
DUGGAN SET FOR MEDITERRANEAN ADVENTURE ON RALLY ITALIA



Junior World Rally Championship contender Rob Duggan will start the second round of his 2017 campaign on this weekend's Rally Italia Sardinia. It's been 2 months since the season opening round in Corsica and the 24 year old driver from Killarney will be looking to build upon his 6th place finish on that event.

Sardinia is the first loose surface event in the Junior World Rally Championship calendar and the Mediterranean island has earned a fearsome reputation since it was first included in the World Championship calendar in 2004. Duggan however, remains unperturbed, despite the fact he will have a new co-driver for this rally. Tom Woodburn will slot into the seat normally filled by Ger Conway as Conway is getting married this weekend.

"I suppose it's a decent excuse" smiled Duggan speaking ahead of the rally. "It'll be a pity not to have Ger aboard as usual but Tom is an excellent replacement and I'm looking forward to working with him. Sardinia is a completely different rally to anything I will have done before, dust for example could be a significant factor. Having talked to people who have been here in the past, running down the field like we will be can leave you vulnerable to picking up punctures and suspension damage so we will have to be mindful of that, especially on the second pass over stages. We learned a lot in Corsica but didn't come away with the points we wanted so a strong haul of points here would put us right back on track. I'm looking forward to using the DMACK Tyres on gravel again and to continue to build up my loose surface experience. A good result would be a nice wedding present for Ger and Ciara!"

EPSOM DERBY CHAMP WAS A WINNER ALRIGHT IN KILLARNEY

When the Aidan O'Brien trained Wings Of Eagles romped to victory in the prestigious Epsom Derby last Saturday, it sparked great celebrations at Killarney Racecourse where there was a special interest in the big event.

The 40/1 rank outsider caused a major sensation when he powered past the post in the elite event but it came as no huge surprise to those monitoring the proceedings from the Ross Road track where Wings Of Eagles won his maiden race last summer.

The Epsom success provided O'Brien with a sixth Derby winner but the impressive colt had already caught the eye and tasted success in the competitive Irish Stallion Farms EBF Median Auction Maiden in Killarney last August.

A field of 18 lined up at the start at Epsom but Wings Of Eagles was the toast of Killarney at the finishing post, edging out the fancied Cliffs of Moher with the short odds favourite Cracksman, piloted Frankie Dettori, beaten into third. He was the biggest outsider to win the Derby for four decades and the first winner at double-figure odds since 1998.

"It was a fantastic win and we were all absolutely delighted to see it," said Killarney Race Company Chairman Gerard Coughlan.

"It just goes to prove the great quality of the maiden in Killarney and Aidan O'Brien certainly targets this course as a great test for his good horses," he added. Wings Of Eagles is now likely to compete in the Irish Derby in The Curragh on July 1 where the form of both the English and French derbies could be put to the test.

UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL KERRY TO BENEFIT FROM GALA NIGHT

The Annual Gala Benefit Night sponsored by Kerry Group is set to benefit University Hospital Kerry and will fund vital equipment for the facility. The event is set to take place on Friday 7 July 2017, at Tralee Greyhound Stadium.

The announcement of this year's Benefit Night was made as the Friends of University Hospital Kerry marked the official instalment of the Foetal Assessment Ultrasound Machine, which was donated to the hospital's Obstetric Unit.

Purchased with the proceeds of the Friends' successful fundraising efforts in 2016, this specialised ultrasound will be of huge assistance in monitoring the health of babies while still in the womb. Dr. Richard Horgan, Consultant Obstetrician, on behalf of the Obstetric Unit in the hospital, expressed his gratitude and said that at present, all women have a scan when they register with the hospital in early pregnancy. However, with the new scanner each one will now receive a second scan at 28

weeks. This second foetal scan will determine whether the baby is growing normally and will help to detect any problems with the womb or the placenta. The results provided by this new equipment will play a key part in planning the care required for both mother and baby up to and including the baby's birth.

