


Medal Haul for Killarney Couple

CALL FOR VOUNTEERS TO CLIMB CARRAUNTOOHIL

young Killarney woman will be remembered by her family and friends at a poignant event on Sunday August 26th.

Elyse Brosnan is organising the sponsored climb of Carrauntoohil Mountain in memory of her sister Carolyn. The event aims to raise funds and awareness for the Kevin Bell Repatriation Trust (KRBT).

The KRBT aims to alleviate the financial hardship of bereaved families repatriating the bodies of loved ones who have have passed away in sudden or tragic circumstances abroad, back to Ireland. Elyse's sister Carolyn passed away in London in December, the Kevin Bell Repatriation Trust were helpful and supportive and took over the legalities and costs of bringing her home.

"When Carolyn passed away suddenly in London we were devestated and didn't know where to turn", Elyse told the Killarney Outlook. "We contacted the Kevin Bell Repartriation Trust and they were amazing. They took over the legalities and spent thousands of pounds in bringing her home to her family", Elyse added.

The KRBT were established on June 16th 2013 following the death of their son Kevin Bell aged 26 years, in New York. KBRT have now repatriated 537 loved ones to their families in Ireland from countries worldwide such as Australia, Argentina, South Korea, USA, Canada, Ecuador, Cambodia, India, Uganda to name just a few.

The Trust repatriates approximately 10-15 loved ones back to Ireland per month and operates on a 32 counties basis for all sides of the community, creed, colour and circumstances of death.Costs per repatriation can cost up to GBP12,000 depending on the circumstances of the death, local charges and hospital release costs. KRBT eases a huge burden for grieving families and is growing every year since they started in 2013 with 7 repatriations to , this went up to 109 repatriations in 2018.

iarmuid Murphy has seen the bulk of support from punters to succeed Éamonn Fitzmaurice as Kerry's Senior Football Manager since betting opened last Sunday.

Éamonn Fitzmaurice stepped down from the role after six seasons in charge, seeing his side win only one of their Super 8 matches, with both Monaghan and Galway advancing to the All-Ireland semi-finals at their expense.

Murphy, who has four All-Ireland winning medals under his belt as a player, had been available at 5/1 initially, but the sustained support all week for the Dingle man to get the nod has seen his odds crumble into 1/2.

Two-time All-Ireland MFC winning manager Peter Keane had originally been made the 7/4 favourite by BoyleSports but he has since drifted out to 4/1 to share second favouritism with current selector Maurice Fitzgerald and Jack O'Connor, who is in the running for third stint on the Kerry touchline.

Lawrence Lyons, Spokesperson for BoyleSports commented: "We opened up with Diarmuid Murphy as a 5/1 fourth favourite, so the fact that he's now trading at an odds-on 1/2 tells you all you need to know about where the money has been going. He has significant experience as a selector and the way the market has gone this week we won't be surprised to see him don the bainisteoir's bib next season."




Top 5 Pubs in Killarney RATED BY TOURISM WEBSITE





Know Your Rights:

QUESTION

I am unhappy with the result in one of my Leaving Cert subjects and think that I should have got a higher grade. How can I get the grade checked?

ANSWER

If you are not satisfied with the mark you got in a Leaving Certificate subject, you can appeal this result to the State Examinations Commission (SEC).

Before you decide to appeal, you can view your examination script at the school where you sat the exam. When you get your exam results, your school will get a personalised application form for you. If you want to view your exam script, you must complete this form and return it to your school by 21 August 2018.

The Organising Superintendent appointed by the SEC will assign you to one of the viewing sessions, on either 31 August or 1 September. You can only view your scripts from the written examinations – not the results of oral examinations or marks for practical examinations.

If you decide to appeal your result, you can use the online Appeals Application Service. This service will be available from 12 noon on 20 August 2018. You need your examination number and PIN to access this service.

When you apply online and pay the fee, you will get an Appeal Confirmation Form, which you must print and bring to the Organising Superintendent in your school no later than 3 September 2018.

If you cannot use the online service, you must contact the SEC for a personalised appeal application form, pay the appeal fee in a bank and get the bank to stamp the form to confirm payment. Bring the stamped form to the Organising Superintendent in your school no later than 3 September 2018.

Your script will then be sent to an appeal examiner for re-marking. The appeal fee is \in 40 per subject for the Established Leaving Certificate. The appeal fee for the Applied Leaving Certificate is \in 15.50 per subject. You will get this fee back if your result is upgraded.





