TO RUSSIA WITH LOVE.... GARY UNDERTAKES MISSION OF MERCY

A Physiotherapy student at UL, Gary McGowan from Killarney is undertaking a mission of mercy this weekend as he heads to Belarus to volunteer at the Gorodische Orphanage.

Gary, who is the son of Julie and Gerry McGowan will spend two weeks at the facility with temperatures there expected to reach -10 degrees during his stay. Accompanied by five fellow students, Gary will be involved in caring for the orphans who range from newborn babies to adults in their '40's all of whom will be suffering from extensive disabilities. The orphanage is situated in an isolated village with very limited resources and Gary is currently fundraising in an effort to provide necessary provisions along with some small luxuries.

Gary and his friends are travelling out with the Burren Chernobyl Project which is closely associated with the Killarney Branch of the Friends of the Children of Chernobyl. The group who are all Physiotherapy students are also hoping that they will be able to pass on some additional help to the patients through the management of their physical conditions. Speaking to the Killarney Outlook Gary said "Having heard about the opportunity, I began reading more about the orphanage and the role of the Irish volunteers in it's running, along with the level of impairments the kids present live with. Those of us travelling then met with 2 volunteers who had previously travelled, at which point we were shown pictures and told stories about the kids, along the type of work we would be taking on. Although it seemed incredibly challenging, I felt that what we can offer to them would be very rewarding, as they have the utmost gratitude and find entertainment and pleasure in the simplest of things that we take for granted", he said.

"It was also of further interest to those of us travelling due to our course of study (Physiotherapy), which would coincide with the management of such physical impairments. Although we won't be able to offer much in terms of that during our brief stay, it will be good experience to witness such impairments. Another idea would be to also potentially sometime down the line organise a temporary or even permanent physiotherapy service at the orphanage, which shockingly has none at the moment", he added. "The experience will prepare us in some way for our hospital placements in both paediatric and neurological physiotherapy, in which we may see patients with less severe but similar impairments. Therefore, this could be an area I would like to work in the future, as I feel the rewards would go far beyond any monetary reward. Helping

KILLARNEY RECOVERS FROM STORM FRANK

As parts of the country are still reeling from the damage caused by Storm Frank, Killarney got its fair share of flooding with low lying areas and property situated in close proximity to rivers and around the shores of the lakes of Killarney suffering the most.

This week the Road Safety Authority (RSA), issued a reminder to all road users to continue to excercise caution when using the roads. Even though weather conditions have improved, road conditions in parts of the county are still hazardous due to the continued presence of flooding on roads. There is also the added danger posed by storm damaged road surfaces and gravel / stones deposited by surface water, especially on regional roads.

THE RSA ADVISES THE FOLLOWING:

• Driver behaviour needs to match the road conditions on roads. Debris deposited by the recent rainwater (surface run off) and wet roads will reduce grip so drivers are asked to slow down and increase braking distances, by leaving a bigger gap between vehicles.

• DO NOT attempt to drive through flooded roads as stranded cars are causing obstruction and a hazard in some locations.

• Pay attention to any advice or signage that either the Local Authorities or the Gardai have

in place for road closures and obey any signs detouring traffic away from flooded roads.

• Plan your travel routes carefully before beginning your journey allowing time for any diversions.

• Road users are asked to be extra careful at night when it's harder to see flood dangers.

YOUR CHANCE TO SAVE A LIFE.... OPERATION RESUSCITATION WANTS TO TRAIN YOU

Killarney teenager Tom Geaney made headlines around the country this week as news of his second chance at life hit the headlines.

