

Celtic face epic battle this weekend

CHICKEN POX/VARICELLA ZOSTER

History

Chicken Pox is a highly infectious disease spread by the varicella-zoster virus. Most chicken pox is mild to moderate and self- limiting but serious complications can occur in well and in immunocompromised people with underlying conditions. In UK Data over 76% of people have been exposed to chicken pox by 5 years of age. 90% of people are affected by adolescence. It is worldwide and is endemic in most countries. It is infectious (contagious) from a few days before the rash appears (usually 2-3) until all the lesions are dry and crusted (may take 5-7 days usually but longer in more severe cases). It is not possible to get shingles from someone who has chicken pox. Likewise if you had had chicken pox in the past and have a healthy immune system you cannot get shingles from someone who has chicken pox virus which had been dormant (effectively asleep in your body). It is theoretically possible to get Chicken pox from someone who has active Shingles but in practice this is rare.

Presentation

The virus enters through the upper respiratory tract from another persons' infected secretions or saliva. The incubation period(time taken for illness to develop) is typically 14-21 days. Symptoms include fever (even before rash), headache, off form, abdominal pain, aches and pains followed by the evolution of the traditional rash. The diagnosis of Chicken pox is a clinical one and requires the presence of the various stages of the rash all at the same time. That means you can see a papule (flat red mark), vesicle (water filled blister) and crusted lesion (scab) all at the same time. You may also see some pustules is some lesions get slightly infected or inflamed.

Lesions can occur in the mouth or genital area that are painful and require pain relief. Lesions touching the eyeball need medical attention. Lesions on the face or eyelids away from the eye should be managed like all other lesions.

Management

Maintain a good fluid intake, manage temperature and pain with paracetamol and avoid scratching. Anti-histamines may be used in children over 2 years old to ease itch. Ibuprofen/Nurofen is not recommended in acute chicken pox due to fear more severe infections.

Anti -viral medication is not recommended routinely in children but may be considered in severe cases or those at risk of complications.

High risk situations

Anyone pregnant who is not immune to chicken pox and becomes exposed should seek immediate medical advice. People with significant underlying immune deficiency states are also at high risk of complications and should seek advice on treatment, especially those on oral steroids, cancer treatment, older people, HIV, post transplant, people on immunosuppression medication.

Complications

Secondary skin infection can occur and require antibiotics as can Pneumonia.

Meningitis and encephalitis (brain infection) is rare, as is bleeding problems but both require hospitalisation.

Secondary bacterial infection, especially Group A strep should be looked for. Prevention

Mass vaccination is not available in Ireland or the UK. In the USA and Australia where routine chicken pox vaccine is offered there appeared to be an increase in Shingles rates. Some studies suggest this is not significant. The vaccine is available for purchase and can be discussed with your doctor.

Prognosis

Crude mortality rates from chicken pox are 2-4 per 100,000.

New scheme to help musicians launched

A Questions and Answer style information session developed where queries were dealt with in a practical way. The session was organised by the Arts Service at Kerry County Council and delivered by Music Network. Little by Little.... A Little becomes a Lot.... Night nurses, Counselling, Grants and <u>Research....Where the money is spent</u>

As the Killarney/South Kerry Branch of the Irish Cancer Society prepare for their biggest annual fundraiser, Strictly Come Dancing, Killarney Outlook take a look at the work

undertaken by the Irish Cancer Society here To date, over €165,000 has been raised through Strictly Come Dancing and with this year's show guaranteed to be another sell out, it is important to point out that all the money raised stays local.

Every 3 minutes in Ireland someone gets a cancer diagnosis. Every hour someone dies from cancer. Incidence of cancer in Ireland is growing but more people are surviving cancer than ever before.

The Irish Cancer Society is funding lifesaving research to improve methods of detection and treatment, providing information and support to those affected by cancer, and raising awareness of how cancer can be prevented. Most recent data from the National Cancer Registry of Ireland shows that more than 36,500 people were diagnosed with cancer in 2013, 1,277 of these people are from Kerry.

