

The second half was a bit slow to get going but on 36 minutes, McGuigan found the net with a great dummy. This was the first time the Sem had been in a situation like this and all the doubters were about to have their questions answered. David Shaw kicked a much needed score with his left leg and the Sem were starting to take over. Then came a huge turning point. Conor Glas, St. Pats captain was shown a straight red card by referee, David Gough for an off the ball incident with 16 minutes remaining. The Sem then kicked probably the point of the game. Billy Courtney rose highest around the middle and knocked it down to Lee O'Donoghue, who picked out Evan Cronin, who in turn slipped it off to the on rushing Clifford and he kicked a fantastic score with his so called weaker right leg. David Clifford added another great score from an extremely tight angle to level things up with just 6 minutes left to play. Daniel O'Brien, then saw red for another off the ball incident but St. Brendans didn't look back. Moynihan kicked a great score, which was cancelled out 30 seconds later the St. Pats midfielder. David

Clifford found the net 3 minutes from time to give the Sem a 3 point lead. It all started with a fantastic turnover by David Naughton, he found Cronin, who beat his man and passed across to Clifford and he slid along the surface to palm into the net. Four minutes of added time was played and with only two remaining David Shaw was awarded a free near the sideline. He looked up and saw David Clifford one vs one inside. Once Clifford got the ball in hand the full back was in trouble. Clifford beat his man with ease and absolutely riffled it into the top right hand corner. It was a sensational goal and even the Gooch himself would have been proud of that one. That goal gave the Sem a six point cushion and brought David Cliffords tally to 2-5. Dara Moynihan capped off a superb performance with his fourth point of the afternoon with the last kick of the game, leaving the Sem victorious on a scoreline of 2-13 to 2-6.

The Sem showed great grit and determination to win the game and all the hard work throughout the year paid off. It was a phenominal achievement by a special group of players.

We were constant. We were loud. We were celebrating

one of the greatest days in St. Brendan's history. "Shoes Off For The Boys In Green" will stay in the memory of those who were there, not to mind the continuous performance of "Seminary, Victory". The Sem Team were so good we were never silent for long. The bodhráns rang out about the stadium as we roared and cheered. The deafening noise as David Clifford scored his second goal of the game would send shockwaves through anyone, not to mind the celebrations at the final whistle. We had come to Croker, and we had conquered. The bus back home was guiet. Voices were gone. Fatigue was setting in. But our heads were a whirlwind of great things. St. Brendan's voyage made memories that will last a lifetime.


SPA SCORE WINNERS



Kerry has seen a sharp increase in the number of people availing of local services for mental health wellbeing, according to the South West Counselling Centre in Killarney.

The centre which provides outreach services in the community including low cost counselling, talks, workshops and programmes in local schools, community groups, clubs and organisations, revealed at its AGM that it had provided support to over 2,400 clients in Kerry in 2015, an increase of 26% on the previous year. The demand for services provided by SWCC continues to grow with an alarming increase in client numbers of over 90% in the last 4 years. "Funding continues to be a constant struggle with the need for ongoing fundraising paramount in sustaining and developing services for individuals in need" the Centre's Business Manager, Nikki Wissell told the Killarney Outlook. "We receive no Government funding for our Kerry Lifeline Service and we remain indebted to the local community, our fundraisers, supporters and friends of SWCC who contribute time, expertise and money in supporting us, she added"

The annual AGM meeting for SouthWest Counselling Centre was held at the end of March at the Centre's premises in Lewis Road, Killarney. Addressing the meeting Tim O'Leary SWCC Chairperson, said that 2015 had been an important and successful year in the life of SouthWest Counselling Centre which is now into its third decade of existence. He thanked the staff of SWCC who continue to provide a service at the highest level and also thanked the Board of Management who give their time voluntarily with the goal of supporting the Centre in the best possible way to provide the service that it does. Director's Anthony Garvey, Mairead O'Sullivan and Clotilda O'Keefe-Lyons were re-elected to the Board

MICK WALSH RIP

A TRIBUTE FROM FOSSA GAA CLUB

It was a moment of great sadness for all of us, friends of Mick Walsh from Fossa, when we heard of his sudden passing on the morning of Palm Sunday March 20th 2016. He was a fixture at every game Fossa played over the past 46 years, knew every player by name, and it was a fitting tribute that such a large number of these, formed the Guard of Honour at his removal to Fossa Church on the Tuesday evening.

