

STUNNING NAOMI IS AN INSPIRATION TO ALL

“Don’t quit, suffer now and live the rest of your life as a champion” – This is the motto that inspirational Killarney teenager Naomi Brosnan has vowed to live by after spending a gruelling six months in Cork University Hospital.

On November 5th 2014 Naomi, who is the daughter of Ciara and Martin Brosnan from

Killarney was diagnosed with Burkitt’s Lymphoma. The severe treatment that followed caused Naomi to lose her hair and endure four months in isolation – however, at Naomi’s insistence, doctors at the hospital turned a blind eye at night when at all times one of Naomi’s friends or family spent the night with her.

While Naomi has nothing but praise for staff at CUH she feels that there isn’t enough support for teenagers with cancer. Her experience was extremely difficult and now Naomi wants to start a support group where people like her would visit teens with cancer just to show that you can come out the other side of the illness. Naomi is currently in remission and plans to sit her Leaving Certificate in June at St. Brigid’s Secondary School, Killarney and hopes to do a PLC course in fitness afterwards. On Saturday night last, Naomi graced the catwalk at the Miss Kerry competition and secured a top ten position. She decided to enter the competition from her hospital bed on the day her hair fell out. “I just felt so ugly that day” said the stunning teenager. “I was looking at facebook and saw that my friend had entered it and I thought – why not – it would be something to look forward to”. And Naomi certainly enjoyed

COLM RETURNS BUT ADMITS IT WAS "PRETTY CLOSE"



COLM COOPER WHO HAS RETURNED TO THE PLAYING FIELDS AFTER HIS LONG INJURY.

No, doubt the biggest highlight of Kerry recent draw with Tyrone in Healy Park was the sight of a fit again Colm Cooper returning to the fray mid-way through the second half when he replaced Bryan Sheehan. It was the end of an almost 14-month wait for

one of the game's greatest footballers to make a full recovery from a career threatening injury. Cooper has admitted that at one stage during his long rehabilitation from a cruciate knee ligament injury, the end of his career was "pretty close".

The 31-year-old Dr Crokes player suffered the season-ending injury, along with a knee fracture, in the clubs All-Ireland club semi-final defeat to Castlebar Mitchels in February 2014.

"I never thought of anything about it being the end," Cooper says in a 12-minute documentary entitled #The Toughest Road Back, released by AIB to mark his return. "But when he (the surgeon) listed out the number of injuries, it wasn't so far away from it I don't think. It was pretty close. I think if that injury happened 20 years ago, I would have to retire."

However, his return is good news for both club and county and if his sparkling touches are anything to go by especially the perfectly flighted ball to Kieran Donaghy in which the Stacks player scored from, there could be a long season to look forward to.

Messiah for all is the theme of this year's performance. Singers who have previously sung the great work or sections of it are invited to bring their scores along and join in with the Chamber Choir and Orchestra in the Halleluja Chorus at the end of the ninety-minute concert.

The Messiah's fame and popularity arise from the dramatic and often exhilarating music of movements such as For unto us a child is born, Glory to God, He shall feed his flock and, of course, the Halleluja Chorus. It appeals to all music lovers, not just classical buffs.

Handel was invited to Dublin, the empire's second city at that time, by the Lord Lieutenant to give a series of concerts. While in Dublin he set about writing the Messiah in the form of a sacred oratorio – an un-staged opera. This was a very popular form of musical entertainment at the time. Legend has it that the work was written in a fever of invention in nineteen days. Its premiere was, by coincidence on April 13th, 1742 in Neil's Music Hall, Fishamble Lane, Dublin, close to Christ Church. Its success was immediate. Due to public demand a large number of extra performances had to be arranged. Gentlemen were requested in the broadsheets of the time to "leave off their swords" and ladies their hoops so that the maximum number of places might be created for the eager public.

Messiah for all is the theme of this year's performance. Singers who have previously sung the great work or sections of it are invited to bring their scores along and join in with the Chamber Choir and Orchestra in the Halleluja Chorus at the end of the ninety-minute concert.

The concert begins at 8pm on and admission is €10. Children go free.

GREENLAND CHALLENGE FOR IRISH ADVENTURERS

Irish adventurers Mike O'Shea and Clare O'Leary are again foregoing the mild climes of Ireland for much colder weather. The duo announced their upcoming expedition to Greenland - where they plan to cross the Greenland Icecap from West to East over 25 gruelling days. Greenland is the second largest ice mass outside of Antarctica, and their journey is just under 600km and gaining a maximum altitude

of 2500m. This expedition is the 6th expedition in an ongoing series of ice related adventures that the pair have dubbed The Ice Project, with the team having previously crossed the North Patagonian Icecap and Lake Baikal and made two attempts to walk to the North Pole.

The expedition will begin on the 30th April when O'Shea and O'Leary will fly to Kangerlussuaq in Western Greenland where they will meet the 4 other international members of the team. The other members of the team hail from the UK, USA and Norway and the team will meet up to finalise preparing their equipment and food. As the ice Cap is extremely difficult to access, the team will initially focus on accessing the Ice Cap, which is getting more difficult due to the extreme melting that is taking place each year, this can take between 3 and 7 days on foot before the team will take to Ski's to continue with the rest of the crossing.

