Celebrating the Solstice

Climbers gathered on the summit of the Paps of Anú, to celebrate the Winter Solstice 2019, in aid of Kerry Hospice Foundation Palliative Care.

The sacred summits, The Paps of Anú, resemble a pair of breast shaped hills known as 'The Paps' in the Derry Na Saggart Mountains close to the Cork Kerry border. The Paps have long been associated with mythology, mystic

and majesty. The Goddess Anú represents all that is earthly fertile, abundant and protective. Over 200 people gathered to celebrate in song, dance and ancient blessing at the summit.

With kind permission of local landowner Sean O'Donoghue, Glenflesk, and neighbour Jimmy Moynihan, over 200 people departed from Garries Bridge at 5.45am. The long walk in to the summit has two strenuous inclines, leading to the Western Pap at 690 Metres. Sunrise and Craic begin, with Glenflesks finest musicians Derry and Rosie Healy, setting the pace for a Kerry polka set, followed by an ancient ceremonial Blessing by another Glenflesk Native, Mary Cronin. The trek was led by expert Mountaineer Donie Mulcahy and crew.

KERRY HEROES ARE HONOURED FOR THEIR ACTIONS

From extraordinary kindness, dedication on the pitch to caring for loved ones, seven Kerry heroes of 2019 have been announced.

The awards, which are supported by Fexco, were presented to Dr Patricia Sheahan and the staff at UHK Palliative Care Unit; the Kerry Senior Football Team and Peter Keane; Jack Fitzpatrick of the St Mary of the Angels Parents' and Relatives' Association; Dr Susan Mary Lawlor of State of Mind, the Kerry Camogie Team (Clanmaurice); Margaret and John Quilligan, and Ryan Murphy. The winners were presented with specially commissioned original awards created and sponsored by Louis Mulcahy Pottery.

In a year of challenges for the county on the football pitch, inclement weather, community tragedies, the ongoing threat of Brexit to our economy and more, so many individuals and groups have shown outstanding courage, vision and leadership. Following a call out to listeners to nominate who they felt deserved to be recognised, over 40 submissions were received. The judging panel of Susan McCarthy and Helena Buckley of Fexco along with Fiona Stack and Treasa Murphy of Radio Kerry had the unenviable task of choosing seven to be honoured as the Kerry Heroes of 2019.

Dr Patricia Sheahan and the staff at UHK Palliative Care Unit, were nominated by Haulie and Carol Liston, and by Denise Murphy. In nominating the Palliative Care Unit, Carol wrote: "My mother Catherine Liston passed away last May. I will never forget the trust that mom placed in Dr Sheahan. The care, kindness and love that was shown to mom under Dr Sheahan's care was incredible. At the time I was heavily pregnant with twins; they were born two weeks before mom passed away. My family and I will never be able to thank Dr Sheehan and her team for the help they gave our family at the time."

The Kerry camogie team were nominated by Kathleen Fitzgerald who wrote: "Two All Irelands from this very disciplined and dedicated panel. The final whistle in Croke Park provided memories that will never be forgotten."

Ryan Murphy, aged 10, was nominated by

for raising money for Kerry Hospice and Palliative Care "to the tune of €8,000 and still counting. He wanted to honour his late dad, Jim, who spent his last weeks in palliative care."

The Kerry Senior Football Team and Peter Keane were nominated for uniting the county, giving us belief and making everybody proud to wear the Kerry jersey.

Laura Fitzpatrick nominated her father Jack because he "spearheaded a campaign to stop Joanne Morgan who praised the Ballyduff boy the closure of St Mary of the Angels residential

facilities, so his son, my brother Bernard, and other residents could stay in their home. He formed a parents' and relatives' association which helped raise over €400,000 to improve and maintain St Mary of the Angels."

Sylvia Coffey nominated her aunt and uncle, Margaret and John Quilligan, who became her and her siblings' parents when their own father and mother were killed in a crash. Sylvia wrote: "When I was 10, my parents were killed in a crash leaving five of us, from the age of 12 down to nine months old orphaned. My aunt and uncle took us in, they wouldn't allow the family be broken up. I can't begin to tell you the happiness and love we felt in that small house because of them."

