More than 2700 rowers will descent on the picturesque village of Waterville, which lies on the Iveragh Peninsula, 530 crews each competing for a medal and a trophy, in the most coveted of Rowing Championships. The Kerry Coastal Rowing Association will be hosting the championship event. There are over 20 coastal rowing clubs, involved in the mammoth task of organising a fantastic programme of rowing and entertainment during the weekend. A total of 25 categories of rowing from the Under 12s crews to Master/ Veteran crews.

Speaking about the event, well known event PRO and Organiser Mary B Teahan, said "This regatta is the biggest regatta in the country and promises to be full of passion, pride and fantastic competition, where the best in the country will come to take on the might of each other. 





LEAVING CERTIFICATE RESULTS WILL BE AVAILABLE ON WEDNESDAY

The keenly awaited Leaving Certificate Examinations results will be issued by the State Examinations Commission (SEC) next Wednesday and will, hopefully, contain good news for all concerned. Assuming that your results go according to plan, you will be in the mood to celebrate your achievement and to enjoy the moment. But remember that there are tasks to be undertaken and loose ends to be tied up before you progress



to the next stage of the exciting journey through life. Stay focussed during the next few weeks and keep an eye on the important dates and deadlines. Leaving Cert results will be available early in schools on Wednesday morning and, from 12 noon, online at www. examinations.ie and by telephone at 1530716016. If you wish to view one or more of your marked Leaving Cert Exam scripts return your completed application form to your school by Tuesday, 19th August. The viewing of marked scripts will be held on Friday/Saturday, 29th/30th August. The closing date for receipt by the SEC of Leaving Cert appeal applications is Wednesday, 3rd September. The appeal fee is \notin 40 (LC) or \notin 15.50 (LCA) per subject. Results of Leaving Cert subject appeals will be released in mid-October. CAO Round One offers and points requirements will be available at www.cao.ie from 6am on Monday, 18th August. CAO Round One offers and points requirements will be available at www.cao.ie from 6am on Thursday, 28th August. CAO Round Two offers may be accepted up to 5.15pm on Wednesday, 3rd September. Thereafter, offers will be available at seven and the available at www.cao.ie from 6am on Thursday, 28th August. CAO Round Two offers may be accepted up to 5.15pm on Wednesday, 3rd September. Thereafter, offers will be issued as necessary until October to fill any vacancies which may arise.

Interviews for Post Leaving Cert (PLC) courses, which are practical and vocational in orientation, take place in the period after the Leaving Cert results are released. If you haven't applied for a PLC course and would like to do so, contact the colleges of your choice. There may be vacancies on a variety of PLC courses. The majority of PLC courses are offered at Level 5. A number are offered at Level 6 and the entire list of PLC courses can be found on www.qualifax.ie. If you are interested in undertaking an apprenticeship in a trade or a training course, register at your local Solas (formerly FAS) Training Centre if you have not already done so. Check the Solas website, www.solas.ie, for further information.

If a career in agriculture and horticulture appeals to you, then make contact with Teagasc, which provides a variety of courses in the agricultural and horticultural areas. The agri-food industry is the fastest growing sector of the Irish economy and offers excellent career prospects at all levels. Teagasc website address is www.teagasc.ie.

If you are interested in a career at the craft level of work in the Hotel and Catering Industry make contact with Failte Ireland if you have not done so already. Many Failte Ireland craft courses are in the CAO application system. However they may not all fill and they also have a range of other training courses to suit a variety of circumstances. Keep an eye as well on the CAO website, www.cao.ie, for vacant places. Failte Ireland website address is www.fáilteireland.ie.

An increasing number of young people are taking a year out after the Leaving Cert to gain work experience or to travel. Many Irish students are very young when they enrol in further education. A year out is a maturing experience and allows an extra year to make the transition from second level education. In addition, colleges usually accommodate students who wish to defer taking up the offer of a course for one year.

If you feel that your results didn't do you justice, it is worth considering a return to school to repeat the examination. Most repeat students significantly increase their points. A more competitive result in the Leaving Cert Exam might be in your best interests in the long run. So, even though you'll feel a sense of relief when the waiting is over and the precious Leaving Cert results are in your hand, don't take your eye off the ball. Be aware of closing dates, carefully read your correspondence and take the appropriate steps to allow a trouble free passage on your education journey. Good luck to all candidates who will be getting Leaving Cert exam results on Wednesday. Bonne chance!