Mick was born on a farm at Knockalougha Duagh in April 1927, so he was just a month from his 89th birthday. One of eleven, raised on the family farm, Mick emigrated to England in the mid-1940s, and he worked at various jobs, culminating in a job as a welder at a car manufacturing plant in Birmingham where he worked for many years. While there he played his beloved Gaelic football, and he captained his team to victory over Coventry in 1949. Before emigrating Mick played with Knocknagoshel the parish of the love of his life Dora O'Connor, where among his team mates was the great Eddie Walsh (no relation), who remained a friend all his life. Mick, Dora, and three sons Liam Philip and Michael returned to Ireland in the early 1960s where he first worked as a welder at the Mallow Sugar Beet factory. In 1964 he started working at Liebherr Ireland Ltd as a welder, and remained there until his retirement in April 1992. He always praised the Liebherr family for their commitment to Fossa and Killarney and to their employees. He bought a house and some land from the late Sean O'Connor the artist, and he had lived there since. He regaled us, the young lads of Fossa, with tales of the Kerry team of the 1940s, and stories related to him of the great four in a row team of 1929 to 1932. Who was better Barrett or Keohane, he'd ask, and then he'd answer his own question by quoting his fellow emigrant Brendan Reidy who played in goal behind both of them " Barrett was the best". From what he heard Jackie Ryan was the best forward Kerry ever had, and this was the nick name he put on our young David Clifford a number of years ago. Indeed at the time of his death Mick was looking forward to watching David line out for the Sem in Croke Park in the Hogan Cup final on April 2nd. His first meeting with his great friend Mick Myers was in Hussey's bar after the 1968 O'Donoghue Cup Final. "Were you above at the match" Walsh asked. "I was playing in it" said Myers, " the Crokes beat us". "The Crokes didn't beat ye, Tom Long beat ye" said Walsh. Tom had scored 2-01 that day. Mick was always looking forward. He took particular interest in the minors and under 21s. Our most recent conversations were about the

games against Tipperary and Limerick, "When is Mark O'Connor coming back "he'd enquire. "Barry O'Sullivan seems like a great prospect" A few Christmases ago John Rice brought Jacko Shea to the Nugget where he was introduced to Mick. Who were the two best midfielders you've seen playing for Kerry, Mick was asked. "Paddy Kennedy and Mick O'Connell" he replied without hesitation, "but you weren't too bad yourself either Jacko". As well as football he had many other interests, the gun club, the greyhounds, the politics, and he was a keen follower of horses. He visited Killarney most days where he visited Donie and Liam Sheehan, Donal Culloty and Cathal O'Grady among many others to "hop a few balls" Every Sunday night he eventually made his way to the back table in the Nugget, having chatted his way through the bar, and then the banter would really start. Mick told it as he saw it, and we loved him for that.

To his beloved wife Dora, his sons Liam, Philip, Michael, Patrick, and Donal, grandchildren Brian, Colm, Danielle, and Michelle, and his daughters in law, we express our deepest sympathy. Ar dheis De go raibh a Anam,







NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE DIVISION 1 KERRY WIN EARNS SEMI-FINAL SPOT AND RELEGATES REBELS

KERRY O'SHEA REPORTS ON KERRY'S VICTORY IN AUSTIN STACK PARK ON SUNDAY.

KERRY 0-20 CORK 1-12

It was a good day all around for Kerry supporters, a win over Cork in front of 8,327 patrons at Austin Stack Park, that ensured a League Semifinal spot and a result that ended Cork's term in top flight, leaving Kerry and Dublin as the only 2 counties in Division 1 of both the Football and Hurling Leagues.

Cork came to Tralee knowing that a win would preserve their Division 1 status but in the end it was not to be, their scoring difference coupled with other results earlier in the campaign militated against them.

