€1.5 MILLION FOR LOCAL CHARITIES..... THANKS TO THE 2014 RING OF KERRY CHARITY CYCLE

It's official..... the Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle is one of the biggest fundraising events in Europe. Last Friday night the organisers hosted the annual dinner dance in the Gleneagle Hotel Killarney where the highlight was the announcement of this years overall amount of money raised from the 112 mile cycle. There were gasps of shock and surprise when the figure was announced shortly after 11pm..... more than €1.5 million was raised for local charities. This was the most money the 31 year event has ever raised, surpassing last year's total of €1.2m. "We were shocked and delighted with this figure. It shows the amazing kindness and goodwill of Kerry people who dig deep each year for charity. For people to go out and raise almost €1.6m is the stuff of dreams and is a testament to the goodwill of everyone who takes part and goes out to train hard, raise money and cycle 180km for Charity. We want to thank the public, the cyclists, sponsors and volunteers for making the 2014 cycle one of the highlights of the year," said Cathal Walsh, PRO of the Ring of Kerry Cycle. The nine charities benefiting from the 2014 Cycle were Ard Cúram Day Care in Listowel, Acquired Brain Injury Ireland (Castleisland), Irish Red Cross (Tralee), Kerry Hospice Foundation, Kerry Parents &

Guests at the event on Friday night included Bishop of Kerry, Ray Browne and Mayor of Killarney Municipal Area, John Joe Culloty. "More than 10,500 cyclists took part in the 2014 event. The average age of cyclists taking part was 40, with entrants from more than 19 countries. In a survey distributed to the participants, over 96% rated the cycle as either excellent or very good, while 98% said they would recommend it to a friend. Over 85% said they would register for the 2015 cycle."



The Irish National Teacher's Organisation (INTO) has launched a campaign to highlight the importance of limiting class size so that children can fully realise their potential, and develop socially through co-operation with others in schools. The campaign is called 'Room to Bloom'.

As part of the INTO's 'Room to Bloom' campaign, the INTO held a briefing event for TDs and Senators in Dublin at the start of October (2.10.14). Classes in Irish primary schools are among the most overcrowded in the EU, with an average of 25 pupils per class compared to an EU average of 21 per class. More than 125,000 pupils in Ireland are in classes of 30 or more.

In County Kerry alone, there are 21.9 per cent of classes where pupil numbers are 30 or more. The majority of classes in the county comprise pupil numbers between 20–30.



Charity Champion Campaigner Eddie Sheehy and his daughter Triona spend their twelfth successive year with the The Kenya Education Project in the village of EmbulBul on a three week visit this summer.

With many negative pictures of Kenya making the news headlines in the past year but thankfully this year's trip was incident free and both Eddie and Triona were made very welcome by everybody in the village and felt safe at all times.

Fundraising efforts this year has allowed Eddie to support 41 students in primary and secondary school which continues to grow, giving young people the opportunity to attend school, a basic human right that is not accessible to all children in Kenya. This year saw the fruits of last year's fundraising with new desks and chairs purchased for the secondary school and tables and chairs provided for a dining hall in the primary school where last year children sat on the floor to eat their food. It is hoped this year to use funds to furnish a library and computer room.

This year there was great excitement in Bro. Beausang School when the boy's soccer team qualified for the National Play-offs, a huge achievement for a new school which the Kenya Education Project has supported each year with the provision of playing gear and footballs. It was encouraging to meet past pupils of the school, either now in college or working knowing that having completed second level education they now have a brighter future. One such student is Stephen Oechieng who has been sponsored through secondary school and computer training courses by the project and who obtained a job with a computer company recently. He now rents his own flat, supports his mother with a monthly donation and enjoying the freedom of independent living.

As in so many years past, the work of the project would not be successful without the support of many groups and individuals in Fossa, Killarney

80TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEATH OF REV. PATRICK S. DINNEEN M.A. D. LITT.