PERSONAL BARRIERS TO SUCCESS

Frequently we sabotage ourselves by feeling that we don't deserve success or happiness. Fear of failure can prevent us from moving towards a desired goal. However, this is often to do with our sense of not being enough – more than loss of money or time or reputation. If you have a fear of failure you may be holding some negative belief about yourself which is repressing you. To understand what your barrier may be, fill in the following blank for yourself: "If I try and don't succeed, everyone will know I'm".

Another helpful way to identify our blocks to success is to write down, without censoring, the specific thoughts and feelings you have that hold you back. This will help you to identify child-like or vulnerable feelings that may be unconsciously controlling your behaviour. In the same way that a parent might reassure (and not ridicule) a scared child, learn to parent yourself – and assure the vulnerable part of you that you'll take charge and that you have their back.

Perfectionism can hinder our success, leading us to focus more on avoiding failure than accomplishing our goals. Begin to see mistakes as opportunities for learning and not reasons to beat yourself up about something. If you don't get the result you wanted, this doesn't make you a failure. Look at the event as a learning experience and ask what you can take from the situation. Assess if it could have been prevented and ask what you can do differently next time. It is also vital that we not take things too personally and separate what we do from our overall sense of identity. Shifting our focus in this way can be difficult – and is a practice that we can perfect over time.

Self-limiting thoughts or beliefs can be particularly damaging as they limit the possibilities for change and success. If you find yourself thinking a limiting thought – turn it into a question. Rather than thinking "I can't do this – it's impossible", ask "How can I do this" or "How is this possible". Simply changing the statement to a question opens us up to finding new possibilities and sounds more hopeful.

Getting to where you want to be takes many small steps. It is important to begin by firmly establishing in your mind what you want to achieve. Write this down and believe with certainty that it can be accomplished. It can also help to visualise yourself attaining this goal. Continue to take meaningful steps towards your destination until you have reached your goal.

NON-SPECIFIC LOWER BACK PAIN IN ADULTS PART 1

About 8 in 10 people have one or more bouts of low back pain. In most cases, it is not due to a serious disease or serious back problem, and the exact cause of the pain is not clear. This is called non-specific lower back pain. The usual advice is to keep active, and do normal activities as much as possible. Painkillers can help until the pain eases. In most cases, the pain clears within a week or so but may recur from time to time. Chronic (persistent) pain develops in some cases, and further treatment may then be needed.

Understanding the lower back

The lower back is also called the lumbosacral area of the back. It is the part of the back between the bottom of the ribs and the tops of the legs.

Most of the lower back is made up from muscles that attach to, and surround, the spine. The spine is made up of many bones called vertebrae. The vertebrae are roughly circular and between each vertebra is a disc. The discs act as shock absorbers and allow the spine to be flexible.

Strong ligaments also attach to adjacent vertebrae to give extra support and strength to the spine. The various muscles that are attached to the spine enable the spine to bend and move in various ways.

The spinal cord, which contains the nerve pathways to and from the brain, is protected by the spine. Nerves from the spinal cord come out from between the vertebrae to take and receive messages to various parts of the body.

What are the types of low back pain?

Non-specific low back pain

This is the most common type. About 19 in 20 cases of acute (sudden onset) low back pain are classed as non-specific. This is the type of back pain that most people will have at some point in their life. There is no specific problem or disease that can be identified as to the cause of the pain.

Nerve root pain – often called sciatica

This occurs in less than 1 in 20 cases of acute low back pain. Nerve root pain means that a nerve coming out from the spinal cord is irritated or pressed on. You feel pain along the course of the nerve. Therefore, you typically feel pain down a leg, sometimes as far as to the calf or foot. The irritation or pressure on the nerve may also cause pins and needles, numbness or weakness in part of a buttock, leg or foot.

About 9 in 10 cases of nerve root back pain are due to a prolapsed disc – What happens is that part of the inner softer part of the disc bulges out (prolapses) through a weakness in the outer harder part of the disc.

Cauda equina syndrome – rare, but an emergency

Cauda equina syndrome is a particularly serious type of nerve root problem. This is a rare disorder where the nerves at the very bottom of the spinal cord are pressed on. This syndrome can cause low back pain plus: problems with bowel and bladder function (usually unable to pass urine), numbness in the saddle area (around the anus) and weakness in one or both legs. This syndrome needs urgent treatment to preserve the nerves to the bladder and bowel from becoming permanently damaged.







Tips on what to watch out for

Buying a used car is an intimidating prospect for many consumers. The fear of dodgy deals and the fact that you could be buying someone else's problems make the hunt for honest value seem daunting.

