



# **GOOD NEWS FOR DEERPARK RESIDENTS**

# AS PROBLEMATIC TRUNK MAINS TO BE REPLACED

rish Water is replacing ageing, problematic trunk water mains in Deerpark, Killarney, to provide a safer and more reliable water supply to the community and reduce high levels of leakage.

works involve replacement of approximately 1,200 metres of aged problematic trunk water mains with new modern pipes. The programme to replace the trunk water main located in Deerpark will commence in mid-September. These works are being carried out as part of Irish Water's National Leakage Reduction Programme with the section of works taking place between Arbutus Grove, Arbutus Drive and Countess Road. Works will commence adjacent to the rear entrance of Dr. Crokes GAA pitches on Arbutus Grove, and will proceed along Arbutus Grove and Drive, through the Park Road roundabout where the new pipe will tie into the existing network on Countess Road.

Where water mains are being

replaced, traffic management may be in place. Parking spaces may be temporarily closed works. to complete Local and emergency traffic will be maintained at all times."

This project is one example of how Irish Water is working in partnership with Local Authorities to reduce leakage and provide a more reliable water supply. Fixing leaks can be complicated but we are making progress. In 2018 the rate of leakage nationally was 46%, by the end of 2021 it was 38%. We are on track to achieve a national leakage rate of 25% by the end of 2030.



# Public speak on traffic thanks to green light idea from TD

A Tralee based TD has got the ball rolling on Killarney traffic. The public ball that is. Pa Daly of Sinn Fein - the party has no councillor in the Killarney, the Kenmare or indeed the Corca Dhuibhne and Castleisland MDs - found locals in Killarney so overwhelmingly concerned by town traffic he started what was effectively a public consultation on social media.

At 5 pm on Friday last it took people 40 minutes to get to the Plaza on the Mission Road, Pa said. (They were lucky, was my first response as I have been stuck there longer.) The just under fifty responses to Daly's FB post twenty-four hours later had a variety of suggestions, some of them very interesting. Some echoed the concern by schools highlighted in this column not so long ago with one contributor suggesting a shuttle bus at Daly's Roundabout and another at Fossa. Heavy school bags means teenagers not on the bus runs have to be dropped off by private cars.

It's a great idea. Shuttle buses for general transport were put forward by more than one responder.

The need for the bypass to Muckross where most tourist traffic heads came up too.

Pedestrianisation contributed to the grid lock as the traffic now had nowhere to go but the Mission Road it was said.

Some people believed carrying out road and other works during the height of the summer season in Killarney contributed to the gridlock.

One suggestion I have heard frequently is the need for gardai on traffic point duty.

Indeed the town can point to the huge success of the Killarney Races in July under Sergeant Dermot O'Connell. Traffic moved seamlessly even on Ladies' Day because of the garda work.

Until the issue is tackled properly, Killarney will need gardai on point duty at peak school and work times and at key locations - Mission Road, Muckross Road and Hans Liebherr Road at 9pm, 4pm and 5pm..

This is the first time I recall a truly public

consultation on traffic in Killarney. A private consultants' report after approaches by hoteliers and others on the Muckross side was commissioned by the county council but to the best of my knowledge has yet to be acted upon.


Local councillors are hoarse from raising the issue of Killarney traffic and are years doing so to little avail.

The ideas so far on the social media pages of the Tralee TD are worth monitoring and listening to. This type of consultation "points" to a way forward too for the council to reach out to the public in Killarney on any number of issues. Killarney has felt the loss of its town council executive and planning offices in the town hall more keenly than most and a council facebook page for Killarney may be just the ticket. Well done to Pa Daly for showing the way.

# Tourism Industry a wonderful way of life for Kathleen

41 years have gone past in the blink of an eye for hotelier Kathleen O'Regan-Sheppard who says it was time to say "goodbye to the 18-hour day".

Kathleen, an industrial engineer by profession, and formerly with Cork



Kathleen had achieved the first Grade A guest house in Killarney and this blossomed into a four-star hotel in 2013. It sold earlier this year.

The testimony of guests or word-of-mouth referrals were her real marketing tool.

She will especially miss the company of her returning guests - some US and German guests returned to her country house in Killarney over decades.

"Tourism is a wonderful way of life," she said, adding how it gave her "immense joy welcoming people back".

However, Kathleen always looked beyond her own front door. Even during her busiest years building up her international business she was heavily involved in the IHF, Cork-Kerry Tourism and other bodies promoting tourism.

# A good year for the grapes, if little else Killarney has escaped the worst of what

continental Europe and UK and even some parts of this country suffered this summer. But with the planet heating up mercilessly, huge change is on the way. I was heart-broken to learn how even the sublimely beautiful garden of France this August - the Loire region - was brown and burnt by the sun. Water restrictions mean the corn has died on the cob and fruit and vegetable gardens simply withered. If you didn't know it, you could be in areas of North Africa bordering the Sahara.

Harvests, such as they are, are earlier and even the grapes are being picked weeks ahead.

