





LEGO COME UP TRUMPS IN THE "TOYLIKEME" CAMPAIGN

A Killarney man who is a campaigner for people with disabilities has expressed his delighted with the news that LEGO, one of the words top brand names in children's toys has finally produced a product depicting a young person with a disability.

Tom Doherty, who himself suffers from a disability has fundraised in the past for the National Rehabilitation Hospital in Dublin.

Lego the building bricks of childhood since 1932 was named toy of the century twice, receiving its second accolade by Forbes magazine in 1999. The Lego group produce an astonishing 19 billion elements every year.

The figure is of a young wheelchair user wearing a beanie cap. The mini figure can be found in the City theme range 60134 Fun in the park.

The online campaign #toylikeme highlights the

need to produce toys representing all children equally.

"This group and others like them came to my attention early last year when I decided to raise funds for the paediatric department of the National Rehabilitation Hospital Dun Laoighaire which caters for Brain injury, stroke, spinal-cord injury, neurological disorders or limb absence", Tom told the Killarney Outlook.

"It shocked me that toys representing them are extremely difficult to come by. It is vital that all children have toys they can identify with", he added.

It was great to finally get my hands on this Lego set. I look forward to purchasing a number of the toy for the hospital.

Hopefully more toy makers will take up the #toylikeme challenge", he added.

Veronica, was a founding member of the club and she passed away in 2013.



October is a busy month in Recovery Haven. This Autumn we see the return of our very successful Men's Prostate Programme. This is a 6 week course and is aimed at men who have been diagnosed with prostate cancer in the past two years. This programme commenced Tuesday 4th October 7-9pm.

Recovery Haven will also be running an 8 week programme called 'Living Life'. This is aimed to provide information and support to those living with a secondary cancer diagnosis. It is an opportunity to meet others dealing with secondary cancer daignosis. This will take place on alternate Wednesdays commencing Wednesday October 5th, 7-9pm. Killarney Outreach Support Service Monday 3rd and Monday 17th October-dropin support service 10am-2pm, counselling and complementary therapies arranged by appointment. In the Reeks centre (upstairs behind Kennelly's Pharmacy). Any queries to 066-7192122. October also sees the return of the pilates classes on Tuesdays (commencing October 4th) with an intermediary class at 10.15am and beginners at 11.15am.

The Mindfulness class for those dealing with cancer will recommence on Thursday October 13th at 10.30am. Finally Cancer Week Ireland is taking place between Monday 17 October and Sunday 23 October. This national initiative hopes to raise awareness of cancer and advances in care and treatment. Breast cancer is the most common cancer in women in Ireland, after skin cancer.

Better treatments mean that more and more people are now living long and full lives after breast cancer. However, the number of cases is

- Every year, around 2,600 women are diagnosed with breast cancer and 660 women die from the disease.
- 1 in 10 women in Ireland will get breast cancer at some stage in their lives.
- · It is most common in women over the age of 50, but you can get it at a younger age.
- · Men can also get breast cancer but it is very

WHAT ARE THE SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF **BREAST CANCER?**

- A change in size or shape such as one breast becoming larger than the other.
- · A change in the skin such as puckering or dimpling (like orange peel) or redness.
- · A change in the direction or shape of your nipple, especially if it sinks into your breast or

becomes irregular in shape.

- · An unusual discharge (liquid) from one or both of your nipples.
- A change on or around the nipple such as a rash or flaky or crusted skin.
- Swelling in your armpit or around your collarbone.
- · A lump or thickening in your breast
- · Constant pain in one part of your breast or armpit

Be Breast Aware...

It is important that every woman is breast aware. This means knowing what is normal for you so that if any unusual change occurs, you will recognise it.

The sooner you notice a change the better, because if cancer is found early, treatment is more likely to be successful. Get into the habit of looking at and feeling your breasts from time to time. This will help you to notice any change if it occurs.Please attend your GP if you are notice any changes.

