

WHITE-TAILED SEA EAGLE CHICKS TAKE TO THE WING!



The first White-tailed Sea Eagle nests in Co. Kerry in over 100 years have successfully fledged chicks in 2015! Two pairs, one in Killarney National Park and the other on the Beara peninsula near Kenmare, fledged single chicks at each nest. This was the third attempt to successfully raise a chick by the Killarney pair while the Beara pair succeeded on their first attempt. Since fledging, the Killarney

chick has been closely followed and fed by its parents around the Lower Lake where the trio have been seen by local boatmen and some excited tourists! It's likely that the young eagle will spend the next few months around the Lakes of Killarney before wandering more widely across Ireland. Over the last month four young White-tailed Sea Eagle chicks fledged successfully from nests in counties Kerry, Clare and Galway bringing to seven the number of Sea Eagle chicks to have flown from nests in the wild in Ireland since 2013. Four of the seven chicks have come from one nest at Mountshannon, Co. Clare, on Lough Derg, by far our most successful pair to date. Happily a second pair took up residence on Lough Derg in 2013 and also nested successfully in 2015, raising their first chick. A fifth nest, at Glengarriff, Co. Cork, raised a single chick but sadly this chick died close to fledging.

Although its early days, each successful nesting and chick fledged brings the reintroduction project a little closer to its goal: a self-sustaining viable breeding population of White-tailed Sea eagles in Ireland.

ITS TIME TO THRESH CANCER

All roads will lead to Beaufort on Sunday August 16th for Threshing Cancer on the farm of Brendan Ferris.

The charity day is set to raise money for Recovery Haven, the Oncology Unit at Kerry General Hospital and the Hospice Room at St. Joseph's Home, Killorglin. Since its inception in 2013, Threshing Cancer has raised €49,000 in total for its three beneficiaries.

Everyone is invited to this year's threshing and family fun day however this unique occasion will be of particular interest to historians, teachers, the farming community and those with an interest in heritage and vintage machinery. The threshing event has proven to be popular with overseas visitors with tourists from 11 countries attending since 2013, impressed with the depth of heritage and culture on display. Threshing Cancer's large-scale event encompasses 35 acres.

It is our intention to display and work all methods of threshing beginning with the scutching block or stone which has been in existence for thousands of years and has been used throughout the ages. The second oldest method of threshing on display is flail threshing, invented by the Chinese for rice and brought to Europe by the Romans for cereals like oats and wheat. The first mechanical thresher was invented in 1784 cranked by hand and by pedal. Historically, the next advancement involved horses turning a gearbox which itself turned a threshing drum. This is used in conjunction with a winnowing machine.

After this, the stationary thresher would have been carted from place to place on horse cart or by hay cart. Driven by oil engine and invented in the early 1900s, the next thresher was a little larger, was moved on iron wheels and could be pulled and driven by a small tractor. The final

thresher, and the last before the self-propelled combine harvester, weighed four tons and required a large tractor for transport.

Along with the threshing equipment we will display three different rare balers from the early stages of baler invention. The connection between the agricultural activities of threshing and the food chain will be demonstrated as unique methods of corn grinding for flour and animal feed will take place as will breadmaking and porridge-making from the flour and rolled oats produced. Straw produced in the threshing process is used in thatching houses, rope making and in personal dress for festivals. These three applications will also be demonstrated on the day as will butter-making to accompany the bread.

The event will incorporate guided tours and

demonstrations of vintage threshing and agricultural machinery, working horses, and the secondary applications such as thatching. Traditional household artefacts such as butter churns and cream separators will be demonstrated & worked on the day.

Threshing Cancer's fundraising day will have something for every member of the family. Live entertainment will play throughout the day along with a dog show and horse show-jumping. A whole host of novelty fundraising activities for both adults and children such as Digger Bucket Swap, Air Suspension Ball and Sheaf Tossing are sure to test the skills of patrons. The Killarney August Racing Festival gets underway on Wednesday 19th to Saturday 22nd. with the three days of racing being evening meetings, Wednesday 19th of August features the Vincent O'Brien Ruby Stakes with a prize fund of €45,000. LEAVING CERT RESULTS AVAILABLE ON WEDNESDAY

The eagerly awaited Leaving Cert exam results will be issued by the State Examinations Commission (SEC) next Wednesday and will, hopefully, contain good news for all candidates. Assuming that your results go according to plan, you will be entitled to celebrate your achievement. But remember that there are tasks to be undertaken and loose ends to be tied up before you progress to the next stage of the exciting journey through life. During the next few weeks keep a close eye on the important dates and deadlines.