This expedition also give the Irish pair a unique chance to work with a dog team on their

adventures. The team will use dogs while on the ice cap to pull sleds which will carry some of the teams communal equipment. Greenland is notorious for its strong winds and devastating storms and temperatures will reach a low as -30c on the expedition. The team have a wealth of experience to deal with all that Greenland can throw and hope to return to Ireland in early June.

Mike O'Shea has said "This is a great opportunity for us to get the chance to work with a dog team which will bring another unique aspect to this trip. It will undoubtedly be an extremely tough expedition but I am looking forward to it, and all the challenges that it will bring."

The team will stay in contact with their base back in Ireland on a daily basis throughout the expedition, with daily blogs and updates on their website theiceproject.org

"Year after year we see an increase in demand for our services. Financial restrictions should not be a barrier to individuals seeking help and support when they are feeling most vulnerable."





HOMESTAYS REQUIRED FOR CYCLISTS TAKING PART IN THIS YEAR'S CYCLE AGAINST SUICIDE

- Provide an overnight for cyclists and play your part in breaking the stigma of suicide in Ireland -

Cycle Against Suicide in partnership with Homestay.com, is looking for homeowners throughout the island of Ireland, to provide overnight accommodation for the thousands of cyclists taking part in this year's event, as part of the hugely successful Homestay programme.

The cycle which begins in Belfast on Monday April 27th and ends in Dublin on Sunday May 10th, covers 1,400 kms and over the two week period, the Homestay programme provides an opportunity for people across the island of Ireland to open up their homes to the participants, providing them with a warm meal, a chance to freshen up and a bed for the night. Research shows that this is a hugely rewarding experience for both the homeowner and the cyclist alike. It provides a chance to lend support in a very tangible way to Cycle Against Suicide without necessarily taking part in the cycle. This year, Cycle Against Suicide is partnering with Homestay.com to facilitate homestay recruitment and allocation of beds for the cyclists.

On Sunday, May 3rd, the Cycle will be arriving into Kerry and we are looking for 300 beds to host this year's participants of Cycle Against Suicide. THE CYCLE TO WORK SCHEME

This is a tax incentive scheme which aims to encourage employees to cycle to and from work. Under the scheme employers can pay for bicycles and bicycle equipment for their employees and the employee pays back through a salary sacrifice arrangement of up to 12 months. The employee is not liable for tax, PRSI or the Universal Social Charge on their repayments.

Your employer does not have to take part in the scheme. However if they do, they must offer it to all their employees.

What equipment does the scheme apply to?

The scheme applies to new bicycles and pedelecs (electrically assisted bicycles which require some effort from the cyclist). It does not cover motorbikes, scooters or mopeds.

Purchase of the following new safety equipment is also covered:

- Cycle helmets which conform to European standard EN 1078
- Bells and bulb horns
- Lights, including dynamo packs
- Mirrors and mudguards to ensure that the rider's visibility is not impaired
- Cycle clips and dress guards
- Panniers, luggage carriers and straps to allow luggage to be safely carried
- Locks and chains to ensure cycle can be safely secured
- Pumps, puncture repair kits, cycle tool kits and tyre sealant to allow for minor repairs
- Reflective clothing along with white front reflectors and spoke reflectors

How do I pay for the bicycle?

Usually your employer pays the supplier for the bicycle and sets up a

'salary sacrifice' arrangement from your salary over an agreed time frame (which cannot be more than 12 months). This generally means that you visit the shop, select the equipment you wish to buy and have the shop invoice your employer directly for the cost. Note that the tax exemption does not apply if you pay for the bicycle and are reimbursed by your employer – they must pay for the bicycle.

The repayment for the bicycle and equipment is then deducted from your gross salary (this means before income tax, PRSI, pension levies or Universal Social Charge are deducted). These deductions can be made weekly, fortnightly or monthly depending on your salary payment arrangement. Your employer can also buy the bicycle on your behalf and not require you to pay for it.

You can only avail of the scheme once in a five-year period. This applies even if you do not purchase equipment up to the €1,000 limit.

Qualifying journeys

You must use the bicycle and safety equipment mainly for qualifying journeys. This means the whole or part (for example between home and train station) of a journey between your home and your normal place of work. Employers do not have to monitor this but you will be asked to sign a statement saying that the bicycle is for your own use and will be mainly used for qualifying journeys.

There is a limit of €1,000 on the amount that can be spent (this includes bicycles, safety equipment and delivery charges). If you spend more than this limit you are liable for a benefit-in-kind income tax charge.

