THE great employment and training opportunities available in the tourism and hospitality sector in Kerry will be clearly outlined at a high-profile event in Killarney at the weekend.

KILLARNEY BACKS A WINNER With Extra Day

Killarney Races has backed a winner in its campaign to extend the racing season at the local track.

It has been confirmed that another day of top quality racing has been approved for 2018 and the flagship July festival is to be extended to a five-day event, commencing on Sunday, July 15.

Securing the additional day of racing had been one of the main priorities set by the new Chairman of Killarney Race Company, Gerard Coughlan, who has been anxious to build on the success of the existing four-day festival that had been attracting record attendances.

"We had been striving for a fifth day of racing in July and the fact that it has been approved is fantastic news for Killarney," Mr Coughlan remarked.

The newly appointed chairman said the races contribute enormously to Killarney's economy with the three festivals in May, July and August, as they stand already, ensuring 80 races over a total of 11 days which will now extend to 12.

"The conservative estimate is that the races are worth in the region of $\in 6.2$ million to Killarney with an additional $\in 1.42$ million in prizemoney and that is now set to increase with the extra day approved," Mr Coughlan said.

To cater for the increase in racing days, a new 54-unit stable barn, built at a cost of \in 350,000, was opened this year.

Killarney Races Company has also taken on an

international dimension in recent weeks with a twinning agreement reached with Bordeaux Racecourse in France. That partnership will see Killarney hosting a race to promote Bordeaux and the French track doing likewise for Killarney.

Gerard Coughlan and Race Company Secretary Con O'Mahony attended the recent meeting in Bordeaux to make the presentation to the winning connections at the close of the

Killarney Welcomes race.

Off the track it has been a hugely successful year for Killarney Race Company and premier events included the hosting of delegates to the TBEX conference for a night of entertainment and a major international Buddhist congress in the summertime.

SR ORLA TREACY RECEIVES O'FLAHERTY Humanitarian Award 2017

The 2017 Hugh O'Flaherty International Humanitarian Award was presented to Loreto Sr Orla Treacy by the Mayor of Killarney Cllr Niall Kelleher at a ceremony in Killarney on Saturday evening November 4th. This is the tenth year of this Award, established in 2008 to commemorate the humanitarian work of Killarney native Monsignor Hugh O'Flaherty, in Nazi occupied Rome during WW2.

Sr Orla is the Principal of a Loreto education and medical mission in Rumbek, South Sudan. In 2004, the Loreto Sisters in Ireland and worldwide started a new movement called 'Courage to Move.' It was an invitation for all Loreto Sisters in different countries to start a new mission, to re-engage with missionary spirit that was reflected in the early foundations, and to try to start a new mission in new countries. Shortly after she was professed as a Loreto Sister, Sr Orla responded to this call and in 2006 travelled to Sudan. In the face of abject poverty, civil war and the absolute oppression of women and in particular young girls, they succeeded in establishing schools and a basic medical centre in the area of Rumbek in central South Sudan.

In accepting the Award, Sr Orla told the large audience, "In 2011, South Sudan gained independence and it was hoped that matters would improve. Following a brief period of relative peace, conditions in South Sudan have returned to those applying pre-Independence and the Loreto Sisters continue to struggle to provide education and minimal medical care for those in their care".

She went on to describe the terrible circumstances facing young girls in South Sudan, with forced marriages while still in their teens, high mortality in childbirth and almost non-existent education, even at primary level. Concluding on a positive note, she added, "The Loreto sisters are committed to staying the

course and with the help of supporters in South Sudan and at home in Ireland, we will continue to do everything in our power to ensure that the young people of South Sudan will receive an education thus enabling them to climb out of poverty and oppression. The girls and young people we work with in South Sudan fill us with hope for a better future for this country".

In his opening comments, Chair of the Hugh O'Flaherty Memorial Society Jerry O'Grady reminded the audience of the words of Nelson Mandela, "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world".