Fr. Patrick S.Dinneen, the renowned lexicographer, poet and playwright - a native of Rathmore, Co. Kerry, died on the 29th September 1934. As a member of "Conradh na Gaeilge", he laboured unceasingly for the revival of the Irish language, when it was almost extinct at the beginning of the 20th century. Among his published works were three large volumes of "Foras Feasa ar Eirinn" - "A History of Ireland" by Geoffrey Keating, the edited works of the

Four Noteable Kerry Poets, Aoghan O'Rathaille, Eoghan Rua O'Suilleabhain, Pierce Ferriter and Geoffrey O'Donoghue, together with the edited works of Tadhg Gaelach O'Suilleabhain and Sean Clarach Mac Domhnaill. He is reputed to have written the first historical novel in Irish "Cormac Ua Conaill". However, his greatest achivements were his two large dictionaries (1903 and 1927). He left and indelible mark on Irish literature through his 1927 dictionary. It has been used by scholars both in Ireland and internationally, even up to this present time. He was awarded a Doctor of Literature for his lexicographical work and on his death he was granted a state funeral by the government. We are very grateful to U.C.C. for creating a digital form of the dictionary on the internet.

FIVE WAYS TO PREVENT DRAFTS FROM WINDOWS AND DOORS

We all know how upsetting and cold drafts can be. Cold breezes are bad for colds, flu, bronchitis and your general physical comfort and are especially unpleasant during the Winter, which is just around the corner!

 Windows and Doors Draft Snakes: The old favourites! All sorts are available in hardware stores and other shops, and are an excellent (if ancient!) method to keep those drafts out. You can even make your own by filling and old knee sock with cloth or rice.



2. Window Insulator Kit: Available from manufacturers like

3M, these are very effective ways to trap heat and prevent draft leaks through your windows. It's made of a clear, plastic material and placed over the window and you use the included double-sided tape around the window edges to seal it.



It's a great, cost effective way to trap heat and prevent it from escaping and cold breezes coming in.

3. Applying Self Adhesive Foam Weather Stripping: This is an excellent way to seal your house's doors and windows. If your windows or doors are leaking heat or receiving drafts, this rolled up product is easy to install. You just apply it to the outside edge of a doorframe or at the bottom of a leaking window pane. Choose the smallest quantity that will seal the spaces and then just peel and stick. Make sure you don't make the foam piece too big as you could have trouble closing the door or window.

4. Window Film: This can be used to insulate the entire pane of glass. This product can be found in any hardware store and come in a variety of styles. Several of the products are to be stretched across the frame from the inside, then shrunk into position and proper fitting with the use of a hair dryer. Some others insulate from the outside. Decorative styles are available, particularly the frosted effect style film.







'SLEEP DISORDERS' MAIN TOPIC OF SAFETY LECTURE TO MARK IRISH ROAD SAFETY WEEK

The Road Safety Authority (RSA) held their fifth Annual Academic Road Safety Lecture, marking the first day of 'Irish Road Safety Week' which runs until Sunday 12 October. The theme of the lecture was 'Fatigue, Sleep Disorders and Driving Risk' and was attended by over 100 road safety stakeholders.

The 7th annual 'Irish Road Safety Week' is taking place nationwide this week. The RSA is urging people to get involved in this national drive to save lives, as statistics show that road fatalities are almost as high as last year, when we experienced the first increase in roaddeaths since 2005.

Speaking at the lecture, Ms Moyagh Murdock, CEO of the Road Safety Authority said: "The lecture brings together road safety stakeholders to learn from national and international experience of how sleeping disorders, in particular sleep apnoea and sleepiness, impact on our ability to drive. Evidence suggests that driver fatigue and sleepiness is a factor in 1 in 5 collisions, and for those suffering from sleep apnoea, the risk of falling asleep at the wheel is up to 7 times greater than the general population. In a recent RSA Survey of Driver Attitudes & Behaviour (2013), 1 in 10 Irish motorists admitted they have fallen asleep at the wheel. The lecture will explore these challenges presented by sleepiness and sleep disorders and examine ways to mitigate driver risk."

Prof Walter McNicholas, who presented at lecture, said: "Untreated sleep apnoea is associated with high levels of sleepiness, which makes driving incredibly dangerous. When treated effectively, sleep apnoea is incredibly manageable, so awareness of the signs and early diagnosis is key. International literature from a number of different countries shows an average of 20-25% of all collisions on motorways are caused by excessive sleepiness. If you are tired behind the wheel, the best intervention is to pull over and sleep for 15-20 minutes. However, this is a short term measure, and will only revive a driver for up to an hour."To date this year, 146 people have been killed on Irish roads, a decrease of 1 when compared to the same period last year. This week, road safety activities will take place around the country to promote the need to stay safe on the roads. A full list of these activities is available on www.rsa.ie



TOP 10 TIPS FOR WINTER DRIVING

Taking a number of simple precautions can ensure safety on Irish roads during winter. Don't get caught out if severe weather hits, make the necessary checks on your vehicle now.

