



FAMOUS KERRY WRECK SURVIVES STORMS... BUT NOT SOUVENIR HUNTERS

Before the storm...

A young Kerry girl, (pictured right) thinks she is Kate Winslet aboard the bough of 'Titanic' as she plays on the wreck of The Sunbeam at Rossbeigh Strand in Co. Kerry recently.

The wreck has been embedded in the sand for 111 years but this week's storm propelled the wreck from its sandy grave and dumped it on the rocks about half a kilometre away. The Schooner Sunbeam was

away. The Schooner Sunbeam was built in 1860 by Walters in Exmouth. She was owned by her Builder up to the late 1870s and was then bought by Richard Kearon of Arklow. On January 1st 1903 when on a Voyage from Kinvara to Cork she was driven ashore in a storm and wrecked with no loss of life. The wreck has remained on Rossbeigh Beach for the past 111 years.

KGH A SMOKE-FREE ZONE

Kerry General Hospital and the adjacent HSE community services are now a tobacco-free campus. The new smoke-free regime, which came into effect on Monday applies to all staff, patients and visitors to the hospital or on its grounds.

Prior to their admission to hospital, all patients are being informed of the new policy and for those who smoke, they will be offered free nicotine replacement therapy during their hospital stay.

Patients can also be referred to the HSE's free Smoking Cessation Services, provided by the Health Promotion Department.



The smoking ban also applies to Bantry and Mallow hospitals and is part of the HSE plan for tobacco-free campuses on all of its premises nationwide by 2015.

SAMARITANS RECEIVING MORE 'OUT OF HOURS' CALLS

Kerry Samaritans received more calls from midnight to 6am than at any other time during the day over the past year. That's according to the organisation's 2012-2013 Impact Report, which was launched in late December. The report launch was followed by a briefing by volunteers from Kerry Samaritans for

their local politicians. Almost 10,000 people had face to face contact with Samaritans in 2013, which is a 14 per cent increase on last year. While the number of calls received by Samaritans fell by 7 per cent on last year the number of contacts through other mediums increased by 18 per cent.

The issues of most concern to callers in 2013 related to family and relationship problems; depression and mental health issues; loneliness and stress / anxiety. These mirrored the most common issues for callers last year.

According to Director of Tralee and Kerry Samaritans Chris O'Donoghue Samaritans Ireland is the longest-serving organisation in the area of emotional support and suicide prevention. It is volunteer-led, with 2,000 people volunteering around the country and 57 active volunteers in the Tralee and Kerry branch.

ANOTHER SUPERB RESULT FOR KILLARNEY IN 2013 IBAL LITTER LEAGUE

Both Killarney and Tralee are among the ten cleanest towns in Ireland, according to Irish Business Against Litter's Anti-Litter League for 2013. Killarney is 'cleaner than European norms' in 7th position, while Tralee moved up from 34th to 9th spot – its highest ever - in the ranking of 42 towns and cities. The survey reveals that 83% of towns and cities in Ireland are as clean as or cleaner than their European counterparts.

An Taisce, who were commissioned by IBAL to carry out the survey, reported of Killarney: "Another excellent result for one of our leading tourist towns. As with so many previous IBAL Anti-Litter surveys Killarney has scored very highly – this time around there were eight top ranking sites. High Street was particularly nicely presented and maintained. Killarney Sports and Leisure Centre was spotless throughout. New Road and Rock Road were also excellent. Here is what the report had to say:

Killarney:

Overall 2013 result: 7th out of 42 towns / cities surveyed. Cleaner than European Norms.

scored very highly – this time around there were eight top ranking sites. High Street was particularly nicely presented and maintained. Killarney Sports and Leisure Centre was spotless throughout. New Road and Rock Road were also excellent. Lidl continues to undermine the great work being done in Killarney.

Killarney Sports and Leisure Centre: Grade

A. This was an excellent site – not only was it clear of all litter but it was very nicely presented maintained.

Brooklodge Hotel: Grade A. One of the lovely features of this site was the abundance of greenery throughout – there was a complete absence of litter throughout the area surveyed.

High Street: Grade A. The paving, bollards, ornamental trees, street lamps, flower boxes and seating all contribute to a very attractive streetscape – it is lovely to see this nice environment so clean and well respected.

