

Men's Shed and Meitheal invaded Killarney's Natural woodlands

The scourge of the Rhododendron was tackled head on this week in Killarney as members of the Men's Shed Association from across Ireland descended upon Killarney National Park to help protect a vital part of Ireland's natural heritage.

The civic and pioneering initiative is a joint partnership with Killarney Chamber of Tourism & Commerce, Haven Pharmacy, Killarney Meitheal Group and Killarney National Park. Through the generosity of Killarney Chamber & Hoteliers, all those attending will be accommodated and fed for the duration of their stay in Killarney.

The initiative takes place under the auspices of the Killarney National Park Mountain Meitheal which is sponsored by the Trustees of Muckross House – the meitheal being an ancient lrish agricultural practice which brings rural communities together in common cause. The volunteers will be specifically trained in using the approved "snip and spray" method which has proven to be effective at restricting the regrowth of the invasive plants.

Killarney National Park is one of Ireland's natural treasures. An unspoiled habitat of lakes, mountains and unique wildlife, the Park attracts thousands of tourists and visitors each year.

Invasive rhododendrons, whose unconstrained growth is a danger to flora and fauna, threaten the Park's natural beauty and delicate ecosystems.

Tim Cahalane, Rhododendron Management NPWS, Killarney, said "There are about 3100

hectares of Killarney National Park that have varying degrees of rhododendron infestation. Currently, approx. 2300 hectares (74%) of the park is under active management preventing rhododendron from becoming re-established following initial clearances using efficient and environmentally friendly methods. Along with a year-round student program, Voluntary Services International also hosts four twoweek work camps over the summer months and finally the Killarney Mountain Meitheal have also been working tirelessly over the last number of winters eradicating rhododendron in different locations in the park. There are also annual contracts for areas that are not suitable for volunteers to work in"


The programme is set out in an interactive workshop format which will include case study reviews of food producers, video stories,



FUNDING FOR RIVER FLESK





Last month Eddie Sheehy travelled to Kenya where he spent two weeks working on behalf of the project. He tells the Killarney Outlook about the progress that has been made there and how the families are benefitting from the fantastic work being undertaken.



2018 will be remembered in Kenya for the torrential and prolonged rains which fell during March and April which lead to loss of life, destruction of homes and property and damage to roads and farmland. It will also be remembered for the price hikes in petrol and mobile phone usage resulting from increased repayments on loans from foreign banks. It was against this background that the Kenyan Education project (KEP) continued its work focusing on school sponsorships, supporting a parish feeding programme, a soccer academy and the local S.V.D.P. group.

In the village of Embulbul 80 young children from needy backgrounds receive a hot meal five evenings

per week. For some it is their only meal of the day. It costs 650 euro per month to run the feeding programme. The KEP continues to increase its commitment to feeding the children by donating more money each year.

A large number of students continue to be sponsored in the local primary and secondary schools ensuring that their education continues. A number of students are sponsored to continue further studies, with one boy starting teacher education, another undertaking a business degree while a third continues on a medical science route. Jecinta, helped by the KEP to obtain a secretarial qualification is now working and returning to college part time to continue her studies.

The links with the local SVDP group remain strong, this year helping 15 families to purchase new beds, mattresses and blankets. Some of these families were visited by volunteers who saw at first hand the harsh living conditions experienced by families on a daily basis.

For the third successive year a summer camp was organised by the KEP. Thirty young children from the village were treated to a week of Arts and Crafts, games day visits to parks as well as receiving new shoes for the school term.


The Young Talents soccer academy made the news recently as their coach, Kaka, was nominated and chosen for a trip of a lifetime to travel to the Arsenal soccer academy to work with coaches there. The coach was short listed from nominations throughout Africa, which is a huge boost to the work of academy which the KEP supports financially.

WHEN CAN YOU ACCESS YOUR PENSION & WHAT ARE YOUR OPTIONS WHEN YOU WANT TO RETIRE?