There are a number of simple precautions the RSA advises for driving over the winter months:

1. Check your tyres...they are your only contact with the road. Tyres should be at least the minimum legal thread depth of 1.6mm but need to be changed before they get this worn. Tyres need to be to the correct tyre pressure to give the motorist the best chance in extreme conditions.

2. Use your lights. As we come into the winter months, motorists are advised to use dipped head lights during the day so you are easily seen. Headlights and taillights should be in working order.

3. Understand your brakes. Check your car manual and find out if your vehicle has safety assist technology such as Electronic Stability Control (ESC) or Anti-Lock Braking System (ABS). Learn how these technologies can assist your driving in harsh weather conditions.

4. Safe Distance. It takes longer to stop a car during the winter weather so slow down and allow extra distance between you and the car

in front.

5. Make sure you can clearly see. All too often motorists do not de-fog or de-ice windows and mirrors which can compromise visibility. This winter ensure windows and mirrors are clear, and carry a de-icer and screen scraper. Do not use boiling water as this can crack the windscreen.

6. Beware of "Black Ice". Black Ice is one of winter's biggest hazards as it is difficult to see. Watch out for sheltered/ shaded areas on roads, under trees and near high walls.

7. Be prepared. During these winter months it is advised that motorists carry a number of essentials in the boot of their car.

- 1) High visibility vest
- 2) Spare fuel
- 3) Appropriate footwear in case you need to leave your vehicle e.g. boots
- 4) A hazard warning triangle
- 5) Spare wheel (Check that your spare wheel is in good condition and is fully inflated. Some cars may have an inflation repair kit instead of a spare wheel. Make sure that you know how to use it.)
- 6) Tow Rope
- 7) A shovel

- 8) De-icing equipment (for glass and door locks)
- 9) Spare bulbs
- 10) First aid kit
- 11) A fire extinguisher
- 12) A working torch
- 13) A car blanket, additional clothing & some food and water

8. In the event of a breakdown. Drivers need to ensure their vehicle is well in off the road so as not to obstruct other vehicles. The driver should also put on their hazard warning lights. If the vehicle breaks down on the motorway pull in as far as you can, alerting traffic behind you with hazard lights. The driver should leave their vehicle, get behind the barrier (on the embankment) and call the Gardaí, on their mobile phone or roadside telephone.

9. Keep up to date. Listen to local weather and traffic reports. Pay heed to the weather warnings alerting drivers of unsafe and dangerous driving conditions.





OUTLOOK RECIPES

Pear, Chocolate and Almond Traybake

Ingredients

- 225g softened butter
- 225g caster sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- Zest of one lemon
- 4 free range eggs
- 225g self-raising flour
- 3 tbsp milk
- 3 pears peeled, cored and sliced
- 3 tbsp raisins
- 3 tbsp flaked almonds
- Honey to glaze
- Dusting of icing sugar

Method

- Preheat oven to 180° and grease and line a 9-inch square tin.
- Place the butter, sugar, extract and lemon zest into a large bowl and whisk together until pale and creamy.
- Gradually beat in the eggs.
- Sift over the flour and fold in with a metal spoon adding the milk.
- Pour the mixture into the tin and level the mixture with a spatula.
- Arrange the pears and chocolate chips on top, pressing them in gently.
- Scatter over the raisins and almonds.
- Bake for 45-50 minutes until risen golden and firm to the touch.
- Brush all over with a little heated honey.
- Leave to cool in the tin, then dust all over with icing sugar.
- Cut into squares and enjoy.

THE PUBLIC VIEW OF AGRICULTURE (BY TOMMY ROCHE, CASTLEISLAND)

All too often in the public view of agriculture today, the difference between reality and perception becomes blurred. Blame it on specialisation, disinformation, degrees of separation but the gulf in understanding between those who farm and those who don't, continues to grow. The effects in the future, I expect, will become more dramatic but even now that lack of understanding can be frustrating. A couple of generations ago the link between urban and rural was tangible. Cattle were even walked through and penned for export in inner city Dublin, locals made their living out of the trade, the sight of a herd of cattle walking through the streets of any town was not unusual. Urban areas were smaller and more people were involved in agriculture. It is very different today, right across the developed world. These are two stories I came across from"Down Under" recently, both related to the dairy industry and the outsiders interpretation of its workings.

