The Irish Business Against Litter (IBAL) awards were presented last week by Minister for Communications, Climate Action and Environment Richard Bruton, with Killarney coming third in the cleanest town category. The overall winner was Fermoy, Co Cork and second place went to Athlone, Co Westmeath. An Taisce surveyed 40 towns and city areas on behalf of IBAL, with 90% of towns surveyed deemed to be as clean as the European average.

Cathaoirleach of Killarney Municipal District Cllr John Sheehan said "It's particularly pleasing given the visitor numbers we've seen this year in the town, that the town came out so high in the national standings. We cannot be complacent though litter and dumping is an ongoing battle that we have to keep

fighting" There is a great working relationship in Killarney between the Municipal District, Tidy Towns and the business community who all contribute to Killarney Looking Good.

Eileen O'Donoghue, Killarney Municipal District Council Officer congratulated all those involved in achieving such high standards. She said 'there is a great sense of cooperation in Killarney and it is this working together that has resulted in the town achieving such a good result. I would like to acknowledge the dedication of the Tidy Towns volunteers for their ongoing commitment to the town. This active citizenship makes such a positive impact on the town. I would also like to recognise and acknowledge our own street cleaning staff in the Municipal District for their continued good work.

These efforts not only visually enhance tne town, but they also provide us with the knowledge and experience of what can be achieved when people work together in partnership towards a shared goal. Ní neart go cur le chéile - we are stronger when we work together. Judges deemed Killarney cleaner than European norms and were very impressed overall by what they described as 'one of the country's busiest tourist attractions'. Special mention went to the recycle facility at New Street Carpark ,they said the standard here was excellent which is rare for such facilities in general. Main Street was commended for overall presentation such as paving, seating, bollards, as well as lack of litter. The same applied to the jarvey park - which they said 'was a very attractively presented and maintained environment.' They also pointed out the fact that some of the bins in Killarney provide the opportunity for dry recycling and this is a very welcome feature. The approach Road from Cork achieved a Grade A for overall presentation with a virtual absence of litter throughout. The Park Road Commercial Park also achieved a Grade A. Beech Road also achieved a Grade A where judges stating that 'The overall presentation of Beech Road was very good with paving, bollards, trees, etc, all in very good condition. The litter bins provide the opportunity for dry recycling. It was excellent with regard to litter.' There were a number of areas that received fantastic marks however litter on the approach road from Killorglin to Killarney, the N22 Killarney-Tralee connecting road and New Road where the judges spotted a number of food-related items of litter which brought the grade down. Overall Killarney was said to be a very well managed and respected environment with adjudicators said it was an outstanding performance by one of the country's busiest tourist attractions As runnersup, Killarney will receive a number of Norway maple trees to enhance the local environment, courtesy of the Irish Tree Centre in Cork.

Popular walks to benefit from funding

Cardiac Steps and the walk to Dinis are among some of the popular walks in Killarney to benefit from the Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme.

Mayor of Killarney, Cllr John Sheahan was delighted to welcome the news this week following the announcement of a number of grants by the Department of Rural and Community Development under the Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme. €160,000 has been announced for improvements to parking access at a number of the trails

on the Kenmare road. These include some of the most popular walks in killarney at Dinis and Cardiac steps. This application was submitted in association with the NPWS.

This announcement is particularly welcome given the huge numbers we have seen out and active over the Christmas period.

There is significantly more investment needed at these locations but this is a great start to the year.

Killarney Economic Conference Annual dialogue between economic, civic and political leaders from Britain and Ireland

Former Taoiseach Bertie Ahern to share thoughts on Brexit

It is 12 months since DUP leader, Arlene Foster, made the symbolic and conciliatory gesture of addressing the inaugural Killarney Economic Conference but one year on, the Irish border backstop remains the key issue in the Brexit withdrawal process.

The second Killarney Economic Conference has been confirmed for The Brehon/INEC complex on January 17/18 next and, once again, it will concentrate on Brexit. This highly anticipated gathering of economic, civic and political leaders, from Britain and Ireland, is aptly timed with the UK parliament poised to vote on Theresa May's withdrawal deal that same week. The outcome, impact and implications of that vote will be discussed by the expert panel of speakers, drawn from business, academia and politics.