Supermarkets everywhere are looking at covered areas and more tree planting in car parks.

White is being put forward as the colour in urban areas now to reflect the intense heat so that at least at night buildings are not so hot people can get some sleep.

Sleeplessness because of the heat is becoming a huge problem all over Europe.

The media attention at home has focussed on dramatic forest fires, some deliberately lit. But the real tragedy is the ordinary death of nature itself because of a combination of heat and lack of water.

Holiday makers returning to Killarney from Spain and Portugal and Greece have told me they will be revising their plans for next summer and go way earlier or later - there is no fun in being indoors all day to escape heat.

Meanwhile there is some indication that school terms may have to change on the continent.

Killarney too will probably have to look at the holiday season in a different light going forward.

Everywhere the case is being made for quick thinking to make life more pleasant and indeed bearable in not so much a changing as a changed climate.

There is however a bright and maybe a necessarty side to the heat in France: this year's grapes are for some reason the roundest and the sweetest in some years and those laying down cellars would do well to buy 2022 French wine apparently.



# HELEN TO HOST A COFFEE MORNING FOR THE HOSPICE

A Killarney woman whose husband benefited from the services of the Kerry Hospice Foundation is fulfilling his dying wish to highlight the importance of a Hospice which cared for him in his final days.

Helen Mannix O'Leary wants to thank the Kerry Hospice Foundation staff who made the final weeks of her husband Derry's life so special.

The staff at the Kerry Hospice Foundation made sure Derry (Jeremiah) O'Leary, 44, got to see his favourite horse-racing festival with friends in the comfort of his own home, just weeks before he passed away.

Derry was so impressed with the care and treatment given to him that he asked his heartbroken wife Helen to hold a fundraiser for the centre after his death.

The hugely popular resident of Muckross Road in Killarney - and native of Inch, Kilcummin - lost his three year battle with lung cancer on April 11, 2020 - Covid-19 restrictions depriving many friends and relatives the chance to say their goodbyes at his funeral.

Helen staged a coffee morning as a way to say thank you to the Hospice for helping her husband keep his independence right up to the end and will be doing so again next month. Helen is also asking others to register to host a coffee morning on Thursday, September 22 as part of the Bewley's Big Coffee Morning Social for Hospice at www.hospicecoffeemorning.ie or by calling 0818 995 996.

The nationwide event, which has raised over €41.5 million since its inception, celebrates its 30th anniversary this year.

"We were engaged for 10 years and married for just seven when he died. He was sick for three years, but he put up a great fight," said Helen.

"He was a huge sports fan and a Liverpool supporter but he absolutely adored horseracing. He went to the Cheltenham Festival

each year and to many of the local meetings, where everyone knew him.

"Indeed, it was at the Galway Races that he proposed to me. Due to his illness, he couldn't go to Cheltenham in 2020 and ahead of it, on February 26, he got really sick and was taken to the Hospice.

"He made the nursing team promise to have him back home in time to watch the racing on his own TV with friends and relatives.

"Horse-racing kept him going through his illness but the Hospice ensured his independence until the very end, with everything he needed to pass away at home."

Together for Hospice, The National Hospice Movement represents 26 Hospice and specialist palliative home care providers supporting patients and their families nationwide.

Funds raised locally stay local and go back into each local hospice service, helping to pay for medical and general staff, palliative care beds, home care visits, specialist equipment and new hospice builds.

"Covid-19 Restrictions only allowed immediate family to see him at the end and no-one was allowed to attend his funeral. I found this really hard because he was hugely popular in the parish and beyond," added Helen.

"We were a young couple who didn't even think of sickness when this happened and all of a sudden, we were relying on people to get us through it and that's what the Hospice staff did.

"I had to think about how I was going to continue paying the bills and the mortgage as well as other issues like getting a medical card. "These are basic things that I never thought I'd have to know about and I didn't know the first place to begin looking for answers.

"The Hospice staff were incredible. They had a dedicated person to guide me through every step. No question was silly to them and they

just knew what to do to make things a little better at every turn.

"Derry knew he wouldn't get to hold a fundraiser to say thank you for everything the Hospice did and so he made me promise to hold one for them.

"A coffee morning felt like the right thing to do and it gave people who couldn't get to the funeral a chance to get together and remember him with laughter because he was such a character.

"No-one thinks about Hospice care until it's needed but unfortunately our story could be anyone else's tomorrow."




# School celebrates the Beginning of the New School Year

# B FINAL WIN FOR NIAMH AT EUROPEAN ROWING CHAMPIONSHIPS





here were celebrations in Muckross last weekend, where members of the local rowing club were closely following proceedings the European U23 Rowing Championships, taking place in Belgium. At the Hazewinkel lake venue in the north of the country, Muckross rower Niamh Coffey was making her international rowing debut having been selected to row for Ireland just two weeks earlier during a final water trial. Her qualification however was the culmination of years of dedicated training both on land and water and followed her participation in several rounds of trials over the past rowing year.