Two years ago a couple on a high altitude farm in New Zealand had a spot inspection and ran into trouble with the inspector. By way of introduction, it needs to be said that in most cases New Zealand farmers out-winter all stock, housing is not normally a requirement. If the country were in the Northern Hemisphere it would run from North Africa to somewhere in central France. The climate is generally kind to both man and beast. However if the winds blow from the Antarctic, they can be pretty severe; animals have frozen to death if caught out without shelter. It was after circumstances similar to this that the farm inspection took place. Whilst no animal had



died the inspector deemed that the cows on the farm were not being cared for properly and were suffering from malnutrition. The farmer was informed that he would be prosecuted for mistreating his animals. His defence enlisted the farm extension services, the equivalent of Teagasc, to assess his animals. Their expert witness, a farm-systems specialist, determined that the farm was well run, on difficult terrain, that the animals were not malnourished and that their condition score was adequate. Their dishevelled state was due to exposure to the natural elements. The stage was set for a showdown. Shortly before the court date, the case was settled. The farmer signed a form effectively stating that he would follow best practise in looking after his stock and the charges against him were dropped. The parties would pay their own costs, which after a year of preparation for trial were substantial. A bitter but pragmatic pill to swallow for the farmer who felt he had done nothing wrong. It would appear that an extreme weather event can absolve most industries of blame but not a farmer.


NEW €250K FUND TO SUPPORT AGRI-BUSINESS SECTOR IN IRELAND

MINISTER COVENEY MUST CHANGE KNOWLEDGE TRANSFER DISCUSSION GROUP PAYMENT IN FAVOUR OF FARMERS

IFA Rural Development Chairman, Flor McCarthy has called on the Minister for Agriculture, Simon Coveney to amend the RDP proposals on Knowledge Transfer to pay farmers the full amount and to allow farmers, in turn, to pay the consultants. Flor McCarthy said as it stands the Minister has proposed to the EU Commission that farmers will get a payment of €750 while the facilitator, which can be Teagasc or a private planner, will get €500 for each participating farmer up to a maximum of 15 farmers (10 in the case of poultry). This proposed payment to the facilitator is much higher than what farmers were paying Teagasc and planners under BTAP, STAP and DEP in a competitive environment. The IFA Rural Development Chairman said paying a standard fee is unacceptable and goes against a policy of having

competitive tendering.

Flor McCarthy said the following areas need to be addressed before the Knowledge Transfer measures are implemented:

* The payment level to farmers should be increased to €1,250 with the farmers paying the facilitator a competitive rate for the work done.

* The Knowledge Transfer measure which will apply to Beef, Sheep, Dairy, Tillage, Poultry and Equine must be extended for Pigs. In addition, a special Hill Sheep Measure (HSTAP) must be introduced.

* Farmers who have both a Cattle and Sheep enterprise should be allowed to be members of 2 groups, as is currently the case. Many farmers have duel enterprises and should be allowed to join both as the Knowledge Transfer measure in each enterprise is important for improving their farm income.

FOOD SAFETY AUTHORITY OF IRELAND ADVISES CAUTION WILD MUSHROOMS

The Food Safety Authority of Ireland (FSAI) has strongly advises people not to eat any part of a mushroom found in the wild without first seeking the advice of an expert mushroom forager. It warns of the serious risks posed by poisonous mushrooms and, in particular, the need for parents and guardians to ensure children do not consume wild mushrooms that may be growing in gardens or fields.

The warning coincides with the start of the foraging season and an increase in enquiries to the National Poisons Information Centre of Ireland in relation to wild mushroom consumption. In 2013, 19 cases of poisoning related to wild mushrooms were notified to the Centre, involving seven adults and twelve children. To date this year, 18 cases have been notified, involving seven adults and eleven children. All of the children had accidently eaten wild mushrooms.

There are 14 native species of mushrooms growing in Ireland that can cause food poisoning and a further 13 species that are highly dangerous and can cause hepatic and renal toxicity and ultimately, can be life threatening. The FSAI states that if people do gather mushrooms in the wild, they need to be aware of the risks they are taking and should always enlist an expert for advice.

FOCUS ON WINTER BEDDING PLANTS

With most of the summer bedding displays in hanging baskets, containers and window boxes nearly finished now is the time to start replanting them with a winter selection of bedding plants. Even though you won't have as much of a selection of winter bedding as you have in the summer, there is still a large range to choose from. When you are choosing your winter bedding plants, try to pick the biggest and the strongest as they don't grow during the winter.

