

SIT LEAVING CERT EXAMS

The students of 2021 have showed tremendous resilience despite the significant disruption and uncertainty during the past two years.

They will go down in the history books as the class who overcame unprecedented challenges due to COVID-19 and on Wednesday last, 9th June 2021, 55,000 candidates who had opted to sit Leaving Certificate examinations commenced their Leaving Certificate and Leaving Certificate Applied examinations across the country. The examinations are being held in 4,900 examination centres running until Tuesday 29 June for Leaving Certificate (Established and Vocational). The examinations in the Leaving Certificate Applied programme finish on Thursday 17 June.

61,500 candidates were entered for the 2021 Leaving Certificate which comprises both examinations and Accredited Grades. Candidates have been able to opt to sit their examinations, to receive Accredited Grades, or both on a subject-by-subject basis. Candidates finalised their choices through the Candidate Self Service Portal in early May. In total, 58,342 candidates are entered for the Leaving Certificate and 3,177 candidates are entered for the final year of the Leaving Certificate Applied programme.

The majority of candidates have confirmed their intention to sit examinations this year. From the latest information available to the State Examinations Commission (SEC), 90% of all candidates have indicated their intention to sit examinations in one or more subjects with almost 40,000 indicating their intention to present in 5 or more subjects.

The Laurels opened their new area "The Back Yard" and are experiencing great interest in booking.







The eleven new easily accessible coaches are operated by Bus Éireann for the National Transport Authority. The blue and yellow buses are in the Transport for Ireland livery and also include USB sockets as well as complimentary Wi-Fi for passengers.

this to increase significantly in the coming years and look forward to keeping the people of Kerry connected to the who and what matters to them into the future.”



Cruinniú na nÓg set to take place this weekend



Cruinniú na nÓg is taking place all over Ireland on Saturday 12th June this year with a programme of creative celebrations for children and young people.

The programme in Kerry offers a vast choice of free events and activities for children and young people to look forward to.

This year's event is entirely online with lots of opportunities for making, creating and doing. Earlier in the year, the Arts Office at Kerry County Council carried out an extensive consultation with young people of Kerry to see what they wanted in this Cruinniú na nÓg Chiarraí.

There is something for all ages and tastes in this year's programme and some of the highlights include dance workshops, online circus show and workshop, short film programme and discussion panel, music and music video creation workshop and tutorial, creative writing and poetry workshops, painting, pottery and plaster making workshops, origami workshops, youth theatre screenings and kite making workshops.

"It's fantastic to see all that's on offer here in Kerry, free, for Cruinniú na nÓg," the Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr Patrick Conor-Scarreen said. "No doubt it will be a great day with lots of positive experiences and great fun."

All events are online this year – some are live interactive events and workshops while others are pre-recorded sessions that will be available on the day. The hashtag #CreativeIreland has also been set up to give us all a flavour of what to expect and what is happening throughout

the country.

"While events are online for safety, children will still get a change to engage creatively, and even get outside with some activities. It is a wonderful opportunity to experience something creative, at no cost," explains Kate Kennelly, the Creative Ireland Co-ordinator and Arts Officer at Kerry County Council.

KODALINE 'ACOUSTIC TOUR' TO PLAY THE GLENEAGLE INEC ARENA

Their extensive touring throughout Asia also included a headline set at Monsoon Music Festival in Vietnam plus dates in China, Japan, South Korea, The Philippines, Malaysia, Indonesia, Thailand, Taiwan and Singapore.

"We're excited to do our first ever stripped down fully acoustic tour, it's something we've wanted to do for a long time and something that's gonna be very special for us," the band said.

In August last year, Kodaline performed their smash-hit album 'In A Perfect World' back to back for the first time since its recording, and will be heading back to the stage with the showcase live across Ireland in 2021.

In their free time, Karen and Edwin have enjoyed walking their dogs and are both keen golfers and will miss their many friends in Beaufort Golf Club where Karen was Lady Captain in 2020. They have both enjoyed their time in Killarney and have no doubt they will return on holiday.

