On stage with Daithi, Breda spoke about her Mom who passed away in July 2010 after 8 courageous years fighting numerous Cancers. Breda told us 'Every time I hear of someone being diagnosed or passing away from Cancer, I feel every ounce of emotion that their family experience. That big C word leaves permanent marks on people's lives, which unfortunately so many people can relate to. I went through a phase of wanting to be an Oncologist after being inspired by Mom, however due to an unrelenting and sometimes comical phobia to blood and needles, I had to hang up my doctor's coat prematurely. I haven't become a doctor and I'm

not quite Einstein so I'm useless to finding that cure to cancer, but I can help fundraise for other Einstein's in the form of researchers to find that cure. I couldn't think of a more significant time than May 26th to do this.' So on May 26th Breda will be taking on Ireland's highest mountain and climbing Carrauntoohil. From there she will be cycling to the Ballyroe Heights hotel, the home of the 2018 Kerry Rose selection, where she will be passing the sash to somebody else who will have the fortune of representing the Kingdom for the next twelve months. O'Flaherty Humanitarian nominations sought

he Hugh O'Flaherty Memorial Society is making a final call for Nominations for the 2018 Hugh O'Flaherty Humanitarian Award. Nominations are sought for the person or organisation doing outstanding humanitarian work and most deserving of the Award. The Award will be presented as part of the 11th annual Hugh O'Flaherty Memorial Weekend, which will take placeon Saturday November 3rd & Sunday November 4th 2018 in Killarney. This year marks the 75th Anniversary of the creation of The Rome Escape Line. Monsignor Hugh began hiding some within the Vatican and in the GermanCollege.

Amongst the high profile anti-fascists being hidden by the Monsignor was Princess Nina Pallavicini - suspected by the Gestapo of operating an anti-Fascist radio station and being actively involved in forging documents for the resistance, - she just escaped capture by jumping out a ground floor window of her Palazzo and making her way to her friend Hugh O'Flaherty where he secured a safe place for her in the nun's quarters of the German College. With the help of Monsignor Hugh, she resumed her broadcasting and forging activities from there until Rome was liberated. By late Spring/early Summer, 1943, fearful of the implications for its "neutrality", the Vatican authorities

ordered the Swiss Guards to refuse any more escapee entries to the Vatican and Monsignor Hugh was forced to seek safe locations outside the Vatican. Beginning with some New Zealand downed pilots, Hugh began finding safe refuge for an increasing number of escapees throughout Rome but was finding it hard to persuade those in hiding to take appropriate precautions unfortunately resulting in several recaptures. By late Autumn, having jumped from a POW Train on its way to Germany, Allied escapee Lt Col Sam Derry had found his way to Rome and approached Monsignor Hugh on the steps of St Peters. Within days, from the safety of the German College, both men had reorganised the Rome Escape Line, applying military like discipline to those in hiding and all but eliminating recaptures.

Last year's 2017 Humanitarian Award recipient was Irish Loreto Sister Orla Treacy. In 2006, she went to Sudan to establish an educational & medical facility in that war-torn country.


The all new Valley 70 Cycle launched



he award winning European Circular Ocean project has launched a global "Innovation Competition", designed to engage creative and technical communities to provide inspiring and fresh ideas and solutions related to the re-use and recycling of end of life fishing nets in the Northern Periphery and Arctic (NPA) region. Circular Ocean would like to hear from individuals and/or multi-disciplinary teams of entrepreneurs, inventors, designers and students in the Kerry area, who would like to tackle marine plastics with ideas, solutions and product concepts. Irish partners "Macroom E" hope the competition will act as a catalyst to motivate and empower communities across Kerry to consider sustainable business opportunities

utilising plastics from waste fishing gear. It is estimated that up to 8 million tonnes of plastic enters the sea each year, causing serious damage to our ocean environment and marine ecosystems. This concern is particularly pertinent to Ireland, as an island nation, where many communities are already subject to the consequences of ocean plastic pollution damaging their environment as well as local fishing industries, tourism and related business. Aligned with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, the challenge will seek to attract new ideas that enable a circular value chain through innovative material processing, technology, local machinery, systems, business models or completely