In a sign of the high competitive standards required for qualification, UL student Niamh was selected as the sole female representative for the prestigious competition with just two male rowers also selected, namely Ciaran Purdy of Queens University Boat Club and Ryan Spellman, a fellow student and rowing team mate of Niamh with UL.

Niamh, the daughter of Sean Coffey and Denise Casey of Muckross, continues a successful family tradition in the sport of rowing. In her selection for the Irish squad, Niamh follows in the footsteps of her uncle Sean Casey, who rowed internationally for several years reaching the Olympic regatta of 2008 in Beijing. Niamh's parents, Sean and Denise are also well known in the rowing community with Denise having represented Ireland at the Home International Regatta and with a number of National Championship titles to her name. Sean's involvement in rowing also dates from his youth and he has coached several Muckross crews since the 1990s, with numerous successes on the national and international stage. Niamh's aunt Anita was also an Irish Champion rower at Junior 18 and Senior grade for Muckross.

Niamh's own involvement in rowing began during her first year in secondary school and from an early stage, her talent and commitment to the sport was evident. Niamh's early involvement saw her passion for the sport develop as she travelled to regattas and time trials around the country. The onset of the COVID-19 pandemic would see her final year at the Junior 18 grade significantly disrupted but the transition to college in UL allowed Niamh to recommit with the university's rowing programme among the most highly regarded and successful in the country. In the past two years, Niamh has continued to develop her rowing talent and has met the rigours of a demanding training programme head on, all the while balancing her training with her studies in physiotherapy.

In 2021, Niamh caught the attention of many in the Irish rowing scene in winning not one but four Irish Championship titles in a single weekend - a feat that is matched by few in the history books of Irish rowing. In a dazzling display, Niamh was winner of both the Intermediate and Club grade single scull events while also teaming up with crewmates to win the Womens Intermediate Double and Club Four titles. This resulted in Niamh's eligibility ascending to the Senior grade of Irish rowing for the 2022 season with the Irish Championships of July this year witnessing a very memorable win for Niamh and her family. In her first year as a Senior rower, Niamh was part of the winning Womens Senior Four for UL RC at the Championship regatta, a title won by her mother 13 years previously for Muckross in

With national honours becoming par for the course, Niamh's talent did not go unnoticed by the Irish coaches who oversee the Rowing Ireland High Performance programme from

their base at the National Rowing Centre in Cork – a programme that counts the infamous O'Donovan brothers, Fintan McCarthy and Sanita Puspure among its ranks with an enviable trophy cabinet of Olympic, World and European Championship medals from recent years.

Niamh's selection for the European U23 Championships saw her train Queens University coach John Armstrong, who also oversaw the training of Ryan Spellman and Ciaran Purdy selected to row in the Mens Heavyweight and Lightweight sculling events.

On Saturday last, Niamh made her mark in the first of three heats with an impressive win over scullers from Germany, Switzerland, Slovenia and Finland. This saw her qualify directly from the A/B semi-finals on Sunday morning with tough competition waiting from the competing heat races. In her semi-final race, Niamh was fourth with the competitors from Greece, Great Britain and Italy claiming the A final places and Niamh progressing to the B final. The B final saw Niamh drawn against some familiar competition to challenge for overall rankings from 7-12th place. Despite and early challenge from her Slovenian counterpart, Niamh challenged strongly through the middle of the 2000m race to claim her lead through the second half and power to a winning margin of almost four seconds with Slovenia second and the Czech Republic third. The B Final win and 7th place ranking in Europe is a tremendous result for Niamh in her international debut and holds promise for further success in the years ahead.

The successful weekend for the Irish rowers was capped with a silver medal for Ciaran Purdy of Queens University Boat Club in the A final of the Mens Lightweight Scull. Niamh's university team mate Ryan Spellman was fourth in his B final ranking tenth overall in the Heavyweight Single.



to 61,107 Leaving Cert candidates, including 2,009 candidates from Kerry, a linear adjustment was applied to the marks to ensure that the 2022 grades were on par with the 2021 results. In order to raise the results to the 2021 level, additional marks were added to all exam scores on a gradually reducing scale from 11% at the bottom scores to 2.7% at the top scores. No marks were adjusted downward. Of the 410,161 grades awarded in the traditional Leaving Cert, 50.5% increased by one grade and 49.5% remained unchanged. In the final analysis, the overall results this year are at the highly inflated grades levels of 2021. For example, 14.3% of grades were at H1 level in 2021. This year it was 14.4%.

#### **SUPERB**

The outstanding results were always likely to keep CAO points at last year's high level. That's exactly what happened when CAO Round One of offers was released yesterday. Leaving Cert results in Kerry were superb and, as expected, third level college offers poured into the region yesterday. It looks as if Kerry's CAO applicants will be top of the class in securing college places. More than 70% of Kerry's Leaving Cert candidates are likely to progress to higher education. A further 20% will secure places in Further Education, Apprenticeships and Traineeships. That scenario, of course, is predicated on students' ability to finance their education and to secure accommodation.