Recycle Facility in Car Park at War Memorial: Grade A. There was a virtual absence of litter at this recycle facility – care needs to be taken at the area behind the recycle bins. **Tralee Approach Road: Grade A.** An excellent first impression of Killarney – the grass and flowers were in very good condition and it was a very clean road.

Bruach na hAbhainn – Residential: Grade B. There was a small, but obvious, litter presence on the approach and connecting roads of this residential development – all of the litter was food related. It was particularly pronounced at the base of brown steel fencing.

Car Park at War Memorial: Grade A A well presented and maintained car park – road surface / signage / markings were in good order and there was a virtual absence of litter throughout.

Lidl: Grade B. There were several separate incidents of sweet wrappers discarded in the car park – the overall appearance was very untidy,

New Road: Grade A. This busy road accommodates a couple of schools – there was a complete absence of litter throughout. All aspects of the area surveyed were in very good order.

Rock Road: Grade A. A top ranking site throughout – the brick wall was a lovely feature of this road.







Citizens Information

Know Your Rights:

OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT

QUESTION

I have recently moved to Ireland. However, I don't have any utility bills yet and I want to open a bank account. How can I satisfy the bank as to my identity?

ANSWER

Before you open an account with a financial institution, they have to establish your identity and verify your address. This requirement is set down in antimoney laundering legislation. Financial institutions include banks, building societies and credit unions.

YOU CAN PROVE YOUR IDENTITY WITH ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

A valid passport or current Irish driving licence

A National Age Card (issued by An Garda Síochána)

An identification form with a photograph signed by a member of An Garda Síochána

Documents issued by government departments showing your name, for example, a Public Services Card

You can provide evidence of your address with one of the following (which must show your address):

A current utility bill

(such as a gas, electricity or telephone or mobile phone bill).

A current car or home insurance policy .

A document issued by a government department.

A certificate of tax credits issued by the Revenue Commissioners.

A current balancing statement (' $\mbox{Form}\ \mbox{P21'}\)$ or a C2 certificate from the Revenue Commissioners.

A social insurance document.

Note that you cannot use the same document to prove your identity and your address. Alternatively, you can provide a letter from your employer or licensed employment agency stating that you have recently arrived in Ireland and have started work but cannot yet provide evidence of your Irish address (you will have to provide evidence of your address at a later date). If you open an account that pays interest on your money, you also need to supply your PPS (Personal Public Service) number. If you do not have a PPS number, you can contact your local social welfare office for information on how to apply for one.



Getting enough protein helps preserve muscle mass and encourages fat burning while keeping you feeling full. So be sure to include healthy protein sources, like yogurt, cheese, nuts, or beans, at meals and snacks.

No. 8: Spice it up.

Add spices or chilies to your food for a flavour boost that can help you feel satisfied. When you need something sweet, suck on a sweet for a long-lasting burst of sweetness with just a few calories.

No. 9: Stock your kitchen with healthy convenience foods.

Having ready-to-eat snacks and meals-in-minutes staples on hand sets you up for success. You'll be less likely to get a takeaway if you can make a healthy meal in 5 or 10 minutes. Stock your kitchen with:

 94% fat-free microwave popcorn (20-25 calories per cup, and you can make it in two minutes or less)

 Frozen vegetables, bags of pre-washed greens, canned diced tomatoes, canned beans, wholegrain wraps or pitas, pre-cooked grilled chicken breasts, a few containers of pre-cooked brown rice

No. 10: Swap a cup of pasta for a cup of vegetables.

Simply by eating less pasta or bread and more veggies, you could lose a dress or pants size in a year.

"You can save from 100-200 calories if you reduce the portion of starch on your plate and increase the amount of vegetables," says Sass.

very quick chicken casserole

INGREDIENTS

- 4 large or 6 small skinless chicken thigh fillets 3 shallots, quartered
- 📕 1 carrot, sliced 📲 1 cupful peas 📕 1 tbsp half-fat crème fraîche (optional)
- B new potatoes or salad potatoes, skin left on and halved or quartered if large
- 500ml chicken stock, fresh, cube or concentrate
- a small bunch of tarragon, chopped

DIRECTIONS

Put the chicken thighs, shallots, carrot, potatoes, some seasoning and the stock in a wide casserole and bring to a simmer. Cover and cook for 15 minutes, then add the peas and tarragon and cook for a further 10 minutes or until the potato is tender. Stir in the crème frache if you like.



