BUMPER WEEKEND SEES THOUSANDS DESCEND ON THE TOWN OF KILLARNEY

Thousands descended on the town of Killarney this past week in what was a bumper few days of entertainmeent for the town.

Cyclists began arriving for the 34th annual Ring of Kerry Cycle on Friday afternoon ensuring that the towns shops, hotels, restaurants and hostelries enjoyed a record breaking weekend of spending.

10,000 cyclists took part in this year's Ring of Kerry Charity on Saturday morning with the first arrivals back to the New Street Car Park from lunchtime onwards. Everyone enjoyed a party atmosphere with live music, food & drink tents and a free kidz Zone all of which added to the fun for everyone as the thousands of cyclists and their supporters milled around chatting and congratulating everyone involved.

On Sunday the town welcomed the Clare Minor Football Team and the Cork Senior Football team for a double bill at Fitzgerald Stadium where both Kerry teams came

away with the spoils. Supporters made their way down town afterwards and enjoyed a drink and food in the many premises which were packed to capacity.

It was Good Morning America for the new Killarney Municipal Area Mayor, Niall Kelleher who raised the American flag to a rousing performance of the Star Spangled Banner performed by members of The Shire Male Choir.

Locals and visitors alike enjoyed the celebrations which saw down town Killarney transformed into Main Street USA. In the evening the town came alive with street entertainment including The Wild West Troupe, Brass bands and cancan girls performing on the streets, along with a pipe band, a big parade, street party and BBQ. Late into the evening, nostalgic movie lovers got to watch the classic Back to the Future in Killarney House and a firework display saw the end to an amazing few days in the town of Killarney.

OFFICIAL OPENING OF KILLARNEY HOUSE TO THE PUBLIC

Local and national dignItries gathered for the official opening of Killarney House on Monday last. The Minister for Arts, Heritage, Regional, Rural and Gaeltacht Affairs, Heather Humphreys TD together with Minister of State for Tourism and Sport Brendan Griffin TD did the honours.

The €10 million project was announced in 2011 by then Minister Jimmy Deenihan and involved a major refurbishment programme for the House and its ornamental grounds and gardens. The project involved collaboration with the Office of Public Works as project managers and Fáilte Ireland.

The three principal rooms of the house, which have been restored to their former glory, are now open to the public for the first time; the Dining Room, the Living Room/Library and the Drawing Room. The House is being developed as the main visitor and interpretative centre for the National Park, highlighting the beauty and interpreting the richness and significance of the Park's landscapes, habitats, flora and fauna as well as telling the story of man's interaction with the Park over the centuries.

"I am delighted to be here today to officially open the wonderfully refurbished Killarney House, which will be a fantastic addition to the town's already rich tourism offering. The House's setting is absolutely beautiful, with the ornate gardens already proving very popular with visitors and locals alike. The location of Killarney House is also unique and I have no doubt that it will help to draw many visitors staying in the town into the expanse of the National Park", Minister Humpheries told the gathering.

"I am delighted that Killarney House is now open to the public. It is a wonderful addition to Killarney and to the tourism offering that is available in Kerry. Fáilte Ireland's investment of €5.2m in Killarney House is an example of the Government's commitment to enhancing tourism through investment in key heritage sites. Killarney House and Gardens, located within walking distance of the town centre, provide an added attraction for visitors and a vital link between the town and the National Park. It also provides another experience for visitors who are exploring Ireland's Wild Atlantic Way. 2016 was a record year for tourism and that strong performance is continuing into 2017. A key part of the tourism success story is our policy of investing in heritage sites such as Killarney House", Minister of State Brendan Griffin said.

THOUSANDS LINE THE STREETS AS KILLARNEY CELEBRATES 4

Killarney once again pulled out all the stops to celebrate the 4th of July this week.

The town was transformed into all things American as it celebrated from 7am until midnight.

Now in its 4th year, the event was the biggest yet with the parade taking centre stage along with a BBQ, live music, street performances, fireworks and much more.

