Friends of Glenflesk native Kevin Casey who passed away on January 3rd after a short battle with cancer are planning to hold a night in his memory on Saturday, April 1st at the Gleneagle Hotel, Killarney. Kevin worked as Sports Editor at WLR in Waterford City and lived in the village of Dunmore East with his wife Marguerite and their three young sons Paul, Mark and James.

A past pupil of Glenflesk National School and St. Brendan's College, Kevin was a multi-award winning broadcaster who was honoured on numerous occasions at the GAA's McNamee Awards and last October won a prestigious Gold PPI National Radio Award in the Sports Story category for a touching interview he recorded with Waterford hurler Maurice Shanahan. Maurice gave an open and honest account of his struggle with depression which made for compelling listening, the programme was enhanced by the compassionate and sensitive style of Kevin's interviewing.

The son of Mary and Paddy Casey from Gortacoosh, Glenflesk, Kevin won a prestigious PPI National Radio Award last October for the same programme. He worked with many media outlets including The Irish World newspaper in London, Radio Kerry, where he worked on Terrace Talk, Newstalk 106 and Today FM. Kevin

represented his club Glenflesk up to U21 level and had a huge love for the game. Through his work as PRO for the Kerry Ladies Football County Board he became involved with the national organisation in Croke Park and was responsible for writing weekly copy for the Irish Times, Irish Independent and the Irish Examiner. The night in Kevin's memory will be held on Saturday, April 1st at the Gleneagle Hotel, Killarney. THE ART HOUSE SET TO OPEN IT'S DOORS





Killarney Daffodil Day Committee hosted the Daffodil Day launch in the Killarney Towers Hotel, last week. State Pension (Contributory)

The State Pension (Contributory) is paid to people from the age of 66 who have enough Irish social insurance contributions. It is not means-tested.

If you retire early, you should ensure that you continue to pay PRSI contributions or get credited contributions (if eligible) to maintain your entitlement to a pension.

To qualify for a State Pension (Contributory) you must be aged 66 or over and have enough Class A, E, F,G, H, N or S social insurance contributions.

- 1. Have started to pay social insurance before the age of 56
- 2. Have a certain number of social insurance contributions paid
- 3. Have a certain average number over the years since you first started to pay

Number of paid contributions

If you reach pension age on or after April 6 2012, you need to have 520 full-rate contributions (10 years contributions). In this case, only 260 of the 520 contributions may be voluntary

However, if you were a voluntary contributor on or before April 6 1997 and you have a yearly average of 20 contributions, you may meet the requirement if you have a total of 520 full-rate contributions (of which only 156 need to be compulsory paid contributions).

DON'T "GET THIS SEASON'S KILLER LOOK"

The Road Safety Authority (RSA) has launched a new digital road safety campaign focusing on the misuse of seatbelts by women. The campaign entitled "Get This Season's Killer Look", is aimed at discouraging women from wearing their seatbelts under their arm, which can cause horrific injuries in the event of a collision.

A study of 300 women aged 17 to 34, undertaken in 2016 by Behaviour & Attitudes, on behalf of the RSA found that:

- 28% admitted to misusing a seatbelt by wearing it under the arm, rising to 35% among younger women.
- 53% of those interviewed said that their friends wore the seatbelt under the arm
- The main reasons cited for wearing the seatbelt under the arm were to relieve neck tension (49%) and for general comfort (47%).
- 9% said it was to protect their tan, or 7% to protect clothing.
- While seatbelt compliance is consistently very strong among young fe males, it is not universal: e.g. 23% do not always wear a seat belt as a rear passenger.

Commenting on the campaign Ms. Moyagh Murdock, Chief Executive, RSA, said "How you wear your seat belt is as important as whether you wear your seat belt or not. Worryingly, whether for comfort or vanity, many women choose to wear their seatbelts under the arm, instead of over the shoulder, which exposes them to terrible injuries and even death in the event of a crash. Placing the shoulder strap of the seatbelt under their arm leaves your upper torso — including your neck, face and head — completely unrestrained during a collision."

