NEW COLLEGE OF HOTEL MANAGEMENT FOR KILLARNEY

A brand-new international college of hotel management is set to open its doors in Killarney. The Institute of Technology Tralee (ITT) and The Gleneagle Group have joined forces to create a new International College of Hotel Management which is preparing to welcome its first students in September 2017. The college, which is modelled on the prestigious Swiss hotel management education system, is the first of its kind in Ireland and is backed by a major international education group with similar colleges in Germany and Austria. The college will offer higher education programmes in hotel management to mainly international students. The courses will combine practical on-the-job training with classroom and online learning designed to equip students with the varied skillset required for a successful career in the hospitality industry. The new venture represents a key strategic public/private partnership between The Gleneagle Group and IT Tralee, while securing students from overseas is one of a number of objectives specified under the Action Plan for Jobs (2016)

The International College of Hotel Management in Killarney will welcome students from around the world and will also bring longer term benefits at regional and national level. Students living and studying in the town will contribute to the economy of Killarney and will undertake their work-placements in hotels throughout the region.

While the first students are expected to join the college in September 2017, the full degree programme will be on offer from September

Dr. Oliver Murphy, President of IT Tralee outlined: "The opening of the International College of Hotel Management in Killarney represents an excellent opportunity for IT Tralee.

Patrick O'Donoghue, CEO of The Gleneagle Group said: "Killarney is the home of Irish tourism, there is a wealth of knowledge and experience here. This college will harness the intrinsic expertise of the locality and the excellent academic offerings of IT Tralee to produce a world-class suite of courses".

Mary Rose Stafford, Head of School of Business, Computing and Humanities acknowledges the longer term benefits the college will bring at regional and national level: "The programmes will be unique in terms of how they are taught. Programme delivery will focus on work-based learning and distance learning, as well as traditional lectures and practical demonstrations.

We hope to gain the support of regional hotel providers and we will be encouraging them to benefit from the availability of highly trained and skilled personnel for placements."

FITZGERALD STADIUM COULD HOST 2023 RUGBY WORLD CUP

The Irish Rugby Football Union's Olly Hodges, was in Killarney this week discuss the bid to host the 2023 Rugby World Cup in Ireland. Hodges, who was a guest of the Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce, gave a presentation at The Malton Hotel, about the anticipated tourism and financial benefits of hosting the competition and the enormous potential that this may have for Ireland. Killarney is one of nine Irish venues listed in the proposal bid which means at least four matches would be played in Fitzgerald Stadium with a capacity crowd of 35,000 people at each game. At least one of these games would host a Tier one game involving a top rugby side such as the All Blacks, England, Australia, France, South Africa, Argentina or Italy. Hosting the Rugby World Cup would be a unique opportunity to showcase Killarney, not just to the hundreds of thousands of visitors who come for the tournament, but to a worldwide television audience.

Top officials have already made several visits to Killarney and the Fitzgerald Stadium is among the top venues. Killarney's ability to host major events such as the Irish Open, Munster Final and the Ring of Kerry Cycle all stand in its favour. However Mr Hodges has said that Killarney must get preparations underway and investment is required. Ireland is battling it out with South Africa and France for the chance to stage the World Cup in seven years' time. Global governing body, World Rugby, will decide the 2023 competition's destination in November 2017 - and Ireland are comfortably the first of the three competing nations to map out their detailed hosting plans. The Rugby World Cup could bring €800 million into the country in 2023 and would be the biggest sporting event ever held in Ireland should the bid be successful.

STEPHEN LYNE FOUNDATION INTRODUCES TINY TEACHERS

BY: CAOIMHE SPILLANE The Stephen Lyne Foundation is bringing Roots of Empathy, an evidence based classroom programme for primary schools, to Killarney. Last Friday a presentation was given by instructor Susana Nunez, to local teachers and supporters of the foundation to showcase how Roots of Empathy works in the classroom.

At the heart of the programme is a baby and parent from the local area who visit the classroom every three weeks over the school year. A trained Roots of Empathy Instructor coaches students to observe the baby's development and to label the baby's feelings. The baby becomes a "Tiny Teacher", which the instructor uses to help children identify and reflect on their own feelings and the feelings of others.