When presenting the Humanitarian Award to Sr Orla, Killarney Mayor Cllr Niall Kelleher spoke of the uncertain future for South Sudan, "In a 2017 international assessment of 178 nations, South Sudan was considered to be the most fragile democracy and the most difficult nation in the world for girls to receive an education". "I appeal to everyone to support the work of the Loreto Sisters in whatever way they can to enable them to continue and further develop their tremendous humanitarian work in South Sudan".

A most welcome new addition to the O'Flaherty Award this year saw students from all the schools in the Killarney Parish present a Bursary to Sr Orla. The Schools Bursary Chairperson Colm O'Suilleabhain said, "This initiative was enthusiastically supported by the students and teachers of the eleven schools in Killarney and they were delighted to be associated with the project".

Sr Orla was accompanied at the Ceremony by her father Blaise Treacy, her brothers and extended family members, friends from her hometown of Bray and some of her Loreto colleagues.

KERRY PLANS TO BUILD ON SUCCESS OF Berlin Trip

A 35 strong group led by Minister Brendan Griffin TD and Mayor of Kerry, Cllr John Sheahan enjoyed a three-day Kerry tourism promotional visit to Berlin last weekend.

The group held a series of engagements with tourism trade, media and consumer groups. They also held a high level political meeting with State President Mr Ralf Wieland in the Berlin Parliament to promote closer economic ties between Kerry, Berlin and the State of Brandenburg.

The visit was in support of the new direct Ryanair flight from Berlin to Kerry and was organised by Kerry County Council, Destination Kerry and Kerry Airport and supported by Tourism Ireland, Fáilte Ireland and the Irish Embassy in Berlin. Trade representatives from all over Kerry formed part of the delegation.

The main events were hosted by the Irish Ambassador, Mr Michael Collins, at the Irish Embassy.There were presentations to the group by Tourism Ireland's Head of Europe Finola O'Mahony and Manager (Central Europe), Zoe Redmond. Over 70 Berlin trade and media attended the Kerry Tourism Showcase event at the embassy where Ambassador Collins, Minister Griffin and Mayor Sheahan spoke and there were presentations by Angela McAllen and John Griffin of Kerry County Council and Conor Hennigan of Kerry Airport.

Minister Griffin, who spoke in German and English, stressed the popularity of Kerry as a holiday destination for German visitors with over 250,000 now visiting the county each year, the most to any Irish county. Currently, these visitors come mainly from northern, central and southern Germany. The potential for growth from eastern Germany is now considerable, he said, with the opening up of the new direct route to Kerry.

'Berlin is a largely new tourism market, from a Kerry perspective,' according to Mayor John

Sheahan. 'There are 3.5 million people living in the greater Berlin area and we wanted to present Kerry as an attractive holiday option to them.' In his speech the mayor pointed out that the flight time from Berlin to Kerry of 2.5 hours is less than it takes to drive from Kerry to Dublin. There was laughter when he said that you also gain an hour when flying west from Germany to Ireland.

The group also participated in consumer promotions at the Irish Embassy and at the Ring Shopping Centre. There was strong interest in English language learning, outdoor pursuits and coastal and cultural activities. "As Berlin is five hours from the sea, coastal destinations and the Wild Atlantic Way have a particular appeal to them" according to Caroline Boland from Dingle Peninsula Tourism Alliance. 'The challenge now is to build on this success,' according to Brendan Tuohy, Chairman of Destination, 'and continue the momentum through further promotions and engagements. To coincide with the Berlin promotion Ryanair announced a special seat sale for January on the route for €12.99 to be booked by midnight, 15 November next.

Health Matters... With Dr. Lynda O Gallaghan

Long Term Reversible Contraceptives (LARC)

LARC is fast becoming one of the most popular methods of contraception regardless of your age due to reliability and reversibility. When compared to standard methods of contraception (Pill/Condoms/Patch /Ring) LARC show superior efficacy with lower failure rates. This is not only due to less user error (ie forgetting to take your pill) but also due to better long term control. The initial cost is greater than the other methods but they become more cost effective with time and over the course of 3-5 years is cheaper than all non LARC methods. Most are readily available at your own doctor's surgery.