The AA advises all potential used car buyers to avoid side-of-the-road sales and go to SIMI dealers, to buy an AA Autocheck car or failing that to have the vehicle professionally inspected before purchase. No reputable seller will object to an independent inspection.

Many publications carry ads offering secondhand cars for sale. Most are genuine but unfortunately there are still unscrupulous dealers posing as private sellers. If you decide to make contact, say that you are asking about 'the car for sale'. If he has to ask you which car then he is a dealer. Having blown his cover, steer clear of his car!

Never buy a car in the dark as this easily conceals various blemishes and possibly even evidence of accident damage. A key fact that you want to be sure of is that the car has not been involved in an accident. No matter whether its from a private individual or from a dealer ask the critical question, preferably in front of a witness "has the car ever been crashed or had any bodywork repairs carried out whatsoever". The response given has significant legal implications.

The National Car Test (NCT) was introduced to Ireland in January 2000 and since then the

quality of used cars in Ireland has improved greatly in recent years. All cars now need to undergo and NCT after four years initially and after two years thereafter. This has meant that it is no longer possible to run 'rolling wrecks' on Irish roads.

There is very good value to be found in the second-hand market. For every new car bought in Ireland almost 2.5 second-hand ones bought and most people are happy with the results. You have to look out for the pitfalls, do the homework and remember the maxim caveat emptor – let the buyer beware.

What to look for in a second hand car - pro tips

Check the body lines for consistency

Look for any evidence of repainting, such as overspray on window rubbers or any inconsistency in the paintwork

Check for uneven tyrewear

Look out for different makes of headlights

Watch for different consistencies of stonechips over the front of the bonnet compared to the adjacent wings.

Examine carefully the wear at the pedal rubbers, the gear stick and the steering wheel Closely examine the odometer for any sign of interference

Make sure the keys provided operate in all of the locks and that there is a spare set.

Try all keys provided in the ignition and make sure that they start the engine – as occasionally a 'cut' key is not a 'transponder key' or microchipped to work in the ignition.

RELEASING BUCKLES



How to stop children undoing their seat belts

Most children will eventually find they can undo their seat belt. So why don't they make seat belts that can't be undone by a child? This is because it must be possible to release the belt in an emergency, quickly and easily. At worst this might be with a car inverted in a ditch at night, with access at arm's length through a window, or by a person in shock, unfamiliar with such equipment.

Any form of 'Chinese puzzle' is out. The catch cannot be hidden, must be obvious and accessible and must not require a large force to release it.

A different type of catch, perhaps a friend's seat, may not be undone as easily as one with which a child is familiar but this is usually only temporary. Given the right conditions they will soon get the knack.

Don't be tempted to make additional security attachments to the buckle. Anything like this will inevitably compromise safety and again tends to be only temporarily effective, presenting a new challenge rather than solving the problem.

Diverting the child's attention

Rather than trying to persuade your child that the buckle cannot be undone, try persuading them that there is no advantage in doing so. These are techniques you might like to try.

Show that the car does not go (or soon stops) with the belt undone.

The best time to start this approach is when you get a new seat (or perhaps when a car is changed). But remember to do it when there is no deadline for the journey.

If the child is old enough to really want to get somewhere, that's ideal. Try telling the child that unless the seat belt is fastened, they won't get to the party, zoo, etc.

A raised seat can also be some help, as it will increase your child's field of view.

A 'play tray' attachment can provide some distraction and may make the buckle less tempting.



FOCUS ON HERBS


Most herbs are very easy to grow. They can be grown in the garden in vegetable beds or raised beds or in containers like a window box on a window sill.

There are a lot of different types of herbs but the most commonly grown herbs for culinary use are basil and dill which are annuals and have to be sown every year. Parsley and chervil, which are biennials and last for two years while herbs like fennel, mint, tarragon are perennials.

If you want to grow mint make sure you plant it in a container and not in the ground as it is a very invasive herb.

Even if you are not using your herbs for culinary use, it is important to pick them regularly otherwise they tend to go to seed very quickly.





Unlike the Kingdom, Galway failed to make proper use of their possession and in the first half they shot 10 wides, some from easy positions, in contrast to the Kingdom, who shot just two. David Moran was a more than adequate replacement for Bryan Sheehan, who was taken off injured in the first five minutes. Once again, all six Kerry forwards scored and another notable statistic to emerge was that all but two of Kerry's final tally came from play.

James O'Donoghue gave yet another man of the match display. The Killarney Legion man is Kerry's marquee player this summer in the absence of Colm Cooper, and he scored 1-5 from play to bring his tally in two championship games in this campaign to 1-15.