Maple Overnight Oats

Serves: 1

INGREDIENTS

- ¼ cup oats (I prefer Gluten free)
- 1 tbsp chia seeds
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- ¾ cup unsweetened almond milk
- A splash of vanilla
- ½ ripe banana, sliced
- 1 tbsp natural peanut butter
- 1 tsp maple syrup
- A small handful of pecans, toasted*

INSTRUCTIONS

1. In a small bowl or jar, combine oats, chia seeds, cinnamon, almond milk, and vanilla. Cover and chill in fridge overnight, at least 8 hours.
 2. Before serving, microwave sliced bananas and peanut butter in a small microwave-safe bowl for 20 seconds, or until bananas are soft and peanut butter is melted. Add to chilled oats.
 3. Drizzle in maple syrup and top with pecans; stir until combined. Enjoy!
- Notes

*To toast pecans: Spread pecans in a single layer on a baking sheet. Bake at 350°F for 7 to 8 minutes until fragrant. Keep a close eye on it as pecans will turn from perfectly toasted to burnt in seconds!



MAN ON A MISSION - DECLAN O'DONOGHUE

Declan O'Donoghue of Kerry Acupuncture Clinics, began 2015 with a goal to free 100 Kerry based people of their dependency on cigarettes before the year's end. When I reach my goal of helping 100 people to quit this year I will present my findings at the Acupuncture Council of Ireland's annual conference. I will try to convince many more acupuncturists to work towards the same aim in their counties and together we could have a real impact on the numbers of people being diagnosed with smoking-related cancers."



RSA & IKA URGE DRIVERS TO OPT FOR ORGAN DONOR CODE 115 ON PLASTIC CARD LICENCE

Almost 4 out of 10 drivers chose to become an organ donor.

To mark Organ Donor Awareness Week, which ran from March 28th - April 4th the Road Safety Authority (RSA) and the Irish Kidney Association (IKA) have asked drivers to consider declaring if they wish to become an organ donor when applying for a plastic card Learner Permit or Full Driving Licence.

Since the introduction of the plastic card licence format in January 2013 the code 115 can be displayed, meaning you have indicated on the Learner Permit/ Driving Licence application form that you wish to be a donor.

A total of 426,091 drivers have been issued a Driving Licence or Learner Permit with Organ Donor code 115 from 19th January 2013 to 28th February 2015. This includes 121,502 Learner Permits or 38.5% of permits issued and 304,589 Full Licences or 39.7% of Full Licences issued

Ms Moyagh Murdock, Chief Executive, Road Safety Authority said "This is the first time we have ever been able to put a figure on the number of drivers who are willing to become an organ donor, through the driving licence."

"When Ireland, along with the rest of Europe changed over to a standardised plastic card format driving licence, in January 2013, one of the new features added was the option to declare a willingness to sign up as an organ donor."

"On the previous paper licence, it was left up to the individual themselves to tick the box on the back of the licence. Under the new plastic card system, question 18 on the application form specifically asks the individual if they want to be an organ donor and have this displayed on their licence by referencing the code 115."

Chief Executive of the Irish Kidney Association, Mark Murphy "The focus of Organ Donor Awareness Week is to raise awareness about the ongoing and ever increasing demand for transplantation which relies on the public for organ donation. Families need to talk together and keep the reminders of their willingness to donate visible by carrying the organ donor card, downloading the Smartphone App. In particular I would urge anyone who is applying for the first time or renewing their driving licence to give serious consideration to becoming an organ donor and having the Organ Donor code 115 on the licence."

ROWING TO RIO

The Monika Dukaraska Blog. The story of a Professional Athlete



We are a step closer to our first regatta of the 2015 season. A team of eight will represent Ireland at the 2015 International Regatta in Piediluco in Italy. The entries have been published and I will face Spain, four crews from Italy and a crew from the Republic of South Africa in the Women's Pair event. We are expected to race a heat on Friday, final on Saturday with another heat-taking place that afternoon, followed by a final on Sunday. Piediluco is a double regatta, giving us plenty of opportunities to try things out and of course learn from it. The event will be followed by a 10 day training camp in Varese, Italy where we begin our preparations for the European Rowing Championships which are held in my hometown Poznań in Poland.

The past week of work consisted of a lot of long distance training sessions and some on the water lactate testing. This is unusual before a regatta as normally we would taper and decrease the amount of training however the event in Piediluco and the training camp are used as a training preparation for the Europeans, hence taper is limited ensuring that we peak at the right time.

Physiologists from the Irish Institute of Sport performed the lactate testing. We completed a 47-minute rowing piece on the water at various rates. During the rest time, the physiologists took a blood sample, which was then inserted into a reader that gave us a lactate score. It is much harder to generate lactate on the water in comparison to a rowing machine, as it is highly dependent on the technique and connection at the catch while rowing. The lactate levels should increase once the rate increases. The following day we were tested once more during a 20km outing where the aim was to paddle at a UT2 level, meaning that the lactate should be between 0.8 and 2.0 level. The UT2 level ensures that you work on your aerobic threshold. The same was repeated during our ergometer training in the afternoon. Knowing the level at which you train is key as we aim to develop a huge aerobic capacity which will ensure that we can keep going for long periods of time, when other rowers fatigue during the race, we will be able to go on and attack. Imagine a triangle; we work on its base. The longer the base, the higher the triangle. The top of the triangle represents our ability to sprint and race.

Just to wrap it up, it has been a hard and demanding week. I was put through my paces on a daily basis. I had to fight a slight hand infection and push myself through the discomfort of holding an oar handle on a daily basis. Now, I am excited to depart to Italy. I am looking forward to racing, exploring the new event and learning. Keep your fingers crossed! Chat soon!