Specific topics for discussion include an exploration of the legal issues raised by Brexit, building a collaborative and open political future, the challenges posed to businesses and

how to respond and the regulatory fall-out in banking and finance.

"Our conference this year takes place in a critical and historic week and there is still so much uncertainty," said conference organiser and historian Dr William Sheehan.

"Our goal is to bring some light to the way ahead for businesses and organisations and, given the calibre of our speakers, I know we will do that."

The list of speakers for the Killarney Economic Conference 2019 includes Bertie Ahern, former Taoiseach; Mark Kennedy, Mazars; Ed Sibley, Central Bank; Mícheál Ó hÉanaigh, Údarás na Gaeltachta; Ruth McCarthy, Fexco Corporate Payments; Moira Murrell, Kerry County Council; Dr. Mary C. Murphy, University College Cork; Prof. Brigid Laffan, European University Institute; Henry Newman, Open Europe; Dr. Edward Burke, University of Nottingham; Mark Hennessy, The Irish Times; Doug Beattie, Ulster Unionist Party; Lucinda Creighton,

Vulcan Consulting; Dr. Simon Kingston, British Irish Association; Peter Bellew, COO, Ryanair; Dr. Orla Flynn, Cork Institute of Technology; Michael Russell MSP, Scottish Government and Micheál Martin, Leader, Fianna Fáil.

The conference will begin at lunchtime on Thursday, January 17 with a half-day forum followed by dinner that evening. On Friday, January 18 the debates and discussions continue for a full day conference. All events take place in The Brehon/INEC complex in Killarnev.

Dr Crokes' unveil the John F Moynihan Memorial Stand

Amotion at last year's Dr. Crokes AGM to dedicate the stand in Lewis Road to the memory of John Moynihan RIP was passed unanimously and on Sunday 23 December, Dr Crokes did just that. Along with John's daughter, Geraldine, Club Chairman, Patrick O'Sullivan unveiled the naming of the John F Moynihan Memorial Stand.

It was preceded by a short ceremony, officiated by Canon Tom Looney and Fr. Paddy O'Donoghue, with a gathering of Club members also in attendance. It is a fitting tribute to a man, whose dedication, hard work and love of Dr Crokes ensured the Club's survival during the most difficult period of its existence.

John was elected to the position of Club

Secretary in the early 1940s.

Unlike today, Dr Crokes were not a force in the County or indeed East Kerry. In fact, a win of any kind was hard to come by. If it was not for John Moynihan and his dedication, persistence and leadership, many think that the Dr Crokes Club would have faded out of existence. Communications was a more laborious task in the 1940s and with no email or texts and few telephones, this meant letter-writing and personal calls to various addresses around Killarney, in order to get the weekend's team organised.

It was difficult enough to get 15 players together, but then many players did not possess football boots and John called on his contacts in St Brendan's Seminary to acquire appropriate footware for those lacking same.

It appears that John was the "go to" man during these lean years. But his enthusiasm and optimism paid off with an East Kerry Junior Championship in 1944. John also served as Secretary to the Fitzgerald Stadium Committee during this period.

A career move to Tralee in 1949 did not dilute John's interest in Dr Crokes and he travelled back to Killarney on a weekly basis to keep abreast of affairs and to offer advice.

In more recent times, John was appointed Club President, a position he held until his passing on St. Stephens Day 2017.

Two Club occasions that John relished above all were the two All-Ireland Club Championships in 1992 and 2017.

The naming of the John F Moynihan Memorial Stand is a small acknowledgement to a tremendous servant to Dr Crokes. Ní bheidh a leithéad ann arís.

Beaufort Film Night returns for another screening which will take place at The Inn Between Bar, Beaufort, on Friday 18th January at 8.30pm.



Untouchable centres on the uplifting and unmissable story of unemployed African immigrant, Driss, who applies for a live-in carer job to get a signature to continue his social welfare payments. He unexpectedly gets the job and so begins a hilarious and heartwarming friendship with his new employer, wheelchair-bound millionaire Philippe. This is the biggest-grossing non-English language film of all time and is the perfect antidote to the dreary month of January. The French title of the film is "Intouchables". The film is in French subtitles. The night's short film, Wave, based on a man who wakes from a coma speaking a fully

unrecognisable language. Wave was winner of the Best Irish Short at the OFFline Film festival and won the IFTA for Best Live Action Short. Wave was longlisted in the Live Action Short Film category at the 90th Academy Awards while Wave's Director, Benjamin Cleary, won the Best Live Action Short Oscar at the 88th Academy Awards for Stutterer.