The programme has shown significant effect in reducing levels of aggression among school children by raising social and emotional competence and by increasing empathy. The result is reduced bullying, less violence and increased emotional literacy

Lotte Lyne, the founder of Stephen Lyne Foundation, aims to provide the Roots of Empathy programme to all primary schools in Killarney and the surrounding communities and then into all schools across Kerry. The Stephen Lyne Foundation was set up by Lotte in memory of her son Stephen. Stephen was brutally murdered just yards from his home on the Ross Road, Killarney in 2009. In 2016 Stephen Lyne Foundation funded the Roots of Empathy Programme into three schools in Killarney, St. Oliver's Primary School, Holy Cross Mercy Primary School and Presentation Monastery Primary School. The Foundation funded the cost of training six Roots of Empathy instructors who follow a curriculum designed to teach emotional literacy. This has enabled the programme to reach more than 200 children in the 2016-2017 school year.

Barnardos is the lead agency for Roots of Empathy in Ireland and has agreed to work with Stephen Lyne Foundation to implement the programme in Kerry. Roots of Empathy is totally funded by Stephen Lyne foundation and free to schools.

There has already been great feedback from parents of children involved in the programme. Stephen Lyne Foundation intend to fund the training of ten more roots of empathy instructors in 2017 making it possible to reach more than 700 children in 2017-2018 school year. To reach their goal of ten roots of empathy instructors they will need to raise \in 70,000 in 2017. Roots of Empathy and Stephen Lyne Foundation want to make our community a safer place for our young people.

LIFE-SAVING DEFIBRILLATOR UNVEILED IN BALLYHAR

The Ballyhar Community Development Group are delighted to inform the public that they have purchased a defibrillator which is now in place and available for the general community in the event of a medical emergency.

The life-saving machine was obtained with the help of Kerry County Council through their Community Support Fund which assisted the group with grant aid in order to purchase the defibrillator unit for the benefit of the local community and the public in general. Kerry County Council provided important support and backing to the voluntary group.

The machine analyses the victim to determine if they are having a cardiac arrest. If required, it delivers a powerful but controlled electric shock to restore normal heartbeat. The defibrillator is located at the front of Ballyhar Church and the group would like to take this opportunity to say a very special thank you to Parish Priest Fr Tadgh O Dochartaigh for his assistance in facilitating the placing of this life saving equipment on the wall of Ballyhar Church.

AED, automated external defibrillator, first aid training has taken place throughout the parish

As part of a new initiative to bring the old hand ball alleys back to life, The Sem will be holding a Past Pupils Reunion and Fundraising Activity Day on Saturday, 15th April, 2017. There is an open invitation to all, especially their Alumni, to meet old friends and make new ones. There will be a wide range of events held on the day in order to raise money for school refurbishments with the fundraising target set at €30,000.

All monies raised will be used in the refurbishment of the school's old handball alleys. The aim is to transform the area into a modern roofed indoor area with a high tech AstroTurf floor. This all year round facility will provide the school with further indoor recreational and training facilities and a specialised kicking/hurling skills wall will feature as part of the upgrade. Events being held on the day include a golf classic, cycling tour, mountain walk and leisurely boat and walking trip.

The Golf Classic will be held at the Beaufort Golf Club and will cost €200.00 per team. Teams must be made up of 4, with two scores to count on all holes with any combination of ladies and gents – full handicaps. Tee times will be from 7:30am to 3:30pm.

For those looking for a challenge, another outing will be a strenuous mountain hike over Ireland's highest peak Corrán Tuathail with guide Con Moriarty. This outing will be limited to 25 participants. The journey will set out to ascend the peak out of The Hag's Glen before then traversing westwards over the third highest peak, Cathair Na Féinne and dropping down into Glencar. The cost is ϵ 75 per participant, including transport to and from Killarney. With places being so limited,

booking promptly is advised so as to avoid disappointment.

The leisurely boat and walk event will be the "Gap trip" a fantastic opportunity to take a trip many tourists see and few locals get a chance to enjoy. Leaving Ross Castle by traditional boat, the journey will take you through the three lakes to the Black Valley in time for lunch at Lord Brandon's Cottage. Thereafter, you will walk out of the Black Valley over and through the Gap of Dunloe to Kate Kearney's Cottage. The cost will be \in 30 per participant, children U-12 \in 15, this includes the boat trip and transport back to Killarney from the Gap of Dunloe. Spaces are limited to 60 people maximum.

