



# Ross Golf Society celebrates 40 years

Founded in The Ross Hotel in 1978, Ross Golf Society is Killarney's oldest golf society. This year, Captain Jim Morris and his committee celebrated their 40 years of existence with a special 40th. Anniversary Outing on Killarney's Killeen Course in June and last Thursday night held a reunion of

past-captains at the Ross Hotel to make a presentation to the Society's president, Padraig Treacy.

While there are plenty of Golf societies around nowadays, in 1978 there was only one in Kerry, The Old Reserves in Tralee.

The first impetus came from a group of

senior caddies, all skilful golfers and Killarney members. After some discussion with some fellow members a small group met informally in the Ross Hotel and formed a society that would be open to members of any recognised golf club. Affiliation to the GUI followed some years later. Support from the Ross Hotel was readily forthcoming and to this day three generations of the Treacy family have generously assisted the society. Padraig Treacy is still the president of the society.

Among the founding group were Sean Counihan, Dermot Roche, Kieran O'Connor, Connie Brosnan and the late lan O'Leary. Ralph O'Connell joined the society in its early years and served as hard-working Hon. Secretary for over 30 years. Kieran O'Connor and Connie Brosnan are still members and have given unstinting service to the society down through the years.

The immediate aims of the society were to promote the game of golf and friendship between golfers while providing more competitive golf than the Club's Sunday competitions afforded at that time.

It is heartening to see generation succeeding generation, and now the sons of previous members or captains have joined the Ross and became captains: Bernard O'Shea, Mike Stack, Sean O'Sullivan, Neil and John Coffey, thus bringing with them new and younger members giving promise of a brighter future for the Ross Hotel Golf Society.

#### Raising Funds For Feileacain

20,000 people took part in the Dublin city marathon which took place at the end of October, and one of the many people raising money on that day was Stephen Griffin. Stephen ran the marathon on behalf of the charity Feileacain, which is the Stillbirth and Neonatal Death Association of Ireland. Stephen's sister Bridget and her husband Patrick McCarthy sadly had a stillborn daughter, Avery, at 20 weeks in October 2016 in Kerry General. Both Bridget and Patrick received amazing help from Feileacain when their daughter Avery gained her angel wings far too soon. Feileacain are a non-profit organisation which offers support to anyone affected by the death of a baby during pregnancy or shortly afterwards. Some of the support services they offer include providing memory boxes to hospitals to be given to the bereaved parents, cold cots to help regulate the baby's temperature which allows parents to keep their baby with them just that little bit longer, a support helpline and regular meetings. Every donation is massively appreciated and can make a huge difference to a family who unfortunately need the service of this wonderful worthwhile charity. The Memory Box in particular is hugely important to families. This box provides so many opportunities for parents to create memories with their babies by providing them with the necessary items to take hand and footprints. Also inside are the 2 little teddy bears. Baby takes one that is filled



with love and one stays with the parents, there is also a blanket, knitted with love, to wrap baby in. These memory boxes are a huge and valuable part of the grieving process as they provide the opportunity to create precious memories which can be looked at over and over again. Feileacain currently provides between 800-1000 memory boxes to hospitals each year. A beautiful candle with babies name and date of birth can be ordered from the office. All money raised through fundraising goes back in to ensuring that families are supported

during one of the hardest times of their lives. Speaking to the Killarney Outlook Bridget and her husband Pat said "We are delighted to announce the final figure raised was €3,830 and a huge thank you to all those who supported us achieving this in honour of the memory our daughter Avery. We were completely blown away by all the support we received, and all the well wishes for Stephen as he was the one running the Dublin City marathon on behalf of Feileacain." Stephen finished the marathon in 3 hrs 57 minutes.

