

# STUDENTS DON THEIR CHRISTMAS JUMPERS FOR THE HOSPICE

St. Brendan's College successfully launched their Christmas Jumper Day Fundraiser last Friday morning in aid of Kerry Hospice Foundation with the help of teachers and students from some of their neighbouring schools. The Christmas Jumper Day will take place on Friday, December 15th.

The beneficiary once again this year is the Kerry Hospice Foundation which is run entirely on donations, it costs over  $\leq 10,000$  a week to run, yet still provides services to its patients free of charge. Over the past three years, through the hard work of the students and staff at eight local primary and secondary schools, they have been able to donate in excess of  $\leq 25,000$  to Kerry Hospice Foundation.

#### Kerry Hospice Foundation provide services such as:

• A dedicated unit that provides medical, spiritual, and emotional treatment and support to those coming to the end of their lives.

Additional nursing care including night-time and twilight nurses who care for patients in their own homes.
Specialised hospice rooms in several community hospitals.

- Palliative care in designated nursing homes.
- Palliative care equipment, aids, and appliances to the homes of those who need it most.
- Extra support for patients and respite for their families.
- The funding of ongoing education of specialist nurses and carers.

At present there are twelve schools participating in this years fundraiser; Killarney Community College, Lissivigeen National School, Gaelscoil Faithleann, Knockanes National School, Scoil Bhride Loreto National School, Barraduff National School, St. Francis Special School, St. Oliver's National School, Loughguittane National School, Cullina National School, Presentation Monastery National School, and St. Brendan's College.

#### LANEWAYS

Kerry County Council has given details of concessions in parking charges over the Christmas period. In Killarney, free parking, subject to a two-hour limit, will be available between 9.30am and 2pm in the Glebe Car Park, Fair Hill Car Park, and the Upper and Lower New Street Car Parks. A parking charge of €2 per day will apply in the Rock Road, High Street and Lewis Road parks.

This column is aware of a lack of clarity when it comes to parking in Killarney's lanes.

To wander for a minute, the lanes were and are again a vital part of urban Killarney. The 1895 Ordnance Survey shows a network of lanes and houses off every street. Back then there weren't issues with parking - now we have traffic lanes - lanes of a different kind, you might say.

Parking issues in the Glebe Lane have come to a head. There some business operators are being given parking tickets and it is not clear what the permit situation is.

Does it depend on whether you are actually a resident? The council has clarified the issue (at least for me!). There is no parking allowed to the Radio Kerry building/entrance to the car park, is what they say. This would be from the slaughterhouse/Milk Market side, is my

#### THE DEMISE OF THE GURRIER

Whatever happened to that fine old Dublin word 'gurrier'? A lot of people got their proverbials in a twist over the use by Minister Helen McEntee of 'scumbag' in the Dail last week in relation to the Dublin riots. Scumbag is a silly plastic 1950s slang word. It came to prominence in the Dirty Harry films and was funny in that context. But I don't like it. I think it is utterly disrespectful of anyone and should not be used in public discourse. Certainly not by a justice minister. Justice should mean balance. I think she was advised to show a tough side and she went too far. Scum means impure matter rising to the top and has a double meaning too, by the way. It has nothing human about it. A far better, more hard-hitting, yet kinder and more native word would have been 'gurrier'. I immediately

#### **ST BRENDAN**

Brendan the navigator: He is the saint you see everywhere, and the saint you see nowhere. The Sem is called after St Brendan, Mount Brandon and the glen outside Killarney are called after him. He was the explorer who was also, at times, a hermit. This rather complex figure is the patron saint of Kerry. The Irish version is Breanán and several place names bear Brendan's name. But other than a nodding acquaintance, we don't know or celebrate him.

We hear far more about civil wars and ambushes and men with rifles and bombs all to do with awful events of 100 years ago. The fifteen-hundred-year old erudite, spiritual yet enterprising Brendan is far more uplifting. Brendan is, as Frank Lewis and others said last week, 'the story of Kerry.'

One startling realisation from the new campaign by Frank is that our Brendan may be better appreciated abroad than at home. There is no central archive, no real local appreciation of the Kerry saint who enjoyed a cult status for hundreds of years and whose sea voyages are believed to have inspired Christopher Columbus.

Elements of his story are to be found 'in every monastery in Europe', a conference organised by Frank and others heard in Ardfert.