Celebrations commenced on Tuesday July 4th at 7am with a "Dawn Chorus" of the Star - Spangled Banner - performed by The Shire Male Choir and a ceremonial hoisting of the USA flag over Killarney Town Hall. Every year this proves to be an incredibly emotional event with American visitors joining Irish revellers to hold their state flags aloft and sing their national anthem with pride.

The 34th annual Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle had a very special start this year with legendary Kerry footballer Colm Cooper and his biggest fan Amy O'Connor seeing off 10,000 cyclists.

The event is the biggest one-day charity fundraising event in Ireland. Over the weekend Killarney attracted thousands of leisure cyclists, completing the 180KM challenge across the spectacular Ring of Kerry, while at the same time fundraising for worthy charities.

Cyclists gathered in Killarney for the 7am official start with Colm 'Gooch' Cooper and ten-year old Temple Street Children's Hospital patient Amy O'Connor, to complete 180km circling the Ring of Kerry scenic route. The event attracts participants from all walks of life including Olympic silver medallist Sonia O'Sullivan who flew in from Melbourne Australia to take part for the first time.

NEW MEMOIR OF MILLTOWN FROM LOCAL HISTORIAN

It promises to be a night of memories and nostalgia in Milltown on Friday, 14th July when a memoir of life in the mid-Kerry village is published and launched by a local retired teacher and historian. 'Gwin for the Blue' by Pat McKenna from Milltown recounts the happenings and characters of his native place in the 1940s, 1950s and 1960s and is a lively and entertaining read.

Recounting stories and anecdotes from the first twenty years of his life, the memoir charts an Ireland barely recognisable to the young people of today and tells of life in a rural village from the War years to the Swinging Sixties. The self-published book is described as a tribute to local people who survived the ups and downs of life "in spite of dungeon, fire and sword."

Pat's stories include references to local landmarks like the Godfrey Estate and the formidable last member of that landed gentry family, Miss Phyllis, as well as recollections of the railway line through Milltown, schools sports days, and the dominant position of the Catholic Church at the time.

Pat McKenna was born in Milltown in 1943 and was educated locally. Having graduated from University College Dublin, he became a secondary school teacher and taught in Dublin, Tralee and Africa before retiring to his native village.

"This memoir deals with my memories of Milltown from 1943 to 1963. It has stories from my childhood and tells of what life was like in the locality in those years. In the 1950s there were huge changes locally with the opening of the Liebherr factory as a major new employer, the closure of many branch railway lines, and the replacement of the street fair by the cattle mart," said Pat. "I hope it will bring back memories for people and I hope everyone will enjoy it. NEW APPOINTMENTS IN THE DIOCESE OF KERRY

BISHOP RAY BROWNE ON THE CHANGES IN THE DIOCESE

As the summer 2017 annual list of changes of priests in our diocese is published I pay tribute to all our priests for their great service. I admire their faith, their care of and commitment to the parish. What other group has a retirement age of 75 or 76? Our parishes are also helped greatly by the willing assistance of our retired priests. It is wonderful how, year in year out, priests willingly agree to move parish for the good of the overall provision for all our parishes.

The first days and weeks of Easter saw the sad death of two active priests, Fr John Lucid who died suddenly and Fr Pat Moore who was ill for two years. They are greatly missed by their fellow priests, their many friends and by the people of Kilcummin, Duagh and Moyvane parishes. We are inspired by their lives. For them we trust in God's mercy and his promise of eternal life. May they rest in Peace.

