INEC GOES GOLDFOR CANCER AWARENESS MONTH



The INEC is set to go gold tonight for the performance of the High Kings in support of Childhood Cancer Awareness Month.

"The INEC Killarney are delighted to join the host of National and International buildings in 'Lighting Up Gold' for Childhood Cancer Awareness. This is our 4th year taking part in this fantastic initiative which shines a light on the bravery of children dealing with cancer", Ceara Scanlon PR and Marketing Manager at the INEC told the Killarney Outlook.

There are currently at least five children from the Killarney area battling cancer. The Childhood Cancer Foundation launched the 4th annual Light It Up Gold campaign with a Candle Lit Walk in Dublin City Centre on Saturday last, 3rd September. St Patrick's Cathedral will light up gold for the event and throughout September for Childhood Cancer Awareness Month. As part of the international campaign Mary Claire Rennick of Childhood Cancer Foundation told the Killarney Outlook "We are getting a great response from buildings across Ireland. The campaign is spreading every year with buildings across Ireland and the UK joining international landmarks. My own daughter was diagnosed with leukaemia in February 2013 and prior to that I was completely unaware of childhood cancer, as parents who have experienced this disease we want to ensure that everyone is aware. Increased awareness will improve early detection and increase understanding among policy makers and communities which will hopefully reduce the isolation of families going through childhood cancer treatment and side effects. Awareness will also lead to improved funding for supports and services for families and funding for research into childhood cancer." Over 200 children are diagnosed with cancer each year in Ireland. That's 4 families each week who hear the devastating news that their

child, brother, sister or grandchild has cancer. Childhood cancer is the biggest cause of death by disease in children in Ireland. The campaign features candle lit walks around the country. These walks and candlelit vigils serve to recognise and support the bravery of children undergoing treatment, honour the survivors and remember all the boys and girls who have tragically lost their young lives to this disease. These events are family friendly.

Between August 4th and September 4th this year five children who were patients in St. John's Cancer ward in Crumlin Children's Hospital have passed away.



THE SKY IS THE LIMIT FOR ORLAITH

A Killarney woman who suffered a crippling fear of flying hardly has her feet on the ground these days. Orlaith Monks who is from Beaufort hadn't been on a plane for 30 years when her daughter suggested a holiday in Portugal to celebrate her 21st Birthday.

"Within a few days the holiday was booked and then it all became very real and the panic set in. I was going to have to fly and I hadn't been in a plane in 30 years. I couldn't even look at them in the sky I was so terrified!! I think it was a control thing and if I could be up in the cockpit flying the plane myself the fear might not be as bad",



Orlaith told the Killarney Outlook. "I remembered having heard a radio programme about fear of flying and the fact that there was a course you could do to help you. I emailed Fly Fearless and Michael Comyn who gives the course very kindly

fitted me in at very

short notice".

The course itself is held at the back of Dublin Airport and is done in a day. "It was great that I knew I wasn't the only one afraid and that everyone in the room were there for the same thing. Michael went through everyones fears no matter how big or small they were and broke them down rationally for everyone. He explained in great detail a typical flight from arriving at the airport to landing at your destination. All the sounds, noises and bells you hear, to the experience of turbulence and how to cope with it. He gave distraction methods to take ones mind off the take off or landing or maybe just if one started to feel nervous mid flight. Everyone took a flight in a simulator and experienced all these things for themselves and it made it very real for us". "As my holiday was due a week after the course and the fact I was in Dublin airport anyway, I had booked a flight to Kerry Airport. I felt that if I was to go to Portugal I would have to see first that I could do it and not turn back at the airport. I told nobody I booked it so as not to put pressure on myself and when the course finished I headed to the terminal and negotiated my way round the airport on my own for the first time and flew home". "That was 4 years ago and I have

lost count of the number of flights I have taken since. The course has opened up a new life for me and my family and I couldn't recommend it more to anyone who like me was terrified. If I could do it there is no stopping anybody.