Kerry had notable performances too from Paul Geaney and Donnchadh Walsh, while Barry John Keane, and Kieran O'Leary scored four points between after being introduced late in the second half. Kerry led 1-8 to 1-3 at halftime, James O'Donoghue was their first-half goal scorer, while Thomas Flynn scored a solo goal for Galway when the Kerry defence failed to track him. Know Your Rights:

THE CYCLE TO WORK SCHEME

QUESTION

In 2009, I bought a bike under the Cycle to Work tax scheme but it was stolen last week. Can I use the scheme again when I buy a replacement bike?

ANSWER

The Cycle to Work Scheme is a tax incentive scheme which aims to encourage employees to cycle to and from work. Under the scheme employers can pay up to \in 1,000 for a bicycle and bicycle equipment for each of their employees. The repayment for the bicycle and equipment is then deducted from your gross salary (this means before income tax, PRSI, pension levies or Universal Social Charge are deducted) over a period of up to 12 months.

You can only avail of the scheme once in a five-year period. So if you got your bike in December 2009 and were granted the tax relief in 2009, you can claim it again, if you want to buy another bike in 2014 or later.

You must use the bicycle and safety equipment mainly for qualifying journeys. This means the whole or part (for example between home and train station) of a journey between your home and your normal place of work.

If you buy a replacement bike in 2014 you cannot get another bike under the Cycle to Work Scheme until 2018. If you are concerned about another theft you could insure your new bike under your household insurance policy or you could use a special cycle insurance scheme. There is a list of frequently asked questions about the scheme on revenue.ie.

KERRY IFA SEEKS REDUCTION IN PROPERTY TAX FROM LOCAL AUTHORITIES

In a submission to Kerry County Council, IFA Chairman and Castleisland based farmer Sean Brosnan, has sought a reduction in the property tax to reflect the level of services provided and to ensure that there is no further erosion of competitiveness and loss of income for farm families.

"The purpose of the property tax is to support the provision of local services, with the majority of the proceeds of the tax accruing to local authorities. While this should provide more autonomy to local authorities to provide appropriate services, there can be no change in the rate of the tax to compensate for a reduction, or lack of funding from other sources," said IFA Chairman Sean Brosnan.

"IFA believes that the local property tax must reflect the level of local services provided, which are significantly lower in rural Ireland than those provided in urban areas. There is a strong argument, therefore, for a reduction in the property tax to reflect the lower level of services provided in rural areas."

He concluded, "In addition, the burden of taxation on farm families has, in common with other sectors, increased significantly in recent years. Marginal rates of tax are at a very high level and lower income farmers have been negatively affected through the introduction of the USC and the reduction in personal tax credits. Increases in the rates of capital taxes and reductions in tax-free thresholds have added to the costs of investment and asset transfer. To encourage investment and enterprise and to support overall economic recovery, there must be a reduction in the overall taxation burden and I am calling on Kerry County Council to reduce the property tax next year."

PRUDENT CASH FLOW PLANNING REQUIRED FOR THE LAST YEAR OF SUPERLEVY

Milk supplies to the end of June exceeded quota by a record 7.05%, the Department of Agriculture has announced, and January to May production was up 8.5% according to CSO. IFA National Dairy Committee Chairman Sean O'Leary said strong profitability, exceptional weather conditions and good availability of high quality fodder would push Ireland's milk supplies over quota and into a potential record superlevy situation for the last year of the quota regime.

He said this would impose a high cost on farmers, which they needed to plan for prudently, with assistance from advisors, co-ops, and banks to first minimise, and then finance this extra cost of expansion without damaging cash flow or herd potential.

"Irish milk supplies reflect the global trend of exceptionally fast output growth, and for the same reasons: conditions and on-farm profitability are both good. However, farmers need to remember that superlevy is with us for one last year – and production looks set to exceed our quota quite considerably over the coming months, as farmers gear up for the end of the regime," he said.

"Our efforts in Brussels will continue, but even in the increasingly unlikely event that sufficient agreement can be achieved between member states, the best farmers can expect is the equivalent of a 2% improvement in the size of their quota – with superlevy having to be paid in full on the excess," he stressed.

"It is crucial that farmers would seek assistance from their Teagasc or private advisor to adopt husbandry and production techniques which will allow them minimise their production surplus without impeding the future potential of their herd," Mr. O'Leary said.