Tom suffered a cardiac arrest over a year ago while training an Under 11 team at Killarney Celtic. Due to the quick response of a coach at the training ground, Eugene Cosgrove and his friends who provided CPR and operated the defibilator, Tom has made a full recovery. The son of Dr. Fiona Gallagher and Dr. John Geaney, Tom and his friends had learned CPR as part of their year as students in Transition Year in St. Brendan's College. Speaking to RTE, Tom and his family are now involved in the launch of a pilot programme which is being rolled out in Killarney. The aim of the programme is to have 25% of the population trained to administer cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) by the end of the year. It takes just two hours to learn the basics of CPR and AED (defibilator use) in order to

save a life and as over 70% of cardiac arrests happen in the home is it is very important for as many people as possible to be trained. If the campaign goes according to plan the campaign could save over 200 lives each year in the Killarney area. The campaign is very much a community affair with volunteers from across the area helping out in all aspects of the training and running of the initiative.

Volunteers from groups like The Michael Lenihan Heartsafe group, The Killarney Cardiac Response Unit, Beaufort Defibilator Group, The Order of Malta, the National Ambulance Service and the Civil Defence are all involved in the programme. Speaking to the Killarney Outlook Dr. John Geaney said "if bystanders know how to perform CPR and know what to do, we can avoid hundreds of unnecessary deaths"

The group are holding regular training sessions at the Killarney Racecourse VIP Room and are catering for everyone aged 14 years and upwards. There are other defibilator groups being set up around the county at present with Beaufort and Barraduff actively training members at the moment.

At the December Municipal area meeting, Councillor Michael Gleeson asked that the Council would develop a footpath as far as the junction of the N 22 and the road to Upper Lissivigeen/Coolcslough as a logical continuation of the existing footpath from the Castle Heights to the Woodford River [Abha an tSionnaigh].

The Council replied that as the roadway in question is a National Primary road the matter has been discussed with the Road Safety officer of the TI1 [formerly the NRA].

A scheme will be designed linking the traffic calming at Lissivigeen to the Woodlawn iunction.

The design will incorporate improvements to the Coolcaslough junction and may incorporate a footpath from the Woodlawn junction to the Coolcaslough junction. When the design is completed it will be forwarded to the T11 for consideration for funding.

Councillor Gleeson welcomed the positive response and stated that this very busy stretch of carriageway needs to afford the maximum possible safety to pedestrians."

A MESSAGE FOR THE NEW YEAR, 2016.

In the Church worldwide, New Year's Day is celebrated as a day to pray for World Peace. The theme Pope Francis chose for this year is "Overcome indifference and win peace". The events that we commemorate in 2016, the centenary of the Easter Rising and the on-going centenary of World War One, make it truly appropriate to think of both Ireland's needs and the needs of the world and to pray for the peace and wellbeing of all people in Ireland and worldwide. Regarding the First World War this year recalls a most tragic battle, the Battle of the Somme. One historian summed up the Battle of the Somme as commencing on July 1st, lasting 100 days and involving 300.000 lives that were lost. Thousands of those lives were Irish.

Here in our diocese we recall that the first three to die in Easter 1916 were the three men who were drowned off Ballykissane Pier, near Killorglin, on the Good Friday. Seven days later, the Friday of Easter week, The O' Rahilly from Ballylongford was killed in action in the centre of Dublin.

The centenary celebrations of Easter 1916 and all that followed it are important for us as a nation. Is it sufficiently long ago for us to honour all people and organisations from all sides who were involved? Can we respect all, refraining from judgement? We remember and honour the women and men who took up Ireland's cause in 1916 as very precious to us because they started us on a path that led to our freedom. A century later we see ourselves as an independent, successful, sovereign nation. An important element of this is the Good Friday Agreement of 1998 and the hope for lasting peace and justice it contains.

When we recall 1916 the Easter Proclamation always comes to mind. So much of it could be quoted. I choose the following:

• The Republic guarantees religious and civil liberty, equal rights and equal opportunities to all its citizens, and declares its resolve to pursue

the happiness and prosperity of the whole nation and of all its parts, cherishing all of the children of the nation equally, ...

• We place the cause of the Irish Republic under the protection of the Most High God ... • In this supreme hour the Irish nation must, by its valour and discipline, and by the readiness of its children to sacrifice themselves for the common good, prove itself worthy of the august destiny to which it is called.

These quotes inspire many questions: What part does faith in "the Most High God" play in life in Ireland today? Are we still resolved to pursue the happiness and prosperity of the whole nation? What of our readiness to sacrifice ourselves of the common good?