Karen is currently the Circuit Superintendent of the Cork South and Kerry circuit of the Methodist Church in Ireland with oversight of the churches in Killarney, Kenmare and Millstreet plus other groups in Castleisland and Gneeveguilla. MAKE THE MOST OF THE OPPORTUNITY TO DO WELL IN THE LEAVING CERT WRITTEN EXAM

After a difficult and uncertain year, there is tangible relief that the Leaving Cert exam is finally underway. Like many important milestones, the anticipation is often worse than the event itself. The first morning was the most nerve racking as it involved some formality. However, once the question papers were distributed and the candidates warmed to their task, the tension of the morning quickly evaporated.

The exam timetable mainly prioritises compulsory subjects during the early days of the exam. As the exams progress into the second and subsequent weeks, the optional subjects are nicely spaced out allowing for study days. But, as they continue until Tuesday, 29th June, it's important to treat the exams more like a marathon than a sprint. After sitting a few subjects, candidates now realise that exams test not only your knowledge but also your concentration and ability to utilise every available minute. So, stay in exam mode until you leave the exam centre after the very last subject.

Depending on the subjects being sat, the entire exam will conclude reasonably early for some candidates. Others will have to stay focussed until the very last subject on the final day. Irrespective of when you are due to finish the exam, keep in mind that you have prepared diligently for the exam. This is what you have been waiting for. Make the most of the opportunity to do well. Reap the rewards of years of study by performing to your optimum ability in each subject.

After three busy days of exams, the coming weekend will bring welcome relief and give candidates a chance to relax a little, to take stock and plan ahead. Spend as little time as possible on post-mortems. Review your tactical approach over the first week. If you are totally satisfied with your strategy before, during and after each subject then you need change very little. Focus on next week's subjects and forget about the subjects that have already been examined. Your entire concentration must be on the subjects still to be examined.

The weekend provides an opportunity to recharge the batteries for the week beginning on the 14th June and to do some subject revision. Take some active leisure to burn off the residual tension of the first week. It will help you to sleep soundly and to maintain the levels of stamina, endurance and staying power needed for the challenges ahead. Avail of a few good nights' rest, which is essential for alertness. Resist the temptation to study late into the night. Confine your study to daylight hours, enjoy your period of exercise and go to bed early. Defer any late-night socialising

until your exam is over. Keep your fluid intake high to avoid dehydration but be moderate in your use of artificial stimulants such as tea and coffee. Keep a clear head by abstaining from alcohol during the exam period.

Concentrate on subjects being examined next week. Prioritise your revision according to the timetable. Go over the tips and predictions that have been made for the subjects you are sitting during week two. Use your study days well and study wisely by not cramming. At this stage the quality of your revision is more important than the length of time you spend at it. On the evening before each paper spend an hour or so looking over your notes so that the important concepts are fresh in your mind. You are off to a great start after the first few days. Maintain your discipline during the week beginning on the 14th June. Keep a good thought for yourself and stay positive. Have confidence in your ability to do well in your second week's papers. You are now well settled in and rising to the challenge. Deal with each subject as it comes and by this time next week it may all be behind you.

CALL FOR EMERGENCY FUNDING to repair repeated water outages

Cllr. Brendan Cronin, Mayor of Killarney has called on Kerry County Council to request emergency funding to deal with the continuous water breaks on the main supply pipe to Barleymount reservoir.

"These breaks are getting progressively worse and the resulting repeated water outages seriously affecting households, tourism, business and farming customers from Aghadoe, Barleymount, Ballyhar, Faha, Listry, Rockfield and into Miltown, with three major breaks at Crohane in past 4 days alone", Cllr. Cronin told Killarney Outlook.

"I have called on the CE of Kerry County council Moira Murrell to request emergency funding from Irish Water for pipe replacement in the areas that are

being badly affected. I am deeply concerned that facing into the tourist season and the reopening of business and the prospect of warmer weather that we are in a water supply crisis situation with the number of serious and repeated breaks", he added.