"It is also vital that farmers be assisted by their co-ops and banks in financing the superlevy bill a very large number will face next year. This must be planned as early as possible, and the cash flow of farmers protected as much as possible in the process," he concluded.



Tractors and machinery; Trips and falls; Livestock. Ireland has over twice the incidence of farm accidents as other European countries. Public Safety

* Ensure that there is good visibility at access points onto public roadways.

* Ensure that livestock fencing and gateways along public roadways are stock-proof.

* Ensure that public roadways are kept free of hazards. Place warning signs on the road margins when farm activity is in progress.

Vehicles and equipment should comply with the Road Traffic Acts. PREPARE A SAFETY STATEMENT

The Safety Health and Welfare at Work Act requires that a safety statement be prepared for all workplaces, including farms. This is a plan to manage safety on your farm. A format for preparing a safety statement is available from Teagasc or the Health and Safety Authority.

Accidents are preventable

 Most accidents are preventable if practical safety measures are taken
 examine your farm, identify the hazards and take control measures.
 Discuss safety with your family, persons who work on your farm, contractors and visitors and ensure that safe standards and practices are used.

THINK SAFETY AND TAKE ACTION

Tractors, Machinery, Workshop Equipment

* Ensure that all machinery and equipment is in safe working order. Consult the operator's manual. Keep all safety guards in place.

* Make sure that all operators are competent and work in a safe manner.

* Always turn off the PTO and stop the engine before attempting to free a blockage. Watch out for bystanders. LIVESTOCK: All animals can be dangerous. Keep the temperament of animals, especially bulls, under constant review. Ensure that children, in particular, are safe when cattle are being herded. Bulls should have a ring and trailing chain attached. Where a bull is present, place a warning sign at field entrances with public access. Check that your livestock handling, housing and loading facilities are safe and easy to use.

TRIPS, FALLS AND BLOWS

 Keep all walkways and work areas free of tripping hazards.

Rushing is the cause of many accidents - work at a steady pace.

 When gaining access to heights, use a sound and properly secured ladder. Never walk on a fragile roof, use adequately supported crawler boards or roofing ladders. Ensure that lofts and stairways are sound and have adequate guard-rails fitted.
 Fit sliding doors or ensure that doors can be secured. Heavy swinging doors or gates are highly dangerous, especially in windy conditions.

 Look out for and eliminate particular hazards to children on your farm.

 Provide a safe and secure play area for young children.

•Supervise young people working on your farm. A young person must be 14 years old to operate a tractor on the farm and over 16 years of age to do so on public roads. Read the Health and Safety Authority guidelines on child safety on farms.

SLURRY

Ensure that all slurry and effluent tanks are fenced or covered.

 Only agitate and move slurry when there is a lot of air movement. Pick a windy day. Evacuate all people and stock from sheds. Open all doors and outlets.

 Adding silage effluent to slurry greatly increases the level of poisonous hydrogen sulphide gas produced.





LIFTING AND CARRYING

 Prevent back injuries by using mechanical methods of lifting, e.g. loaders, hydraulic jacks, trolleys, wheels under heavy farmyard gates. ·Before lifting - assess the load. Use the correct technique by having a well-balanced stance, bend your knees, keep your back straight and keep the load close to your body.

.Ensure that heavy weights are well secured and that proper stacking takes place.

Electrical Installations

·Have a competent electrician examine the electrical installations on your farm and upgrade if necessary. Be familiar with the standards of electrical installation. Read the ESB leaflet "Farm Well, Farm Safely".

 Ensure that all plugs are correctly wired and that cables are sound. Only use waterproof fittings in damp locations. All sockets should be protected by a 30 milliAmp Residual Current Device (R.C.D.).

 Lookout for overhead cables and observe safe clearance distances. PESTICIDES

 Store all pesticides and farm chemicals in a secure, bunded store, made of non-flammable material. Identify the store with the correct safety warning sign. The store should be isolated from flammable materials such as hay or straw.

 Wear suitable protective equipment wellingtons, coverall, pesticide gloves, a face shield and where necessary a respirator.

.Ensure that the sprayer is in safe working order. Operators should receive training. Consult the Teagasc Code of Practice for further information.

YOUR HEALTH

·Wear protective equipment where the situation requires it: goggles, gloves, veterinary gloves, ear defenders, a facemask or respirator.

·Atmospheres with mould, dust or fumes are injurious to health. Where these

arise, ventilate the area thoroughly. A facemask (EN 149 Type P2) gives a high level of protection against dust and spores.

