elegates from across the North West of Europe as well as from around Ireland were in Killarney last week for the launch of the INTERREG North West Europe Creating new local Community Energy Co-ops (ECCO) project. The project will be rolled out in the region by South Kerry Development Partnership CLG. (SKDP) who are one of eleven partners in the project. Other partners are based in Belgium, France, The Netherlands, Germany and Wales and the project is aimed at looking at the opportunities that exist for communities in these regions through developing the renewable energy assets that exist in their areas. The project is being supported by both The Department of Rural & Community Development and the Department of Climate Action as well as Kerry Group and FEXCO and will run for the next three vears. Project manager with SKDP Seán de Buitléar said that there are

potentially significant economic and social benefits available to the communities in South Kerry from owning and developing the renewable energy assets that exist in their areas. "Many communities across Europe have realised the potential the renewable energy sector offers for them and have embraced it fully. We hope to be able to benefit from our partners knowledge and experience and accelerate the development of such community owned co-ops in the region" Seán said.

Welcoming delegates at the event SKDP CEO Noel Spillane thanked both Departments for their support for the project saying that their financial contribution means the SKDP can take a full part in the project. "It is also hugely positive for us that both FEXCO and Kerry Group, two hugely successful indigenous companies, have come on board to support this project and it shows their commitment to the development of communities in the county" Noel said.

Speaking at the launch Mr. Enda Gallagher of the Department of Climate Action welcomed the involvement of SKDP in the project saying that while Ireland has lagged behind its European counterparts in relation to the development of the community owned energy projects sector, this project offers us an excellent chance to move forward in this area. He added that getting communities involved with such projects has been identified by the Department as being very important in the development of the energy sector in the country going forward. The project will run for three years and will explore and develop some of the opportunities that exist in the energy sector for the communities of South Kerry.

Minister Simon Harris is urging people to give blood and help restore blood supplies for patients, after clinics nationwide were cancelled

due to the impact of Storm Emma. The Minister said "1 in 4 people will require a blood transfusion at some time in their lives. For many people that time is now, and our blood supply has been severely depleted over the last week", the Minister said. "The Irish Blood Transfusion Service has kept up its supply to hospitals during the severe weather, but hasn't been able to hold clinics. Now they have just 3 days supply on average across all groups and just 2 days of O negative. "I'm now asking blood donors, and those who would like to be blood donors, to visit a clinic in

the coming weeks.

"Every week, hundreds of patients in hospitals all around the country are helped in their recovery by the ready availability of blood. I want to acknowledge the generosity of donors and the work of the IBTS in maintaining this vital supply.

"The IBTS is aiming to collect 7,000 donations between now and St Patrick's weekend, and I'm appealing to those who able to do so to give blood and make a vital difference to those in need."

Mission Road crossing



At the recent Killarney Municipal Area Meeting, Councillor Michael Gleeson asked that Kerry County Council would take due cognisance of the large numbers of people crossing Mission Road as they walk to and from Killarney House and Gardens and proceed in conjunction with the TII in the development of a controlled pedestrian crossing.

Kerry County Council replied that they will carry out traffic and pedestrian surveys to determine if a crossing is warranted at this location and they will revert back with details of this survey.

Port Road works welcomed

Cllr. John Sheahan has welcomed the road works at Port Road, Killarney. "I have raised those issues on many occasions at the Killarney Municipal area meetings", he told the Killarney Outlook.

The relocating of the pedestrian crossing and realignment of the footpath will incorporate a system that will help prevent vehicles from parking illegally which has been the root cause of many serious issues at this location.

I look forward to seeing this area when works are complete and that this will be a much safer environment for everyone

Public Lighting needs upgrading

Cllr, Michael Gleeson also raised the issue of the poor standard of public lighting in Ballyspillane Housing Estate. He called on the Council to make financial provision for its upgrading. "Health and Safety demands that appropriate action is taken", he said.

Kerry County Council replied that they operate and maintain 71 No. public lights within Ballyspillane and Hazelwood Drive. As part of routine maintenance, as any lanterns are damaged or are beyond economical repair, we then change them out for an LED lantern. As outlined in the Public Lighting Policy, any requests for public lights to be provided and operated by Kerry County Council



will be assessed annually having regard to the available resources and the policy.

Councillor Gleeson strongly urged the Council to give highest possible priority to both of these very urgent issues.

Call for more beds in Kerry University Hospital

Michael Healy Rae, TD, has raised in the Dail, what he calls a massive problem in County Kerry and all of Ireland with regards to waiting lists and trolleys in our hospitals.