The State of Mind mental health organisation nominated its co-founder in Ireland, Dr Susan Mary Lawlor for her continuous efforts to help raise awareness of mental fitness throughout GAA clubs in Kerry and in the county's community at large. Dr Lawlor co-founded the organisation in Ireland with her late brother Dr

the people with the degenerative disease, (b) They save the State some considerable cost in Hospital / Nursing care and which would without them be necessary and (c) they afford assistance and relief to the immediate relatives / carers"

Councillor Gleeson stated that Motor Neurone Disease is a progressive neurological disease that attacks the Motor Neurones (Nerves) in the brain and spinal cord and impedes the transmission of messages from the brain to the muscles. The sufferers ability to breathe, walk, talk, eat, drink etc can be gradually diminished. The 4 specialist Nurses have a vitally important role in assisting the approximately 360 sufferers at any one time in this country.

"It is very sad that the funding for the 4 wonderful Nurses depends totally on voluntary donations. The 4th Nurse was recently employed as a result of the money raised by Fr Tony Coote (who died in August 2019 aged 55) on his round Ireland wheelchair journey.

I call on Government to allocate the cost neutral finance to the MNDA to allow for the salary payment for those vitally important Nurses", Cllr Gleeson said.

It's January, so it's time to focus on the 2020 CAO college application

With the arrival of a new year, the CAO applications season gets into full swing as the deadline looms large. Indeed, it's shaping up to be a very promising year for the 80,000 plus applicants – about 2,500 from Kerry - seeking a third level college course. More than 48,000 college places will be available next August. Applicants have until 5.15pm on 1st February to submit a completed application form. So, use the remaining weeks wisely. Carefully consider your course choices. Follow your heart but keep an eye on the jobs market in a buoyant economy.

Since the new Leaving Cert grading system and CAO common points scale were introduced in 2017, points' requirements for many courses have stabilised. But keep in mind that points' requirements for courses fluctuate up and down from year to year, so predicting cut off points is an inaccurate science. Each Leaving Cert candidate should aim to achieve her/ his best possible result in that exam. Points' requirements for courses will take care of themselves in due course.

The CAO processes applications for admission to undergraduate courses in third level colleges in Ireland. Every public sector university, college and institute in the country, as well as a number of private colleges, participates in the CAO system. An applicant may choose from the entire range of courses in the CAO Handbook 2020. The courses are categorised as 'Level 8' or 'Level 7/6'. The 'Level 8' category contains the Honours Bachelor Degrees (HD). The 'Level 7/6' category contains Ordinary Bachelor Degrees (DG)/Higher Certificates (HC).

All you have to do is submit a single application to compete for one of the available third-level places. The interactive online application system, 'Apply' has made the process very straightforward. 'Apply' is easy to follow, particularly as the CAO provides an 'Interactive Demo' to enable you make a trial application. The CAO Handbook 2020 also contains detailed easy-to-follow information on how to apply for the courses on offer. Almost all applications are now made via 'Apply.'The interactive online application service will remain open on the CAO website, www.cao.ie until 5.15pm on 1st February. The fee is \in 30, if you apply by 20th January and \in 45 thereafter until the 1st February.

Before you apply, study the CAO Handbook 2020, which explains how to apply for a third level college place. The colleges in the CAO system are listed in alphabetical order by location. The courses in each college are listed directly under the college title, with 'Level 8' courses being listed separately from 'Level 7/ 6' courses. Select your personal preferences from the entire range of courses in the Handbook. Each course is assigned a code, which you enter on the application. You may apply for up to ten courses in each of the two categories, listed in order of your preference.

As the CAO Handbook 2020 doesn't contain information about general academic requirements, specific course requirements nor content of courses, consult the colleges' Prospecti and websites for that information. Consider the potential career value of each course for which you are applying. Play to your strengths as you do your course research during the next few weeks. Jot down your personal career profile, including such variables as ability, achievement, application, aptitude, ambition, values, interests and personality (5AVIP). Select courses that suit you in order to have a fulfilling and successful college experience.

