

The route takes in some breathtaking scenery along with some iconic roads which have been used as rally stages.



Cannonball is coming back to Killarney

The official route for Cannonball 2019 has been announced and it is confirmed that the supercar spectacle is coming back to Killarney on Friday September 6th for the first overnight pitstop of the event. The last time the large Cannonball event came to Killarney was 2011 when thousands lined the streets to welcome the largest road trip in Europe and 190 of the finest cars on the planet. In July there was a smaller Retro Cannonball event which brought classic cars to the stunning driving routes around Tralee and Killarney but now the Super Cars are ready to make an entrance once again to the Kingdom and thousands will flock to Killarney from home and abroad to see the spectacle and enjoy this free family event in aid of the Irish Cancer Society. Cannonball, fuelled by milesPlus from Circle K, will start at Malahide in Dublin this year on September 6th at 10.30 am and then blaze a trail through Cork, Kerry, Limerick, Mayo, Sligo, Meath and Offaly.

Fans will meet the drivers and celebrities and get up close and personal with the world's top mark cars such as McLaren, Lamborghini, Ferrari, Aston Martin, Porsche, Maserati, Rolls Royce and Bentley. The benefit to the Irish economy and host towns of this event is estimated at \in 2,567,000 per year. Over 200,000 people will line the streets all over Ireland for Cannonball and the event has already raised \in 1,016,000 for Irish charities. This year, the charity benefactor is the Irish Cancer Society. The charity funds lifesaving cancer research and a range of free support services for people affected by cancer.

Spectators will enjoy the unique festival atmosphere that Cannonball is renowned for. The Brazilian Dancers will bring all the glamour of carnival, fire breathers, street entertainers, live music and free giveaways get the party started as the largest screen in Ireland shows footage of the event as crowds gather to welcome the event. The notorious NYPD, German Polizei, Fr Willie and colourful Cannonballers in crazy costumes add to the melee. Posts should be advertised Tackle back to school says Brassil

Fianna Fáil TD for Kerry John Brassil has welcomed the news that the Consultant Appointment Advisory Committee has finally approved two new consultant cardiologist posts in University Hospital Kerry (UHK).

Deputy Brassil said it was shameful that it had taken so long for the posts to be approved given that they had been vacant since June 2018 and called for them to be advertised immediately and filled without delay. He said, "Since first becoming aware

of the vacancies in UHK I have raised it numerous times in Dáil Éireann. Unfortunately, I was met with differing stories from the HSE, the Department and the Minister.

"Despite being told the replacement process commenced as soon as the position became vacant, I learned in March of this year that the post was awaiting approval by the HSE's Consultant Appointment Advisory Committee.

"The delay in approving the post has caused huge concern for the people of Kerry who feared for the future of the hospital as a category 3 24/7 hospital. Over one year later I am glad it has finally been approved but we need to see it advertised immediately. "There can be no further delay in filling these posts and I am calling on the Minister to expediate the recruitment process. I will continue to fight until such a time as both positions are filled and the future of cardiac care in UHK is secure", he concluded.

costs - Brassil

Fianna Fáil TD for Kerry, John Brassil, has called on the Government to tackle the soaring costs associated with sending children to primary and secondary schools.

Deputy Brassil said the Government must listen to the Oireachtas Joint Committee on Education and Skills which has outlined a number of measures to be introduced to reduce the financial burden associated with sending children to school.

He explained, "Recently Oireachtas Education the published a report on school costs. It called for funding for the school book rental scheme to be increased; nonbadged generic uniforms to be introduced and for the Department of Education and Skills to carry out an independent assessment of the adequacy of the capitation rates and incrementally increase funding to schools.

"The Barnardos School Costs Survey for 2019 has shown that the costs associated with sending children to school remain stubbornly hiah. Worryingly, the average cost for a first-year pupil is €735 which really brings a different meaning to 'free education.

"New uniform costs, book expenses, transport charges and voluntary charges which aren't really voluntary whatsoever all add up and these don't even take into account additional costs associated with extra-curricular activities such as school trips. It's a worrying time for some parents when instead they should be enjoying the next chapter of their child's life", he concluded.





Good luck to all candidates getting Leaving Cert exam results on Tuesday and Central Applications Office (CAO) offers on Thursday. Keep a close eye on the time line as events are moving speedily this year. Following Rebecca Carter's successful 2018 High Court Case against the late release of Leaving Cert subject appeals, the State Examinations Commission (SEC) and the CAO have acted to have the results of subject appeals issued much earlier. CAO is expediting the release of Round One offers and the SEC has developed a Candidate Self Service Portal (CSSP) for Leaving Cert candidates.