Generous gesture of transparency by SEC as Leaving Cert results out on Wednesday



(By Billy Ryle)

he State Examinations Commission (SEC) will issue the Leaving Cert exam results next Wed, 15th August. I sincerely hope that the results will contain good news for all candidates. By all means celebrate your achievement but, as there are some new developments this year, keep a close eye on dates and deadlines. There are important decisions to be made in the days ahead.

Leaving Cert results will be available early in schools on Wed morning and, from 12noon, online at www.examinations.ie. If you wish to view your marked Leaving Cert exam scripts return your completed application form to your school by Tues, 21st Aug. The viewing of marked scripts will be held on Fri/ Sat, 31st Aug/1st Sept. In accordance with the spirit of new Data Protection legislation, the SEC is allowing candidates to make a copy of Leaving Cert scripts at the viewing by mobile phone, tablet or digital camera.

The online results Appeals Application Service will be available from noon on Mon, 20th Aug. Use your exam number and PIN to access the Appeals Application form. Select the subjects you wish to appeal. Print the Appeals Application form after you have paid the appropriate fee and return it to you school no later than Mon, 3rd Sept. All appeals must be with the SEC by Wed, 5th Sept. If you complete any Candidate Observation forms (Form AP1) after viewing your scripts, return them with the Appeals Application form. The appeal fee is \in 40 (LC) or \in 15.50 (LCA) per subject. Results of Leaving Cert subject appeals will be released in mid-Oct.

CAO Round One offers and points requirements will be available at www.cao.ie from 6am on Mon, 20th Aug. CAO Round One offers may be accepted up to 5.15pm on Fri, 24th Aug. CAO Round Two offers and points requirements will be available at www.cao.ie from 10am on Wed, 29th Aug.

CAO Round Two offers may be accepted up to 5.15pm on Fri, 31st Aug. Thereafter, offers will be issued as available until 17th Oct when the offer season ends.

Interviews for Post Leaving Cert (PLC) courses, which are practical and vocational in orientation, take place in the period after the Leaving Cert results are released.

If you haven't applied for a PLC course and would like to do so, contact the colleges of your choice. The entire list of PLC courses can be found on www.qualifax.ie or www. fetchcourses.ie.

If you are interested in an apprenticeship or a traineeship, register at your local Training Centre if you have not already done so. Check the Solas website, www.solas.ie, or Kerry Education and Training Board (KETB) website,



www.kerryetb.ie, for further information. If a career in agriculture or horticulture appeals to you, contact Teagasc, which provides a variety of courses in the agricultural and horticultural areas. The agri-food industry offers excellent career prospects at all levels. Teagasc website address is www.teagasc.ie.

Contact Failte Ireland at www.fáilteireland.ie., if you are interested in a career at the craft level of work in the Hotel and Catering Industry. Keep an eye as well on the CAO website, www. cao.ie, for vacant places.

Many young people take a year out after the Leaving Cert to gain work experience or to travel. A year out is a maturing experience and allows an extra year to make the transition from second level education. Colleges usually facilitate students who wish to defer taking up the offer of a course for one year.

If you feel that your results didn't do you justice, it's worth considering a return to school to repeat the exam. Most repeat students considerably increase their points.

A more competitive result in the Leaving Cert exam might be in your best interests in the long run.

So, even though you'll be relieved when the precious Leaving Cert results are in your hand, don't take your eye off the ball. Be aware of closing dates, read your correspondence carefully and take the appropriate steps to allow a trouble free passage on your education journey. Good luck to all candidates getting Leaving Cert exam results on Wed.

In the next article, I'll explain the procedure for viewing marked scripts and for submitting an appeal to have your exam scripts remarked.



RATHMORE/GNEEVEGUILLA NEWS

RATHMORE COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Public consultation on improvement works in Rathmore Kerry County Council is inviting submissions on proposed improvement works in Rathmore. Plans for traffic calming measures and enhanced pedestrian facilities on N72 road will be on public display from 1 August until 12 September.