CLLR. WELCOMES NATIONAL ROADS GRANTS

Clir. Marie Moloney has welcomed the details of the National Roads Grants which were announced recently.

" I very much welcome this funding in particular the funding for works at Aghadoe junction where improvement works is badly needed", the Labour Councillor said. This funding is solely in relation to improvement and maintenance works on the national road network. Funding for works on the Regional & Local Road network, from the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport in the past was announced in early February. The overall grant allocation from the TII for Kerry is $\in 25.29m$, which is an overall increase of $\notin 6.3m$

on the initial allocation last year (€18.98). The main points to note are as follows:-

€6.5 m to progress the construction of the Listowel By-Pass in 2020

€500,000 for N22 Farranfore Killarney Scheme – to allow for the progression of the environmental studies and engineering design of the scheme €5.38m for pavement improvement works on the National Secondary Road network including €2.5m for pavement improvement works on the



N71 Kenmare to Molls Gap Road €1m for the N72 Rathmore Pavement Strengthening Scheme €1.14 m for pavement improvement works in Listowel

€0.3 m for pavement strengthening on the N70 at Caherleaheen Tralee to mitigate for the road flooding

€2m for the construction of the N72 Stagmount

Junction Scheme. $\notin 2m$ for the construction of the N70 Brackaharagh Road Improvement Scheme $\notin 3.4$ million for the N86 Tralee to Dingle Road, including close out of final accounts and to progress land acquisition and the next phase of the scheme. $\notin 370,000$ for road safety improvement measures on the National Primary Road network including

€250k for the N22 Aghadoe Junction and

€80,000 for the N21 Tralee to Abbeyfeale Road €200,000 for the N22 Garries Bridge Scheme to complete the design and planning consent process.. €625,665 for road safety improvement measures on the National Secondary Road network including €140k for the N69 Bridge Road in Listowel,

€120k for the Square in Kenmare,

€255,665 for the N71 Ard Bhearna to Sneem Road junction Safety Scheme in Kenmare

Additional Funding. €40 million has been allocated to Cork County Council to progress the construction of the N22 Macroom Ballyvourney Bypass.

€1,151,960 funding for Firies Food Hub

The Kerry Food Hub in Firies is set to benefit from a grant of € 1,151,960 in funding following the third call of the Regional Enterprise Development Fund according to Minister of State for Tourism and Sport, Brendan Griffin TD.

The 'Kerry Food Hub' is a not-for-profit community project located in Firies, Co Kerry. The Hub was purpose-built on a greenfield site to provide food production facilities to start-up entrepreneurs and small but growth-oriented food businesses seeking the opportunity to expand and develop. The Hub currently has 100% occupancy. Current tenants range from Contract Food Producers to Private Label Artisan Producers targeting the retail market and employing 35 people such as; *Bally Goats Cheese - Private Label - Retail Ballyhar Foods - Contract production - Food service.Fruity Farm - Contract production - Food serviceLeen's Salads / Krave Lunches - Private Label - Retail.*

This project entails the expansion to the current facilities, plus the development of a new online sales tool designed to provide greater connectivity between the local/regional Artisan producers and buyers in one of their key target markets. The expansion will go from 4×1000 sq. ft units to 10 units with an addition of 6,000 sq. ft. - all of which will be food production grade incubation spaces.

The second element of this proposal involves the development of an online e-commerce Artisan marketplace designed to connect both the Hub-based and regional artisan suppliers to key hotel buyers in Killarney. Killarney has 1 million visitor nights per year and sells €10m in food each year. This on-line tool will be a Cloud-based system, browser-accessed and fully scalable. It is a B2B marketplace which will be built on a platform provided by leading B2B solutions provider, Magento. Detailed discussions and agreements to use the system have been completed with a range of 4 & 5 star hotels and restaurants in the town who are seeking differentiated product offerings from a single source.

HSE's National Service Plan 2020 overlooks University Hospital Kerry

As trolley crisis worsens UHK gets no funding for additional beds

Fianna Fáil TD for Kerry, John Brassil, has said the overcrowding crisis in hospitals around the country is only going to get worse until extra bed capacity is made available.