LEGION GAA CLUB

WHERE ARE THEY NOW

After a quiet couple of weeks catching up with Legion lads in the local vicinity, I took to the skies once again and headed down under to Western Australia and back to the city of Perth where I finally caught up with one of Killarney's finest - David Murphy. I had actually called to David's home a couple of months back when I was doing another club interview in the city but was informed by a neighbour at the time that David was on vacation at the time. David from "Greenmount" in Rock Rd, Killarney is a son of club stalwart, Mike and Mary Murphy and a brother to Sandra and Linda and he has two nieces Kate and Emma and a nephew Dara who he tells me all play underage for the club.

I met with David down at Perth Shamrock Rovers soccer grounds just as he was finishing a midweek training session and for a moment, I thought that I was actually back home in Killarney as I spot Micky O'Grady and Paudie O'Connor all jogging towards the dressing room and as David told me later on, most of this team are from some part of Ireland and they all get on great and have become very good friends as they are all in the same boat, being so far away from home. This comradery helped them to win Div 1 State Championship last year with David playing at centre back for the campaign.

Before David left Killarney, he had played for nearly twenty years in the green n white [1991 - 2010] and he remembers that although he won a few underage titles in both County and East Kerry, his highlight was definitely winning the Intermediate title with the seniors in 2005 when they beat Finuge in Tralee. David rightly says that gaining senior status at that particular time was huge for the club. I asked David who

he remembers as being the standout players of that time and he says "I always enjoyed watching John Keane train and play. He had the sharpest elbows ever created and I was on the end of one at one of my first ever senior trainings. Galen Carroll was always deceptive to mark. He used to wear massive goggles while playing which were always very off-putting. John Bowler and Seanie Culloty were two of the best players I've played with. Gene McCarthy was a nightmare to mark at training. He would swing off your earlobes for an hour and apologise after. Outside of the club, the late Jimmy Falvey was a fantastic player for us in the Sem and with the Kerry minors."

And speaking of the Kerry minors, I asked David what kind of a team had they the year [2005] when he played with them, he says that they had a very strong team that year with a large Killarney contingent but unfortunately lost out to Mayo in the All Ireland semi final. As for progressing his inter county career, David told me that he got a few trials at U21 and senior level but modestly he says that he never made the breakthrough.

I could kick 2-10 in a minor county league match and the first thing Mike would ask me was what happened the 3 I put wide!

Johnny, Donal and Seanie Culloty were always

very influential as well as Garry McGrath in the Sem."

In 2010 David left Killarney

and travelled here to Perth where he took up a position of Physical Education and Maths teacher at a secondary school in the city where he still teaches today and although he loves the life here, especially the weather, he admits that he would like to get home more often as he has only been home twice since he left, both at Christmas time and he reckons that there is nowhere in the world like Christmas in Killarney. When I posed the question of what he misses most from home ... "Family and friends mostly. It is a nightmare missing everything from weddings and confirmations to funerals. I miss playing GAA too. Although, more or less the minute I moved to Australia the Legion boys started flourishing - getting promoted, reaching O'Donoghue Cup finals, beating the Dr. Crokes - I should have moved away sooner!" he smiles "I will come home eventually but not in the next three or four years. I would like to get back this year for Mike The Psych's inevitable retirement but I am going to Thailand with the school", his smile grows.

David and myself chatted for a while about some of the great days that he had while playing for the club and some of the great craic they had at the time.

With that, the Woodlawn contingent emerged from the dressing room and I bid adieu to David, Paudie and Micky .

KERRY MISS OUT AS "GOOCH" RETURNS TO ACTION

Kerry and Tyrone faced off with both sides needing a good result for different reasons.

Both were in danger of being relegated to Division 2, while Kerry needed a win to qualify for a semi-final spot and Tyrone themselves, needed a 2-point winning margin to send Kerry down.

In a game of very tight margins, a one-point Kerry win in Omagh and a draw between Mayo and Donegal would have sent the Kingdom through to the semi-finals, but the draw was a fair result and enough to keep Kerry's Division one status intact which was the main objective for Eamonn Fitzmaurice and his backroom team from the start of the league campaign while a semi-final spot would have been an added bonus.

This game marked the return to inter-county action of Colm 'Gooch' Cooper. 'Gooch' who was playing his first Kerry match since the All-Ireland semi-final of 2013 against Dublin received a generous round of applause from both sets of supporters, played an important part in securing Kerry's draw, the highlight being a peach of a pass to set up his old friend Kieran Donaghy for a late score.

The quality of the Kerry bench was crucial. Tommy Walsh, Paul Geaney, Darran O'Sullivan and Marc O'Se all made solid contributions, with Geaney and O'Sullivan scoring 1-3 between them.

Referee Joe McQuillan who was a late replacement for Eddie Kinsella, brandished nine yellow cards, six of them to Kerry and three to Tyrone, and also black-carded Kerry's Stephen O'Brien in the second half. Mr McQuillan's performance came in for some criticism from Kerry fans as he also awarded Tyrone some 29 frees, a number of them dubious and many from within easy scoring range.