There will also be a guided bike-ride through Killarney National Park. Departing from St. Brendan's College, participants will enter the National Park at Deenagh Lodge, visit Knockreer House, and cycle alongside Lough Leane to Ross Castle. From there the tour visits Muckross Abbey, and Muckross House, where there will be a stop for lunch. The cycle will continue around Muckross Lake to Torc waterfall, cross under the main road and back to Killarney. Most of the cycle is off road and ideal for families. The cycle finishes at St. Brendan's College. All cyclists must bring their own bikes. The cost of the cycle tour is \in 25 per participant; \in 5 for children U-12

Keep this checklist close by as falling off the band wagon is easy to do and happens is all, so until the habit changes are concreted into you keep checking on them monthly to make sure you haven't slipped back into old ways.

See no diets, no magic pills, just a little bit of organisation and honesty with yourself!

MOTORING OUTLOOK

TIPS FOR SAFE BIKING AND ADVICE ON SAFETY GEAR

TOP 10 SAFETY TIPS:

Be vigilant. Look into the far, middle and near distance, and behind you, using your mirrors and checking over your shoulders, before changing position or turning.

Keep your distance. In wet or icy conditions, always leave a bigger gap.

Be seen. Make sure your position is correct. Use dipped headlights and wear high visibility clothing (such as a neon vest and 'Sam Browne' reflective belt).

Avoid surprising others. Never do anything on the road that could cause another road user to slow down, brake or swerve or that could startle pedestrians.

Think like other road users. Anticipate how they might react.

Read the road. Ride to current road, weather and traffic conditions.

Match your speed to the conditions. Never let others dictate your pace.

Never ride your bike after consuming alcohol or drugs.

MAINTAIN YOUR BIKE PROPERLY

Regularly check petrol, oil, water, damage, electrics and tyres.

Take lessons from an experienced instructor. See every ride as a chance to improve your skills.

SAFETY GEAR

Wear appropriate clothing and a secure helmet every time you get on your bike.

Jackets and trousers should give you enough protection from impact, abrasion, cold and weather conditions.

Use body armour on vulnerable areas such as the back, knees, elbows, shoulders, hips and shins. This should be adjustable so it fits snugly and does not move in a crash.

You should wear a good reflective jacket to make you more visible on the road.

Wear protective gloves, and footwear that at least comes above the ankle.

YOUR MOTORBIKE

A well maintained motorbike can reduce the chance of death or injury on the road. Make sure you know your machine and look after it Vehicle reliability and safety are key issues for



any road user but particularly motorcyclists, whose machines offer little protection compared to cars in the event of a collision.

If you ride a motorbike, the following checklist will help ensure you are as prepared as you can be for the dangers of riding on public roads.

PETROL

Make sure you have enough fuel for the journey. Does your machine have a reserve tank switch or just a warning light? Can you turn the fuel tap to reserve while on the move without taking your eyes off the road? Do you know where the tap is?

Oil

Find out how to check the oil level on your machine. Most dry-sump machines require you to check the oil when the engine is hot, while most wet-sump machines should have their oil level checked with the engine cold. Which type is yours? The owner's handbook will tell you how to perform this check correctly.

Water

Is your machine water - or air-cooled? Do you know how to check the coolant level?

Damage

Check your bike for signs of obvious wear-andtear. Are the light lenses or mirrors cracked or broken? Any noticeable buckles in the rims? Any drips or pools under the bike? Check for damage to the tyre walls and rim.

Electrics

Check your lights and indicators are clean and working. Do you know where the fuses are and can you replace them?

Rubber

As the only point of contact between you and the road, your tyres and their condition are critical to your safety. Too much air in your tyres reduces grip, too little promotes instability because it allows the side walls of the tyres to flex. Know your tyre pressures and the legal minimum tread depth.

Maintenance

Maintenance is vital. A badly maintained chain may snap or jump off and cause you to crash. If you cannot service your bike yourself get a professional to do it.

