Organiser of the event is local businesswoman Karie O'Toole who lost her dog Teddy to old age 3 months ago and decided to do something in his memory.

After a chance meeting with volunteers from The Irish Guide Dogs for the Blind, she signed up to do Stage 1 of the Camino De Santiago to

raise funds for them.

Karie who has never before hiked in her life is now training for this tough challenge.

On August 17th she will be joining 24 others and taking on the Camino De Santiago Stage 1. One of the most demanding stages of the entire Camino, the week-long hike will see Karie traversing the Pyrenees, reaching a height of 1500m on day one alone!

"As part of the fundraising, I wanted to do something different and thought a Spanish theme would be a great idea and Niamh Sheahan from JM Reidy's had been there from the start", Karie told the Killarney Outlook "Both Niamh and Mikey thought it was a great idea and have been so supportive in helping me launch this event and I am so grateful to them both", Karie added

all things Spanish, Sangria, Tapas, Rioja and entertainment.




BUSY TIMES FOR KERRY MOUNTAIN RESCUE TEAM

It's been a busy few weeks for members of the Kerry Mountain Rescue team who have dealt with a total of 7 callouts since the 11th May. Among the incidents the team dealt with included: 11th May - Recovery operation, Hags Tooth Ridge. 18th May - Lost party, Tomies/Shehy Mountain. 2nd May - Fall from height, Torc Waterfall. 25th May - Medical emergency, Torc Mountain. 28th May - Fall from height, Devil's Ladder Carrauntoohil. 28th May - Cycling accident, Derrycunihy. 01st/02nd June - Lost party, Shehy Mountain. Kerry Mountain Rescue Team membership is entirely voluntary and the 35 active team members come from all walks of life, but all are active and accomplished walkers and

mountaineers in their own right. The team cover the entire SW of the country – principally the peninsulas of Beara, Iveragh and Dingle – and boasts fifteen of Ireland's twenty highest peaks, including Carrauntoohil (the country's highest, at 1039 metres). Approximately 50% of the annual budget is met through grants from the Irish Coast Guard and Kerry County Council and the remaining 50% is raised through private donations and the Team's own fundraising efforts. And while the last three weeks was extremely busy for the team, they also managed to fit in some training sessions. They train regularly in a complete range of disciplines such as casualty care, technical

ropework (including horizontal and vertical stretcher lowers, cableways, strop rescues, hoists etc.), helicopter winching, search management, navigation, radio communication, 4WD techniques etc.. Many team members also go on their own mountaineering trips to places such as the Alps, Southern Alps (New Zealand), Himalayas, Alaska, Africa, Scotland etc... All team members are qualified to Advanced Rescue Emergency Care (REC) First Aid Level, and first Aid training is undertaken on a regular basis to ensure that the skills of each team member are continually maintained, and the most up-to-date developments in emergency medicine are utilised.

CADEN TAKES SHOW JUMPING WORLD BY STORM

13 year old Caden O'Donoghue is an exceptional rider and performer who has accomplished in just one year what other kids aim or dream for in a lifetime.

His coach and trainer Claudia Vallverdú Felip has international experience as a grand prix rider (Dressage, and 1'35m showjumping) around the world including countries such as the USA, France and Germany and trained by Olympic riders is helping and ensuring that every member of her team boost up to any podium.

Caden has won over 55 rosettes, cups, medals, leagues and trophies in less than a year and is actually competing at 1'00m classes training up for a very near 1'10 competitor soon.

With their sights set on joining the Irish team in the future, Claudia Vallverdú Felip also trains Leah Clarke and Jessica Fuller who along with Caden have raised over 100 prizes and rosettes in one year. Caden is certainly a prodigy to be on the lookout for in the coming years. "As Kerry athletes are rising up in all sports, Caden can be considered Kerry's pride" his trainer Claudia told the Killarney Outlook.

"He is a hard worker who has never let me down as his wins are my wins, and his happiness is my pride", she added.