different solutions that enable the collection, reusing and recycling of discarded and used FNRCs. Closing date for entries is 1st June 2018, submissions will then be evaluated by a panel of experts from the NPA regions and specialist networks, including Irish representatives Keiron Phillips, Project Manager at the Environmental Protection Agency. The initiative is also supported by the Global Ghost Gear Initiative (GGGI), a multistakeholder alliance, established to drive solutions to the problem of lost and abandoned fishing gear worldwide. Smart lighting fund for small businesses can lead to 90% savings on lighting costs

pplications are now open for €3 million Lighting Upgrade Grant Scheme according to the Minister of State for Tourism and Sport, Brendan Griffin.

The grant is open to small businesses

across all sectors including retail, hospitality, tourism, private education, health facilities and manufacturing.

Applications can be submitted by individual businesses or by coordinators who group applications and are in a position to apply and deliver lighting upgrades for a number of businesses.

Minister Griffin said: "The Programme for Partnership Government committed to providing additional resources to help support start-ups and small businesses across the country.

"There are currently over 200,000 SMEs operating in Ireland and this

scheme aims to support energy efficient lighting upgrades across all SME sectors.

"Collectively small businesses account for a significant portion of national, and indeed, global energy demand. The smart lighting grant will significantly help businesses reduce their energy-use, producing real results for our economy, while also helping to protect the environment," Minister Griffin said.

"We in Fine Gael believe that our small businesses need to be given the supports to help them thrive in our resurgent economy. I would like to thank Minister Naughten for making this funding available."



With the state exams now just five weeks away, candidates may become anxious about their performance. A level of anxiety is normal and focusses the mind on the challenge ahead. Almost all exam candidates, irrespective of how laid back they appear, feel nervous. It's the body's way of dealing with a stressful experience. How you deal with this nervous energy is the critical issue. If you channel it in a positive direction it will give you the vitality to cope with the demands of the exam.

A positive mental attitude is a considerable aid around exam time. Be confident in your ability to do well. Don't be discouraged by other students appearing to know more than you do. Aim to do perform to your own capability, not to compete with others. Make positive statements about yourself. Banish all negative thoughts from your mind. Think well of yourself and of your readiness to achieve success. Your best effort is more important than your ultimate performance in the exam. Determine to do your best, no more, no less.

Success is a product of positive thinking. By motivating yourself towards your goals, you will redouble your effort and improve your performance. Have items in your study environment to spur you on. Place a statement of your objectives, such as your target grades, in a conspicuous place. An occasional glance in their direction will encourage you.

Exam stress becomes newsworthy every year because of the assessment system used in the state exams. For the most part these exams are terminally assessed. In effect, two years of work is examined by means of written papers in June. Perhaps, not enough credit is given to the candidate for consistent work over the two years. Continuous assessment is not utilised although project work is becoming a more important part of the exam structure. The major problem with the exam system is the increased level of stress it causes in some students around exam time. Despite all that is written about exam stress, students continue to show that they are excellent exam performers and use stress as a stimulant rather than an affliction.

The stress experienced by the majority of exam candidates is positive stress. It concentrates the mind wonderfully. You realise that the forthcoming exam is making increased demands of you. However, your application to study and revision provides you with the resources to meet these demands. Positive stress provides you with the motivation to prepare for the exam. It will sustain and stimulate this motivation until the exam is over. Properly controlled stress will activate hidden resources of energy and application in you. It's important to control the stress and channel it into positive energy.

It's only when you haven't the resources to meet the demands of the exam that distress or negative stress becomes an issue. Exam distress is a rare occurrence in young people and can easily be confused with normal exam anxiety. The present cohort of young people is highly skilled and well able to cope with the demands of the exam. Distress, when it does occur, is disruptive and may interfere with your performance if it isn't counteracted.