# Sporting Talents Wins Tomás Mary Immaculate College Alumni of the Year award

Kerry football legend, Tomás Ó Sé has been Mannounced as a recipient of this year's Mary Immaculate College Alumni of the Year award. Tomás was presented with his award alongside three other notable graduates, Limerick hurling captain, Declan Hannon; sustainable fashion designer and educator, Miriam Keegan; and RTÉ Broadcaster, Petula Martyn. The annual MIC Alumni awards recognise the remarkable achievements of notable graduates in their personal or professional lives.

Tomás, was awarded an MIC Alumni Award in recognition of his notable sporting talents, both on the pitch—as a five-time All-Ireland winning footballer-and off the pitch as a pundit and sports writer. Originally from Ventry, Tomás is widely regarded as one of the best Gaelic Footballers of the modern game. Representing Kerry on the football pitch, alongside his brothers Darragh and Marc, for over 20 years, Ó Sé has nineteen Munster championship medals, five All-Ireland titles, five All-Stars and three National Football League medals, in addition to one All-Ireland and three Munster Championship medals at U21 level and a Munster Championship title at Minor level. Tomás successfully represented two clubs, winning two County Championships and a Munster Championship with An Gaeltacht before moving to Nemo Rangers (Cork) in 2015 and winning a further two County Championships and a Munster Championship. Tomás was described as the 'best wing back that I've seen play the game' by former Kerry manager Éamonn Fitzmaurice and in 2020 was listed as one of the 20 greatest footballers of the past 50 years by the Irish Independent. Since leaving football, Tomás has gone into punditry alongside fellow MIC Alumni of the Year awardee, Jacqui Hurley, on The Sunday Game and writes for the Irish

Independent. Additionally, Tomás has taken up a management role, coaching Glanmire's minor footballers to a Cork Minor Football Championship win before commencing a role with the Offaly senior team in 2021. In 2022, Tomás returned to Kerry, to become manager of the County's U20 football team. Tomás graduated as a primary teacher from Mary Immaculate College in 2001 and nurtured his football career during his time at college. Teaching in Gaelscoil de hÍde in Fermoy since his graduation, Tomás was made Principal of the school in 2022. He currently resides in Glanmire with his wife Orla and four children. On receiving the award Tomás thanked Mary Immaculate College for all it had given him and for the relationships he had formed whilst a student there.

Speaking at the awards ceremony, Tomás said: "It's a huge honour to be given this award. I really enjoyed my time at MIC and made life-long friends here. I was a shy lad when I came into the College and had a desperate fear of teaching and it's not until you look back that you realise the help you were given along the way. There was a time there I didn't even think I'd graduate so I was very surprised and delighted to hear that I was to get this award! From the sporting side I was very ambitious when I was in College and I think that MIC, if anything, pushed me along further. The people I met and crossed path with her thought me a lot about leadership, about communication and about bringing people along with you, and I've valued that throughout my life."

## MINISTER FOR HEALTH ANNOUNCES FREE 'FLU VACCINE TO BE EXTENDED TO CHILDREN AGED BETWEEN 13 AND 17

Minister for Health Stephen Donnelly has announced that the nasal spray 'flu vaccine is being made available free of charge to children aged 13 to 17 from next Monday 3 December.

The announcement means that all children aged 2 to 17 are now eligible for the 'flu vaccine as part of the 2023/2024 seasonal 'flu vaccination programme.

The nasal spray flu vaccine, which is available through GPs and pharmacies, and to some groups of children in the primary school setting, is a safe, quick, and pain-free way to protect children from 'flu this winter. The vaccine also reduces the risk of children transmitting infection to others, including older, more vulnerable people.

An injectable vaccine is available for other eligible groups including those aged 65 and over, individuals with a certain health condition and healthcare workers.

As it takes two weeks for the full protective effects of the vaccine to kick in, all eligible people are encouraged to top up their protection as soon as possible.

Dr Horgan is also a historian with a specialist interest in the revolutionary period in County Kerry. He has had four books published in this field: The Men Will Talk to Me – Kerry interviews of Ernie O'Malley (Mercier, Cork, 2012), Dying for The Cause (Mercier, Cork, 2015) and Fighting for The Cause (Mercier, Cork, 2018) as well The Stones Still Speak – The Patriot Graves of Killarney's New Cemetery (2022).

Tim has recently completed a book on the influence of eye diseases on

the cultural and political history of Ireland. A member of the National Graves Association, he is involved in the care of County Kerry's patriotic monuments and graves. Tim Horgan is married to Ruth, has four children and lives in Ballymacelligott.