Health Matters.... with Dr Sarah O'Meill CERVICAL CANCER AND THE HPV VACCINE

Cervical cancer is a cancer of the cells of the cervix (neck of the womb). Cervical cancer is the second most common female cancer in Europe. In Ireland there were an average of 287 new cases of cervical cancer between 2007 -20009 and 89 women died from the disease in 2010. Cervical cells change slowly and take many years to develop into cancer cells, making cervical cancer a preventable disease. HPV stands for human papillomavirus, which is a group of over 100 viruses. Different types of HPV cause different types of infections. Most people will get a HPV infection during their lifetime, from sexual activity. Most of these infections do not need treatment but they can cause genital warts and other skin infections. In some women, however, HPV causes changes in the cervix that can develop into cervical cancer.

HOW DOES HPV INFECTION CAUSE CERVICAL CANCER?

HPV can infect the cells on the surface of the cervix and damage them, causing their appearance to change and lead to abnormalities in these cells over a number of years. These abnormalities are known as Cervical Intraepithelial Neoplasia (CIN). These changes can be classified according to their severity. Mild lesions are known as CIN 1 and severe lesions are described as CIN 2/3. In some cases these more severe lesions can develop into cervical cancer. There are different types of HPV virus and some are far more likely than others to cause cancer.

So the theory is if we can reduce the rates of HPV infection we can reduce the rates of cervical cancer-this has been shown to work in other countries and this is why the HPV vaccine has been introduced in Ireland. The vaccine works best if it is given to girls before they start any sexual activity.

The HPV Vaccination Programme was introduced by the HSE to protect girls from their future risk of cervical cancer and is being carried out in schools. The HPV schools vaccination programme is continuing to target all girls in 1st year and 6th year of second level schools from September 2013. From September 2014 the programme will target all girls in 1st year of second level schools as all other girls will have already been offered the vaccine.

There are two vaccines currently licensed for the prevention of HPV infection. Gardasil [®] is the vaccine that has been chosen for the HSE's HPV vaccination programme. Gardasil [®] protects against the types of HPV that cause 7 out of 10 of all cervical cancers. It works in the same way as other vaccines- by making the body produce antibodies which will help the immune system fight HPV infection. It has been shown to provide protection for 5 years so far. Further studies that are being carried out worldwide will show if a booster dose is required after this time. Three doses of the vaccine are needed to give full protection-these are usually given over 6 months; at 0, 2 and 6 months.

If your daughter has the HPV vaccine she will still needs to have regular smear

tests when she is older as the vaccine only protects against 70% of cervical cancers.





MARGARET'S Ramblings

Here we are again readers at the beginning of another New Year - a new year which I hope will be very kind to you all, filled with health and happiness and that whatever you wish for yourself will come true.

Once again I will be very grateful for any news items and articles you submit to me for publication in my Ramblings and I would also very much appreciate any suggestions for items you would like to see published - if you ever have any queries or corrections on any articles published in my Ramblings, please contact me and I will get back to you as soon as I possibly can, my contact details are on top of the page.

THE NIGHT OF THE BIG WIND:

There is no doubt we had a stormy and wet end to 2013 and the beginning of January has been similar, I hope you all avoided injury and any serious damage to your property, but let's go back in time and just imagine what it was like for our ancestors on the days following the 6th of January 1839. The entire island of Ireland was subjected to a tempest of such ferocity that it became the date by which all other events were measured. The Night of the Big Wind - was the JFK assassination or the 9/11 of the 19th century. It was the most devastating storm ever recorded in Irish history More people were made homeless during the night of the Big Wind than were evicted during the years 1850-1880. By 10pm Ireland was in the throes of a ferocious cvclone that would continue unabated until 6 o'clock in the morning. The hurricane had roared across 3000 miles of unbroken, island-free Atlantic Ocean, gathering momentum every second. It hit Ireland's west coast with such power that the waves actually broke over the top of the Cliffs of Moher.