Cruising, craic and plenty of chrome – ten of thousands of festival goes soaked up the fun and fantastic atmosphere at Ireland BikeFest 2019.

An estimated 50,000 visitors passed through the Bike Village over the long weekend to partake in the festival activities, soak up the atmosphere and enjoy the free entertainment.





REMARKABLE ACHIEVEMENT AS DAMIEN BECOMES TRIPLE CHAMPION

A TRULY remarkable achievement for Deerpark's Pitch & Putt Club's Damien Fleming took place on Monday at the National Mens Matchplay Championships as he came from behind to clinch victory over defending champion Bryan Delaney of Cork.

Damien is now the first man ever to be the holder of a triple crown of National Matchplay, National Strokeplay and Irish Open titles at the one time!

Playing out of his adopted course of Rocklodge, Damien was seeded second in advance of the event and began his campaign with a 4&3 victory over another former Irish Open winner in Eamon Gibney of Meath on Saturday. Damien came through three matches on Saturday to advance to Monday's Semi-Finals. He started Sunday with an 8&6 victory over Dubliner Anthony Malone before finishing strongly in a tricky encounter with Tipperary's Shane Hoare to reach Sunday evening's Quarter-Finals. He played the man he beat in the 2011 Final of the competition, Cork's Chris Scannell, as despite trailing by one during the second 18, Damien powered ahead again to win out by 5&4.

Monday's Semi-Final with

Munster Senior Matchplay winner Shane Murphy of Rocklodge itself was always expected to be a tight affair, and so it was as Damien just eked ahead by 1 up on the last with Murphy just missing a birdie putt to force a playoff. As tight as that match was, it did not have half the drama of the final as despite Damien getting a Hole-In-One on the 7th he found himself hanging on to defending champion Delaney's coattails with the Cork play 12 under par for his first 15 holes in Damien trailing by three at the halfway stage.

When Delaney went 5 up with 13 holes to play it looked like Damien's chance was slipping away but slowly but surely he whittled down the lead to draw level by the 16th hole before going ahead for the first time in the encounter at the penultimate hole! Delaney did stick his ball just below the pin on the 18th as Damien missed a subsequent putt to win the title outright as sudden death would be required to decide the winner. Delaney's tee-shot bounced off the green meaning Damien would get a putt for the title again at the first playoff hole and he made no mistake this time in claiming his second National Matchplay and complete a remarkable 12 months

from last July's National Strokeplay and last August's Irish Open victories!

The win is Kerry's third success in the competition after Damien's Deerpark club-mate Derry McCarthy's win in 2004 and it is a sixth major singles honour for Damien in the game after three Irish Opens, the National Strokeplay and now two Matchplays after his first Irish Open win 10 years ago. Elsewhere in the competition Tralee's Jason O'Regan and Listowel's Kevin McCarron were beaten in the Second Round as Tony Blake of Tralee lost to Delaney in the opening match of the competition on Sunday. Tralee's Lisa O'Connor was beaten in the First Round of the Ladies Nett event as she to eventual winner Sarah O'Neill of Cork.

Also on Monday the Tralee Scratch Cup took place with Jamie Blake the winner by two strokes with 18 under par for 54 holes ahead of club-mate Jason Cregan with another Tralee player Alan Hobbart third on 14 under par. Eamonn Sheehy won the Last 18 prize with eight under while there was one stroke between first and second in the Intermediate and Junior sections. Tralee's Danny O'Leary got the better of Deerpark's Gearoid Cronin with five under as Ger Guerin of Listowel got the better of Newmarket's Willie Buckley with a score of four over par.

Lisa O'Connor of Tralee won the Ladies Prize with a score of 131 as this weekend sees the first Kerry U-16 team trial in Deerpark at 9am followed by the adult County Strokeplay Championships in Castleisland on Sunday.



LEST WE FORGET...