Deputy Brassil said he was disappointed that University Hospital Kerry (UHK) has been overlooked by the HSE in its recently published National Service Plan 2020. The plan which was released shortly before Christmas announced an additional 6.3% in funding.

The budget set for 2020 is up €1 billion to €17.4 billion however the plan includes no mention of University Hospital Kerry and no additional funding for the hospital. He said, "Time and again we see that the worst hit hospitals, when it comes to the trolley crisis, are all outside of Dublin. Limerick, Cork and South Tipperary hospitals are continuously placed among the worst hit, they are bursting at the seams and this is having a knock-on effect on UHK.

'Yet while all the major hospitals in the South South-West Hospital Group have received project funding under the service plan, UHK has been skipped over.



"It's clear as day to see the Government place absolutely no emphasis on UHK and are immune to the pressures on the overcrowded ED and on hard working staff. "The HSE itself recognised the opportunity for additional beds in 2016, it's National Bed Review identified 33 additional beds available in UHK, however none of these beds have been opened as funding is required to refurbish wards and hire additional staff and this was not provided for in the Plan.

"How much longer are the people of Kerry going to have to wait for their health needs to be taken seriously by this Government?" he concluded.

Outstanding Contribution to Sport Award for Mary

One of Kerry's greatest sporting heroes was honoured at The Irish Times Sport Ireland Sportswoman Awards when Mary Geaney was presented with the Outstanding Contribution to Sport Award 2019.

Geaney captained her native county to All-Ireland football glory before going on to lead Cork's camogie team to All-Ireland success, the first player to achieve such a feat. The Castleisland woman captained Kerry to football success in 1976 – she scored 3-2 in the final win over Offaly, the first hat trick in a lady's final - before going on to win three All-Ireland camogie medals with Cork. Geaney, who scored a hat trick in the 1978 final, captained the team in 1980 – the final against Limerick went to a replay - and won a third medal in 1983. She also won two club football AllIrelands with Castleisland Desmonds in the early eighties. While her GAA exploits form a huge part of the Mary Geaney story, there is much more. Geaney also played hockey for Ireland, making her international debut as goalkeeper in 1971 against England. She went on to represent her country 65 times and was a member of the Ireland teams that won the 1977 Triple Crown and the 1983 Women's Intercontinental Cup. She was inducted into the Irish Hockey Association Hall of Fame in 2010. She also played squash, badminton and golf for Munster and managed her golf club, Killarney, to Irish Senior Cup success in 2017. Hockey player and November Sportswoman of the month Roisin Upton presented Mary with her award.

In October, the South Kerry combination of Kenmare / Kilgarvan / Dr. Crokes won the U21 Co. Hurling Championship, the first time in over 30 years. Michael O'Keeffe, PRO, South Kerry Hurling Bord na nÓg looks back on the historic win.

The newly-formed combination of Kenmare/ Kilgarvan/Dr. Crokes were crowned County U-21 Hurling Champions, causing a major upset when they defeated Lixnaw in the final played at Austin Stack Park on Bank Holiday Monday 28th October 2019.

This was a historic win as it is over 30 years since any team outside of North Kerry has won the U-21 Title. However, this team really made their mark this year and were worthy champions, beating last year's Champions Crotta O'Neills in the first round, Causeway in the semi-final and now Lixnaw in the final.

While they might have surprised many, the majority of these lads were also part of a successful South Kerry U-16 Team that won a County Title back in 2015.

It is one thing to have potential - it is another thing to go out there and win it! This team are naturally all Dual players and probably play 2 to 3 times more football than hurling. However, they are excellent Dual players and proved that they can manage to play both!

