRENS HEALTH TACKLING CHILDHOOD **OBESITY**

### **Reducing Portion Sizes**

Children's portion sizes have gotten bigger over the last 20-30 years. They're children, give them child-sized portions. A 5 year old needs about half the amount an adult does.

### Here are some tips to help you on your way.

- 1. Give them smaller portions of food on their plates to with, and if they want more food, then give it to them.
- start
- 2. If they say they're hungry, offer them something nutritious like fruit and vegetables (for example, an apple or handful of grapes).
- 3. Avoid having fatty and sugary snack foods freely available between and after meals.
- 4. Don't pressure them to eat all the food on their plate, allow them to stop when they say 'I've had enough'.
- 5. Use plates and cutlery that match their size.
- 6. Look at the proportions of food you offer during the day, they should be roughly:
  - One third fruit and vegetables.
  - One third starchy foods like bread and potatoes
  - One third dairy (milk, cheese and yogurt) and protein (meat and fish).

### **MAKE BEING ACTIVE FUN!**

All physical activity counts towards your kids' 60 minutes a day of exercise. And you don't have to do it all at once.

### TIPS

- If your children have not been active at all, start slowly with bursts of 15 to 30 minutes – and build it into your daily routine.
- Add activities over time until they reach the goal of at least 60 minutes a day.
- Free play is just as important as structured sports. Running around, playing in the garden or local park and having fun
- Kids love a challenge setting them a task is a great way to get them active and keep them focused. For example, ask them: 'How many times can you throw and catch a ball between you without dropping it?' or 'How many skips can you do in a minute?'.
- Check out activities in your area so your child can make local friends. Then you won't have to drive them around. It can also help them to explore and develop confidence and social skills.
- If you have safety concerns, get together with other parents and agree to patrol the area. You get a walk and chat while they get

- Don't let the rain interfere. Have rain gear (jacket, leggings and wellies) to hand. In very bad weather, swap outdoor activities for indoor ones (e.g. hide and seek, disco dancing in the kitchen, short bursts of house clean-up followed by a trip to the swimming pool or sports club).
- Join in! Adults need to be active too for 30 minutes a day. Take a family walk. To add fun, you can challenge your kids to:
  - Walk backwards or sideways
    - Skip or hop on one foot
  - Take giant steps

# **POLYCYSTIC OVARY SYNDROME 2**

### Diagnosis/ Tests required:

Tests may be advised to clarify the diagnosis, and to rule out other hormone conditions.

- Blood tests may be taken to measure certain chemicals (hormones). For example, a test to measure the male hormone testosterone and luteinising hormone (LH) which tend to be high in women with PCOS.
- An ultrasound scan of the ovaries may be advised. The scan can detect the typical appearance of PCOS with the many small cysts (follicles) in slightly enlarged ovaries.

### What is the treatment for polycystic ovary syndrome?

There is no cure for PCOS. However, symptoms can be treated, and the associated health risks can be reduced:

### You should aim to lose weight if you are overweight

Losing weight helps to reduce the high insulin level that occurs in PCOS. This has a knock-on effect of reducing the male chemical (hormone) called testosterone. This then improves the chance of your ovulating and so can help with period and fertility problems and may also help to reduce hair growth and acne. The increased risk of long-term problems such as diabetes, high blood pressure, etc are also reduced.

Even a moderate amount of weight loss can help.

The best foods to eat for someone with PCOS are those which are slowly absorbed keeping blood sugar levels steady. (These are referred to as low glycaemic index (low GI) foods). This means avoiding white bread, pasta and rice, and choosing wholemeal alternatives. Potatoes and sugary foods and drinks are also best avoided. Most fruit, vegetables, pulses and wholegrain foods are both healthy and have a low GI.

#### Treating hair growth

Hair growth is due to the increased level of the hormone testosterone.

- Unwanted hair can be removed by shaving, waxing, hair-removing creams, electrolysis, and laser treatments. These need repeating every now and then, although electrolysis and laser treatments may be more long-lasting (but are expensive).
- A cream called eflornithine may be prescribed to rub on affected areas of skin. It can reduce unwanted hair growth, although this effect quickly wears off after stopping treatment.
- Some tablets can also treat hair growth, such as some contraceptive pills. These can also help to regulate periods and may reduce acne.

### Treating acne

The treatments used for acne in women with PCOS are no different to the usual treatments for acne.