# Taking Care of Your Christmas Tree

It's a magical time of year with the Christmas Tree takes centre stage in the famiy home. Clonkeen Christmas Tree Farm are sharng their Christmas Tree Care and Christmas Tree Facts with readers of the Killarney Outlook this week to make sure you get as long as possible out of your fresh tree. Make sure the tree has water and you can add

sugar or such to the water. The water will need to be topped up frequently. If the tree has been cut for a number of days take a slice off the base to allow it to absorb water.

Keep the tree away from all heat and heat sources. Place the tree near a door or a window and preferably where there is cooler air.

Good care of the tree may result in a beautiful odour in the area where the tree is placed. It is a good idea to measure the space where the

tree will be before you buy a tree. Remember trees are living things that need care.

#### Christmas Tree Facts

50 / 60 million Christmas Trees are harvested in Europe each year.

The Christmas tree originated in the Baltic states in the 16th century.

The Vatican's first Christmas Tree was erected in 1982.

The tallest Christmas Tree in Ireland is 202 ft and is in Wicklow.

It takes 6 to 10 years to grow an average height Christmas Tree.

Real Christmas Trees are best recycled as wood chippings or mulch.

Real Christmas Trees that end up in landfill will produce harmful emission.

A 6.5ft artificial tree has a carbon footprint equivalent to about 40kg of greenhouse gas emission.

Buying a plastic Christmas tree produced using oilbased materials that is shipped half way around the world is not a sustainable practise.

### DRY EYE

#### WHAT IS DRY EYE?

People with dry eye either don't make enough normal (lubricating) tears or the ones that they make are of poor quality, causing the tears to dry up too quickly and the front of the eye to become dry and irritated. As a result, dry eye can be uncomfortable and cause the eye to produce the watery type of tears. This only helps for a short time – leaving the eye uncomfortable and gritty.

If your eyelids are sore and red, you may also have another condition called blepharitis. Blepharitis is a condition that affects the eyelids making them sore and inflamed. If the eyelid glands become blocked, you may have a condition called meibomian gland dysfunction. It is quite common to have a combination of these conditions.

Dry eye doesn't tend to cause serious damage to the eyes, but it can be very uncomfortable. Severe cases do have a risk of causing long-term damage, but fortunately these are rare.

#### **RISK FACTORS**

Dry eye is much more common in people over the age of 50. This is often because the glands that make the normal tears, and particularly the oily part of the tears, tend to become less effective as you get older. Also the tears tend to spread across the eye less well with age.

Some general health conditions can cause dry eye as a side effect, such as autoimmune diseases and hormonal changes. The condition is also more common in windy, cold, dry and dusty conditions.

If you're concentrating on your computer or smartphone for long periods of time without a break, this may also make your eyes feel dry.

Air conditioning and central heating can make dry eye worse too, as can some medications and general health problems. Smoking has also been linked to dry eye as it may both cause the condition and make it worse.

#### SYMPTOMS

People with dry eye may get some or all of the following symptoms. • A sandy or gritty feeling

Sore eyes

• Uncomfortable and sometimes painful eyes

An itching or burning sensation
Short-term blurred vision

Watery eyes, as if you are crying (having watery eyes can mean you are producing poor-quality tears and actually have dry eyes)

### TREATMENT

Most cases of dry eye tend to be a long-term condition, meaning that you'll need ongoing treatment.

There are lots of different types of drops and gels that can help your eyes feel more comfortable. The best ones don't have preservatives in them, or if they do they contain very gentle preservatives, which helps to reduce irritation. They may also contain an ingredient called sodium hyaluronate, known to be very effective in treating the condition.

It's important to use the correct type of drops. The wrong drops are unlikely to cause any harm, but they won't help as much. If your drops aren't working or you're not sure which drops to use, you're a sight test can help determine the best treatment options.



#### NEW YEAR CHANGES FOR EMPLOYERS TO PREPARE FOR

Revenue's Enhanced Reporting Requirements (ERR) apply in Ireland from 1st January 2024. It requires employers to report details of some payments -"reportable benefits" - including:

 Small benefit – Since January 2022, you can give employees up to two small non-cash benefits each year tax-free - such as gift cards, vouchers, memberships or tickets. They must not exceed €1,000 in total.

 Remote working daily allowance – Employers must now report the total number of days, amount paid and date paid.

· Travel and subsistence - Employers must report reimbursement of business-related travel and subsistence costs, including emergency travel and eating on site.

#### Pension auto-enrolment begins in Q3 2024

Auto-enrolment, the new retirement savings scheme for Irish employees, is expected to begin in the second half of 2024.