#### **ROUND ONE**

Two preliminary rounds of offers, Round A and Round 0, were issued during the summer to applicants not awaiting exam results. Round One is the main round of offers where the majority of offers are released. There are two separate lists on the CAO application form – Level 8 (Honours Bachelor Degrees) and Level7/6 (Ordinary Bachelor Degrees/Higher Certificates). Offers are issued independently in respect of the two lists (Level 8 and Level 7/6) so that many of the applicants who filled in both lists received two offers yesterday, one

from each list. However, an applicant can only accept one offer, in any round of offers, from either the Level 8 List or the Level 7/6 List. A Round One offer can be accepted online until 15.00 on Wednesday, 14th September. An offer automatically lapses unless it's accepted on time

#### **GUIDELINES**

Applicants sometimes find the CAO course offers system a bit confusing, so the following key points are worth your attention. You are offered the highest course preference(s) to which you are entitled based on your points. When you are offered a course preference, you are excluded from any course preference lower than the one offered. In the second or subsequent rounds of offers, you won't be considered for a preference lower than that already offered. If you were offered a preference, which is not your first preference, you may subsequently be offered a higher preference if such a place becomes available. It's not necessary to accept an offer in order to be considered for a higher preference if it becomes available. As there is no guarantee, of course, that a higher preference will become available, it's in your best interests to accept your Round One offer and hope for the best in Round Two. As the saying goes, 'a bird in the hand is worth two in the bush!' Finally, once you have accepted an offer you are not obliged to accept any subsequent offer.

#### **AVAILABLE PLACES**

These are places that remain unfilled after all offers have been made and waiting lists have been exhausted. The available places application facility opens at noon today, Friday at a fee of €45 to new applicants and is fee free for existing applicants, whether placed or not. When considering application for available places courses, applicants should ignore previously published points in earlier offer rounds. Applicants must, however, meet the normal minimum entry requirements for the course(s) in question. Find further information on the available places facility on the CAO website, www.cao.ie.








# **CRONIN TEAMS UP WITH MOLSON GROUP** FOR BRITISH CHAMPIONSHIP RUN-IN

This weekend sees the British Rally whom I am very grateful". This weekeng sees the Championship enter a crucial phase, with the series' fifth of seven rounds, the Rali Ceredigion, being decided over twelve stages around its Aberystwyth base on Saturday evening and Sunday. I'll give it my best shot to bring home the title with Molson Group and all of our other existing supporters, to





#### **SCRATCHED CORNEA**

A scratched cornea is one of the : • Blurred vision or loss of vision most common types of eye injury What is the cornea?

The cornea is the clear front part of the eye. This part of the eye is packed with nerves - it has many more nerve endings than your fingertips, for example.

#### What should I do if I scratch my cornea?

A corneal abrasion is a common eye injury.

If you are experiencing any eye pain or discomfort, or you suspect you have a corneal abrasion, you should always consult your optometrist for advice.

#### What causes a corneal abrasion?

A corneal abrasion normally happens after an accident or injury to the front of the eye. They are often caused by fingernails, or an accident in the home or while gardening.

#### What are the symptoms of a corneal abrasion?

There are several symptoms associated with corneal abrasion, and you may only experience a few, but they can include:

- Pain, which may feel worse when you open or close your eye. A feeling that there is something in your eye or irritation
- Your eyes watering far more than usual
- Redness
- Sensitivity to light

• A headache

#### How long does it take to heal?

Corneal abrasions will normally heal completely within 48 hours. If the abrasion is in the centre of the cornea, your vision may be slightly blurred. It is also normal that your eye will be a little red and you may find bright lights uncomfortable until the abrasion has healed.

#### **Treatment**

You may be given lubricating drops to make your eye feel more comfortable and help to keep it

#### The following may also help:

Over-the-counter painkillers such as paracetamol will help with the

Avoid rubbing or touching your eye as this may make the abrasion worse or slow down the rate of healing

Wearing sunglasses may help if you are sensitive to light

If you wear contact lenses, you should not wear them until the corneal abrasion has completely healed. Your optometrist will be able to tell you when you can wear your lenses again

If your vision starts to become more blurred, or if the pain and redness increase, you should get advice from your optometrist.

# SENIOR FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

Games have been coming at us in a whirlwind of late. We scarcely had time to pause for breath after an All Ireland campaign that turned into a thriller after a very slow start, and a thriller that contained a very happy ending for Kerry supporters. Clubs had to hit the ground running in the best club championships I can remember - separating them from the inter-county campaign completely was a huge success and, in Kerry at least, the gradings seem to have been justified by the quality and closeness of games. There wasn't a single dead rubber that I can recall – that's almost unheard of.