Celebrating 1916 can evoke a renewal of commitment to the original vision. The values, the hopes and the ambitions of our people in 1916 and the values, the hopes and the ambitions of our people in the one hundred years since, will they inspire us afresh as we enter the second century after 1916?

In his recent Encyclical on the environment, 'Laudato Si', Pope Francis speaks of all people on earth as one human family with the world as our common home. We are aware of the difficulties and challenges facing our country as we come out of the recession. It has led to awful ongoing consequences for some people in particular. Are our economic difficulties manageable in comparison with the difficulties of many nations and peoples elsewhere in the world? We are aware of the pain and devastation caused by thirty years of 'Troubles' in Ireland: what must it be like for nations like Syria or Central African Republic or the Palestinian people suffering ongoing war and strife?

May commemorations throughout Ireland in the year ahead inspire us as a people to give of our best for our own people in Ireland and to open our hearts to world needs too. The great event we commemorate occurred at Easter, the highpoint of our annual celebration of the Death and Resurrection of Jesus. Thus the following words from the first letter of St. John are appropriate to conclude:

This has taught us love - that He gave up his life for us; and we too, ought to give up our lives for our sisters and brothers. If a person who was rich enough in this world's goods saw that one of their sisters or brothers was in need, but closed their heart to them, how could the love of God be living in that person? 1 Jn:14-18

A new year means it's time to focus on your CAO application

(By Billy Ryle)

More than 80,000 people will apply to the Central Applications Office (CAO) this year for a place in a third level college. The Galway based CAO processes applications for admission

to undergraduate courses in Higher Education Institutions (HEI) in Ireland. Using a single application, you may choose from the entire range of courses in the CAO Handbook 2016. All of the courses are categorised as 'Level 8' or 'Level 7/Level 6'. The 'Level 8' category contains all the Honours Bachelor Degrees (HD). The 'Level 7/ Level 6' category contains Ordinary Bachelor Degrees (DG)/Higher Certificates (HC). Every public sector university, college and institute in the country participates in the CAO system. With the exception of a number of private colleges in the CAO, the Department of Education and Skills (DES) pays the tuition fees of eligible students who are attending full-time undergraduate courses.

All you have to do is submit a single application in order to compete for one of the available third-level places. The interactive online application system, 'Apply' has made the process very straight forward and convenient for students. In fact, the application system is now so well structured that there is absolutely no reason to feel anxious about applying for a third level college place. 'Apply' is user friendly and easy to follow, particularly as CAO provides an 'Interactive Demo' to enable you make a trial application. The CAO Handbook 2016 contains detailed easy-to-follow information on how to apply for the courses on offer at the institutions, which participate in the CAO system.

The CAO application process has moved very smoothly from the old paper application to an interactive online application. Almost all applications from school leavers will be made via "Apply" this year. The interactive online application service will remain open on the CAO website, www.cao.ie until 5.15pm on 1st February. The fee for the online application is $\in 25$, if you apply by 20th January and $\in 40$ thereafter until the standard closing date of 1st February.

Before you tackle the online application, study the CAO Handbook 2016, which explains the procedure to be followed when applying for a third level college place. The institutions in the CAO system are listed in alphabetical order by location, beginning with Athlone IT and ending with Waterford IT. The courses available in each college are listed directly under the college title, with 'Level 8' courses being listed separately from 'Level 7/Level 6' courses. Using a single application, select your personal preferences from the entire range of courses mentioned in the Handbook. Each course is assigned a code, which you enter on the application. You may apply for up to ten courses in each of the two categories – listed in order of your preference in each case.

The CAO Handbook 2016 does not contain information about general academic requirements, specific course requirements nor content of courses. Don't apply for any course without first consulting the information literature or the web site of the institution offering that course. Carefully study the content and the potential career value of each course for which you intent to apply. Play to your strengths as you research your course choices during the next few weeks. Jot down your personal career profile, including such variables as ability, achievement, application, aptitude, ambition, interest and personality (5AIP). It's important to select courses to which you are suited. In that event, you are less likely to lose interest in the course or, in a worst case scenario, to drop out of college without a third level qualification.