Here is a breakdown of the most common cancers in Kerry in 2013:

 368 non-melanoma skin cancer;
 93 breast cancer; • 107 prostate cancer; • 75 lung cancer • 97 bowel cancer; (33 melanoma skin cancer) In 2016 the Society invested €3.2m in cancer research initiatives and projects throughout Ireland. Since 2010, the Society has committed over €20 million to cancer research making it the leading voluntary funder of cancer research in Ireland. This investment has supported more than 150 cancer researchers, from laboratory researchers to research nurses to population scientists to work on a diverse range of individual or collaborative projects that will ultimately lead to better ways of diagnosing and treating cancer. Some of these initiatives include significant investments in collaborative cancer research centres, such as, BREAST-PREDICT, a €7.5m investment focused exclusively on breast cancer research, and Blood Cancer Network Ireland, a €2.3m clinical research network for blood cancers, co-funded by Science Foundation Ireland.

SUPPORT: • The Freephone Cancer Nurseline 1800 200 700 answered 4,333 enquiries in 2016, with 63 enquiries from Kerry. The Nurseline is staffed by Cancer Nurses, Monday – Friday from 10am to 4pm, to provide confidential support and information to anyone affected by cancer.

• The Daffodil Centres available in 13 hospitals around the country, allow people affected by cancer to speak directly to a Cancer Nurse and to avail of information about cancer. A total of 38,562 contacts were made nationally with the Daffodil Centres.

• The Society sent 5,094 cancer information booklets and leaflets free of charge to Kerry,

while a total of 234,793 were distributed nationally.

• 77 cancer patients in Kerry received 369 nights of care through the Society's Night Nursing service. Over the course of 2016 Night Nurses provided 8,008 nights of care to 1,934 patients around the country, in their homes.

• 298 journeys were facilitated for 33 patients from Kerry who used the Volunteer Driver Service. The Service currently operates in 21 hospitals around the country and transports patients to and from their chemotherapy treatment. Nationally drivers clocked up 1,119,170 km as they facilitated 11,538 journeys for 1,162 patients.

• Grants totalling €7,100 were provided to 12 families in Kerry through the Society's Financial Support Programme which supports parents of children who are undergoing cancer treatment and experiencing financial hardship. Financial Support to the value of €248,054 was provided to 402 cancer patients across the country.

• Counselling sessions were provide in Kerry through Recovery Haven, providing emotional support to cancer patients and their families during and after their cancer journey. $\leq 25,920$ was granted to the centre to cover counselling costs and a total of $\leq 352,892$ was granted across the country in 2016. The Irish Cancer Society also supports local cancer support centres through training, organisational consultancy and grants for approved psycho-social programmes - ≤ 750 was granted to Kerry Cancer Support Group and $\leq 4,750$ was granted to Recovery Haven.

•42 patients from Kerry were granted a total of €11,080 from the Travel2Care transportation assistance fund made available by the National Cancer Control Programme (NCCP) and administered by the Irish Cancer Society. This fund is available to patients travelling to the eight designated cancer care centres in Ireland. In total 1,130 patients were assisted with transport costs to the sum of €270,675 in 2016.

PREVENTION: Four out of 10 cancers can be



awareness campaigns and a number of programs designed to raise awareness of cancer symptoms, cancer prevention and to support people to make lifestyle changes that can help reduce their risk of cancer. Initiatives include the PREVENT Programme aimed at educating communities on cancer prevention and early detection, Fit for Work and Life – an 8-week community health and wellbeing programme and the X-Hale initiative which aims to decrease the number of young people smoking.

• The X-HALE initiative aims to decrease the number of young people smoking. A total of \in 350 was awarded to a youth group in Kerry in 2016 to create their own anti-smoking campaign to encourage their peers and communities to be tobacco free. The Irish Cance Advocacy team is working to improve the lives of people with cancer and reduce the risk of people getting cancer, by informing and influencing Government policy and legislation, including:

• Lobbying for a reduction in the Drugs Payment Scheme threshold (currently set at €144)

• Calling for the prescription charge to be abolished (currently set at €2.50 per item)

 Campaigning against high hospital car parking charges

 Extending cancer screening programmes You are helping us by raising vital funds to support our work. For example:

• €30 covers the cost of supplying a GP Health Clinic with a supply of cancer literature for one year

• €60 will provide in-depth consultations on our Cancer Nurseline for three people

• €120 pays for five Spill Kits for Volunteer Drivers in the event a patient is ill in their car • €350 will cover the cost of one night of Night Nursing.



Killarney mourns the late John Kelly, R.I.P.