The Rebels weren't helped by the fact that they had to make three late changes to their starting line-up, with Tom Clancy, Ruaidhri Deane and Brian Hurley replacing Jamie O'Sullivan, Daniel Goulding and Luke Connolly respectively

Kerry were also keen to arrest a two-game losing streak in the league at the expense of the Rebels and thus regain local bragging rights over their great Munster rivals.

Referee David Gough didn't endear himself to fans, with a number of questionable decisions including the first-half penalty awarded against the home side when Peter Crowley was black-carded for pulling down midfielder lan Maguire and thus giving Cork who were clearly struggling at the time, a major boost right on the stroke of half-time.

Gough dismissed Cork's Michael Shields in the 60th minute for a high challenge on Mikey Geaney (who received a black card late in the game), while Kerry's skipper Killian Young, Kieran Donaghy, Colm Cooper, Marc O'Se and Shane Enright also incurred Mr Gough's wrath over the 70 minutes.

Both sides adapted a cautious approach in the early stages of the game and traded four points inside the opening seven minutes, Donnchadh Walsh and Alan Fitzerald for the home side in

most cases, a fixed charge notice setting out the fine payable will then be issued, and you have the option of paying the fixed charge or allowing the matter to proceed to court.

A person has 28 days from the date the fixed charge notice is issued to pay. Anyone who pays in the subsequent 28 days pays that amount plus 50%. Court proceedings are initiated if a fixed charge is not paid within this 56-day period.

Most penalty point offences also attract fixed charges, but a small number of offences result in automatic summons to court without the option of paying a fixed charge.

Where an offence is detected by camera, the fixed-charge notice will be sent to the registered owner. The Road Traffic Act provides that unless another person is identified as the driver it will be assumed that the registered owner was driving the vehicle at the time of the occurrence of the alleged offence.

There is an explicit requirement that where the registered owner of a vehicle was not driving or using the vehicle he or she must give the name and contact details of the driver of the vehicle. No payment should be enclosed.

When this information is received, the fixed charge notice will be issued to the named driver, on whose licence record the points will be endorsed, either on payment of a fixed charge or a court conviction.

CANCELLING PENALTY POINTS

If you believe there are grounds for cancelling a fixed charge notice or prosecution because of exceptional circumstances there is a formal process in place for reviewing such cases. This review is undertaken by An Garda Síochana and further information can be found at www.garda.ie.

WHAT LICENCES DO PENALTY POINTS **APPLY TO?**

Penalty points apply to all driving licences and learner permits.

disqualification commencing. It is an offence not to surrender a licence. It is also an offence to drive while disgualified. Penalty points are designed to encourage safe driving and reduce casualties on our roads. This

How long will the penalty points stay on my licence record for?

Penalty points remain on the licence record for a period of three years. The three years will not include any period where your licence is out of date or where you are disgualified from driving because of another offence. If your driving licence is out of date, the points will only apply from whenever you renew your licence.

Penalty points do not physically appear on the licence. Instead, your points are recorded on your driving licence record. These records are held on the National Vehicle and Driver file operated by the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport.

If you have committed a driving offence that incurs penalty points you will receive a written notification informing you that points are being added to your driving licence record. This notice will include details of your name, address, date time and location of the driving offence concerned. It will also confirm that you either paid the fixed charge for the offence or were convicted in the court of such offence. The notice will also contain a date on which the notice was issued to you. This is the important date as the points will only be added to your licence record 28 days after this date.

WHY DO PENALTY POINTS NOT TAKE **EFFECT FROM THE DATE OF THE OFFENCE?** Penalty points do not take effect from the date of the offence because:


The points can only be applied after you pay a fixed charge or after you are found guilty of the offence:

A licence holder is disqualified from driving 28 days after a written notice has issued and not immediately as otherwise it would be possible that you would be driving while disqualified without knowledge of the disqualification - for example, where you already have 10 points and commit an offence caught by camera.

PAYMENT OF FIXED CHARGES

Offences can be detected by Garda interception or, in the case of speeding offences, by speed cameras.

