KILLARNEY'S HIGHEST HONOUR BESTOWED ON ENDA KENNY

The former Fine Gael leader Enda Kenny was inducted into the Order of Innisfallen – the highest honour the town can bestow – in recognition of his years of service to the country, particularly in terms of tourism development and promotion at a ceremony on Friday last.

In a citation delivered in Killarney House and Gardens – refurbished and reopened at cost of €10m during Mr Kenny's term in office – MC and hotelier, Michael Rosney, said that from a Killarney perspective, the single most important and creative initiative Mr Kenny oversaw was the reduction in the tourism VAT rate to 9%.

"In some cases, it saved seriously at-risk businesses from extinction and, in all cases, it was a fantastic support to everyone involved at the coalface of the tourism industry, both locally and nationally," he said.

"We in Killarney's tourism sector will always be grateful to Enda Kenny for the work he has done on our behalf and for the great things he has helped to bring about," Mr Rosney added.

Recalling the former Taoiseach's two-star performance on the RTÉ reality TV programme, The Restaurant, the MC quipped: "The Killarney tourism industry gives thanks that his career path took him into a government cabinet rather than into a busy kitchen".

Cathaoirleach of the Killarney Municipal District, Cllr Niall Kelleher, acknowledged that Enda Kenny demonstrated the essential qualities required to make a difference in political and public life.

"Apart from his work ethic, his great energy and his dedication to his brief, he has always been personable, friendly and approachable and he was certainly a man of the people," he said.

"Our colours might be different, but I applaud Enda for what he achieved in a long life in politics. To enable him to achieve the goals he set, he had to make some very difficult decisions, implement some very tough measures and make some big calls which might not have always been met with universal approval," the Fianna Fail councillor added.

Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce President, Paul O'Neill, remarked: "When he passed on the Fine Gael leader's baton in Dáil Éireann last June, Mr Kenny said it was his hope that in the two Governments he had led, that he made a modest contribution. I think everybody will recognise that for the understatement that it is".

The Chamber chief added: "Enda Kenny was and is a forward-thinking, innovative, dedicated politician who has always put the country and its people first".

Osteoporosis

Osteoporosis occurs when you lose bone density, making them more fragile and at risk of fracture. It is neither a disease exclusively for the elderly or for females. Bone is made of tough, elastic fibres (collagen) and gritty, hard material (minerals). Bone continues to remodel' itself throughout our lives. As a child you make more bone than you remove (resorb) so your bone density increases with age. Most people reach peak bone density in their 20's. Ideally your overall bone density remains very static for many years (20's to 30's) .In the later decades (50-60 on) you slowly resorb more bone than you make, so your overall bone density falls (slightly) no matter what you do. The goal of good bone care is to first ensure everyone reaches a normal peak bone density so they have the reserves to facilitate a small amount of loss as they age. Secondly there are several measures you can take to limit as far as possible the gradual decline in density in the later decades.

How common is it?

15% of people over 50 years old and 70% of 80 year olds have Osteoporosis. In Ireland 1 in 2 women and 1 in 5 men over 50 will develop a fracture because of Osteoporosis. Despite its prevalence many either do not know they have it or do not take regular treatment. Special risk factors

Women with absent periods or early Menopause.

Eating disorders, especially Anorexia.

Long distance/endurance runners.

Steroids taken orally for >3months at >7.5mg per day

Excess Alcohol (>21 units per week)

Low calcium diets

Low Vitamin D/Living in northern Latitudes (ie Ireland)

Prolonged immobility (bed bound/dementia etc)

Hyperthyroidism(overactive)

Coeliac Disease, especially if non compliant

Chronic Kidney Disease

Crohns/Ulcerative Colitis

Rheumatoid Arthritis

Family History

Symptoms

Typically there are no symptoms until presentation with a fragility fracture (a fracture after a minor trauma) .Acute compression fracture of the spine occurs when one of the small bones in your spine (the vertebrae) collapses in on itself- usually the front portion. This may have no symptoms or cause sudden inexplicable localised back pain. Repeated vertebral fractures result in the forward stoop or a 'hump' frequently associated with Osteoporosis. Without a fracture aches and pains are never caused by Osteoporosis.

Diagnosis

Blood tests are only useful in diagnosing risk factors for Osteoporosis like Coeliac disease or very low Vitamin D. You must have a Bone Density Scan (DEXA Scan) to diagnose Osteoporosis. This test involves radiation so cannot be performed on anyone who may be pregnant.