NEWS DESK

The death of John Kelly of Coolcoslough on Monday morning has cast a pall of gloom over an area far wider than his own beloved Spa/ Lissivigeen. The suddeness of his departure has shocked all who knew and respected him. The word Polymath could have been coined with John in mind. His knowledge and expertise embraced a vast range of topics and pursuits. He was a farmer, psychiatric nurse, oarsman, masseur, footballer, golfer, political activist and extremely able administrator.

His great love for people found full and fruitful expression in his life as a psychiatric nurse. He had deep affection for and empathy with those who were vulnerable and in need of care and support. He made a particularly important contribution when visiting and supporting people in their own homes. He understood that for many living and interacting in their own community offered the best opportunity of having a fulfilled life. He was chairman of the Saint Finan's Historical Society that co-ordinated the collection of the material that became the definitive history of the hospital - A Medical, Social and Sporting History [1852-2012]. The publication is the invaluable telling of the evolution of psychiatric care and is also a chronicle of society in Killarney and Kerry over one hundred and sixty years.

John had a deep affection for Killarney Lakes and its ancient sport of rowing. He was an

oarsman in his younger years and thereafter became very active as an administrator. His contribution in this regard helped revitalise Killarney's oldest sport event when its future looked somewhat bleak.

His professional involvement with people in their own community convinced him that a vibrant rural countryside was essential. This deeply held conviction saw him actively involved in the campaign to ensure that people could live and work in or close to where they were born and reared.

Gaelic football, especially with the Spa Club, was deep in his heart and soul. He was part of the 1966 team that won for the Club its first and vitally important O'Donoghue Cup. When his playing days ended he became a committed and very able administrator. He held virtually every officer position, including that of Cathaoirleach. He was a wonderfully effective and all embracing P.R.O. for the Club and ensured that his weekly notes informed locals and exiles of all that was happening in the place that they loved.

There are many players at club and county

level whose post-match aches and pains were eased by John's strong but gentle hands. He greatly enjoyed those sessions as they allowed him the opportunity to closely interact with sportsmen of all levels, including some of Kerry's finest.

In the year 2014 the Spa Club initiated an annual awards ceremony. John Kelly was the first recipient of the Lifetime Achievement award. Last Saturday at the fourth annual function his absence was noted and best wishes were forwarded. None of us present anticipated that cruel fate was soon to intervene and rob us of a man whose life of service and friendship enriched each and every person he encountered in his long and varied life of giving and caring.

We extend our deepest sympathy to Sheila, their five fine children, grandchildren, his sisters and very many friends. We hope and pray that memories of a life well lived will be their consolation and inspiration.

ESRI wants closer links between PLC courses and the jobs market

Post Leaving Cert (PLC) courses in the Further Education and Training (FET) system provide an attractive alternative to higher education and have established a link between second level and third level. The CAO route isn't always the best one after the Leaving Cert. Some may not be ready for higher education while others may not secure a CAO course offer or may be unhappy with the offer received. Colleges of Further Education throughout the country offer PLC courses leading to awards at QQI FET Level 5 (Certificate) and QQI FET Level 6 (Advanced Certificate) from Quality and Qualifications Ireland (QQI).

A PLC course is ideal for a person who has completed the Leaving Cert and requires further vocational education and training to enhance her/his employment prospects. A PLC course provides anyone who is unsure of her/ his career preferences with the opportunity to try out a course before committing to a third level course. It's also tailor made for a student who has completed the Leaving Cert Applied (LCA) or who didn't achieve sufficient points in the Leaving Cert for entry to a CAO course. A PLC course is perfect for a mature student, who may not have completed senior cycle but has the capacity to benefit from the PLC course.

PLC courses are full time, mainly one year, offering an integrated curriculum of academic work, practical work and work experience. The courses are an

end in themselves leading directly to employment in many cases. Increasingly, PLC's are used as an alternative entry route to third level education. Last year, about 16,000 applications to the CAO were from students with a PLC gualification. This is a very healthy development as it provides an alternative route into third level. Another attraction of PLC courses is their availability nationwide at nominal cost in Colleges of Further Education. There are a number of colleges in Kerry providing an extensive range of PLC courses. These include Kerry College of Further Education (KCFE Tralee), North Kerry College of Further Education (NKC Listowel), St. Joseph's Secondary School (Ballybunion), Killarney Community College and O Connell Centre (Caherciveen).

