





Health Matters...

Acne is a very common treatable condition, not reserved solely for teens. If required, treatment (either topical with creams or oral medication) should be commenced early to avoid scarring. It is more common in boys than girls and can affect the back, face and chest. It can vary from very minor to severe. 8 out of 10 teenagers develop some degree of acne with 3 out of 10 requiring treatment to pervert scarring.

Cause

Small sebaceous glands lie under the skin surface. These make oil (sebum) to keep skin soft and supple, which is expelled onto the skin via our pores. Hair also grows through these. A combination of excess sebum production either by puberty or hormonal disturbances results in these pores becoming blocked. This is aggravated at times by the healthy bacteria that lives on the surface of our skin then infecting these blocked pores.

Types of spots

To select the best treatment you must first assess what type of spots or acne you have. Some unfortunately can have all types together.
Comedones/Comedogenic Acne: Blocked pores that hold old dead skin/sebum result in visible

blackheads or white heads that contain small amounts of thick grease but are not very red/raised

Pustules/Pustular Acne: When inflammation/infection develops in blocked pores these lesions swell with pus resulting in larger spots with overlying red skin which can be tender. In some cases these can become even larger causes nodular or cystic Acne which can be quite painful.

Exacerbating Factors

Picking and squeezing spots can cause further inflammation and scarring. Some medications can worsen Acne eg. Cerazette/Azalia (The progesterone only pill), Phenytoin (an anti epileptic), Steroid creams used for eczema and banned steroid substances (Anabolic steroids). Heavy make up or very poor facial hygiene when removing make up will also exacerbate Acne. Light non oil based make up is not thought to exacerbate Acne.

Treatments

Topical /Treatment applied to the skin

There is a variety of topical antibiotic gels available on prescription that can treat mild Pustular Acne. They have little activity against comedones so many are formulated with a second ingredient to help treat Comedogenic Acne.

Benzyol Peroxide (Acnecide - available over the counter or Duac) reduces inflammation and helps unplug pores. It will bleach sheets and towels. It should not be applied before going to a disco as it glows in neon lights! Apply before going to bed and sleep in older bed clothes. It can cause drying/irritation of the skin.

Retinoids are Vitamin A creams. These work by unplugging pores and may reduce inflammation. When you start using them they often create irritation which should ease with gentle introduction of the gel. You need to use extra sun protection if using topical retinoids. They are strictly contra indicated in pregnancy. The added advantage these creams have is their potent anti aging action which makes them popular in other demographics!

Oral treatments

Long term use (4-6 months minimum) of oral antibiotics can also be used to treat Acne in conjunction with some topical treatments. They have little effect on comedones so you will need to use topical treatment for that but they can be very effective at reducing Pustular Acne. It can take at least 6-8 weeks to notice a significant improvement. Generally if you are over 12 years old with mature teeth there are 3 licenced antibiotics to choose from and 1 unlicenced antibiotic (but it is in widespread use). If you have been taking one anibiotics for 3 months without effect it may be advisable to see you doctor to change to an alternative. With all antibiotics the person must be monitored regularly to ensure there are not developing side effects such as abnormal liver blood tests, low white blood cells or other rashes. These side effects are very rare and usually quite easily

The Combined Oral Contraceptive Pill is also used in females to treat acne. The most potent of these has an extra ingredient which helps block the persons own androgenic (male type hormones) which naturally occur but are thought to exacerbate Acne. The side effects of this medication is possible mood disturbance like all pills or an increased risk of a blood clot in the leg or lung. This is a very rare side effect and very unlikely in a young, non smoker, who has a normal weight. Oral Vitamin A/Roaccutane is reserved for severe Acne. In a female it may only be used in conjunction with the pill to prevent a pregnancy while taking this medication. It is generally only prescribed by Consultants and requires monthly blood tests. It is very effective when required. Lastly, another un-licenced medication is called Spironolactone. This is traditionally used as a water tablet in blood pressure or heart disease but in recent years has shown potential to block the male type hormones in females and so reduce Acne. Again this is typically prescribed by a

Hello Readers and welcome to 2018. I hope you all had a pleasant Christmas and enjoyed the New Year celebrations. I wish you all health and happiness in the months ahead. Please continue to make sure your elderly neighbours and those living alone are keeping well and please keep putting out food for wild life even if the weather is mild and even if you live in the countryside. The natural habitat for birds in particular has been decimated and manicured hedgerows do not provide food. If the weather is frosty please also provide fresh clean water. **LITTLE CHRISTMAS:**

Today is the Eve of the Feast of the Epiphany the world over or Little Christmas as it is also known in Ireland, when I was growing up it was one of the 6 nights of the Christmas Season that the lighted candles were to be seen on the windowsills (the others being Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Eve, New Year's Day and Little Christmas Day itself).