The Ask the Expert on-line breastfeeding support service has helped over 46,000 Irish mothers with their breastfeeding queries in the 12 months since its launch. The service is provided via the HSE website www. by International Board breastfeeding.ie Certified Lactation Consultants (IBCLCs). The new supports will help to reach more mothers and improve access to user friendly breastfeeding help and information. The Public Health Nurses and community parents facilitate 8 weekly breastfeeding support groups around county Kerry in Killarney, Kenmare, Castleisland, Tralee, Listowel, Dingle,

Caherciveen. Castlegregory and breastfeeding support group invites all pregnant and breastfeeding women to attend. The aim of the breastfeeding support group is to promote breastfeeding, support mothers who are breastfeeding and assist mothers to overcome breastfeeding challenges over a cup of tea/cofee in a friendly enviroment.

The Public Health Nurses facilitate Antenatal breastfeeding workshops for expectant parents in Killarney and Kenmare. Antenatal classes are also facilitated in Killarney, Kenmare, Caherciveen and Dingle.

2,500 ON THE QUEST FOR ADVENTURE IN KILLARNEY

Over 2,500 adventurers competed in the Quest Killarney - a multi-activity one day Adventure Race event, at the weekend, making it the largest Adventure Race in the World. With 5 different routes including a 70Km and 60Km PRO as well as 27Km Sport event. Athletes braved the rugged Kerry landscape, Trekking the MacGillycuddy's Reeks, Mangerton Mountain, Cycling the Gap of Dunloe, Black Valley and Killarney National Park and Kayaking at Muckross Lake. Dessie Duffy, was the winner of the 70Km Expert race in a fantastic time of 3hrs and 42 minutes, while Moira O'Sullivan won the Ladies 70Km race in a time of 4 hours and 14 minutes. The Adventure Race was Voted the best Outdoor Event in 2014. It started 5 years ago with 500 participants and now the event has now grown to over 2,500 and continues to attract Irelands top endurance athletes and competitors from around the world. The Adventure Race is designed for all levels of fitness, tough endurance routes for those who want an extreme adventure to a sports 27km route, making it a great adventure for every level of fitness.

The tasks and instructions were listed in the booklet for both the player and the parent/guardian. Each of the outlined tasks was assessed in a constructive manner by the football coaches at our weekly training sessions. We believe the Skills Booklet was a key motivating factor in encouraging players to practice the various skills of the game and strive for personnel achievement but also assisted in ensuring our players remained physically active while also improving their general movement quality.'

Eugene Cosgrave, Firies Coiste na nOg Chairman, feels the initiative was a marvellous success adding 'This is the second year of running the initiative and it is definitely giving the cohort fantastic confidence whilst developing their GAA skillset!'

With this forward thinking coaching approach, the future certainly looks bright for Firies GAA!

Anna Grazia Laura, President of ENAT, said: "Europe is the biggest tourism magnet in the world and has very high quality tourism products that visitors can enjoy. Yet all countries need to put more focus on making sure that tourism and travel is accessible for everyone, including people with disabilities and the senior market, as these are key growth markets for the future." 

This practice deprives very many people who are life long supporters of and workers for the Association and who may now be old and inform and also the young who long to see their idols, of the joy of watching their favourite players and teams play in some of the most important games of the year". Councillor Gleeson stated that historically the media, particularly through Mícheál O'Hehir, was a major factor in popularising Gaelic games. The power of television should be maximised in this regard. Councillor Gleeson also stated that many parents who do not have SKY have no wish to bring their children to pubs to watch their idols playing.

He asked that the G.A.A. would re-appraise and take cognisance of the social and sporting needs of individuals and communities.

The Motion was seconded and unanimously agreed.



Two second year students from Killorglin Community College are about to embark on the trip of a lifetime when they take their place at Europe's largest Maker Faire in Rome, Italy. Jack Nagle and Eoghan McKenna have qualified, out of a field of thousands, to exhibit

their medical device 'Dreamy Baby Prop'. The two young men, who are only 14, designed, developed and manufactured this medical device themselves and are hopeful that it will make a considerable impact in Rome in October where there is an expected 600 inventions and more than 100,000 visitors.