Most employees in Ireland who earn more than €20,000 without a pension scheme already will be automatically enrolled into the new system. Employees and employers will initially each pay 1.5% of gross salary into the scheme, with a state top-up. Contributions will rise over 10 years until they reach 6%.

#### Other payroll changes in 2024 are:

- Statutory sick leave increases from 3 days to 5 days. January 01st 2024
- Minimum Wage will increase by €1.40 to €12.70 per hour. January 01st 2024
- Parent's leave will be increased to 9 weeks from August 2024.

#### Board & Lodgings

If board and/or lodgings i.e., meals and/ or a place to live, is part of the minimum wage then the following amounts can be included to make up the national minimum wage rate:

#### Amounts for 2023:

- Meals €1.01 per hour worked
- €26.70 for accommodation only per week or €3.81 per day
- Increased rates from 01 January 2024:
- Meals €114 per hour worked
- €30.00 for accommodation only per week or €4.28 per day

Right to request flexible and remote working to be introduced into law The right to request remote working and the right to request flexible working under the Work Life Balance Act require a code of practice. This code of practice is currently under development at the Workplace Relations Commission. The Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment has indicated that work in this regard is ongoing, with a working group meeting regularly in order to complete the code. No set date has been agreed for its finalisation. However, it is widely expected to be introduced in Q1 of 2024.

#### Kerry Boxer Wins World Bronze

Congratulations to Mary McDonagh of Sliabh Luachra BC, who won a light heavyweight (70kg) bronze medal in the World Junior Champions in Yerevan last Thursday. Siofra Lawless of Four Kings, already guaranteed bronze, beat Georgia's Ana Khvedelidze to secure silver.

Mary beat Akbota Essimekova of Kazakhstan 5-0 to guarantee herself a medal. She put up a fantastic battle against Akansh Phalaswal of India but lost out on the same scoreline (27:30, 27:30, 28:29, 27:30, 27:30). Nonetheless she most definitely did herself, Sliabh Luachra BC, and all of Kerry proud.

Conlan, who famously turned professional after an Olympic bout where he was clearly the more aggressive fighter all through, gave it everything but was always on the back foot after a second round knockdown and the Englishman always had the upper hand. Conlan is taking time to consider his future – I thought it was a bit premature, if not distasteful, of Andy Lee, who has always shown a bit of class, to post what was practically a eulogy to a fighter who hasn't made any announcements.

#### SUPERB MOUNTHAWK CLAIM FIRST O'SULLIVAN CUP TITLE

#### O'Sullivan Cup Final: Mercy Mounthawk 2-14 St. Brendans 1-11



## **HOW TO TAKE** HARDWOOD CUTTINGS

A lot of hardwood cuttings are gown on, outside in prepared beds but if you are only taking a small amount of cuttings you can grow them in pots as well. While taking a hardwood cutting pick a good healthy shoot that has grown in the current year. Next remove any soft growth at the tip of the cutting. Then cut into sections of about 6-10 inches above a bud at the tip with the cut sloping so the water can't rest on it.

Then cut at the base below a bud or pair of buds and then dip the lower bud into some rooting powder. Next prepare a trench that is well dug over and has good drainage or if you are growing them in pots - make sure there is plenty of drainage. Insert the cuttings two thirds into your pots or ground and allow about 4-5 inches between cuttings. Cuttings should be left until the following autumn and remember to water in dry spells.

# A Word of Victory


Welcome back dear student. Here is a verse from one of my favourite songs.... 'When my heart is racing deep inside my chest, when I'm underneath the weight of anxiousness. When fear is raging, and I can't catch my breath; I will remember - You are Faithful still. You have carried me through deeper waters - walked beside me through the fire. Faithful still! You have closed the mouth of bigger lions, conquered even greater giants, gone before me and You always will. You are Faithful still...' These beautiful lyrics are from the worship song 'Faithful Still' by Kings Porch. You can find it on YouTube. The line 'when fear is raging, and I can't catch my breath' resonates with many of us I'm sure. In fearful situations people often gasp for breath. It's a reaction to stress and fear. When things calm down people exhale deeply – a signal that the pressure is easing or over, and the body starts to relax again.

I see many signs around saying, 'Staff Wanted – Immediate Start'. For many reasons it's hard to find staff. In Genesis the Word says that God had created the Earth and the Heavens but there was nothing growing here, because there were no people to cultivate the soil. Isn't that amazing? God needed people to partner with Him to develop the Earth. So, He made the first man – Adam. "Then the Lord God formed the man from the dust of the ground. He breathed the Breath of Life into the man's nostrils, and the man became a living person" (Genesis 2:4-7). 