#### **COUNCILLOR PENS OPEN LETTER TO MINISTER**

APPRAISAL APPLICATION FOR NEW 2 LANE BRIDGE ON THE R563 AT LISTRY



Dear Minister Griffin,

I write this open letter to you on behalf of the local community of Listry and the thousands of road users that drive the R563 linking Killarney to West Kerry. In July of this year Kerry County Council made an appraisal application to the Department of Transport, Tourism & Sport seeking approval for funding under the Capital Plan for Regional Roads, for a new 2 lane bridge to replace the current single lane 170 year old structure on the R563 at Listry Co

Kerry.

The Council have submitted a preliminary design for a new 2 lane bridge complete with footpaths, on the main transport archery linking Killarney to West Kerry. I want to stress in the strongest possible terms, how critically important this application is, to improve transport efficiency, enhance regional access to and from West Kerry and supporting the rural economy of the region. It is also of paramount importance for tourism transport and to provide major road safety

improvements for daily road users at this location where an antiquated single lane bridge creates a dangerous bottle neck on a regional road with rapidly increasing traffic volumes.

I am appealing to you as Minister of State to ensure that this application for a new bridge is successful and funded in the Capital Plan for Regional roads. I want to recognise and acknowledge the funding that you as Minister have secured for Kerry, but it is essential that you ensure that Listry bridge is not forgotten again. Over decades this project has been ignored by successive Governments, Ministers, and TD's. For almost 20 years as a local Councillor I have been relentlessly campaigning in Kerry County Council for this new bridge. This application is now at a critical stage and this is Listry's one and only opportunity, if successful it gives the opportunity for progress, growth and improved safety, if refused it will be viewed as a devastating setback totally ignoring the needs of transport, tourism, safety and improved regional accessibility. Minister Griffin your influence in delivering this project will prove vital and I appeal for your support.

# Killarney Cardiac Respose Unit continue to help save lives



This week the Killarney Cardiac Response Unit launched a video detailing the work of Community First Responders. To date they have responded to over 550 calls with the Natial Ambulance Service.

The video, which has gone viral across Ireland shows how's people from all walks of life volunteer their time to be there in the minutes that matter when someone suffers an out of hospital cardiac arrest.

"The commitment shown by the members of the organisation to increase the out of hospital cardiac arrest survival rate is incredible. Not only do they provide 24/7 cover with 2 Responders on call at all times but increasingly they are visible within the community providing training to community groups. These efforts give the people of Killarney the greatest chance of surviving an out of hospital cardiac arrest by being there in the minutes that matter", Mike Marshall Chairman of Killarney Cardiac Response Unit said

Kevin O Leary, Scheme Co-Ordinator, paid a special tribute to the sponsors of the

unit and to the town of Killarney for their ongoing support. "As a 100% voluntary organization we rely upon the support of the community and our sponsors and this support enables us to strive to provide 24/7 emergency cover and equip our volunteers with the skills and equipment that is so crucial in an emergency."

The unit which has grown since its inception in 2015 has over 40 Responders, each giving up their time to make a difference within the community.

The Killarney Cardiac Response Unit recently welcomed 5 more Instructors to the Unit who provide weekly training to its members. In addition to this, these instructors along with the Responders of KCRU have provided community training to various groups, just recently in Muckross where over 60 members of the public where trained in CPR and AED use.

The KCRU would like to thank Niall Foley who created the recent video along with Independent Irish Health Foods and Tricel for their continued support.



A minutes silence was observed before the game and the Irish flag was flown at half mast in honour of the late Con Griffin (East Kerry Coiste na nÓg, Fitzgerald Stadium Committee and Dr Crokes) and the late Weeshie Fogarty (Killarney Legion, The Kerryman and Radio

Kerry). This Fr Galvin Cup Final, sponsored by the Aquila Club, was a very entertaining end to end sporting game between two closely matched neighbouring teams. The game went to extra time and that failed to seperate the sides, putting the final to a replay -date and venue to be decided.