The good thing about winter displays in containers is that you can choose what you want as a centre piece, because you will probably get a few seasons out of it in the container and you can plant it somewhere in your garden afterwards.

Some good centre pieces for containers are large, ie: Phormium, Cordyline, (green or purple), Varigitas, Holly or Bay Tree.

Small, ie; Carex Algold, Heuchara, Euonymus, Azalea, but just make sure when choosing that the plant is evergreen. There is also a good selection of flowering winter bedding such as Violets, Pansy, Primrose, Polyanthis, Cyclamen, Ornamental Cabbage.

Know Your Rights: LOCAL PROPERTY TAX AND THE LOCAL ADJUSTMENT FACTOR

QUESTION

What is the local adjustment factor for the Local Property Tax and how will this affect me?

ANSWER

Until now, Local Property Tax (LPT) rates have been the same nationwide - 0.18% for properties valued up to ≤ 1 million and 0.25% on any balance over ≤ 1 million. However, from 2015 on, a local authority may vary these basic rates within its own area by a maximum of 15%. This means that your local authority can either increase or decrease the rates of LPT payable in its area in 2015 by up to 15%. This is called the local adjustment factor. While the local authority has the power to vary the rates, the LPT will still be collected by Revenue.

The elected members of a local authority must consider the issues and decide whether to apply a local adjustment factor for 2015. To do this they must have passed a formal resolution to vary the rates and must have notified Revenue on or before 30 September 2014. If they reduce LPT rates by 15% in 2015, for example, this will result in a corresponding reduction of 15% in the amount that the local authority gets from the central LPT fund in 2015. (Each local authority will retain 80% of LPT to fund public services in 2015. The remaining 20% will be redistributed to provide top-up funding to certain local authority areas that have lower property tax bases than others because of the variance in property values across the State.)

The introduction of the local adjustment factor means that residential properties of the same value in different local authority areas may pay different amounts of LPT from 2015 on, depending on whether the local authority has applied a local adjustment factor or not.

For example, if your house is valued under $\in 100,000$, you will have paid $\in 90$ LPT in 2014. If the LPT rate in your local authority area is increased by 15%, you will pay $\in 103.50$ LPT in 2015 and if this rate is decreased by 15%, you will pay $\in 76.50$ LPT in 2015. Your LPT record will be updated in October 2014 to include your 2015 LPT charge. You will be able to confirm your LPT rate for 2015 by accessing your online LPT record.

The above list is by no means complete and the only way to try to keep your pets safe is to keep all cut flowers and pot plants out of their reach. Other seasonal plants, such as mistletoe and aloe, are also not so great to have in your home. These plants can be detrimental to the intestinal tract of your animal and can result in permanent damage to your pets' vital organs.

COULD YOU LIVE WITHOUT OIL?

How do you keep yourself clean without the help of oil? We use it in our water heaters, and even in the cleansing products we use. The truth is, if you're determined to have a hot shower from the tap, it's almost impossible to free yourself from oil completely. However, for the dedicated there are some options.

Bucket showers or sponge baths with water collected from rainwater storage can keep you clean and green. For those in cold climates, heating the water can be done through solar panel heaters. And for those worried about the chemicals/petroleum in the products they use, there are a range of all natural soaps that can be used on hair and body and come in a variety of green packaging.

For clothes, there's no better method than the bucket wash, along with drying clothes on a line. It is time consuming, and it's not nearly as convenient as a washing machine. However, it can cut gallons off water waste and save a tonne on electricity. Also just another small benefit: toned arms.

It is likely that your primary consumption of oil comes from your method of transportation. Even public transport, with few exceptions, uses petrol in their vehicles. So while mass transit is a good solution, it does not help one live an oil free life.

Enter the bicycle. Not only is it an efficient way to get around that millions around the world use daily, but it's environmentally friendly and a wonderful form of daily exercise. In countries such as Holland they are used daily by those in every strata of society. For difficult rides to formal workspaces, a change of clothes and wet washcloth can provide the level of professionalism necessary.

However, an even better option is to try to live near your place of work. Of course it's not always an option, but it's worth checking out. Not only is it a refreshing way to start your morning, but walking to work introduces you to local shops and cafes you might have otherwise passed by in your car.

