Representatives from Killarney hotels were among forty Irish tourism enterprises who travelled to London this week to take part in Flavours of Ireland 2015.



MARTIN EXPRESSES CONDOLENCES ON THE PASSING OF JOHN O'LEARY

Fianna Leader Micheál Martin has expressed his sadness at the passing of former TD for Kerry South and Minister of State John O'Leary. "I last met John in June when he launched his memoirs 'On the Doorsteps' Leinster House. He was a man I

had the great privilege of knowing personally, having worked alongside him as a young TD. A proud Kerry man and ardent Fianna Fáil activist throughout his life he was still full of energy and excitement about politics and the party. His passing brings to an end a remarkable career defined by his love of his home county of Kerry and his commitment to public service as the means to make his county and country a better place."

Martin told the Outlook that "Over three decades of representation at local government and Dáil level marked him out as a committed

public servant - a commitment recognised by his appointment as Minister of State at the Department of the Environment. He had previously worked for Kerry County Council and was eager to take his commitment to working for the people to another level. John was a veteran of the rough and tumble of Irish politics. He didn't always see eye to eye with the then Taoiseach Charlie Haughey and fiercely fought his corner in the constituency but always remained fully committed to politics as a means to better the lot of ordinary working people in Ireland. He was a firm believer in empowering the ordinary grass roots of the party who had their ear to the ground and ensuring that government did its bit to give people a fair crack of the whip.

"John's remarkable electoral success, topping the poll in eight of the ten elections he contested is a testament to his hard work and to the respect he was held in by the people of Kerry. He was the longest ever serving TD for Kerry South and served under four different party leaders - Jack Lynch, Charlie Haughey, Albert Reynolds and Bertie Ahern - from 1966 to 1997 often during turbulent and troubled times. His earnest dedication to the public good and pride in where he came from represents some of the best traditions of our party"

Julien co directed the documentary with Martina Durac. He is the son of Richard and Brenadine Behal and is a past pupil of St. Brendan's College, Killarney.

As the annual Hugh O'Flaherty celebration is about to begin this is an appropriate time to recall the to-date almost unsung heroism of Jane McCarthy from Killarney.

Jane was born in January 1885 at 74 New Street. Having left Killarney in 1910 to work as an au pair. She soon became a teacher and graduated from the Sarbonne University.

During the terrible years of the 2nd World War when France was an occupied country she became a very active member of the Resistance. Her apartment was used as a safe haven. She led many to safety from the city and across international frontiers. She rescued airmen who were parachuted in France and led them to safe hiding places. Her heroism was internationally recognised by France, Britain and the United States. The French Government awarded her the Legion d'Honour, the Croix de Guerre and the Croix de la Resistance. President Eisenhower acknowledged her greatness with the Medal of Freedom and a citation. She was presented with the Tedder certificate for her rescuing of British citizens.

Most of the money that she earned was expended on the welfare of internees and French resistance people in hiding from the Germans. It took many years for the greatness of Monsignor O' Flaherty to be recognised in Killarney. Let us try to ensure that her home town will not forget the life of quiet heroism of Jane and that she will be given due recognition.

THE ONE AND ONLY MICHAEL **SMILER MOLONEY**

MICHAEL 'SMILER' MOLONEY: In this week's article we recall the fantastic achievements of Michael 'Smiler' Moloney and how he made numerous Schoolboy International appearances while still playing for Killarney Athletic. Michael carried the nickname 'Smiler' from his own father Mike who was an outstanding central defender with Athletic in the '70s and was a member of the 1st club team to play in the Kerry District League when it started in 1972. 'Old smiler' got his early soccer experience as part of the Franciscan Youth Club teams. Michael also took some of his sporting talent from his mother Ina's side of the family as his uncle Donie Kelly was a talented soccer player with Lieberr and Athletic in the '60s & '70s. His cousins Alan Kelly and Paul Cahill also played with 'Smiler' for Athletic, as of course did Brendan Moloney, who we will feature in next week's article. Michael started playing for the club in 1997 and it would be fair to say that he was the most dominant underage player to play for any Athletic schoolboy team. He was a powerful centre back and scored numerous goals for his team when he went forward for corners and free-kicks. Michael also captained an Athletic team that won multiple league and cup titles at underage level and lead the Kerry Kennedy Cup team to a Shield win in the 2002 tournament as the side were unbeaten in their six matches. He was also a member of Athletic's most successful underage team that made the semi-final of the National Cup in 2002.