'Dreamy Baby Prop' is an affordable cot (or adaptation to a cot) that allows a parent to effortlessly raise their baby to the medically recommended 30-degree elevation to help them gain relief from reflux, head colds and sinus irritation. Parents all over the world can relate to trying to raise cots single headedly, sometimes with a very upset & sick baby in their arms, and often in the early hours of the morning. This device does not solve the reflux problem itself but it does help the baby get some rest so as to make it easier to deal with. 
LECTURE AT THE LIBRARY



6. Put the fork down after putting food in your mouth. Take a sip of water, engage in conversation. Savour each bite, make it a pleasant experience so you will want to repeat it. 8. Wait at least 20 minutes to finish your meal. Have a wall clock in plain view from the table to adjust your eating speed; eat your last portion really slowly. If you are still hungry after 20 minutes, it means you are eating too fast! Another way to see this is to recognize when you feel pleasantly full or neither hungry or full.





CHILDCARE SERVICES RELIEF

Childcare Services relief is a scheme of tax relief for income arising from the provision of certain childcare services. Subject to certain conditions, where the gross annual income (before expenses) from the provision of childcare services does not exceed €15,000, the income is exempt from tax. A summary of the scheme is as follows:

- The individual's gross income limit for a year of assessment is €15,000. If more than one person is providing childcare services in a dwelling, the €15,000 limit is split between the number of people involved,
- In determining whether the income level exceeds €15,000 no deductions of any kind are taken into account,
- Where the gross income exceeds €15,000 the income is taxable in the normal way, i.e. calculate taxable profits by deducting allowable business expenses from turnover,
- The childcare service must be provided in the carer's home, not the children's home,
- No more than three children may be cared for at any one time,
- The care provider must be self-employed (not an employee) and include the gross income in their annual return of income to the Revenue Commissioners.
- By claiming this relief you are confirming that you have notified the relevant person in the Health Service Executive (HSE), that you provided child minding services in
- The election to have this income exempt from income tax for 2015 must be made on or before 31 October 2016. This income is exempt from income tax and USC but

The Serenity prayer is not necessarily about religion nor belief in a higher power. The link to mental health or well being is what is important in this article. Serenity is best described as calm, peaceful or untroubled, and that is the first element to grasp in this prayer, or mantra or way of coping with pressure or difficulty. How many times have we tried to count to 10 before we react, and there is a good reason for this, we actually allow the physical reaction of blood in our brain the chance to recede, or go down, and by so doing we actually calm our emotions or mood down. So the first step is to really find a calm and peaceful way to make peace with the things in life we cannot change. The Rudyard Kipling poem "IF" springs to mind "If you can keep your head when all about


Are losing theirs..." A simple but really important example of this, would be the weather. If it is going to rain we can calmly accept that, but make sure we pack the right rain gear for the day ahead. If we keep saying how bad the weather is, we are not really accepting the situation. And in fact we will expend emotional and practical energy trying to change the weather, and so feel exhausted and defeated along the way. So next part of this prayer, or way of life, is to have the courage to make changes in our lives where we actually can. We often hear people talking about some one having courage, and after we have found that peaceful place, we have to often dig deep to find courage. We think of the Wizard of Oz, the lion needing courage to go on the journey with Dorothy. The literal meaning is doing something you are frightened of. Now apply this to the things in your life you wish you could change, to be more specific, the things you are too frightened of to change, those are the ones you can do something about, if you could imagine holding your hand through that fearful process.

And lastly, crucially the wisdom, the quality of having experience, knowledge, and good judgment to know the difference between what you cannot change, and therefore need to accept and what you can change but may be too afraid to. These are not simple things, nor easy to do, but with continued practice and kindness to one self, as well as asking for the help we need when it does get too hard along the journey. We can all get better at the Serenity Prayer. Have a peaceful, gentle autumn day!

Know Your Rights:

FREE CANCER SCREENING PROGRAMMES

QUESTION

My friend has been invited to take part in free cancer screening. I haven't received an invitation but she says it's a national free screening programme. How do I take part?

ANSWER

There are free screening programmes to help detect or prevent a number of types of cancer.

BOWELSCREEN: The National Bowel Screening Programme, aims to find bowel cancer at an early stage in people who have no symptoms. It offers free screening every two years to men and women aged 60 to 69. If you are in this age group you can ring BowelScreen on Freephone 1800 45 45 55 to check your details are on the register. If you are on the register you will receive an invitation to take part in the BowelScreen programme.