All across the country, hundreds of thousands of people awoke to the sound of the furious tempest, their windows shattered by hailstones, their brick-walls rattling, their rain-sodden thatched roofs sinking fast. As the wind grew stronger, it began to rip the roofs off houses. Chimney pots, broken slates, sheets of lead and shards of glass were hurtled to the ground. Many of those who died that night were killed by such falling masonry.

Ulster, the West and Midlands bore the brunt of the hurricane, the wind blew all the water out of the canal at Tuam and stripped the earth alongside the River Boyne, exposing the bones of soldiers killed in the famous battle 150 years earlier. All along the Grand Canal, trees were pulled up by the roots and hurled across the water to the opposite bank.

Tenant farmers were particularly hard hit. In the countryside, stacks of corn and hay were blown completely from their haggards and were scattered in the fields. What was recovered had been drenched which caused it to rot; this left farmers without winter feed for their livestock.

Boundary walls of dry stone construction were blown down allowing animals to stray and mix with other herds and flocks. Sheep on mountains were blown to their death and killed by loose stones tumbling down hillsides.

Millions of wild birds were killed causing the near extinction of crows and jackdaws. Their traditional

nesting places were wiped out. When spring came, the absence of song birds was eerily noticeable.

Sea water was carried inland by the force of the storm and flooded houses. One of the most abiding memories of the night, and its aftermath was the smell of salt which lingered in houses for weeks. Seaweed too, was carried inland for great distances. Herrings and other fish were found miles from shore. "My estate is now as bald as the palm of my hand" was the complaint of one landlord who lost seventy-thousand trees.

There were people in every community who practiced weather forecasting using such factors as the lunar cycle, appearance of the sky and sea, wind direction, the behaviour of birds, animals, fish and insects and their own intuition - often with a remarkable degree of success. These amateur weather forecasters failed to predict the event, so people sought their explanations elsewhere.

The superstitious were quick to attribute the storm to the fairies. Traditionally, the 5th of January was the feast of St. Ceara, when it was believed the fairies held a night of revelry. The fairies, they thought, were so unruly that the storm resulted. Others believed that on that night, all but a few of the fairies of Ireland left the country never to return and that the wind was caused by their departure.

The devout, noting that the storm occurred on the night of the Epiphany, saw it as of Divine origin. All the more so since many Roman Catholics in Ireland believed that the 7th of January (year unknown) would be the Day of Judgement.

The Night of the Big Wind happened prior to the introduction of government relief measures and widespread insurance. The relationship between landlord and tenant dictated that the tenant made good damage caused by storms. What little reserve of cash was held by the poor was used up in rebuilding and restocking. In many cases houses were re-built in sheltered locations at the bottom of hills, and for many years, until the advent of sturdier building materials, shelter from the wind was a primary factor in choosing a house-site.

Given the storm's ferocity, the death toll was miraculously low. Perhaps 250-300 people lost their lives, most at sea in the disastrous wrecks. While there were many lucky escapes, the enforced famine followed seven years later. It almost completely wiped out the class that suffered the most on the Night of the Big Wind.

In 1909, old age pensions were introduced in Ireland which entitled people over seventy to an allowance of five shillings per week from the State. For those who had no documentary proof of their ages, which was very common in those days, pensions were granted if they could remember the night of the Big Wind.

WINTER WARMER:

In the winter, bitterly cold temperatures can take a major hit on your utility bills. But what's the alternative – freeze? Wear gloves and a hat to bed? It doesn't have to be that way, though. There's a really, really easy way to keep your home warmer and save money. You don't even need to make a trip to the hardware store!

Roll a beach towel or an unused blanket up, and tie it together with a few pieces of fabric scraps or string. Place the towel at the cracks of particularly drafty doors and windows. Because anywhere from 5 to 30% of your home's energy is lost due to drafts. This simple trick will make a big difference in keeping your house warm.

THE DANGEROUS HABIT THAT MAY BE INCREASING WOMENS' DEATH RISK

Inactive lifestyles and periods of prolonged sitting have been named as significant contributors to climbing rates of obesity and chronic illness, and a new study shows that aging adults are adopting sedentary trends at an alarming rate.