Tyrone had the better of the exchanges in the



opening half, where their forwards with Darren McCurry and Sean Cavanagh scoring 0-5 between them in the first-half and 0-13 in total, posed endless problems for the Kerry defence, who tightened up considerably on the resumption.

Tyrone led by the minimum margin (0-8 to 0-7) in a first-half of few highlights amongst which were David Moran's excellent long-range effort in the 10th minute, McCurry's wonderful effort for the home side and the free-taking of both Bryan Sheehan and Sean Cavanagh.

Bryan Sheehan and Darren McCurry exchanged points at the start of the second half before the outstanding Paul Murphy and Paul Geaney with a brace of superb scores, put the Kingdom ahead. Kerry stretched their lead when Paul Geaney found the net from a rebound when Darren O'Sullivan's initial shot was stopped by Johnny Curran, the stand-in Tyrone goalkeeper.

Tyrone hit back and points from McCurry (2) and Joe McMahon, which could have been a goal, left three between the sides with 14 minutes still to play.

Kerry had a brilliant chance to stretch their advantage when Paul Murphy was clear with only Johnny Curran in the Tyrone goal to beat, but Curran smartly prevented the danger.

Then with five minutes to play, The Kingdom gained a one-point advantage when Anthony Maher pointed. Darren McCurry cancelled this at the other end with a point from a free to level things up again.

Play was fast and furious with both sides going for the jugular. Kieran Donaghy, from a Colm Cooper pass gave the visitors the advantage again with less than two minutes to go. Tyrone had a goal chance late on when Mattie Donnelly's shot hit the post.

In the last act, Darren McCurry levelled from play for the home side but in the end it was not enough to prevent Tyrone's relegation.

Tommys Farming Week

When Randall Donoghue of the CSIO developed a mathematical model to predict the effect of increased carbon dioxide on plant growth it did not make any headlines. Hardly surprising you might say, not interesting enough to fascinate the public, good news stories rarely are, especially one related to the most reviled gas on our planet today. Over the last week news of increased dairy output due to milk quota abolition created many headlines, the negative description of increased carbon dioxide output as a pollutant was repeated repeatedly. The minister for Agriculture to his credit backed dairy expansion and spoke of our low carbon footprint relative to almost all other global producers. Three different takes on the same subject, the good, the bad and the objective. Randall hypothesised that the 14% increase in carbon dioxide in the atmosphere over 28 years from 1982 to 2010 (a period measurable by satellite data), would result in an increase of 5% to 10% in plant growth worldwide. They then concentrated their study on the regions of the world where change would be most obvious, the areas most vulnerable to climate change, the dry regions of North America, Africa, the Middle East and Australian Outback. Allowing for all other factors, they found that the increased carbon dioxide was responsible for an increase in vegetation of 11%. Good news for biodiversity, food production and sustainability. This is not news to farmers or market gardeners or horticultural researchers across the globe, it merely confirms what

they have known for decades. Carbon dioxide has been used to increase output in greenhouses for generations. In fact, yields of all crops that we depend on for food and shelter have grown significantly over the last forty years, due to increased carbon dioxide. I was interested to look up the source of the claim that one of the principal building blocks of life on this planet was a pollutant. The Wall Street Journal reported that the US environmental protection agency, back in 1998 stated that carbon dioxide was the major contributor to the warming of our atmosphere and should therefore be listed as a pollutant. The irony of course is that satellite data shows that there has been no warming of our atmosphere since 1996. Carbon dioxide levels are up a further 8% in the intervening period. Time perhaps for the EPA to revisit that definition. Minister Coveney's assertion that our production of milk was cleaner and greener than our competitors is well founded. A pastoral grazing system is more natural and less energy dependant and grassland is a sequester of carbon dioxide, storing it in the soil as it has done for millennia. Denying Ireland the opportunity to produce would merely see it produced elsewhere in a less environmentally efficient manner. There is no logic to such an approach. An increase in dairying will be good for rural Ireland. It will be regulated to ensure it does not affect negatively the environment and the climate will do what it has done consistently for billions of years, it will change, with little or no regard for how many cows we milk in Ireland.

Know Your Rights: EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

APRIL 2015

QUESTION

I am signing for unemployment credits but I don't qualify for Jobseeker's Allowance because my partner's income is over the limits. What supports are there to help me back into the workforce?

ANSWER

The Department of Social Protection (DSP) provides employment support and advice to jobseekers nationwide. Jobseekers include people who are getting a jobseeker's payment, people who are signing for credits and people who are unemployed but not eligible for a payment. In general, DSP employment services focus on people getting social welfare payments. However, there are a range of supports for people who are not getting a social welfare payment.

You can avail of upskilling opportunities, for example, through Further Education and Training (FET) courses provided by the Education and Training Boards (ETBs). Day courses and evening courses are available. Although people signing for credits do not get an allowance during the course, you may receive some support for expenses on travel, meals and accommodation.

If you have been signing for credits (for three or nine months depending on the course) you can take part in the Back to Education Allowance scheme. You do not get the allowance but you can apply for a student grant (both the fee and maintenance component of the grant).