Results

You are given a T score reading from your DEXA scan. Anything above zero and down to -0.9

- -1.0 to -2.4 is considered Osteopenia. This is not a disease per se but a risk factor for the development of Osteoporosis if nothing is done to maintain or improve current scores. -2.5 to -2.9 is Osteoporosis
- -3.0 and below is considered severe Osteoporosis.

Weight bearing Exercise is essential to maintain good bone health. A good target is 30–40 minutes of walking every day but change the route and direction to prevent preferentially weight bearing on one side. Swimming unfortunately is not beneficial for osteoporosis. Maintain a good calcium intake. Aim to have 3 portions of calcium per day- a glass of milk, a matchbox size of cheese, a portion of yoghurt, a portion of salmon/spinach or broccoli.

Milk with Vitamin D added to it/SuperMilk is beneficial for all the family and superior to standard milk.

Currently there are 6-7 different treatments for Osteoporosis available. These can be dis-

BT YOUNG SCIENTIST EXPO BECKONS FOR SEM BOYS

St Brendan's College Killarney Students, James Knoblauch, Oran O'Donoghue and Harry Knoblauch, have qualified for the prestigious BT Young Scientist and Technology Exhibition, in the RDS, in January 2018. The fifth-year students are investigating conformity and how minorities influence it. Conformity is a social influence which can change peoples' behaviour and beliefs. The students have devised their own experiment to further research this widely unexplored area of psychology.

Team member James said, "We wish to examine both internal and external forces that lead to conformity in groups. The project was in part inspired by the phenomena of contagious yawning and laughter - why do people mirror the actions of others? From here we began to consider conformity - which is defined as 'A type of social influence involving a change in belief or behaviour to fit in with a group'. We wanted to see whether and how the conformity rate differed between and across different genders and ages. Also, we wished to see how successful a minority influence was within a group, varying that input between

AVOIDING EMERGENCY TAX ON PRIVATE PENSIONS

Your private pension may be paid by your former employer or through a pension company. To avoid paying emergency tax you need to get a Tax Credit Certificate (TCC) in the name of your pension provider.

You may be widowed or a surviving civil partner and receive a private pension from your deceased spouse's or civil partner's pension provider. If this is the case, to avoid paying emergency tax, you need to get a TCC in the name of the pension provider.

HOW TO GET A TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATE (TCC)

If you have a Form P4S from your former employer, give it to your pension provider when you start your pension. Your pension provider will use the P4S to calculate your tax and will send us the P4S. A TCC will then be sent to both you and your pension provider.

If you do not have a Form P45, use the Jobs and Pensions service in myAccount to inform revenue about your new pension online. A TCC will then be sent to both you and your pension provider. You will be able to view, print or download your TCC in My Documents in myAccount.



KILLORGLIN GO 2ND IN 15 PREMIER:



COUNTY CONVENTION ON MONDAY **NIGHT**

The annual Convention of Kerry GAA takes place on Monday night next in the Gleneagle Hotel Killarney commencing at 7:30. The County Convention provides a great avenue for clubs to air their views on all aspects of the running of the Association in the County as invariably, all issues big and small are referred to in the Runaí's report which is with the Clubs since midweek.

On the field of play it has been a pretty successful year with All Ireland football titles at Minor and Junior level and in Hurling, the successful Minor Teams of the past few years are now beginning to bear fruit at Under 21 level with an All Ireland title in that grade. Hopefully that progression will continue and reflect itself in success at senior hurling level.

Of course the failure of our senior footballers to get past Mayo in the All Ireland semi final has generated a lot of debate in the last three months or so and that is standard practice in this county when Sam Maguire does not come to visit.

Four great stalwarts retired from the Intercounty scene during the year under review; Aidan O'Mahony, Colm Cooper and Bryan Sheehan all had long and successful careers in the green and gold jersey while John Griffin was equally a great servant to Kerry intercounty hurling teams.

On the Club front, Dr Crokes dominated the headlines once again winning the All Ireland Club title and then retaining their County title while Glenbeigh-Glencar and St Brendans College also visited Croke Park and came away as All Ireland Champions.

Meanwhile, Ballyduff are back on top of the pile after winning the senior Hurling championship at the second attempt.

The opening of the new Centre of Excellence in Currans is something to really look forward to after Christmas. This is a long overdue central facility for Kerry teams in both codes and in all grades. However, the challenge to fund the resources for it's upkeep is only beginning.

An election for officers always provides a bit of excitement at County Convention but despite the fact that seven posts became vacant, there is only one contest and that is for the post of Assistant Treasurer where outgoing Munster Council delegate Joe Crowley from Laune Rangers and Pat McAuliffe from John Mitchels are both contesting the position.