IMPRESSED IRISH TEAM BOSS: Although it was accepted in the club and the league at the time that Michael was a very talented young player with huge potential, it was also difficult for players like him in Kerry to get the opportunity to display their talent on a bigger stage. But playing at centre back for the aforementioned Athletic under 15 team in the last 8 of the National Cup in 2004 away to Belvedere Boys was the significant opportunity he got to impress as the Irish under 15 & 16 managers who, unknown to himself, were in attendance at the fixture. The game ended in a scoreless draw as Athletic forced their more

fancied opponents into a replay in Woodlawn that the Dublin side eventually won.

Michael obviously made enough of an impression on the Irish boss as he got a 'random' call up to join the Irish under 15 squad in their last friendly International of that season as they hosted France in Malahide. Playing with a considerable wind advantage in the opening half Ireland went in 1 goal up at the interval. Irish team boss Vincent Butler decided to give the young Kerry lad who only came into the squad the night before a run in the second half. Pitched into the centre back position as the French laid siege on the Irish goal for all of the second period the boy from Dalton's Avenue gave what the manager described as "an outstanding performance and didn't put a foot wrong" and Ireland held out to record a notable 1 nil victory over their more flamboyant French opponents.


SAIPAN CALL-UP: Michael's performance earned him a call-up into Sean McCaffery's Irish under 16 squad that competed in an invitational tournament in Japan and South Korea later that summer. There was great pride in the club when his name was listed as being in the panel and Killarney Athletic named as his club. Michael recalls, "In Japan in August, based in Toyota city, we beat Nagoya Grampus 3-0 in the group, and lost 1-0 to South Korea in the group. We played Japan in the 3rd/4th place playoff then and lost on penos! Japan/ Holland and Mexico were in the other group and Korea beat Holland in the final! It was a great experience and the stadiums were fantastic. We were also the 1st Irish team to revisit Saipan since the infamous 2002 World Cup".

SIGNED WITH HOME FARM: Michael took up on the advice to sign with a club in the Dublin District League to maintain his place in the Irish set-up and also with the hope of being 'spotted' by football scouts who regularly attended the DDSL schoolboy matches. So 'Smiler' followed the path of Diarmuid O'Carroll and signed up with Home Farm who flew him up for the Sunday matches. Michael was one of only two home based players to make the Irish squad for the 1st qualifying stage of the 2005 European under 17 finals. Ireland finished runners-up to Germany and ahead of Iceland in the group with 2 draws and a comprehensive 5 nil win over Lithuania. He missed out on a trial with Bolton due to a clash of events and without being attached to one of the cross channel clubs, he was only on standby duty for the 2nd stage of the qualifiers.

MICHAEL OPTED FOR THE 'GAA'

Feeling he had missed his opportunity to play as a soccer pro he opted to dedicate his sporting interest to playing gaelic football with the Sem and the Crokes who were also good to him and he won all the major titles with them. Michael also played for the Kerry minors for two years and won an All -Ireland under 21 medal in 2008 in a team that included many of his Killarney Athletic teammates. Michael's first appearance at senior level with Athletic didn't come until the 2010 season when he was a key member of Shane Kelly and Alan O'Connor's team that reached the last 16 of the FAI junior cup. Hopefully we will see 'Smiler' back in the heart of the Athletic defence again in the near future as he is surely one of the best players that the club has produced.









RSA EXPRESSES CONCERN OVER DRIVER ATTITUDES TO TYRE SAFETY

Irish Road Safety Week to Focus on Tyre Safety, Child Safety and Cycling Safety.

The Road Safety Authority (RSA) has expressed concern at driver attitudes to tyre safety, as a survey conducted by the Authority has revealed that 1 in 8 drivers (14%) have bought part-worn tyres in the past. The survey of 1,000 motorists, conducted in November 2014, also showed that motorists are not checking their tyres regularly, despite knowing how to do it. 8 out of 10 (79%) drivers stated that they know how to check the air pressure of their tyres, yet 1 in 10 check this less than once a year or not at all. Similarly, 1 in 8 drivers check the condition and tread depth of their tyres less than once a year or not at all, despite 72% of drivers knowing how to perform this important check. Tyre safety, child safety and cycling safety are the focus of this year's 'Irish Road Safety Week' which was launched last week and will see a week of road safety activities taking place nationwide until Sunday 11 October. In support of Irish Road Safety Week, the Irish Tyre Industry Association (ITIA) members will be providing free tyre checks to motorists at participating garages during Road Safety Week.