The proposed works include:

Traffic calming on the Killarney approach to Rathmore (N72)

A reduction in the width of the roadway to 6.5m for the entire length of the scheme

Realignment of the junction from local and regional roads on to the N72

The installation of two controlled pedestrian crossings to be provided at the community centre/playground and at the service station at the eastern end of the village

For a 150m area between O'Keeffe's hardware store and the community centre the following additional works are proposed:

Formalised parking areas both perpendicular and parallel to be provided adjacent to the local post office, public houses and community centre.New off-line bus stops to be provided either side of the road

The monument currently positioned directly across from the junction with Station Road is to be repositioned in front of the playground and community centre. Under the Planning and Development Acts, submissions can be made on the proposed works, details of which are available on the Kerry County Council website and Kerry County Council offices in the Killarney Municipal District and at County Buildings in Tralee.

NEWS FROM MICHAEL GLEESON

Councillor Michael Gleeson asked that Kerry County Council engineers would travel the banks of the Cullawa River with a view to determining the works that need to be undertaken in order to relieve flooding.

Kerry County Council has replied that Council staff and the Municipal District engineer have inspected the river. They have identified a section downstream of the bridge, located on the R582, where a certain amount of maintenance works will be carried out. The Council has consulted Inland Fisheries Ireland and has gained their approval.

The Council has received funding of €4,500. When agreement with a landowner is finalised the Council intend to access the river bank in order to undertake the necessary work."



* Players who have played inter county football at any level during 2018.

* Under 17 players not allowed play Adult competitions as per rule.

Clubs who wish to enter 2 teams in the Junior Cups the following apply:

* Any player who plays (starts or comes on as a sub) in this year's Molyneaux Cup cannot subsequently play in a lesser Cup competition



i.e. McElligott, Barrett or Cahill cups. * B team must play their Rd 1 game before C team plays. If B team concedes a walkover in Rd 1 game – C team is automatically removed from competition.

GUIDELINES ON MUNSTER COUNCIL DEVELOPMENT GRANTS

It is that time of year when clubs start preparing their application forms for grants. Munster Council Grants are categorised as follows:

• Category 1 - Purchase of ground for playing pitch (including first, second or third pitch)

• Category 2 - Construction of new Dressing Rooms or Extension of existing Dressing Rooms • Category 3 - Schools Grounds Purchase & Development

· Category 4 - Construction or Refurbishment of Handball Court

 \cdot Category 5 - County & Major Grounds Development

· Category 6 - Other Club Development Project

· Category 7 - Sanding Grant Scheme

· Category 8 - Regularisation of legal ownership of property

Application forms and guidelines for the various grant categories were issued in May. The closing date for grant applications is the last Friday, in September each year. Applications for grants received in Comhairle na Mumhan after the last Friday, in September in any year and incomplete applications received before that date shall be returned to the Club in question. Late applications shall be re-submitted for processing and approval the following year. Applications shall be deemed incomplete if any of the necessary documentation is not supplied. Only expenditure of a capital nature (providing a long term asset) is eligible for support under the Grant Schemes. Applications for grants shall only be considered from County Boards, affiliated clubs, handball clubs and schools, except in exceptional circumstances, within the province of Munster. In general only one application can be made for grant approval for the same project and proposed phasing of development must be stated in all applications for grants in first year of application. All GAA units in receipt of development grant funding are required to provide the use of their facilities to provincial, county, clubs, schools, colleges and other GAA units free of charge. Clubs found to be submitting incorrect or fraudulent documentation will be subject to sanctions as deemed appropriate by the Council up to and including suspension from the scheme and repayment of monies

paid. All grant payments shall be made in favour of the applicant unit and will be paid out at a meeting organised in each County by the Munster Council representative. Kerry did what they had to do at Fitzgerald Stadium on Saturday evening, but in the end, things didn't go their way as the defeat to Galway and draw with Monaghan in the earlier rounds of the All-Ireland Super 8 Series proved very costly.

Thus, the Kingdom failed to make the All-Ireland SFC semi-final stage for the first time since 2012 meaning an earlier than expected end to the 2018 SFC season.

When we engage with strategies to enhance Mental Wellness resilience is talked about, but usually as an essential skill for healthy childhood development. This article examines the steps adults can take to boost resilience in middle age, which is often the time we need it most as midlife can bring all kinds of stressors including divorce, the death of a parent, career setbacks and retirement worries, yet many of us do not build the coping skills we need to meet these challenges. The good news is that some of the qualities of middle age — a better ability to regulate emotions, perspective gained from life experiences and concern for future generations — may give older people an advantage over the young when it comes to developing resilience.