CERVICALCHECK: The National Cervical Screening Programme, tests women aged 25 to 60 for changes in the cells of cervix. Early detection and treatment can prevent cervical cancer. If you are aged between 25 and 60 and have never had a CervicalCheck smear test you can simply make an appointment with a GP practice or clinic registered with CervicalCheck. You can find one in your area by visiting cervicalcheck.ie or by calling Freephone 1800 45 45 55. A letter of invitation is not needed to make an appointment and attend for a first test.

BREASTCHECK: The National Breast Screening Programme, invites women to a free mammogram (x-ray of the breast) every two years. The screening has been available to women aged 50 to 64 but is currently being extended to also include women aged 65 to 69. If you have not received an invitation you can check if you are registered by visiting breastcheck. ie or by calling freephone 1800 45 45 55.

Screening can help prevent or detect cancer at an early stage in people who have no symptoms. If you have any specific concerns or symptoms you should visit your GP (family doctor).



KITCHEN SCRAPS CAN HELP TO FEED BIRDS

Offering scraps as food for birds is a great way to save money on birdseed by using food that might otherwise be thrown away. By turning scraps into bird food and placing it in a separate mesh feeder less is wasted and at the same time the birds enjoy a greater variety of treats that can keep them coming back to your feeders. While a diet composed completely of scraps is less suitable, occasional scraps are easily incorporated into birds' high metabolic rates without detrimental effects. In winter months, when alternative natural food is minimized, scraps provide greater variety and different proteins, fats and carbohydrates that are not always abundant in birdseed mixes. Small amounts of scraps can also be welcome during migration and nesting seasons when

• **Baked Goods:** Stale or dry bread, bread crusts, doughnuts, cakes, biscuits and crackers are all appealing to backyard birds. Break the products up into small pieces and soak very stale pieces in water before offering them to the birds. Whole grains and less processed baked goods are preferable.

birds require more food and a stronger source

of energy to stay healthy.

- Cheese: Stale, hard bits of cheese will readily be eaten by birds. Mild flavours such as mild cheddar are most suitable, but soft cheeses such as cream cheese are not. No mouldy or rancid cheese should be offered to birds at any time.
- Pasta and Rice: Unsalted leftover cooked plain pasta or rice is a great source of carbohydrates, especially for granivorous birds. The scraps should be soft, and chopped into small enough pieces to be carried by the birds. Avoid offering leftover pasta with heavy sauces, strong spices or thick cheeses.
- Vegetables: Birds eat a lot of seed and plant material, and scrap vegetables can be a welcome feeder treat. Frozen peas or corn (thawed first), leftover baked potatoes or

bits of canned vegetables, even from canned soups, can all be offered to backyard birds. Scraps are not an alternative to bird seed, if birds ate nothing but scraps, they would not get sufficient nutrition for healthy growth or proper energy. Instead, a poor diet could lead to health problems such as obesity or feather deformations. To minimize this risk, offer scraps only on rare occasions and only in limited quantities along with your regular supply of bird seed. (Continued next week).

SWEDEN IS GOING TO ENCOURAGE PEOPLE TO REPAIR INSTEAD OF REPLACE GOODS

The idea drawn up by the country's ruling Social Democrat and Green Party coalition, comes in the form of a parliamentary proposal that would bring in tax breaks that reward Swedes who opt to send off consumer goods such as bicycles, clothing and shoes for minor mending and repairs instead of throwing them in the rubbish and replacing them with new ones. This would be achieved by lowering the rate of the value-added tax (VAT) applied to the professional repair of such items from 25% to 12%. An additional incentive introduced to Swedish Parliament would offer tax refunds half the labour cost of repairs - to those who fix larger items including home appliances such as dishwashers, washing machines and ovens. Swedes can already recoup 50% of labour costs of "paid house work" such as employing a handyman or cleaning person from their annual income taxes. The tax breaks are expected to lead to a thriving repairs industry and create new job opportunities for the country's immigrant population. France, in 2015 passed a law outlawing planned obsolescence and requiring manufacturers to offer consumers free repairs or replacement parts on appliances up to two years after the date of purchase. Germany and Norway have similar laws on the books, aiming to curb the amount of waste entering landfills, keep money in the pockets of consumers and generate jobs in the appliance repair sector.