"There are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose." (1 Cor 12) This summer sees the situation of a sixth parish, Knocknagoshel, becoming a parish without a resident priest. Within the parish and pastoral area work is in progress to plan for this situation. As I said before it means that in that pastoral area no priest is fulltime in their own parish. Now part of their appointment is to serve in the parish that has no resident priest. In a short few years this will be the situation in all twelve pastoral areas. Already in many situations the rural priest is involved in helping with ministry in the local town. All around the diocese, parishes, people, deacons and priests, are responding to this challenge. We are becoming more and more aware of the calling of the laity to serve their local church community. There are good signs that all our pastoral courses and our parish meetings are bearing fruit. In the autumn three will be ordained as permanent deacons. I am confident that though we have fewer and fewer priests, we can continue to have the fullness of parish life everywhere. It is a great challenge. Please continue to pray for vocations to the priesthood in our diocese. God's will be done.



Soon it will not be possible to have a weekend Mass in every church in the diocese. That day is not far off. In all there are 111 churches in our 53 parishes in the diocese. Most parishes have two or three churches, a small number have one church, and one parish has four churches. When that decision has to be made, and a local community finds that is the situation regarding their church, we will have some guiding principles:

• A priority is that the church area community continue as a separate faith community, with its own identity, its committees, its National School etc. Where appropriate, funeral Masses, marriages, baptisms, first Friday Masses, will continue in that church.

• Parishioners will attend 'Sunday Mass' in neighbouring churches. 'Community spirit' may involve sharing transport to ensure everyone has the opportunity to travel to a neighbouring church. Celebrating Sunday Mass is always the weekly communal prayer of every baptised person.

I thank everyone, laity, religious, deacons and priests, for their participation in the life of the Church over the past year. God bless everyone, especially those for whom the past year has been difficult.

In just over twelve months' time Dublin will host the 'World Meeting of Families'. Its theme is "the Gospel of the Family, Joy for the World". Realise the precious treasure family is, and it is God-given, his wonderful gift to us. In the year ahead let us ponder on and value family life in our own homes and in all homes in the diocese.

WHO SHOULD REGISTER FOR VAT?

Value-Added Tax (VAT) registration is obligatory when the VAT thresholds are exceeded or are likely to be exceeded in any 12 month period. If you are below the thresholds you may elect to register for VAT.

Killarney Outlook

The principal thresholds are as follows:

• €37,500 in the case of persons supplying services only.

• €37,500 for persons supplying goods liable at the reduced or standard rates which they have manufactured or produced from zero rated materials.

- €35,000 for persons making mail-order or distance sales into the State.
- €41,000 for persons making acquisitions from other European Union Member States.
- €75,000 for persons supplying goods.

• €75,000 for persons supplying both goods and services where 90% or more of the turnover is derived from supplies of goods.

 A non-established person supplying taxable goods or services in the State is obliged to register and account for VAT irrespective of the level of turnover.

MUNSTER SENIOR FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP FINAL

OUTLOOK PUBLICATIONS' GAA CORRESPONDENT KERRY O'SHEA REPORTS FROM FITZGERALD STADIUM

KERRY 1-23 CORK 0-15

Kerry cruised to their 79th Munster title and first five-in-a-row at provincial level since 1979, when they recorded a convincing victory over a disappointing Rebels outfit at Fitzgerald Stadium Killarney on Sunday afternoon.

Before an attendance of 31,830, Kerry's dominance was clear from the outset. Paul Geaney scored Kerry's goal in the 61st minute to copper-fasten the victory. While the Kerry fans cheered their heroes from start to finish, the ominous silence from their Cork counterparts was particularly noticeable. One wonders have the Rebels lost their yell.

FOXES ARE NOT VERMIN

The treatment of foxes is a topic that arouses strong passions in many people as Foxes sometimes get a bad rap as cunning figures of trickery, as in such stories as The Three Little Pigs and Reynard The Fox.

In reality, foxes are not vermin, but nature's natural pest controller: They eat rats, mice, snails and human litter and so perform an important function.

Despite the fact that Fox hunting is banned in England, Scotland and Wales sadly, there are those who still pursue fox hunting, even though it's been illegal since 2004, but most inhabitants of Great Britain love their foxes, and plenty of animal activists have stood up to defend the rights of these animals. Two years ago, a Care2 petition that garnered almost 155,000 signatures successfully persuaded the Scottish National Party and their leader Nicola Sturgeon to vote against weakening the fox hunt ban.