A recent Economic and Social (ESRI) Research Institute evaluation has highlighted the fact that PLC courses are producing too many hairdressers, beauticians, childcare, health and community service workers and not enough people with qualifications that the economy needs. According to the ESRI evaluation, the PLC sector, which accommodates over 30,000 students annually, appears to be poorly connected to the requirements of the labour market. Minister Richard Bruton is aware that more needs to be done to ensure that PLC courses respond to labour demands. The Minister wants more coordination at local level on PLC course provision. He also wants employer engagement with PLC providers to become mandatory for new job specific PLC course proposals.

Through the higher education links scheme (HELS), the PLC courses provide an alternative route into CAO courses other than Leaving Cert exam results. Over forty higher education institutions including universities, institutes of technology and private colleges offer a variety of courses to PLC graduates. A PLC course normally involves completing eight modules in the academic year. Students' entry to CAO colleges is then based on a scoring system for PLC awards achieved at Level 5 and/or Level 6 on the National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ). Full details about the scoring system are available on the QQI website, www.qqi.ie.

There isn't а centralised application system for PLC courses. Each PLC college looks after its own application process. requirements normally Entrv consist of Leaving Cert standard of education and satisfactory performance at interview. Mature applicants are assessed on their life's experiences. PLC colleges are now accepting applications so apply early as places on the most popular courses fill up quickly. Contact your local PLC course provider, check the PLC colleges' websites or access all the relevant information on www.qualifax. ie or the FET course hub, www. fetchcourses.ie.





PRE-LETTING EXPENDITURE IN RESPECT OF VACANT RESIDENTIAL PREMISES

Expenses incurred on a vacant residential premises prior to it being first let after a period of non-occupancy are allowable as a deduction against rental income from that premises.

The premises must have been vacant for at least 12 months and then let as a residential premises between 25th December 2017 (the date of the passing of the Finance Act 2017) and 31 December 2021.

The expenditure must have been incurred in the 12 months before the premises is let as a residential premises.

The deduction authorised is capped at €5,000 per vacant premises.

If the person who incurs the expenditure ceases to let the property as a residential premises within 4 years of the first letting the deduction will be clawed-back in the year in which the property ceases to be let as a residential premises. This cessation can be either on sale of the property or change of use from rented residential property. The claw-back will be made by deeming the deduction previously allowed to be a Case V profit or gain of the year of cessation.

Jack Barry was later joined on the field by his brother Andrew making it a fantastic family





FORGET TIME MANAGEMENT. TRY ATTENTION MANAGEMENT:

You can't manufacture time and you can't catch up on it or trade bad hours for good ones either. What you can manage, however, is your attention. Attention is a resource we all possess. Your attention reflects your conscious decisions about which activities will occupy your time. You are where your attention is, not necessarily where your body is.

The first step is to precisely understand your priorities. There's a big difference between managing your attention to accomplish priorities and checking off items on your todo list. Your natural tendency is to do what is fun, convenient, or absolutely necessary at any given time--but your true priorities may not fit into any of those categories. So, ask yourself, "If I could accomplish only one thing right now, what would that one thing be?" Your answer will quickly identify your top priority, which is where you should be directing your attention. Also ask yourself these questions to clarify your priorities:

What are you doing to prioritise your day and develop an action plan when you are inevitably interrupted? What is okay to say "no" to? How will you handle interruptions when they arise? Do you hold an assumption that you must respond to any interruption?

Knowing where attention should go isn't going to help if you can't stay there. Distractions destroy focused attention and it is possible to make great strides in creating an environment that promotes and protects attention.

Be sure to distinguish between "urgent" and "important" activities. Important activities are beneficial and should be accomplished, if not right away, then eventually. Urgent activities are time sensitive, but not necessarily crucial to your bigger goals.

Dwight D. Eisenhower, the World War II general who went on to become President of the United States, used what is now called the Eisenhower Method for managing attention. After identifying the tasks confronting him, he drew a square and divided it into four quadrants. Each task was then designated to one of the four quadrants, according to which of the 4 D's was the most appropriate: Do it, dump it, delegate it, or defer it.

As you identify priorities, be realistic about what you can accomplish. Be honest with yourself about what you truly want to achieve in your life and work. Although important tasks are your top priorities, most of the time these are not the things that appear to be urgent. Don't be fooled into thinking that whatever seems urgent is worth taking your attention from your most important goal.

Remember, be patient with yourself as you start this process. These essential skills take time to cultivate and explore to find the strategies



that help each of us stay effective in turbulent times.