Intra- Uterine Systems (IUS)

The first of its kind was the Mirena, but now 3 exist in this category. These are small plastic t- shaped devices that emit a small amount of progesterone daily in the uterine cavity (womb) and prevent implantation. It does not alter your own hormones so while many people will have a much lighter period or none at all, the dose of progesterone is not adequate to interfere with ovulation so the risk of hormonal side effects is much less than with the Pill.

Mirena- lasts for 5 years. This is suitable for any woman who is at least 16 weeks after a normal vaginal delivery and no longer breastfeeding. It can also be used in women who have had a caesarean section or sometimes in women who have never been pregnant but it can be more difficult to insert in these cases. The Mirena is one of the most effective treatments for heavy painful periods irrespective of any need for contraception. 50-65% of women will <code>/</code> experience no bleeding at all 6 months post insertion.

Jaydess- this is the smaller than Mirena and last for 3 years. It will lighten periods but usually they do not disappear entirely due to the much lower dose of progesterone. It is designed to be used in women who have never had a pregnancy and wish to avail of IUS.

Kyleena-This is the newest to the range, similar in size to Jaydess but with a higher dose of progesterone and lasts for 5 years. It may be suitable for women who have never had a pregnancy or in women who have but where the Mirena cannot be inserted. It does not lighten heavy bleeding as effectively as the Mirena however.

All these are immediately reversible. They can be removed at any time and return to fertility is rapid. While you have an IUS you continue to ovulate (unlike the Pill that stops ovulation) so conception may occur promptly after removal.

Common side effects include nuisance break through bleeding (especially common in the 6 weeks post insertion), breast tenderness, mild acne (particularly jaw line) and some short lived bloating and cramping after insertion.

Significant complications are very rare. Failure is much less than the pill but if a pregnancy were to occur there is a 1 in 20 chance it will be ectopic. Perforation where the IUS moves outside the womb and into the pelvis or abdomen is a very rare but serious complication and ultimately may require keyhole surgery to resolve and remove the device.

Copper Coils

These remain an effective method of contraception and are entirely hormone free. The disadvantage is copper causes irritation to lining of the uterus and so , makes periods more painful and heavier.

Implanon

The Implanon is a very slim rod approximately 1.5" long (like a matchstick) that is easily inserted into your arm at the beginning of your cycle. It works immediately and lasts for 3 years. It is extremely effective and is only surpassed by surgical methods of contraception (Tubal ligation and vasectomy). It works by inhibiting ovulation and again many women may experience no bleeding while it is in. There is no limit to the number you can have and it can be exchanged for a new one easily after 3 years. Unfortunately it can cause the kind of hormonal side effects people associate with the Pill, including mood changes, acne, libido, abnormal bleeding. It is easily removed at any time and the hormone is rapidly eliminated from your body within days. It can take several weeks for a regular cycle to re- establish however.

KILLARNEY HOTELIERS REACT TO WORLD Rugby Technical Report

Killarney's hoteliers have expressed their annoyance at the recent report made by World Rugby's Technical Review group, specifically in relation to the comments made about the town's size and its inexperience at hosting large scale events.

Speaking in reaction to the report, Patrick O'Donoghue, Chairman of the Kerry Branch of the Irish Hotels Federation said, "While Killarney's population is smaller than other proposed host cities, the town has a disproportionately high number of hotels and guesthouses. Also, contrary to the report, Killarney has hosted the Irish Open four times." Killarney currently has in excess of 2,500 hotel rooms and has the highest concentration of four and five star hotels in Ireland. There are over 5,200 hotel rooms in Kerry, with many of these located in Killarney's neighbouring towns of Tralee, Kenmare and Dingle. These figures do not take into account the number of guesthouses, B&Bs, hostels and self-catering accommodation in the county.

The 2010 Irish Open welcomed an attendance of 85,179 over the four days while in 2011 the tally of attendees for the international gold tournament exceeded 86,500. While not an international event, the Kerry town also hosts the Munster Football Final on a regular basis with attendance figures, for the highly anticipated Cork and Kerry clashes, averaging just under 40,000 people.