Where a Garda interception takes place you must show your driving licence to the Garda

SELF-ACCEPTANCE II



Last week we highlighted our tendency to be self-critical and extremely hard on ourselves. Self-acceptance on the other hand means accepting ourselves just as we are whilst acknowledging that there is always room for improvement. This can be very difficult however and requires a change in how we

view and what we tell ourselves. By developing a 'self-accepting' voice we focus on validating ourselves rather than paying heed to the automatic negative thoughts. Instead of listening to the thought that says 'I'm not good enough' or 'I'll never get it right' we validate ourselves (much as a parent might a child) saying something like 'I know your feeling useless right now. It's Ok. This is challenging and difficult and frustrating. But you are capable. How about taking a break and coming back to it later" Despite the feelings of guilt, self-criticism and negative put downs, we can start by telling ourselves, that we've done the best we could do.

We need to look at what is it within ourselves that we don't accept – and begin to bring more compassion and understanding to those aspects of ourselves. Perhaps there is a part of us that we are rejecting based on the internal programming (and not the actual reality) that we received as a child. Sometimes our lack of self-acceptance is due to our unwillingness to feel or experience uncomfortable emotions. At other times unrealistic expectations can lead to lack of self-acceptance. When we are unable to forgive ourselves for our 'humanness' then it is very difficult to develop self-acceptance.

Practicing mindfulness can be a great way to begin to become aware of the negative, self-judging thoughts we continuously tell ourselves. It becomes like watching a movie – where you are having these thoughts but these thoughts are not who you are.

Self-acceptance isn't about fixing anything in ourselves. Instead it is affirming who we are (warts and all) at this point in time. It's not that we ignore our faults or weaknesses – we just view them as not relevant to our overall sense of acceptability. We accept ourselves today, just as we are, regardless of our shortcomings. Whilst we can commit to make changes in the future that will enrich our lives - it's about being Okay right now. The only thing we need to change at this moment in time is the way we view ourselves.

FARM -INCOME AVERAGING



The Finance Act 2014 increased the averaging of farm profits from three years to five years for year 2015 and onwards.

This means that an unusual high profit in a year could be reduced by adding it to the profit of the 4 previous years and taking an average profit figures for the five years.

A farmer in obliged to remain in the system for a minimum of five years and thereafter opting out may result in the benefit that was gained being clawed back.

Farmers are not eligible for Income Averaging where he/she or their spouse is engaged in another self-employed trade or profession or are a proprietary director. However where the self-employed activity is ancillary to the trade of farming, and is carried on by the individual on the farm land, this restriction does not apply.



FOG HARVESTING IN THE MOROCCAN DESERT

Moroccan NGO Dar Si Hamad has built the world's largest fog harvester, which provides water for those living in arid, landlocked southwest Morocco.

The people of the Aït Baâmrane region lack reliable access to water so they constantly battle drought and tainted wells – but fog is abundant in their area six months out of the year. Dar Si Hamad utilized CloudFisher technology to install giant polymer nets between steel poles of the 600 square meters (nearly 2,000 feet), installation in the Anti-Atlas mountain range. Mountain fog is denser than coastal fog, and provides more water. The collected water is sent to locals via solar pumps and pipes installed by the NGO in partnership with other organisations, foundations, and universities. The fog harvester can produce 17 gallons

per square yard of net, and it's already making a difference for people affected by desertification caused by climate change. Over 400 people who never before had running water now benefit from the system.

Up to now local people used to have to spend around three and a half hours collecting water, and as the job was the responsibility of women, girls were often prevented from continuing their schooling to help with the chore. Now, women continue to manage their family's water system by sending mobile phone messages if anything is wrong, and girls don't have to stop going to school because they have to collect water.

Fog harvesting is a centuries-old technique which, thanks to developing technology, is now more efficient and productive than ever before.

THE IRISH SLAVE TRADE

(CONTINUED FROM LAST WEEK):

By the 1630's, Ireland was the primary source of the English slave trade... and then Cromwell came:

After Oliver Cromwell defeated the royalists in the English Civil War, he turned to Ireland, who had allied themselves with the defeated royalists. What happened next could be considered genocide.