When it comes to buying food with a low oil factor, it is imperative to buy local. Researching who produces the local cheeses, dairy, meats, vegetables and flours should be your number one goal. Of course what you buy will be influenced heavily by your diet, but eating with a low oil impact just means learning how to produce your own basics. It might sound hard, but most of our grandparents could cook bread from scratch, dehydrate their own meats and can their own produce, which are all skills that are worth knowing. It also means buying fresh produce and meats, and cutting down on plastic packaging (which is made with oil).

If you have room, starting a garden can be a great approach to sustaining your own food source. However, for those who live in apartments indoor vegetable and herb gardens are a great alternative. As an added bonus, learning how to preserve your own veggies can help you eat locally year round.

In terms of cooking, this can be a stretch. Whether you use gas or electricity you'll be using oil. However, you can cut this down considerably. Using pressure cookers can reduce cooking times by more than 60%. Also cooking large batches at once and using efficient equipment (such as glass instead of metal) can help reduce cooking times. For the very dedicated, solar cookers are available.

When it comes to electricity, the most obvious solution might be solar panels, for those who live in cities this is likely your best option. If you live in a rural area, it might be possible to use wind as well.

Keeping appliances unplugged when not in use, switching to energy efficient items and sizing down your appliances will also help. For instance, if you are single, you might not need a full size fridge.

If you use a computer, it is made with parts that require electricity and petroleum. Yet many companies including Apple, Dell and HP have come out with green computer models that use recycled parts that can later be recycled again after you upgrade to a new model. Also don't forget to ensure your computer uses power saving modes, like hibernate, when not in use (read: no screen savers).

If you are reading this, you realise it is impossible to not engage the petroleum sector at all. After all

GOOD NEWS:

The thousands of homeless pets in animal shelters could use all the earthly help they can get when it comes to finding loving new families — but a little divine support certainly doesn't hurt either.

In a special Catholic ceremony to mark the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of animals, dozens of unwanted and abandoned pets were invited to St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City to receive a blessing from Cardinal Timothy Dolan, the Archbishop of New York.

36 shelter dogs, cats and a lone rabbit, were on hand for the event. Along with them was a small crowd of dedicated animal caretakers from the Mayor's Alliance for New York City Animals and the Humane Society; they got a special mention in the blessing for the good work they do.

"Francis is the saint who reminded us that God's love is revealed through creation and creatures," Cardinal Dolan said. "We ask you to bless these pets and the people who rescue them and take care of them."

WELL DONE TO THE HEALTH WORKERS RISKING THEIR OWN LIVES IN FIGHT AGAINST EBOLA:

The world's most pervasive outbreak of Ebola remains at a critical level as the number of cases continues to grow. More than 2,200 deaths have now been reported in four countries, a number the World Health Organization (WHO) warns is likely to be grossly underestimated. WHO forecasts that reported cases could soar to 20.000 before the outbreak is contained.

Health workers on the front lines have borne the brunt of the crisis. More than 225 have contracted the virus and nearly 130 have died since the outbreak began in March. According to Ruwan Ratnayake, an epidemiologist with the International Rescue Committee (IRC) Medical staff don't currently have adequate changes of personal protection equipment and are handling patients with trash bags for gloves and wrapping bits of cloth around their face instead of using proper equipment.

In Liberia and Sierra Leone, the IRC is redoubling efforts to procure and distribute protective personal equipment for use at health facilities, training health workers on the proper protocols and procedures to prevent infection. These protective kits include masks, rubber boots, safety glasses, gloves, chlorine, scrub sets, aprons and coveralls. "Of all the emergencies going on in the world, this is the easiest one to contain," adds Srikanthan. Ebola only spreads through direct and substantial contact with the bodily fluids of someone carrying the disease. With the proper precautions, supplies and protocols, the virus generally is easier to contain than airborne diseases like influenza or tuberculosis. The supplies they need to contain the outbreak aren't expensive, but there just aren't enough available," says Srikanthan.

The IRC is supporting 41 health units in Lofa County, Liberia, and has reached 121 health units in Kenema District, Sierra Leone. They have trained more than 2,500 health care workers in both countries. In Monrovia, the capital of Liberia, they are leading a consortium of five humanitarian aid groups providing infection protection equipment and trainings at 240 clinics. In Sierra Leone, the IRC is coordinating efforts with other organizations and the local government to scale up infection protection and control activities in all 1,200 peripheral health units in Kenema.