2017 marks the 27th Anniversary of the fundraising programme, which has now raised in excess of \in 2 million since its inauguration. Over the years, funds raised have been used for the provision of essential equipment at the hospital, which delivers critical services to families throughout County Kerry, West Limerick and North Cork. The fundraising target for the 2017 event is \in 100,000 and the money raised this year will be used to buy equipment for the Cardiac Unit.


Diseases of the chest and blood vessels (heart attacks and strokes) cause over 9,000 deaths in Ireland each year. Early diagnosis of these

diseases enables treatment to begin, which in many cases can prevent crippling illnesses and death. One of the ways of examining the heart and blood vessels is through the use of a Cardiac Ultrasound or ECHO Machine. At present, waiting times in University Hospital Kerry for a routine Echo can be up to 15 months with 1,300 patients currently on the waiting list. Speaking at the launch, Dr. Louis Keary, Consultant Cardiologist, said that, the only Cardiac Echogram in the hospital is already working at over-capacity and there is an urgent need for a second machine. He said that the installation of this essential equipment will make a huge difference to the care of a large number of patients.



LOOKING AFTER YOUR HANGING BASKETS

Having colourful plants growing in containers is a great way to add colour anywhere in the garden, patio or window sill. However, plants in containers will require a lot more care than plants which are planted in the ground. The first and most important thing when looking after your containers is watering. If you don't water regularly it will cause plants to gradually dry-up and die. On the other hand over-watering is also damaging as most plants don't like sitting in water. Remember to check drainage holes at the bottom of containers to make sure that the water is draining away properly.

Some plants, like geraniums like to dry out before being watered again, but if you have other plants mixed with them then water as normally.

Feeding your plants in containers is also very important. Use a liquid feed of tomato feed or something with a high nitrogen feed. Always feed when the compost is moist and preferably in the evening time as this will stop any scorching from the sun.







START YOUR OWN BUSINESS RELIEF

The Start Your Own Business scheme provides for relief from Income Tax for long term unemployed individuals who start a new business. The scheme will provide an exemption from Income Tax up to a maximum of ϵ 40,000 per annum for a period of two years to individuals who set up a qualifying business; having been unemployed for a period of at least 12 months prior to starting the business. It runs from 25 October 2013 to 31 December 2018.

Who qualifies for this relief?

You may qualify for this relief if: (a) you have been unemployed for twelve months or more, and (b) during that period you were in receipt of any of the following:

- crediting contributions
- iobseeker's allowance
- jobseeker's benefit
- the one-parent family payment
- partial capacity payment

Periods of time spent on certain training courses and schemes will be treated as part of a period of unemployment. If you were entitled to jobseeker's allowance or jobseeker's benefit immediately before starting on the training course or scheme, then any allowance paid for attending such a course will be treated as if it were jobseeker's allowance or jobseeker's benefit.

Examples of training courses and schemes would include FÁS training courses, Community Employment Schemes, Job Initiative and Back to Education Schemes.

MUNSTER SENIOR FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP KERRY BEGIN THEIR QUEST TO WIN BACK SAM

Kerry begin their quest for Munster and All-Ireland honours when they take on Colm Collins' Clare in the Munster SFC Semi-Final at Cusack Park in Ennis on Sunday afternoon. Kerry, having won the National League in April, will go into this game as raging hot favourites but manager Eamon Fitzmaurice will be taking nothing for granted. Fitzmaurice met the media ahead of the tie last Monday and much of his press conference was taken up with dealing with the issues surrounding Brendan O'Sullivan. Fitzmaurice expressed his disappointment and frustration at the way the matter was handled by Sport Ireland. He said that the Kerry camp had nothing to hide and questioned the manner in which the story was leaked into the public domain before the Sport Ireland report was finalized. "We felt all along from the start of the

process that it was important we released a statement outlining the facts and saying what happened, prior to it breaking in the public domain because of the fact that we knew we had nothing to hide and Brendan O'Sullivan had nothing to hide.