Leaving Cert results will be available early in schools on Wednesday morning and, from 12noon, online at www.examinations. ie. If you wish to view one or more of your marked Leaving Cert exam scripts return your completed application form to your school by Tuesday, 18th August. The viewing of marked scripts will be held on Friday/ Saturday, 28th/29th August. The closing date for receipt by the SEC of Leaving Cert appeal applications is Wednesday, 2nd September. The appeal fee is €40 (LC) or €15.50 (LCA) per subject. Results of Leaving Cert subject appeals will be released in mid-October.

CAO Round One offers and points requirements will be available at www.cao.ie from 6am on Monday, 17th August. CAO Round One offers may be accepted up to 5.15pm on Monday, 24th August. CAO Round Two offers and points requirements will be available at www. cao.ie from 6am on Thursday, 27th August.

CAO Round Two offers may be accepted up to 5.15pm on Wednesday, 2nd September. Thereafter, offers will be issued as necessary until October to fill any vacancies which may arise

Interviews for Post Leaving Cert (PLC) courses, which are practical and vocational in orientation, take place in the period after the Leaving Cert results are released. If you haven't applied for a PLC course and would like to do so, contact the colleges of your choice. There may be vacancies on a variety of PLC courses. The majority of PLC courses are offered at Level 5. A number are offered at Level 6 and the entire list of PLC courses can be found on www.qualifax.ie.

If you are interested in undertaking an apprenticeship in a trade or a traineeship, register at your local Solas (formerly FAS) Training Centre if you have not already done so. Check the Solas website, www.solas.ie, for further information.

An increasing number of young people are taking a year out after the Leaving Cert to gain work experience or to travel. Many Irish students are young when they enrol in further education. A year out is a maturing experience and allows an extra year to make the transition from second level education. In addition, colleges usually facilitate students who wish to defer taking up the offer of a course for one year.

If you feel that your results didn't do you

justice, it's worth considering a return to school to repeat the exam. Most repeat students considerably increase their points.

Good luck to all candidates who will be getting Leaving Cert exam results on Wednesday.





MOTORING OUTLOOK

GOOD DRIVING TECHNIQUES

DISTANCE BETWEEN YOUR CAR & THE **CAR IN FRONT:**

It's a good idea to always keep a minimum three seconds gap between you and the car in front. When it's raining and/or foggy double the distance to six seconds no matter what speed you're doing.

SMOOTH DRIVING:

Don't rush into things. Plan ahead when driving. Make early decisions on braking and accelerating. Change gears and brake smoothly to avoid skidding. This will provide a smoother drive for yourself and your passengers while also providing less wear and tear on the vehicle and helping you save on fuel costs.

KEEP LEFT UNLESS OVERTAKING:

When driving on a dual lane road always keep to the left lane. Use the right hand lane for overtaking, turning right or when roadworks are being carried out and there is no other choice.

INDICATE EARLY:

Always indicate when changing lanes, 30 metres wherever practical, to advise other motorists of what you are doing.

EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED:

Drive with your line of sight parallel to the road not looking down onto it. By doing this you see further into the distance so you can be better prepared if there is a problem ahead. It may even mean you can avoid a crash.

OVERTAKING:

Ensure you have enough room to go past the



vehicle you are overtaking and not cut them off. Pick you time carefully as overtaking can be quite dangerous and making the wrong decision may result in a serious crash.

STOPPING BEFORE THE INTERSECTION:

Always slow down coming to an intersection especially if you are towing a van. Your braking distance will be greater than when you're not towing, so make sure you allow for this. You must stop on a stop sign/line.

DRIVING AT NIGHT:

Driving at night requires more skill & concentration than at daytime due to your restricted vision. Oncoming headlights can obscure your vision and pedestrians can be near impossible to see. Leave a bigger gap between you and the car in front to allow for your reduced vision and reaction time.

ROAD RAGE:

Stay relaxed and try not to let other people's driving skills or decisions worry you. If another driver makes a mistake don't get angry just concentrate on your own driving skills, behaviour and safety.

If another driver is courteous towards you, then acknowledge the good deed with a wave.



The Highlights

Crowning of a goat and 36 hours of FREE family fun at the famous Puck Fair

Killorglin's Puck Fair, which runs annually from **August 10-12**, is undeniably one of quirkiest festivals in the world, and it is Ireland's original and oldest 'Gathering Festival'.