 Adopt high standards of hygiene and cover all cuts and wounds with waterproof plasters. Keep a first aid box and attend a first aid course. FARM FIRES

 Ensure that combustible materials such as hay, straw, fuel/oils are separated from livestock buildings and dwelling houses. Hay/straw should be stored 18 metres or more from other buildings.

 To allow access for a fire brigade, entrances and gates should be at least 3.0 metres wide. A fire brigade may have only 2,000 litres (400 gallons) of water aboard. Check that a farm water supply is available to fight a fire.

Ensure that all emergency phone numbers are in view at the phone. Have suitable fire extinguishers on the farm and in the home. Additionally, smoke alarms and a fire blanket should be fitted in the home.

FARMING OUTLOOK

IFA CALLS ON FARM FAMILIES TO RE-DOUBLE EFFORTS TO IMPROVE FARM SAFETY

IFA President Eddie Downey has again called on farm families to make safety a top priority on their farms and to think safety and farm safely at all times.

Tragically, 17 lives have been lost to farm accidents so far this year, which is more than all of 2013.

Eddie Downey said farming is a high-risk occupation, but accidents and injuries can be prevented by taking time and working safely. "Being tired, distracted and stressed is often a reality on busy farms and every effort must be made to avoid shortcuts. At the peak of this busy summer season on farms, safety must come first".

As with IFA's National Farm Safety Awareness Day last month, the IFA President appealed to farm families to dedicate time to thinking about health and safety on their farms; to identify potential danger areas; and, to consider ways to minimise risks. "By taking time with family members and farm staff to review or complete a risk assessment, farmers will not only reduce the risks to themselves, their families, employees and farm visitors but will also ensure they are complying with Health and Safety legislation".

The IFA has a dedicated 'Farm Safety' section on its website www.ifa.ie, which provides farm safety videos, booklets, links and information. This will complement a range of initiatives, including messages in the IFA calendar, text alerts to our members and regular updates through our County Executive network.



IFA Rural Development Chairman and Kenmare based farmer Flor McCarthy has called on the Minister for Agriculture, Simon Coveney to amend the RDP proposals on Knowledge Transfer as the Department of Agriculture plan to make €500 of the farmer payments directly to facilitators including Teagasc is both excessive and anti-competitive. Flor McCarthy said as it stands the Minister has proposed to the EU Commission that farmers will get a payment of €750 while the facilitator, which can be Teagasc or a private Planner, will get €500 for each participating farmer up to a maximum of 15 farmers (10 in the case of Poultry). This proposed payment to the facilitator is much higher than what farmers were paying Teagasc and Planners under BTAP, STAP and DEP as it was done in a competitive environment. Mr. McCarthy said paying a standard fee is unacceptable and goes against a policy of having competitive tendering. Farmers are also being asked to make an additional payment to a vet in preparing an animal health and welfare report as part of their Plan requirement. Continuing, Flor McCarthy said the following areas

needed to be addressed before the Knowledge Transfer measures are implemented. These include:

The payment level to farmers should be increased to ϵ 1,250 with the farmers paying the facilitator a competitive rate for the work done.

* The Knowledge Transfer measure which will apply to Beef, Sheep, Dairy, Tillage, Poultry and Equine must be extended for Pigs. In addition, a special Hill Sheep Measure (HSTAP) must be introduced.

* Farmers who have both a Cattle & Sheep enterprise should be allowed to be members of 2 groups as is currently the case. Many farmers have duel enterprises and should be allowed to join both as the Knowledge Transfer measure in each enterprise is important for improving their farm income.

Concluding, Flor McCarthy said it was vital that the Knowledge Transfer measure worked for farmers as the group advisory concept has worked successfully through the various discussion groups over the last 4 years. However changes are needed before implementation of the new programme.



TREES SAVE LIVES:

While trees are just standing around – swaying in the breeze and providing shade – they are also up to seriously noble work. While most of us know that trees take in carbon dioxide and release oxygen, they are quietly providing another important service as well. Namely, they remove deleterious pollutants from the air, according to new research from the United States Forest Service.

The study found that trees are actively diminishing air pollution. The researchers examined four pollutants in particular: nitrogen dioxide, ozone, sulphur dioxide and particulate matter less than 2.5 microns (PM2.5) in aerodynamic diameter. Health problems from these pollutants include harm to pulmonary, cardiac, vascular, and neurological systems. In the U.S., an estimated 130,000 deaths were related to PM2.5 and another 4,700 to ozone in 2005.