The morning show on TV 3 with Martin and Sybll were doing a segment on fear of flying and invited Michael and myself on to speak about the course and my own experience so hopefully I encouraged others to take the plunge and conquer their fears also", she added.

MANY CHANGES AT KILLARNEY COMMUNITY COLLEGE

As the new Academic year begins, staff and students at Killarney Community College are returning to some new changes. Fiona O'Brien has been seconded by JCT in a Leadership capacity and Stella Loughnane who has been Deputy Principal for 8 years is now taking over as Principal of the College. The college now welcomes Eilish O'Leary as the New Deputy Principal. Eilish has worked in the College and students young and old will remember her as the Business teacher and PLC tutor. The college is pleased to be taking on 6 new teachers in a variety of teaching capacities.

NEW BUILDING: Currently due to growing numbers in the college we were granted four new class rooms by the department of education and skills. These rooms will be fully equipped with wifi, data projectors. The Parents council fund-raised to create a foyer / meeting space between the rooms along with a corridor out into the new wing. We have a beautiful tree on the property that was important to us to preserve so we took this into account when planning, and also designed a walled window so that the tree is now a focal point of the foyer. As the college now moves to one hour classes (first in the town to do this!!) room for teachers and students to participate in active classroom methodologies and instructional strategies is now paramount. The building was also designed to be 'future proofed' so that if we are

ever fortunate enough to receive more funding in the future we will be in a position to continue this style of modern build. The college has also just completed a comprehensive renovation of all bathrooms, all are now brand new !

CURRICULUM CHANGES: Following lengthy research and whole staff discussion the college has decided to move to one-hour classes starting this academic year. There are many reasons for this change, but it is primarily to improve the teaching and learning experience for all of our students. By introducing one-hour classes we aim to:

• Facilitate a more active learning environment for all students.

• Create more interactive classrooms that are student centred.

• Improve group work, and embed peer learning.

• Increase inquiry based learning.

Solidify varied teaching methodologies.

• Facilitate the implementation of good formative assessment practices.

• Meanwhile, this new structure falls in line with the requirements of the revised Junior Certificate Curriculum.

Killarney Community College is the first school in the Killarney area to take on this progressive challenge. It is our hope that students will take more responsibility for their learning as they will be more active participants. Students should



become more focused but less stressed as they are now preparing for six classes (instead of 9) a day. Bags should be lighter, and students more organised. There will be time now for positive student/teacher collaboration in the class. There should also be evidence of an improved atmosphere in the school building as there will be less disruption and time lost when changing over of classes. The time allocation and class contact time of each subject has been carefully calculated, and adjusted where necessary so that over the course of study students receive the correct amount of time.

As with any major change in our college we will monitor and review this progressive new initiative at the end of the year with teachers, parents, and students.

The Governing Body of ERYICA (The European Youth Information and Counselling Agency) is meeting this week in Killarney as part of an enhanced engagement in Ireland. The meeting which is being organised by KDYS and Youth Work Ireland, will examine a variety of EU wide topics relevant to young people and youth services today. The main focus of ERYICA is supporting and promoting quality general youth information policy and practice at all levels, a process which KDYS lead on in Kerry and Youth Work Ireland nationally. The meeting and an associated seminar in Dublin next week will work to further develop critical areas of youth information provision in Ireland and throughout the EU. ERYICA is composed of national bodies (non-governmental or governmental) which seek to guarantee the right of young people to full and reliable information, which helps them make the choices they face in their lives, and which promotes their autonomy and their active participation in a democratic society.

Tim O'Donoghue, Director of KDYS Services said;- "We are delighted to bring this significant European meeting to Kerry and to host it in our Youth Centre in Killarney. This is a key part of our ambition to develop our Killarney Centre into a formally approved 'European Youth Centre' under the Council of Europe. If successful the Killarney Centre will be the first European Youth Centre in Ireland and will represent and strengthen Ireland's commitment to Youth Development in Europe. This will, most importantly, open up new opportunities for local young people and professionals to access many opportunities across Europe under a range of European initiatives." "Ireland has a particularly strong and proud record in supporting the provision of youth information and has been the model and inspiration to many other European countries. The Irish voice on this matter therefore commands respect at a

European Level. The meeting of ERYICA in Kerry will formulate a strong message emphasising the critical importance of Youth Information Services and for the new Youth Strategy currently being formulated by the European Commission to strongly support the right of young people to quality and appropriate information." Said Patrick Burke, CEO of Youth Work Ireland.