The 6th of January is also known as Nollaig na mBan (Women's Christmas), a day (according to what I have read) when the men did the "women's work" to thank them for the hard work they had to do preparing for Christmas and women used meet up for a chat and a little refreshment - but that did not apply in my area, instead both days really were treated as a Little Christmas with the children of the house being given soft drinks and biscuits and other special treats that in most cases they would not partake in again until the following Christmas. The Feast of the Epiphany is and was a Holyday of Obligation for Catholics and like Sundays at that time was a rest day, with no unnecessary work carried out and after Mass it was a day for visiting or being visited. It was also the end of the Christmas Season and the school holidays but there was often a day or two before the schools reopening so on January 7th all the household helped with the taking down and storing away for another year of the Christmas decorations

In the Scottish Highlands, the name Little Christmas, or Nollaig Bheag in Gaelic, was applied to New Year's Day - which is also known as Là Challuinn, or Là na Bliadhna Ùire, while Epiphany there is known as Là Féill nan Rìgh, the feast-day of the Kings - as it marks a visit to the baby Jesus by The Magi - also widely



referred to as the three Kings, or Wise Men.

A VILLAGE IN THE SWISS ALPS WILL PAY YOU TO LIVE THERE.

The Swiss village of Albinen, near Leukerbad in the canton of Valais, has voted on an initiative that will offer money to non-residents who are willing to live in the village for at least 10 years. These new residents will be paid 25,000 Swiss Francs (about €21,400) per adult and 10,000 Francs (just over €8850) per child.

Residents of the tiny village have been moving away over the last few years, leaving only 240 residents at present and the local school has closed due to families with young children leaving for better employment opportunities.

The village which is located in farmland and forest is guite beautiful and clean and is situated at an altitude of 1.31064 Kilometers (4,300ft) in the south-west of Switzerland overlooking the Rhône valley, has stunning views of its surrounding mountains with pure mountain air. It's less than six Km to Leukerbad, home to one of Europe's largest medical wellness, beauty and thermal baths complex and there are bigger towns close by where you might be fortunate enough to find work.

Other than agreeing to live in the town for a decade, eligible applicants must be aged under 45 and are required to build or purchase a property worth at least 200,000 Swiss Francs (about €170,000), and it will have to be your permanent home, not a second residence.

The money does not have to be repaid, unless you leave the village before the ten year deadline.

Local residents have demanded that the council do something to help reverse the decline and ensure the village's future and the officials hope that Albinen's reduced economy will benefit from the new homeowners through taxes, building contracts and the purchase of local produce and young people will bring life back to the village and the reopening of the school.

DID YOU KNOW?

That on January 5th 1943 George Washington Carver, Educator and scientist, died at the age of 81 at Tuskegee, Alabama? Mr. Carver was born the son of a slave woman in the early 1860s, went to college in Iowa and then headed to Alabama in 1896. There, at the Tuskegee Institute, Mr. Carver served as an agricultural chemist, experimenter, teacher and administrator; working to improve life for African Americans in the rural South by teaching them better agricultural skills. One of the farming methods Mr. Carver devised, using peanut and soybean crops to enrich soil depleted by cotton crops, revolutionised Southern farming in the U.S. He was wellrespected by people such as President Franklin D. Roosevelt, Mahatma Gandhi, Josef Stalin and Thomas Edison, whose offer of a job for more than \$100 a year Mr. Carver refused and he continued working at Tuskegee until his death. **CAN'T AGREE ON A NAME FOR YOUR PET?**

NEW ZEALAND GOVERNMENT PLANS TO PLANT 1 BILLION TREES:

The country's Prime Minister, 37-year-old Jacinda Ardern, signed a coalition agreement in December with the New Zealand First party that addresses several initiatives to be employed by the coming administration.