Listry got off to a dream start with a goal from the throw in, when Ronan Buckely took return pass and buried the ball to the back of the net 30 seconds into the game. It was tit for tat for the remainder of the quarter. With Fossa's Paudie Clifford orchastrating scores and Tadgh O'Shea accurate with frees, Fossa narrowed the gap to the minimum with 4 Tadgh O'Shea points to 2 for Listry from the boot of Jimmy O'Leary - 1-2 to 0-4 on 15 minutes. #### **Beaufort are Munster** Junior Club Champions

Congratulations to Beaufort on being crowned Munster Junior Champions. It was an epic battle in Mallow and a game which kept supporters enthralled until the final whistle! At half time Beaufort trailed 2-6 to 1-3 but pegged it back to finish at full time 2-9 a piece. Extra time was needed to crown a winner and the final whistle saw Beaufort ahead by the slimmest of margins 2-13 to 2-12. Nathan Breen received the Cup from the Munster Chairman Jerry O'Sullivan.

Congratulations also to Kilgarvan who have secured their place in the Junior B final having beaten Doonbeg 1-10 to 7 points. Next Sunday they play Ballinacrra in the final at 2pm in Knockaderry.

#### **Munster Championship Fixtures**

A meeting of the Munster CCC took place last Thursday night at Aras Mumhan, Limerick. The fixtures for the 2019 Munster GAA Senior Football Championship were ratified. Kerry will play the winners of Clare v Waterford in the semifinal. All games will take place on Saturdays including the Munster Senior Football Final.

The draws took place for the 2019 Bord Gais Energy Munster GAA Football Under 20 Championship. Kerry will play the winners of Tipperary V Limerick in the semi-final. A decision on dates for this competition was deferred.

A new structure for the 2019 Electric Ireland Munster GAA Football Minor Championship was ratified at the September meeting of the Munster CCC. At last Thursday night's meeting, the order of the round robin fixtures was determined and the fixtures were ratified. Cork will play Kerry in phase 2 round 1 on May 7th.

#### The Standing Committee on the Playing Rules

Approved Gaelic Football Playing Rules for Experimentation (November 2018)

1: Hand Pass To introduce a restriction of three consecutive passes of the ball with the fist or open hand by players of the team in possession. The playing of the ball by open hand(s) or fist for the purpose of scoring a point shall not be deemed a hand pass. Once an opponent touches the ball in play, this will be considered a break in the hand pass chain. Penalty: Free kick from where the foul occurred except as provided under the Exceptions in Rule 2.2.

2: Side-line Kick The ball shall be played forward from the kick except where the kick is inside the 20m line of the opposing team. Penalty: Cancel side-line kick. Throw-in the ball in accordance with Rule 2.2 Exception (v)

3: The Advanced Mark To extend the application of the Mark to the clean catching of the ball from a kick in play (i.e. not from set-play) delivered by the kicker on or beyond the opposing team's 45m line, that travels a minimum of 20 metres and without it touching the ground. - The application of the Mark shall be standardised as follows Fifteen seconds shall be allowed for a Free to be taken from a Mark. A player shall signify he is taking a Mark as per current Rule 2.12 where the 'player shall signify to the Referee he is taking the 'Advanced Mark' A score may be made from a free awarded for a Mark in all cases. Exception: A free-kick from a Mark shall be taken from the hand(s) only.

4: Sin-Bin To have a Penalty on the day for a Black Card Infraction by ordering off the offending player for 10 minutes in a Sin Bin. The 10 minutes shall commence with the ordering off to the sin-bin and shall end on the expiry of the 10 minutes, irrespective of delays. The 10 minutes shall be monitored by the 4th Official, where operating, and otherwise by the Referee. The player may only re-join the game at a break in play and on the instruction of the 4th Official or Referee. A subsequent Black Card Infraction shall be penalised by the showing of a Black Card followed by a Red Card. In this case there shall be no substitution allowed. - The maximum number of substitutions in normal time to return to five.