The annual 200 KM gruelling Kerry Way Ultra Marathon - non stop endurance race, departed from Randles Garage, Killarney, at dawn on Friday morning as Race Director Eileen Daly saw off the Fifty two Elite runners who competed and raced solidly for 40 hours!. 

KILLARNEY MAINTAINS TOP TEN STATUS IN IBAL LITTER SURVEY

The latest survey by business group Irish Business Against Litter (IBAL) shows Killarney in 9th position in the ranking of 40 towns and cities and once again deemed "Cleaner than European Norms". The town is a former winner of the IBAL Anti Litter League.

While nearly all of Ireland's main towns are now clean, pockets of our major cities continue to suffer from significant levels of litter. The study, conducted by an Taisce, showed only two of 25 towns surveyed to be littered, but 7 of the 8 bottom places in the rankings to be occupied by city areas. IBAL says councils need to concentrate on those specific areas where the problem is worst.

The An Taisce report on Killarney stated: "Killarney has been a top performing town for a number of years in the IBAL Litter survey and this high ranking is continued in 2016. Some of the particularly good sites included High Street and Main Street, the residential area of Countess Grove and Plunkett Street – the latter had colourful windows boxes and nicely presented shop fronts." 





TAX Matters with



CHANGING JOB: TAX & PRSI

Whenever you leave a job you should get a P45 certificate from your employer. Your P45 is a statement from your employer that shows your pay, tax, USC, and PRSI details for the year up to the date you leave.

When you begin work at your new job, you will need this P45 to give to your new employer. Your new employer then takes some details from your P45 and then sends your P45 to the tax office on your behalf. This is to notify the tax office that you have now commenced working for a new employer and ensures that they are deducting tax appropriately. When you give the P45 to your new employer, they will:

- Operate PAYE in accordance with the tax credits and standard cut off point details shown on the P4S until they receives a tax credit certificate from the tax office.
- Notify the tax office that you have changed jobs so that a tax credit certificate can be issued for your new job.

If you do not give your new employer a P45 certificate, emergency tax will be deducted.

REDUCING EXPOSURE TO POLLUTANTS WHILE STUCK IN TRAFFIC

We can now thank outdoor air pollution for seven million premature deaths a year, according to the World Health Organization (WHO). In London, for example, air pollution kills more than 10-times the number of people than traffic accidents do. In urban areas, says WHO, outdoor air pollution was as carcinogenic to humans in October 2013 as smoking was in February 1985. Looking at the problem, last year a group of researchers led by the University of Surrey's Dr. Prashant Kumar found that drivers stopped at traffic lights were exposed to up to 29 times more harmful particulate matter than those driving in moving traffic. Dr. Kumar and his research team advises that when stuck in traffic, "Where possible and with weather conditions allowing, closing the windows and turning off the fan – or turning the fan on recirculating, increasing the distance between you and the car in front while in traffic jams or stationary at traffic lights - are the best ways to limit your exposure. If the fan or heater needs to be on, the best setting would be to have the air recirculating within the car without drawing in air from outdoors" he added.