It's a long schedule for players and absolutely merciless in terms of recovery time, and I know that could become an issue (there are group games scheduled in the All Ireland championship next year). Kerry is in a slightly unusual position because we effectively have two senior championships – our club championship and our county championship. I firmly believe that the inclusion of divisional teams is the closest thing that there is to a secret of Kerry's success. Frankly, I am absolutely amazed that other counties haven't followed suit.

There is a strong argument that it has given us an advantage in terms of Junior and Intermediate club All Irelands – we have eight senior clubs instead of sixteen in most counties – a lot of our Intermediate clubs would be playing senior in other counties. But it means that county league players from relatively small clubs get to showcase their skills on big occasions in front of judgemental but generally appreciative Kerry crowds. I wouldn't swap it for anything.

There's a careful development system in place in Kerry for good footballers – you get very few players who aren't already in the county system by minor (Rathmore's Tom O'Sullivan and Paul Murphy are two famous exceptions). But the County Championship is still our headline act. They are where you really make your reputation and where you attract attention. Tralee Mitchels were so good they had to be broken up into three teams - they became Stacks, Rahillys, and Mitchels. The latter remain the only team to win the County Championship five times in a row - Dr. Crokes came very close recently. Austin Stacks in the seventies - Micheál Hayes sowed strong seeds in that fertile ground. Fr. Brian Kelly wrought transformations in both Mid and West Kerry.

I remember an old story about East Kerry being stuck for a midfielder one day because Pat Moynihan of Gneeveguilla had scholarship obligations with UCC. One spectator had done well in a garda tournament the day before, so they asked him if he had brought his boots. Young DJ Crowley had indeed – he won two All

Irelands with Kerry after and scored one of the most famous goals Croke Park has ever seen.

Shannon Rangers were a strong team in the early seventies, so the news that they were starting a sixteen year old raised a lot of eyebrows. Young 'Ogie' Moran, the Kerry mascot in a winning All Ireland in 1962, wasn't long joining senior ranks. Connie Murphy was known as a good footballer, but he wasn't really considered in the elite of Kerry footballers until the 1987 County Final. Dr. Crokes lost in a replay, but Connie Murphy was on Mick O'Dwyer's radar from then on alright! Stories upon stories, and every generation throws up new ones. It's woven into the seam of us as a people.

Look, I could tell you a thousand such stories. Give it a couple of weeks, and like Schezerade of old in the Arabian Nights, I could tell you a thousand and one. Who'll be the last team standing in this year's Kerry County Championship? And, perhaps more significantly, what new names will establish themselves and ask questions of Jack O'Connor and his selectors? Like everybody else, I have half-educated guesses and suppositions, but I'm really looking forward to finding out.

# GROUP ONE Kenmare Shamrocks v Shannon Rangers (Fitzgerald Stadium, Sunday, 2.00pm





Kenmare Shamrocks were unlucky enough in the club championships, but they might have a little too much reliance on Seán O'Shea for scores. If Kenmare can bring Stephen O'Brien and Paul O'Connor more into the play, I could see it being a bit more effective for them. They are a very solid team. It's great to see Dan McCarthy back in action, but I will say that for me he is one of the most promising wing backs around; I wouldn't be playing him in the forwards. Shannon Rangers had one tremendous burst back in 2014 that took them all the way to a semi-final, but they have been struggling ever since and I have to say that the omens don't look good. Jason Foley is the obvious headliner, Shane Enright is still a great footballer, and the likes of the Goulding brothers are serious talents. But my understanding is that the Kennelly brothers and several more players won't be available for this opening game, and that tips the scales in Kenmare's direction in a big way.

Dr. Crokes v St. Kierans





#### (Milltown, Sunday, 2.30pm)

Dr. Crokes have had the upper hand in recent battles between the two, but they have always been very competitive games. Crokes have basically been the kingpins over roughly the past decade, but the likes of Cooper, Buckley, Eoin Brosnan have quietly stepped away. Mike Moloney and Kieran O'Leary have been on the bench. Brian Looney and John Payne are as incredibly effective as ever and Daithi Casey has shown very well of late. Young tyros like Neil O'Shea, Evan Looney, and Cian McMahon have been fearless and effective in starting roles. Crokes aren't too far away. But Kierans have been serious dark horses for me for the last couple of years. Paul Walsh (Brosna), the Walsh brothers of Knocknagoshel. Thomas Hickey is out, but his brother Maurice, Luka Brosnan (I rate Luka very highly) and Brian Leonard are available. The Horan brothers of Scart. It might be a little early for Kierans to gel, drawing from three different districts, and you'd still give Crokes a very tentative nod, but I expect this one to be an absolute cracker.

# GROUP TWO Kerins O'Rahillys v East Kerry (Austin Stack Park, Saturday, 7.30pm)

Look, there isn't any real debate to be had about the favourites this year. I thought East Kerry were caught badly on the hop in their opening round of last year's championship. Don't mistake me - Stacks fully deserved their win and had a strategy that would eventually win the Bishop Moynihan -but I suspect that East Kerry would reverse that result at any other time of asking. This year you are including a Legion side who have been flying in the Intermediate. I don't actually envy Jerry O'Sullivan one bit - he'll have tough choices to make and there will be good players who won't even make the bench. That comes with its own burden - every tiny issue is magnified thousandfold. Win by twenty points and there will be people complain that it wasn't fifty - and would have been if their team was selected. No. Like everyone else, I have East Kerry as strong favourites, but I don't envy them.