Speaking at the launch of 'Irish Road Safety Week', Minister for Transport, Tourism and Sport Paschal Donohoe TD said:

"Irish Road Safety Week' is an important event in the road safety calendar as it gives us an opportunity to review our behaviour on the roads. If we all looked at how we use the roads every day, I have no doubt that we would find room for improvement. So this week, consider what small change you could make to make the roads safer for yourself and others. In particular, as the weather starts to get that bit colder, I would urge road-users to ensure they check their tyres regularly. Tyres are the only thing between you and the road, so it is critical that they are in good condition and that the tread depth and air pressure are checked regularly." The RSA is reminding road-users that roadworthy tyres must be the right type and size for the vehicle, be properly inflated, free from defects and have a tread depth of at least 1.6mm.

Chief Superintendent Mark Curran An Garda Síochána said:

"Tyres are the only part of your vehicle that separate you from the road so it is critical that they are in roadworthy condition at all times. We would encourage everyone to avail of the free tyre check next week and ensure they are up to standard, particularly as winter approaches."

Ms Moyagh Murdock, Chief Executive of the Road Safety Authority said:

"We are concerned with the level of part worn tyres being used on vehicles, some are on sale for as little as 10 euro. When you consider that tyres are your only contact with the road, you really have to ask yourself is this the value you place on your family's life?"

"The RSA are currently finalising a report, based on an analysis of forensic data that shows the quality of tyres plays a much bigger role in fatal collisions than previously thought. So it is really worrying that people are not prioritising safety when they purchase tyres. Your safety, along with the safety of your passengers and other road users, could depend directly on the condition of your vehicle's tyres. If you drive with tyres in poor condition, you really are putting your life at risk. You may save a few euro in the short-term, but at what price? Get them checked and give yourself and your passengers the peace of mind that you're travelling safely." Moyagh added.

Mr Paddy Murphy, Acting President of the ITIA

"It is important to keep our car and its tyres in top condition, yet many of us don't make it a priority. As winter approaches and the weather starts to get worse, it really is critical that your tyres are in the best condition possible. If you are unsure what to do or how to check them a simple 5-minute visit to a local ITIA tyre outlet is all it takes to get your tyres checked for free to ensure they are safe. Today Friday 9 October, Beep Beep Day, which focuses on road safety for pre-schoolers, will be taking place in crèches and pre-schools around

The RSA will also be giving away 3,000 bicycle lights on their Facebook and Twitter pages throughout Irish Road Safety Week, while the road safety educational initiatives will be travelling the length and breadth of the country to teach children, students, parents and guardians about road safety.

Ms Moyagh Murdock, Chief Executive of the Road Safety Authority encouraged people to play their part in keeping our roads safe from death and injury

"To date this year, 119 people have died on our roads, 20 fewer than the same period last year. We can all play a role in keeping our roads safe by changing our behaviour for the better. Small changes can make a huge difference, for example, reducing your speed, making sure you and your passengers are safely restrained in the car, or keeping your vehicle, motorcycle or bicycle in roadworthy condition at all times. So this week, think about what you can do to be a better, safer driver and play your part in reducing deaths and serious injuries on our

WELDON'S WINTER STORAGE TIPS FOR YOUR LAWNMOWER

Your lawn mower has been a faithful fair weather companion. So at the end of the mowing season, give it the attention it deserves. Spend just a little time prepping your mower for storage over the winter, and you'll enjoy a happier reunion in spring. Here are some tips on what you can do now to be sure your mower will start easily next spring. Make sure your operator's manual is on hand for quick reference when you work on your mower.

REMOVE THE BATTERY

It's a good idea to remove your lawn mower battery for the winter and store it in a cool, dry place. Be sure to store it away from fuel cans and heaters/boilers. Disconnect the battery cable from the battery, starting with the negative cable (it will have a minus sign). Remove the battery and wipe it off with a cloth. Clean the battery terminal using a metal brush, or clean it with a battery cleaner product like the John Deere Battery Terminal Cleaner. For added protection, coat all terminals with a product like the.