THE SEASON OF CREATION

The Season of Creation is a month-long prayerful observation of the state of the world, its beauty and the ecological crises that threaten it and all its inhabitants. It runs from September 1st, the World Day of Prayer for Creation, through to October 4th, the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi. On September 1st at the Vatican Pope Francis celebrated the World Day of Prayer for Creation with a message that urged Catholics to view care for creation among the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. The pope also called on individuals in the various countries of the world to push their governments to make good on recent international agreements aimed at halting the warming of the atmosphere and encouraging sustainable development. Repeating his call from his June 2015 ecological encyclical Laudato Si', Pope Francis said "Global warming continues, due in part to human activity: 2015 was the warmest year on record, and 2016 will likely be warmer still." "This is leading to ever more severe droughts, floods, fires and extreme weather events," the pope continued "Climate change is also contributing to the heart-rending refugee crisis. The world's poor, though least responsible for climate change, are most vulnerable and already suffering its impact." Asking that the continuing Jubilee year of mercy might summon a "profound interior conversion" among individuals for better treatment of the environment, Pope Francis says it is time for humanity to "repent of the harm we are doing to our common home."

IF A BLOOD DONATION COULD SAVE YOUR OWN OR YOUR CHILDS LIFE WOULD YOU CARE WHO THE DONOR WAS?

In the early 1940s, large-scale blood donation was still a relatively new technology. Improvements in storage, ranging from special plastic bottles to new anticoagulants, had made blood banking and transportation a sudden possibility. Governments, anticipating unprecedented wartime injuries, jumped on its promise - as did civilians looking for a new way to help. Even before the U.S. joined World War II, Americans proudly sent blood overseas via the "Plasma for Britain" project, which was masterminded by Charles Drew, a black doctor from Washington, D.C. - yet in late 1941, the U.S. Army and Navy told the Red Cross that they would only accept blood from white donors - black Americans nationwide were banned from giving blood. After three months of uproar, the US military changed their position slightly - instead of refusing black people's blood outright, they would instead segregate it from the white supply. Meanwhile, they doubled down on the party line, suggesting that all those who disagreed with this policy were undermining the war effort. Letters from thousands of white constituents appeared on the desks of Congressmen, expressing concerns about multiracial transfusions and supporting the separation. Despite the fact that it had long

been known that human blood is all alike, from whatever race it comes, the Red Cross in the U.S. (who let it be said never approved of the policy did not get it straightened out until 1950, when, after a decade of criticism, they finally stopped segregating blood though some states, like Louisiana, took even longer to come around. That was in the "Land of the Free" in the 1940's but do you know that even in Ireland and in many other parts of the world in 2016 blood donation is still mixed with discrimination - since the 1980s until June of this year in the Irish Republic there was a total ban on gay and bisexual men donating blood and though the lifting of the total ban is to be welcomed they will have to wait one year before being able to donate blood after last sexual contact which effectively means a gay man can never donate blood unless he is celibate and as yet no date has yet been set for when the policy will change. This "lifting" of the ban will bring Ireland into line with a similar policy set to commence in Northern Ireland in September, and which has already been enacted in Great Britain.

ON THIS DATE – 9TH SEPTEMBER

1754 - Captain William Bligh, known best for his role in the mutiny on the 'Bounty' was born. 1803 - The "Lady Nelson" arrived in Van Diemen's Land, now Tasmania, in preparation for the first British settlement

1870 - Canadian Finance Minister authorised legally struck copper tokens, sous, and halfpence as cents, and Canadian one-pence pieces as two cents, effective from October 1st, 1870; announced withdrawal of the 20c piece.

1880 - Australian pioneer in physical therapy for polio sufferers, Sister Elizabeth Kenny, is born.

1914 - The German advance on Paris is halted and thrown back by a British and French counterattack.

1918 - Returning troops brought the Spanish Influenza to Canada.

1919 - Alexander Graham Bell's newly invented HD-4 hydrofoil, powered by twin aircraft engines, reached a new world water speed record of 122 kph;

1939 - Ottawa set up the Agricultural Supplies Committee for wartime distribution.

1976 - The government's establishment of New Zealand's first centralised electronic database through the Wanganui Computer Centre Act raised questions about the state's ability to gather information on its citizens. 1978 - Jack Warner died; the film producer and studio boss was one of 12 children of Jewish immigrants from Poland who first settled in London, Ontario, where he was born on August 2, 1892. In 1905 he and his other Warner brothers, Albert Warner, Sam Warner and Harry Warner started a film distribution business in Ohio, but were soon forced to sell out to the Patents Company. They started producing shorts in 1912, and established a studio at Burbank, California, called Warner Bros. In 1927 they launched the sound era with Al Jolson's The Jazz Singer.