In the next article, I will take a detailed look at the CAO 2016 application timeline.

KILLARNEY PERFORMS WELL IN BAL LITTER LEAGUE

Killarney is Cleaner than European Norms, and is in 6th spot among the 40 towns surveyed in the final litter survey of 2015 by Irish Business Against Litter show. There was a slight fall-off in the number of litter-free towns across Ireland, but no towns were deemed 'litter blackspots' and only one was 'seriously littered'. An Taisce report for Killarney stated: "Some of the very good sites in Killarney included The Main Street and Plunkett Street, both of which had some very nicely presented premises. There was a complete absence of litter in the residential area of Friary Downs and the Car Park on College Street was very clean and tidy. However, the 'heavily littered' road to Tralee brought down the town's ranking."

Three quarters of the towns and cities surveyed by An Taisce on behalf of IBAL were found to be Clean to European Norms, a fall of 15% on last year. Likewise, the number of towns deemed Cleaner than European Norms fell from 17 to 12. However, the most littered areas have improved, with Farranree in Cork no longer a litter blackspot and Dublin's North Inner City shedding its 'seriously littered' tag. The cities of Limerick, Galway and Cork were all clean, with Waterford deemed Cleaner than European Norms.

Drogheda, Dun Laoghaire, Dungarvan, Longford and last year's winner Kilkenny are vying for the title of Ireland's cleanest town, to be revealed later.

"After a decade of year-on-year improvement, it is disappointing to see the very high standards achieved by towns slip in a number of cases," comments Conor Horgan of IBAL. "We may be witnessing the effect of the disappearance of town councils, or we may be getting slightly complacent. At the same time, we can say the great majority of our towns are clean. Also, it is heartening to see the problem city areas getting better - if only slowly." Across the country, recycling facilities (invariably the responsibility of the county council) and disused or abandoned sites were the sites most prone to litter, with two thirds found to be littered or worse, followed by promenades and river walks.

"As the economy recovers, there are signs that the number of vacant or disused sites is declining, which augers well for a clean environment," says Horgan. "In other instances we have seen abandoned sites being put to novel uses, such as inner city gardens. We would like to see more of this, as the benefit it brings to the community can go well beyond cleanliness."

SAFETYFORPERMIT HOLDERS

How learner drivers can ensure their driving experience is a safe and enjoyable one

SAFETY FOR PERMIT HOLDERS: To ensure your safety and that of other road users, learner drivers are bound by certain laws.

DRIVING ALONE: You can't be alone in the vehicle when driving, regardless of how long you have been driving and how many learner permits you have held. And the person who's with you must hold a full driving licence for the category of vehicle you are driving for a continuous period of 2 years.

The only exceptions to this are when you are: Driving a work vehicle (eg, agricultural tractor or JCB), unless it has been adapted to carry a passenger, and the passenger holds a full driving licence for a work vehicle for a continuous period of 2 years.

Riding a motorcycle, if you obtained your first learner permit on or after the 6 December 2010 you need to carry a Certification of Satisfactory Completion with your permit in order to drive.

ACCOMPANYING OTHER LEARNERS: You may not act as an accompanying driver, ie, holder of a full licence, for a person driving on a learner permit. The Certificate of Competency you receive on passing your driving test does not qualify – you must hold a full licence to be an accompanying driver for a continuous period of at least 2 years.

'L' PLATES: Your vehicle must display an 'L' plate front and rear. The plate should consist of a red 'L' on a white background.

MOTORWAYS: No driving on motorways even if you possess a certificate of competence.

TRAILERS: If you hold a learner permit to drive vehicles of categories B, C1, C, D1 or D you may not drive the vehicle when drawing a trailer.

PASSENGERS: No passengers can be carried for payment or other reward.

VEHICLE SAFETY: Safe driving alone does not ensure road safety. The vehicle you are driving must also be fit to be on the road. In fact, it is a serious offence to drive an unsafe vehicle on a public road.