"My message to anyone who wears their seatbelt under their arm is simple – wear your seatbelt correctly. The belt should be worn diagonally across the wearer's chest on their shoulder and never under the arm. If it feels uncomfortable, adjust the height of the belt on the anchor point on the door frame or adjust the seat position and height. Most importantly of all avoid getting "This Season's Killer Look" because you didn't wear your seatbelt properly."



The campaign will feature primarily on online in a bid to reach young women where they spend the majority of their free time. It will be fronted by a 30 second ad that will be deployed on 'Video On Demand' (VOD) platforms. The "This Season's Killer Look" Public Service Advert is centred on a young model, posing for a fashion shoot in a glamorous car. As the shoot progresses, the model puts on her seatbelt and places the belt under her arm. Suddenly, the model is thrown violently forward and the scene switches to an eerie x-ray world where we see clearly the devastating injuries sustained in a collision. When we switch back to reality, we see the model is wearing a neck and body brace and has scaring on her face. Lifelong injuries now replace her glamorous look. The campaign slogan invites viewers not to get - 'This Season's Killer Look' - by never wearing a seatbelt under the arm.

The RSA sought the input of Gerry Lane, Consultant in Emergency Medicine at Letterkenny General Hospital, Donegal in developing the campaign.

The campaign will also be promoted on the RSA social media channels including Facebook, Twitter, Snapchat or Instagram with the campaign's official hashtag #KillerLook.

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

Road-wise pedestrians are safe pedestrians. Find out how to put your best foot forward and stay safe on Irish roads

Better safety, step-by-step

In 2008, 49 pedestrians were killed and 1,124 injured on Ireland's roads. That's 18% of all fatalities and 12% of all casualties from road collisions in the country.

THE BASICS

Although you can't be responsible for the way people drive, you can take a number of steps to make yourself safer as a pedestrian:

- Stop, look and listen
- Don't try to cross the road between parked
- If possible, cross at a pedestrian crossing or

traffic lights

- Never cross at a bend
- If there is a footpath use it
- If there is no footpath, walk/run/jog on the right hand side of the road, facing oncoming traffic and keeping as close as possible to the side of the road
- Walk no more than two abreast and if the road is narrow or there is heavy traffic, walk in single file

INCREASE YOUR VISIBILITY

More than two-thirds of fatal pedestrian collisions happen at night. Although you can hear a car coming and see its lights, the driver may not see you (and certainly won't hear you). To protect yourself make sure you:

 Always wear a pair of reflective armbands, high-visibility belt or other reflective or fluorescent clothing which will help you to be seen from a distance

Carry a torch on country roads

SOBERING FACTS

Drunken pedestrians are a source of danger to themselves and other road users. If you have had one too many, don't attempt to walk – hail a taxi, use public transport or get a lift from a (non-drinking) friend.

Pubs and clubs also have a responsibility to prevent intoxicated customers walking out on public roads where they could be hit by passing vehicles, or cause a crash through their own behaviour. To prevent this happening, bar staff or anyone serving alcohol should decide if the person is fit to walk. If not, they should arrange to get them home safely.

USING JUMP LEADS

How to use jump leads without hurting yourself or damaging either car

Unless you know what you're doing, delving under the bonnet to check for or correct faults can be dangerous. We generally recommend that you seek professional assistance.

Check the vehicle handbook before using jump leads. All include general advice on jump starting but some include model specific procedures. If this is the case you must follow

the manufacturer's procedure rather than the steps described below.

Jump starting a vehicle can be a safe procedure however and damage can be avoided if a few simple rules are followed:

SAFETY RULES

Keep metal objects out of the way – rings, watch straps, hand tools, clips or stray wires just brushing a battery post can cause a spark, possibly exploding the battery and releasing the acid.

Don't attempt to jump-start a battery that is

leaking or looks damaged – it could explode. Avoid smoking or naked flames – batteries give off flammable gases so an explosion could result.

Keep hands well away and avoid loose fitting clothing, particularly scarves or neckties – with the engine running it's easy to get caught-up and seriously injured on moving parts like pulleys or belts.