"But there is a process involved there which we had to go through. That was the advice which we were given from the start, the legal advice which stated that you couldn't state anything until the process was finished. "We had a statement ready to go on this issue since last July. I think there was a lot of commentary about why it wasn't released and we were accused of trying to hide something. "It is the exact opposite in fact. Our hand was forced because of the way the report was leaked to the Sunday Independent. I haven't seen much of the commentary because we were away in training camp but I think the question that needs to be asked is why and how and who leaked it.

"Not so much for the Sunday Independent, I understand that they got a scoop and they felt they had to go with it but who leaked that report when it wasn't finalised."

Fitzmaurice went on: "I think this is a big question, when you're talking about a player and a human being. Brendan got a telephone call last May 12 at 10am in the morning to say that he failed a drugs test and by the way you're banned for four years. "I didn't see that anywhere. Sport Ireland

rang him to inform him that under Wada

regulations he was banned for four years. It was clear straight away that the problem was the contaminated product because everything else that he would have taken would have come through the setup. "It took us 11 weeks to prove it was contaminated. Why everything takes so long in this thing is something I cannot understand.

"His suspension was suspended once we proved it was a contaminated product and Sport Ireland were happy that he

hadn't cheated and that he was a victim of circumstances.

"So for us, this was the end of the matter. We were just waiting for the process before we released our statement.

"We heard nothing for the rest of the year, then on December 21st at 5.30 in the evening Brendan gets a phone call informing him to say 'you're suspended for seven months and happy Christmas by the way'.

"This was Sport Ireland again and that's how come the thing drifted into a second season," added Fitzmaurice.

On the playing front, Fitzmaurice confirmed that Kenmare Shamrocks' talented centreforward Sean O'Shea has been drafted into the Senior Football panel. Kerry manager Eamon Fitzmaurice stated that Kerry had hoped to give O'Shea some game time during the National League but because of his commitments to the Kerry U21 set-up and his Club Kenmare Shamrocks this was not possible.

Eamon Fitzmaurice said that five members of the successful minor teams over the last few years are involved with the current senior set-up and expects some of these to see championship game time during the summer. He said some other players from these underage teams are involved in a development squad and expected them to be pushing for places next year.

Fitzmaurice is looking forward to another Munster and All-Ireland campaign. He said that the Allianz League win over Dublin and the introduction of younger players like Jack Savage, Kevin McCarthy, Jack Barry and Ronan Shanahan has revitalized the squad and has added to the competition for places. Apart from Killian Young (groin) and Tom O'Sullivan (hamstring) Kerry report a clean bill of health heading into the game with Clare, who will provide stiff opposition for Kerry as they are on the back of a successful league campaign in Division Two.

The Banner County famously defeated Kerry in the Munster Final in 1992 and will be hoping for a similar outcome on Sunday. This Sunday's clash will be the 49th time in which Kerry and Clare have clashed in the Munster SFC. To date, Kerry have won 45 of the head to head clashes with Clare victorious on just two occasions, 1949 in Ennis when they recorded a 3-7 to 1-8 win and that 1992 Munster SFC win in the Gaelic Grounds. However, Kerry are expected to win and should do so but only after a searching examination from Clare.



AN EASY WAY TO REMOVE A MANGO FROM ITS TOUGH OUTER SKIN

STARVED AND LEFT ABANDONED IN BASKET AS BABY - NOW THE FIRST FEMALE CEO AND PRESIDENT OF THE SAN

Following an extensive national search, The San Francisco Chamber of Commerce selected Tallia Hart, as its new president and CEO. The 43-year-old not only broke a gender barrier, but she also blazed a trail as the first minority and youngest leader of the 167 year old business group. At the time of her appointment Ms. Hart had served as president & CEO of the Irvine Chamber of Commerce, the largest Chamber in Orange County. During her seven-year tenure, she moved the Irvine Chamber into the forefront of Western Chambers in terms of profitability and engagement. She oversaw advocacy for the organisation's 1000 member companies and established economic development and international programs for the City of Irvine.