The scientists looked at how trees remove air pollution by the interception of particulate matter on plant surfaces and the absorption of pollutants through the leaf stomata; they concluded that trees in the U.S. are saving the lives of more than 850 Americans a year. And that's not all – they are preventing 670,000 incidents of acute respiratory symptoms and saving a whopping \$7 billion a year in health costs by reducing respiratory illness.

And all that just by improving air quality by less than 1 percent.

Not surprisingly, the amount of trees in an area has an effect on the benefits. While the average tree cover in the U.S. is estimated at 34.2% overall, it ranges by area from 2.6% in North Dakota to 88.9% in New Hampshire.

POPE FRANCIS & ECUMENICAL PATRIARCH APPEAL FOR RESPECT OF CREATION:

Pope Francis and the Ecumenical Patriarch, Bartholomew I, held private talks in Jerusalem on 25th May 2014 and signed a Common Declaration in which they pledged to continue on the path towards unity between the Catholic and Orthodox Churches.

They also called for Christians to live in a way that protect God's world: "It is our profound conviction that the future of the human family depends also on how we safeguard – both prudently and compassionately, with justice and fairness – the gift of creation that our Creator has entrusted to us. Therefore, we acknowledge in repentance the wrongful mistreatment of our planet, which is tantamount to sin before the eyes of God. We reaffirm our responsibility and obligation to foster a sense of humility and moderation so that all may feel the need to respect creation and to safeguard it with care. Together, we pledge our commitment to raising awareness about the stewardship of creation; we appeal to all people of goodwill to consider ways of living less wastefully and more frugally, manifesting less greed and more generosity for the protection of God's world and the benefit of His people."

It's time to start preparing for Creation Time! Once again, Christians throughout the world will be taking time from 1st September to 4th October to reflect on the wonder and mystery of God's Creation and consider ways they can relate better to the living earth - ways that reflect God's ways of justice and peace.

This year's theme - God, Whose Farm is All Creation - ties in with 2014 being the UN International Year of Family Farming.

Creation Time started in the Orthodox Church in 1989 and since then has been supported by a growing number of churches throughout the world and the World Council of Churches. It was endorsed at the European Ecumenical Assembly in Sibiu, Romania in 2007, when it was agreed that the period "be dedicated to prayer for the protection of Creation and the promotion of sustainable lifestyles that reverse our contribution to climate change".

The Irish Catholic Bishops also encourage the observation of Creation Time in their excellent 2009 pastoral, The Cry of the Earth, which has recently been updated and will be re-launched during Creation Time this year. The pastoral also recommends that all parishes enrol in an environmental programme, like Eco-Congregation Ireland.

RESTORE YOUR FAITH IN HUMANITY:

At a time when tragedy dominates world affairs, it's easy to despair at the path some 'leaders' have led us down. But if you're worried about losing faith in humankind, despair not: we have the antidote.

Rich or poor; young or old; Irish, Australian, Chinese or Brazilian - the world over one universal trait truly unites us all: kindness.

Courageous deeds caught on film can sweep across the world in an instant, but it's acts of kindness, that don't get any airtime, that change the world every day.

* When a young Himalayan blue sheep, known as a Bharal, was left stranded from his flock in the Nangqen county of Tibet, an 11-yearold girl vowed to protect him - feeding him and keeping him company, until he grew old enough to rejoin his companions.

* Since 2009 a former Chinese chef, Li Zongwen, has single-handedly adopted 140 stray dogs who had been abandoned on the streets of Wuhan, China. Skilled at catering for large numbers, Mr Zongwen prepares a massive amount of freshly cooked dog food every day — using a giant pan and a garden shove!!

The 59-year-old man put a roof over their heads, but admits he couldn't afford to feed all of them, without donations from other local animal lovers.

*A boy in Bangladesh risked his life when he jumped into a flood-swollen river to save a fawn from drowning. The boy, Belal, disappeared and onlookers feared the worst - until he resurfaced, holding the tiny fawn safe above his head. Belal's heroism would have gone unnoticed if an international wildlife photographer hadn't been on hand to document the scene!

* Two Camels Albert and Einstein, as they have been named (camels are terrifically clever), are happy now, but life wasn't always so cheery for them. Born in the wild, they were rounded up and torn from their mothers before they were even a year old. Destined to be sold at auction to an uncertain fate — Emma and the kind people at Brightside Farm Sanctuary stepped in and whisked them away to safety. All they have to worry about now is smiling for the camera.

*It's not your average stroll along the beach when Hassan Kasskin takes his dogs walking in Gaza. Horrified by the death toll of shipwreck victims off the coast, Mr Kasskin has given his two brave German Shepherds lifeguard lessons - training them to swim out into the choppy Mediterranean waters to rescue drowning people.