Last year, another Care2 petition was successful in stopping the practice of killing foxes at Moseley Golf Course in Birmingham. The Club promised instead to "work with animal welfare organisations and other local golf clubs to look at alternative methods of controlling problems associated with foxes" and now there is a third win for foxes!

Early in June, shoppers at Sainsbury's were alarmed when they learned that exterminators had shot a fox trapped in a cage outside their Crayford, Kent, superstore, when questioned a spokesperson for the company released this statement: "A number of foxes have tried to gain access to the store on several occasions. As a food retailer, this presents a health risk to both our colleagues and customers so we consulted pest control experts".

Annette Ashton decided to create a Care2 petition, demanding that Sainsbury's use a "Humane Pest Controller to deter problem foxes, and not an Exterminator to shoot foxes. She added in the petition that she was, "calling for a boycott of their stores until they do!"

Over 46,000 Care2 members signed up to support Ms. Ashton, and on June 16th she learned that her petition had succeeded.

Here's how she announced the good news: "Well done everyone! Sainsbury's has responded and changed their policy! They pledged that in future only humane deterrents will be used if there is a fox problem. Our campaign clearly worked because they added this pledge to their statement today, 16 June. Whilst they admitted three male foxes had been shot at Crayford, they claim that two female foxes were released not killed. If true then the cubs should be OK." In their announcement on June 16, the



company wrote:

"We've completed a thorough review of how pest control was managed at our Crayford store, which involved the release of two mother foxes and extermination of three males. An independent expert has confirmed our contractor correctly followed industry guidelines and in the interests of the safety of our customers and colleagues.

We understand the killing of foxes is a topic close to the hearts of many of our customers. Safety will always be our top priority, but we have worked with our contractor to set out new processes. In the extremely rare event there are issues with foxes in the future, we can confirm that we would only use humane deterrents."

Congratulations to Ashton and all the Care2 activists who signed her petition. And if you have an issue where you'd like to make a difference, why not start your own petition? Care2 will help you get started, and soon Care2 members will be signing up to support you.

The mother moose and calf were close enough to take a photo, so she rolled down her window to capture the moment. That is when she heard tiny cries coming from the fence line.

Covered by tall grasses, a twin calf was difficult to notice at first. Looking closer, Ms. Howie noticed that the calf's leg was twisted between two wires in the fence, trapping the poor creature.

It appeared to Ms. Howie as if the calf had tried to jump over or through the fence but then slipped and got its hoof caught. Ms. Howie decided to do what she could to free it.

Thinking of her own safety, Ms. Howie made sure the mother moose did not plan to charge her. She approached the trapped calf slowly and carefully, stroked the calf's face and comfortingly said, "your worries are over."

When she got to work, she showed the photos to her co-workers and delighted them with the story of her moose rescue and some of her co-workers are even referring to her as a "moose whisperer."

Ms. Howie was happy to be in the right place at the right time. Had she not come along, there's no telling how long the calf would have been trapped. More than a moose whisperer, Ms. Howie is a moose hero.

GPS tracking bracelets are also offered, to help keep track of all members of a group. All rides are adapted to allow those with disabilities to participate.

WOMAN'S WALLET RETURNED 8 YEARS LATER WITH MONEY STILL INSIDE

In 2009 Courtney Connolly's wallet containing \$141 in cash, her social security card, and ID was stolen out of her car while she was working a summer internship, naturally she thought she would never see any of its contents again.

Then in March of this year someone gave the wallet to a Boston police officer, who then located Ms. Connolly's address on a pay stub found inside. The police officer brought the wallet to Ms. Connolly's sister-in-law's house. When she was told about the return of her possessions, she was shocked.

Nothing had been used, touched, or stolen. Even the fortune cookie message that was taped inside reading "Soon you will receive pleasant news" was still there.