"Killarney is accustomed to punching above its weight, and anyone that has attending a largescale sporting event, concert or conference here will testify to that. The atmosphere, safety and professionalism of everyone involved is always second to none," added Mr O'Donoghue.

ALL THINGS SCIENCE NEXT WEEK AT THE MUSEUM

The ancient secrets of Killaclohane Portal Tomb will be revealed using 21st century science next week as part of Science Week at the Kerry County Museum. The Tomb in the Lab is a series of discussions, demonstrations and displays taking place during Science Week Ireland.

All events are based on Killaclohane Portal Tomb near Milltown, Kerry's oldest known man-made structure dating to about 3800 BC. The Neolithic tomb underwent a major excavation and restoration programme in 2015 and the artefacts found have been the subject of intensive scientific scrutiny. The techniques used in these tests and the results are showcased for the first time during Science Week, which runs from 12th to 19th November. The event is funded by the Heritage Council and Creative Ireland and supported by Kerry County Council.

Over four days speakers and facilitators will showcase what archaeological science can tell us about our ancestors based on finds from Killaclohane. County archaeologist Dr Michael Connolly will outline the dig, describing tools

and techniques used. Osteo-archaeologist Dr Linda Lynch will discuss what extraordinary information can be gleaned from a handful of cremated bone found at the dig. US based visiting researcher Kendra Sirak will showcase the ability to extract, sequence and analyse ancient DNA. Ceramicist Lone Beiter O'Reilly will demonstrate how pottery was made thousands of years ago for the purpose of holding the cremated remains of our ancestors buried at Killaclohane.

BEAUFORT GAA CLUB RECEIVES NATIONAL RECOGNITION AT CROKE PARK

Representatives from Beaufort GAA Club attended a special ceremony with governmental representation in Croke Park on Saturday last. The event saw 58 GAA clubs recognised as the first official 'Healthy Clubs' on the island of Ireland.

Thirteen Munster GAA clubs, including Beaufort and Tralee Parnells in Kerry, can now proudly fly a flag above their grounds (endorsed by both Healthy Ireland and the Public Health Agency in NI), letting their members and communities know that they value health and wellbeing as much as leagues and championships.

In January 2016, almost 100 clubs applied to participate in Phase 2 of the project (just 16 participated in Phase 1 between 2013-2015). Many cited the dearth of services in their communities that are tackling issues such as obesity, sedentary lifestyles, mental health and suicide. They wanted to be part of the solution. Clubs engage with their members and community before identifying health themes upon which to focus on. Most common include healthy eating; physical activity for non-playing members; emotional wellbeing; engaging older members of the community; youth development; gambling, drug, and alcohol education; and inclusion and integration. Almost half of the clubs (29) also opted to become completely smoke-free venues as part of their 18-month journey.

Progressive GAA club, Beaufort and Tralee Parnells are the first clubs in Kerry to receive national recognition.

Beaufort GAA Club's various health and wellbeing initiatives have had a tremendous impact on their clubs and wider communities.

"Ring of the Reeks Leisure Cycle" in Beaufort GAA Club is now becoming an annual social event with up to 300 people participating. The cycle covers a section of Ireland's highest mountains, the McGillycuddy Reeks and is aimed at community members with various levels of fitness; beginner (30km), intermediate (65km) and advanced (110km). The initiative has not only encouraged people to get physically active, but has also encouraged plenty of social interaction between the cyclists, fostering a great sense of community spirit around the local area.

The innovative Healthy Club model was developed in partnership with Healthy Ireland, the HSE's health promotion division, the National Office for Suicide Prevention, and is supported by Irish Life through a CSR investment. In an era of unprecedented societal health challenges, the Healthy Club Project aims to harness the potential of the GAA club setting to deliver evidence-based health promotion information and interventions, backed up by appropriate policies and partnerships. Its potential to be replicated by other sports is currently being explored by a working group involving the FAI, IRFU, and Athletics Ireland. There are numerous benefits to clubs that take part in the GAA HCP including exclusive access to Healthy Club resources and support.