The main celebration surrounds the crowning of a wild mountain goat as a King in honour of a tradition and heritage that is purported to be ancient, but can only officially be traced back as far back as 1603 when King James I issued a charter granting legal status to the existing fair in Killorglin.

The 3 days of festivities begin on what is known as 'Gathering Day', when the main coronation ceremony takes place. The "Queen of Puck", who is always a young school girl from one of the local primary schools, crowns the goat "King Puck". The honour this year has gone to local schoolgirl Ciara O'Brien.

The Queen and King Puck will then parade through the town, granting residents and visitors alike the 'Freedom of the Town' for the duration of the festival and this commences three days of entertainment, music, pageantry and traditions.

The parade is set to be the biggest and best yet with more floats and colourful participants guaranteed to entertain the thousands expected to line the streets on the day, and a new route will ensure spectators have a better viewing area. The parade will now begin at the Bridge, go through Lower Bridge Street, The Square, Upper Bridge Street and onto Iveragh Road.

Another highlight of 'Gathering Day' is the Horse Fair, which is the oldest and longest continually running horse fair in the country. Buying and selling horses, ponies, donkeys & equipment starts very early in the morning, and continues throughout the opening day of Puck Fair.



The second day, 'Fair Day', sees the street markets and craft fairs go into full swing. You'll find everything you could possible hope for among the tented stands, from horse tack to fashion, local crafts and tasty produce. An independently run Cattle Fair, which is not organised by Puck Fair Organising Committee, also takes place on this day from early morning in Langford Street.

The Closing Parade is the main highlight of final day, known as 'The Scattering', which leads the goat back to his mountain home. The parade will begin at Iveragh Road, and go through Upper Bridge Street, The Square, Lower Bridge Street, ending at The Bridge.

The celebrations will close with a breath-taking fireworks display, which gets bigger and better every year.

There's lots more to see and do over the few days with 36 hours of free entertainment from traditional music and dance sessions, to live open air music, story-telling, workshops, street-theatre, busking, face painting, puppet theatre, a pet show, bonny baby contest, and Ireland's premier funfair, Euroshow. And the pubs stay open until 3am!

It was also the first time since the 1995 Munster SFC Semifinal against Tipperary that Kerry scored seven goals in a Senior Championship game.

This was Kerry at their clinical best. They were totally dominant, clinical in front of goal, disciplined in defence and they also dominated the aerial battle where David Moran gave a magnificent display of high fielding, aided and abetted by his partner and Kerry's other midfield general Anthony

This victory was achieved at a cost, as a shoulder injury sustained by Kerry's 2014 Player of the Year James O'Donoghue raised alarm bells for the Kerry supporters.

The injury occurred in the 28th minute of the first half when O'Donoghue was involved in an accidental collision with Kildare goalkeeper Mark Donnellan.

Kerry GAA issued a statement on the County Board's official website on Monday morning confirming that the Kerry medical team realigned O'Donoghue's

shoulder and that no injury was sustained. The statement went on to add that O'Donoghue will have a routine MRI scan and a few days rest before making a gradual return to training.

manager Eamonn Fitzmaurice will not be getting too carried away with this win, as tougher tests lie ahead in the Kingdom's campaign to retain the Sam Maguire.

Colm Cooper, a late replacement for Kieran Donaghy who did not start the game after picking up a groin injury in the pre-match warm-up, chose the occasion to give a tremendous performance, notching 2-3 of Kerry's final tally and having a hand in several other scores as well including a peach of a pass for Darran O'Sullivan's first goal. It was the Gooch, who was marking his 80th championship appearance, at his brilliant best. What a pleasure it was to be in Croke Park to witness it!

Substitutes Barry John Keane and Darran O'Sullivan also got in on the scoring act. Both made immense contributions when introduced, and scored an impressive 3-4 between them.

Kerry's other goal scorers were Stephen O'Brien and Donnchadh Walsh. O'Brien also scored four sweet points from long range in the first half.

Kerry, with captain for the day David Moran directing operations at midfield, laid the foundations for the win when they led 0-10 to 0-3 at the break.

The floodgates really opened once Donnchadh Walsh was on hand to fire home Kerry's first goal in the 38th minute.Kerry scored at will from there to the finish. Colm Cooper, Darran O'Sullivan and Barry John Keane added further goals as the Kingdom stretched 4-11 to 0-6 clear by the

50th minute. Kildare were shellshocked as Kerry completed the rout with three more goals from Cooper and Darran O'Sullivan, who both scored a brace on the day, and Stephen O'Brien.