SouthWest Counselling Centre **COPING WITH LOSS**



Loss is considered to be a natural part of life - yet coping with loss is one of the most difficult challenges we will face in our lives. Grief is a natural response to loss and the more significant the loss, the deeper our grieving will be. When a loved one dies, we may experience all kinds of difficult emotions - and it can feel

like this pain will never ease. This is a normal reaction. Grieving is a vital process and typically, over time, these intense feelings will diminish in intensity. Everyone reacts differently and there is no right or wrong way to grieve. Equally there is no 'normal' period for someone to grieve - and it may take months or years to come to terms with a loss. For most people, grief doesn't go away - but it fades into the background. Thoughts and memories of our loved one are woven into our minds - and whilst missing our loved one may be part of our life - it doesn't interfere with us living our life. Sometimes however, we can experience what is termed 'Complicated Grief'. This refers to an intense and long-lasting grief that takes hold and doesn't seem to lessen as time goes on. Many people come through the loss on their own – supported by friends and family - others benefit greatly from bereavement counselling. Whilst there are no right ways to grieve - there are however, healthy ways to deal with the pain. People often report that grieving the loss of a loved one gave them a renewed sense of meaning, purpose and direction in their life. Helpful steps include

1. Accept what you are feeling: If we deny or ignore our feelings it will only make it worse in the long run. For healing to occur, we need to acknowledge and face our feelings.

2. Talk about the death of your loved one: Talking to family and friends can help us to understand what has happened and remember our loved one.

3. Remember and celebrate the life of your loved one: Honor the individual – perhaps through making a collage of photos, planting a tree in their memory, donating to a favourite charity etc.

4. Be patient and allow the grieving process to naturally unfold. Whilst we may often think of grief resulting from the death of a loved one, any loss can cause grief. Over the coming weeks we will explore grief and loss and ways we can deal with this.

ALLIANZ NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE KERRY UP AND RUNNING IN LEAGUE CAMPAIGN

KERRY O'SHEA REPORTS FROM O'DONNELL PARK LETTERKENNY, DONEGAL.

DONEGAL 1-17 KERRY 2-17

In the five years since he was appointed Kerry Senior Football supremo, Eamonn Fitzmaurice has never won an Allianz National Football League opening round tie. That record was put straight before 6,320 spectators including a strong Kerry contingent in O'Donnell Park on Sunday as Kerry eked out a three-point win to get their 2017 league campaign off to the best start possible.

Sometimes scorelines can appear deceptive. This is true on this occasion as Kerry were dominant for most of the game and had built up a sizeable lead but they failed to score for the closing 24 minutes.

In a game that was largely free of any of the rancour that enveloped the corresponding fixture in Tralee last season, Kerry claimed their first win in Donegal soil since 2003. They now move to 14 wins in head to head series between the counties. That said though

this was a refreshing performance from the Kingdom.

They used the ball intelligently with swift, quick, pacey movements and their kick passing had the Tir Conaill men in trouble time and time again.

Eamon Fitzmaurice used the occasion to start three League Debutants-Jason Foley, Tom O'Sullivan and Jack Savage, they were soon joined by a fourth as Na Gaeil's Jack Barry replaced Shane Enright eight minutes into the first half.

Enright suffered concussion following a collision with Donegal's targetman Michael Murphy and following a medial scan he got the all clear and will now follow the return to play protocols under the care of the Kerry GAA medical team.

All four Kerry newcomers acquitted themselves very well which is something that delighted Eamonn Fitzmaurice and his management team.

It was a very profitable day for the Kerry attack, with the insideline of Jack Savage, Paul Geaney and James O'Donoghue finished with a haul of 2-10 between them, 2-7 of which came from open play.

David Moran bossed the midfield area where he was a commanding influence throughout, while Donnachdha Walsh, Paul Murphy and Tadgh Morely also impressed. James O'Donoghue showed just why he is one of the best forwards in the country both in creating and taking scoring chances.

Donnchadh Walsh opened the scoring for

Kerry before Paddy McBrearty levelled for the home side. Jack Savage (2) and Jack Barry added points (Barry was unlucky not to goal as his goalbound shot whizzed over) as Kerry moved into an early lead.

However, Michael Murphy kept Donegal in touch with a pointed free. Kerry were on top at this stage but wasted some good opportunities through poor finishing. Donegal won a penalty against the run of play in the 22nd minute when Martin O'Reilly following a scything run through the heart of the Kerry defence was hauled down. Murphy slotted home to push Donegal ahead for the only time in the game.

Kerry hit back with a goal of their own through Paul Geaney minutes later and they never looked back after that. Martin O'Reilly added a fine Donegal point as Kerry hit full throttle with points from James O'Donoghue, Tom O'Sullivan, Paul Geaney, Jonathan Lyne and a superb David Moran effort to take a commanding 1-11 to 1-5 lead at the short whistle.