"I am also requesting the water services dept of KCC to make provision for emergency supports to business, tourism, farming and the general public with the provision of water tankers where necessary should this pattern of water breaks continue. This situation is totally unacceptable and very frustrating and must be addressed by Irish water immediately", the Councillor said.



SKDP Led Kerry Eco-Social Project Approved for Funding

A South Kerry Development Partnership led project focused on addressing not only biodiversity within the farming landscape but also inclusion and accessibility within rural communities has been approved for funding under the European Innovation Partnerships (EIP) initiative of Ireland's Rural Development Programme.

The project will seek to implement biodiversity actions as proven in existing EIP projects on host farms within the Kerry Social Farming (KSF) Network. These actions will include hedgerow management, actions for pollinators and habitat management for birds and bats. Alongside practical actions, training will be offered in habitat management and biodiversity for both host farmers and participants. A system of monitoring and training to maintain standards in biodiversity will be provided to both host farmers and KSF participants and supported through the existing KSF team.

Other partners involved in the initiative include NEWKD, Representative from KSF working Group, Biosphere Officer – Kerry Biosphere Reserve, Transition Kerry, GreenBelt, Biodiversity Partners, Host Farm representatives, Kerry County Council, Teagasc and the NPWS.

Expected outcomes include an increase in

biodiversity managed areas on participating host farms and ensuring a wide cohort of people will engage in this biodiversity project; learning and sharing their knowledge and information about the positive role of biodiversity in farming throughout Kerry. Ongoing monitoring of the biodiversity on the participating farms will be undertaken by the KSF participants and it is hoped the project will

also promote a greater embeddedness of best ecological practices among participating farms, initially, and across the county, subsequently.

Welcoming the approval of the project for funding SKDP CEO Noel Spillane noted that Kerry has been to the fore in Ireland since 2013 in developing the social farming concept and now has more than 39 participants involved on some 30 host farms. "This project will deliver outcomes that go beyond the farm habitat improvements made during the project timeframe" Noel noted, adding that it will offer training to farmers and participants of KSF throughout the project. The development of a biodiversity map of the farm which will be updated during the final project review and provided to all participating farms, will give them the tools to continue managing areas for biodiversity he said. Noel also noted that a communications plan designed to include the wider community in this project will be put in place to help ensure a wider uptake of these actions will be encouraged in non-participating farms and non-farming landowners, thus increasing the reach of the project and supporting improved biodiversity management within the community. The project will run for a 12 month period beginning later this year.

NEW CAMPAIGN TO STAMP OUT LITTER AT KERRY'S BEACHES

Everyone visiting beaches in Kerry this summer is encouraged to 'Give Your Litter A Lift' and to ensure that coastal areas remain free of litter over the coming months. The local authority will be increasing the number of litter bins available at beaches across the county but is also appealing to all beach users to act responsibly by taking litter home. New signage promoting the anti-litter message has been erected at all Blue Flag beaches this week.

Kerry was recently awarded a total of 14 prestigious Blue Flags in recognition of the quality of beaches in the county and the local authority is appealing to play their part in retaining those honours. The Mayor of Kerry, Cllr Patrick Connor-Scarsteen said everyone has a role to play. "We hope that this summer everyone

can enjoy our beach environments in a safe way and that visitors to these beautiful amenities will leave nothing behind but their footprints. Kerry County Council is playing its part by providing extra bins to dispose of litter and there will also be extended opening hours at public conveniences at our beaches.

"So, the message is simple, when you are heading home: give your litter a lift," he said.

Director of Environment with Kerry County Council, John Breen said that the local authority recognises the need to ensure that everyone can enjoy the beach environment in Kerry as the county focuses on outdoor activities over the coming months.

"We have so much to offer our visitors and those who live in the county. So, we are appealing to everyone to take litter home, to take away dog

foul and dispose of it properly, and to avoid anything that would damage our beaches. We have already stepped out our monitoring of beaches and a significant number of fines have issued to, for example, so-called boy racers, but our first approach always remains encouragement of good behaviour in the first place, so that everyone can enjoy a safe beach experience," said Mr Breen.