One of these initiatives is to plant at least 100 million trees in New Zealand every year of the Billion Tree Planting Programme.

While the country currently gets 85% of its electricity from renewable energy sources, the coming administration hopes to become 100% sustainably-powered by 2035 and reduce its greenhouse gas emissions to zero by 2050.

A THIEF MESSED WITH THE WRONG **MOTHER:**

The family of Angie Boliek from Oregon in the US have a yearly tradition for the children to take a photo in Christmas pyjamas. So she went online and ordered some pyjamas for her 4-month-old son, Ben, and anticipated the

She received an email saying the Christmas PJs she had ordered had been delivered, but when she went to look for the package, it was nowhere to be found. It had been stolen right off her porch.

Ms. Boliek was angry and decided to teach thieves a lesson by leaving a not-so-pleasant surprise. She filled a box with 10 to 15 of her son's dirty nappies and left it on the porch with a note saying "Enjoy this you thief!" inside the box. By the next evening, the package was gone.

Ms. Boliek's advice to everyone is to find out in advance if it is the suppliers' policy to insist on a signature when the parcel is delivered, if it's not - shop elsewhere.

DOG WOULDN'T STOP WHINING AND STARING AT PREGNANT WOMAN, SAVED **BOTH MOTHERS AND BABY'S LIVES:**

Akitas are large, huggable dogs. But they are very wary of strangers: they take a while to warm up to new people, but they are incredibly loyal to their family.

"Keola" is the name of this Akita, she lives with 21-year-old Alhanna Butler and her husband, Ricky, in Doncaster, South Yorkshire. They claim that she chose them, and not the other way around, when they went to a breeder to select a pup.

18 weeks into her pregnancy, Ms. Butler started to feel unwell. The doctors sent her home, telling her it was nothing serious. They said her back pain was just because she was small and the pregnancy was taking its toll.

Keola was right by her side, again but this time she also kept crying and staring at Ms. Butler for about an hour and when Ms. Butler posted a photo online her friends all began saying Keola was trying to tell her that something was

Ms. Butler went back to the hospital, and collapsed. She was tended to, and doctors found out both her kidneys were infected and she'd caught an antibiotic-resistant bug. If she hadn't gone back to the hospital, she could have died. Doctors told her she came in at just the right time — she'd contracted an infection the doctors had only seen once before, and they had to make treatments especially for her. She recovered, but it was a close brush with death, and she credits both her and her son's life to the vigilance and sixth sense of Keola. Since little Lincoln was born, he and Keola are inseparable. Ms. Butler says that "In Japan, Akitas are known as 'babysitting' dogs and Keola definitely lives up to this. She is inseparable from him."

PEOPLE SHOULD NOT BE TOO QUICK TO JUDGE OTHERS:

Like any other child, 7-year-old Garrett Coynes loves going to visit Santa every year and when his mother Nancy, took Garrett to the shopping arcade to spend time with Santa, she simply hoped to bring joy to her son.

But when they returned to the car park after their visit, Nancy was appalled by what someone had written on her car. The words "UR



not handicap" were scrawled in red lipstick on the window.

When Garret was three years old, he was diagnosed with Batten's disease. The neurological disease is degenerative, causing him to slowly lose his motor skills. His speech is rapidly declining, he has lost his eyesight, and he now relies on a wheelchair. Tragically, there is no cure or treatment, and the disease often times ends in childhood death.

The Coyne's car was parked in a handicap spot with a legal parking placard displayed, making the rude note even more confusing.

A spokesperson for the shopping arcade where the incident occurred said that they are extremely offended by the situation and are working closely with the police during their investigation, though they all hope that the Graffiti artist did not see the child in the wheelchair or else assumed wrongly that handicap parking areas are for drivers only.

Although the Coyne family were angry at first, they now hope the person simply realises that they did something wrong and can learn from their mistake.

A DINO SWIMMER:

It may have walked like a duck and swum like a penguin, but a flipper-limbed creature discovered in what is now Mongolia was no bird. The strange new species is the first known nonavian dinosaur that could both run and swim, researchers say.