SECOND HALF

Donegal resumed in determined fashion with points from Paddy McBrearty and the outstanding Ciaran Thompson who finished with three points to his name but Kerry were not going to be denied and moved seven clear with points from James O'Donoghue (2) and Paul Murphy.

Paul Geaney added Kerry's second goal in the 44th minute following good approach work by Donnchadh Walsh and should have had another green flag moments later when Donnchadh Walsh's effort flicked onto the crossbar.

Eamonn Fitzmaurice then began to empty the bench and introduced Barry John Keane, Brendan O'Sullivan, Conor Geaney and Barry O'Sullivan to the fray for the remainder of the second half but they failed to score from the 46th minute onwards as Donegal added a string of points to put a better reflection on the scoreboard.

Next week, Kerry will face a stern test as they face Mayo in Tralee at 7pm on Saturday evening, while Donegal travel to Hyde Park to play Roscommon.

The CPA were officially launched a number of weeks ago and already over 21,000 club players, coaches, mentors and members across the country have signed up and Quill is looking for Kerry club players to throw their considerable weight behind the Association.

"I think it's important for club players to have a voice as well as the county players. After all, they make up 95% of the playing association on a weekly basis and the CPA will serve as a voice for them. I think it's important to point out that we are really facilitators of a message and not looking to cause a disruptive influence, after all this is the game we all love and have given a lot to"

Since taking up the role, Quill, a two-time All-Ireland winner, has certainly noticed his phone is a lot more active. "It's certainly ringing a lot more as the message gets out there and I have a lot of clubs showing interest and looking for information. Becoming a member is free and is very easy to do. A quick visit to the website (www.gaaclubplayers.com) and just head to the Register me section. It will only take a few minutes at most" Moreover, its numbers that Quill wants initially to build up a membership that so that The CPA will have an ongoing dialogue with its members to represent their views as accurately and effectively as possible. At their launch the CPA announced their core objective as one "to establish a regular playing

season for clubs and curbing the pervasive influence of the county scene on the fixtures calendar of club players the length and breath of Ireland. It is the desire of club people, that fixtures for clubs are set out in a definitive manner rather than the current situation whereby club games are vying for space in the calendar alongside national league and championship fixtures at inter-county level. This is just one issue facing the modern club GAA player here in Ireland."

Quill feels that significant progress has been made in Kerry and last season with Kerry GAA showing good example with a more streamlined season, in which players knew when and where their games would be played but the CPA is for the country and some counties have some way to go yet to improve the lot of the club player.

"Certainly fixtures is something that is very important to club players, to know when your playing, to know your season, to be able to plan family time and a holiday around it or during it, without the goal posts being moved"

The former Kerry star has seen both sides of the fence, having enjoyed a Kerry career in which he won two All Ireland medals; he concedes that last year playing at Junior level was probably one of the most enjoyable years of his career. "I think at times, we forget that it was fun and enjoyment that brought us into the GAA and certainly a willingness to play with your friends".

LOGS OF COFFEE GROUNDS ARE A LIFELINE FOR ENCAMPED REFUGEES:

Instead of throwing out the grounds leftover from morning pots of coffee, University of Toronto engineering students are turning them into a valuable resource for refugees overseas with the creation of Moto: a fake flammable log made of sugar, coffee grounds, and paraffin wax that can burn for up to 90 minutes.

Women and children in refugee camps perform 90% of their cooking using firewood and family

members are often put in danger of assault when leaving the camp to gather more firewood, it can also be a strenuous hours-long endeavour. Moto logs not only prevent the dangers, but also frees the refugees up to spend time doing other things, whether that's trying to find another source of revenue or spending time educating their kids, a spokesperson said.

The team currently collects coffee grounds from local Starbucks, Second Cup, and Tim Hortons outlets. As they continue to develop their prototype, they plan on creating a simple recipe that can be replicated regardless of location or coffee shop availability.

RUNNING GOT 6,000 **HOMELESS PEOPLE BACK ON** THEIR FEET:

In the U.S.A. 1,200 people have found housing; 2,300 people have found jobs; 6,000 people have found purpose and transformation - and it's all because of running.