If you have been signing for credits for six months, or more you can take part in the Vocational Training Opportunities Scheme (VTOS) run by the ETBs (subject to availability). You do not get a training allowance but you may get travel and lunch allowances. If you have been signing for credits for 12 months or longer in the previous 18 months you can take part in Momentum courses. However, you will not receive any payment.

Springboard and Skillnets courses are also open to many people who may not be eligible for a social welfare payment – such as people signing for credits and unemployed graduates. If you have been signing for credits for three months (78 days) in the last six months, you are eligible for the JobBridge programme (and a payment of €50 a week).

Other employment services, such as advice on jobseeking and online job search tools, are available to people who register with DSP employment services regardless of their social welfare status. In general you apply for courses and JobBridge through your local Intreo centre or social welfare local office.

WORKPLACE STRESS

Whilst we can't control everything in our work environment, we're not powerless to make some changes – even in very difficult circumstances. Fear of losing our job, increased pressure to perform to meet rising expectations, staff cutbacks and increased overtime can all lead to excessive workplace stress. The way in which we deal with workplace stress and pressure is crucial. The key factor is to focus on those things that are within our control – namely ourselves. The better we are at managing our own stress, the less we will be affected negatively by other people's stress. Strategies to manage our own stress include It is important not to ignore the warning signs of work stress as these can lead not only to less productivity and effectiveness but to physical and emotional problems. Some signs and symptoms of excessive job stress include lack of interest in work, sleeping problems, social withdrawal, headaches and muscle tension, fatigue, difficulty concentrating, feeling anxious or irritable and stomach upset. If you are experiencing any of these symptoms then it is time to take action. Taking care of you involves making more positive lifestyle choices – one step at a time.

1. **Keep Active.** Regular exercise is a powerful stress buster. Try to get at least 30 minutes of heart-pounding exercise at least 5 times a week. This will enhance your mood, increase your energy and relax your body and mind.
2. **Healthy eating** is vital for dealing with stress. Eat small but frequent meals to maintain a balanced blood sugar, avoid mood swings, keep your energy up and help you to concentrate.
3. **Smoking** can lead to higher levels of anxiety as nicotine is a very strong stimulant.
4. **Don't drink** to relieve job stress as this can lead to problems down the line.
5. **Aim to sleep for 7-8 hours** per night as a good sleep can keep us emotionally balanced and better resourced to deal with stress.
6. We've all heard how '**a problem shared is a problem halved**' – so share how you are feeling with family or friends.
7. **Prioritise** and **Organise** your responsibilities. Good time management and organization can significantly reduce stress levels. Make a list of 'to-do' tasks and attend to them in order of importance – with high priority tasks first.
8. Break tasks into small steps – and focus on each manageable step one at a time. This will prevent you from getting overwhelmed by taking on everything at once.

Next week we will look at further strategies to reduce Workplace Stress.

FUNGAL NAIL INFECTIONS

Continued

DO I NEED ANY TESTS?

Other nail conditions can sometimes look like a fungal infection. Therefore, to confirm the diagnosis, a doctor will usually take a nail clipping and send it to the laboratory for testing.

What is the treatment for a fungal nail infection?

NOT TREATING

This is an option if the infection is mild or causing no symptoms. For example, a single small toenail may be infected and remain painless and of little concern. Some people may prefer not to take treatment because:

- Treatment does not always cure the infection. Cure rates are about 60-80%.
- Treatment that clears the infection does not always restore the nail's appearance to normal.
- The antifungal medicines used for treatment need to be taken for several months - sometimes longer.
- Although rare, unpleasant side-effects sometimes occur with antifungal medicines.

HOWEVER, TREATMENT IS USUALLY ADVISED IF:

- Symptoms are troublesome. For example, if walking is uncomfortable due to an affected nail.
- Abnormal-looking nails cause distress.
- You have diabetes, vascular disease or a connective tissue disorder (because of a higher risk for secondary bacterial infections and cellulitis).
- The nail infection is thought to be the source of a fungal skin infection on your body.
- You have, or are likely to develop, severe problems with your immune system. For example, if you are to have certain types of cancer treatment.

MEDICATION:

Antifungal tablets will often clear a fungal nail infection. The medication will also clear any associated fungal skin infection, such as athlete's foot.

ANTIFUNGAL NAIL PAINT (NAIL LACQUER)

A nail lacquer that contains the antifungal medicine is an alternative for most (but not all) types of fungi that infect nails. You may need six months of nail lacquer treatment for fingernails, and up to a year for toenails.

NAIL REMOVAL

If other treatments have failed, an option is to have the nail removed by a small operation done under local anaesthetic. This is combined with treatment with antifungal medication.