In a recent address in the dail, Deputy Healy Rae said: "These waiting times are unacceptable and specific action must be taken to decrease waiting times in places such as Kerry University Hospital. One such action that can decrease waiting times and the amount of people on trolleys is an increase in the amount of beds.

Due to the overcrowding and trolly crisis the General Manager of Kerry County Hospital, Fergal Grimes, has submitted a request and plan to the HSE and South/ South West Hospital Group for 40 more beds in Kerry County Hospital.

"This plan is a fantastic proposal that must be implemented to improve the healthcare of the people of Kerry", Cllr. Healy Rae said.

"Due to its importance, I raised the issue in the Dáil to the

Taoiseach but unfortunately, the Government refused to make any specific commitments to the plan. "This is why I am formally calling upon the Government and the South/ South West Hospital Group to review Kerry County Hospital's plan and implement it immediately, he added.

DRIVERS AND CYCLISTS

ADVICE FOR DRIVERS AND CYCLISTS SO THAT ROADS ARE SHARED SAFELY

Many people are getting back on their bikes or taking up cycling as the most convenient (and cheapest) way to get around

The following are key tips for safer and confident cycling.

Be aware of the driver's blind spot when passing lorries and buses. It's often safer to hang back. Pay attention to what is going on around you and be aware of what other road users might do.

Try to make eye contact with drivers so that you know they have seen you.

Ride assertively, away from the gutter. If the road is too narrow for vehicles to pass you safely, it may be better to ride in the middle of the lane to prevent dangerous overtaking.

Ride in a straight line past parked cars, rather than dodge between them, and allow at least a full door's width between you in case the doors are suddenly opened.

Wait in front of other vehicles at traffic lights. Use the advanced stop line for cyclists if there is one.

Don't ride through red traffic lights.

Use appropriate hand signals when making a left or right turn.

Wear bright clothing in the day and reflective clothing or accessories at night.

Use lights after dark; white at the front and red at the rear.

Wear a helmet.

Keep up to date with your knowledge of the Rules of the Road and follow its advice.

RULES FOR CYCLISTS:

Cyclists have the same rights on the road and as a driver you should remember that you are sharing the road with cyclists.

Cyclists are more vulnerable than car users take particular care near cyclists and give them plenty of room at all times.



Expect cyclists in unexpected places – always check your mirrors for cyclists before turning. If you're uncertain as to the intention of another road user - including cyclists - hold back rather than risk a wrong assumption.

Watch out for cyclists coming up on your near side when turning left or moving over to the left - check mirrors and blind spotscarefully.

Give as much room as practically possible when over-taking a cycle

When parking check the door mirror and look behind you before you open the door to make sure you don't hit a cyclist.

When turning left allow any cyclist ahead of you to pass the junction rather than overtake them and turn sharply across their front wheel. Don't overtake a cyclist if you can see that the road narrows ahead - if they're travelling faster than you think you could end up squeezing them off the road.

Don't drive aggressively around cyclists or sound your horn

Cyclists may be travelling faster than you think (could be 20mph plus) - judge their approaching speed with care before pulling out at a junction.

Take special care on roundabouts - you must give way to any vehicle approaching from the right and that includes cyclists.

Be prepared to wait behind a cyclist turning right in the same way you would for a car - rather than squeezing past or getting impatient.

Don't park in cycle lanes - you could be forcing a cyclist into a dangerous situation and will be committing a road traffic offence if you drive or park in a cycle lane marked with a solid white line.

Match your speed to the conditions and make sure you will be able to stop well within the distance that you can see to be clear on country roads there could be a group of cyclists, a horse rider or pedestrians around the next bend.

At night, use dipped headlights when approaching cyclists as you would when approaching any other road user.

Allow cyclists extra room in wet weather as surfaces will be wet and slippery.

Consider riding a bicycle for some of your own journeys to get a better understanding of the risks cyclists face.

USING JUMP LEADS

How to use jump leads without hurting yourself or damaging either car

Unless you know what you're doing, delving under the bonnet to check for or correct faults can be dangerous. We generally recommend that you seek professional assistance.

Check the vehicle handbook before using jump leads. All include general advice on jump starting but some include model specific procedures. If this is the case you must follow the manufacturer's procedure rather than the steps described below. Jump starting a vehicle can be a safe procedure however and damage can be avoided if a few simple rules are followed:



SAFETY RULES

Keep metal objects out of the way - rings, watch straps, hand tools, clips or stray wires just brushing a battery post can cause a spark, possibly exploding the battery and releasing the acid.