Normally I'd consider this one a serious banana skin. After all, Rahillys went to last year's final and were unlucky to lose key players to injury early on in that game, and are in this year's Senior Club Final. They aren't getting the credit they deserve. But Cormac Coffey and Jack Savage being away puts a different complexion on it. Savage has been absolutely the key scorer

for Rahillys. Conor Hayes back from injury gives them a serious shooting option, and a team with players the calibre of David Moran, Tom Hoare, Seán Walsh, Gavin O'Brien....well, you're not going to muscle through them, are you? East Kerry will go into this one as strong favourites, and rightly, but I expect this one to be a lot closer than most people think.

### Dingle v Spa (Killorglin, Sunday, 2.30pm)

This is an interesting one. Realistically the winners of this one have a great chance of going through, while the losers are hugely up against it. Spa beat Dingle in the opening round of the Club Championship, and deservedly so. Liam Kearney was superb in that game, and Spa have other big aces in the likes of Dan O'Donoghue, Shane Cronin, Ciarán Spillane, Evan Cronin, Michael Foley, and David Spillane. But I think Dingle made a big mistake in that game, bringing Pual Geaney out around midfield in the first half. Geaney has played as a targetman ever since and is one of the deadliest predators around. Having namesakes Dylan and Conor (hopefully back from injury) makes a potent combination. Barry Dan O'Sullivan has been immense of late, while Tom O'Sullivan needs no introduction. Add the likes of wily veteran Billy O'Connor and impressive young gun Ruadhán Mac Carthaigh into the mix, and Dingle will fancy their chances. They can be a bit defensive, though, and Spa have gotten good at breaking through those lines. Accuracy will be key - Dingle will miss very little, and Spa will have to at least match their conversion rate.

### GROUP THREE Austin Stacks v Na Gaeil (Austin Stack Park, Friday, 8.00pm)

Well, there'll be a bit of spice about this one! The reigning champions against the competition debutants, and a derby match to boot. Na Gaeil were the main element in a St. Brendans's team who have made the latter stages three years in a row and gave East Kerry some fantastic contests at minor in recent years. It should go without saying that Jack Barry and Diarmuid O'Connor are a formidable midfield - they should have a slight edge over fellow Kerry players Joe O'Connor and Greg Horan. Stefan Okunbor is a big loss, of course, but I must say that I thought the weight of expectation being placed on his shoulders on his return from Australia was a bit ridiculous to me. I'd have left him play club football for a year and settle back into the game before pulling him into inter-county. Like Tommy Walsh before him, I think the body needs time to readjust after a professional environment in a very different game - and AFL is a very different game despite the similarity in some skills. Na Gaeil have unsung heroes like Damien Bourke, Enda O'Connor, Dan Goggin, Andrew and Fergal Barry, and young talents like Jack Sheehan and Tomas Ó hAiniféin. That's a club who have put a huge amount of work in on the ground over years and are now reaping those rewards. But Stacks might still be a bridge too far. They have a good blend of experienced campaigners like Wayne Guthrie and David Mannix supplemented by young guns like Dylan Casey and Jack O'Shea and Tralee CBS

stars Conor Horan and Armin Heinrich. Seán Quilter can be unpredictable, but he's always a serious long range threat. I think Austin Stacks have to get the nod in this one.

### Mid Kerry v West Kerry, (Austin Stack Park, Saturday, 5.30pm)

An Ghaeltacht have shown very well in getting to the last four of the Intermediate after a titanic battle against Gneeveguilla. The return of Dara Ó Sé, who played in a Cork County Final with Clonakilty last year, is a huge boost. Himself and Robaird Ó Sé are two of the best club midfielders around, big men and well able to pick off scores. West Kerry don't have a huge pick by any means, but the likes of Killian Falvey, Thomas O'Donnell, Maurice O'Connell, and Colm Moriarty have impressed with Kerry teams and have the fearlessness of youth. The likes of Brian Ó Beaglaíoch and Jason Hickson need no introduction to this level.

But they are coming up against a team who seriously impress me. Any team with Darran O'Sullivan, Gavan O'Grady, Liam Carey is going to be dangerous. Jack O'Connor and Seán O'Brien are two of the best young players in Kerry to me (hopefully Jack is fully fit after injury). Eoghan Hassett joins his older brother Gearóid on the field. Fiachra Clifford and John Tyther. Peter Crowley and Pa Kilkenny are elite quality defenders, but I think the likes of Caolim Teahan, Jack Brosnan, and David Managan would supplement any team. Milltown/Castlemaine will be plying their trade in Division One next year and I'm not surprised given the population flow, I suspect that they are a growing force anyway. Having Éanna O'Connor's accuracy on board doesn't hurt! Mid Kerry went all the way to the final two years ago, serving up a semi-final against Dr. Crokes that remains one of the best football matches Il have seen in any grade. Gavan O'Grady was visibly carrying an injury in that final – I don't think it would have really turned the tide after that wonder goal by David Clifford, but it shows that the bones of a championship-winning side are there. Mid Kerry could be very, very interesting to watch this year.