Beaufort Film Night is a non-profit community organisation founded by local film enthusiasts whose aim is to screen cultural English language and international language films. fostering an interest in and appreciation of these category of films, films which normally don't get a general release screening in Kerry. Films screened at Beaufort Film Night will be carefully curated in order to appeal to a general audience. 

WHEN CAN YOU ACCESS YOUR PENSION & WHAT ARE YOUR OPTIONS WHEN YOU WANT TO RETIRE?

Many pensions can be accessed from age 60, a lot of the rules depend on whether you are an employee or self employed. If you are coming close to retirement you are probably wondering what options you have when you want to get access to your pension. It depends on what type of pension you have but generally there



This is in line with all public libraries

This is in line with all public libraries nationally and is one of the key aims of the new public library strategy Our Public Library 2022: inspiring, connecting and empowering communities which was launched by the Minister for Rural and Community Development, Michael Ring T.D. in June 2018. The strategy states 'The library is a free lifelong resource that should be available to all without barriers or charges. Library charges have been shown to have a detrimental effect on library use by children and the disadvantaged. However, there is little evidence to show they ensure timely returns - rather they may actually dissuade members and users from returning overdue

However, no fines does not mean no responsibility. Library borrowers will continue to receive reminders and overdue emails to prompt them to return items to the library. Items should be returned as normal on or before their due date to allow them to be borrowed by other library users.

Items can still be renewed online, by phone or in person at a local library. Failure to return or renew items will result in your card being blocked from taking out or renewing any further items, including e-books and e-audio books.
Borrowing

privileges cannot be

restored until an overdue item is returned. The elimination of overdue fines is another way for libraries to encourage people who might not regularly use the library to experience what they have to offer. Members of the public are encouraged to return undamaged, overdue library items to their local libraries. There will be no fines to pay and Kerry Library would be happy to reactivate your library membership for you to begin using your local library again.

Previously paid overdue fines will not be refunded. Also note that fines cannot be cleared from an account until an overdue item is returned to the library.



Work on the four-week refurbishment is set to start on Monday 12th January 2019 during which time the queuing system and general ambience of the restaurant will be transformed.



MINIMUM RATES OF PAY

Since 1 January 2019, under the National Minimum Wage Order 2018, the national minimum wage for an experienced adult employee is €9.80 per hour. An experienced adult employee for the purposes of the National Minimum Wage Act is an employee who has an employment of any kind in any 2 years over the age of 18 Exceptions to those entitled to receive the national minimum wage

There are some exceptions to those entitled to receive the national minimum wage. The legislation does not apply to a person employed by a close relative (for example, a spouse, civil partner or parent) or to people in statutory apprenticeships. Also some employees such as young people under 18 and trainees are only guaranteed a reduced or sub-minimum rate of the national minimum wage.

The national minimum wage for experienced adult employees and the sub-minimum rates for young people and certain trainees are:





Common eye conditions: Refractive Erro

Refraction is the bending of light as it passes from one medium to another. The eye has several optical elements that, if correctly powered, focus light onto the retina at the back of the eye. However, there are four common types of refractive eye conditions where the eye is unable to correctly focus light onto the retina. These 'refractive errors' can cause vision to be blurred, and may lead to headaches and eye strain.

Myopia - short sightedness

Myopia is a refractive condition of the eye where light focuses in front of the retina. This makes distant objects appear blurry, but objects that are close are clearer. If the amount of myopia is large enough and is left uncorrected, distance vision is poor and may lead to headaches and eve strain.

Hyperopia – long sightedness

Hyperopia is a refractive condition of the eye where light focuses behind the retina. This makes close objects blurry, and while distant objects may appear clearer sometimes they are blurry too. If the amount of hyperopia is large enough and is left uncorrected, close vision may be poor and may lead to headaches and eye strain, particularly in adults.