On Jan. 15, 1974, a Nun found the woman now known as Tallia Hart abandoned as a newborn in a rice paddy in Vietnam during the War there. She was severely malnourished and covered in scabies and boils. She doesn't know her date of birth, the identity of her birth parents or if she has brothers or sisters. Had the Nun not found her and taken her to a nearby orphanage, there would have been no story to tell. Because of her mixed-race appearance, Ms. Hart believes she may have been the daughter of a Vietnamese woman and an American soldier during the Vietnam War. After the nun rescued her, she spent several months in an orphanage.

Meanwhile, a nursing student and a Police officer living in Colorado who had previously adopted a boy from Germany were desperate to adopt a girl. After they filed all the necessary paperwork, an agency in Vietnam called and said there was a baby girl available for adoption. The agency warned the couple that the baby, by then 6 months old, was very ill and might die on the plane ride.

"They said if they sent her and she didn't survive then we wouldn't get our money back, and it couldn't be transferred to another child," said Betsy Steen, Ms. Hart's mother, "on faith alone, we just decided to go ahead and take our chances".

The financially struggling couple already had spent thousands of dollars on the adoption. A volunteer flew with the infant to Colorado, and when Ms. Steen met her new baby at the airport she knew she'd made the right choice. "My mother beat me to her, and I had to fight my mother to get ahold of her, and when I did I couldn't let go" Ms. Steen said, the baby weighed just six pounds — small for a newborn, let alone an older baby — and was shorter than average. too. She had pneumonia and developed slowly because of malnourishment she had suffered in Vietnam, not walking until she was 2. Ms Hart's adoptive father died in a bicycle accident when she was just 6, and Ms. Steen raised Tallia by herself. She enrolled her daughter in dance classes as a child to help her develop physically, but Tallia hated it and insisted on gymnastics in which she excelled, winning a national title in the uneven bars and aspired to go to the Olympics, but had to quit gymnastics after a bad wrist injury.

So time moves on into the 21st Century and nine years ago Ms. Hart and her spouse, Mark Bodenhamer were made aware of another baby girl that was found lying in a basket that was placed in a garden outside an orphanage, they went to Vietnam to sort out the paperwork for the adoption of this little girl who was then only a few weeks old, though returning back to Vietnam was difficult for Ms. Hart because it made her think of her own birth mother. Ms Hart says "I kinda wish I could reach out to Lola's biological mother somehow and just let her know that Lola's thriving and is really well taken care of, we just feel that the gifts of opportunity and love are the greatest gifts you can give anyone".

GERMANY VOTES TO END CRUEL FUR FARMING

Every year, millions of animals are killed for their fur for no reason whatsoever apart from humans wanting to put on airs and swagger around. It's estimated that 85% of these animals are raised on fur farms, places far more similar to grim fur factories. Minks, rabbits, foxes, and in some countries cats and dogs, are confined to small cages and forced to live in unacceptable and unsanitary conditions until the moment they are, most often cruelly, killed. Many animals are either killed by way of electrocution or even by being skinned alive. However obvious this statement sounds, it still has to be made – there is no reason for us to wear other living beings' fur.

Fortunately, in many places in the world, fur farming is already banned due to the issues of animal welfare and ethics. The first countries to introduce the ban were Great Britain, in 2000 and Austria in 2004. Other places that banned fur farming include the Netherlands, Croatia, Slovenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Serbia, the Republic of Macedonia, and Japan.

Recently, a great victory against fur farming has been achieved in Germany where the leaders have voted to shut down the last six working fur farms after a transition period that is to last five years.

Germany's last fur farms will close. This great news will save the lives of countless animals lives and is, without a doubt, a big step towards complete outlawing of fur farming in that country. The question now is when will the Republic of Ireland follow the example of the aforementioned Countries?