## GROUP FOUR St. Brendans v Feale Rangers (Castleisland, Saturday, 4.00pm)

St. Brendans absolutely captured hearts and minds last year, and could feel very unlucky to lose that humdinger to Stacks on penalties. St. Brendans go about their work quietly and well and have produced very good underage teams in recent years, especially at minor. The overwhelming narrative this year, obviously, is the loss of Na Gaeil from their ranks. That is a huge loss, of course it is, but I wouldn't exactly be writing off St. Brendans quite yet. As well as the young players to come into Donie Rooney's hand for selection, you have dual stars Brandon Barrett (the definition of a box to box player), sharpshooter Jordan Conway, and Michael Leane coming on board. All three may be best known as Kerry hurlers, but they are serious footballers as well – I consider Leane in particular to be an under-rated talent. Ivan Parker is a hugely consistent scorer, and that can take a team a long way.

It's not exactly any secret that North Kerry football has been struggling for some time. Part of that is increasing urbanisation, part of it is the lure and love of hurling. But it has become a problem and a glance at results in recent years for both the North Kerry sides clearly proves it. North Kerry have amalgamated at underage and it's generated a huge buzz around those teams. They lost the County U21 Final in a cracker after extra-time to East Kerry. The minors went a step further and brought the Frank King Cup back to North Kerry. That's a big lift for young players who, frankly, had grown unaccustomed to seeing silverware in their home parishes. Will that translate into success for Feale Rangers on the field? This game with St. Brendans will tell an awful lot, but I think unless they can really hit the ground running (and remember, their preparation time is even shorter than most because of the North Kerry Hurling Championship) then I think they might struggle. I think you'll have a North Kerry combination in the Senior County Championship before too long, and I think it's a necessary step going forward for the area.

Templenoe v South Kerry (Fitzgerald Stadium, Saturday, 3.45pm)

If Templenoe weren't a senior club, they would have been almost certainly joining up with South Kerry - they did so at minor and were part of the South Kerry team that ended East Kerry's six year reign. As such, there's a slight irony about their meeting, but no more so than Spa playing East Kerry, it won't be a factor, just a point of interest. South Kerry were the best team in Kerry before Crokes took over, but they haven't really troubled the top echelons since that amazing 2015 triumph over Killarney Legion - Declan O'Sullivan's finest hour. Seán O'Sullivan doesn't have Declan to call on, and Bryan Sheehan has finally called it a day. They have also lost the likes of Mark Griffin to Éire Óg (Griffin was a powerhouse at centre back), sharpshooter Éanna O'Connor (to Milltown/ Castlemaine) and the O'Sullivan brothers of Valentia (to Austin Stacks). You still have plenty of talent with the likes of Graham O'Sullivan, Robert Wharton, the Cliffords and O'Dwyers of Waterville, Brian Sugrue in Reenard, the Dalys and Conor O'Shea of St. Marys. Cian O'Donoghue's return from injury is a nice boost. But Templenoe are a joy to watch these days. The Spillanes, Gavin Crowley, and Tadhg Morley need no introduction and are as good or better than ever. But there is real strength in depth. Brian and Colin Crowley, Patrick Clifford, Josh Crowley Holland, veteran Seán Sheehan, John Rice, Kieran O'Neill, the Hallisseys.....there's absolutely no weakness there. When on song, Stephen O'Sullivan is almost as dangerous a threat as Killian. For that matter, Aidan Crowley at full forward looks a real find and his long range frees are an added threat. For that matter, the long range accuracy by the likes of Gavin Crowley in the club championship was spectacular. Any team that can hurt you with kicks like that will be dangerous to anyone. They are a seasoned side now and I think they could catch South Kerry early on before they find their feet.

## OKWUTE SIGNS FOR STOCKPORT

I've watched the first four episodes of 'Wrexham FC', the documentary about Hollywood actors Ryan Reynolds and Rob McElhenny's attempts to restore Wales' oldest soccer club to it's former glory - or at least back to professional league status. Reynolds and McElhenney don't actually eat up too much screen time - McElhenney speaks very well about the parallels between South Philadelphia and Wrexham and the industrial collapse of both in the early '80s and how the immersion in sport helped. The real stars are unquestionably the players, staff, and most especially the long-suffering supporters whose lives are inextricably intertwined - these are ordinary people who speak with great candour about their emotional connection to the club. It's a glimpse into the real life of a football club, not one of those glossy and carefully manufactured documentaries/ hagiographies for the Premiership giants that are basically just ads. This is where football



really lives, down at the roots.