Astigmatism

Astigmatism is where the optical surfaces are shaped more like a rugby ball than a football. This means that there is not a clear single point of focus. If left uncorrected, it can also lead to headaches and eye strain.

Presbyopia

Presbyopia is caused by a loss of flexibility of the lens inside the eye. It affects all people as they age, generally becoming problematic after 40 years of age. Presbyopia results in the inability to focus on close objects.

Presbyopia makes it difficult to read small print, and focus on closer objects, particularly in poor light.

Optometrists can recommend wearing an appropriate correction, such as reading glasses, or multifocal glasses.

OUESTION

I work part-time from Wednesday to Friday. This year Christmas fell on a Tuesday. Should I get paid for Christmas Day, even though I didn't work that day? What about New Year's Day which fell on the following Tuesday?

ANSWER

Christmas Day, St Stephen's Day and New Year's Day are time off or pay.) Part-time workers must have worked for the employer for at least 40 hours in the previous five-week period to have a public holiday entitlement.





Connection unveiled as Kilcummin face Two Mile House

Back in the summers of 2008 and 2009, Kilcummin man Billy Doolan used to let his nephew and future Two Mile House player Caomhán into Fitzgerald Stadium for the odd kick around. He couldn't have known that he was helping create a threat to his beloved club. A decade later, Kilcummin face Two Mile House in the All-Ireland semi-final and guess who's in the team? Only his nephew, who probably honed some of his skills in the shadow of the mountains that encircle Killarney. Although Caomhán is from Kildare, his father Michael's people are staunch Kilcummin people. His Kerry heritage has worked out well for the Kildare club with Doolan confirming "I was always proud to have family from Kerry and then to follow that football line because the Kingdom were so good."

Caomhán has represented his school Newbridge College, his underage club Athgarvan and his adult club Two Mile House with pride but admits his love of football was formed by those kickabouts on the hallowed turf of Fitzgerald Stadium. "I used to practise kicking scores. Fitzgerald Stadium is where the greats were, so being there helped develop my love of football." "It was always the Gooch," says Doolan when asked who his childhood hero was, adding "he could kick a point over any player on both feet, so I used to practise that with my Dad. He used to go behind the goals and I'd just keep kicking scores." Although born and raised in Kildare, Doolan says the lure of following the green and gold of Kerry was too much to resist. "We used to go to all the games in Croke Park. We used to watch all the great like Gooch and Dara Ó Sé. I'd even go to watch the interprovincial Championship Leinster vs Munster matches to keep an eye on the Kerry players. One of my prized possessions is a signed Kerry jersey by former manager Pat O'Shea that I got one day when my uncle brought me to Kerry training."

When Doolan talks about football it's clear he loves the game, a love developed by his Kilcummin father. "When we'd go on holidays

we'd always bring a ball with us and he had me soloing with my eyes closed, which I enjoyed. He made football fun and still believes to this day that everything should be done with the ball. He's disappointed when he hears about training without footballs because he believes everything should be ball work."

It's been a busy few months for Doolan who's mixed his college commitments with football, winning county and provincial titles. The provincial final clashed with one of his exams but somehow, he managed to fit both in. Bad weather meant the helicopter that was due to take him from Tullamore to University of Limerick was cancelled so he had to jump into a car to make the dash without even time for a shower "I looked over a few notes in the car on the way down and arrived at the exam five minutes late and still in my match gear including my wet socks. I wouldn't say anyone sitting around me was too pleased!" While he's still awaiting the results, Doolan reckons he did ok in the exam.

Two Mile House have had guite the journey in recent years, winning the All-Ireland junior title in 2014 and four years later becoming a senior club for the very first time. The high of the All-Ireland win however was matched by the terrible low of forward Adam Burke's on field stroke in 2016. After a long road, Burke is recovering and is still a central part of the club. His pre-county final speech this season was a key part of the team's preparation. Recalling Burke's inspirational words, Doolan says "He calmed us down and took any nerves away. He spoke about how much he'd love to be on the pitch, asking those of us who get the opportunity to go out and have no regrets afterwards. When someone like Adam Burke speaks, you listen."