CLEAN YOUR MOWER

Brush or hose off leaves, grass and mud from your mower. Always remove the spark plug lead wire from the plug before doing this or any other mower maintenance, and tape or tie it out of the way. Gently tip your walk behind mower on its side (Always air filter side up) to spray the under body with John Deere anti corrosion spray . If debris is caught on the blade, use a stick or tool to remove it - never use your hands and always wear gloves.

USE FUEL STABILIZER CORRECTLY

You shouldn't store your lawn equipment with a partially full fuel tank. Its good practice to use fuel stabilizer in a full tank of fuel. Add the stabilizer (also called fuel preserver) according to package directions. Then - and this is important - run the mower for a few minutes so that the stabilizer circulates through the carburetor. The stabilizer keeps fuel fresh for up to 6 months. Turn off the engine and completely fill the gas tank. A full tank will help



prevent moisture from condensing in the tank which can form rust that could break away and clog the carburetor.

STORE YOUR MOWER IN A DRY PLACE

Store your mower in a dry, protected place such as your garage or a garden shed. Never store it next to a furnace, water heater or appliance with a pilot light.

THIRD LEVEL TUITION FEES - TAX RELIEF

WHO CAN CLAIM?

An individual can claim tax relief on fees paid for Third Level courses in respect of any person as long as he or she has paid the qualifying fees.

QUALIFYING FEES

Includes tuition fees (including the Student Contribution), but not examination fees, registration fees or administration fees, in respect of an approved course at an approved college.

AMOUNT OF RELIEF

Tax relief is available at the standard rate of income tax (20%) for qualifying tuition fees. The maximum limit on such qualifying fees for the academic year 2014/2015 is €7,000, per individual

Per claim for 2015, the first €3,000 is disregarded in the case of a Full Time student or €1,500 is disregarded in the case of a Part Time student.

Know Your Rights: FUNDING FOR COLLEGE

QUESTION

I'm unemployed and thinking about going to college. What funding is available for this?

ANSWER

Most undergraduate students attending publicly funded third-level courses for the first time will qualify for the Free Fees Initiative. You must meet criteria as regards residence, nationality and immigration status, as well as course requirements. If you qualify for free fees you do not have to pay tuition fees. There is a separate Student Contribution, which you pay to the college.

The student grant is the main financial support for students. The grant can cover all or part of your fees (if they are not already covered), the Student Contribution and provide some maintenance. To qualify for a grant, you and your course must meet certain criteria and you must pass a means test.

The Back to Education Allowance is available to people who have been getting certain social welfare payments for a set period of time before starting their course. You cannot get a Back to Education Allowance and the maintenance portion of a student grant at the same time. If you are eligible for both, you should find out which would be of more benefit to you.

The Free Fees Initiative, the student grant and the Back to Education Allowance all have rules regarding progression from previous studies. However, there are exceptions. If you intend to start a course at a level you have studied before, you should check out whether the rules on progression apply to your

If you do not qualify for the Free Fees Initiative or the student grant you should find out whether Springboard can help you to return to education. Springboard provides free higher education courses for people who are unemployed.

Saturday Oct 10th is WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY and we reflect on what we can do to look after our mental health? Having good mental health means that we enjoy a sense of overall wellbeing. We function well in our everyday life and feel confident and secure in ourselves. There will be times in our lives when we will need to boost our mental health and wellbeing and the following tips can help us to stay on track.

- 1. Connect with Others. Building and sustaining good relationships with others can support and enrich our lives. Good quality relationships impact positively on our wellbeing and bring great rewards.
- 2. Participate in life and share interests. Being part of a group of people with similar interests can greatly enhance our sense of belonging and is good for our mental health.
- 3. Look after yourself. Eat well and keep active. Doing activities that we enjoy such as dancing, walking or gardening can all help us to feel good about life.
- 4. **Volunteering** is a great way to meet people and also a great way to learn new skills. One study showed significant health benefits for those who volunteered 100 hours or more a year. Another study showed older generations had less of a decline in health and lived longer when they volunteered!
- 5. Having a sense of purpose. Knowing what's most meaningful in your life and clarifying what is important means you will spend less time focusing on unimportant things and eliminate stress.
- 6. Let go and accept what you cannot control.
- 7. **Deal with Stress.** Know what stresses you and how you react. Avoid stress triggers if you can and if they are unavoidable learn how to manage them. Maintaining a balanced lifestyle will help you to cope with stress. Try yoga, meditation or breathing exercises to keep stress at bay.