HISTORY – THE 1980S

The early '80s in the club saw Billy Doyle back to the 'helm' of 'A' team management while younger brother Frank played a more active role in the administration side of the club. Tony Fleming took over the 'chair' while Kevin 'Plug' Malley and Tom Ashe continued in their respective administrative roles that they held from the 70s. Antonio Cirillo who joined the club in the late '70s proved to be a very dedicated member of the committee. The organising and running of the 7-a-side had become the major focus of the club for 3 months of the summer as the tournament numbers swelled. The coverage and support of the local media contributed a lot to its increasing popularity.

THE 'MEN FROM THE BOWER'

JOIN ATHLETIC: Another spin off from the 7-a-side was that there were many players getting the appetite to join the Kerry league clubs. Athletic gained with some members joining from the former 'The Bower Rovers' team (Rathmore). They were: Sean Moynihan, Dan Leary, Neily Kerins and the Mulcahy brothers of Donie and DD. Neily also managed teams at schoolboy level for the club and with Sean O'Sullivan had the privilege of managing Brendan Moloney of Nottingham Forest fame. DD Mulcahy was an excellent goal scorer and an outstanding club secretary in the 80s.

Limerick United play in the Half Moon in 1982 Frank Doyle was very keen to raise the profile of the club by bringing some League of Ireland teams to Killarney. And to his credit he succeeded in landing Limerick United, the

1981/82 FAI Cup winners to play a friendly against an Athletic selection in the Half Moon in September '82. The Limerick side who had qualified for European competitions for the 3rd successive year had many big soccer names in the club that season with Mia Dennehy, a former international and English League professional, the best known player while former Irish international manager Eoin Hand was also associated with the club. Needless to say Athletic didn't win the match but scored on 3 occasions.

COBH RAMBLERS V KILLARNEY ATHLETIC

IN 1983: Frank repeated his success in '83, when he attracts Cobh Ramblers the 1983 FAI Cup winners to town that September. This game was played on the St Finan's Pitch that was to become the home ground for Celtic for many years. Bill Davidson a Cobh native managed Athletic on the night and for the early part of that season. Athletic were narrowly beaten by Cobh on a night when the club chairman Tom Griffin lined out in the back four. Bill was also to make an invaluable contribution with Connie O'Sullivan to the club's underage teams over the following years.

THE DUAL PLAYERS: Some of the club's better teams in the early '80s included a number of very good dual players, James Cronin, Connie 'Doc' O'Doherty, Seanie and Pat O'Shea in particular were equally talented players in both codes. Connie also played for the KDL in the Oscar Traynor Cup, while Pat was a 'wizard' with the ball at his feet. Pat also had success as the Kerry team boss that won

the 2007 All-Ireland Championship. Two other talented players of that era were John Casey and Pat Fennell.

'B' TEAM KNOCK 'A' TEAM OUT OF CUP: The

1983/84 season will be best remembered for the quarter-final cup tie between Athletic 'A' & 'B' teams with the 'B' team emerging victorious after a replay thanks to a Vince Casey goal. A good win for the 'boys' but not such a good result for the club! The 'Sossy' managed 'B' team suffered a heavy defeat in the semi-final as they failed to raise their game against a strong Tralee Dynamos team.

THE GROWTH OF SCHOOLBOY SOCCER:

With the Kerry soccer league now 10 years old many clubs were beginning to realise the importance of promoting underage soccer. Athletic's underage 7-a-side tournament held in the 'Áras' pitch was nurturing a great interest in the game locally while Castleisland man George Callaghan was to the fore in promoting school boys soccer in the county. Vince Casey and Tom 'Sossy' Mullins co-managed Athletic's first schoolboy team in the early '80s. The Kerry vouth league was also proving to be a very popular competition and contributing to an improvement in the standards of the game in the county. Next article will focus on the late '80s that saw the club moved from the Half Moon, Derry City visiting for pre-season 7-a-sides in the 'Áras' and the outstanding achievement and honour for the club to have our first Schoolboys' International capped player.