4 TIPS FOR INTERVIEW SUCCESS

- Starting right now make sure there is nothing on your social media pages that could harm you in the eyes of an interviewer either in your own posts or posted by friends – it might be too late to delete after the interview.
- Try not to be nervous, your job in the interview is to help the interviewer get to know you. You are the expert in the situation! No one knows more about you than you do.
- Learn as much about the company that's interviewing you as you can, even going so far as to read the notes on its financial statements. Stay up to date on whatever news there is about the company. It can be very time-consuming to conduct such thorough research, but it might just be essential to your success.
- Follow up with a thank you note, it's a simple thing to send an email after an interview; and successful candidates rarely miss that opportunity. It can really cement the good impression you worked hard to create. Thank the interviewer for the time they invested getting to know you; it could really set you apart from other candidates. (Not sending a thank you note or email can also set a person apart from other candidates for the wrong reason!)

ATTRACTING INSECT EATING BIRDS TO YOUR GARDEN

- In the long term you can encourage birds to nest in your garden by planting native hedges, trees, and climbers to provide suitable sites. More immediately, you can encourage Blackbirds and thrushes by providing a platform in a sheltered position, such as behind a bush against a wall or a bunch of twigs tied around a tree trunk. Robins will choose all sorts of strange nesting places: try placing an old kettle, with the spout pointing downwards for drainage, in a sheltered place.
- A garden can easily be made to be attractive both to people and to wildlife, especially if you choose plants to provide natural foods and plenty of cover for roosting and nesting.
- A lawn is a good worm-hunting ground for Blackbirds and Song Thrushes, and Starlings will happily devour 'pests' such as leatherjackets. Even paved paths and edgings have a use: Song Thrushes may use them as 'anvils' to smash open snails. If you do not have suitable paving, provide a brick or flint: the thrushes will repay you by devouring your garden snails!
- The best trees to plant are the ones that produce berries or seeds, as these will provide natural foods for birds in autumn and winter, as well as shelter and shade all year round. If you have a large garden you can have a mix of native species. If you have a small garden with only room for one tree, consider a rowan, crab apple or native hawthorn.
- The best shrubs to provide berries for birds are elder, ivy, and female varieties of holly.

THIS MAN SHOULD HAVE BEEN DECLARED A HERO – NOT ARRESTED

An old video has been making the rounds on the internet again recently, one which raises a very interesting question: How far would you go for your dog?

In West Memphis, Tennessee in 2003, Jarrod Martin watched from the parking lot of his burning apartment building as his dog cried for help from within.

Unsatisfied by the fire department's assurances that they would retrieve the dog before the fire spread, Mr. Jarrod took matters into his own hands.

Contending with noxious smoke and heat from the flame, he climbed to the balcony of his second story apartment and smashed through the door to save his dog.

Unfortunately, Mr. Jarrod had been warned by the police not to enter the building, so when he safely returned to the parking lot (plus one happy dog) he was quickly handcuffed. Jarrod Martin was ultimately cited for two misdemeanours: disorderly conduct and reckless endangerment.

Instead of declaring the man a hero, authorities defended their actions stating that if Mr Jarrod had been harmed or trapped, more fire fighters would have been compelled to risk their lives to save Mr. Jarrod.

BOLIVIAN WOMEN KNIT PARTS FOR HEARTS

The indigenous Aymara women have centuries of experience of knitting and weaving distinctive woollen hats, sweaters and blankets. Now, they are applying their expertise to a hi-tech medical product - which is used to seal up a "hole in the heart" which some babies are born with.

The Nit Occlud device was designed by a cardiologist who set up his clinic in La Paz to help children born with heart problems. The women weave the tiny devices which are made from a single strand of a super-elastic metal used in military industries in a special "clean room". Known as an occluder, the device is so small and intricate that it's technically tricky to mass produce and takes a weaver about two hours to make.

The cardiologist tested the first prototypes on sheep with heart problems and has since successfully used them on hundreds of children, he now exports his new inventions all over the world. The occluder can memorise its own shape and can be folded up inside a slim catheter which a cardiologist inserts into the groin. The device remains folded as it travels through blood vessels - and is only expanded when it reaches the right place in the heart. Recovering its original shape, it then blocks the hole or ductus that causes the heart problems. Bolivia is the poorest country in South America and does not have enough hospitals or specialists to care for its population; it also has one of the highest

children mortality rates in the world. This minimally invasive approach also helps to avoid cultural barriers to treatment: manipulating a heart is considered an act of desecration on the human soul by some indigenous communities.

ANSWER TO LAST WEEKS RIDDLE

A poor farmer went to the market to sell some peas and lentils. However, as he had only one sack and didn't want to mix peas and lentils, he poured in the peas first, tied the sack in the middle, and then filled the top portion of the sack with the lentils. At the market a rich innkeeper happened by with his own sack. He wanted to buy the peas, but he did not want the lentils. Pouring the seed anywhere else but the sacks is considered soiling. Trading sacks is not allowed. The farmer can't cut a hole in his sack. How would you transfer the peas to the innkeeper's sack, which he wants to keep, without soiling the produce?

Pour the lentils into the innkeeper's sack, bind it and turn inside out. Pour in the peas. Then unbind the sack and pour the lentils back to your sack.

DID YOU EVER WONDER – HOW BANANAS GROW WITHOUT SEEDS?