Back On My Feet is a nonprofit that helps homeless people turn their lives around through jogging and community engagement.

Volunteers operating in 12 major cities recruit participants from homeless residential facilities. Interested individual's sign up for a month-long commitment of showing up three days a week to participate in a group run from 5:30AM to 6:30AM. If the person finishes the commitment with a 90% attendance rate, they go to the second phase of the programme which offers educational support, job training programmes, employment partnership referrals, and housing resources.

Since the programmes start in 2007, 80% of participants have successfully moved onto the second phase.

Thanks to Back on My Feet's transformational experience, over 6,000 members have obtained jobs, homes, and traditional skills training - and according to a spokesperson for the non-profit, 90% of members have maintained their employment; 60% have received a wage increase; and 20% have achieved a promotion.

CAFÉ GIVING FREE MEALS TO PEOPLE WILLING TO **EXERCISE:**

As a way of encouraging office workers to break their sedentary work routine, The Run For Your Bun Café inside the David Lloyd Club in London is now accepting exercise as payment for healthy meals off of their menu, provided participants complete a six-minute intensive micro workout. The restaurant was open recently to members of the public with reservations.

The high-intensity interval training consists of one-minute on a rowing machine, one minute on a spin bike, one minute on a treadmill, followed by 60-seconds of sit-ups, bodyweight squats and lunges, with 30-second rest periods between each exercise.

The calories replaced by the lighter, healthier meals are no where near the same amount that is burned during the routine. Plus, the gym wants to encourage their guests to understand the benefits of balancing healthy diets and exercise rather than exercising just to "cancel out" unhealthy meals.

According to research British office workers

spend almost 90% of the working day sitting down being inactive and invariably eating lunch at their desks. A spokesperson for David Lloyd Clubs said "We want to remind workers of the importance of being active at work and moving around more."

ON THIS DATE – FEBRUARY 10TH:

1763 - France signed the Peace of Paris ending the Seven Years War, retaining the sugar-rich Caribbean islands of Guadeloupe, Saint Lucia, and Martinique, along with the slaving post of Gorée island in Senegal, Saint Pierre and Miquelon off the south coast of Newfoundland as a fishing port, and part of Louisiana which it later sold to Spain in 1803

1788 - Reverend Richard Johnson officiates at the first marriage ceremonies in the New South Wales colony. Amongst the 5 convict couples that married that day one were William Bryant and Mary Brand, who became notorious for their daring escape from the colony. Stealing away into one of the ships bound for the new Norfolk Island colony, the Bryants then acquired a compass and maps, stole one of the longboats and sailed for Timor, along with their young son Emmanuel and daughter Charlotte. After being handed over to an English captain and sent to Java, William and his son eventually died from tropical fever, and Charlotte died after she and her mother were sent on a ship back to Sydney. Mary Bryant's story was reported back in England and, due to extensive public sympathy, Mary was pardoned.

1838 - British Parliament passed an act to suspend the Constitution of 1791 in Lower Canada following the Rebellion of 1837, and direct rule by a Special Council; to come into effect as of March 27th.

1844 - Daniel O'Connell was convicted of "conspiracy," fined £2000 and sentenced to 12 months in prison. The conviction was later thrown out by the British House of Lords.

HARVARD TELLS COLLEGE APPLICANTS: FOCUS ON KINDNESS, NOT OVERACHIEVING:

A new Harvard report is basically saying the best way to succeed for students who are applying to college is to relax, and be nicer to your family and neighbours.

The change is one of several reassessments of current admission policies, including deemphasising standardised test scores and more attention to home life, contained in a new report from the Harvard Graduate School of Education called "Turning the Tide."

The report focuses on reducing pressure on students applying to college, promoting the common good across communities, and making it easier for students of different races and income levels to compete for a spot at college.

"Too often, today's culture sends young people messages that emphasise personal success rather than concern for others and the common good, Richard Weissbourd, Senior Lecturer at the graduate school said. "It is unhealthy to increase the pressure on students to constantly achieve, blaming that pressure for higher rates of anxiety, depression, and substance abuse among college bound teens.

Among the multiple recommendations the report recommends are:

*Decreased emphasis on college advanced placement classes and ACT and SAT scores.