I mention this because one of the teams that Wrexham face in that dog-eat-dog world where results matter more than share price is Stockport, and one of the players who will be plying his trade there from now on is Killarney's own Daniel Okwute. Daniel has signed a two year deal with the club, with the option of a third

Daniel has been on the radar of a number of clubs, having scored a whopping 17 goals in sixteen games for the Kerry U19s – all the

more impressive in a struggling team down at the foot of the table. Daniel has starred for Kerry teams since the Kennedy Cup, where he played as a winger/striker, and his first touch and lightning pace make him a real threat for any team.

A lot of casual supporters in Ireland seem to equate League Two in England with something like the Irish First Division. It's not - it's an entire stratosphere above that, making some of the expectations we tend to place on young players going over on professional contracts a bit unrealistic. League Two players aren't just full-time professionals, a lot of them are earning between £65 -£78k a year. Daniel isn't going to be starting off on that, but this is a very real and viable career move in it's own right, not just a shop window. Very, very few players get this far; it takes skill, guts, and most of all dedication to get your foot in this particular door, so congratulations and best wishes to Daniel going forward.

## <u>Ireland</u> Ladies Defy the Odds

Five years ago, the Irish womens' team were sharing tracksuits and changing in public toilets. Things were so bad that an FAI that already had a low reputation initially simply shrugged off their complaints with a few token platitudes until the public clearly got behind the players. It was in many ways the pebble that started the avalanche – John Delaney's credibility took a huge blow. He had put up a huge fight over what should have been a modest sum of money in overall terms. Why? Well, that mess was slowly but inexorably dragged into the light of day.

Small comfort to the women, though. Facilities had improved to at least a minimum standard, but Ireland still hadn't qualified for a major tournament and didn't look likely to. Enter Vera Pauw. An extremely experienced Dutch coach from the same calvinist work ethic and sensibility as the great Cruyff - she has shown great personal courage recently, I for one am a huge fan. Pragmatically ambitious and extremely professional, she cast the net far and wide, tightened Ireland's defence considerably, and got Ireland using the ball more - we are a passing team now, not hit-and-hope. You could feel momentum shift a small bit - I will freely confess that I didn't really give them a hope of qualification. We simply aren't prolific goalscorers.

But bit by bit, results started to tot up. The 1-0 win over Finland a year ago was a big one. Of course, we followed that feat of giant-killing by coughing up a bad draw to underdogs Slovakia – it felt like one step forward, two steps back. We lost the Pinatar Cup semi-final to Russia last Spring – a great tournament for us, but were the big guns blooding players instead of showing their hand?

Then came the Sweden game. 1-1. Against Sweden. That one had the clarity of a church bell – only a good team could do that. Believe me, that was a way better result that the 20-0 aggregate victories over Georgia. Two games left, and Ireland, remarkably, were actually within a chance of qualification here.

It wasn't vintage soccer in either game, to be truthful. Ireland were astonishingly negative early on against Finland – personally I thought you could sense the nerves and the tension. I have to say that I thought the amount of empty seats in Tallaght Stadium didn't do anyone any favours, either. Finland were a lot more willing to push forward with the ball, but very, very limited when they did get on the attack. Finland had one good chance but couldn't execute it – Ireland had two and took one. Lily Agg, ferociously determined all through,

ensured that Ireland were in the World Cup playoffs. 18 months beforehand, the idea was genuinely laughable.

Less than 500 people turned up in Slovakia last Tuesday. Ireland



used the full width of the pitch and actually played a good bit better – Slovakia would not be as skilled as Finland – but Denis O'Sullivan's goal was gifted on a plat by a poor defensive touch. We will need more teeth up front in the future – but Ireland have a bye in the first round of the extremely complicated qualifying process.

There's an awful lot more to be done – people like Ramona Keogh are needed on the ground to grow the game and the FAI need to invest more in our national leagues – but there are finally rays of light peering through the clouds. For the likes of Louise Quinn, Megan Connolly, and the truly superb Latie McCabe, this has been a long time coming.

### SOWING HARDY ANNUALS

It may seem a long time away, but sowing some hardy annuals now will give you a very impressive display in early spring. Most hardy annuals can be sown in autumn and will over- winter quite well.

Hardy annuals are plants that will grow and flower for one year only.

When sowing your seeds, dig the soil over well, to about a spades depth, then rake it over and firm it down, and make sure it is weed free. A good idea before sowing your seed is to mark it out by sprinkling some sand on the on the area you're going to sow the seed on. Also don't sow the seed into soil that is too rich, as this will only encourage too much leafy growth and not enough flowers. If the soil is rich there is no need to use fertilizers.

You can also scatter the seed over the whole bed, and try and leave about a 1/4 of an inch between them and cover them lightly with some compost and water well, but make sure there is a fine rose on your watering can. There is a range of hardy annuals to choose from so make sure you know the heights and spread and, of course, the colour