ROWING **TO RIO**

The Monika Dukarska Blog. The story of a **Professional Athlete**



My journey to Rio took a small diversion. A diversion that was perhaps out of my control. The reason why I call it a detour/ diversion is because the goal remains the same - Olympic Qualification - but the way in which I will get there has altered. Last Thursday I raced two races over 1,500 meters to select a new combination for a pair but also to prove that the women's pair boat is quick enough to be sent to the World Rowing Championships in France at the end of August. I won both races coming on top in the stroke seat position. Unfortunately, both combinations were few seconds too slow (based on prognostic gold medal times) to be in the mix to fight for an Olympic qualification in August hence the boat was scratched as a result.

This decision came as a shock, as it is important to train and compete in the toughest of environment to ensure that we constantly progress and challenge ourselves. Now, we are onto Plan B. A plan that I am not fully satisfied with. A plan that forces me to compromise. I will be rowing in a women's four for the forthcoming World Championships. This means that all four of us will be training and competing for, hopefully, medals at the Championships with the aim of forming a quick enough Women's Pair this September.

Thankfully there is another window of opportunity to qualify in May 2016. This will be our route to qualification with 4 places remaining (11 boats qualifies at the championships this year). Rowing in a four will give us an opportunity to get used to one another and adopt a common rowing style which will filter through the boat. This will give us a stronger platform for creation of a smaller boat in September, that is the Women's Pair. Also, if injury or sickness struck – there are spares, which was not the case this season.

The Women's Pair however is not my only option for Rio. Here again is why I think the word 'diversion' describes this situation perfectly. Come September we will know exactly which boats did qualify and which seats are up for grabs. Also, we cannot forget about injuries, sickness and unforeseen circumstances which are present in all kinds of sports. Therefore, I have to be ready for any boat that I will be put into, whether it would be in sculling (single, double) or in sweep (pair).

Of course change like this is not welcomed and cherished, and also a lot of questions come to mind but I know one thing- I fought for so long to be in a position I am right now and I'm NOT going to give up! This is only a beginning of my rowing journey and I will one day become an Olympian - Just Watch Me!

COMPLACENCY AT BEEF FORUM A MAJOR CONCERN - ICMSA.

President of the ICMSA, John Comer, said that he was deeply concerned at the level of complacency in relation to the key issues of concern for farmers and in particular, despite a commitment to review the beef grid, there was no support to commence the review on an issue that ICMSA believes there is widespread support amongst farmers that it needs to be changed and simplified.

While beef and cattle prices are in a good place at present and this is hugely positive, as farmers, history has shown us that this will not last forever, and we should be addressing the key issues of concern now rather than when beef prices are under pressure. The supply situation and the exchange rate is very much in our favour at present, Mr. Comer said, but the reality is that this will not always be the case and the issues raised and agreed at last November's Beef Roundtable remain as valid today and if we fail to address them, it will lead to further problems going forward. ICMSA is particularly disappointed that no significant progress has been made in relation to the many issues of importance to farmers and in particular the review of the beef grid and the over 30 month issue.

In relation to the beef grid, the commitment was simple and as follows "the QPS system will be reviewed, with the assistance of Teagasc, with a view, in particular, to providing a more simple and transparent system, before the middle of 2015". Farmers are very clear of the

view that the beef grid is way too complex for selling cattle and that it must be simplified. The commitment was simply to simplify the beef grid and make it more transparent for farmers and I am very disappointed that

ICMSA got no support to progress this review, said Mr. Comer.

With increased numbers of cattle likely in 2016 and 2017, the beef grid and the other issues will again come centre stage given that we have failed to address them and it is regrettable that the Beef Forum has not progressed these matters at a time when the market is in a strong position, concluded Mr. Comer.

CATTLE PRICES CONTINUE TO RISE

IFA National Livestock Chairman Henry Burns has said the cattle trade remains strong with factories paying a base of €4.30 for steers and €4.40 for heifers and top-ups to both base prices ranging from 3c to 5c/kg extra in places to get numbers.

He said factories are having to pay up to 10c/kg over quoted prices to get very tight supplies. "Some farmers are reporting of factory agents and procurement managers ringing them, offering 10ckg more for immediate supply on the day or the next morning delivery. Flat prices of €4.50/kg for heifers have been paid this week."

Henry Burns said the change in the strength of sterling to 70p against the Euro lifts Irish returns from the UK market considerably. In addition, he said UK prices are continuing to increase, up another 5p/kg last week and at £3.61/kg for R3 steers, they are now equivalent to €5.42/kg incl vat. He pointed out that at a UK price of £3.61/kg for R3, the recent move on the exchange rate from 72p to 70p on the €uro changes returns from €5.27 to €5.42, an increase of 15.5c/kg.