Meanwhile, 41 lifeguards, who are all fully trained and certified by Water Safety Ireland, took up their duties at Blue Flag beaches at the weekend. They are rostered for all beaches between noon and 7pm on weekends and 11am and 7pm from Monday to Friday and will be on duty until the end of the bathing season (on the second weekend of September).



WHAT KIND OF INSURANCE DOES A FARMER NEED?



All underwriters offering Farm Insurance now offer package policies with optional extras depending on the type of farming conducted. Here is a brief outline of the types of cover usually required.



Property damage cover

Your residential property can be insured under a farm policy once the property is owner occupied and fits the acceptance criteria. Farm outbuildings can also be included for cover against fire and storm. For most insurers they will review the storm cover element on a case by case basis depending on the construction material used and the year of construction. The sum insured for farm buildings & outbuildings should be reviewed annually as rebuilding costs are increasing. There is also scope under the property section to cover farm machinery, utensils and loss of or damage to growing crops.

Livestock

Cover can be arranged for fatal accident to livestock against fire, lightning, explosion, storm, electrocution, and loss in transit. Optional covers can include theft and sheep worrying.

Employers, Public and Products liability

Employer's liability can be included on farm policies and can include family and non-family workers. Public liability will cover your legal liability to members of the public and is rated on total acreage farmed. Products liability will cover your legal liability as a result of a defective product supplied. Cover can be extended for loss of your own milk if rejected by the co-op due to accidental contamination by antibiotic residue and failure of the co-op to collect.

Tractors and agricultural vehicles

Cover can be arranged for third party, fire and theft and comprehensive cover for farm vehicles. Some insurers can also cover older farm jeeps.

Forestry

Some insurers can offer cover for fire, storm and reinstatement cover for forestry. The premium is based upon acreage, type of forestry planted, age and fire protections in place. LEMON CHEESECAKE

Ingredients

For the base

- 100g melted butter
- 300g digestive biscuits

For the cheesecake mix

- 100g of icing sugar
- 600g cream cheese
- 250ml double cream
- 75ml lemon juice (3 lemons)

Method

1. Mix the melted butter with the mashed digestive biscuits and pour them into a spring form tin and flatten down with wooden spoon and place in the fridge to set.
 2. Whip the double cream in a bowl and set aside
 3. In another bowl mix the cream cheese and icing sugar until fully mixed together
 4. Pour in the lemon juice and mix together
 5. Next fold in the whipped cream into the mix and mix together again
 6. Pour the cheesecake mix over the biscuit in the tin and smooth the top with a spoon
 7. Place in the fridge for 4 to 6 hours or overnight
- For the topping you can add some grated lemon zest and whipped cream on top

COURGETTE AND MUSHROOM PILAF

Ingredients

- 2 tbsp oil
- Salt and Pepper
- 150g mixed mushrooms
- 2 courgettes diced
- 2 garlic cloves crushed
- 2 teaspoons smoked paprika
- 1 cinnamon stick broken in half
- ½ teaspoon chilli flakes
- 200g kale chopped
- 300g brown rice
- 600ml boiling water (Salad leaves to serve)

Method

Heat the oil in the pan add the onions and fry for 3 minutes. Add the mushrooms and season with salt and pepper fry for another 2 minutes. Add the courgette, garlic and all the spices and mix well for 2 minutes. Add in your rice and boiling water. Bring to a boil and then simmer for about 25 minutes or until all the water is absorbed. Stir in the kale and stir in for another 2 minutes or so. Remove the two halves of the cinnamon stick before serving. I served with some green salad leaves this rice is delicious and has a nice spicy kick from the chilli flakes.





THE IMPORTANCE OF PELVIC MOBILITY IN THE GOLF SWING

One of the first things we test as part of the TPI golf screen is a golfer's ability to pelvic tilt and also to perform pelvic rotations.

A golfer's ability to not only move their pelvis but also to be able to control the movement and position is vitally important when it comes to power transfer from the lower body to the upper body.