TREATMENT

Pain control can be achieved by thermotherapy (heat packs) and acupuncture (strong evidence to support its use in knee pain).

Medication may be needed in many cases. Paraceatmol is a particularly effective and safe painkiller which does not lose its effect over time.

Medication with codeine (eq solpdeine) are also effective but may carry side effects such as constipation, if used regularly.

Steroid injections may be an option if a joint becomes badly inflamed.

FOOD SUPPLEMENTS

Glucosamine and chondroitin supplements have become popular in recent years. These are chemicals that are part of the make-up of normal cartilage. The theory is that taking one or both of these supplements may help to improve and repair damaged cartilage. There is mixed evidence as to whether or not these supplements help with OA

A large study was published in the British Medical Journal (BMJ) in 2010. This analysed 10 research trials of glucosamine and chondroitin supplements, involving over 3,800 patients with knee and hip OA. The conclusion of the study was that the supplements appeared to be no better than a placebo (a dummy tablet) at relieving pain.

But, there was considerable correspondence that followed the BMJ study. Some writers were critical of the study's design and conclusions and some cited other studies and individual cases that seemed to show some benefit from glucosamine and chondroitin.

Note: You should not take glucosamine if you are allergic to shellfish. Glucosamine may also interact with warfarin. You should talk to your doctor or pharmacist before you take glucosamine if you are on warfarin treatment.

SURGERY FOR OA

Most people with OA do not have it badly enough to need surgery. However, OA of a joint may become severe in some cases. Some joints can be replaced with artificial joints. Hip and knee replacement surgery has become a standard treatment for severe OA of these joints. Some other joints can also be replaced.

Joint replacement surgery has a high success rate. However, like any operation, joint replacement surgery is not without risk.



TIPS FOR SAFE AND COMFORTABLE AIR TRAVEL

- Drink a bottle of water before you get on the flight, so you start your journey well hydrated. If you hate buying bottled water, carry an empty water bottle through security and fill it as soon as you're through.
- Use a saline nasal solution or nasal mist to keep your nasal passages moist (just follow the directions on the bottle), which effectively boosts your body's own germ-flushing action. Or try applying a small amount of Neosporin or petroleum jelly just inside the nostrils (use a Q-tip if your hands aren't freshly washed). The steam from hot drinks, like tea, coffee, and hot chocolate, is also an effective way to keep the mucous membranes moist.
- Since heat kills most food-borne bacteria,

pay close attention to whether your airline meal is served piping hot. If you see evidence that a meal wasn't heated thoroughly, such as a still-frozen or cold spot in the center, send it back. Make sure all snacks and sandwiches are served in plastic.

- If you suspect a fellow passenger to be a germ dispenser, ask the flight attendant if you can move. You can either be truthful about the situation or try another tactic, such as volunteering to be in an exit row, asking to be closer to the bathroom, or offering to switch places with someone who wants to sit closer to children or other family members. If moving isn't an option, take steps to protect yourself. If someone behind you is coughing or sneezing, don't tip your seat back, which brings you closer. If the person hacking away is in the row in front of you, tip your seat back; gaining even a few inches can be protective.
- There's no substitute for hand washing as a first line of defence against all types of illness. Wash your hands before and after you get on the plane, using a paper towel to turn off the faucet so you don't pick up more germs before you're out the door. And don't forget to scrub under the nails; a recent study found that this is where up to 70 percent of germs hide.

WORLD'S FIRST SOLAR AIRPORT

Officials at Cochin airport in the southwestern state of Kerala in India say the 46,000 solar panels laid out across 45 acres of land will not only power the airport but they will produce an excess that will boost the state's electricity grid.

The project's designers say between 50,000 and 60,000 units of electricity will be supplied each day by the 12 megawatt plant, commissioned by the German multinational engineering and electronics company Bosch. India, which relies heavily on coal-fired power plants for its energy, is the world's fourth biggest emitter of greenhouse gases (GHGs), sending nearly 1.3 million tonnes into the atmosphere each year. China is the world's biggest polluter, with annual GHG emissions of more than six million tonnes.

Other airports in India are now being urged by the government to follow Cochin's lead. The Netaji Subash Chandra Bose International Airport in Kolkata, West Bengal is already planning to set up a 15 megawatt solar plant on 60 acres of land.

Around the world, other airports are adopting solar power to run all or part of their ground operations.