Doolan was too young to feature in the All-Ireland win of 2014. It was historic, as it was the first time a men's team from Kildare won a national club title. He says seeing the club enjoy such success is driving the younger generation to claim their own piece of history and the older players also want to repeat their heroics. Although the youth are keen to make their mark, the wise old head of Peter Kelly is still a driving force. The All Star is the "biggest influence in the team" according to Doolan, who says he has unbelievable game smarts and is constantly communicating throughout matches. Lillywhite forward Chris Healy is also among the Two Mile House ranks, with Doolan outlining his ball winning ability as a key asset "just get the ball to him and he'll put it over the bar" says his young teammate of the county star.

So, what of the game itself? Will Doolan's Kilcummin father be conflicted or will he be one hundred percent behind Two Mile House on the day? "He'll be wearing the Two Mile House jersey that day," says Doolan. "I reckon he'll be hoping we'll win because then he'll have something to slag his brothers about!"

Although he dreamed of playing in the green and gold of Kerry as a child, it's the green and gold of Two Mile House that is now the centre of Caomhán Doolan's attention.

New Code of **Behaviour Launched**

Packed with 10 different sections, the Code of Behviour (Underage) has been updated to reflect recent child safeguarding legislative requirements that are now enshrined in our Rules and in the day to day organising of our games.

Sections include guidance on maintaining appropriate levels of behaviour when working with children and young people, how to promote the Code and also deal the breaches of the Code, useful guidance on recruiting coaches and managers for underage teams, how to plan away trips, the Club child safeguarding statement, dealing with bullying of children and young people, social media guidance and how to report any concerns or allegations of abuse.

THE PRETENDER

Bubbles the horse knew he had only one chance to pull off the impossible, so he took it. The thin, gray gelding was being held at a kill pen in Texas when Sue Chapman of Becky's Hope Horse Rescue pulled up to save nine mini donkeys. The nonprofit raises money to make monthly trips to slaughterhouses in an effort to rescue, rehabilitate and re-home abused, neglected and abandoned horses and farm animals.

Ms. Chapman and her team were originally there just to save the donkeys. Upon closer inspection of the lot, however, she was surprised to see a horse attempting to inconspicuously blend in.

"He just stood there patiently. He didn't try to shoo the donkeys away. He didn't try to fight with them. He just stood there like 'I'm a donkey and you don't realize that I look any different," she said. When it came time to leave the kill lot, Bubbles the horse decided the time had come to make his daring escape.

"When we went to bail the mini donkeys from the kill lot, this skinny, grey gelding walked straight up to our trailer, past the gates, disregarding the commands of the kill lot employees," she said. "He



was intent that this was his ride out of there. We stood there staring as this old guy with crumbled ears from frostbite who waited patiently for the group of mini donkeys to catch up so he could jump on the 'freedom trailer' out of there. There was just no way we could leave him behind!"

Thanks to some generous donations, the group was able to secure Bubbles' freedom and he's now living out his days in comfort and peace at the nonprofit's 100-acre facility in Frisco, Texas.

As you might expect, his second shot at life has also come with a hefty dose of fame. A Facebook page setup to tell his story currently has more than 2,500 likes.

The Rescue organisation sent to save the mini donkeys from a slaughterhouse is thrilled to have discovered the adorable imposter standing in their midst. "People have taken Bubbles into their hearts and made a difference in the life of this sweet, old horse" Ms. Chapman said. "The outpouring of support has been truly amazing.

2002 - The first prisoners arrived in Guantanamo Bay. Following reports of torture, Amnesty International called the situation at the US detention camp a "human rights scandal".

2008 - Death of Edmund Hillary, New Zealand mountaineer, explorer, and philanthropist in Auckland City Hospital at the age of 88. In 1960 he was determined to help the impoverished Sherpas in the Khumbu region of Nepal, who had put so much effort into his expeditions. He established the Himalayan Trust, which built schools, airfields, bridges, clinics and hospitals in Nepal, and restored Buddhist monasteries.

A DUBLIN CAFÉ IS ON A MISSION TO GIVE HUNGRY SCHOOL CHILDREN A FREE BREAKFAST

Skinny Batch café located in Rush, Co Dublin has announced that it is offering a free breakfast to every child who may need it.

From last Monday, the café served up a pot of porridge for children and teenagers up to the age of 18 to take to school with them.

"We believe that every child and teenager deserves a warm healthy breakfast before school each day so that's what we're going to do" the owners explained.