NATURE LOVING NUNS STOPPED A PIPELINE IN ITS TRACKS

On August 8, 2013, Ceciliana Skees a farmers daughter from Kentucky and other Nuns from Loretto and several other convents attended an informational meeting held by representatives of the Bluegrass Pipeline. A joint venture between Williams and Boardwalk Pipeline Partners, the project would have transported natural gas liquids from fracking fields in Pennsylvania and Ohio southwest across Kentucky to connect with an existing pipeline to the Gulf of Mexico, with Loretto's land directly in its path. Frustrated with what they saw as a lack of helpful information at the meeting, several of the sisters, including 83 year old Sister Skees, gathered in the centre of the room and broke into song. A video of the sisters singing "Amazing Grace" was picked up by media outlets, and reached hundreds of thousands of people. A company representative asked the police to arrest the sisters for disrupting the meeting that day. But the officers, who were graduates of local Catholic schools, refused to arrest their former teachers. Woodford county resident Corlia Logsdon joined the campaign against the pipeline when she realised the proposed route would cut directly through her front yard and she found the Nuns to be stalwart partners, who regularly accompanied her to negotiate with state lawmakers. In March 2014, a circuit judge ruled against the pipeline, saying the companies had no right to use eminent domain against owners unwilling to sell their land. A few months later, the companies agreed to redraw their route to avoid Loretto's grounds, but the Nuns kept protesting to support their neighbours. The case eventually went to the state supreme court, which upheld the lower court's decision. The pipeline was defeated and the same coalition is now fighting another planned pipeline in Kentucky.

THERE ARE SOME PLACES IN AMERICA WHERE YOU CAN'T BUY A BOOK

A new study has identified a new type of desert, affecting many of the 13.5 million people living in grocery store-less areas: book deserts. An investigation led by NYU's Steinhardt School of Culture, Education, and Human Development found that there's startling lack of children's books in low-income neighbourhoods across Detroit, Washington, D.C. and Los Angeles. The more concentrated poverty levels were in these areas, the less likely they were to contain access to books, according to the findings. Researchers say that much like a lack of access to healthy foods, these book deserts are seriously hindering children from being successful in school.

Three of the six neighbourhoods had no bookstores and while online book sales have grown throughout the U.S. in recent years, three out of four children's books are still bought in brick and mortar stores. While public libraries are critically important in giving families access to books, research has shown that the presence of books in the home is related to children's reading achievement," explains NYU. This means growing up in a house with a bookshelf, where it was possible to look at, touch, read and re-read printed materials at any time has a big impact on a child's propensity for reading and thus their potential for academic success.

REEF FISH SING IN THE MORNING, JUST LIKE BIRDS

Researchers from Curtin University in Australia and the University of Exeter in Great Britain placed hydrophones in the coastal waters of Western Australia to study fish sounds and recorded a cacophony of calls. The sounds recorded were made by individual fish, but when they overlap they form an underwater chorus.

Researchers found seven types of fish choruses in total, which occurred mainly between early spring and late summer, with distinct patterns observed at sunrise and sunset.

MARGARET'S RAMBLINGS

"You get the dusk and dawn choruses like you would with the birds in the forest," said Steve Simpson, a marine biologist at the University of Exeter.

Fish, which may otherwise seem like the silent type, use sounds to find mates, feed, defend their territory or call out in distress.

According to the study, worldwide there are over 800 species of fish that reportedly produce sound.

This study also adds to a growing body of knowledge about the secret lives of fish who continue to be one of the most underappreciated and overexploited species on earth. They're bred and taken from the wild to be kept as pets and held in aquariums, farmed, used extensively in biomedical research and widely killed for food, but we pay far less attention to them than other marine species and land-based animals.

*Count Felix Graf von Luckner earned the nickname Der Seeteufel (the Sea-Devil) for his exploits as captain of the German raider SMS Seeadler (Sea Eagle) in 1916-17.