An effective way of managing distress is through utilising your social support network

of people who care about you. If you need emotional support approach someone in whom you have confidence. That person may be a teacher a





A Guide to changing a tyre

Punctures are the second most common cause of breakdowns. Each year we track the most common vehicle break down causes our break down recovery Patrols respond to and more often than not it's the simple vehicle faults that are stopping motorists in their tracks. Following flat batteries, punctures are the second most common cause of break down reported to AA Rescue. Here AA Patrol, Trevor Freeman, who has been rescuing broken down Irish motorists for more than 7 years, shares his step by step guide on how change your car wheel quickly and safely following a puncture.

MOTORING

Getting started on your puncture

First things first, secure your car. That means putting the vehicle into first gear, making sure the hand break is on and that the car is on flat level ground.

Secondly, lay out your wheel change tools safe from oncoming cars. You'll need your spare tyre, jack, towing eye and wheel brace. Here at AA Rescue we also encourage motorists to carry a hi-vis vest and triangle in their vehicles. During the wheel change, you should wear your hi-vis vest and place the triangle at least 20m behind the car to alert other drivers.

Removing the punctured wheel from your car, taking off the hub caps

Firstly, you need to get the hub cap off the car wheel in question. A tip to help you with this is to use your car's towing eye as it's got a little screwed edge on the corner. Lip it underneath the edge of the hubcap and pull it off to expose the wheel nuts.

Removing the wheel nuts

Some vehicles have an anti theft nut. You'll need to start with this. You'll find the key for this in the car's glove compartment or in the boot of the vehicle along with your car's other wheel changing equipment. If you can't find it, refer to your vehicle manual. Once it's off you can start on the 4 other wheel nuts.

You'll need to slacken these off before jacking

Tips to aid in the prevention of car theft

With modern cars being fitted with complex immobilizers, a common tactic for thieves these days is to take keys off hall tables or from convenient key racks near the door, simply by 'fishing' for them with a pole through the letterbox.

The days of 'hot-wiring' cars are for the most part behind us. However tactics have changed. Thieves will now target car keys, and will sometimes break into a house to look for them. It is a mistake to leave them in an obvious place like on a hall table.

Burglars are also adept at opening doors secured with conventional slam-shut barrel locks. Once in the house, they'll often find the keys left on a table or sideboard and can make a quiet getaway in the stolen vehicle.

Jacking up the car

You're now ready to jack up your car. Each car has a jacking point which is reinforced. If you put it into the wrong position you can damage the vehicle severely. Check the diagram on top of your car's jack or in your vehicle manual to help locate it. Then slide it underneath the car in the indicated position then turn the handle of the jack to raise your car.

Removing the punctured wheel from the car

You are ready to remove the wheel from your car. Your wheel nuts are already loosened so you can now just pop them out. Put them somewhere safe so as not to lose them.

You can then pull the wheel off your car.

If you use a sat nav in your car, take it with you whenever you leave the car. You should also remove the cradle and suction pads and clean away any tell-tale marks.



TAXATION OF PENSIONS

In general, all income arising from pensions in Ireland is subject to taxation. Many pensioners do not actually have to pay tax, because their income is too low.

Occupational pensions are not subject to social insurance contributions (PRSI) but if you are aged under 66, you may have to pay PRSI on other income. Occupational pensions are subject to the Universal Social Charge.

If you have a social welfare and occupational pension

There is no mechanism for taxing social welfare pensions at source. Your other source of income determines how tax is levied. The most common situation is where a pensioner (State Pension (Contributory) or Widow's/Widower's/Surviving Civil Partner's (Contributory) Pension) has both an occupational pension and a social welfare pension. If the occupational pension is paid from within Ireland, it is taxed by PAYE in the same way as a wage or salary. This means that you get your tax credits in the normal way. In order to tax your social welfare pension your annual tax credits are reduced by the tax liability on your social welfare pension. For higher incomes, the standard rate cut off point will also be reduced. You then effectively pay tax on both the pensions, but it is collected from the occupational pension. The same arrangement applies if you have income from a job and a social welfare persion.

If your other source of income is not taxed on the PAYE system, for example if you have an occupational pension from abroad or you have investment income, then you are classed as a self-employed person and your tax is payable annually by 31 October each year.

FOCUS ON SUMMER FLOWERING SHRUBS

From now until late autumn there is a large range of flowering shrubs in all different sizes and from evergreen to deciduous for you to choose from.