### Treating period problems

Some women who have no periods, or have infrequent periods, do not want any treatment for this. However there is a slight increased risk of cancer of the uterus (womb) if you do not have any periods over a prolonged duration. For this reason some women with PCOS are advised to take the contraceptive pill, as it causes regular withdrawal bleeds similar to periods. If this is not suitable, another option is to take progestogen hormone for several days every month, which will cause a monthly bleed like a period. Another option is a coil which releases small amounts of progesterone into the womb preventing a build-up of the lining.

### Fertility issues

Although fertility is often reduced, contraception is still required to be sure of not getting pregnant. The chance of becoming pregnant depends on how often ovulation occurs. Some women with PCOS ovulate now and then, others not at all. Losing weight can help to improve fertility.

### Metformin and other insulin-sensitising medicines

Metformin is a medicine that is commonly used to treat people with diabetes. It makes the body's cells more sensitive to insulin. It is sometimes used in PCOS, especially if there are fertility problems. It is usually only started by a specialist.

# Preventing future problems As the risk of diabetes is increased with polycystic ovaries, it may a good idea to have regular check (once/year) for diabetes, especially if obese, aged over 40 or if there is a family history of diabetes. # **ROAD SAFETY ADVICE ON HEAVY** RAINFALL, **STRONG WINDS AND FLOODING**

The Road Safety Authority (RSA) is advising all road users to take extra care when using roads in poor weather

- It takes longer to stop a vehicle on wet roads so slow down and allow extra distance between you and the vehicle in front, 4 seconds at a minimum (use the 2 second rule and repeat it twice).
- Take special care when driving behind trucks or buses as they generate a considerable amount of spray which reduces your visibility.
- Watch out for vulnerable road users such as pedestrians, cyclists and motorcyclists.
- Use dipped headlights at all times of poor visibility not parking/side lights and fog lights.
- Be mindful of Aquaplaning on roads where 100/120kmh speeds apply. Aquaplaning occurs

where the tyre thread fill with water and the driver is at risk of losing control of the vehicle.

- Pedestrians, cyclists and motorcyclists are advised to be seen. Wear bright clothing with reflective armbands or a reflective belt.
- Pedestrians should walk on a footpath, not in the street. Walk on the right hand side of the road, facing traffic if there are no footpaths.
- Beware of objects being blown out onto the road. Expect the unexpected.
- Watch out for falling/fallen debris on the road and vehicles veering across the road.
- Control of a vehicle may be affected by strong cross winds. High sided vehicles and motorcyclists are particularly vulnerable to strong winds.
- Allow extra space between you and vulnerable road users such as cyclists and motorcyclists.
- Drive with dipped headlights at all times.
- Monitor radio weather broadcasts while travelling.

### The RSA also has the following advice for driving in flooded conditions

- If the road ahead is flooded choose another route, do not attempt to drive through it.
- Flooded roads that appear shallow could be deeper than you think.
- After going through water, drive slowly with your foot on the brake pedal for a short distance - this helps to dry the brakes.
- Sometimes roads can be closed due to their fragile state after wet weather or because they are blocked by flooding.
- Road users should always follow recommended routes and obey signs closing roads to traffic.

- Take extra care when crossing the road or cycling in extremely windy conditions as a sudden gust of wind could blow you into the path of an oncoming vehicle.
- Walk on a footpath, not in the street. Walk on the right hand side of the road, facing traffic if there are no footpaths














### **NUNS'** INNOVATIVE EFFORT TARGETS SEX TRAFFICKING WHERE IT **HAPPENS**

U.S. Catholic Sisters Against Human Trafficking recently sponsored an ad they hope will spark awareness in the airline industry, as victims are often flown from city to city as they are trafficked. The image is a demure little girl with the accompanying words: "To her parents, she is priceless. But, it's really up to the market."

And major sporting events create perfect venues. So with the Super Bowl approaching, advocates were on alert to the marketing of minors and others who are trafficked into the sex trade at hotels where football fans will stay.

Human trafficking is a fast-growing criminal industry, with \$32 billion in profits annually. Law enforcement is often racing to keep up, as the Internet has shoved much activity underground. Yet nuns working with a Missouri business originated one of the most proactive and sensible approaches.

Several years ago, The U.S. Federation of the Sisters of St. Joseph insisted that their 2011 national conference be held in a hotel willing to sign on as a partner against sex trafficking. They approached a St. Louis company, Nix Conference & Meeting Management, for help. A partnership was born.

Nix's principals now advocate for hotels to sign an agreement and give staff training to spot the illegal activity and alert police. Guidelines created by ECPAT (End Child Prostitution and Trafficking) USA are used. And the nuns have gone on to form a nationwide network of advocacy with Nix.