Laws exist to enforce vehicle standards. One of the most important of these is that your car,

if more than four years old, must undergo a regular health-check called a National Car Test (NCT). As a driver, it is your responsibility to ensure your vehicle is in good working order. You must ensure that the steering, brakes, front and rear lights, reflectors, rear view mirrors, safety belts, speedometer, tyres, windscreen wipers, horn and silencer are all checked regularly to ensure they are in good condition and working properly.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS: Not all of the following are legal requirements but they are all important to adhere to:

CHILDREN IN MOTOR VEHICLES: You must not leave young children on their own in a motor vehicle, even if you are away for a short time. The children may face a number of hazards, such as:

A fire breaking out

Dehydration and heatstroke on a warm day (if all windows are closed)

Being trapped in electric windows, which could result in serious injury or death

ANIMALS IN MOTOR VEHICLES: You should never leave animals alone in vehicles. It is cruel and unsafe and can result in injury to the animal and/or damage to your vehicle.

USING A MOBILE PHONE: You must not drive a vehicle or ride a motorbike while using a handheld mobile phone. It is an offence that can result in your receiving up to four penalty points. Cyclists should never use a mobile phone when cycling; pedestrians should be careful when using one.

IPODS ETC: Personal radios and MP3 players can be distracting and cause you to lose concentration while driving or crossing the road. Cyclists in particular should avoid these devices, as they, more than most, rely on their hearing while on the road.

SIX MONTH RULE

How long you need to hold a learner permit before you can apply for a test

WHAT IS IT: First-time learner permit holders (in certain categories) must wait six months after the date of issue of the particular licence category before they can sit their driving test. In the past, some people took the test shortly after getting their first learner permit and research has shown that the more practice and experience a person gets, the better a driver they become. This is particularly important



if you have added a licence category to your permit as it is the date the category was added that is relevant not the date that your permit was issued. It is your responsibility to ensure that you have checked your permit details and that you are eligible to sit the test. If you apply and turn up to sit your test and you are not eligible then you will lose your fee and have to re apply.

WHO DOES IT APPLY TO: It applies to first-time learner permit holders for: cars, motorcycles, works vehicles (eg, tractors, JCBs)

EXEMPTIONS: Where you opt to take Progressive Access (where you have held the lower category for a minimum of 2 years) from category A1 to A2 or Category A2 to A and wish to take a driving test, you do not need to wait six months to sit the driving test. A holder of a current full driving licence from another country (jurisdiction) for more than six months is exempt from this requirement, provided you forward a current original driving licence and a letter of entitlement from the relevant licensing authority in that country to the:

Applicants are advised to forward their original licence by registered post.

One of the key measures announced in Budget 2016 were the changes to the Universal Social Charge (USC).

Incomes of \leq 13,000 or less in 2016 are exempt from the charge. This is an increase of \leq 988 from the 2015 exemption limit of \leq 12,012. If your income is above the exemption limit you will be taxed as follows:-

€0 to €12,012 @ 1%

€12,012 to €18,668 @ 3%

€18,668 to €70,044 @ 5.5%

€70,044 to €100,000 @ 8%

PAYE employee income in excess of €100,000 @ 8%

Self – employed individuals income in excess of €100,000 @ 11%

The change in USC bands and rates leads to the following USC cuts for various levels of gross income up to the maximum reduction of \notin 902.

Know Your Rights:

SMACKING CHILDREN

QUESTION

I heard that smacking a child is now illegal. What exactly are the rules?

ANSWER

The Children First Act 2015 provides for a number of key child protection measures. Changes aimed at banning corporal punishment or use of force against children came into effect on 11 December 2015. Since that date, a person who physically punishes a child can no longer rely on the defence of "reasonable chastisement" in the courts.

Before this change, parents or others acting in loco parentis could use physical force to punish their children, even though a law allowing parents to use force against their children was repealed in 2001. They could do this by relying on the common law defence of "reasonable chastisement". This meant that a person who hit or smacked a child could argue that they did so to discipline the child. This was a defence to what would otherwise be an assault on the child. This defence can no longer be used in the courts.