Don't attempt to jump-start a battery that is leaking or looks damaged – it could explode.

Avoid smoking or naked flames - batteries give off flammable gases so an explosion could result.

Keep hands well away and avoid loose fitting clothing, particularly scarves or neckties - with the engine running it's easy to get caught-up and seriously injured on moving parts like pulleys or belts.

Don't use jump leads if they're damaged broken conductors or damaged clamps can overheat and may catch fire.

Over the next year he rode horses for a various owners. He was placed a number of times and showed great potential as an up and coming young jockey. Jonjo's competitive nature meant that he would not be content until he rode his first winner. Unfortunately, it was not to be! On 2nd March 2013, aged just 19, Jonjo had a life changing accident while racing at Tyrella Point to Point. A serious spinal injury at the c3 and c4 level has seen Jonjo paralysed from the neck. Jonjo, along with his family and friends, remain very hopeful for an independent and fulfilling future.

You may be due a refund of some of the tax you paid for the years 2014 to 2017. To check if you are, you will need to review your tax for those particular years.

For 2017, all pay and tax details may not yet be on Revenue's record. If so, you will need to supply these details from either a P60 or P45 available from the relevant employer.

MARGARET'S RAMBLINGS

WILDLIFE PHOTOGRAPHER OF THE YEAR AWARD

A photo of a man and a gorilla sharing a sweet embrace has earned Jo-Anne McArthur the coveted title of the Wildlife Photographer of the Year People's Choice Award.

Pikin the gorilla had originally been captured by poachers with the intent of using her for bushmeat. Ape Action Africa charity rescued her and brought her to an animal sanctuary in Cameroon.

In the winning photo, Pikin was being transferred to a new sanctuary when the sedatives wore off and she woke up. While some animals might have exhibited discomfort towards finding themselves in a moving car, she woke up in the arms of her

caretaker Apollinaire Ndohoudou who shares a bond with Pikin; not just because he helped rescue her from the poachers, but also because he too was forced out of his home in Chad because of a civil war. Upon rebuilding his life in Cameroon, he found a passion for helping displaced wildlife – just like Pikin.

The competition, which was held by the British Natural History Museum received almost 50,000 entries from professionals and amateurs across 92 countries and Ms. McArthur's photo was chosen as the winner by 20,000 nature fans that voted on a shortlist of 24 photographs. DID YOU KNOW?

On 19 August 1960 Russia launched Sputnik 5 (also known as Korabl-Sputnik 2) which carried the dogs Belka and Strelka, along with a grey rabbit, 40 mice, 2 rats, and 15 flasks of fruit flies and plants. It was the first spacecraft to carry animals into orbit and return them alive. One of Strelka's pups, Pushinka, bred and born after her mission, was given to US President John F Kennedy as a present to Caroline Kennedy by Nikita Khrushchev in 1961, and many descendants are known to exist. Pushinka soon settled in to the White House and used climb a ladder up to Caroline's playhouse and then slide down the metal chute.

So when no one showed up to one of his library session recently, his owner posted some lonesome looking photos of the greyhound to Facebook to encourage participation and thousands of people from across the USA started clamouring to cheer him up.

The 10-year-old greyhound is a retired race dog who now works as a certified therapy dog in White Bear Lake, Minnesota. Once a week at the city library, Sting lets children read to him for the Paws to Read programme – an initiative that lets children practice their reading skills by reading to complacent dogs. He usually spends an hour at the library so at least three children can get 20 minutes of reading time.

John Muellner, Stings owner posted "Unfortunately nobody signed up to read to Sting at the White Bear Lake library tonight. If you know of a 4 to 8yr old who would like to read to a dog, please contact the White Bear Lake library by phone or their website about the Paws to Read program".

Much to the surprise of Mr. Muellner and the library staff, the phones immediately started ringing off the hook with people asking if they could get people to hold the phone to Sting's ear so they could read to him.

WAS ONE OF THE WORLD'S MOST IRREPLACEABLE BOOKS USED AS A CUTTING BOARD?

Though the Anglo-Saxon period in England lasted for roughly six hundred years, not many Old English (think Beowulf) manuscripts from that era survived. As the longest and oldest of four manuscripts that contain poetry, the Exeter Book is a particularly crucial remnant of a once-rich oral tradition.

While the first few pages of the book are missing, the opening pages that are intact have deep knife marks, which suggest that the book may have been used as a cutting board. Several folios of the book are stained with a circular ring that bled through the pages as well.