Don't use jump leads if they're damaged – broken conductors or damaged clamps can overheat and may catch fire.



Fitzmaurice said that there was a kneejerk reaction to last week's defeat at the hands of Monaghan.

"Sometimes there can be a kneejerk reaction to results. We can be over the top with good performances and bad performances No one was more disappointed last week than the players and the management. We were anxious for a good performance today. The Kerry supporters who travelled saw a much different Kerry display than last week," he

Kerry were much improved on this occasion. Their movement, support and build-up play was first-class as was their kick-passing. The win was notable too for some big performances from Paul Geaney, James O'Donoghue who scored 1-10 between them while the three Kerins O'Rahilly's players on duty, David Moran, Barry John Keane and the outstanding Jack Savage, shared 0-5 of Kerry's tally between them.

Kerry's tendency to fade out of games, particularly in the second half, has been a feature of their League performances this year. Roscommon, who were reduced to 14 men in the second half following the dismissal wingback John McManus produced a 14-minute purple patch which saw them outscore Kerry 1-3 to 0-0.

The game took a dramatic swing in the 66th minute when the home side were awarded a debatable penalty when referee Barry Cassidy



One more step, one more push, one more big game for Dr Crokes to reach the summit of GAA Club Football world – the toughest.

Mount Everest is not climbed in one attempt. There are stages along the way, different camps and then the Hillary Step, the final obstacle to overcome, before the climber stands on the top of the world. And it is not just the climbing ability that gets you there. It requires stamina, resilience, bravery, camaraderie, a bit of luck and a lot more. Only the elite reach the summit; only the toughest.

Reaching Base Camp is a significant achievement in itself, lying at over 5,000 meters – over five times higher than Carrantuohill. Base Camp or the County Championship for Dr Crokes was reached via a good win over West Kerry, a single point win to St Kierans and a five-point win over Kerins O'Rahillys. A single goal victory over Dingle in the Semi-Final and Kenmare District waited at Base Camp. But a one goal, four-point win in the Final brought the Bishop Moynihan

Cup to Lewis Road and Base Camp was well established.

Munster Championship commenced in Quilty, County Clare. Camp 1 was anchored in Kilmurray Ibrickane, well-known to Crokes from previous visits. Another good win in Quilty brought Loughmore Castleiney on a visit to Lewis Road. The Tipperary visitors supported their warriors with great zeal, but left emptyhanded. Dr Crokes were now at Camp 2 and the Munster Final pitched Dr Crokes against the Nire from Waterford. Played in Mallow, Dr Crokes were devastating on the day, winning by a large margin. Another Munster Championship in the bag and Crokes were now sitting happily at Camp 3.

Crokes had been to Camp 4 on three previous occasions in recent years and were turned back, without reaching the summit. But this year is different. As in 1992, Corofin from Galway stood

in the way of a trip to Croke Park on St Patrick's Day. Could Dr Crokes dare to dream?

The Gaelic Grounds in Limerick was the venue for the Semi-Final battle with Corofin. Dr Crokes produced another fantastic display, to win by another big margin 2-11 to 0-8. Finally, Dr Crokes had broken through to Camp 4.

And now Dr Crokes are ready to climb the Hillary Step; ready to summit again - 25 years on. The buzz around the Club and in Killarney is terrific. A large band of supporters will travel by plane, train and automobile, to be there for our lads, whatever the outcome. Like their founders, the nineteen dangerous dreamers, Dr Crokes dare to dream, again.

One more step, one more push, one more big game for Dr Crokes to reach the summit of GAA Club Football world - the toughest. Na Chrócaigh abú.

"Lessons had been learned and decisions were made and with a great youth policy in place the Club went on to succeed in the District, County, Province and to win the ultimate prize - the All-Ireland Club Title in 1992."

PAT O'SHEA

"Pat O'Shea followed in Dr. Eamonn O'Sullivan's footsteps when he managed the County Team to win a Munster and an All-Ireland title in his two year term (2007- 2008)."