No new offence has been created and there are no laws that directly ban the smacking of children. However the withdrawal of the "reasonable chastisement" defence means that an effective ban is in place.

You can visit Parenting24seven, an online resource from Tusla, the Child and Family Agency, to get information that is relevant to children and families at different stages of childhood and in different situations.

The New Year brings with it new expectations and experiences for everyone. It can be a time of excitement and fresh starts and yet feel one of the most difficult times also. Many people report

feeling down, a little fatigued and more hopeless. There can be a sense of deflation after all the festivities of Christmas and with that anti-climax low mood and, in some cases, isolation can occur. The temptation may be to give in a little and retire from the world but the opposite is more helpful. Engaging in moderate physical exercise, eating a balanced diet and staying connected to others can prohibit a low mood from getting increasingly worse. Of course we all have off days or lazy days whereby we need to rest more and retreat but if you notice that you are experiencing ongoing low mood and change in behaviour that affects your quality of life and/or relationships then you may have to reach out for help.

A good place to start is family or friends, someone you already know and trust. They know you already and know your life experiences and how much you have been through so chatting to them about how you feel can alleviate the pressure/stress you may be feeling. Family and friends will want to know if you are struggling and from my experience, as a counsellor, they will appreciate you letting them in. The first step is the hardest but once you start the conversation you will feel less alone and instantly begin the process of connection. Communication is key. Whether it is anger, sadness, fear or anxiety talk about it; problems are relative so if it bothers you then it bothers you. Don't fall into the trap of thinking it doesn't matter or other people won't care because this way of thinking only serves to isolate you more. Don't pretend to be ok if you are not ok. This only serves to delay or postpone what you inevitably have to address so consider the benefits of sharing how you feel, as not sharing could have a negative impact on your mental, emotional and physical wellbeing.

Another avenue worth exploring is visiting your GP. Describe to your doctor how you feel and what you are experiencing recently. Discuss your concerns and fears and how others i.e. family or friends, may have noticed a change that concerns them. Again you have begun the process of reaching out. Your doctor can listen and make some suggestions or refer you to other services. They can discuss your support network and request a repeat visit to them so that they can monitor and support you as necessary.

Alternatively, you may consider counselling. This would give you the opportunity to explore your thoughts, feelings and experiences (past or present) in a confidential, non- judgemental, safe setting.

Counselling can provide support, insight and validation. It is a useful space where people can open up and discuss what is on their mind and what is happening within the context of their world. The aim is to feel seen and heard at a time when you may be feeling alone and/or invisible! The developing relationship between you and the counsellor can restore confidence in yourself as well as confidence in others; thoughts can be challenged and feelings can be held. In turn, there can be a sense of empowerment when we become pro-active in our lives and starting the counselling process is a positive indication of this. Acknowledging that we matter, that we are enough and that we need others (either on a personal or professional level) can enable us to face another year with less dread, more hope and more understanding.

FLU VACCINATION INFORMATION

WHAT IS INFLUENZA (FLU)?

Influenza is a highly infectious acute respiratory illness caused by the influenza virus. Influenza affects people of all ages. Outbreaks of influenza occur almost every year, usually in winter. This is why it is also known as seasonal flu.

HOW SERIOUS IS FLU?

Flu is often self limiting with most people recovering in 2-7 days. However, flu can be severe and can cause serious illness and death, especially in the very young and in the elderly. Serious respiratory complications can develop, including pneumonia and bronchitis, to which older people and those with certain chronic medical conditions are particularly susceptible. Pregnant women have also been found to be at increased risk of the complications of flu. Some people may need hospital treatment and a number of mainly older people die from influenza each winter.

HOW DO PEOPLE CATCH FLU?

Flu is a highly infectious illness. A person carrying the virus can spread the illness by coughing or sneezing. A person can spread the virus from 1-2 days before they develop symptoms and for up to a week after symptoms develop.