KILLARNEY OFFICER HONoured AT ANZAC DAY



At a ceremony in Bundaberg in Queensland in Australia recently, Acting Inspector Glenn Cameron laid a poppy wreath to honour Constable Thomas McGillicuddy who was from Beaufort in Killarney and who died in the First World War.

Constable McGillicuddy was one of 30 Queensland Police Constables who took the leave from the Queensland Police Service and died

whilst on active service during the First World War.

After emigrating from Killarney, at the age of 21, Thomas joined the Queensland Police in June 1913.

He last served at Bundaberg Police Station before joining the 15th Infantry Battalion in August 1915.

Thomas saw active service in Gallipoli, the Battle of Pozieres in France and Battle of Messines Ridge before being absorbed into the 45th Battalion.

Wounded in August-1916 with severe shrapnel wounds to the foot, thigh and hip and treated in Sir Patrick Dunnes Hospital in Dublin. Returned to the battlefields of France in May-1916 and wounded again in June-1917 with gunshot wounds to the arm. Treated in hospital in Rouen and returned to the trenches in November-1917.

On the July 8, 1918, at the age of 26, Thomas was killed in action Somme, France.




DECLAN MALONE TO LAUNCH BILLY RYLE'S NEW SPORTS NOVEL

Make the most of the opportunity to do a great State Exam

There is tangible relief that the state exams are finally up and running. Like many important milestones, the anticipation is often worse than the doing. The first morning was the most nerve racking as it involved some formality. However, once the question papers were distributed and the candidates warmed to their task, the tension quickly evaporated.

The exam timetable mainly prioritises compulsory subjects during the early days of the exam. As the exams progress into the subsequent weeks, the optional subjects are nicely spaced out allowing for study days. But, as they continue until Tuesday, 25th June, it's important to treat the State Exams as a marathon rather than a sprint. After sitting a few subjects, candidates now realise that exams test not only your knowledge but also your concentration and ability to utilise every available minute. So stay in exam mode until you leave the exam venue after the very last subject.

Depending on the subjects being sat, the entire exam will conclude fairly early for some candidates. Others will have to stay focussed until the very last subject on the final day. Irrespective of when you are due to finish the exam, remember that you have prepared diligently for the exam. So, make the most of the opportunity to do well. Reap the rewards of years of study by doing your best in each subject.

After three busy days of exams, the coming weekend brings welcome relief and gives candidates a chance to relax a little, to take stock and plan ahead. Spend very little time on post-mortems. Review your tactical approach over the first week. If you are totally satisfied

with your strategy before, during and after each subject then you need change very little. Focus on next week's subjects and forget about the subjects already examined. Your entire concentration must be on the subjects ahead. The weekend provides an opportunity to recharge the batteries and to do some revision. Take some active leisure to burn off any residual tension. It will help you to sleep soundly and to maintain the levels of stamina, endurance and staying power needed for the challenges ahead. Avail of a few good nights' rest, which is essential for alertness. Resist the temptation to study late into the night. Confine your study to daylight hours, enjoy your period of exercise and go to bed early. Defer any late night socialising until your exam is over. Keep your fluid intake high to avoid dehydration but be moderate in your use of artificial stimulants such as tea and coffee. Keep a clear head by abstaining from alcohol during the exam period.

Concentrate on subjects being examined next week. Prioritise your revision according to the timetable. Go over the tips and predictions that have been made for the subjects you are sitting during week two. Use your study days well and study wisely by not cramming. At this stage the quality of your revision is more important than the length of time you spend at it. On the evening before each paper spend an hour or so looking over your notes so that the important concepts are fresh in your mind.

You are off to a great start after the first week. Maintain your discipline during week two. Keep a good thought for yourself and stay positive. Have confidence in your ability to do well in your second week's papers. You are

now well settled in and rising to the challenge. Deal with each subject as it comes and by this time next week it may all be behind you. Next week, I'll have a few words of encouragement for candidates who have subjects timetabled in the final days of the State Exams.