ACHIEVEMENTS

"The wheel of life really turned full circle from 2000 on when the Club had what must be a clone of Dick Fitzgerald in Colm "Gooch"

Cooper, All-Ireland winning medalists in Colm, Eoin Brosnan, Kieran Cremin, Kieran O'Leary, Johnny Buckley and Fionn Fitzgerald and 4 County Championships in a row (2010, 2011, 2012, 2013)."

COUNTY BOARD CHAIRMAN

"Patrick "Tatler" O'Sullivan was appointed Chairman of the Kerry County Board in 2012, the first Dr. Croke Chairman since Eugene O'Sullivan who held the position from 1903-1908. During Patrick's term, in 2014, the Sam Maguire returned to the Kingdom and Kerry's Winning Captain, Fionn Fitzgerald was the first Dr. Croke captain since Dick Fitzgerald's Winning Captaincy of the Kerry Team in 1914."

"The Club Website celebrated its first birthday in style in the Clubhouse on September 2002. Over 1,000 people log on to the site each month. The Dr. Crokes diaspora sent messages to us from 41 countries."


"Our Club was the first in the country to show live matches on the site. The first transmission was the County League game against An Gaeltacht on September 5, 2010 and what a tremendous success this venture was.

The reaction from Crokes and non-Crokes around the world was really exciting and congratulations rolled in - especially from old members because it was the first time they had direct contact with their Club since they had left Killarney and for many this was a long time previously. Google rates the Dr. Crokes Website as the 213th most popular website in Ireland.18,963 logged on in 2005. Most unusual visitor was from Easter Island, in the Pacific."

In a time where mobile phones and computers are a necessity, it seems a long way from the time men gathered around a gaslight to form the GAA but we hope the ideals and dreams are still the same."

Citizens Information

Know Your Rights: JURY SERVICE

QUESTION

I have been called for jury service but I'm not sure if I can take the time off work. What are my employment rights if I attend for jury service?

ANSWER

If you are in employment, there is a duty on your employer to allow you to attend for jury service. Time spent on jury service must be treated as if you were actually employed. In other words, you are entitled to be paid while you are away from work. Anyone with a contract of employment (including temporary or contract workers) is entitled to be paid by the employer while on jury service. There should be no loss of any other employment rights while you serve on a jury. The Jury Office of the court will provide a certificate of attendance on request. If you are self-employed and work alone and your attendance at jury service may mean that you can't earn a living, you may qualify to be excused from jury service. Contact the Jury Office for more information. The County Registrar or the trial judge may also excuse you if satisfied that there is good reason for doing so.

Some people have a right to be excused from jury service, including:

- Full-time students
- People who are 65 years of age or older
- · Those who provide an important community service, such as practising doctors, nurses, midwives, dentists, vets,
- People in certain official positions (for example, members of the Oireachtas)
- Some public officials whose work can't be postponed or
- Those who have served on a jury within the last three years, or who remain excused by a judge following previous

If you serve on a jury and feel your employment rights have been infringed or you have lost employment rights as a result, you can make a complaint to the Workplace Relations Commission using the online complaint form available on workplacerelations.ie. Read more about enforcing your employment rights on citizensinformation.ie.

EMOTIONAL INTELLIGENCE



Emotional Intelligence (EI) refers to the way in which we manage, perceive, understand and control emotions and relationships - both our own and others. Research has shown that El is very important in our life – and for many people it is more important for success than general intelligence (IQ). Four different factors have been identified in EI and these include:

- 1. The ability to perceive emotions....in order to understand emotions, we have to first perceive them accurately. This might mean understanding non-verbal cues such as body language and/or facial expressions.
- 2. Reasoning with emotions.... Emotions help us to prioritise what we pay attention to and what we respond to.
- 3. Understanding emotions..... If someone is expressing emotion, we must interpret what it might mean - emotions can have a wide variety of meaning.
- 4. Managing emotions..... Being able to manage our emotions, regulate our emotions and respond to the emotions of others effectively is the key to El.