To compensate for a long swanlike neck, probably used for dipping underwater for fish, this dino's centre of mass shifted toward its hips, allowing it to stand erect, similar to short-tailed waterfowl like ducks, scientists added. Along with the flipperlike limbs, those adaptations suggest the animal, dubbed Halszkaraptor escuilliei, probably spent much of its time in the water, say vertebrate paleontologist Andrea Cau of the Geological and Palaeontological Museum in Bologna, Italy, and his colleagues.

To study H. escuilliei in 3-D, and while still partially embedded in rock, the researchers used synchrotron radiation scanning. Zapping the fossil with high-energy X-rays illuminates structures in fine detail without causing damage.

H. escuilliei lived in the Late Cretaceous around 75 million to 71 million years ago and belonged to maniraptora, a diverse line of theropods

that include both nonavian dinosaurs and birds. Although many theropods, such as the tyrannosaurs, were primarily meat eaters, H. escuilliei's jaw, nose and number of teeth suggest it preferred fish.

PEOPLE SAID NO TO SOCIAL CLEANSING IN **STOKE-ON-TRENT:**

Over 300,000 people in Great Britain and Northern Ireland are homeless. That's the equivalent of one in every 200 residents. And the number with no place to call home is increasing.

You might expect local authorities to take action and help people whose lives are in crisis, but instead the council for Stoke-on-Trent, a city in the centre of England, came up with the idea of fining people living on the streets £100, using a law known as Public Space Protection Orders (PSPOs).

This would increase to £1000 (around €1130) for those who are unable to pay the fine and end up in court.

When Christian Garland found out what Stoke-on-Trent was proposing to deal with the "homeless problem," he jumped into action and created a Care2 petition demanding "No PSPOs to criminalize homelessness in Stoke, no to social cleansing."

"The sick absurdity of criminalising people who are in crisis and adding to it further by imposing fines they can't pay, is seemingly lost on Stoke-on-Trent council, which is proposing the punitive use of PSPOs in the city centre, Hanley park, Festival park and Octagon retail park," Mr. Garland wrote in his petition.

Within just 48 hours, the petition had gathered over 15,000 signatures from Care2 members dismayed and angry at such an inhuman proposal.

It didn't take long for the city council to take notice of the public outcry against the idea of imposing a fine on people for being homeless. Here's what Mr. Garland posted on his petition: "Victory. Stoke-on-Trent dropped the proposal - this petition of now 15,743 signatures contributing to that without doubt. The council confirmed that the fine element had been removed due to the 'strength of response' and added: 'We got it wrong. This option should not have been included."



CHRISTMAS - SOME PRACTICAL

The New Year brings with thew expectations and experiences for everyone. It can be a time of excitement and fresh starts and yet feel one of the most difficult times also. Many people report feeling down, a little fatigued and more hopeless. There can be a sense of deflation after all the festivities of Christmas and with that anti-climax low mood and, in some cases, isolation can occur. The temptation may be to give in a little and retire from the world but the opposite is more helpful. Engaging in moderate physical exercise, eating a balanced diet and staying connected to others can prohibit a low mood from getting increasingly worse. Of course we all have off days or lazy days whereby we need to rest more and retreat but if you notice that you are experiencing ongoing low mood and change in behaviour that affects your quality of life and/or relationships then you may have to reach out for help.

A good place to start is family or friends, someone you already know and trust. They know you already and know your life experiences and how much you have been through so chatting to them about how you feel can alleviate the pressure/stress you may be feeling. Family and friends will want to know if you are struggling and from my experience, as a counsellor, they will appreciate you letting them in. The first step is the hardest but once you start the conversation you will feel less alone and instantly begin the process of connection. Communication is key. Whether it is anger, sadness, fear or anxiety talk about it; problems are relative so if it bothers you then it bothers you. Don't fall into the trap of thinking it doesn't matter or other people won't care because this way of thinking only serves to isolate you more. Don't pretend to be ok if you are not ok. This only serves to delay or postpone what you inevitably have to address so consider the benefits of sharing how you feel, as not sharing could have a negative impact on your mental, emotional and physical wellbeing.