(Lead Vocals) Tommy O' Connor (Bass) Alfie Curtin (Guitar) Tommy Griffin (Drums) Johnny Wall (Guitar) Bernie O' Connor (Trumpet) and John Curtin (Tenor/Sax). Their first release was 'My Elusive Dreams' in 1968. In January 1978, D.J. decided to leave the Kerry Blues and join Brendan Bowyer and the Big 8. D.J.'s biggest hit was 'Noreen Bawn' in September 1977.

Eyes in the sun

Too much sun can damage the eyes. As with skin damage, it is the ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun which causes problems. There are two types of UV rays: UV-A and UV-B. Over time, the effects of UV rays may help cause a number of eye problems.

UV-A
can hurt your central vision. It can damage the macula, a part of the retina at the back of your eye.

UV-B
The front part of your eye (the cornea and the lens) absorbs most UV-B rays, but these rays may cause even more damage to your eyes than UV-A rays.

WHAT EYE PROBLEMS CAN UV RAYS CAUSE?

Macular Degeneration

UV rays may lead to macular degeneration, a leading cause of vision loss for older people.

Cataract

UV rays, especially UV-B rays, may also cause some kinds of cataracts. A cataract is a clouding of the eye's natural lens, the part of the eye that focuses the light we see.

PTERYGIUM

Another UV-related problem is a growth called pterygium. This growth begins on the white of the eye and may involve the cornea.

Eventually, the growth may block vision. It is more common in people who work outside in the sun and wind.

SKIN CANCER

Skin cancer around the eyelids is also linked to prolonged UV exposure.

CORNEAL SUNBURN

Corneal sunburn, called photokeratitis, is the result of high short-term exposure to UV-B rays. Long hours at the beach or skiing without proper eye protection can cause this problem. It can be very painful and may cause temporary vision loss. Protecting your eyes from the sun If you are spending time outdoors, especially in the summer or on holidays abroad, make sure that you and your children have good quality, dark sunglasses with UV protection. Look for the British Standard (BS EN ISO 12312-1:2013) or the CE mark, which is the manufacturer's assurance that the sunglasses have been made to the appropriate safety standards. You can also protect your eyes by making sure to wear a hat with a brim or a sun visor in bright sunlight.



Before a large audience in the unique and beautiful St Mary's Church of Ireland in Killarney, including foreign Ambassadors and Diplomats and UN Veterans, Killarney's Deputy Mayor Niall Kelleher presented the Hugh O'Flaherty Humanitarian Award Scroll last evening to Minister for Defence Paul Kehoe and Irish UN Veterans Chairman Jim Casey.

Representing the Hugh O'Flaherty Family and Memorial Society, Judge Hugh O'Flaherty and Pearl Dineen presented the International Humanitarian Medal to Deputy Chief of Staff Major General Kieran Brennan and Brigadier General Patrick Flynn.

The Award Ceremony was preceded by a powerful performance by Donal Courtney of his acclaimed one-man play "God Has No Country", receiving a standing ovation from all present.

In his introduction, Memorial Society Chairman Jerry O'Grady said, "Heroes are often defined as those who give of themselves, often putting their own lives at risk for the greater good of others. By this measure, without seeking fame or fortune, the brave men and women of the Irish Defence Forces wearing the iconic blue beret, are truly heroes, deserving of our unbridled admiration and support" Addressing the gathering, Deputy Mayor Niall Kelleher said, "From Lebanon to Cyprus and from El Salvador to Kosovo, Irish UN peacekeepers have always served with diligence and distinction. Irish Defence Forces in particular have always been warmly welcomed wherever they have served. That honourable service has probably come to greater public attention in recent years through the telling of the story of the Siege of Jadotville, but for decades now, Irish men and women have proudly entered some of the world's most dangerous and volatile regions. It is important to remember at time too those 86 members of our Defence Forces who have paid the ultimate sacrifice".

In his acceptance speech, Minister Paul Kehoe said, "Just like the incredible humanitarian work carried out by Monsignor O'Flaherty over 75 years ago, the Irish Defence Forces have also brought great honour to Ireland through their participation in peacekeeping operations over the last 60 years. One of the elements that I am often struck by as Minister is the deep respect and admiration for the Irish Defence Forces right around the world".