* A pig born without hind legs has become a celebrity in the Henan Province of China. Known as Zhu Jianqiang - which means 'Strong-Willed Pig' - her carer, Wang Xihai, taught her to walk on her front legs, despite calls from his wife to get rid of the special little piglet. 'She proved to us that no matter what form life is it should continue to live on,' Mr Xihai said.

* A photo shoot turned into a dramatic rescue mission on the island of Giske, Norway when friends Erik and Torvald risked their lives to save a young lamb from drowning in the ocean. Torvald grabbed Erik to keep him from slipping down a slippery rock-face into the rough waves of the freezing waters as the pair hauled the stricken animal to safety.

THE WORLDS BEST MOTHER?

The ultimate goal of all species on the planet is procreation, the act of making anew. And many species go to great lengths to set their progeny off on the right path: orangutan mothers have been known to breast feed for eight years, the father emperor penguin braves the brutal Antarctic winter to warm a single egg, while the mother wolf spider carries her dozens of offspring wherever she goes. However, few could contend with a deep-sea octopus, known as Graneledone boreopacifica, which researchers observed guarding its eggs for four-and-a-half years (53 months), before likely succumbing to starvation soon after.

Each of the 18 times the marine biologists visited the1, 397 meters (4,583 feet) deep sea site in the Monterey Submarine Canyon off of central California, they found the same octopus clinging to the vertical rock face, arms curled, covering her eggs. Continuous growth of the eggs provided evidence that it was the same clutch throughout and the octopus was also easily identifiable by her tell-tale scars. In the Autumn of 2011 the eggs hatched.

Many octopus mothers, such as the giant Pacific octopus (Enteroctopus dofleini), are known to lay eggs only once in their lives. They guard and care diligently for the eggs, all the while losing weight and weakening due to a lack of food. They also change colour, usually taking on a ghostly pallor. The mothers often die soon after the eggs hatch, essentially sacrificing themselves for the success of their children. The researchers believe Graneledone boreopacifica acts similarly.

There is no evidence that [Graneledone boreopacifica] females feed while brooding. Potential prey in the form of Lithodid crabs and Pandalid shrimps were frequently in close attendance around the brooding female, however, the only interactions the biologists observed were when she pushed these crustaceans away, the mother even refused food when they offered her pieces of crab. The scientists also never observed the mother away from her eggs during the 18 visits over the years and said while she occasionally shifted her position slightly, or uncurled and lifted one or two arms, the female always remained centered over the clutch of eggs.

NOAH'S ARK THEME PARK:

The governor of Kentucky has promised generous tax incentives to a group of entrepreneurs who plan to construct a full-size replica of Noah's ark, load it with animals and actors, and make it the centerpiece of a Bible-based tourist attraction called Ark Encounter. The theme park was conceived by the same Christian ministry that built the Creation Museum in Petersburg, Kentucky has drawn 1.2 million visitors in its first three years — proving that in the U. S. at least there is a sizable paying audience for entertainment rooted in a literal interpretation of the Bible.

The developers of Ark Encounter, who have incorporated as a profit-making company, say they expect to spend \$150 million, employ 900 people and attract 1.6 million visitors from around the world in the first year. With the Creation Museum only 45 miles away, they envision a Christian tourism corridor that would draw busloads from churches and Christian schools for two- and three-day visits. The park will include a 100-foot Tower of Babel, a first-century Middle Eastern village and a journey through the Old Testament, with special effects depicting Moses, the 10 plagues and the parting of the Red Sea. For children, there will be a petting zoo, live bird and animal shows and a play area with ziplines and climbing nets - all Bible-themed.

83 YEAR OLD WILLIAM SHATNER INJURED IN HORSE RIDING ACCIDENT:

"Star Trek" icon and legendary Canadian actor William Shatner rolled into the 45th annual Comic-Con International celebration of the popular arts in a wheelchair. The 83-year-old actor, who became known around the world for his role as Captain Kirk in the series "Star Trek," had to be pushed onstage for his appearance at the Legends of TV Land panel.

Mr. Shatner was in a wheelchair due to an unfortunate horse-riding accident he had been in the previous weekend. He explained that he was in a great deal of pain and was unable to walk, but there was no way he was going to miss the event.

Mr. Shatner told the crowd, In a couple of days I'll be fine, but right now I'm in a lot of pain." He added..."I was riding a horse and had an accident. The horse got off scot-free. I did not. I wrecked my leg."