There are three core psychological attributes at the heart of resilience: strength, meaning/purpose, and pleasure. If your personal life is characterized by these traits, you have the core components needed to build resilience. You feel equipped to handle both daily life and those challenging moments when you have to dig deeper. You also believe that you're contributing to the world in a way that helps others, consistent with what seems most important to you. Whether you believe that you exist in a universe controlled by a clearly defined higher power, or participate in the human collective that transcends your personal identity, your source of meaning helps you manage high stress and trauma effectively. And finally, pleasure. It's about deeply enjoying that which enriches and satisfies you. Whether it be poetry or pottery, movies or theater, having experiences that bring you a deep sense of pleasure are essential.

Strength, meaning and pleasure. These core attributes must be experienced on both an emotional and cognitive level. Resilience grows from both feelings and engagement in a thought life, bringing you strength, meaning and pleasure. Reading, thinking, working, praying, writing, conversing – these are just as important as emotional experiences that give you the feelings of strength, meaning and pleasure.

These are some ways to increase resilience:

Practice Optimism. Optimism is part genetic, part learned. So if you were born into a family of Eeyores, you can still find your inner Tigger. Optimism doesn't mean ignoring the reality of a dire situation. After a job loss, for instance, many people may feel defeated and think, "I'll never recover from this." An optimist would acknowledge the challenge in a more hopeful way, saying, "This is going to be difficult, but it's a chance to rethink my life goals and find work that truly makes me happy."

Rewrite Your Story. When recovering from a challenging situation, know that your life was forever changed, but reframing the situation, focusing on the opportunity the setback presented, so that you can rewrite what will be the outcome.

Don't Personalize It. We have a tendency to blame ourselves for life's setbacks and to ruminate about what we should have done differently. In the moment, a difficult situation feels as if it will never end. To bolster your resilience, remind yourself that even if you made a mistake, a number of factors most likely contributed to the problem and shift your focus to the next steps you should take.

Go Out of Your Comfort Zone. Resilience doesn't just come from negative experience. You can build your resilience by putting yourself in challenging situations and learn to cope a bit more each time.

Take Stress Breaks. Times of manageable stress present an opportunity to build your resilience. It's almost as if you need to invite stress into your life to practice how to manage it. Taking a walk break, spending five minutes to meditate or having lunch with a good friend are ways to give your mind and body a break from stress.

So, take a look around in your life, and keep working on strength, meaning and pleasure and building resilience!



MARGARET'S RAMBLINGS

IS YOUR CHILD A PICKY EATER?



Researchers from University of Michigan followed a group of 244 ethnically diverse 2- and 3-yearolds over a year, comparing parental pressure tactics at mealtime to the children's growth and how picky eating behaviour changed during that period.

The study set out to answer these questions:

*Should parents pressure children to eat, and what are the consequences for children's weight and picky eating?

*Will the child learn she must eat everything, resulting in obesity, or will learning to eat veggies and other healthy foods help her avoid weight gain?

Although both scenarios are logical, the study found that neither occurs, said lead author Julie Lumeng, director of the University of Michigan Centre for Human Growth and Development.

"In a nutshell, we found that over a year of life in toddlerhood, weight remained stable on the growth chart whether they were picky eaters or not," Ms. Lumeng said. "The kids' picky eating also was not very changeable. It stayed the same whether parents pressured their picky eaters or not."

So, basically parents (or grandparents) don't turn children into picky eaters, but by pressuring them into eating, they don't turn them into "good" eaters either. If a human is destined to be picky, it just happens because some tastes are just hardwired and difficult to change, according to the researchers.

What can happen by using coercion at the dinner table, however, is damage to the relationship, the study found.

EARTH OVERSHOOT DAY

August 1st was Earth Overshoot Day, which means humanity has already used up nature's budget for the entire year. At the current rate of consumption, we'd need 1.7 Earths to avoid depleting our environment, overshooting what the planet can naturally regenerate, and destroying the ecosystems that support the complex web of life on Earth. This year Earth Overshoot Day is earlier than ever before.

THESE SIBERIAN WORMS SURVIVED MORE THAN 30,000 YEARS

Tiny roundworms, a type of nematode, that made their home close to 100 feet below the surface

in Siberia have lasted those tens of thousands of years, frozen and immobile. Now scientists in Russia have revived them, making these worms all of them females—the first multicellular organisms to have survived being frozen in Arctic permafrost.