The offer is available to any child or teenager up to the age of 18 between 8 and 9am each morning. The owners have asked that each child brings their own pot or container with them on their way to school to avail of the offer.

Another local business in Rush, McCormack's Fruit and Veg has now offered to join forces with the Skinny Batch and will be providing the café with fresh fruit to go with the porridge.

OCEAN CLEANUP SYSTEM HAS LAUNCHED FIRST VESSEL INTO THE PACIFIC

The Ocean Cleanup, a cleanup campaign created by Dutch teenager, Boyan Slat, has launched its first vessel to rid more than 50% of the rubbish in The Great Pacific Garbage Patch - the world's largest collection of floating rubbish, which is often described as "larger than Texas."

Cleaning up this location using conventional methods - vessels and nets - would take thousands of years and billions of dollars to complete. The Ocean Cleanup's system uses the natural oceanic forces to catch and concentrate the plastic. Both the plastic and system are being carried by the current.

The system consists of a 600-meter-long floater that sits at the surface of the water and a tapered 3-meter-deep skirt attached below. The floater provides buoyancy to the system and prevents plastic from flowing over it, while the skirt stops debris from escaping underneath.

The teenager founded The Ocean Cleanup in 2013 and managed to raise \$2.2 million through a crowdfunding campaign with the help of 38,000 donors from 160 countries. In 5 years, the organisation had raised \$31.5 million in donations from entrepreneurs in Europe and in Silicon Valley. Boyan estimates that half of the Great Pacific Garbage Patch will be gone within 5 years, and is hopeful for a plastic-free ocean by 2050.

The New Year brings with it new expectations and experiences for everyone. It can be a time of excitement and fresh starts and yet feel one of the most difficult times also. Many people report feeling down, a little fatigued and more hopeless. There can be a sense of deflation after all the festivities of Christmas and with that anti-climax low mood and, in some cases, isolation can occur. The temptation may be to give in a little and retire from the world but the opposite is more helpful. Engaging in moderate physical exercise, eating a balanced diet and staying connected to others can prohibit a low mood from getting increasingly worse. Of course we all have off days or lazy days whereby we need to rest more and retreat but if you notice that you are experiencing ongoing low mood and change in behaviour that affects your quality of life and/or relationships then you may have to reach out for help.

A good place to start is family or friends, someone you already know and trust. They know you already and know your life experiences and how much you have been through so chatting to them about how you feel can alleviate the pressure/stress you may be feeling. Family and friends will want to know if you are struggling and from my experience, as a counsellor, they will appreciate you letting them in. The first step is the hardest but once you start the conversation you will feel less alone and instantly begin the process of connection. Communication is key. Whether it is anger, sadness, fear or anxiety talk about it, problems are relative so if it bothers you then it bothers you. Don't fall into the trap of thinking it doesn't matter or other people won't care because this way of thinking only serves to isolate you more. Don't pretend to be ok if you are not ok. This only serves to delay or postpone what you inevitably have to address so consider the benefits of sharing how you feel, as not sharing could have a negative impact on your mental, emotional and physical wellbeing.

Another avenue worth exploring is visiting your GP. Describe to your doctor how you feel and what you are experiencing recently. Discuss your concerns and fears and how others i.e. family or friends, may have noticed a change that concerns them. Again you have begun the process of reaching out. Your doctor can listen and make some suggestions or refer you to other services. They can discuss your support network and request a repeat visit to them so that they can monitor and support you as necessary.

Alternatively, you may consider counselling. This would give you the opportunity to explore your thoughts, feelings and experiences (past or present) in a confidential, non-judgemental, safe setting. Counselling can provide support, insight and validation. It is a useful space where people can open up and discuss what is on their mind and what is happening within the context of their world. The aim is to feel seen and heard at a time when you may be feeling alone and/or invisible! The developing relationship between you and the counsellor can restore confidence in yourself as well as confidence in others; thoughts can be challenged and feelings can be held. In turn, there can be a sense of empowerment when we become pro-active in our lives and starting the counselling process is a positive indication of this. Acknowledging that we matter, that we are enough and that we need others (either on a personal or professional level) can enable us to face another year with less dread, more hope and more understanding.