The Minister added, "Ireland's unbroken and proud history of participation in UN missions is one of the things that helps make us stand out as a nation. It strengthens our values; it deepens our international relations; it shows that one small country can make a huge difference on the global stage. As Minister, I am determined that we continue our great Peacekeeping tradition".

The minister paid a special tribute to one member of the audience, Scartaglin native Irish UN Veteran John O'Mahony. In 1980 while

serving in the Lebanon, John was shot and seriously injured but happily he survived. Sadly, two of his colleagues, Pte Derek Smallhorne and Pte Thomas Barrett were killed. The final element of the Award Ceremony was the presentation of a generous bursary to the Veterans Association by Donal Hickey, Vice Chair of the Muckross House Trustees Board. Included in the audience were four members of the Raaijmakers family from the Netherlands. Their uncle Anton Musters (Fr Anselmus) was an Augustinian Priest in Rome and an active member of the Rome Escape Line. One month before the Liberation of Rome, he was captured by the Gestapo, interrogated and tortured, but he refused to reveal any information on the Rome organisation. He was being transported to a prison camp in Germany when he escaped during a stopover in Florence and returned to Rome on the day of Liberation. If Fr Anselmus had given up the Rome Organisation during torture, it is probable the Msgr Hugh and many others would not have survived the war. His bravery saved the lives of many of the Escape Line organisers. Earlier in the day, to mark the 75th anniversary of the Liberation of Rome, two symbolic trees were planted in the Graveyard of the O'Connell Memorial Church in Cahersiveen, the burial place of Monsignor Hug O'Flaherty.

ORNAMENTAL GRASSES

Ornamental Grasses can grow in a wide range of conditions. There are grasses to suit damp or dry soils, shady and sunny positions. Grasses can add great colour to any shrub bed and they also look great in containers. Ornamental grasses don't need much feeding as this only encourages a log of growth in the foliage at the expense of flowers. There is a large section of grasses to choose from. There are grasses like the Pampus, which is tall to the Carex Algod which is small. If you are planting small grasses in the garden try and plant them in groups of three rather than on their own. Grasses are also ideal plants for containers but only choose an evergreen one such as Phormium or an Astelia as they will give you colour all year and you can plant your seasonal plants around them.

Citizens Information

Know Your Rights:

QUESTION

I will be retiring soon. I spent many years working and I have also spent time raising and caring for my family. Can I qualify for the State Pension (Contributory)?

ANSWER

The State Pension (Contributory) (SPC) is paid from the age of 66 to people who have worked and have enough social insurance contributions. Recent changes introduced a new method to calculate the rate of SPC paid to a person who reaches pension age on or after 1 September 2012. The new method can help people who have spent time out of the workforce caring to qualify for an SPC.

Firstly, you must be aged 66 or over and have enough Class A, E, F, G, H, N or S social insurance contributions, you must have started to pay social insurance in Ireland before the age of 56 and you must have 520 full-rate contributions (10 years of contributions).


Then, provided you reached pension age on or after 1 September 2012, you can have your contributions assessed using the new Total Contributions Approach (TCA) and can avail of a new HomeCaring Periods Scheme. The TCA counts the total number of contributions you have paid. If you have 2,080 or more contributions (40 years of employment) you will qualify for the maximum personal rate of SPC. If you have fewer than 2,080 contributions, you can use up to 1,040 Home Caring Periods (20 years) and up to 520 credited contributions (10 years), to help you qualify for an SPC. Your combined Home Caring Periods and credited contributions cannot be more than 1,040 (20 years).

If you reached pension age on or after 1 September 2012, your entitlement to a pension will be calculated using both the current yearly averaging system and the new TCA calculation. If you are entitled to a SPC, the rate of pension you get will be based on whichever calculation is best for you. You can get a State Pension (Contributory) form from your local post office and your Intreo Centre or Social Welfare Branch Office.