IRELAND'S PYRAMID

Pyramids have been used as burial tombs for almost 5,000 years, beginning with the ancient Egyptian pharaoh Djoser. A few thousand years later, a 19th century Irish nobleman may have seen the pharaoh's extraordinary mausoleum, and thought, "I could use one of those myself." Kinnitty Pyramid, the only one of its kind in Ireland, is situated in the graveyard of the Church of Ireland in the village of Kinnity 13 km east of Birr in Co. Offaly on the R440 and R421 regional roads. It stands 30 feet in height and was built as a crypt by Lt. Col Richard Wesley Bernard for his family on his return from Egypt in the mid 1800's. It is an exact replica of the Pyramid of Cheop in Egypt. Building began in 1830 and was completed in 1834. It is permanently sealed now. The doors are 3 inches in width and made of steel that lead down 5 steps to the inside tomb. There are 6 coffins belonging to the Bernards of Kinnity Castle. The first Bernard entombed is believed to be Margaret, who was laid to rest in 1842 at the age of only 24, after being bitten by a rabid dog. Over the next 65 years five more Bernards followed before the doors were final sealed in 1907. The village itself derives its name from the myth that the head of an ancient princess is buried beneath the village, Ceann being Irish for head and Eitigh being the name of the princess. In the 11th century the O'Carroll's of Ely built a castle on the site. In 1630 a new castle was built by William O'Carroll near the site of the original abbey which was confiscated by the English in 1641 and was handed over to the crown. In 1664 the castle was handed over as a reward for military service to Colonel Thomas Winter, his descendants sold the castle after his death to the Bernard family in 1764. The castle was renamed Castle Bernard and in 1811 the family commissioned architects to extend it. The castle was burned down by the republicans in 1922 and was subsequently rebuilt by the Bernard's who remained there until 1946. The castle was then purchased by Lord Decies, who only lived there for five years before he sold it again in 1951 to the State. The castle remained with the state until it was sold to the Ryan family; descendents of the King of Spain, in 1994 when they transformed it into a luxury hotel which stands in woodland on a 20,000 acre estate.

A TOURIST GAVE AWAY HER PIZZA TO A HOMELESS MAN. BUT SHE COULD NEVER HAVE IMAGINED WHO HE REALLY WAS

A woman from France, Karine Gombeau, was in New York on holiday when she mistook the American actor Richard Gere for a homeless person. Without recognising him, she then offered him a slice of pizza. As the French tourist later recounted herself, she was out for a walk in the city with her partner and fifteen year-old son when she saw a man digging about in a rubbish bin. He looked like he was homeless. Touched by the sight, she went over and offered him some pizza leftover from a restaurant she'd been in. 'He asked, "what's in the bag?" I tried to answer him in English, but I ended up saying half the words in French. I said: "sorry, but the pizza is cold." He answered, "thanks very much, God bless you," Ms. Gombeau recalls. Karine wasn't aware who she'd met on the streets of New York until two days later, when an employee at the hotel where her family was staying showed them a photo in a newspaper, with her standing next to Mr. Gere. It turned out that the French woman had accidentally wandered onto the set of the film 'Time out of Mind', in which Mr. Gere plays one of the leading roles. But for Richard Gere and the other members of the film crew, the moment will surely stay with them as the perfect illustration of simple human kindness.