WHO IS MOST AT RISK FROM FLU?

Anyone can get the flu but it is more severe in people aged 65 years and over and anyone with a chronic medical condition. Chronic medical conditions include chronic heart conditions, chronic respiratory disease, diabetes mellitus and immunosupression due to disease or treatment. Pregnant women have also been found to be at increased risk of the complications of flu. These groups of people are targeted for influenza vaccination. How can Flu be prevented ?

Flu can be prevented by vaccination. Flu vaccine is a safe, effective way to help prevent flu infection, avoiding hospitalisation, reducing flu related deaths and illnesses.

WHAT IS THE SEASONAL (ANNUAL) FLU VACCINE?

Each year the seasonal (annual) flu vaccine contains three common influenza virus strains. The flu virus changes each year, this is why a new flu vaccine has to be given each year.

AFEWIDEASFROMPARENTS FOR RAISING GRATEFUL AND KIND CHILDREN

Children absorb so much of what adults say and do, that we have an opportunity to purposefully do things that we hope will help mould them into a caring and compassionate persons.

• Help develop your child's identity as a caring person. Rather than telling your child "That was a kind thing to do," say, "You're such a kind person."

• Model the behaviour you'd like to see. No matter how much we talk about being kind or the right way to act, children learn by watching the little things we actually do.

• Listen. It's easy for us to tell children they should listen, and then cut them off when they're too chatty. If we want children to be great listeners, make sure we're great listeners.

• Emphasize the importance of being kind. Talk to children about the importance of trying to do something kind and the importance of being happy.

• Discuss acts of kindness that you saw during the day and you will discover your child will begin doing many of the things mentioned in conversation.

• Practice gratitude. Grateful children (and adults) are more likely to be kind and happy. Talking about what you're thankful for can be a daily ritual at dinner, bedtime or in a journal. A fantastic thing about gratitude is that scientific research shows that something as simple as keeping a gratitude journal for a couple minutes a day increases happiness.

thank you note a week. Your child can play a role in choosing recipients. Include the people who are often taken for granted — the bus driver, post person, rubbish collector and others. This helps ensure that a child realises and appreciates what everyone does for him. • When visiting a large town or city try to carry around some extra food to give to homeless people we see around the city. First and foremost, it must be awful to be homeless and I'm sure the food goes a long way. It also sets an example for children – that we shouldn't ignore people in need.

GUN CRAZY AMERICA

In Chicago a mobile phone store owner, defending himself from an armed robber, sprang into action to put a bullet in the chest of an innocent 27-year-old man at the bus stop across the street, and another through the TV set of a nearby family of five. The robber left the scene unharmed, but didn't get away with the money! In other news, with the deer season winding down, the temporary spike in hunting-related accidents looked to be on its way down. By the time November rolled over into December, hunting accidents were steady at nine, up just one from the previous week. But child season is year-round, with another 15 wounded in the week from November 29th to December 5th. Nineteen people also accidentally shot themselves, and five were shot by family members or significant others. Ohio capital of the north, contributed six shooting reports in a row on December 2nd and 3rd. A pizza delivery boy in Michigan was accidentally shot through the wall by a man showing off his gun in the barber shop next door. Two days later, in Toledo, a delivery worker was accidentally shot at a customer's home by a gun knocked off a table by his dog. And a Florida family is grieving after a mother shot and killed her 27-year-old daughter after taking her for an intruder. The woman told police she was asleep in her bed and thought she heard an intruder enter the house, she heard the person quickly approaching her, so she fired a single shot. The daughter died from the gunshot wound. Police are not releasing the names of those involved: The list is practically endless!

SPREAD GOOD NEWS

Pope Francis has asked journalists to shine more light on the good news in the world.

The pontiff doesn't want the world to ignore the suffering of so many people, but he said the good deeds shouldn't be forgotten, either. "How many great gestures of goodness, love and solidarity have filled the days of this year, even if they are not on television news programs" he asked the congregation at his end of year Mass.