Ms. Courtney who works as a nursing student hadn't the money to enter a powerlifting competition that she was passionate about, but by a strange coincidence, the cash that she found in her long lost wallet was the exact amount that she needed to enter the competition.

VANCOUVER HAS A 2040 ZERO-WASTE GOAL

Vancouver is well on its way to becoming the greenest city in the world and they are now tackling the arduous problem of harmful single-use packaging.

The city launched their Greenest City Action Plan 7 years ago by setting a goal to reduce landfill waste by 50%. Now they are consulting with local businesses on the most strategic replacements for styrofoam containers, plastic bags, and single-use coffee cups. Members of the community were able to present possible packaging alternatives to the city council last week. While the elimination of styrofoam altogether is planned for the future, for the present Vancouver plans on compromising with small business owners so they need not be overburdened financially.

Over 2.6 million polycoat-type paper coffee cups are dumped into city landfills every week and the plan is for businesses to utilize compostable or recyclable coffee cups instead. "The cups take up about 22% of the volume



of our on-street garbage system, and they're costing us literally millions of dollars to deal with," said councilwoman Andrea Reimer.

City representatives emphasise, however, that they will be ensuring the best possible methods of elimination for every stakeholder involved. As community proposals are reviewed throughout the summer, a public survey will eventually be made available in September.

POLICEMAN STOPPED INDIA'S PRESIDENTIAL CONVOY IN FAVOUR OF PASSING AMBULANCE

MI Nijalingappa was directing traffic in Bengaluru's Trinity Circle on Saturday when President Pranab Mukherjee's automotive convoy started approaching. The president was in town for the inauguration of the Metro's Green Line.

The police sub-inspector was about to let the convoy pass when he spotted an ambulance attempting to make its way through traffic, he then halted the convoy in favour of letting the ambulance pass.

However in India the police officers are often pressured to give politicians and bureaucrats special treatment at the risk of their careers and livelihoods.

The Commissioner of Police, Praveen Sood, said that the traffic Policemans brave gesture is indeed something to be hailed – and rewarded.

Killarney Outlook



Last week we were discussing Compassion, and an essential component of developing Compassion is forgiveness. Forgiveness is not a behaviour as such, more of an internal state of being and feeling. Something has happened to cause us to feel resentful, angry or bitter towards someone else. When we feel wronged, hurt or even betrayed we have a negative feeling towards someone or something. We know from many faiths, psychology and life in general that this baggage of negativity harms us more than anyone else, because we carry it!

The first step of forgiveness is learning to let go, as these negative feelings stand in our way of solving problems or finding a healthy way to change. It really is not simple nor easy to let go that negative feeling, but if we can understand that it releases us more than the other person it would be an excellent start. We are attached to that anxious hurt and negative internal feeling, and by releasing that negative emotion we can think more clearly and thus it allows us to be able to respond to the situation rather than just react blindly.

By forgiving, it is almost like climbing up an emotional ladder or flying above our emotional river, so that we can get some distance or perspective on those feelings and emotion. Once we forgive, we can get perspective of the emotions by feeling without getting overwhelmed, then we can learn emotional signals. By doing this we can calm down and use our logic to respond.

In order to forgive, we do need to understand ourselves better, we need to learn to deal with our raw, almost primitive feelings. Elizabeth Kubler-Ross who has written about and worked with grief for many years said that the root of all emotions is fear. These feelings of fear lead to out-of-balance anxiety and a sense of resentment which can in turn lead to aggression rather than a healthy reaction.

Many people confuse forgiveness with forgetting, or condoning or excusing offences or wrongful behaviour. It does not obligate us to reconcile with the person who harmed us, or release them from legal accountability. Instead it brings the forgiver peace of mind, freeing us from corrosive anger or other negative feelings. In this way it empowers us to recognise the pain we suffered without letting that pain define us, enabling us to heal and move on with our life.