The Seeadler was a merchant ship that had been converted into a raider to disrupt Allied merchant shipping. Between January and July 1917 the Seeadler sank 14 Allied ships - 11 in the Atlantic and three in the Pacific.

Von Luckner prided himself on the effectiveness of his operations - the Seeadler destroyed 64,000 tons of shipping - and also on the fact that only one person died in his raids. The crews of vessels attacked were always removed from harm's way before their ships were sunk. By March 1917 there were several hundred prisoners to look after, which created logistical problems for the Seeadler. That month a captured French ship, the Cambronne, was used to transfer the prisoners

to safety in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

In August, for the sake of 'health and morale', the Seeadler took shelter at Maupelia (Maupihaa), an uninhabited coral atoll in the Society Islands 450 km from Tahiti. The ship anchored outside the lagoon but drifted onto the reef, stranding the crew and their 46 prisoners.

Von Luckner and five of his men decided to sail to Fiji via the Cook Islands in an open boat salvaged from the Seeadler. They planned to capture a ship and return for the others. However, when the party reached the Fijian island of Wakaya in September, their claim to be shipwrecked Norwegians proved unconvincing and Fijian police arrested them. They were transferred to New Zealand, arriving in Auckland on 7 October. Von Luckner was sent to nearby Motuihe Island. His subsequent escape from captivity on December 13th boosted his folk-hero status.

NFL STAR DITCHED MILLION **DOLLAR CONTRACT TO FARM** CROPS FOR THE NEEDY

When Jason Brown was signed to the St. Louis Rams in 2009, he was the highest paid centre in the entire National Football League. But something about the fame and fortune didn't quite appeal to the sports star anymore. So after earning \$25 million of his contract, he ditched the profession so he could become a farmer in Louisburg, North Carolina, and live a life of service to the community. Even though he didn't know the first thing about agriculture, he learned how to till, plant, and harvest on his 1,000 acres by watching Youtube videos. Jason's labour of love doesn't end there. His land, known as First Fruits Farm, has made it their goal to donate the first fruits of every harvest to food pantries feeding the less fortunate. Jason and his family moved back to his home state of North Carolina and in 2012 and bought a beautiful 1,000 acre farm in Franklin County, they laboured all of 2013 getting the farm back into shape. 2014 turned out to be a breakthrough year for themselves and their volunteers and they donated more than 10,000 pounds of cucumbers and 100,000 pounds of sweet potatoes to local hunger relief efforts from the seedlings donated to them.

First Fruits Farm's goal is to enrich the lives of those around it. Through wonderful partnerships with the Society of St Andrew, the Innerfaith Food Shuttle, NC State University, NC A&T and other organisations, they've been able to provide opportunities for research, education, and community engagement. Their desire is to maximize production for the benefit of communities, while maintaining proper land management and sound farming practices.

A PUP WOULD NOT BE ALIVE TODAY ONLY FOR A STUBBORN DOG

Poppy was on a walk with her owner when she dashed over to a rubbish pile and refused to heel when called. Her owner joined her only to discover her terrier nosing a tiny creature nestled in the rubbish.

The week old puppy fondly named Autumn was taken to the Dublin SPCA where she will be properly nursed through her adolescence by a foster family.

"We have no idea why this little pup was abandoned in the way she was but we know it is a miracle she is alive as the place she was left is an empty almost derelict site well away from the public where rubbish is dumped in a corner," the Dublin SPCA said on Facebook. "Autumn will now go to an experienced foster home and hopefully will grow up to be a happy healthy dog all thanks to Poppy and her vigilant owner."

CLEVER CROWS FIND THE BEST STICK FOR THE JOB

It's easy for us humans to fish things out jars with narrow openings. We have things like utensils and opposable thumbs and if all else fails we have the ability to turn the jar over. It's not so easy for other animals that don't have our tools or thumbs, but that doesn't stop some of them. A new study published has found that the Hawaiian crow is a crafty tool-user. The crows turn to sticks into skewers to draw out pieces of meat from logs, and they even seek out the best stick for the job. If one stick is too short, it gets tossed aside. Too thick? The bird moves on.