His Les Paul guitars, made famous by Gibson, were favourites of rock legends worldwide. He was the father of multitrack recording, and guitar effects—experiments funded by Bing Crosby. His lightning-fast picking in jazz, blues, and country styles earned Les Paul a television show and accolades too numerous to mention. In his 90s, he still performed weekly in Manhattan jazz clubs, despite numerous disabilities. He died in 2009, three years after earning his last two Grammy awards.

20 YEAR OLD BLIND AND DEAF CAT WENT MISSING

Raymond McNamara was on vacation with his cat, Lily, in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, when all of a sudden; his cat went missing near a construction site.

Devastated, Mr. McNamara alerted authorities, who helped search everywhere for the cat, but to no avail. If Lily was a normal cat, the situation wouldn't have been as scary, but the fact that she was 20 years old, deaf and blind made it that much worse.

Then the dreadful day came when Mr. McNamara had to return home to California without his feline best friend. He was heartbroken and thought he'd never get to see Lily again.

Luckily, Lily didn't wander far. She was waiting around the same place, somehow surviving the Florida heat and rain for two months on her own. She wandered back to the area; most likely hoping her human would come back.

After she was found, she was taken to Saving Safe Animal Rescue in Miami. But she wasn't in the best of shape. She was very sick and dehydrated, and her fur was extremely matted. She also had some liver issues, but vets put her on IV fluids and treated her right away.

While they were taking care of Lily, Mr. McNamara drove back across the country to reunite with his pet. The vets saw Lily's spirit rise once she knew her owner was there.

Mr. McNamara was overwhelmed with emotion to have Lily back and says she's never going to get away from him again.

BOX TRUCK DELIVERS HOT SHOWERS TO CITY'S HOMELESS

A Missouri pastor named Austin has worked with the homeless almost his entire life — his parents ran a soup kitchen when he was growing up. But the importance of showers for the homeless was

made clear to him just a little over two years ago. Handing out hygiene supplies to the homeless, a man thanked him for a bar of soap, then asked him where he could use it. Austin realised even with food and clean clothes, a person who hadn't bathed in months would never land a job. So he created "Shower to the People," a nonprofit to provide hot showers to people living on the streets of St. Louis. They found a used truck and began outfitting its interior with shower stalls, sinks, and privacy curtains for dressing. An additional row of sinks outside lets more people wash their faces and brush their teeth.

A local pipefitters union installed the truck's plumbing and a linen service volunteered to launder towels. The truck travels to different locations around St. Louis each day and connects to fire hydrants across the city and uses a generator to run an electric water heater for hot showers.

"If we can get people regularly clean, we can give them some hope" Pastor Austin says and added "When they get some hope in their bones, they can take the next steps. They can keep climbing".

GRADUATION GOWNS MADE OUT OF PLASTIC BOTTLES

Textile maker Unifi based in the US produces 300 million pounds of polyester and nylon yarn annually. Unifi does recycling through its flagship fibre brand Repreve which was launched in 2009.

The company collects clear plastic bottles from processors around the country who first shred them into plastic flakes. These plastic flakes are converted into small pellets. The pellets are then melted, extruded and spun into polyester yarn. Unifi has turned over four billion used plastic bottles into yarn in the last eight years.

Repreve makes three types of recycled yarn: 100 per cent from used plastic bottles, a hybrid of plastic bottles and fibre waste, and a hybrid of plastic bottles and used fabric. This yarn is used to make everything from jackets and T-shirts to dress pants and even car upholstery. It's used in brands like Patagonia, The North Face, Levi's, Adidas and Ford.

Last year College students across the US

accepted their diplomas wearing gowns made entirely of plastic bottles.

They didn't even go to the shops for a ticket but to buy juice. "As we walked past an agents I said to Jordan "let's just pop in and be a little reckless for once - because we're always so concerned about money and where it's going to go," Ms. Hicks said.

They checked the \$20 ticket at the Lucky Charm Newsagency at Willetton were captured on CCTV, the footage shows the moment Ms Hicks is told that she is holding a winning scratchie ticket valued at \$200,000 — and her eyes widened in astonishment. 