The GAA hope to extend the project to 150 clubs in Phase 3 (with expressions of interest to open in early 2018) before opening the project to all interested clubs in 2020. There are 1,600 clubs in Ireland and over 400 abroad.

HAPPINESS IN THE WORKPLACE

For many of us a great deal of our day is spent in the work place – or thinking about work, therefore it makes sense that we would aim to make our working lives a happy and pleasant experience. However, when faced with various frustrating challenges at work our stress levels can increase and lead to anything from burnout to boredom to distraction. Whilst some levels of stress at work are normal, excessive stress can interfere with productivity as well as our physical and emotional wellbeing.

In her book Real Happiness at Work, Sharon Salzberg discusses eight pillars of happiness in the workplace. These include balance; concentration; compassion; resilience; communication and connection; integrity; meaning; and open awareness. Throughout the book she presents formal meditations along with mini meditations and practices for the reader to try out. These exercises are simple, small and practical ways in which we can achieve greater calm and satisfaction.

The following includes some of the advice she gives us to have a more peaceful and happier day at work.

1. Before starting a project, meeting or even a conversation, ask yourself: "What do I most want to see happen from this?"

2. Before starting your day, set an intention. She gives the following example: "May I treat everyone today with respect, remembering each person wants to be happy as much as I do."

3. Try to perform a simple act of kindness every day. The following are such examples: "holding a door, saying thank you in a sincere manner, or listening to someone with a clear and focused mind." 4. Pay attention to your feelings. For example, if you're feeling irritated toward a co-worker, pay attention to your irritation, "not so much the story of why you're irritated, but the actual feeling of it." What does it feel like in your body? Where do you feel it? Identifying irritation as it starts helps you prevent an action you might later regret. "With a more immediate recognition of what we're feeling, we have a choice as to how we want to respond in that moment."

5. Think about the people who make your job possible, such as a housekeeper, caretaker or fundraiser – and thank them.

These are just some simple measure we can take to generate more happiness in the workplace. Over the next few weeks we will take a closer look at Stress, Workplace Stress and how we can manage it in our lives.

RENTING OUT A ROOM IN YOUR HOME

If you rent out a room (or rooms) in your home to private tenants, the rental income you earn will be exempt from income tax, provided this income does not exceed a certain limit in a tax year. This is called the rent-a-room relief. A self-contained unit, such as a basement flat or a converted garage attached to your home, can gualify for this relief.

The relief applies only to residential tenancies, not to short-term guest arrangements.

The total (gross) rent that you get, which includes sums that the tenant pays for food, utilities, laundry or similar goods and services, cannot exceed €14,000 in the tax year (1 January to 31 December)

You cannot deduct expenses from your rental income while claiming rent-a-room relief.

If you qualify for rent-a-room relief, the income you get from renting out the room is not liable to PRSI, the Universal Social Charge or income tax. However, it must be included on your annual income tax return.

Rent-a-room relief will not affect your mortgage interest relief or your exemption from Capital Gains Tax (CGT) if you sell your home.

GARDENING **UTLOOK**

FOCUS ON NOVEMBER GARDENING

Now that November is here, it is a great time of the year for planting bare rooted trees, hedging, fruit bushes, roses and rootballed conifers.

The bare rooted planting seasons lasts from November until March. The reason for this is that the trees and hedging are dormant at this time of the year, so you can't really do any damage when you are lifting or planting.

When planting bare rooted as a general rule, plant about three plants per metre, roses can also be purchased and planted bare rooted as can fruit trees and fruit bushes.

The main thing when planting bare rooted trees and hedging is that when you purchase them and if you are not going to plant them straight away you will have to heel them into the ground; by this, I mean you will just have to dig a hole and put the plants in and cover the roots with earth to stop the roots drying out.