The Hawaiian crow is extinct in the wild, but the birds' tool use is not limited to a certain group of birds that live in their sanctuaries. Not only did 93% of the birds observed used sticks as tools across the preserves, and researchers noted juvenile crows exhibiting tool-using behaviour as well, and they did so without any social training from older crows. Another tropical crow, the New Caledonian crow has long impressed researchers with its excellent use of tools, but up until this study, no other crow had demonstrated such behaviour. The two species grew up in similar environments, but they evolved independently of one another, meaning the crows weren't swapping tips on which stick is the best one for the job. Researchers think the birds' similar environments - including a lack of competition and predators - gave them ample time to experiment with tool use.



CAR TYRES

ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT CAR TYRES FOR SAFE DRIVING

Four small patches of rubber each about the size of your hand are the only parts of the car in touch with the road so having the right tyres, in good condition and correctly inflated is very important for your safety. Regular checks and maintenance help to make tyres last longer, and keep you on the

right side of the law.

ORIGINAL FIT CAR TYRES: Car and tyre manufacturers work closely together to select the make, size and tread pattern that best suits a new car taking account of many factors including styling, handling and noise. You must stick to the same size and type of tyre - and ideally the same brand and tread pattern - when renewing tyres. Changing brand or pattern could mean more tyre noise and affect handling though it could also mean less noise and improved handling.

NEW TYRES TO THE FRONT OR REAR?

Check the handbook first as some give vehicle specific advice.

Generally it's good practice to fit the best/ newest tyres on the rear – in wet conditions, this favours understeer rather than oversteer. So if you have the front tyres renewed it's best to have the rear ones moved to the front and the new tyres fitted to the rear.

Tyres with deep tread are less likely to puncture and it's more difficult to control a car with a damaged rear tyre.

BASIC LEGAL REQUIREMENTS



- Tyres must be compatible with others on the car and generally in good physical condition
- Tyres must be correctly inflated to the vehicle manufacturer's recommended pressure
- •Tread depth must be above the legal minimum which for passenger cars is 1.6mm throughout a continuous band in the centre 3/4 of the tread and around the entire circumference.
- You don't have to carry a spare and it doesn't have to meet the legal requirements while it's stowed away. It may however affect breakdown cover if you don't carry a serviceable spare

Spare wheels.

If you are buying a new car don't assume that there will be a full-size spare wheel and tyre in the boot. It is increasingly common for car manufacturers to provide a non-standard or 'skinny' spare or even simply an emergency tyre sealant and compressor/inflator pack.

If carrying a full-size spare is important to you then raise it with the dealer; some offer a standard spare wheel as a cost option if the design of the boot floor can accommodate one.

BATTERY BREAKDOWNS

MOST COMMON CAUSE OF BREAKDOWN AT ANY TIME OF YEAR BUT PARTICULARLY IN WINTER

Battery faults are the most common cause of breakdown. AA patrols were called to more than half a million battery breakdowns in 2010 and replaced more than 140,000 batteries.

Batteries can die at any time of year but it's more likely in winter when cold temperatures hit car batteries with a triple-whammy:

- power output drops.
- ability to accept a charge drops, so the battery doesn't recharge as quickly when you're driving.

• load increases – lights, blowers, wipers, heated seats, rear-screen heater etc are all used

Add in the fact that many cars stand unused over the Christmas holiday and it's no surprise that the first day back to work after New Year is always one of the busiest of the year for the AA.

BATTERY PROBLEMS CAN BE AVOIDED

The garage that services your car should check that clamps and connections to the battery are secure and free from corrosion, but there are a few simple tips you can follow to reduce the chance of your battery letting you down in the depths of winter;

AGE

If the battery is more than five years old and there's any sign of it struggling to start the car, get it replaced. Some will struggle on for a bit but many won't. It's much better done at your convenience than as a roadside emergency.

LOAD

Check that everything electrical is turned off when you park up – even an interior light, boot light, or radio left on overnight can kill a battery when it's cold.

GIVE THE BATTERY A CHANCE

Switch off everything electrical and dip the clutch to reduce the load on the battery when you start a cold car.