CANDIDATE SELF SERVICE PORTAL (CSSP)

To avail of the services on the CSSP, complete the Registration Process on www.examinations. ie. Click on 'Register.'You will need your LC Exam number and PIN number to register. Application to view scripts, to access component marks in subjects (oral marks, practical marks, etc.), to view scripts in subjects marked online (Maths, Biology, Physics, Chemistry, Politics & Society, LCVP Written Component), to submit the appeal application and to access the appeal results services are provided exclusively online this year.

LC RESULTS

Leaving Cert results are available in schools on Tuesday and from 10am on the CSSP. Log on to www.examinations.ie and click on the 'SERVICES' tab. To login in, you will need your exam number and the password you created when you registered on the CSSP. The SEC is also making component marks available (online only) this year from 9am, Wed, 14th Aug.

VIEWING YOUR SCRIPTS

It's well worth viewing your marked scripts before deciding to appeal any subject(s) results. The SEC is providing two viewi

ng of script services this year, the first at your school for subjects marked on paper, the second online for subjects marked online. The application process is the same for both services. Apply to view scripts on your CSSP between 9am, Wed, 14th Aug. and 5pm, Fri, 16th Aug. As well as your scripts you will also have access to the marking schemes. If you are viewing your scripts marked on paper you will be assigned to one of three sessions, Tues, 20th Aug. from 5pm to 8pm or Wed, 21st Aug. from 9am to 12pm or Wed, 21st Aug. from 2pm to 5pm. Each candidate may bring in a mobile phone, tablet or digital camera to copy her/his own scripts. Online access to view scripts marked online will be available from 5pm, Tues, 20th Aug. to 5pm, Wed, 21st Aug. Each candidate will be allowed a three-hour viewing session online.

APPEALING YOUR RESULTS

To submit an appeal application, log on to www.examinations.ie and access the CSSP. The subject appeal application will be available from 5pm, Fri., 16th Aug and closes at 5pm, Thurs., 22nd Aug. Tick the 'APPEAL' box across from the subject(s) you wish to appeal and complete the online application. The application is the same for all scripts whether marked manually or online. The fee is €40 per LC subject and €15.50 per LCA subject. The fee will be refunded if your result is upgraded. It's not necessary, but advisable, to view your scripts before you make an appeal. Appeal results will be available online only through the CSSP in the week ending Fri., 20th Sept. The SEC will automatically inform the CAO of all changes of results.

CAO Round One offers and points requirements will be available at www.cao.ie from 2pm, Thurs., 15th Aug. CAO Round One offers must be accepted by 5.15pm, Fri, 23th Aug. CAO Round Two offers and points requirements will be available at www.cao.ie from 10am, Wed, 28th Aug. CAO Round Two offers must be accepted by 5.15pm, Fri, 30th Aug. As a result of the early offers, there will be no postal offer notices in Rounds One and Two.

Summer Gardening

Ornamental Grasses

After years in the wilderness, more and more gardeners are recognising the exceptional quality of grasses so much so that they are now at the very forefront of modern design. They are reliable and many kinds furnish the garden for most of the year, being at their best in autumn and early winter. Breathtaking when lit sideways by the sun, their elegance and lightness of touch sits uneasily with stiff hybrid roses or dwarf bedding dahlias, but they form a perfect partnership with a large range of sturdy hardy perennials, many of which like the same growing conditions. Grasses are now more widely available, with specialist Irish nurseries growing them "on-site", so that you know when buying that they'll survive and prosper in our climate. They are amazingly tolerant of a wide range of soil conditions, but most need sunlight to survive, which is why ordinary lawn grass dies out under the shade of big trees. Just a few true grasses will tolerate partial shade, among them Millium effusum, delicate melica (useful for groundcover) and the lovely Stipa arundinacea, which likes moist, porous clay, ideally on the acid side of neutral. A great plant this, it seeds itself about profusely when happy, often in the most picturesque places. Only a few species can survive regular waterlogging, while in areas prone to regular drought, most will survive but only those originally from dry places will thrive. Grasses and their natural planting partners, the hardy perennials, need only sun light and a fertile soil to grow. Modern thinking on grasses and bamboos is against adding fertilisers or compost to the soil, arguing that ornamental grasses need to toughen up by finding their own nutrients. If the ground is very heavy though, it might need opening up by adding generous amounts of horticultural grit.