The average older women spends nearly two-thirds of the time she's awake-nearly ten hours-sitting, according to an investigation conducted by researchers from the Harvard School of Public Health. For the study, more than 7,000 women in their 70s were given accelerometers, devices that can tell when an individual is moving or still, to wear as they went about their regular routines.

A 2012 study of lifestyle data from nearly 800,000 adults of all ages indicated that most of us spend anywhere from 50 to 70% of our days in a chair or on the couch.

Seniors might be at risk for severe health consequences if they don't move around enough.

Physical inactivity tops the list of things that can age you. Some of the more startling statistics to arise from

research into the topic include:

Watching just one hour of television may decrease an individual's overall life expectancy by 21.8 minutes, according to a 2008 University of Queensland study. Even if they exercise regularly, people who spend a significant portion of their day sitting down increase their overall risk of death by about 49%, their risk of diabetes by 112% and their risk of cardiovascular disease by 147%, concluded researchers from the University of Leicester.

For seniors, exercise can also keep some of the physical effects of aging at bay by strengthening muscles and bones, enhancing balance, and easing arthritis pain. The increased blood flow to the brain that occurs as a result of physical activity can also keep a cognitively healthy senior's brain sharper and may also decrease symptoms of depression. These advantages have been shown to hold true, even for people in their 80s and 90s.

Arthritis and other mobility-inhibiting ailments can make moving around painful for a senior; not to mention dangerous, given the ever-present risk of falling, fear, pain and fatigue can all play a role in contributing to an elder's reluctance to exercise, so you may need to get creative when searching for ways to incorporate physical fitness into your day - but your life may depend on it, but please seek your Doctor's advice before beginning any changes in your lifestyle, if your Doctor agrees then here are a few tips, for keeping yourself moving:

• Spend at least 15 minutes of the day in the sun and fresh air. Take a walk around the garden or the neighbourhood and be sure to interact with other people along the way.

Buy some gentle workout DVDs and invite a friend over to do it with you.

• The stationary bike can help keep arthritic knees loose, which also prevents dangerous 'shuffling' of feet that can make you trip while walking.

"Go shopping at your favourite store and use the cart to support yourself, if you need it.

You don't need to do anything exotic; sometimes the simplest things work best.

NOT YOUR USUAL STOCKTAKE:

More than 1,500 cockroaches and two new zebras were among the animals being counted at zoos in Suffolk and Norfolk.

The stocktake is performed annually and the results are fed into a database which can be viewed by other zoos around the world so they can see if they want any of the species.

The stocktake of animals at Africa Alive, near Lowestoft, and Banham Zoo started on 1 January and took four days to complete.

Both zoos are run by the Zoological Society of East Anglia (ZSEA), a charitable trust formed last year.

Banham Zoo's count will show a change in the number of Grevy's zebra, one of the zoo's females died last March, but two more were imported from Germany in December at a cost of approx. €3000 boosting the total stock at Banham to four.

"Animals are never traded for money," said Mike Woolham, animal manager at Banham Zoo, all we

have to do is pay for the transport". Mr Woolham said zebras and tigers were some of the easiest to count of the zoos' 64 species which are part of managed breeding programmes.

DID YOU KNOW....

In late September 1918 in northern France one last massive battle, the Meuse-Argonne Offensive was raging on. It was one of the biggest conflicts of World War I, lasting 47 days until the Armistice on November 11th. Over a million Allied soldiers were involved and over 25,000 Americans had died by the end of this battle.

A group of 500 American soldiers led by Major Charles Whittlesey were trapped in a small depression of a hill, surrounded by Germans. After the first day, only 200 of Major Whittlesey's "lost battalion" were left. To make the situation even worse, their fellow Americans didn't know their location and had begun firing shells at them.

Major Whittlesey sent out two messages by homing pigeon asking the Americans for help, but both pigeons were shot down. The friendly fire on them continued.





A final pigeon named Cher Ami was released with a desperate plea:

"We are along the road parallel to 276.4. Our own artillery is dropping a barrage directly on us. For heaven's sake, stop it."

As soon as Cher Ami flew up out of the brush, the Germans fired on him. It took him 25 minutes to fly through a rain of bullets the 25 miles back to Allied lines. When he arrived at his coop, he had been shot in his breast and blinded in one eye. One leg was so badly shot it dangled by a tendon. The metal case carrying the life-saving message was still attached to that dangling leg. The Allies stopped firing shells at the Lost Battalion, and they were eventually able to break out of enemy territory to safety.