The Argentine pope said the media should not keep "so many great gestures of goodness" hidden while only reporting on the evil deeds. "Good always wins, even if sometimes it many seem weaker and hidden." While I am not a journalist I have decided to take the Popes advice and will

try to find almost unknown good news story's to publish, but like the Pope I will not close my eyes to cruelty in any form. No doubt if all the kind acts of people were reported they would outweigh the cruelty in the world – but unfortunately they are not and the best I can try to do is find a balance each week.

GOOD EXAMPLE PAYS OFF

Caleb White began handing out Christmas packages of food and toiletries to the homeless as a 6-year-old, now at age thirteen his efforts have evolved into giving those in need something a little more fun to raise their spirits by hosting monthly game nights in Detroit area shelters with board games for the women and children. Such as those staying in the Detroit Rescue Mission Ministry's Genesis House II, which provides transitional housing and employment and educational services to women and children.

YOGURT CUPS, FOOD WRAPPERS AND A SHOE FOUND IN STOMACH OF DEAD ORCA

Another whale has been found dead with plastic trash filling its stomach. This time, a 5.7-meter (about 18-foot) female orca washed up on Plettenberg Bay in South Africa. After a necropsy was performed on the whale, items such as yogurt cups, the sole of a shoe, food wrappers, seagrass and tubed organisms were found in her stomach. In Taiwan in October a mature sperm whale found dead had vast quantities of plastic bags and fishing nets filling its stomach.

It is clear from news like this that plastic trash and other marine debris have a major impact on aquatic life.

THE PLANET HAS 3 TRILLION TREES, BUT THEY COULD BE GONE IN 300 YEARS

A new review of the world's forests shows that 3 trillion trees cover the planet—meaning there are 422 trees for every person. But before you celebrate, scientists say there would be way more than 3 trillion trees if it weren't for humans. The study estimates that since the invention of the axe, the number of trees has dropped by 46%. Today, people are responsible for the loss of 15 billion trees every year, owing to development and agriculture. With around 5 billion new trees sprouting up annually, that leaves the world with a 10-billion-tree annual deficit. The U.N.'s Plant for the Planet programme has planted 14 billion trees in 193 countries in the past eight years and In the wake of the study, the group called for more "afforestation," which means planting trees where there were none.

Jennifer Connell arrived at the eighth birthday

party of her nephew Sean, who, overjoyed to see her, leapt into her arms. Ms. Connell, apparently not expecting such affection, fell backward and broke her wrist. She decided to sue her 8-year-old nephew for \$127,000 for "negligence and carelessness" because the boy "should have known that a forceful greeting such as the one delivered by the defendant to the plaintiff could cause the harms and losses suffered by the plaintiff."

It seems poor Aunt Jennifer suffered greatly, pointing out that at a party she attended afterward, she was unable to hold her hors d'oeuvre dish without great difficulty. The jury listened to her heart-wrenching story, deliberated for 20 minutes and awarded her nothing. Ms. Connell later said her insurance company had forced her to sue.

HOMELESS FAMILY GIVEN A HOME IN TIME FOR CHRISTMAS BY A POLICEMAN

A Florida mother and her two children were living in their car in Boynton Beach, Florida after the person they were sub-leasing their apartment from stopped paying rent to the landlord. Between working a full time job and getting the children to school on time, sleeping in the Walmart parking lot was their only option left. That's where Officer Craig Hanning found them and when he checked out the family's background, he found the mother had never missed a day of work and her girls had excellent grades. With that news, Mr. Hanning reached out to his contacts in the community. Rallying support at the real estate agency Remax Direct, they not only found the family a place to live, but all 120 agents at the company agreed to contribute money to cover the first and last month's rent and security deposit, and supply some furniture and supplies for the family. The Community Caring Center and Easy Pay Tire also gave money for food and Christmas gifts and tires for the car so she could get to work safely.

"My husband has been a police officer for 18 years," Mr. Hanning's wife said "He has the biggest heart of anyone I have ever met. This is an inspiring reminder of how going above and beyond to help others in their time of need can have a lasting impact," she added.