Donal Barry discovers how the people of Muckross are happy to share 51 million litres of water a day with the rest of the county.

Surrounded by Council Officials, Politicians, Irish Water staff and a number of invited guests, Muckross resident Seamus "Sham" Courtney cuts an unusual sight amongst all the commotion at the Killarney Oaks Hotel.

Having ensured that a neighbour would collect him and make sure that he was on time, He sits patiently waiting for all the action to start at the entrance to the Hotel lobby.

Of course, the jovial local is taking it all in his stride as he does every day. After all the whole project was made accessible owing to him parting with "a little bit of my land".

Growing tired of the people watching, it is time to escape "for a smoke" before two full buses head for the hills of Muckross to officially open the new €30M Irish Water

Invested project.

"There are at it for the last two years, great men, great workers. No messing around just built it all up so quick" Sham fills me in as we depart to the car park and by the time we part our ways on separate buses, Sham has revealed the whole story and he is very positive about it.

"Barry's tea and Lough Guitane water, a great mixture" is his scampish departure to me. Certainly not much passing Mr Courtney by as he name checks me. A ten minute bus trip and the excitement on the bus is that of a school tour heading away for the day. In many ways, it is strange to see so many retired colleagues meeting for the first time in an age with nearly everyone on the bus having been involved or directly involved with the project at some time.

After a number of short speeches the Minister of State at the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport, Brendan Griffin and Cllr Norma Foley, Cathaoirleach of Kerry County

Council performed the official opening at the plant in the company of Moira Murrell, Chief Executive of Kerry County Council, Mike Quinn CEO of Ervia, Eamon Gallen Managing Director of Irish Water.

With the speeches out of the way, it's the turn of local photographer Don McMonagle to take charge as each interested group await their official photograph, no doubt to don an office wall into the future.

In the meantime, it will mark the official opening of the Kerry Central Regional Water Treatment Plant. A €30 million upgrade to improve treatment facilities that ensures a safe and secure water supply for almost half the population of Kerry. In fact Over 62,000 people and an estimated 1.2m tourists annually are supplied from the Kerry Central Regional Water Supply Scheme which serves one of the main tourist regions in Ireland including, Killarney, Tralee, Castleisland and Castlemaine.

"We're great at sharing" Sham can be heard saying in the midst of the all the action, as the groups as now dividing and sent on the official part of the tour.

"The project included the construction of a new Water Treatment Plant at Lough Guitane and associated upgrade works on existing infrastructure. The new plant is located adjacent to Lough Guitane and the Finnow River, part of Killarney National Park. Construction commenced on site in April 2016 and took approximately two years to complete." Our guide, who travelled from Bray to be with us, tells us.

The new plant, which provides 51 million litres of water a day, has a

hydroelectric power turbine for the intake of water, state-of-theart water filtration, disinfection, chlorination and fluoridation capability; as well as capacity to store 15 million litres of treated water (the equivalent of six Olympic sized swimming pools). That I am afraid I took off the press release for the day, as the excitement of entering what looked like Willy Wonka's factory has now eased a little as the science of the operation is explained to us. For most, this might be a tad too much but for Oliver Ring, the former retired Kerry County Council Director of Water, it proves to be most fascinating. In addition, why not, Oliver has spent a lifetime ensuring that the county's water supplies were kept safe and most of all kept running.

He is also extremely happy that as a result of the upgrade and investment by Irish Water, it was confirmed that the Kerry Central Regional has been removed from EPA's Remedial Action List - RAL is the list of 'at risk' water


Good news all round so as it was time to gauge the political reaction

supplies.

Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr Norma Foley said she would look forward to more days like today "when we will again see investment that will deliver upgraded facilities and services to the benefit of the people of Kerry."