KINDNESS CRUSADERS:

Farm animal sanctuaries do a lot of good for mistreated farm animals; they allow animals to have a second chance at a wonderful, rewarding life. Some farm animal sanctuaries take their well-meaning actions to another level and reach out to communities, allowing the joys that happy animals bring to reach far and wide. One sanctuary in particular has made a personal mission of bringing happiness and peace to nursing homes.

Edgar's Mission farm animal sanctuary, in Victoria, Australia, extends its compassion to humans in need. A few animals from the sanctuary travel around the country, bringing joy and companionship to the elderly at nursing homes. The animal group, appropriately named "kindness crusaders," makes the nursing home residents smile and laugh while gingerly taking food from their hands. The group is made up of a goat, Miss Chief; a chicken, Ginger Chicken and a sheep, Timmy.

The farm sanctuary takes the concept of 'therapy animals' to a whole new level. The

kindness crusade shows people, including the elderly, that any happy animal can bring joy and peace to a person's life. The animal does not have to be a dog or a cat to inspire hope; in fact, farm animals are a very fitting subject for hope for a more rewarding life.

35,000 WALRUSES INVADE ALASKA BEACH:

With Arctic sea ice coverage at its sixth lowest level recorded since 1978, Pacific walruses, dependent on ice surfaces for breeding and hunting, are coming ashore to find resting places.

Record numbers of the walruses—a estimated 35,000—were spotted on a beach in northwest Alaska 700 miles northwest of Anchorage, according to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA). The assessment was part of the agency's annual arctic marine mammal aerial survey.

Summer temperatures cause the edge of the sea ice to recede north. Mothers and newborn babies ride the sea ice north, depending on the shallow water of the Chukchi Sea for feeding. But when the ice recedes as much as it did this year, they find themselves in waters too deep for them to dive to the bottom to hunt.

When clustered so closely, young walruses are vulnerable to stampedes caused by hunters, polar bears or airplanes.

About 10,000 walruses have also come ashore at Cape Schmidt in Chukotka, Russia, reports RIA Novosti World Wildlife Fund (WWF) Russia "polar bear patrol" project leader Viktor Nikiforov. There the walruses have taken over the entire eastern shore of the cape and started to scramble up the cliffs.

"The massive concentration of walruses onshore—when they should be scattered broadly in ice-covered waters—is just one example of the impacts of climate change on the distribution of marine species in the Arctic, the sharp decline of Arctic sea ice over the last decade means major changes for wildlife and communities alike" said Margaret Williams, managing director of the Arctic program at the World Wildlife Fund (WFF).

BREAST CANCER WEEK 2

RISK FACTORS FOR BREAST CANCER

Although breast cancer can develop for no reason, there are certain risk factors which can increase the chance of cancer developing.

Increased age, a past or family history of breast cancer, increased alcohol consumption, periods starting at an early age and menopause at a late age all increase the risk of breast cancer. Taking HRT for many years in women over 50 can slightly increase the risk. About 1 in 20 cases of breast cancer are felt to be genetic in origin. If you feel that you have a significant family history of breast or ovarian cancer then discuss this with your GP who may refer you for genetic testing. Breast feeding your babies lowers the risk of breast cancer. Regular exercise and keeping your weight normal has also been shown to be protective against breast cancer.

WHAT SHOULD YOU LOOK OUT FOR?

As mentioned earlier your breast consistency and size may change from time to time so it is important to know what is normal for you. The usual first thing that is noted is a painless lump in the breast. It is important to know that most breast lumps are **NOT** cancer. Other symptoms which may be notes are changes is breast shape or size. Dimpling of the skin. Nipple changes including discharge may also indicate underlying breast disease. Painful breasts are normally not a sign of early cancer but should still be discussed with your GP. It is important when examining the breast to examine the armpits for lumps.

THE NEXT STEP?

Depending on your breast complaint your GP may refer you to a specialist centre for further evaluation. There is normally no charge for this specialist centre.

The specialist centre may organise a mammogram or another scan (Ultrasound or MRI) of the breast. If there is a lump present a biopsy may be taken. This is a small sample of tissue which can be further evaluated under a microscope.

If you are diagnosed with breast cancer it is important to establish the exact type of breast cancer and the extent of the spread. Awaiting the results of these tests is a very frustrating time for all involved. It is important to get things right at this stage in order to tailor the best treatment plan for you.