EXAM STRESS – WHAT CAN I DO?

Learning to manage stress is important at all times in our lives – and not just around exam time. Tips to give you more control over your life include: Eating healthy food as much as possible and avoiding junk food as much as you can. Exercising regularly, even if it is for a few minutes a day. Walking, jogging, yoga, anything will do. Developing good relationships. Sleeping well. Keeping a balanced view. Learning techniques of stress management and stress relief. Schedule Time for You

A really good habit to develop now, which will stand to you for a life-time is to set aside a half an hour each day to do something that just makes you feel good. Read a book or a favorite magazine, take a walk, dance or ride your bike. This time that you take for yourself will help you focus when you sit down to finish your homework.

But you may be asking 'What Can I do Now? My exams are underway'. The first important thing to remember is that a relaxed body and mind is better equipped to deal with stresses and tensions. So looking after your mind and body at this time will help you to cope better with exam pressures.

Take care of yourself. Now more than ever it's vital that you take care of yourself. Don't sacrifice your health because you feel you are too busy. A combination of a healthy diet, regular exercise and plenty of sleep helps relieve stress.

OVER THE NEXT FEW WEEKS WE WILL GO THROUGH SOME TIPS ON WAYS TO MANAGE EXAM STRESS

Acknowledge your feelings. It is normal to feel stressed at exam time. However, if you are feeling especially stressed or depressed, you may want to look at everything you are doing see if there are one or two things you can cut out until you feel better. Be sure to talk to someone if you feel this way.

If you feel stressed or overwhelmed, it is important to speak with the adults in your life. They may not be aware of just how much pressure you are feeling to get everything done. Talk to a parent, teacher or counsellor, and ask for help in dealing with stress.

JUST 4 WAYS DORIS DAY MADE THE WORLD A BETTER PLACE FOR ANIMALS

Doris Day, who died at age 97 on May 13th, may be remembered for her famous song, "Que Será, Será (Whatever Will Be, Will Be)." But as one of the first celebrities to advocate for animals she did not apply those words and we should also remember her for making sure that the world is a better place for animals.

Born in Cincinnati as Doris Mary Ann Kappelhoff, she turned to singing after a car accident cut her fledgling dancing career short when she was only 12. Inspired by Ella Fitzgerald, she sang on local radio shows, then in New York nightclubs. She was discovered while singing at a Hollywood party and soon made the transition to the big screen.

Known as "The Dog Catcher of Beverly Hills" she often found unwanted dogs dropped off at the gate of her California home, she fostered many in her own home and leased kennel space while animals were waiting for forever homes.

1. In a public service announcement filmed nearly 50 years ago, she encouraged viewers to visit their local shelters and adopt homeless pets. "Shelters are unbelievably overcrowded," she said, "and we can and must do something about it." She always carried photos with her of dogs and cats needing forever homes and shared them with friends and colleagues.

2. In an effort to reduce pet overpopulation, in 1987 she founded the Doris Day Animal League (DDAL), a nonprofit lobbying organisation. In 1995, the DDAL launched Spay Day USA, now known as World Spay Day. Held on the last Tuesday of February every year, this day is an opportunity for shelters and rescue organisations to raise awareness of and support for their spay/neuter programmes. During its first 15 years, the DDAL provided the funding to spay or neuter over 15 million dogs and cats.

3. Prior to starting the DDAL, she became a founding member of Actors and Others for Animals in 1971.

Seven years later, the actress launched the Doris Day Pet Foundation (now called the Doris Day Animal Foundation), whose mission has always been to "help animals and the people who love them." The DDAF provides grants to nonprofits

across the US that care for and protect animals. Last year, it donated \$1.5 million to support the amendment that banned greyhound racing in Florida. The foundation also funds the Doris Day Equine Centre, the Duffy Day Life Saving Programme for older and injured animals, and the Doris Day/Terry Melcher Scholarship at UC Davis School of Veterinary Medicine.