EXTREME-WEATHER TENTS FOR THE HOMELESS COULD HELP SAVE MILLIONS OF LIVES

For millions of homeless people around the world, finding shelter from the elements can be a challenge. Extreme winter cold and summer heat can be fatal to people who aren't sufficiently protected. Tough tents produced by BillionBricks, a small non-profit in Singapore, are helping in a big way to alleviate the problem. Priced at about \$100 per tent, the triple-layer weatherproof fabric is draped over a basic structure assembled from common PVC pipes. The idea is for people to find or purchase the inexpensive pipes on their own, so the tent fabric and joint parts can be shipped to them more easily. The team also decided to make the fabric drape reversible - in the winter, it keeps body heat in, and in the summer, it reflects the sun. BillionBricks just concluded a small six-month pilot in New Delhi, in which 12 homeless families were sheltered through winter and summer months. They gave suggestions to the company, such as built-in lighting — a feature that might find its way into the next design upgrade with solar lights. Some families have also requested larger tents. The structures are designed to hold two adults and three children, but a spokesperson for BillionBricks noticed families of up to seven sleeping in them. BillionBricks is working with other non-profits and governments to reach more homeless people with the product. The company plans for these groups to fund the tents, but is also working on a financing plan that would let homeless people pay for their tents over time. BillionBricks now plan to send 1,000 tents to countries in South Asia by the end of this year as another test project.

A LETTER WITH A MAP BUT NO ADDRESS REACHES ITS DESTINATION

Foreign tourists met a kind woman while on a stopover in the lcelandic city of Búðardalur, and they wanted to send her a letter. The only problem was they didn't know her name or her address. But with some ingenuity, a decent memory and the help of a dedicated postal carrier, the letter made it to its destination. The senders drew a map to the woman's home, showing several roads, a fjord, an arrow and a red dot where she lives. Where the recipient's

name usually goes they wrote: a horse farm with an Icelandic/Danish couple and three kids and a lot of sheep! And in a note in the corner of the envelope added: "the Danish woman works in a supermarket in Búðardalur" to help the mail carrier identify the recipient. They also wrote on the envelope Country: Iceland. City: Búðardalur.

CAT FOUND ALIVE AFTER 6 DAYS IN EARTHQUAKE RUBBLE IN ITALY

Nearly a week after an earthquake levelled homes and killed almost 300 people in Italy, one lucky cat was pulled from the rubble by a team of rescuers in the town of Amatrice, which was nearly destroyed by the quake.

The cat, named Gioia (which means "Joy"), had disappeared when her owner, Daniela Tursini, had fled from her home during the tremors. She was unable to find the cat when she left and had searched relentlessly for her, begging firefighters to help her find the cat, she told them "Gioia is all she has left. My house has gone, I've lost everything," Six days after the earthquake, firefighters were using bulldozers to clear away rocks, when one saw the gray-and-white cat trapped beneath floorboards and twisted metal. They carefully extracted her from the debris and found that she was healthy but dehydrated. Volunteer veterinarians working with the Ente Nazionale Protezione Animali, Italy's animal protection agency, have been working tirelessly to care for animals injured and lost in the earthquake. So far, they've assisted more than 300 animals, including dozens of dogs and cats, a cow in labour, and even a pair of turtles.

MOTORING OUTLOOK

CHOOSING AND USING IN-CAR CHILD RESTRAINTS

Two thirds of child fatalities in the underfour age group occur in cars. Choosing the correct car safety seat for your child is vital. It's also important to know that it is the driver's responsibility to ensure that all persons under the age of 17 are correctly restrained when travelling in their vehicle.

CHILD SAFETY DOS AND DONTS DO

Use only an approved restraint suitable for the child's weight and size.

Use restraints approved to the latest standard, (UNECE Regulation 44.04) – these fit better in modern cars and provide improved protection for your child.

Ensure that the restraint is compatible with your car. Check the seat manufacturer's application list, ask the retailer to demonstrate or install the seat, or ask for advice from the car manufacturer.

Buy a seat that uses the ISOFIX system if your vehicle has the necessary anchorage points - check the vehicle handbook.

Make sure that the restraint is fitted securely and firmly in the car – follow the instructions

CHILD SAFETY

and retain them in the car for future reference. Carry children in the rear seat of the car if possible.

Adjust the harness for a tight but comfortable fit each time your child uses the seat.

Check the restraint installation regularly to ensure that fixing straps or seat belts have not worked loose.