Some can have a short flowering time and others can flower right through the summer.

Remembering when choosing your flowering shrubs that you find out the flowering period as this can determine the position that you are going to plant your shrub.

A good example of a deciduous flowering shrub that will flower for a long period over the summer is a shrub called Potentilla. It comes in a good range of colours also, including white, yellow, orange and red. ALL OUR DAYS ARE MAINTAINED PARTIALLY BY PLASTIC

Plastic may be ubiquitous in modern society and seemingly unavoidable, but is it worth risking the lives of marine species, the health of the oceans and our own future in the name of convenience?

While it probably be wrong to suggest plastics are completely evil as nowadays they offer us a valued level of convenience and flexibility, however, the overuse of plastics by our consumption-driven lifestyles is really starting to spell disaster for the planet and wildlife everywhere. As we drill for crude oil to manufacture more plastic items, we pump greenhouse gases into the atmosphere and further the effects of climate change. Humans produce around 300 million tons of plastic every year and in the past 30 years alone, the rate of plastic production has increased 620% . Some of the plastic items you encounter on a daily basis are used over and over again as you don't throw out your keyboard at the end of each day, only to replace it with another. Same with your appliances, your car's interior fixtures, and furnishings in your house. But there are several areas in our daily life where plastic suffers a tragically short lifespan and enters the waste stream all too early.


Things like single-use water bottles, plastic straws, plastic shopping bags, and singleuse containers of food could all stand to be reduced or even eliminated for the sake of the environment. While eliminating some instances of plastic use may be difficult, planning ahead and offering some conscious thought to your daily habits just may help you discover where you can step up your plastic-reducing game.

As you go about your day today, pay attention to where your plastic use is coming into play and seek out ways to reduce or eliminate it. A DIFFERENT KIND OF CAVIAR

The finger lime is a small, sausage-shaped citrus that comes in an assortment of colours, including red, yellow, brown, green, and black. The best way to open one these fruits is to slice at its centre and then squeeze one of the halves. When you apply pressure, little balls of pulp that look just like fish eggs spill out. These tiny juice bubbles easily separate from one another and pop when chewed, releasing a pleasant splash of flavour with each bite. This unusual texture has earned the fruit the nickname "citrus caviar."

Finger limes taste very similar to regular limes, but with less sourness an there is quite a bit of flavour variation depending on a tree's growing conditions.

The fruit is native to the subtropical Australian states of Queensland and New South Wales, where indigenous people have foraged the citrus as both food and medicine for thousands of years. They can serve as a colourful and tasty topping on pancakes, sushi, oysters, desserts, and cocktails. Cooking the pulp can diminish their texture, so it's best to use them to garnish food after it's already made.

DIVORCE LAWYER HELPED SAVE A MARRIAGE BY ASKING FOUR SIMPLE QUESTIONS

This divorce lawyer may have lost a potential customer by saving a marriage – but he still has no regrets.

Rafael Gonçalves, a lawyer from the small Brazilian town of Sao Sebastiao do Paraiso, first met the couple when they went to his office and started explaining their reasons to file for a divorce. Mr. Gonçalves noticed, however, that they seemed to still like each other.

He wrote down a list of the documents they would need for divorce – but at the bottom, he also wrote down four additional questions that he asked for them to answer before coming back.

1. Did I do everything I could to save this

marriage?

2. Is a divorce really the best option today?

3. Who is influencing my decisions?

4. How many problems did you overcome together and how you met?

A few days later, the couple returned to the office saying that they decided not to go ahead with the divorce.

"I don't think I did anything special and, in my opinion, all my colleagues should act the same. Nobody starts dating planning to break up, and nobody marries planning a divorce. We live in a society that trade or throw something away instead of fixing it, and this is sadly applying to relationships, too. Sometimes all it takes for a marriage to work is to find someone to pause a moment of conflict and allow them the opportunity to adjust" Mr Gonçalves said.