The first round game against Crotta, played in Kilgarvan, was a cracking game and it was only in the last 20 minutes which saw a great come back, Kenmare/Kilgarvan/Dr. Crokes scoring 3 goals and going on to win by 4 points, shocking the fancied holders. In the Semi-final against Causeway, it was again in the last quarter that they played their best hurling to get over the line. Lixnaw, with Shane Conway in their ranks, were hot favourites to win the Final. A strong wind favoured Kenmare/Kilgarvan/Dr. Crokes in the first half and they seized the opportunity with a great start when a long delivery in from midfielder Dan McCarthy was brilliantly caught by full-forward Michael Lenihan who was fouled in the square. Donal O'Sullivan buried the resulting penalty and Kenmare/Kilgarvan/Dr. Crokes went on to dominate the first half. Centre-forward, James McCarthy also contributed a great goal just before half-time to give Kenmare/Kilgarvan/ Dr. Crokes a commanding lead of 2-08 to 0-09.

Kenmare/Kilgarvan/Dr. Crokes were up against it in the second half, playing against a strong wind and a man down, as their corner-back, Gary Randles, was harshly sent off just before the break. But County Titles don't come easy and these young men stood up to the task and really put in a great second half shift. Try as they might, Lixnaw never managed to get closer than 3 points and in the end, it was a sweet victory from Kenmare/Kilgarvan/Dr. Crokes.

Kenmare/Kilgarvan/Dr. Crokes had many stars on the Day: Michael Horgan was solid in goals, Liam Twomey was excellent at full-back, Gearoid





Michael Horgan and Michael Lenihan, close friends of lan O'Connell, who brought the Cup to him in celebration following the victory. Ian played hurling in Dr. Crokes with both Michael's and was delighted to be there for the victory.

Fennessy hurled extremely well throughout in this game, and indeed the whole Championship, and, as Captain, led from the front. Both Dan McCarthy & Jack Foley did very well at mid-field. James McCarthy was very effective at centre forward and his goal before half-time turned out to be a very important contribution. Ronan Foley worked very hard at wing-forward. All 3 in the full-forwards made massive contributions scoring 1-15 between them: Daniel Casey 0-3, Michael Lenihan 0-11 & Donal O'Sullivan Down 1-1.

Know Your Rights:

Question

I usually get a gift voucher at Christmas. What are the new gift voucher rules that came in recently?

Answer

Gift vouchers are any voucher, coupon or other document (including an electronic document) that can be used instead of money to pay (or pay in part) for goods and services.

Since 2 December 2019, the Consumer Protection (Gift Vouchers) Act 2019 sets out the following new rules for gift vouchers:

Gift vouchers must have no expiry date or be valid for at least 5 years.

Traders cannot specify that a gift voucher is spent in one transaction.

•Traders cannot charge a fee to change the name on a gift voucher, (if you have to register a name on the voucher).

•If the balance remaining on a gift voucher is more than €1 after you buy something with it, a trader must reimburse the balance to you. They can give you cash, make an electronic transfer or give you another gift voucher.

These new rules do not apply to:

• Vouchers that you can only use to buy specified goods and services at a discounted price, from a specified trader on a specified date, or for a specified period of 3 months or less. For example, vouchers from deal websites such as Groupon or Pigsback.

Vouchers issued as part of a customer loyalty or promotion scheme.

Vouchers issued as a refund for goods you returned to a trader.
Vouchers and gift cards sold before 2 December 2019. The expiry period and the terms and conditions that applied at the time of purchase apply to these vouchers.

The new rules do not apply to electronic money gift cards (for example, One4all gift cards) which are already covered under the European Communities (Electronic Money) Regulations 2011.

HELPFUL HINTS FOR COOKING

*Ginger can be tricky to peel with all its bumps and irregularities. Rather than using a paring knife or vegetable peeler, reach for the spoon. Scrape it against the skin and it'll come right off, following every contour and minimizing waste. *Cut a lemon or lime in half and squeeze it directly through a strainer into the pot to eliminate the need to pick out seeds afterwards. *Use a scale for baking - with a scale, you know that your cup of flour is exactly the same time after time, giving you better, more consistent results and rather than using different cups to measure out every ingredient, just place a bowl on your scale, and measure directly into the work bowl as you go.

*Save your Parmesan rinds (or any hard cheese rind) after you finish off the cheese and store it in a sealed bag in the freezer. It can be used to add intense flavor to broths, soups, and stews by adding it to the simmering liquid for 20 to 30 minutes.