The scientists analysed 300 samples of permafrost. Of those, only two samples had viable nematodes in them. One came from a squirrel burrow; another came from a different permafrost deposit, part of a core drilling near the Alazeya River. That sample was about 42,000 years old.

The samples contained two different types of roundworms, Panagrolaimus detritophagus and Plectus parvus. The scientists let them thaw out, and once they had, the worms seemed ready to go on with their lives, eating and moving.

The permafrost layer of the polar parts of the world contains all sorts of tiny creatures, including bacteria, algae, yeasts, and amoebas, as well as moss spores and seeds. After spending thousands of years in deep freeze, these bits of life are thawing out, as the poles heat up and the permafrost softens. Previously, scientists found that a giant virus that they named Pithovirus was still viable after 30,000 years.

POLISH MOUNTAINEER SKIED DOWN FROM THE TOP OF K2

On July 22nd, 2018 Polish ski mountaineer Andrzej Bargiel achieved a world first when he climbed and then descended from the summit of the planet's second-highest mountain on skis, K2. At 8,611m, it's just 200m shorter than Mt Everest, and a lot more dangerous. Until Bargiel's first descent, it was one of the last of the famous peaks still unskied from the summit.

Mr. Bargiel's incredible achievement will go down as one of the most daring descents on skis ever.

DID YOU KNOW?

The first 'Rin Tin Tin', was discovered September 15, 1918 during World War I by US Air Corporal Lee Duncan and his battalion in Lorraine, France. At a bombed out dog kennel, Corporal Duncan found a mother German Shepherd Dog and her scrawny litter of five pups. Corporal Duncan chose two of the dogs, a male and female, while members of his group took the mother and the others back to camp. The only survivors over the next few months were the two pups Corporal Duncan had claimed, naming them 'Rin Tin Tin'(but shortening it to 'Rinty') and 'Nannette' after tiny French puppets the French children used give the American soldiers for good luck. When the war ended, Corporal Duncan made special arrangements to take his pups back to his home in Los Angeles, but during the Atlantic crossing, Nannette became ill and died, shortly after arriving in America.

In 1922 Rin Tin Tin was spotted by the maker of a motion picture camera man and his career began. He went on to create a total of 26 motion pictures for Warner Brothers and received over 10,000 fan letters per week.

TAIWAN'S FIRE-FISHING BOATS

Traditional sulphuric fire fishing is a century-plusold practice found only in Jinshan, a little port city near the northern tip of Taiwan. On a moonless night long after sunset fishermen use a bamboo torch and soft sulphuric rocks to ignite a fire fierce enough to drive hordes of silver-scaled sardines to the water's surface.

Sulphur is one of Jinshan's most abundant natural resources, found everywhere from the village's rocky golden cliffs to the hot springs. Each firefishing boat carries a metal cauldron full of sulphuric rocks, which produce flammable gas that is fed into a long, skinny bamboo rod affixed to the boat's rear, the fire's blinding brightness attracts the fish and they leap out of the water towards the smouldering light. Nothing is measured, the knowledge is passed down from father to son and the fishermen know by heart how much sulphur to use and for how long for If the fire lingers too long, the boat could explode.

The fire-fishing season lasts from May to August, when the sardines migrate south from Japan to Taiwan's northern shores and on a good night, the fishermen can catch hundreds of barrels of fish, up to three tons of sardines per boat, which can rake in as much as \in 3,800.

Once upon a time this method was used by thousands of fishermen all across the islands of Taiwan, now, there are only four fire-fishing boats left and a dwindling number of fishermen, the local government also provides a small subsidy to fishermen who elect to use the traditional technique.



FOCUS ON PLANTING BULBS

Most bulbs are suitable for growing in containers especially the likes of tulips, daffodils, lilies and aliumns. When planting up a container or window box with bulbs plant them at about three times their depth and about one bulb width apart and don't forget to water them especially when the foliage is on and they are growing. When planting bulbs in the garden dig over the area well where you are planting and add some compost. Always plant your bulbs in groups of about six depending on the type of bulbs. If you would like to add some colour to some areas of the garden for spring and into summer, it would be advisable to grow your bulbs now in small pots and grow them on until early spring. You can then plant them in their pots in the areas you want and after flowering you can dig them up and keep them until next spring. A good dwarf daffodil for this is Tete-a-tete.