The famine (caused by the English intentionally destroying food stocks) and plague that followed Cromwell's massacres reduced the population of Ireland to around 40%.

IT IS NOW THE LAW TO HAVE YOUR DOG MICROCHIPPED

Dogs must at all times wear a collar that bears the name and the address of the owner inscribed on it or on a plate, badge or disc. Though it is essential that you abide by this law, you cannot guarantee that a collar alone will ensure you and your pet will be reunited, because collars can come off.

All dogs in the Republic of Ireland must be microchipped and registered under new regulations which came into force on Friday, 1st April.

The requirement is that every dog in the State must be microchipped and that chip must be registered on a recognised database.

It will also be illegal to pass a dog to another person, even if there is no payment, without the dog being microchipped.

Microchipping your pet is a hallmark of responsible pet ownership. Not only is microchipping quick, and harmless, it is one of the best ways to ensure that you and your beloved companion can be reunited, should you ever become separated.

Microchipping is a harmless procedure that takes seconds and is similar to giving your pet an injection. A microchip is similar in size to a grain of rice, and is implanted in the back of your pet's neck with a small needle. Microchipping takes seconds and will only cause your pet to feel a second of shock (much like us getting our ears pierced), and many cats and dogs tolerate it incredibly well. The microchip contains a unique number that comes up when your pet is scanned with a

MARGARET'S RAMBLINGS

Anyone implicated in the rebellion had their land confiscated and was sold into slavery in the West Indies. Even catholic landowners who hadn't taken part of the rebellion had their land confiscated.

Catholicism was outlawed and catholic priests were executed when found, he ordered the ethnic cleansing of Ireland east of the Shannon in 1652. Soldiers were encouraged to kill any Irish who refused to relocate.

During the 1650s, over 100,000 Irish children between the ages of 10 and 14 were taken from their parents and sold as slaves in the West Indies, Virginia and New England. In this decade, 52,000 Irish (mostly women and children) were sold to Barbados and Virginia. Another 30,000 Irish men and women were also transported and sold to the highest bidder. In 1656, Cromwell ordered that 2000 Irish children be taken to Jamaica and sold as slaves to English settlers.

If a planter whipped or branded or beat an Irish slave to death, it was never a crime. A death was a monetary setback. The English masters quickly began breeding the Irish women for both their own personal pleasure and for greater profit. Children of slaves were themselves slaves, which increased the size of the master's free workforce.

The African slave trade was just beginning during this same period but African Negroes cost generally about 20 to 50 pounds Sterling, compared to 900 pounds of cotton (about 5 pounds Sterling) for an Irish slave. (Continued next week).

CAT ALERTS FAMILY TO ATTIC FIRE

A cat in Cedar Falls lowa is being hailed a hero after she alerted her family to an undetected attic fire. Travis Ryan was at home when his little white cat Emma began acting strangely. Mr. Ryan said Emma was running around in circles and meowing, which concerned him.

He thought she was hungry at first so he checked her food bowl, which was full. Then, he followed Emma to the bedroom, where he smelled smoke and heard a crackling sound in the ceiling. He put his hand up to the ceiling and felt heat.

Mr. Ryan and his family escaped the building with their heroine and the family's other cat and called the Fire Department.

The firefighters had to rip open the ceiling where they discovered what they believe to be an electrical fire in the attic. Although the building had smoke detectors they hadn't gone off so who knows what might have happened to those living in the apartment building if Emma hadn't saved the day!

EVER HEARD OF A STAVE CHURCH?

Some of the most stunning churches in the world are also some of the simplest. Stave churches are wooden houses of worship that combine the austere, peaked architecture of Christianity with the Nordic designs and motifs of a Viking great hall.

Stave churches are characterised by the "staves," or thick wooden posts, that hold

them up. Using the same woodworking prowess that made the Vikings such adept shipbuilders, traditional stave churches were often built using nothing more that expertly crafted joints and joins, with no nails or glue. The only stones used were in the base of the structures.