*The empty half of an egg shell is the best tool to extract stubborn bits of cracked shells that have ended up in the bowl.

BALLOON RELEASES ARE KILLING WILDLIFE AND MARINE ANIMALS

Balloons negatively impact our environment by littering streams, lakes, and beaches. It's basically the same as intentionally throwing trash on the ground or into the ocean. Even balloons marketed as biodegradable or "ecofriendly" can still take years to disintegrate, meaning they're not any better for the environment than standard balloons.

When balloons make their way into the water, their tattered ends and floating pieces can resemble jellyfish or other sea life consumed by marine animals such as sea turtles, fish, and dolphins. When the pieces of latex or Mylar are mistaken for food and ingested, they can get lodged in the digestive tract, inhibiting animal's ability to eat and causing a slow and painful death by starvation.

Wildlife can also fall victim to balloons and balloon strings when the pieces fall to the ground or onto trees and bushes. Birds have been found injured with ribbons wrapped around their beaks or wings, and have strangled themselves when they become entangled in strings attached to trees or power lines. And just like marine animals, they can succumb to a painful death after ingesting balloons. If you know of someone planning a balloon release, please urge them to consider earthand animal-friendly options instead – for instance bubbles are not only fun but can create stunning photo ops. Watching hundreds of bubbles float up into the sky can be mesmerizing and just as symbolic as seeing a balloon float away, but without the resulting of litter and endangerment to wildlife and marine animals.

Planting native trees and wildflowers is a beautiful way to create a memory that lasts for years to come – and give a little something back to nature. Another fun idea is to have people release milkweed seeds, which helps populations of monarch butterflies thrive by replenishing depleted supplies of the milkweed plant that is essential to their survival. Just remember: If you choose to plant trees or flowers somewhere other than your own garden make sure you have prior.

Celebrations and commemorative events are meant to allow us to reflect on important times in our lives, there is no reason these should come at the expense of wild animals.

A TEXAS MAN IS MAKING CANES FOR VETERANS USING DONATED CHRISTMAS TREES

After serving in the US Army for eight years, Jamie Willis was left a 100% disabled veteran completely unable to work.

When the cane he was given by the Veterans Affairs had no style, kept collapsing and wasn't what he deemed trustworthy, he turned to a Florida organisation called Free Canes for Veterans which was giving out 500 canes, he was told that they had no more canes, but Oscar Morris, the man behind the organisation, instead taught Mr. Willis how to make his own. "When I successfully sat down and made my very first cane, I asked him if I could branch it off and start Cane for Veterans in Central Texas and he said he would love for me to do that," Mr. Willis said.

This is the second year Mr. Willis has asked for tree donations and says he has been overwhelmed with the support this year.

Each tree is the equivalent of about one cane, which takes Mr. Willis an entire day to make, package, and ship to the veteran who will use it. While he sometimes asks them to cover delivery costs, Mr. Willis covers all costs from out of his own pockets as well as donations, and pays for delivery if the veteran can't afford it.

NEW YORKERS CREATED THE "WORLD'S WORST SANDWICH" FOR A SPECIAL REASON

Near the end of the 19th century, when New Yorkers out for a drink ordered an ale or whisky, the waiter or bartender would bring it out with a sandwich. Generally speaking, the sandwich was not edible as It was often made from dustladen bread and very stale ham or cheese. Bar staff would commonly take the sandwich back seconds after it had arrived, pair it with the next beverage order, and whisk it over to another patron's table. Some sandwiches were kept in circulation for a week or more.

Bar owners invented this charade to avoiding breaking the excise law of 1896, which restricted how and when drinks could be served in New York State.

The 1896 Raines Law was designed to put many drinking establishments out of business. It raised the cost of an annual liquor license to \$800, three times what it had cost before and a tenfold increase for beer-only taverns. It stipulated that saloons could not open within 200 feet of a school or church, and raised the drinking age from 16 to 18.