* Encouraging students to take on a local community project or volunteer with a diverse group for a cause they believe in, rather than performing "exotic" volunteer trips overseas

*Encouraging students to forego big name schools for those that are a "best fit" for the individual student

*And placing a high value on a student's contributions at home, including simple chores that make life easier for the rest of their family

Some colleges, such as Yale University, have already begun incorporating the report's findings into their admissions process. Its admissions survey next year will require applicants to explain contributions they have made to their family.

DOG ESCAPES SHELTER TO TRACK DOWN WOMAN WHO FED HIM TREATS:

Ted is a German shepherd-Akita mix that was brought into the Northwest Territories SPCA in Yellowknife, Canada recently.

Terrified by the building and surrounding humans, the dog refused to leave his kennel, in an effort to befriend the pup, Abbey Boyd an SPCA volunteer fed him some of the shelter's bacon treats.

After asking the maintenance worker if he could build Ted a bigger, more comfortable kennel, Abbey went home.

The next day at 3am, Abbey went to work at the airport. Three hours later, she arrived home to find a dog sitting on her porch, barking in her direction. Though they were wary of each other, Abbey invited the dog into her house for investigation and she noticed a small familiar mark on the dogs nose and recognised him as Ted. According to the SPCA, Ted had broken out of his kennel and wriggled out from the chain link fence so he could trek over three miles to Abbey's house.

How he found Abbey's house is a mystery, but she took the incident as a sign and is planning on adopting Ted once she moves houses.

"I can't ignore a sign like that," Abbey said. "He showed up at my house, out of how many people that live here? All the dogs. All the smells. He chose my house. Where I am. I'm going to] build my bond with him that apparently, he senses more than I do. He's ready to be loved and taken care of. He's coming with me."

A DONATED SUIT HELPS HOMELESS MAN LAND A JOB:

After dozens of failed C.V. submissions, Brian Smith finally landed the job he needed all thanks to a free suit of clothes.

Brian lost his job just over a year ago – and despite applying for 180 jobs over that time, no one wanted to hire him. As he struggled to survive on the streets, things looked bleak.

But then he heard about a special deal at Utah Woolen Mills, a clothing store in Salt Lake City. For every suit that the shop sells, they donate one to someone in the process of turning their lives around.

Brian was given the suit on a Saturday and landed the job three days later.

BOSTON MARATHON BOMBING SURVIVOR SET TO MARRY THE MAN WHO SAVED HER:

Boston firefighter Mike Materia is set to marry Roseann Sdoia in a wedding ceremony this Autumn and the happy couple might never have met if Roseann hadn't been standing near the finish line of the Boston Marathon in 2013 when a bomb exploded.

Matt came to the aid of Roseann and accompanied the severely wounded woman to Massachusetts General Hospital for treatment, staying with her during the entire ambulance ride.

Though Roseann lost her right leg in the explosion, Matt continued to visit her periodically through her recovery until romance eventually blossomed.

"I knew I was starting to have feelings for him because he was so kind and caring. And he has an unbelievable smile Roseann said" and two months after the incident, they went on their first date.

GARDENING Outlook

with John O'Sullivan

What we mean when we call a plant an Herbaceous Perennial is that in most of them the stems are soft, succulent and green as opposed to being brown and woody. With most Herbaceous Perennial they will sprout growth from ground level in spring and will grow and flower right through the summer and into the autumn. With most Herbaceous Perennials, in late autumn and early winter they start to look a bit ragged. But depending on the severity of the winter, some will hold on until the first real cold snap. The maintenance for most Herbaceous Perennials isn't a lot really. During late autumn, early winter cut the majority of the stem down to ground level and mulch over with some compost. Some Herbaceous Perennials such as Lupins and semi hardy Fuchsias will have woody stems because of the milder climate here so when pruning back cut right back to just a couple of inches above ground level.

Herbaceous Perennials are a valuable plant in the garden for a number of reasons.

1. Because of the length of time they flower for.

2. Because of the short length of time it takes them to grow to the maximum height and spread.

When planting an Herbaceous Border always remember to plant the taller ones to the back or middle and the smaller growing ones to the front. When choosing your plants pick one plant that you can repeatedly plant in the border to create a sense of continuity to the planting scheme. Herbaceous Perennials flower from April until October/November so you have a wide range of flowering times and colour to choose from. The secret to having a good flowering Herbaceous Border is every few years in the winter to lift and divide the plants that are suitable for this.

Next week I will focus on roses.