Minister of State Brendan Griffin said the €30 million investment in water infrastructure, which is one of the largest water treatment plants in the country, brings very significant benefits to this community now and into the future. Mike Quinn CEO of Ervia - parent company of Irish Water, said the project represented an investment of €30m by Irish Water in the Killarney area. "This is part of our commitment to improving water quality throughout the country and will involve a €5.5 billion investment in capital spending on drinking water and wastewater quality and capacity as well as new infrastructure up to 2021." And we could not leave without reaction from the man who held the keys to the new "Water Kingdom".

OUESTION

I heard that there is a new grant scheme for installing solar panels in your home. How does the scheme work and do I qualify?

ANSWER

The Solar PV scheme gives grants to install solar photovoltaic home. This means you can generate and use renewable

To qualify for a grant you must:

•Be the owner of a home built and occupied before 2011 (or a home constructed after 2011 that was built to the 2008 Building Regulations)

•Use new materials and products that were not already covered under another grant programme

•Use a registered contractor from the SEAI's Renewable Installers Register for Solar PV

Ireland electrician

•Apply to be connected to the electricity distribution system using the ESB Networks NC6 form (pdf)

•Have a Building Energy Rating (BER) carried out after the work is completed

•Agree to participate in SEAI research about the scheme The grant covers materials and labour, unless you are a contractor doing the work in your own home. In this case only the cost of the materials is covered.

When the SEAI payment system opens (in October 2018) you can claim your grant online and it will be paid directly into your bank account.








Welcome back dear reader, Hebrews chapter 11 is a message on Faith. Little children trust and believe with ease. They are neither suspicious nor sceptical, and when we seek God with childlike faith we touch His heart. The people mentioned in Hebrews chapter 11 purely trusted God. They went through hardships, but their faith is what is remembered even today, because they believed God and saw Him come through for them. Their background, education or status meant nothing. The only thing that mattered was their relationship with the Lord, and He turned their weaknesses into strengths (verse 34). One day Jesus was approached by a man named Jairus whose only child was dying, and he begged the Lord to come with him to heal her (Mark 5:22). Jesus agreed to, but on the way He ministered to the woman with the issue of blood and healed her. Can't you imagine the panic Jairus must have felt - all he wanted was to hurry Jesus along to heal his precious daughter, and Jesus had to stop and heal the woman! Then some people came from Jairus' home telling him that his child had died, and to basically come home and organise the funeral. But the Word says that Jesus, upon hearing what they said; ignored it, and told Jairus "don't be afraid, only believe". It must have taken a lot for Jairus to clear his mind from the dreadful news and walk on with Jesus. When they got to the house Jesus put out all of the unbelievers, and prayed for the little girl. Jairus saw his simple faith and obedience to the Word bring his daughter back from the dead as Jesus raised her up in response to his trust. It is there for you too friend, let Jesus be your Healer today!



be bullied. But I cannot stress strongly enough that anyone can be a target of bullying and the responsibility for bullying always lies with the bully. There are many reasons why people are targeted by bullies and these can vary from personality characteristics to personal vulnerabilities. People can be targeted by bullies because of physical features, an illness or disability, sexual orientation religious or cultural beliefs or belonging to a particular racial group.

Bullies often bully as a means to exert power over others and to make themselves feel better. They are most likely doing it as a way to deal with their own problems, insecurities and low selfesteem. And not because of anything you've done. No one deserves to be bullied and it should not go unchallenged. Dealing with bullying can be tough yet it is really important to do something about it.

If you are being bullied - verbally, physically, socially, psychologically or online – telling someone about it and seeking advice can help. There is nothing weak about reporting a bully or getting advice and just confiding in someone can help to lighten your load. If you don't feel you can talk about it out loud or face to face, then write it down in a letter or an email. Many bullies want attention so ignoring them or walking away is your best bet. Be assertive and confident; adopt a 'Don't mess with me attitude' (even if you are trembling inside). It is important to not take anything bullies say to heart. Show them that their words have no effect on you. Some bullies may be jealous of you because of your success or popularity - so be proud of who you are. Over the next few weeks we will look at workplace bullying, cyber bullying and how we can deal with these.