With hedging plants, roses and fruit bushes, they will usually come in bundles and will be tied together, so you don't have to separate them, just put the whole bundle in the ground.

This is an ideal chance for anyone with an interest in progressing to County Board level as there is a diverse range of posts becoming vacant ranging from Cultural, to Financial to Administrative to Public Relations. All of those current officers whose 5 year term is up can of course also be nominated for other officer posts other than the one they vacated should they so wish.

Nominations and Motions for County Convention have to be returned to the county secretary no later than 5pm on Friday 10th November. All of those nominated will have until 5pm Monday 13th November to confirm if they wish to contest positions or not.

Motions re internal Competitions will be dealt with at the November Meeting of County Committee which has been put back by a week to November 27th to allow clubs additional time to formulate motions. These motions re internal fixtures and competitions for 2018 have a new deadline for their return which is now Friday 17th November at 5pm.

The Club Fixtures Forum provided a great opportunity to ensure that the views of those most affected by fixtures can be taken on board and where necessary be formulated into motions for the November meeting of the County Committee.

in the county present. Some good positive discussions took place with a lot of positive ideas being bandied about. HELP BACK GARDEN ANIMALS PREPARE FOR WINTER

The beginning of Winter is a busy season for animals who are preparing their homes and food stores for the cold months ahead and it's a good time to get your feeding stations ready. Remember, birds and other small animals need food and fresh drinking water, especially in colder months.

Wash and disinfect existing bird feeders and bird baths. Check them for damage, and repair or replace as needed. Plastic, metal and wooden feeders should be cleaned a minimum of once per month, more if the stations are used frequently. If you decide to provide food, please keep the feeder full since many birds will come to rely on it as a regular place to visit and eat.

It's a good idea to put one source of water high up for birds and climbing animals and another lower on the ground for non-climbers like rabbits. If you don't have a birdbath, use a small dish of water or make your own.

Help animals find shelter by making piles of branches and brush in an out-of-the-way corner of the garden for small animals like birds, hedgehogs, and insects to take cover. Birdhouses and bat boxes can also provide much-needed shelter from the elements.

CHILD LABOUR RATES CUT BY ALMOST HALF

According to new data from the International Labour Organisation, child slavery has dropped from 250 million in 2000 to 152 million in 2016 – roughly a 40% decline. The number of children working in hazardous sections dropped by half, and rates also declined across all child labour sectors, including agriculture, industry, factory, and trafficking.

Of the 135 countries that were surveyed on their child labour rates, 61% showed "moderate" to "significant" advancement. The regions that showed the most improvement was Northern Africa with 75% showing improvement, and Brazil, which showed 69% improvement.

The report was created in collaboration with Alliance 8.7, a global partnership dedicated to taking "immediate and effective measures to eradicate forced labour, end modern slavery and human trafficking and secure the prohibition and elimination of the worst forms of child labour, including recruitment and use of child soldiers, and by 2025 end child labour in all its forms".

The organisation states that the decline in child slavery and trafficking is largely credited to countries adopting firmer legislation against child labour, providing adequate funding for enforcement, and encouraging more efficient labour inspections.

WOMAN WINS RIGHT TO USE FAMILY SICK LEAVE TO CARE FOR DOG

An Italian woman has just won a revolutionary court case after stating that she wanted to be given two days of family sick pay while she cared for her dog after surgery.

The woman, who is an academic at Rome's La Sapienza University, was assisted by lawyers from Italy's Anti-Vivisection League (LAV).

Lawyers cited the country's legislation which states that anyone who abandons a pet to

"grave suffering" can be punished by a \in 10,000 and one year in prison. The woman argued that she should be allotted her sick pay for taking care of her 12-year-old English Setter.

The Court then agreed that the University could list the absence as being caused by "serious or family personal reasons" because animals count as family members.

"It is a significant step forward that recognised that animals that are not kept for financial gain or their working ability are effectively members of the family," Gianluca Felicetti, president of LAV, said. "Now, those in the same situation will be able to cite this important precedent." THIS MAN IS A HERO

As wildfires blazed through the state of California recently, thousands of people were forced to evacuate to safety, but the flames weren't only threatening people. Thousands of animals were in danger as well, especially those living in zoos and wildlife preserves.