THE OLDEST EXAMPLE OF A TATTOO KIT IN THE WORLD

About 3,600 years ago, someone decided to bury a collection of sharpened turkey bones and mussel shells. The items were unearthed in 1985 and then forgotten for almost three decades. However, a couple of researchers decided to take another look at the collection a few years back, wondering if the tools were part of a medicine bundle once used by Native Americans. The form of the bones and traces of black and red pigment showed them a different story – one that has left a mark on the history of tattooing.

Aaron Deter-Wolf, an archaeologist with the Tennessee Division of Archaeology, and Tanya Peres, a zooarchaeologist at Florida State University, decided it was worthwhile to take another look at the collection and discovered the sharpened turkey bones have an uncanny resemblance to needles, and the pigment residue in the shells suggest they may have been inkpots.

Aaron Deter-Wolf explained that "By the arrival of the Europeans, virtually every Native American group in the Great Plains and the Eastern Woodlands practiced tattooing. If it's something that widespread and that important, we suspect that it is very deeply rooted in Native American history."

"These bundles were incredibly important, only held and used by certain bundle keepers who were also tattooists. There were oral histories, songs, and dances that went along with the tattooing process" he added.

The tattoo toolkit, now recognized as the oldest example in the world, was discovered in a Late Archaic Native American cemetery in in Fernvale, Tennessee during a bridge replacement project.



Know Your Rights: APPLYING FOR A STUDENT GRANT

I will be sitting my Leaving Certificate this year and plan to go to college in the autumn. How do I apply for a student grant?

ANSWER

Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI) is Ireland's single national awarding authority for all higher and further education grants.

You apply to SUSI by completing an application form online. You must have an online account with SUSI before you can make your grant application. SUSI is accepting grant applications for the 2018–2019 academic year from early April 2018.

You can use SUSI's eligibility reckoner to see whether you meet the standard criteria to be considered eligible for student grant funding. You must meet the conditions of the student grant scheme. You must be an Irish, EU, EEA or Swiss national or have specific leave to remain in the State. You must also have been ordinarily resident in Ireland or the EU for three of the last five years. Your family's means (in the previous tax year, 2017) are assessed and must be under the specified threshold. You must also be attending an approved course in an approved institution.

You must make sure that you provide complete and accurate information (date of birth, Personal Public Service Numbers (PPSNs) and bank details in particular) to avoid any delay to the processing of your application. You need to send hard copies of any supporting documentation to SUSI.

If you are refused a grant, or are approved a grant at a rate that you don't think applies to your situation, you can appeal the decision in writing to SUSI. You must appeal within 30 days of getting your decision.

Student grants are reviewed each year. If you had a grant in one academic year and are continuing your studies on the course in the following year, SUSI will be in contact with you in order to renew or re-assess your student grant for that next year.

We have been looking at self-esteem for the past two weeks, and we spoke about the relationship between parents and children and how to build self-esteem. This article focuses on a crucial element involved in all relationships which is trust.

All of us have some idea of the meaning of trust in an emotional sense, I trust my mother meaning I can rely on her or my friend is trustworthy, I can share personal information and he does not tell everyone. In psychological terms trust is believing that the person who is trusted will do what is expected, and this starts in the family and grows to others. Erik Erikson, a developmental psychologist, helped understand human behaviour by describing trust as the very first relationship building block that develops over the first two years of life. If this is successfully done by the primary caretakers of a child by being consistent, reliable and caring then security, trust and optimism develop in the child. If this is not done successfully it can lead to children feeling insecure and mistrustful making it difficult for the child to bond with family members and later in life with friends and intimate relationships. Barbara Miztal, in her book Trust in Modern Societies, points out three basic things that trust does in the lives of people. It makes social life predictable, it creates a sense of community, and it makes it easier for people to work together.

As a counselling centre we are witness to the breakdown of trust in relationships, sometimes from early childhood due to a number of reasons often in circumstances outside of their control, sometimes the trust was broken in later life in an adult relationship, and at times people experience a breakdown of trust with financial situations. The Centre offers a trusting space to explore these feelings and to work through the trust being broken. In order for a good working relationship to ensue trust is at the core of the counselling process. We ask that you trust us as a charity as well.