PREPARATION

When planting, dig a hole twice the width of the plant in its pot, break up the soil at the bottom of the hole with a fork to loosen it, remove any large or medium stones, and break up any big lumps of clay. Put the plant in the hole and back-fill with the soil you've just taken out, mixing with some added grit if it feels too sticky. It's important to ensure the plant sits at the same level in the ground as it did in its pot. When planted, fir m the ground around it with your feet, to ensure the roots make contact with the earth and to stop it rocking in the wind and coming loose. Most grasses have a long and narrow leaf, so if different kinds are all massed together, they can cancel each other out. Use them either as specimens standing apart, or in little groups of one kind. Best of all, mix them with strong, selfsufficient perennials for company.

BAMBOOS

Bamboos are a sub-family of woody or tree grasses from moist temperate forests. The hardier types all thrive in Ireland's moist and temperate climate with the minimum of fuss. They have a reputation for being invasive, which puts some people off using them at all, though in fact many more are perfectly well behaved. There are practical ways of controlling the most vigorous kinds. You can buy special lengths of flat




metal or sturdy, flexible plastic to insert into the ground as a physical barrier, so as to stop the bamboo's rhizomes (roots) running where you don't want them. Some species can grow into impenetrable jungle, so you shouldn't choose them for a small garden or for containers. Another complaint sometimes heard against bamboos is their susceptibility to wind burn, which can look terrible, so plant them in your most sheltered site. While no bamboo can tolerate very dry winds for long, tests show that in exposed seaside places, for example, Pseudosas japonica (2m), when used as a windbreak, does very well (2m). Another good hedging plant that will also do well near the sea is Phyllostachys bissettii, being very hardy and always fresh and green looking even in the depths of winter. The striking colours of some bamboo culms (stems) are particularly attractive. They come in horizontal and vertical stripes and striations, in yellows, whites, creams, pinks, greens and even blue, as with Himalyacalamus hookerianus, which is rare but certainly available here, though be warned that its waxy new culms will age from dusty blue to yellowgreen or purple-red in colder areas.

Containers filled with permanent and seasonal plants can be very versatile as they can be moved anywhere in the garden at any time to brighten any corner. It is usually annuals that are planted in containers, but you can also plant them with most shrubs, grasses, herbaceous perennials and even certain types of trees and conifers. Vegetables can also be grown in containers. If you have an area in your garden that you would like to screen off but haven't got the earth to do it, you can plant most climbers in containers. A good type of container for this is a quarter barrel as it can fit next to a wall or railing. As with all plants in containers, make sure that you water and feed regularly. When choosing a terracotta container, make sure that the label says frost proof rather than frost resistant as these can still crack in prolonged frost. There are also imitation terracotta pots made from plastic which are very practical to use in your garden.



Get Enough Sleep - We need 7-8 hours of sleep each night to keep our





However Kerry were also able to pick off some great scores from distance to underline their continued supremacy.



A well maintained motorbike can reduce the chance of death or injury on the road. Make sure you know your machine and look after it Vehicle reliability and safety are key issues for any road user but particularly motorcyclists, whose machines offer little protection



compared to cars in the event of a collision. If you ride a motorbike, the following checklist will help ensure you are as prepared as you can be for the dangers of riding on public roads.

Petrol

Make sure you have enough fuel for the journey. Does your machine have a reserve tank switch or just a warning light? Can you turn the fuel tap to reserve while on the move without taking your eyes off the road? Do you know where the tap is?

0il

Find out how to check the oil level on your machine. Most dry-sump machines require you to check the oil when the engine is hot, while most wet-sump machines should have their oil level checked with the engine cold. Which type is yours? The owner's handbook will tell you how to perform this check correctly.

Water

Is your machine water- or air-cooled? Do you know how to check the coolant level?

Damage

Check your bike for signs of obvious wear-andtear. Are the light lenses or mirrors cracked or broken? Any noticeable buckles in the rims? Any drips or pools under the bike? Check for damage to the tyre walls and rim.

Electrics

Check your lights and indicators are clean and working. Do you know where the fuses are and can you replace them?

Rubber

As the only point of contact between you and the road, your tyres and their condition are critical to your safety. Too much air in your tyres reduces grip, too little promotes instability because it allows the side walls of the tyres to flex. Know your tyre pressures and the legal minimum tread depth.

Maintenance

Maintenance is vital. A badly maintained chain may snap or jump off and cause you to crash. If you cannot service your bike yourself get a professional to do it. Tips for safe biking and advice on safety gear Top 10 safety tips

1. Be vigilant. Look into the far, middle and near distance, and behind you, using your mirrors and checking over your shoulders, before changing position or turning.