The funny thing is that the for example the Pelvic Tilt test looks so simple but it's surprising how many people fail the test, even though they feel that they are doing the movement correctly. In tests carried out by TPI on almost 20,000 amateur golfers 36% showed limitations in both parts of the movement, compared to 4.8% of PGA tour players having similar issues.

Things we look for would include poor co-ordination, lumbar spine mobility and the possibility of the golfer having lower crossed syndrome which is usually a muscle imbalance problem affecting the pelvis.

Pelvic rotation is also assessed as we look at the golfer's ability to rotate the upper and lower body independently of one another as it's an important skill for correct sequencing in the downswing.

A golfer's inability to correctly perform pelvic rotations can mean they could laterally move in the swing, which would lead to a sway in the backswing or a slide in the downswing. Either of these will make it more difficult to swing consistently and impact on power. What we want to do is make the golfer more consistent, more powerful which in turn will lead to a more efficient swing.

SUMMER EYES

As the weather gets warmer and the days grow longer, we often think about improving our health and getting into better shape. As you prepare to enjoy the outdoors this summer, don't forget a plan for keeping your eyes happy as well.

Avoid getting "sunburn of the eye."

When sunlight shines off water, sand or other highly reflective surfaces into your eyes, it can cause a very painful condition called photokeratitis. This is when the sun's ultraviolet rays burn the surface of your eye. Pain, redness, blurriness and even temporary vision loss are symptoms of this condition. Prevent photokeratitis by wearing sunglasses that are marked "100% UV protection." Also, wear a broad-brimmed hat for added eye protection.

Prevent "swimmer's eye" in the pool.

Pools can be tough on the eyes. Chemicals used to keep the water clean, such as chlorine, can affect the natural tear film that keeps our eyes moist and healthy. The result can be Red, gritty-feeling eyes and blurry vision. Keep eyes feeling and looking good by wearing swim goggles in the pool, and splash your closed eyes with fresh water immediately after getting out of the pool.

Keep dry eye at bay.

Spending time outside when it is hot, dry or windy can irritate a common condition called dry eye. A hot, dry environment

affects the tear film, drying out the eye's surface. To protect your eyes in these conditions, wear wrap-around glasses to keep wind from your eye's surface. Also, use artificial tears (preferably those that are preservative-free) to keep eyes moist and refreshed.

Don't play around with eye safety.

Spending more time outside often means more outdoor work and play. Whether mowing the lawn, trimming weeds or playing baseball, always wear the proper protective eyewear.

More than half of all eye injuries occur at home, yet only about one out of every three people wears eye protection when they should. Don't be an eye injury statistic!

Quit smoking

When thinking about getting healthy this summer, think about quitting smoking. Cigarette smoke, including second-hand smoke, not only worsens dry eye, but is a risk factor for many eye diseases, including cataracts, macular degeneration and more. Quitting smoking reduces your risk of getting eye disease and other major health problems.





PLAYERS INJURY FUND

I wish to confirm that a GAA Players "Loss of Wages Cover" will be re-instated back into the GAA Player Injury Fund with effect from 1st June 2021. It will form part of the GAA "Players Injury Fund" in line with previous years and will see the associated cover benefits restored in full. Following representations made by clubs and members of Ard Chomhairle in relation to the pause placed on the "Loss of Wages Cover"

in January 2021, a ballot of Ard Chomhairle was held last week to determine the preferred option that would see this cover fully restored. The option selected by Ard Chomhairle will see a 25% levy applied to a clubs Adult and U20 team registration costs with all claims being fully administered from within the existing GAA player Injury Fund and not via a separate Insurance Policy. This will see an Adult team registration cost increase from €1,000 to €1,250 and an U20 team registration increase from €200 to €250. There will be no increases applied to juvenile team rates. The 2021/22 Player Injury Fund term will run from 1 June 2021 to 31 May 2022. Injury cover will commence once a player is registered on the Foireann system.

Payment of your clubs 2021/22 Player Injury Fund premium will be due by the 20 th August and invitation invoices for team renewals will issue this week. I trust the above is in order and thank all units for their engagement with this matter over the last number of months.