At the Safari West Park and animal preserve in Santa Rosa, California, all employees were told to evacuate immediately as fires sped toward them.

Every single person left - except the 77-year-old owner and founder of the park, Peter Lang.

Peter refused to leave the animals alone and in danger. As the wildfire closed in on all sides, Peter worked tirelessly and single handedly to keep the animals safe.

With no other options, he used regular garden hoses to keep the threatening flames back.

He believed he was responsible for "a thousand souls," and thanks to his hard work and dedication, every animal was preserved and remains safe today.

Sadly, Peter and his wife lost their home and many vehicles in the fire, but they know they are not alone, with dozens of other families facing the same challenges.

A VICTORY FOR MARINE CONSERVATION WORLDWIDE

Chile has announced the establishment of two new national marine parks that will protect roughly 240,000 square miles of ocean from commercial fishing and dangerous human activity and the small South Pacific island nation of Niue converted 40% of its exclusive economic waters into a protected marine park. Exclusive economic zones are oceanic areas in which the country can claim exclusive rights for fishing, drilling, and other economic activities, the Niue parks will provide protection to an impressive 49,000 square miles of ocean.

The total of both marine park additions is a whopping 340,000 square miles of protected ocean – which is roughly twice the size of Germany.

Chile's new marine park alone has become the largest oceanic reserve of its kind in South America and is home to seals, sea lions, albatrosses, penguins, petrels, and whales. The Nieu reserves will protect the world's largest population of reef sharks in the world.

"Jack has autism and Ruby has such complex needs it would take me all day to explain them. Lily is profoundly deaf and Joseph has Down Syndrome" he said and added "that although being a single father is challenging, it's also the best thing in the world".

"People have called me a saint and say what I do is remarkable but I just wanted to be a dad and adopting is my way of becoming a dad," he said.

When he's not looking after the children which is pretty much all the time Ben finds time to educate other prospective adopters and sits on a local adoption panel.

"I celebrate and promote adoption. It's the most rewarding, satisfying and challenging thing I have done. I am not going to sugarcoat it because it's not for the faint-hearted. You have to be 100% committed. If you are considering adopting, make sure you have childcare experience. If you are not already a parent make sure that it's right for you" is his advice.

Mr. Carpenter had worked with children and adults with complex needs and knew adopting children with additional needs was right for him but that it is not for everybody.

The now 33 year old who doesn't believe biological children are the "be all and end all", is father to Jack, 10, Ruby, 7, Lily, 5, and Joseph, 2. Is it any wonder Mr. Carpenter has been labelled "Britain's Most Inspiring Single Dad"?

PRISONERS IN TEXAS POOLED FUNDS TO **DONATE \$53,000 FOR HURRICANE HARVEY** RFLIFF

Commissary funds are small allowances that are given to prisoners in the US for them to buy hygiene products and toiletries in jail and convicts from several jails and rehabilitation centres across Texas collectively donated \$53,000 of these commissary funds to the American Red Cross for Hurricane Harvey relief. Texas Department of Criminal Justice spokesman Jason Clark said that the average prisoner donated roughly \$8 to hurricane relief. Other inmates donated hundreds of dollars.

Regardless of the amount, however, choosing to donate a portion of their meagre allowances was no small gesture for the inmates - and yet they still wanted to do it anyway.

"They were requesting to donate money," Mr. Clark said. "It's just something they chose to do." **CATS MAKE YOU FEEL BETTER**

*Caring for your cat and having a cat to cuddle with can reduce emotions such as anxiety. loneliness, depression, or even frustration and adopting a cat from a shelter can provide a feel good buzz for saving an animal in need.

*There is also a sense of connection that is unconditional, attachment provides a purpose for someone who may be feeling depressed and even suicidal; 'who will take care of my cat?' is a guestion many ask before they do or act on something that could be fatal. Cats are little healers.