The IFA Livestock leader pointed out that the official prices from the Department of Agriculture continue to show increases with R3 steers at €4.38/kg for week ending July 19th and heifers at €4.50/kg. Official bull prices are at €4.16/kg for Os, €4.37/kg for Rs and €4.50/kg for Us. Henry Burns pointed that cow price is ranging from €3.75/kg for P+ to €3.80 for Os, €4.00 for Rs and €4.15 for U grades.

On supplies, Henry Burns said Bord Bia has highlighted the fact that finished cattle supplies will remain very scarce for the next 12 months, with AIMS data from June 1st 2015 showing that the number of cattle in the 12 to 36 month age category are back 100,000 head compared to 2014 levels. In addition, this data also shows that calf registrations for 2015 are up 116,000 head, with most of the increase occurring in Angus and Hereford calves from the dairy herd.

In addition, he said the strength of sterling and price returns from the UK continue to be very positive.

IFA MEETS COMMISSIONER HOGAN'S CABINET TO DISCUSS DAIRY INTERVENTION AND USE OF SUPERLEVY FUNDS

IFA President Eddie Downey and National Dairy Chairman Sean O'Leary were in Brussels this week to meet with members of Agriculture Commissioner Phil Hogan's cabinet to discuss the IFA's case for an increase in the dairy intervention safety net level, and the use of superlevy funds to support dairy farmers. They urged Minister for Agriculture Simon Coveney to work on achieving support from as many fellow Agriculture Council members as possible ahead of their early September meeting to deliver on both issues.

"We have made it very clear that, despite claims by Commissioner Hogan to the contrary, the majority of dairy farmers in Europe and in Ireland, are now producing milk for a price that does not allow them to break even. Growing unrest among French and German dairy farmers is clear evidence of this. The current downturn is lasting longer than anyone expected, and farmers cannot take any further milk price cuts when so many are already in

serious loss making situations." Mr Downey said.

"A significant cause of the current prolonged market slump is the now extended Russian embargo, which is a result of geopolitical sanctions made by the EU in the last year. Farmers should not be left to carry that burden, and it is essential that, in addition to continuing with the Private Storage Scheme, the EU Commission would offer additional supports to help turn markets around and help farmers cope until prices recover," he said.

IFA National Dairy Chairman Sean O'Leary added: "The EU Commission must accept that first announcing, then carrying out an upward review of the intervention price levels would send a strong message to international dairy buyers that there

is a limit to just how low product prices can fall, and encourage them to buy at more realistic prices again, thereby combating the negative sentiment maintained by GDT and speeding up the recovery in dairy commodity prices to sustainable levels," he said.

"Also unanimously supported by COPA members and the European Parliament is our contention that the superlevy funds collected for 2014/15 must be used to support farmers. The EU Commission has countered that these funds were destined for the general EU Budget. However, the EU 2016 Estimates only factor in €441m to be included in the general EU Budget, and current estimates of the final total EU superlevy fine suggest that is only half of what will be collected, leaving the other half to be used to support dairy farmers," he said.

"Commissioner Hogan must deliver on these issues, and Minister Coveney must lobby fellow EU Agriculture Ministers to secure the necessary support," he concluded.

CLLR. N. KELLEHER: What is the current position with regard to the upgrading of the Main St. in Rathmore, what were the results of the surveys?

Have plans seeking funding been submitted to the NRA to include the two pedestrian crossings (Dennehy's Corner and Donagh Hickey Motors), footpaths, traffic calming and underground liahtina?

REPLY: The Main St. was overlaid in recent times through funding from the NRA. It would be desirable to carry out a plan for the upgrading of footpaths, public lighting and the general amenities of the town. A preliminary speed survey was carried out in the village recently and indicated instances of speeding infringements in the village. Know Your Rights: STARTING A SMALL BUSINESS

AUGUST 2015

QUESTION

I lost my job last year and I am now thinking of starting a small business. Are there any supports to help me?

ANSWER

Local Enterprise Offices provide supports to local businesses that are starting up or in development. You can find information about their training programmes and start your own business courses on localenterprise.ie. Also, Enterprise Officers in local development companies can offer advice and information on starting your own business.

If you have been getting a jobseeker's payment for 12 months or more, you may be eligible for the Back to Work Enterprise Allowance. This allows you to keep a percentage of your payment for two years. If you are starting a business, you also may get extra supports, such as grants for training, market research, business plans and access to loans to buy equipment.