"We sit down with management and explain what can be happening in their hotel," said Sister Jeanne Christensen, justice advocate for human trafficking for the Sisters of Mercy West Midwest Community in Kansas City.

Sr. Christensen said they don't blame, but instead try to get the hotels to keep staff trained, as turnover is high among



housekeeping and room service staff.

# THE HISTORY OF HIS LIFE IS THE HISTORY OF MUSIC CHANGING THE WORLD

94 year old Pete Seeger was an innovative figure in American music, kept folk music alive and influenced generations of musicians from Bob Dylan to Bruce Springsteen, died recently of natural causes.

As a solo performer, songwriter, interpreter, and member of the legendary folk band the Weavers, Mr. Seeger brought traditional and political songs to the mainstream over the course of his 70year career. He wrote or co-wrote "If I Had a Hammer" (a hit for Peter, Paul and Mary) and "Where Have All the Flowers Gone?" (made famous by the Kingston Trio). The Byrds had a Number One hit with "Turn! Turn! Turn!" which Mr. Seeger had adapted from the Book of Ecclesiastes and set to music. In Mr. Seeger hands, songs from Cuba ("Guantanamera") and South Africa ("Wimoweh") became beloved sing-along standards around the world, and "We Shall Overcome," a traditional gospel song that Mr. Seeger heard early in his career, was a regular part of his repertoire and a staple of civil rights rallies for decades to come.

Although Mr. Seeger never scored a Top 40 hit on his own, the charts were never an indication of his overwhelming impact. His massive influence on music and message was never more obvious than at his 90th birthday concert at Madison Square Garden in 2009. Among those paying tribute to Mr. Seeger were Bruce Springsteen, Joan Baez, Emmylou Harris and many others. Throughout his career, he participated in pro-union and civil rights events and protested wars and nuclear power. For his trouble — and his membership in the American Communist Party — Mr. Seeger was blacklisted by the House Un-American Activities Committee in the Fifties; to make ends meet, he sometimes had to play four concerts a day, for \$25 each. "I still believe the only chance for the human race to survive is to give up such pleasures as war, racism and private profit", were beliefs that Mr. Seeger held until his death.

Offstage Mr. Seeger helped clean up the Hudson River with his Clearwater Project, which began in the late '60s. In recent years, Mr. Seeger, who lived with his longtime wife Toshi at a house he built in New York's Hudson Valley slowed down a little though he continued to record and tour. He also appeared at an Occupy rally in 2011.

# TAKING CARE OF OUR MOST **THREATENED GARDEN**

House sparrows, starlings and song thrushes are rapidly declining in number, but there's plenty we can do to help them in our gardens.

:: House sparrows are seed eaters, but they feed live food particularly aphids - to their young, so try to leave an area in your garden where aphids have free rein. Availability of nest sites is also important; house sparrows nest in loose colonies, so add a few nest boxes to the north or east sides of your house, but avoid locations where swallows breed.

They also need large shrubs and hedges to socialise in, so why not plant a hedge? A mixed, native hedge will provide them with thick cover, as well as a wide range of insects to feed to their young. A good choice of plants includes hawthorn, beech, spindle, hazel and holly.

:: Starlings also eat a lot of insects, particularly beetles, flies and flying ants, as well as earthworms and leather jackets (the larvae of crane flies, or daddy long legs). Some gardeners have problems with leather jackets in their lawns, but if you can strike a balance and tolerate starlings digging



around for grubs, they will be better for it. Plant an elder tree as starlings seem to be fond of elderberries, and erect a large nest box with a 2in (45mm) diameter hole high up on a shady wall of your house.

:: Song thrushes love to eat snails, so avoid using slug pellets as these may harm any wildlife that eats the dead bodies. Instead, you may have success by leaving a rock or piece of slate in the garden, which song thrushes might use as an anvil to smash snail shells. Mulch borders with leaf mould to retain moisture and increase the number of invertebrates for song thrushes to eat, and grow berry-bearing shrubs such as holly, ivy, blackthorn and hawthorn, to provide food for them in autumn and winter. Supplement this food by leaving grated cheese, rehydrated raisins, halved apples and breadcrumbs on the ground in winter.

### THE **BREED PROBLEM** PEOPLE WHO RAISE THEM

One of the most important jobs at Denkai Community Veterinary Clinic in Colorado belongs to a pit bull puppy named Dominic. Dominic came to the clinic after police found his mother and her litter of puppies in a Denver home during a raid. Denver has a ban on pit bulls, so the animals were transported to Denkai in Eaton, Colo.