Anglo-Saxon writing would have been incomprehensible to most people by the 13th century and went unread for centuries though the book has spent most of its existence in the Exeter Cathedral library. The book and its large size

appear by the damage to have made it a useful countertop.

FATHER FIRED FOR ATTENDING SON'S BIRTH WAS FLOODED WITH SUPPORT AND JOB OFFERS:

Lamar Austin was working a part-time 90day trial period as a security guard at Salerno Protective Services when his wife went into labour. Though he sent a text to his boss explaining the situation, he received a response reading: "You're forcing my hand; if you aren't in work by 8 tomorrow we are going to terminate you."

At 1am on New Year's Day, after their son became the first baby of 2017 born in New Hampshire, he received another text saying that he was "terminated".

When Lamar's story was published in the local newspaper, it was seen by former town board member and paid family leave advocate Sara Persechino, who created a GoFundMe campaign to ease the financial stresses of the family until Lamar found another job.

"No one should have to choose between their family and their job," said Sara. "Welcoming a new baby to a family should be a joyous time." Within two days of its creation, 100 people had donated over \$2,000 to the campaign. More importantly, 3 different local employers contacted Lamar with job offers, as well as an apprenticeship from the local business manager of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers and from the labour union, AFL-CIO.

Citizens Information

Know Your Rights: PART-TIME WORK AND SOCIAL WELFARE PAYMENTS

QUESTION

I'm working part-time on a low wage. Do I qualify for any social welfare payments?

ANSWER

It depends on your personal circumstances. Many people work part-time before taking up full-time employment. If you are working part-time you can, in some cases, keep or apply for a partial social welfare payment, or you may qualify for additional supports.

If you work over 38 hours in a fortnight and you have children you may be able to claim Working Family Payment (WFP), formerly known as Family Income Supplement or FIS. WFP is a weekly tax-free payment for people on low pay.

You may be able to claim a jobseeker's payment for the days you are not working. You can work part-time for up to three days a week and claim a reduced Jobseeker's Benefit or Jobseeker's Allowance payment. You may qualify for the Part-Time Job Incentive Scheme if you were getting Jobseeker's Allowance and find part-time work for less than 24 hours per week.

However, one of the main conditions for getting a jobseeker's payment is that you must be available for work and actively seeking work. This means that you must continue to look for work on the days you are unemployed. You must also be unemployed for at least four days out of seven consecutive days.

If you return to work after a period of unemployment, you may qualify for the Back to Work Family Dividend (BTWFD) which aims to help families move from social welfare into employment. The BTWFD and WFP can be paid together and the BTWFD is not taken into account in the means test for WFP.

If you are parenting alone and getting a One-Parent Family Payment, you are allowed to earn a certain amount each week and keep your payment. In some cases, people getting disability payments can do some work and keep a social welfare payment.

You can get more information on your options from the Citizens Information Service below.

FOCUS ON CONIFERS

For colour all year round you can't go wrong with conifers and there are lots of different types to choose from.

When choosing a conifer they are usually classified under four sections. Dwarf which will grow from 1.5ft to 15ft. Medium 12ft t 50ft. Tallanything over 50ft and finally ground cover or prostrate growing from about 2ft in height to a spread of anything from 2ft to 6ft.

When choosing a dwarf conifer it is very important to remember that it can mean two things. It may describe a slow growing variety which will grow to about 2 to 3 ft after 10 to 12 years or it may mean that it will grow to its maximum height in a quicker time frame.

An ideal dwarf conifer to choose is Juniperus Communis Compressa which will not grow more than 2 to 3 ft which makes it ideal for a rockery.

There is also a big choice when it comes to medium conifers. So remember before you choose find out the mature height and spreads. Medium conifers are ideal for shrub beds as they will give you a good focal point and colour all year round whether it is green, gold or bluegrey.

Tall conifers speak for themselves and are ideal for a large garden. Prostrate conifers are ideal for ground cover but make sure to remember that there are different varieties, dwarf, medium and large. Conifers are also ideal for centerpieces in pots and containers. Next week I will focus on Climbers.

Go further and make exercise part of the equation and you are well on your way to a healthier you; another layer of self- care is sleep. Strive for 8 hours and when awake strive for healthy eating and moderate exercise. Our physical and mental state is often vulnerable and under duress so it is important to acknowledge this and fuel our being with the right nutrients and minerals when, and if, necessary. Needless to say have the occasional treat and indulge a little every now and then because something sweet and tasty is deserved and worthwhile after all your hard work to be good! Bon Appetite!