If you have been unemployed for at least 12 months and you set up a qualifying business, you may be eligible for Start Your Own Business Relief. It provides exemption from income tax on the profits from your business up to a maximum of \in 40,000 a year for a period of two years.

Often, someone starting a small business does so as a sole trader rather than setting up a partnership or a company. However, as a sole trader, if your business fails, your personal assets could be used to pay your creditors. Your main legal obligation is that you must register as a self-employed person with Revenue. As a self-employed individual you pay tax under the self-assessment system.

You may carry on your business using your own name. If you wish to use a business name you must register it. The Companies Registration Office has information about business names and different business structures on its website, cro.ie.

Further information is available from your local tax office and your Local Enterprise Office.

Talk to others about your worries - Friends may also be going through the same problems and it will really help to talk about it. If you are feeling really down don't suffer in silence, talk to your parents, phone the Samaritans or talk to your doctor. Consider seeing a counsellor. There is a lot of support out there for you and you will get through this difficult time.

The National Parents Council Post Primary operates a helpline for anyone who needs support after the results. The service is provided by Guidance Counsellors who will give advice to both students and their parents. The helpline number is 1800 265 165 and will be available for advice on the first round CAO offers from Monday 17th August 8am - 7pm, Tuesday 18th August 8am-7pm and Wednesday 19th August 8am-1pm.

HEALTH RISKS FROM THE SUN

Advice if you are planning a sun holiday:

SUN DAMAGE TO THE SKIN

Although sunbathing may be enjoyable and a suntan a status symbol, it must be remembered that excessive sun exposure is a health hazard due to the effect of ultraviolet (UV) radiation on the skin.

UVB causes sunburn which can range from intense erythema to blistering and 'burnt skin' similar to a burn from hot water of fire. Sunburn is more likely when, in addition to direct exposure from the sun, UV is also 'reflected' from water (swimming pools or the sea), white sand or snow. The risk is greater at higher altitudes when there is less protection from the earth's atmosphere. Both ultraviolet A (UVA) and ultraviolet B (UVB) radiation are known to cause pre-mature cancers. Drying of skin can result in exacerbation of facial seborrhoeic dermatitis.

ESPECIALLY VULNERABLE GROUPS

- · Babies and children.
- Fair skinned people who often also have red hair or blue eyes.
- Those with certain medical conditions such as albinism or previous skin
- Those medications such as tetracyclines including doxycycline, oral hypoglycaemic drugs and diuretics.

PRECAUTIONS

- Babies under 9 months should be kept out of direct sunlight.
- Children should wear long sleeved, loose fitting shirts, hats and high-factor
- The greatest risk is from the midday sun, usually from noon until 14.00 hours (15.00 in tropical regions) when precautions are especially important.
- · Adults should wear a broad brimmed hat, long sleeved shirts and sunglasses.

SUNSCREENS

- Sunscreens do not replace the precautions described above but they can help absorb UVB and to a lesser extent UVA.
- Waterproof sunscreens can prevent their removal by sweat or water although they should always be reapplied after swimming.
- There is a voluntary star system for sunscreens grading UVA protection; more stars indicating greater protection.
- The Sun Protection Factor (SPF) refers to the protection against UVB (e.g. 'SPF 8' allows approximately 8 times longer sun exposure without burning than with no protection).
- To gain effective protection a cream with an SPF value of 15 or above should be used (less than this provides little protection).
- Sunscreens are expensive be wary of cheap sunscreens bought abroad which may not give adequate protection.
- Check expiry dates.







Another study in 14,001 elderly Japanese individuals aged 65-84 years found that those who drank the most green tea were 76% less likely to die during the 6 year study period.

AIRLINE TAKES ON BIG GAME HUNTERS TO PROTECT RHINOS, LIONS, AND ELEPHANTS

Africa's largest airline has banned the shipment of endangered animal trophies on its flights. It just got harder for big game hunters to bring endangered animal trophies back home from South Africa to hang on their wall.

That's because South African Airways (SAA), the continent's largest airline, has banned the transport of endangered rhinos, elephants, and lions aboard its passenger and cargo flights. "SAA will no longer support game hunters by carrying their trophies back to their country of origin," SAA country manager Tim Clyde-Smith said. "The vast majority of tourists visit Africa in particular to witness the wonderful wildlife that remains. We consider it our duty to work to ensure this is preserved for future generations and that we deter activity that puts this wonderful resource in danger."