Those in favour of the Sunday ban, generally middle-class and Protestant, saw it as a cornerstone of social improvement. For those against, including the city's tide of German and Irish emigrants, it was an act of repression—an especially spiteful one because it limited how the average labourer could enjoy himself on his one day off.

FOCUS ON EARLY SPRING FLOWERING SHRUBS

Now is a good time if you are planning a new garden or trying to add some colour to an established garden to plant some early flowering spring shrubs. One of the best known shrubs is the Carnellia and these popular shrubs are starting to flower in most places at the moment. The Camellia is a very valuable shrub in the garden as it can give a focal point to any shrubbery all year round with its glossy green leaves and showy blooms from early spring. A lot of people think that Carnellias are a difficult shrub to grow, but in fact they are no more difficult than Rhododendrons or azaleas, and most varieties on sale now are hardy.

When choosing the spot to plant your Carnellia, make sure it is sheltered from cold winds as they can damage the flowering buds, as can frost. When planting your Camellia make sure to mix plenty of moss peat with the earth, rather than on its own around the plant, as it will tend to root out quicker. Camellias are also ideal for growing in containers. Remember if you are planting your Camelia in the ground, that it might be small initially but most will grow to the size of a small tree, so allow plenty of room around it. There is very little maintenance with Cameilias only to prune out old dead wood, clean up old blooms that fail to the ground and to mulch around the base of plants every spring with some moss peat. There are a lot of ther good spring flowering shrubs, here is a list of just a few. Forsythia, Cythisus, Corylus ris Darwinii, Ribes, and skimmia.

The New Year brings with it new expectations and experiences for everyone. It can be a time of excitement and fresh starts and yet feel one of the most difficult times also. Many people report feeling down, a little fatigued and more hopeless. There can be a sense of deflation after all the festivities of Christmas and with that anti-climax low mood and, in some cases, isolation can occur. The temptation may be to give in a little and retire from the world but the opposite is more helpful. Engaging in moderate physical exercise, eating a balanced diet and staying connected to others can prohibit a low mood from getting increasingly worse. Of course we all have off days or lazy days whereby we need to rest more and retreat but if you notice that you are experiencing ongoing low mood and change in behaviour that affects your quality of life and/or relationships then you may have to reach out for help.

A good place to start is family or friends, someone you already know and trust. They know you already and know your life experiences and how much you have been through so chatting to them about how you feel can alleviate the pressure/stress you may be feeling. Family and friends will want to know if you are struggling and from my experience, as a counsellor, they will appreciate you letting them in. The first step is the hardest but once you start the conversation you will feel less alone. and instantly begin the process of connection. Communication is key. Whether it is anger, sadness, fear or anxiety talk about it; problems are relative so if it bothers you then it bothers you. Don't fall into the trap of thinking it doesn't matter or other people won't care because this way of thinking only serves to isolate you more. Don't pretend to be ok if you are not ok. This only serves to delay or postpone what you inevitably have to address so consider the benefits of sharing how you feel, as not sharing could have a negative impact on your mental, emotional and physical wellbeing.

Another avenue worth exploring is visiting your GP. Describe to your doctor how you feel and what you are experiencing recently. Discuss your concerns and fears and how others i.e. family or friends, may have noticed a change that concerns them. Again you have begun the process of reaching out. Your doctor can listen and make some suggestions or refer you to other services. They can discuss your support network and request a repeat visit to them so that they can monitor and support you as necessary.

Alternatively, you may consider counselling. This would give you the opportunity to explore your thoughts, feelings and experiences (past or present) in a confidential, non-judgemental, safe setting. Counselling can provide support, insight and validation. It is a useful space where people can open up and discuss what is on their mind and what is happening within the context of their world. The aim is to feel seen and heard at a time when you may be feeling alone and/or invisible! The developing relationship between you and the counsellor can restore confidence in yourself as well as confidence in others; thoughts can be challenged and feelings can be held. In turn, there can be a sense of empowerment when we become pro-active in our lives and starting the counselling process is a positive indication of this. Acknowledging that we matter, that we are enough and that we need others (either on a personal or professional level) can enable us to face another year with less dread, more hope and more understanding.