2. Keep your distance. In poor weather conditions, always leave a bigger gap.

3. Be seen. Make sure your position is correct. Use dipped headlights and wear high visibility clothing (such as a neon vest and 'Sam Browne' reflective belt).

4. Avoid surprising others. Never do anything on the road that could cause another road user to slow down, brake or swerve or that could startle pedestrians.

5. Think like other road users. Anticipate how they might react.

6. Read the road. Ride to current road, weather and traffic conditions.

7. Match your speed to the conditions. Never let others dictate your pace.

8. Never ride your bike after consuming alcohol or drugs.

9. Maintain your bike properly. Regularly check petrol, oil, water, damage, electrics and tyres.

10. Take lessons from an experienced instructor. See every ride as a chance to improve your skills.

Wear Approved Safety gear

Ensure that the safety helmet and protective clothing that you wear every time you get on your bike has CE or British Kitemark approval standards.

• Jackets and trousers should give you enough protection from impact, abrasion, cold and weather conditions.

• Use approved body armour on vulnerable areas such as the back, knees, elbows, shoulders, hips and shins. This should be adjustable so it fits snugly and does not move in a crash.

• You should wear a good reflective jacket to make you more visible on the road.

• Wear approved protective gloves, and footwear that at least comes above the ankle.

When we engage with strategies to enhance Mental Wellness resilience is talked about, but usually as an essential skill for healthy childhood. development. This article examines the steps adults can take to boost resilience in middle age, which is often the time we need it most as midlife can bring all kinds of stressors including divorce, the death of a parent, career setbacks and retirement womes, yet many of us do not build the coping skills we need to meet these challenges. The good news is that some of the qualities of middle age - a better ability to regulate emotions, perspective gained from life experiences and concern for future generations — may give older people an advantage over the young when it comes to developing resilience. There are three core psychological attributes at the heart of resilience: strength, meaning/purpose, and pleasure. If your personal life is characterized by these traits, you have the core components needed to build resilience. You feel equipped to handle both daily life and those challenging moments when you have to dig deeper. You also believe that you're contributing to the world in a way that helps others, consistent with what seems most important to you. Whether you believe that you exist in a universe controlled by a clearly defined higher power, or participate in the human collective that transcends your personal identity, your source of meaning helps you manage high stress and trauma effectively. And finally, pleasure. It's about deeply enjoying that which enriches and satisfies you. Whether it be poetry or pattery, movies or theater, having experiences that bring you a deep sense of pleasure are essential. Strength. meaning and pleasure. These core attributes must be experienced on both an emotional and cognitive level. Resilience grows from both feelings and engagement in a thought life, bringing you strength. meaning and pleasure. Reading, thinking, working, praying, writing, conversing - these are just as important as emotional experiences that give you the feelings of strength, meaning and pleasure.

These are some ways to increase resilience:

Practice Optimism. Optimism is part genetic, part learned. So if you were born into a family of Eeyores, you can still find your inner Tigger. Optimism doesn't mean ignoring the reality of a dire situation. After a job loss, for instance, many people may feel defeated and think, "I'll never recover from this." An optimist would acknowledge the challenge in a more hopeful way, saying, "This is going to be difficult, but it's a chance to rethink my life goals and find work that truly makes me happy."

Rewrite Your Story. When recovering from a challenging situation, know that your life was forever changed, but reframing the situation, focusing on the opportunity the setback presented, so that you can rewrite what will be the outcome.

Don't Personalize It. We have a tendency to blame ourselves for life's setbacks and to ruminate about what we should have done differently. In the moment, a difficult situation feels as if it will never end. To bolster your resilience, remind yourself that even if you made a mistake, a number of factors most likely contributed to the problem and shift your focus to the next steps you should take.

Go Out of Your Comfort Zone. Resilience doesn't just come from negative experience. You can build your resilience by putting yourself in challenging situations and learn to cope a bit more each time.

Take Stress Breaks. Times of manageable stress present an opportunity to build your resilience. It's almost as if you need to invite stress into your life to practice how to manage It. Taking a walk break, spending five minutes to meditate or having lunch with a good friend are ways to give your mind and body a break from stress.

So, take a look around in your life, and keep working on strength, meaning and pleasure and building resilience!

Know Your Rights:

QUESTION

If I am unhappy with a result in my Leaving Cert, how can I get the grade reviewed?

ANSWER

The Leaving Cert results will be available on 13 August this year. If you are unhappy about a result and would like to have it checked, you can appeal your grade to the State Examinations Commission (SEC).