4. A visionary when it came to pet-friendly travel, around 1990 she became co-owner of the historic Cypress Inn in Carmel-by-the-Sea, California. This boutique hotel became the first to welcome four-legged as well as two-legged guests.

Doris Day didn't just make the world a better place for pets—she also helped make it better for the people who love them.

GIRL BORN WITH BACKWARDS LEGS IS NOW WALKING

3-year-old Victoria Komada was born with bilateral tibial hemimelia – a congenital deformity which results in deformed legs and missing bones. Doctors initially told Victoria's family that the only solution was a double amputation – but then her parents heard about Dr. Dror Paley of the Paley Institute in West Palm Beach, Florida who told them after Victoria's initial examination that he would be able to reconstruct her left leg and her right leg could simply be fitted with a prosthetic. The surgery cost £180,000 (€204,000 approx) which thousands of strangers contributed so that the Polish family could travel for the treatment and Victoria had her first nine-hour operation in July. After months of treatments and therapy, she underwent a second operation in November so the bones in her left leg could be fused together. Two days later, she could walk.

"We were so happy when she took her first steps, we started crying, Victoria's parents Marzena Drusewicz and Dariusz Komada said "We were on the way to the car and she said 'Mummy, can I show you something. We are thankful beyond words to all the people that gave donations and made it all possible they added.

Dr. Paley, the mastermind who performed the surgery, said: "We achieved all that we said we would achieve for her. The reconstructed leg is very functional. "She can walk and run and do sports now. She has had superb results."

Victoria and her parents are now back at their home in Norwich, Norfolk and Victoria will be beginning school in September.

THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE DONATED HAND-KNITTED NESTS TO A WATERFOWL RESCUE SHELTER

Nesting season is always their busiest time of year for the Carolina Waterfowl Rescue of Charlotte, North Carolina when their shelter often take in as many as 3,000 birds in need of care.

In April of this year posted a plea for help on their Facebook page, asking their readers to send in knitted nests for the chicks.

The post was shared hundreds of times and the shelter quickly became flooded with thousands of hand-knitted nests, messages of encouragement, and greeting cards from all over the country.

Needless to say, the rescue workers have been delighted by the response, and they have encouraged readers to continue sending the nests.

"We could always use a [few] more and even if we don't use them, we can send them to other people who we know that does need them," shelter wildlife rehab specialist Bayleigh MacHaffie said.

THIS WOMAN FINALLY GOT THE CHANCE TO REPAY THE FIREFIGHTER THAT HELPED SAVE HER DAUGHTER

Becca Bundy has always been grateful for the firefighter who came to her daughter's rescue in 2016. 66-year-old Bill Cox was the emergency responder who first arrived on the scene when Ms. Bundy's daughter was having a seizure and he was able to get control of the situation before the ambulance arrived.

At a charity event two years after her daughter's seizure, Ms. Bundy again ran into the volunteer with the Bearville Volunteer Fire Department in northern Minnesota and she noticed he was wearing a tee shirt that read: "My Name is Bill. I'm in end stage KIDNEY FAILURE and in need of a KIDNEY. They got talking and the 66 year old told Becca that he was born with only one kidney. When it eventually went into failure, he was added to the transplant list in 2017. In January, he was forced to go onto dialysis.

In a desperate bid to find himself a kidney donor, he made two tee shirts emblazoned with his plea for help. Even though the shirts spurred several people to offer up their kidneys, none of them were a match. Ms. Bundy discovered that they had the same blood type and she immediately promised to get tested and sure enough, she was a match.

Since they underwent a successful transplant in February, Ms. Cox has been enjoying a renewed sense of strength and energy. He also maintains a close friendship with Ms. Bundy to this day.

Prior to the surgery, he expressed his gratitude to the Minnesota mother by carving a statue of an angel out of wood and painting it her favourite colour. "She's my angel," he said. "She saved my life and I thought that would be an appropriate little gift for them."