OCTOBER 2ND WAS WORLD DAY FOR FARMED ANIMALS

Last year on the 32nd annual World Day for Farmed Animals, over 12,000 people in 95 different countries on six continents participated in the Fast Against Slaughter. There were also candlelight vigils, marches, cage-ins, information tables, exhibits, video screenings, and more.

Activists in Great Britain protested outside a McDonald's restaurant, groups in Russia organized leafleting and outreach events, and activists demonstrated at slaughterhouses in 14 cities in the United States and 4 in Canada.

WORLD'S LARGEST CLEAN ENERGY PRODUCER PER CAPITA

Until the 1970s, Iceland was classified as a developing country by the United Nations Development Programme. For centuries it was among the poorest in Europe, a nation dominated by sheep farming, fishing and a dirty energy mix of fossil fuel, imported oil and coal.

In the decades that followed, Iceland radically transformed its energy system to one that relies on domestic renewable sources. Today, all of Iceland's electric power is generated by hydropower and geothermal energy, and about 95 percent of the nation's heating demands are warmed by geothermal means. This was accomplished through localized, profit-driven initiatives led by communities, small villages and individual entrepreneurs.

Iceland's president, Ólafur Ragnar Grímsson, has had a great deal to do with the country's turnaround during his 19 year tenure as he has been a tireless advocate of sustainable development and an outspoken leader in climate action.

MORE THAN ONE MILLION **MALARIA CASES EACH YEAR** DUE TO AFRICAN DAMS. **STUDY FINDS**

The connection between dams and malaria has long been known. The stagnant water of reservoirs and the puddles along their shorelines create perfect conditions for the Anopheles mosquito, which transmits malaria, to breed.

The researchers identified 723 dams that are located in Sub-Saharan areas where malaria prevails. Close to 15 million people live within 5 kilometers of their reservoirs - the maximum distance that Anopheles mosquitoes can fly. The researchers found that these people suffer more than 1.1 million additional malaria cases per year due to the reservoirs. In other words, one out of thirteen people in the vicinity of such reservoirs suffers from dam-induced malaria – year for year. The 442,000 people who live near the 60 proposed dam sites in Africa's malaria regions are expected to suffer an additional 56,000 malaria cases every year if the dams are built.

105 YEAR OLD SPRINTER

A Japanese centenarian broke one sprinting record recently, but was still disappointed he didn't break a second record the same day. Hidekichi Mivazaki celebrated his 105th birthday on the day before he became the world's oldest competitive sprinter. His time for 100m was 42.22 seconds, but that fell short of his personal best of 34.10 seconds which he set at the tender age of 103.

"I wanted to shave off a few more seconds as I got 36 seconds while training," Mr. Miyazaki said after completing his run. His world record is still intact and will likely remain untouched for years to come.

Mr. Miyazaki did not start running until he was in his 90s, and is now known as the "Golden" Bolt," a tribute to Jamaican gold medalist and world's fastest man Usain Bolt. Mr. Mivazaki was asked about the secret to his success and he responded by saying "The doctors are all surprised. It's all about being in good health".

WOULD YOU LIKE TO BUY A VERY SPECIAL DIAMOND?

The Blue Moon diamond is a 12.03 carat gem and is internally flawless. Until recently it was thought to be priceless. It's now scheduled to go up for auction and is expected to fetch a record \$55 million. The diamond was discovered in South Africa in January of 2014 and will be exhibited in Hong Kong, London

and New York before being auctioned in Sotheby's in Geneva on November 11th.

In November 2010, A 24.78 carat pink diamond called the Graff Pink sold in Geneva for a shade over \$46 million. The record for a blue diamond came last November in New York when a 9.75 carat gem sold for \$32.6 million.

COULDN'T THE POLICE LET THIS ONE GO?

Surveillance video in New Jersey caught a man taking a phone from a display on September 11th and showed the man return the phone. along with a handwritten note four days later. The man wrote he is out of work and his children are in need and took the phone thinking of the money he would get for selling

The store owner and his daughter said they are not interested in pursuing legal action against the man and said they hope that the man has learned a lesson. But the police said they will pursue the investigation and said the man should turn himself in to police.


BE CAREFUL WHERE AND **HOW YOU KILL A SPIDER**


FINALLY THIS WEEK

Welcome back dear reader there was great interest in the phenomenon of the recent Blood Moon and its significance. NASA tell us that such signs will not appear again on Jewish feasts for six hundred years.