However, before you decide to appeal your grade, you can view your examination script to see how your work was marked. To do this, you must register on the Candidate Self Service Portal on the SEC website, examinations.ie. You can make an application to the viewing of scripts service online from 9am, 14 August to 5pm, 16 August. You will need your username and password (you get this when you register on the portal). Only the scripts from the written examinations can be viewed - not the results of oral examinations or marks for practical examinations. If your script was marked on paper, you will be assigned a session to view it on either 20 August or 21 August. If it was marked online you can view it online from 5pm on Tuesday 20 August to 5pm on Wednesday 21 August.

If you decide to go ahead and appeal your result after viewing your script, you should log into examinations.ie, access the Candidate Self Service Portal and complete the process online. This service will be available from 5pm, 16 August until 5pm, 22 August. The process is the same for all scripts whether they were marked manually or online. Your script will then be sent to an appeal examiner for re-marking.

The appeal fee is \leq 40 per subject for the Leaving Certificate. The appeal fee for the Applied Leaving Certificate is \leq 15.50 per subject. You will get this fee back if your result is upgraded. You can get more information from the Candidate Information Booklet – Leaving Certificate 2019, published by the State Examinations Commission.

Scamwiseni has since warned anyone planning to book a holiday online to stick to reputable websites and travel agents. The public are advised to carry out checks on holiday review websites to ensure the operation is above board before handing over any money.

DID YOU KNOW?

That not draining the water out of your ear canal after a swim creates the perfect habitat for bacteria. The resulting infection, commonly known as swimmer's ear, is painful and can cause reduced hearing. Make sure to drain the water from your ear canals after swimming or showering by dipping your head to both sides and pulling on your ear lobe gently to help the water out. And whatever you do, do not insert cotton swabs in your ear. Ear wax protects you exactly from these types of infections and foreign objects may only hasten swimmer's ear.

ROBOTIC ARM ENABLES AMPUTEE TO TOUCH AND FEEL AGAIN

Thanks to a groundbreaking new technological accomplishment, amputee Keven Walgamott can use his new robotic arm to pick up an egg without crushing it.

What seems simple for nearly everyone else can be more of a Herculean task for Mr. Walgamott, who lost his left hand and part of his arm in an electrical accident 17 years ago. When he picked up the egg, however, he was testing out the prototype of a high-tech prosthetic arm with fingers that can not only move, but also move with his thoughts—and thanks to a biomedical engineering team at the University of Utah, he "felt" the egg well enough so his brain could tell the prosthetic hand not to squeeze too hard.

The team, led by University of Utah biomedical engineering associate professor Gregory Clark, has developed a way for the "LUKE Arm" (so named after the robotic hand that Luke Skywalker received in Star Wars: The Empire Strikes Back) to mimic the way a human hand feels objects by sending the appropriate signals to the brain. "We changed the way we are sending that information to the brain so that it matches the human body. And by matching the human body, we were able to see improved benefits," Professor Clark said. "We're making more biologically realistic signals."

An amputee wearing the prosthetic arm can sense the touch of something soft or hard, accurately understand how to pick it up, and perform delicate tasks that would otherwise be impossible with a standard prosthetic with metal hooks or claws for hands.

MATH EQUATION GOES VIRAL SINCE PEOPLE CAN'T AGREE ON ONE ANSWER

Only 1 in 1,000,000 people can solve this simple equation" — we've all seen taunts like these, inviting us to dust off our noggins and get our hands dirty with deceptively basic calculations. Well, here's the newest 'simple' equation to go viral on the internet: $8 \div 2(2+2) =$? Have you worked out the answer yet? Are you sure? Have you double-checked everything?

Odds are that you got one of two answers: you either belong to the huge swathe of internet users who got 1 or you're one of the people whose answer is 16. The internet is raging with amateur and professional mathematicians debating what the real answer is resulting in many arguments over who's right.

Some internet users used calculators to show everyone that the answer was 16. Others referred to their 'maths degrees' as an appeal of authority to demonstrate that the answer was 1. Others still took this equation business a bit more seriously than you would expect, and suggested that both answers were correct... depending on what rules you use to figure out the answer.

The reason why there's a lack of consensus regarding this equation is a fairly simple one. Different people are using different rules about what order everything should be calculated in. Whether, after adding 2 and 2 together in the brackets, you should divide 8 by 2 first or multiply what's in the brackets by 2, instead.

Robert Glenn Howard, a social psychologist at the University of Wisconsin–Madison said that such equations are the same as riddles and games, and people get heated over such things because Facebook and other forums are a place for discussion. "Humans have used riddles as a form of play since ancient times," Mr. Howard explained. "And sometimes people can get competitive and wrapped up in it."