The surviving 197 men, whose lives had been saved by Cher Ami made sure that their little bird received the best medical care and carved him a tiny wooden leg to replace the one that was blown off. The French army awarded him their Croix de guerre medal for his bravery. Cher Ami became a famous hero, and he was personally seen off by General Pershing on his boat voyage back home to the states.

Cher Ami died less than a year later due to complications from his injuries. He was stuffed and is kept on display at the Smithsonian in Washington, D.C.

FINALLY THIS WEEK

Over thirty years ago, only the folks at Greenpeace and other environmentally-aware groups even thought about recycling. These days, you'd be hard-pressed to find someone that has not heard of the concept. Recycling aluminium drink cans saves 95% of the energy it took to purify the metal and 95% of the water pollution and 97% of the air pollution created in manufacturing that drink can. We don't usually think about these savings achieved through recycling, but this, as well as the obvious space saved from landfill, is enormous. There are similar numbers for the savings achieved through recycling paper, and just about anything else with the Universal Recycling Symbol on it. Making recycling a habit is one of the most environmentally-friendly things you can do.

Top Ten Tips for Applicants to CAO 2014

• Think about the type of person you are: What are your personal qualities, skills and strengths? What do you love doing and what do you prefer to avoid? What subjects do you like or dislike in school? What are your hobbies and interests? What type of learner are you? Self-assessment tools are available on various career website such as www.careerdirections.ie and www.qualifax.ie to assist you.

• Talk to those who know you well: your parents and teachers for example; make an appointment with your guidance counsellor to discuss your options.

• **Research is the key to making informed choices:** As applicants to 3rd level institutes, you need to be familiar with all aspects of the courses that they are applying for: what are the subjects you will be studying from 1st year to final year? Is there a work placement or a study abroad option? At what point do you have to choose subjects to specialise in and what are those subjects? All of this information is available in college prospectuses and on the college websites but if you are unsure contact the admissions office or head of subject department in the college for clarification.

• Check the basic entry requirements for each of the courses you are interested in: Some courses will have language requirements or may require a certain grade in Maths as well as a point s requirement. These details will be found in college prospectuses and on sites such as www.cao.ie and www.qualifax.ie.

• **Restricted Courses:** Certain courses are restricted and must be included in your application before the 1st of February. These courses which require a separate assessment along with leaving certificate results and points and include areas such as Art, Music, Architecture, Medicine, etc. Assessments for such courses usually take place between February and April and details can be found on the college and CAO websites.

The CAO deadline of February 1st (5.15pm) is fast approaching and over the coming weeks applicants will be researching the various options open to them and completing CAO forms. There is a huge volume of information available and sometimes it can be challenging for applicants to sift through it. The following tips are essential reading for those applying to CAO in 2014.

• Apply ONLINE at www.cao.ie: The online form is significantly cheaper (Reduced fee of \in 25 up to Jan 20th, normal fee is \in 40) and it does not allow applicants to make mistakes by entering a course code that does not exist. Take time to fill out the form, ensuring that all your details are correct: Full name, address, mobile number and an email address that is valid and that you check regularly!

• **Put courses in genuine order of preference:** This is the golden rule of filling up the CAO form. It is very important that you put what you really want to do first and not what you think you II get the points for. Dream big and imagine the best that you can do. Points rise and fall for courses every year based on the demand for places by students in that particular year so the cut off points for any given year are only known on the day of the 1st round CAO offers (18th August 2014).

• Fill in all 20 spaces provided if possible. Each CAO applicant is given ten Level 8 choices and ten Level 6 and 7 choices to give you as much choice as possible.

• **HEAR/DARE:** Applicants meeting the criteria for HEAR or DARE on the basis of socio-economic disadvantage or disability (check out www.accesscollege.ie) must have competed CAO applications by the 1st of February and supplementary HEAR/DARE forms by the 1st of March.

• Make sure you don't miss the key deadlines: Remember the Change of Mind Option will be available from the 5th of May until the 1st of July at 5.15pm.