Bananas do not grow from a seed but from a bulb or rhizome. The banana plant is not a tree, but the world's largest perennial herb and

grows up to 25 feet, developing massive banana leaves that may extend 9 feet in the air. Edible bananas are technically berries and do not produce mature seeds. Their rhizomes - a thick plant stem that grows underground and has shoots and roots growing from it, can be hundreds of years old. If banana farmers need extra trees, they cut off a little of the rhizome and replant it in clumps or groups away from strong winds. Bananas prefer rich, dark soil; lots of mulch; steady, warm tropical or semi tropical temperatures and require lots of water; they thrive on humidity. On the French island of Martinique, there is a banana museum and there you will discover that bananas have more potassium than any other fruit or vegetable and, despite only containing 100 calories, will leave you feeling full. Bananas grown in mountainous areas at an altitude of more than 600 meters (or .37 miles) are sweeter than those grown at sea level. A row of bananas is called "a hand." In parts of Africa, bananas are used to make beer, and in many areas of the world, the banana plant is transformed into clothing, carpets, baskets and ropes. And, unlike most fruit, they do not have a growing season but grow year-round, making them a favourite winter crop. Around the world, there are thousands of varieties of bananas and depending on the variety, can be eaten raw or cooked. Although they strongly resemble trees, banana plants are considered a perennial. (Gingers and birds-of-paradise are distant relatives) and take about nine months to a year to bear fruit. Bananas are versatile. They are often a baby's first real food. They can be sliced on your morning cereal or in pancakes. Add them to salads (with avocado, pink grapefruit and a lime-flavored dressing) or serve them with sharp, gooey cheeses. You can make a pie, pudding or cake, or use overly ripe, almost ready-to-throw-out fruit in a sweet bread.



from busy roads, and their hunting grounds are few and far between. As more and more people pave their gardens and block them up with fences or walls, hedgehogs find it harder to get around and find places to sleep. In addition, widespread use of pesticides and slug pellets in gardens results in less food for the hedgehogs. All this means one tragic fact: in Britain these days you are more likely to see a dead hedgehog lying on the road than a live one. On March 16th, the first-ever large-scale hedgehog sanctuary in G.B. opened in Solihull, located in the West Midlands area of England. In response to the alarming decline in the hedgehog population, the Warwickshire Wildlife Trust has created this 90-hectare refuge in the hope that it will serve as model for hedgehog conservation across the whole of Britain. The refuge includes a nature preserve, a public park, and all the surrounding streets. The goal is to restore hedgehog habitat and complete further scientific studies. The sanctuary plans to create more than 100 "footprint tunnels" to show where the hedgehogs have been. Not only will they be placed in the wide green spaces, but also in the gardens of willing local people. Hidden cameras are being installed and volunteer "wildlife guardians" will help to protect the spaces.

Simon Thompson, the Trust's hedgehog officer explains: "We're going to be looking at distribution using the footprint tunnels and abundance via a capture, mark and recapture scheme. Hedgehogs will be trapped overnight and in the morning we will give them a unique colour code. We'll aim to recapture them again, and from the results we will be able to estimate the population numbers in the area." Hedgehogs are small nocturnal mammals that live in Europe, Africa, Asia and New Zealand. They're called hedgehogs because of their fondness for hiding in bushes, and because of their pig-like snouts. Spines cover the entirety of their backs; these can vary in colour from grey to brown and black. These spines are their primary defence, meaning that when they curl into a ball it's very difficult to hurt them.

Why The Drastic Decline In Hedgehog Population? The same story has been repeated

so many times: we humans are responsible for the decline in animal populations. In Africa, for example, the biologically diverse grasslands that sustain lions and thousands of other species have declined by 75% since 1960. This has led to huge drops in those animal populations. Monarch Butterflies have declined by a shocking 90% percent in less than 20 years and may have lost more than 165 million acres of habitat, an area about the size of Texas, including nearly a third of their summer breeding grounds. Pesticides and Herbicides have added greatly to their decline as well as to the huge loss of the Bees.

BRITAIN CREATES ITS FIRST HEDGEHOG SANCTUARY

Not if conservationists in Britain can help it. Hedgehogs need to roam to forage for worms and insects. But the urbanization of Britain means hedgehogs are in danger

It all began with one man and his wife. Julius Sterling Morton and his wife, Caroline, were among the pioneers moving into the Nebraska Territory in 1854. Having lived in Detroit where they were surrounded by trees, they grew up being lovers of nature. Mr. Morton was a journalist and became editor of Nebraska's first newspaper. With writing at his fingertips, he used the newspaper to spread agricultural information and his enthusiasm for trees to an audience that listened. Mr. Morton promoted tree planting and care and also wrote and spoke about environmental stewardship (taking care of the earth) and how all of life is interrelated. Through the newspaper and his speeches, he encouraged everyone to set aside a specific day to plant trees.

In other lands, you may hear it called Arbor Week, Tree Holiday, or Tree Festival. In Japan, it is called Greening Week. In Israel it is called the New Year's Day of the Trees. Korea actually has a Tree-Loving Week. Iceland has a Student's Afforestation Day. People in India celebrate a National Festival of Tree Planting, in Ireland we call it National Tree Week. Whatever people call this special time of year, they are sharing the news that trees are important to us all, wherever we live around the world.