Vet technician Stephany Haswell offered to foster a couple of puppies, so she brought Dominic and one of his siblings home. To her surprise, her family and three dogs bonded quickly with Dominic, but Ms. Haswell was determined not to adopt another

However, it took time to find forever homes for all the pups and by the time Domnic was the only pup left the Haswell family insisted Domnic already had his forever home so Ms. Haswell began taking Domnic to work with her so her older dogs could get a break from the rambunctious puppy, she worried Dominic would be a nuisance at the clinic, but the puppy surprised everyone when he found himself a job.

One morning, clinic staff set a dog just out of surgery on a pillow outside the operating room, and Dominic immediately settled down next to him. At first, Ms. Haswell thought Dominic was simply cold, but later that day she watched him nestle into a pile of dogs just out of surgery. He rested his head on them when they cried, and the dog that whined the most got the most

"I was actually walking through our veterinary clinic and stopped dead in my tracks as I watched Dominic literally walk over to two of our post-surgery patients as one was beginning to wake up and sort of struggle," said Denkai Animal Sanctuary President Floss Blackburn. "He calmly lay down between the two of them and put his head on that dog's shoulder. The dog immediately relaxed."

Since then, both clinic staff and patients have welcomed Dominic's post-surgery cuddles.

Dogs waking up from surgery can be frightened or even aggressive, but when Dominic lies with them, the animals wake up calm and rested.

Dominic even cuddles with cats post-surgery. However, they're not guite as grateful as the dogs.

The pit bull puppy now has a part-time job. Every day he's at the clinic, he waits at the door until vet techs bring a dog out and lay him on the pillow. Then Dominic takes his place, cuddling the animal until he awakes.

"Animals are incredible and so sensitive," Ms. Blackburn said. "If people would watch more and observe, I think that they would see these things in their animals."

# AND THEY SAY YOU CANT TAKE IT WITH YOU

One of the earliest Anglo-Saxon Christian burial sites in Britain has been discovered in a village outside Cambridge. The grave of a teenage girl from the mid 7th century AD has an extraordinary combination of two extremely rare finds: a 'bed burial' and an early Christian artefact in the form of a stunning gold and garnet cross.

The girl, aged around 16, was buried on an ornamental bed -avery limited Anglo-Saxon practice of the mid to later 7th century

- with a pectoral Christian cross (3 and a half centimetres in diameter) on her chest that had probably been sewn onto her clothing. Fashioned from gold and intricately set with cut garnets, only the fifth of its kind ever to be found, the artefact dates this grave to the very early years of the English Church, probably between 650 and 680 AD.

The bed consisted of a wooden frame held together by metal brackets, with further pieces of looped metal fixing the crossslats to create a suspended bed base, similar to modern beds, but with a straw mattress. The body was then placed on the bed, probably when it was already in the grave.

The teenager's grave also contained other items. An iron knife and a chain that would have hung from the waist were found in the girl's grave, along with some glass beads which seemed to have been kept in a purse on the end of the chain. Preserved textile on the iron knife and chain offers the possibility of reconstructing her burial costume.

For 18 years before Billy Standley died he planned every detail of his funeral including buying up the three plots next to his wife's grave, had his sons build him a custom casket, and arranged for the funeral director to embalm him in a sitting position. Finally his dream funeral took place, and he was laid to rest atop his custom-painted 1967 Electra Glide cruiser Harley-Davidson on January 31st 2014.

The casket was made out of plexiglass, with wood and steel rods reinforcing its bottom.

Five embalmers prepared his body and secured him with a metal back brace and straps to ensure he'd never lose his seat, even as it was towed by a trailer to his final resting place.

The casket was assembled in the garage of Vernon's' funeral home in Mechanicsburg Ohio, enshrining him with his trophies and well-worn leathers.

Along with his friends and family, motorcyclists from across the country reportedly rode along with his funeral procession through Mechanicsburg, Ohio.

### REMEMBER RIPLEYS **BELIEVE IT OR NOT?**

On January 14, 2014 a statement from Ripley's announced their acquisition of a Steve Jobs portrait made entirely out of keys from old keyboards. The amazing portrait was created by renowned Orlando artist Doug Powell, who in the past has created other unique artwork out of keyboards, jigsaw puzzle pieces and other random objects.

The 7'by 4'portrait is a collection of 6,000 keys from old keyboards acquired at garage sales, on Craigslist and at a collection centre for old keyboards. Mr. Powell used a combination of black, brown, gray, yellow and shades of off-white keys, to make the