The news broke on April 25th, when the Professional Hunters Association of South Africa posted internal documents from SAA revealing its embargo plans. The airline then issued a statement announcing that the embargo had gone into effect April 21st on all of its flights. No exceptions will be made, even if the hunter holds a valid permit "issued by the relevant authorities" to transport the animal, the airline spokesperson said.

If all airlines and shipping companies had adopted this policy Cecil the Lion would still be alive

LEGO-INSPIRED HOMES COULD BE THE FUTURE OF DISASTER RELIEF

The Mobile Factory, founded by 73-year-old Dutch business consultant and sustainability specialist Gerard Steijn, housed inside two shipping containers. It crushes construction debris within its walls, churning out Legoshaped building blocks that can be easily stacked and snapped into place to build temporary housing in less than a day. Mr. Steijn's goal is to dispatch these small factories around the world so locals can rebuild their communities using debris and waste that's been left behind in the wake of man-made or natural disasters. Mr. Steijn created the Mobile Factory in 2007 after researching waste production in the construction industry for a major Dutch engineering firm. His work brought him to sites around the world, where he witnessed neighbourhoods and communities destroyed by earthquakes, war, development, and urban growth. What started out as research into reducing construction waste evolved into an idea to create more stable housing for impoverished communities. "My research taught me that 85% of the victims of disasters live under the poverty line," Mr. Steijn added.

In places like Haiti and Nepal, where earthquakes have killed hundreds of thousands and displaced millions, the leading cause of death was poor construction of homes, which are often little more than tents or shacks. The 2010 earthquake in Haiti killed 230,000 people and displaced 1.5 million, creating 25 million tons of debris. After five years, that debris still litters the region and remains unused, Mr. Steijn said.

THE TREE OF 40 FRUITS

Sixteen trees especially cultivated by an artist in the US will soon be heavy with forty different types of fruit as they enter their harvest season. Peaches, plums, apricots, nectarines, cherries and almonds began ripening on the Tree of 40 Fruit in July. To create the plants, New York-based artist Sam van Aken painstakingly collected heirloom stone fruits — which are not commercially available — and fused them onto a single tree using a technique called grafting.

Mr. Van Aken gathered the young shoots from different fruit trees and stored them until spring. He then replaced buds on an existing tree with shoots he had collected.

By noting down when each fruit blossomed, he was able to "sculpt" the tree. The result was trees awash with flowers in hues of pink, crimson and white when in blossom, and will be weighed down by a multitude of stone fruits by autumn. The trees also have a scientific use, he says, with "far-reaching implications for genetic engineering and biodiversity versus food monoculture"





In the natural this would be ridiculous yet this is exactly what happens when we take offence. Our bodies are controlled by our glandular system that secrete various hormones to keep us in balance - for example on hearing good news we feel happy because of the hormones that are released, with bad news we feel sad or miserable again controlled by our hormones - they have a major bearing on our overall health. To remain offended ultimately brings all sorts of sickness. STATE MARKS CENTENARY OF O'DONOVAN ROSSA FUNERAL

President Michael D. Higgins lead the official State commemoration of the centenary of the funeral of Jeremiah O'Donovan Rossa in Glasnevin Cemetery, Dublin last Saturday.

The event, which was hosted by the Minister for Arts, Heritage and the Gaeltacht, Heather Humphreys TD, was the first formal State commemoration being held as part of the Ireland 2016 Centenary Programme.

An Taoiseach, Enda Kenny T.D. who attended, said, "Jeremiah O'Donovan Rossa was an iconic figure in Irish history. Even one hundred years after his death his name is synonymous with the Fenians and with Irish Nationalism. The liberation of his country became his life's ambition. His funeral remains one of the pivotal moments in Irish history and was an occasion that would be hugely instrumental in shaping the future of our nation."

Glasnevin Cemetery was the site of many funerals of critical importance to our nationhood in the 20th Century, Griffith, Collins, de Valera to name three; however, the most significant funeral of them all was that of Jeremiah O'Donovan Rossa. The funeral



was overseen by John Devoy on behalf of the family and organised to the minutest detail by Tom Clarke. Nearly 100 people served on the organising committee, with 13 subcommittees. The Irish Volunteers, The Irish Citizen Army, Na Fianna Éireann, Cumann na mBan, Wolfe Tone Association, Irish Transport and General Workers Union, Dublin Trades

Council, Irish Foresters Association were all represented. The individuals involved included all those who had a significant role in the "Rising" but most notably the seven signatories to the "Proclamation" were all on the committee.