The heyday of the stave church was between the 12th and 14th centuries. At the height of the trend, it is thought that were as many as 2,000 of them spread across Europe. Today there are only 28 remaining stave churches from this era, all of which are in Norway.

Other stave churches built much later or as replicas of the originals, can be found from lceland to Wisconsin.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE FOUNTAIN PEN

From burning sticks and drawing on cave walls to the Gooses quill and the ballpoint pens that we use today, there have been many innovations in writing tools through the ages. Fountain pens have been around since the 1700s, but the first "practical" fountain pen was patented in 1884 by Lewis Edson Waterman.

Mr. Waterman created his pen to combat the fast-leaking fountain pens that were on the market at the time. His patents included improvements on the ink flow using a piece of hard rubber to hold the nib in place and were so successful he was able to build a company around them. The technology grew from there as other inventors improved on Mr. Waterman's design.

A common way that fountain pens retain their ink is through the use of a piston. You take the nib of the pen, submerge it in the ink, retract the plunger and wait until the reservoir fills with ink.

Writing with a fountain pen happens when ink is slowly pulled out of a small reservoir in the barrel of the pen. The ink is pulled through to the pen's "nib" using capillary action. Inside the pen, between the nib and the ink reservoir, are a series of channels that are so small, the ink doesn't flow through them; it slowly adheres to the entire surface of these channels. This movement pulls the ink through the pen at a controlled rate.

With the sale of fountain pens on the rise, it looks like they could be making a comeback!

WILL THE USE OF PEPPERMINT NOW BE BANNED IN THE OLYMPICS?

Researchers measured the effects of peppermint on exercise performance before and after ten days of having subjects drink bottles of water with a single drop of peppermint essential oil in them. And all the subjects' performance parameters shot up, churning out 50% more work, 20% more power, and a 25% greater time to exhaustion. Improvements were found across the board in all those physiological parameters, indicating increased respiratory efficiency.

They attribute these remarkable results to the peppermint opening up their airways, increasing ventilation and oxygen delivery. Be warned - you can overdose on the stuff, but a few drops shouldn't be toxic. Although, it's ideal to blend fresh mint leaves in water rather than use the oil.

ALL THE FOOD STOLEN FROM ANIMAL CHARITY

On Sunday March 20th, staff members at the Animal Rescue League of New Hampshire walked into the pet food storage shed to find it completely empty.

About 65 bags of dry dog and cat food-which was about \$700 worth-had been taken. This wiped out the shelter's food pantry, which helps dog and cat owners who are elderly or struggling financially to feed their pets.

With police on the case, the shelter issued a press release on Facebook and Twitter, asking for donations to replace the stolen goods; and little did they know how much support they would receive.

It wasn't long before people came pouring in, offering bags of pet food and treats.

"The community response was amazing. It was a steady stream of everything — from toddlers carrying little bags of cat treats to families who had picked up full bags of pet food," said a staff member.

There was so much food, that the rescue shared the donations with neighbouring animal welfare organisations.

And better still: because of all the visitors they received most of the animals at their shelter have been adopted!

SURELY THAT IS NOT THE WAY TO SAVE THE ENVIRONMENT?


A nearly century-old, but perfectly healthy, beloved Hickory Tree in West Rock Ridge State Park, Connecticut was chopped down by two workers with the state Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) on February 2nd.

A spokesperson for DEEP said "state parks and wildlife staff had determined the approximately 10-acre field is "well-suited to the growth of meadow grasses and flowers that would attract a wide variety of songbirds, small animal species and pollinators, and that there was great value in creating this type of ecosystem in this part of the state. The presence of the hickory tree was viewed as working in opposition to those goals."

Another spokesperson explained that "DEEP believed the tree posed a threat on two fronts: as a central vantage perch for predator species such as hawks, and as an "attractive nuisance" that lured people and sometimes their dogs across the meadow.

Now the local residents who are very angry over the cutting down of the lone Hickory Tree are just hoping that DEEP personnel do not decide to cut down the tall trees on the outskirts of the meadow just in case the birds of prey will take up advantage points amongst them.