In order to recognise an emotion 'as it happens 'for us, it is important to develop self-awareness. This involves tuning into our feelings, recognising what they are and the effect they have on us. Self-regulation is also important in helping us to better understand, empathise and negotiate with other people. The ability to recognise how other people feel is important for success. Being able to read other's signals and respond appropriately is key. The better we are at discerning the feelings behind another person's behaviour, the more skilled we become at communicating with them.

The good news is that El can be learned and developed. Strategies to work on our El include:

- Observe: How do you react to others....Do you rush in to judge before you know all the facts? Do you stereotype people? Take a closer look at how you are interacting with people and try putting yourself in their shoes.
- Put the focus on others..... Give others a chance to shine- without worrying about getting attention for your accomplishments.
- Examine how you respond to stress.......Do you get upset, blame others or get angry when in difficult situations. The ability to stay calm and in control when things go wrong is key to success.
- Take responsibility If you make a mistake, apologise.
- Know how your actions will affect others.



I am so excited for my little brother and sister to come home from school to hear that I have made enough to go to Texas."

Go Fund Me confirmed that Shauntelle's campaign is the largest Irish campaign to ever be held on the crowd-funding platform.

"I haven't stopped crying, I haven't slept," Shauntelle's mother Leona said "We live in a mighty little country and I can't believe that people have been so good."

Shauntelle will travel to Texas on March 29th on her own to undergo treatment and she added "The doctors in Texas have told me if I don't come for at least 12 months then they don't have a great chance of helping me survive."

Dutch zookeepers are using modern technology to allow female orangutans to choose their future mates. The hope is to learn more about what traits drive females to choose certain males over others and to save money and heartache on failed love connections when an orangutan's other half is chosen by humans.

The programme, named "Tinder for orangutans," is a four-year experiment taking place in the Apenheul Primate Park in Apeldoorn, Netherlands. The lucky bachelorette and test subject is Samboja, an 11-year-old female orangutan, who will follow in the footsteps of other primates who have used tablets to pick out a hot date.

Not only do the researchers hope to gain a better understanding of what roles emotions play in non-human animal relationships, but they hope to save a Euro or two in the process as often, animals have to be taken back to the zoo they came from without mating, some from as far away as Singapore.

So far, the biggest obstacle is creating a tablet that is strong enough to withstand Samboja's strength. The researchers have developed a steel frame for the tablet, which was still intact after some older female orangutans handled it. Unfortunately, once it landed in the hands of Samboja, who takes after her mother Sandy, also known as "Demolition Woman"—it was destroyed.

Once they can find a way for her to flip through photos without issue, they will collect data on whether or not the image of a potential mate is enough to ensure a successful pairing.

FOCUS ON HERBACEOUS PERENNIALS

What we mean when we call a plant an Herbaceous Perennial is that in most of them, the stems are soft, succulent and green as opposed to being brown and woody. With most Herbaceous Perennial they will sprout growth from ground level in spring and will grow and flower right through the summer and into the autumn. With most Herbaceous Perennials in late autumn and early winter, they start to look a bit ragged. But depending on the severity of the winter some will hold on until the first real cold snap. The maintenance for most Herbaceous Perennials isn't a lot really. During late autumn and early winter, cut the majority of them down to ground level and mulch over with some compost. Some Herbaceous Perennials such as Lupins and semi hardy Fuschias will have woody stems because of the milder climate here so when pruning back cut right back to just a couple of inches above ground level. Herbaceous Perennials are a valuable plant in the garden for a number of reasons.

Because of the length of time they flower for

Because of the short length of time it takes them to grow to the maximum height and spread.

When planting a Herbaceous border, always remember to plant the taller ones to the back or middle and the smaller growing ones to the front. When choosing your plants pick one plant tha you can repeatedly plant in the border to create a sense of continuity to the planting scheme. Herbaceous Pernnials flower from April until October/ November so you have a wide range of flowering times and colour to choose from. The secret to having a good flowering Herbaceous Border is every fdew years in the winter to lif and divide the plants that are suitable for this.