Another avenue worth exploring is visiting your GP. Describe to your doctor how you feel and what you are experiencing recently. Discuss your concerns and fears and how others i.e. family or friends, may have noticed a change that concerns them. Again you have begun the process of reaching out. Your doctor can listen and make some suggestions or refer you to other services. They can discuss your support network and request a repeat visit to them so that they can monitor and support you as necessary.

Alternatively, you may consider counselling. This would give you the opportunity to explore your thoughts, feelings and experiences (past or present) in a confidential, non-judgemental, safe setting.

Counselling can provide support, insight and validation. It is a useful space where people can open up and discuss what is on their mind and what is happening within the context of their world. The aim is to feel seen and heard at a time when you may be feeling alone and/or invisible! The developing relationship between you and the counsellor can restore confidence in yourself as well as confidence in others; thoughts can be challenged and feelings can be held. In turn, there can be a sense of empowerment when we become pro-active in our lives and starting the counselling process is a positive indication of this. Acknowledging that we matter, that we are enough and that we need others (either on a personal or professional level) can enable us to face another year with less dread, more hope and more understanding.

Know Your Rights: **CONSUMER RIGHTS DURING SALES**

OUESTION

What are my consumer rights when I buy something in the sales? Can I return sales items?

ANSWER

Your consumer rights during a sale are exactly the same as at any other time of the year. Your rights do not change just because you bought the item in a sale.

Goods should be of merchantable quality, fit for their intended purpose and as described. If they are not, you are entitled to a repair, a replacement or a refund.

If there is a fault with goods that you bought at full price and are now on sale at a reduced price, you are entitled to a refund of the full price (if the shop is willing to offer a refund).

Shop notices such as "No Refunds" or "No Exchanges" do not limit your rights, if you have a complaint about faulty

However, you are not entitled to a refund because you change your mind about something you have bought in a shop, whether this is during the sales or at any other time of the year. Many shops do allow you to exchange goods that you have had second thoughts about, but this is at their discretion. It is a good idea to check the shop's refund policy before buying anything.

You should always keep your receipts as proof of purchase and the price paid. This does not necessarily have to be the shop receipt. You could show your credit or debit card statement if you used one or any other documentation that proves it was purchased.

MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE 2018

The Minimum Wage in Ireland will be increasing on January 1st 2018.

The Low Pay Commission recommended in June this year, that the National Minimum Wage for an experienced adult worker should increase to €9.55 per hour.

These are the rates of the Minimum Wage that will apply from January 2018

- Experienced adult worker €9.55 per hour
- Over 19 and less than 2 years since first job €8.60 per hour.
- Over 18 and less than 1 years since began first job €7.64 per hour.
- Aged under 18 €6.69 per hour

An experienced adult worker – for the purposes of the National Minimum Wage Act is an employee who has an employment of any kind in any 2 years over the age

Exceptions to those entitled to receive the national minimum wage

There are some exceptions to those entitled to receive the national minimum wage. The legislation does not apply to a person employed by a close relative (for example, a spouse, civil partner or parent) nor does it apply to those in statutory apprenticeships. Also some employees such as young people under 18 and trainees are only guaranteed a reduced or sub-minimum rate of the national minimum





Between now and the summertime there is still plenty of time to put a bit of colour in the garden with some winter/spring flowering bedding plants.

It is probably best this Spring, to use them in containers and baskets as the ground is saturated from the amount of rainfall we have experienced.

The first thing you have to do is choose the type of container you want. There are lots to choose from i.e. terracotta, glazed, plastic and wooden. Now that you have chosen a pot, the first and most important thing to do is sort out the drainage. All terracotta and glazed pots should already have drainage holes in them. Plastic ones probably won't so you will have to punch some holes in them. Next you need to put some gravel or aeroboard broken up over the holes on the inside of the pot and then cover with some landscape fabric i.e. mypex.

Now its time to add some compost and ideally some slow release fertilizer mixed with it. Then choose some plants... First of all you need to choose a centre piece and always make sure that centre piece is evergreen and suitable for the size of your container. This way you will only have to change the bedding plants from season to season. Here is a list of a few good winter spring bedding plants for containers, primroses polyanthus, winter pansies, cyclamen, ornamental cabbages and trailing