THIS HEDGEHOG SWAM HIS WAY TO RECOVERY:

A hedgehog in Scotland was found in November near Alness and the Highlands and taken to a local SPCA after he was stranded outside in frigid temperatures.

Once he uncurled his body — hedgehogs roll into a ball when they're afraid — it was found that his hind legs were not functioning. To help cure this, an SPCA veterinarian recommended physiotherapy.

The spiny mammal was placed in a shallow bath of water and closely supervised by Nicola Turnbull, head of small mammals at the SPCA branch during his swims to build up strength in his hind legs without having to bear any weight. He took to swimming so well that he is now named Phelps after Olympic swimmer Michael Phelps.

It took just seven days of swimming for Phelps to reclaim the use of his back legs and he will be released back into the wild when the weather in Scotland becomes warmer.

KILLED BY HIS OWN FACIAL HAIR:

On the side of St. Stephan's Church in the town of Braunau am Inn on the Austrian-German border, there is a large stone relief of a man with an unusually long beard stretching down past his feet and it is a fitting monument to an important man who was killed by his own beard.

Hans Steininger, a 16th-century burgomaster of Braunau am Inn, was a popular town mayor, serving multiple terms, but in 1567, he met an unusual end. On September 28th of that year, there was a large fire in the town that caused a general panic. Mayor Steininger usually kept his beard hair rolled up and stuffed in a pocket, but during the commotion he was running around with it hanging free. In the midst of the chaos, he managed to step on his own beard, sending him tumbling down a flight of stairs and breaking his neck.

Much about his life and role as a leader have not survived the centuries since his death, but his incredible beard, which is said to have been over four and a half feet long, looms large in the town's cultural memory and is on display in the local district museum.

DESPERATE MOTHER CALLED 911 SAYING SHE HAD NO FOOD FOR HER CHILDREN:

In an unusual emergency call, a mother of four young children dialled 911a few weeks ago,

saying she had run out of options. "I went to local churches and everything, trying to find food for my children," she told the dispatcher. "My kids have not eaten since yesterday."

"This is for police only," the dispatcher said. "It's not for this."

The mother from Camden, New Jersey, said she was waiting for food stamps, which would take at least a month. She had no money, transportation or phone service, and the only number she was able to call was 911.

"If I could get some type of assistance," she pleaded. "If someone could come out. Help me with anything."

Another dispatcher overheard the call and requested an officer go to the woman's residence to check on the family. "It made me sad. I couldn't imagine not being able to provide for my child," the second dispatcher who is also a mother later explained.

When Camden County Officer David Hinton arrived at the apartment, he noticed there was no food, so he went to a local restaurant to bring food back to the family. The second dispatcher also told her mother, Sgt. Tracy Seigel, about the situation. And together, along with retired Lt. Scott Bagby and Lt. Janell Simpson, they pooled their money and bought the family 10 bags of groceries, which included supplies like toiletries, milk and bread.

"The family was overwhelmed and extremely thankful for the unexpected surprise," a spokesperson for the Camden County Police Department said and named Sgt. Seigel and Officer Hinton as officers of the week for going "above and beyond the call of duty to help those in need."

According to the United States Department of Agriculture's Economic Research Service, 12.3% of U.S. households, or 15.6 million households, were food insecure in 2016. Food insecure means that members of the household have a difficult time getting enough to eat at some point during the year because they lack resources. Usually, children are shielded from hunger, and adults will go without food so younger members can eat. But 3.1 million households still had children who experienced food insecurity, which was similar to prerecession levels in 2007.

STRANGER ON A TRAIN PAYS A DISTRAUGHT WOMAN'S ELECTRICITY BILL:

An act of kindness by a stranger on a train has spurred a young woman to recount his goodwill on social media and the Israeli public has responded with utter joy.

According Daniel Danino, a woman on the train was in tears begging the Israelie Electric Company to be considerate about her family's circumstances and reconnect their electricity despite an outstanding debt of nearly €400.

A man sitting nearby overheard the young woman pleading with the electric company and not only offered to pay the bill, but gave the electric company his credit-card information over the phone right there on the train.