Check the restraint condition regularly and renew it if there are any signs of cracking in the shell or of fraying or cuts in webbing.

Ensure that your child understands the importance of being safely strapped in for every journey.

Cover the seat when parking on hot days to avoid burning the child on hot metal fittings when you return.

DON'T

Carry children unrestrained, no matter how short the journey.

Fit a rear-facing baby seat in the front seat of a car with a passenger airbag. Death or serious injury can result. Forward-facing seats should be set well back from the airbag.

Buy a restraint unless you are certain that it will fit properly in your car. No 'universal restraint' fits correctly in all cars.

Buy a second-hand restraint unless you Leave v

know its history and it is complete with all its instructions.

Buy an ISOFIX seat without first checking the vehicle handbook to make sure you choose a compatible ISOFIX category and size class.

Use a restraint that has been involved in a crash. Hold a child in your arms or put the seat belt around both of you. In an accident your weight will crush your child.

Allow children to release buckles or climb out of belts.

Modify child seats or buckles. This could have serious consequences in an accident.

Use an ordinary cushion instead of a booster cushion. In an accident it could fly out and the child could slide under the seat belt.

Leave your children unattended in a car.

all work together towards being better connected. Through sharing information, expertise and time, we can do a great deal to help those who are feeling vulnerable to suicide. Through our combined efforts a difference can be made.

You are not Alone

If you are feeling despair and having thoughts about taking your life – it's really important to know that these are just thoughts. No matter how overwhelming they may seem, you don't have to act on them. You may feel like there is no way out of the pain you are feeling. You may feel you can never escape the stresses in your inner and outer world. What I really want to say to you is this; even though you have these thoughts now, however impossible it might sound, there is light at the end of

the tunnel. No matter how big or small your problem may be, even if it's just a tiny glimmer, never give up hope. Don't keep these feelings hidden, there is no



shame. Know that you are not alone. Many people experience feelings of hopelessness and despair. Jenny is one such person.

Jenny's Story "There were times when I felt no way out of this prison of my mind. I just wanted the pain to end. I wanted to disappear. I tried to kill myself but looking back now I'm so grateful I got the right support I needed. In counseling I was able to talk about whatever was on my mind. I had always felt not good enough and somehow thought what had happened to me was my fault, even though I was just a child. I thought it would be best for everyone if I died. I know now I couldn't have been more wrong. After counselling, the 'demons' in my head have quietened and I've moved to a better place within myself. Yeah, sure I have down days but nothing like before. I've started a new course and for the first time ever I'm looking forward to the future." Jenny (not her real name)

Steps to take

Citizens Information

Know Your Rights: DONATIONS TO CHARITY

QUESTION

I make regular donations to charity. Can I claim tax back on my donations?

ANSWER

The tax code provides for tax relief for "eligible charities" and other "approved bodies" including schools and educational institutions. Revenue lists bodies that have been granted a charitable tax exemption on its website. If you make a donation of at least €250 to an eligible charity, tax relief on your donation is allowed to the charity rather than to you (the donor). Cash donations made in installments, such as by standing order, also qualify. The charity can claim a refund of tax on your donation at the end of the tax year. Relief is granted to the charity at a blended rate of 31% rather than the rate you actually pay. The donor is not entitled to a repayment of any part of the tax that has been repaid to the charity.

The amount repaid to a charity for any tax year cannot be more than the amount of tax actually paid by the donor for that year. For example, if your income tax liability for 2015 is \in 350 (which you have paid), the repayment to the charity is restricted to that amount. The minimum qualifying donation for individuals in a year of assessment is \in 250 and the maximum qualifying donation is \in 1 million. (Note that corporate donations are treated differently.)

If you are willing to allow the charity claim a refund on your donation, you need to fill out a form - either an "Annual Certificate" (CHY4) for a single tax year, or an "Enduring Certificate" (CHY3) which lasts for up to five years. You can find more information about tax refunds to charitable organisations in Revenue's booklet about the Charitable Donation Scheme.