There will be at least one new face on the executive next year as Fionnán Fitzgerald from the Ballymacelligott club will become the new Assistant Secretary; Fionnán would be particularly well known in Scór circles.

Five Officers who have completed the maximum five years in their current positions will take up new posts in the coming year;

In a thrilling Tatler Jack East Kerry Minor A Championship Final played at Fitzgerald



Stadium on Saturday last, it took a Jack Griffin free kick at the end of extra time to finally defeat a young and impressive Fossa team by a single point. The game was level at normal time – 1-10 each; level again half way through extra time at 1-12 each and level after 20 minutes of extra time – 1-15 to 2-12. 'The Songs I Used to Sing, Volume 2' will be launched at the Riverside Park Hotel, Macroom, by C103 presenter John Greene, this Friday, December 8, at 8pm

Sadly, Diarmuid O'Connell did not live to see the launch of the CD to which he had devoted the last few months of his life. But he was adamant that not only would he finish the recording of The Songs I Used to Sing: Volume 2' despite his failing health, but that the album would be launched – with or without his presence. So there was no doubt in the minds of the singer's friends and family but that this Friday's event in aid of Marymount University Hospital and Hospice must go ahead, regardless of the rawness of

their grief over Diarmuid's death just 12 days ago. Diarmuid, a native of Cill na Martra, recorded his first album, "The Songs I Used to Sing' in 2016 and divided the proceeds of its sales and a successful launch night between Macroom Community Hospital and the town's St Colman's House facility.

Having been resident in Marymount during the past year, Diarmuid, aged 56, was determined to show his appreciation for the care he received, by recording a second CD of his favourite songs as a fundraiser for the facility. His sister Nora said: "It's for Marymount and it was his wish, whether he was there or not, that it went ahead. It's what he wanted." The new CD serves both as a fundraiser and as a poignant legacy for a man who was surrounded by song throughout his life. "He used always be singing. He was brought up with it and loved it always. The radio was always on in the house," Nora added, recalling 'The Claddagh Ring' as one of her brother's early favourites. Like his first CD, the new recording features songs both in Irish and English, collected over a lifetime steeped in the singing of the Múscral area. In an interview for The County on the release of "The Songs I Used to Sing', Diarmuid said: "I'm singing since I can remember, because our house was full of music and song." Diarmuid and his six siblings were raised listening to the singing of their mother, Nan Hoare, in the townland of Lios Buí. "My mother used to play the fiddle and she was a beautiful singer. She was also a great collector of songs and she used to be writing them down and giving out to us that we wouldn't learn them!" he said. The tradition came from both sides of his family, the noted song-collector and singer Elizabeth 'Bess' Cronin being an aunt of Diarmuid's father. "The first song I ever learned was 'A Mother's Love's a Blessing', which I learned from my aunt Mamie, who was Bess's niece," he recalled. "Bess Cronin would have spent a lot of time in Lios But with my grandmother."

"I got my songs from my mother; from pubs, from the radio; and from people like Dinny Leary of Réidh na nDoiri, and John 'the Master' Kelleher of Prohus," said Diarmuid, who also collected songs from fellow Cill na Martra native, the singer, radio presenter, and GAA director general Seán Ó Síocháin. His lifetime of singing and song-collecting provided Diarmuid with the material for both of his CDs, recorded at Tony Kirby's Satellite Studios in Ballincollig. Despite suffering from a lung condition, Diarmuid succeeded in recording his new tracks, including the evocative 'Taimse im' Chodladh', and paid tribute on the album cover to those who assisted him. Referring to his "beautiful room in Marymount", he said: "I want to show my gratitude to this wonderful facility by organising another fundraiser. What better way than with a new CD?" He praised the "fantastic support and help which I have received from so many, but most especially Tony Kirby, my recording manager, without whom this CD would not have been possible". 



FOCUS ON HARDWOOD CUTTINGS

Hardwood cuttings are a pretty easy and a very reliable method of propagating a wide range of deciduous shrubs, climbers and fruit bushes.

Most deciduous shrubs are ideal for taking hardwood cuttings, for example Buddleja (Butterfly Bush) Ribes (Flowering Current), Viburniums or Forsythia and the same applies to a lot of deciduous climbers like honeysuckles and Jasmine plus fruit bushes like black currants and gooseberries.

The best time to take hardwood cuttings is when the plant is dormant which is from about mid Autumn until late Winter but the ideal time would be just after the leaves fall off the plant or just before the buds start to burst in early Spring.

These types of cuttings may be slow to roots however it is very successful.