*Cats are perfect companions for those who live where dog-friendly spaces are few and far between. If hours at work are longer, the cat will be fine in the home and still be happy to greet his owners when they arrive. For the couch potatoes, it is easy to play with a cat while sitting if you have a pull toy or piece of twine to let the cat chase.

*To pick up your cat, place one hand behind the front legs and another under the hindguarters. Lift gently. Never pick up a cat by the scruff of the neck or by the front legs.

*All indoor cats need a litter box, which should be placed in a quiet, accessible location. In a multi-level home, one box per floor is recommended. Avoid moving the box unless absolutely necessary, but if you must do so, move the box just a few inches per day. Keep in mind that cats won't use a messy, smelly litter box, so scoop solid wastes out of the box at least once a day. Dump everything, wash with a mild detergent and refill at least once a week; you can do this less frequently if using clumping litter. Don't use ammonia, deodorants or scents, especially lemon, when cleaning the litter box.

*Cats need to scratch! When a cat scratches, the old outer nail sheath is pulled off and the sharp, smooth claws underneath are exposed. Provide your cat with a sturdy scratching post, at least three feet high. The post should also be stable enough that it won't wobble during use, and should be covered with rough material.



*Your cat should see the veterinarian at least once a year for an examination and annual vaccination, and immediately if she is sick or injured.

MAN WHO HELPED RESCUE KIDNAPPED **GIRL GAVE HER HIS \$7,000 REWARD**

Earl Melchert first saw 15-year-old Jasmine Block when he returned to his home in Alexandria, Minnesota in order to retrieve a diesel can that he had forgotten to grab earlier that day.

The teenager had only just escaped from a nearby abandoned house after her kidnappers had gone out to eat. After knocking on the doors of several neighbouring homes without any luck, Jasmine swam across a lake and was walking across Mr. Melchert's field when he spotted her.

Mr. Melchert brought Jasmine back to his home where they called the police and organised the arrest of her kidnappers.

Ever since jasmine first disappeared, law enforcement officials had been offering \$7,000 for any information on her whereabouts. When they handed Mr. Melchert the check for the reward he immediately gave it to Jasmine.

"Today we witnessed an incredible example of kindness," said Alexandria Police Chief Rick Wyffels. "Earl Melchert, the man who made the call everyone was waiting for ... was presented with the reward money that had been offered by the Sarah Block family and an anonymous source." What no one expected was the kindness and generosity that came straight from Earl's heart today. He believes that young lady that came running towards him that September day is the real hero and without hesitation, Earl handed the reward over to her, followed by a big hug."

"The family needs the money," Mr. Melchert explained. "To me, yeah, that's a lot of money, but they need it way worse than I do."

A PUBLIC TOILET IN A CEMETERY SEEMS A

BRILLIANT IDEA

A Portuguese graveyard just got a new public toilet designed by the local architects, the structure, also has an office for the cemetery's support staff.

The green tile that lines the whole facade and roof is meant to help it blend more naturally into its surroundings, including both the cemetery and the church associated with it.

Everything about the boxy, geometric design is made to feel like an extension of the rest of the property. The floors are made with the same Portuguese pavement that the sidewalks around it are so that it barely feels like a closed building at all. The marble sinks are designed to mirror the gravestones outside, and the whole building is lit by skylights. There is no exterior door to the room that houses the men's and women's toilets. Instead, people walk into an open, cutout entranceway at the corner of the building that maintains the structure's unique geometric design.

30 year old Young had been issued with the order in February after the pair split up, the court heard.

Judge Loo said: "It's so childish to think a grown man can be so thumb-happy. I don't know whether I should cut off your fingers or take away your phone to get you to stop texting. You probably shouldn't get a phone, period. I hope she changed her number."

Mr Young pleaded no contest to 16 counts of violating the existing order having already spent 157 days in jail. He was ordered to pay \$2,400 (€2058 approx.) in fines and sentenced to 200 hours of community service and was allowed 144 days to write all the compliments for his ex-girlfriend.