"Today I suddenly hear a conversation of a young female soldier like me who is on the

salary of single-parent soldiers. They cut off the electricity and she cries hysterically, and suddenly an angel comes from nowhere, I get off the train with hope and faith in people. There are still those who do things for others without expecting anything in return. I was left with my mouth hanging open, speechless, and full of a sense of pride in being a part of this nation that galvanises to help others during times of distress."

WOMAN FINED £600 FOR PUTTING CARDBOARD BOX IN WRONG WASTE BIN:

Alison Mapletoft a mother-of-two in East Sussex, South East England has been handed a £600 fine and threatened with possible time behind bars - because she accidentally put a cardboard box in the wrong bin.

Enforcement firm 3GS, who were hired by Brighton and Hove City Council, fined the 39-year-old after the bin blunder when she placed a single cardboard box in a communal recycling bin rather than disposing it with other commercial waste related to her small business.

Snoopers sorted through the communal bin and found the cardboard box before sending her a fixed penalty notice, claiming she was essentially fly-tipping.

She was fined £300 for the initial offence of putting the box in the wrong bin and a second £300 for not having a waste disposal contract in place for her home-based scarf and cushion company though Ms. Mapletoft says she doesn't really have any business waste because she doesn't make or sell her goods from my home

3GS has since warned her she faces a court appearance or even jail time if she fails to pay

up - a threat issued at Christmas.

A spokesperson for Brighton and Hove Council said: "Anyone who feels they have been wrongly given a fixed penalty notice can make a representation to 3GS in the first instance. If they are still concerned, or wish to give more general feedback, they can write to the council. "Any cases referred to the council are reviewed on an individual basis to ensure that fixed penalty notices are issued correctly."

HORSE COLLAPSED AND WAS MOMENTS FROM BEING PUT DOWN WHEN HER STABLE MATE REVIVED HER:

Donald MacIntyre and wife Jane Lipington own 23 shire horses on their farm in Somerset, England. Two of the horses, a 16-year-old mare named Beatrice and an 11-year-old stallion named Beau, have been stablemates for years. Recently, Beatrice collapsed in her stable from severe abdominal pain. The longer she was incapacitated, the greater the risk of dying from organ failure.

For the next six hours, Donald, Jane and their farm workers worked tirelessly to pull the one-ton mare to her feet using straps and machinery, they used everything they could, including creating a kind of pulley system with their tractor and massive straps but she was far too heavy.

Meanwhile, her heart rate and blood pressure continued to skyrocket.

Donald and Jane prepared themselves for the worst. They knew that putting down their beloved Beatrice was imminent, while they were waiting Jane remembered Beau needed to be let out of his stall, she opened Beau's door but instead of walking toward the yard, he went right over to Beatrice, hung his neck over the divider of Beatrice's stall and began biting her neck and using his teeth to pull up her head.

In mere minutes, Beatrice rolled over onto her other side... and miraculously stood up! She has since made a full recovery.



FOCUS ON HEDGING

Hedges can make a much more natural background to a garden than a wall or a fence. They can provide shelter and are cheaper and require a small amount of maintenance. Because a hedge allows the wind to filter through, it reduces its velocity. Tall or low growing, clipped or informal, there is a hedging plant for every purpose. One thing to remember about a hedge is that it is intended to be a permanent feature in the garden so therefore should be chosen with care and planted in well prepared soil. To choose he right hedge for your garden here are a few pointers

to think about The type of soil you have.

How exposed the garden is, i.e what direction is it facing? The eventual height and width the hedge will be Does it need to be every

When you have chosen the type of hedge that you want, its time to prepare the soil. Start prepping the soil by digging thoroughly and forking in some well rotted farmyard manure. Hedges can be planted all year round but the ideal time is between November and March as all heding plants will be dormant at this time. What that means is that when you go to buy your hedging plants they are lifted straight from the ground and are called bare-rooted hedging. This enables you to replant straight back into the ground when you get them home. Just make sure that when planting that the roots are spread out well as this will encourage them to root quickly when the growing season starts. If you have missed the bare rooted season at the end of March you can plant container grown hedging all year round. Next week I will focus on trees.

Welcome back dear reader last week we saw how the fear of God has been forgotten and cast aside by some in society. But just to recap, do not mistake humans making others submit in fear to tradition and herd mentality as the fear of God, as that is not Biblical! True fear of God will operate through the characteristic of humility. "In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to His own advantage; rather He made Himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. as a man. He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to death - even death on a cross! Therefore God exalted Him to the highest place and gave Him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in beaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father."