5: Kick-Out from 20m Line The kick-out shall be taken off the ground from a point on the part of the 20m line that forms the semi-circular arc. All players, other than the Goalkeeper (and another player if the goalkeeper is not taking the kickout) shall be outside the 20m line, outside the arc and 13m from the ball until it has been kicked. Penalty: Cancel kick-out. Throw-in the ball on defenders' 20m line in front of the scoring space. T

DESPITE leading by 11 points early in the final quarter, Scotts Lakers were agonisingly pipped in overtime by Limerick Celtics in apulsating national cup quarter final in Killarney Sports Centre last Saturday night. with Killarney Outlook ohn O'Sullivan HOW TO TAKE HARDWOOD CUTTINGS A lot of hardwood cuttings are grown on, outside in prepared beds but if you are only taking a small amount of cuttings you can grow them in pots as well. When taking a hardwood cutting pick a good healthy shoot that has grown in the current year. Next, remove any soft growth at the tip of the cutting. Then cut into sections of about 6-10 inches above a bud at the tip with the cut sloping so water can't rest on it. Then cut at the base below a bud or pair of buds and then dip the lower bud into some rooting powder. Next prepare a trench that is well dug over and has good drainage or if you are growing them in pots - make sure there is plenty of drainage. Insert the cuttings two thirds into your pots or ground and allow about 4-5 inches between cuttings. Cuttings should be left until the following autumn and remember to water in dry spells.

### **Know Your Rights:**

#### **OUESTION**

I am a full-time carer for my mother. I don't qualify for a medical card but I've heard that a GP visit card for carers is now available. How do I apply to get one?

#### **ANSWER**

The rules for GP visit cards have changed. Now everyone who is getting Carer's Benefit or Carer's Allowance, at full rate or half rate, is eligible for a GP visit card.

To get the GP visit card, you complete the registration form your GP from the list of participating GPs.

You can get a registration form, and the list of participating GPs, on medicalcard.ie or by calling LoCall 1890 252 919. You can also register for the card online at medicalcard.ie. It also covers visits to out-of-hours GP services. However, the GP visit card does not cover hospital charges.

Prescribed drugs are not covered by the card but, if you for approved prescribed drugs and medicines for use by yourself and your family in that month.

You can download an application form for the Drugs Payment Scheme from the Health Service Executive (HSE) website, hse.ie, or you can get an application form from your pharmacy or Local Health Office.

Thoughts are constantly streaming through our minds which in turn can impact on how we feel and how we behave. These thoughts can be friendly positive thoughts or hostile, critical and negative ones. It makes sense therefore that we would try to reduce the negative ones as much as possible. Just as we wouldn't allow any stranger to just enter our house and take over, we need to be just as vigilant with our thoughts. We need to take more control over what we allow into our minds and what we prohibit from entering. We have much more choice than we realise - and therefore rather than just reacting to every thought we begin to take more control over our mind. Slowly we begin to realise that just because we think something it doesn't mean it's

By examining our thoughts as they flow through our mind, we begin to increase our awareness of how our minds are focused. Then we begin to allow these thoughts - whether they are positive or negative, exciting or boring - to just flow through our mind stream without reacting or responding. This is the basis of mindfulness.

For many people experiencing depression they can create an endless cycle of 'If onlys' and 'what ifs' in their mind. There is an underlying non-acceptance of the past as they constantly think how their lives would be different 'If only I hadn't taken his advice', 'If only I hadn't behaved in that way'. This all leads to feelings of anger, hopelessness and mistrust of others. Accepting how things are right now- not as we wish they were, but as they actually are - is quite a radical step. It can however mark the starting point from which we can come to terms with past events. and begin to move forward.

Just as there are many paths leading to feeling depressed, there are also many routes out of it. We don't get depressed as a result of an adverse event or experience - but in how we respond to it. When our emotional needs go unmet this can lead to considerable mental distress and depression. If we were to consider depression as a means of drawing our attention to an underlying problem, we must ask ourselves what is the message my feelings of depression are trying to tell me. Counselling can provide a great support as we explore what this underlying message might be. Counselling helps to find contentment and peace of mind through fostering a healthy, non-judgemental, loving relationship with oneself.

Next week we will continue to look at ways we can deal with depression.