Kerry finished this game in cruise control, but things looked ominous for them early on. A good move by Kerry saw Wexford keeper Sarah Merrigan forced into a good save, but a foul on Louise Ní Muircheartaigh in the build-up saw her slot over the free instead. However, Siofra O'Shea came off with a worrying injury – the Southern Gaels star, just out of minor, has been brilliant for Kerry this year and would be a huge loss. To compound matters, a ball in by the excellent Roisín Murphy was fisted to the Kerry net by Aisling Murphy, and Kerry were two points down. EXAM STRESS - SOME TIPS FOR PARENTS AND STUDENTS

For Parents

Exams are here and will be over before we know it. The best way to support your teen at this time is to make home life as calm and pleasant as you can. You may notice that although you are desperate to know how the exam went, it's wise not to launch into an inquisition – so give your teen some space. Feeding them healthy snacks and good nutritious food will all be very welcome. Make sure they eat a good breakfast on the morning of the exam. Be sure to remind your child to take study breaks and get some fresh air to help clear the mind. After an hour or two of study, let them chill out but within reason. They need to switch off from exam student mode too. It's ok to be a couch potato at this time.

A good night's sleep is vital before an exam, so make sure your child isn't staying up late. Encourage an early night but don't let it turn into an argument. Insisting your eighteen year old goes to bed at 11pm doesn't really work, especially if he/she is not able to get to sleep and ends up tossing and turning until 4am. On the other hand it is not good either to turn a blind eye to 'gaming' until the early hours. Remind them that the brain needs at least 7 hours to absorb what they have learnt and to function well the next day. Lack of sleep can cause concentration and memory problems. Often, the study done after midnight is wasted.

For Students

The Psychological Society of Ireland offers some last minutes tips and advice to students how long to study. They advise students to study "regularly and briefly - rather than "cramming" at the last minute. Try to study in blocks of time which do not exceed your concentration span. For example, break up a study session into periods of about 50 minutes each." They also offer valuable advice to gain control over the exam situation as follows: "Ignore what other people do in the exam. Do not look around you in the exam-hall when the papers are handed out and do not pay any attention to students who request extra paper from the exam supervisors. Remember that it is the quality rather than quantity of the answer that attracts good marks. In any case, many "hand raisers" write on only one side of a page or perhaps skip every second line of their answer book. So, be selfish in an exam - ignore everyone else."

National League Semi-Final: Kerry v Tyrone, Saturday, 5.00pm, Fitzgerald Stadium

So.....they were our fiercest rivals for quite a time, and there was a bit of sincerity in the rivalry, too. Tyrone could quite justifiably feel that there was resentment to these confident upstarts with no real winning tradition. And there was. The only thing Mickey Harte ever did to Kerry was win. But at the same time, it wasn't nice football to watch. The blanket defence strangled our game, really. It was hugely successful, and you can be sure and certain that Kerry would not have hesitated to use it. In point of fact, we have been doing exactly that for quite a while now, and so does every other team, including Dublin. Before anyone gets on their high horse, take a snapshot of any time an opposition team are in a Kerry half, and tell me how Kerry players are back there as well? The difference is that Mickey Harte relied on a form of counter-attack for scores, whereas Dublin in particular accelerated the transition from defence to attack.

Except that this isn't Mickey Harte's team, not anymore. And that will be interesting in itself. Feargal Lohan and Brian Dooher have big boots to fill. And in all fairness, Cathal McShane out for the season with an injury is their equivalent of us losing David Clifford, let's be clear on that. Understandably enough, this is being billed as a cracker. And I do think that both managements will want a win. At this stage, you don't want the supporters questioning you, and you certainly don't want the players questioning themselves. This is when you want them really starting to believe that they can win the All Ireland.

Tyrone haven't actually been going all that great. Donegal beat them by two points. I don't think that Donegal team have quite the right gel and synchronicity in them yet, but I'm sure that they have the components and they are quite a long way down the right road, but I think they are closer than Tyrone. The big find for Tyrone was Paul Donaghy, who scored 0-10 in that game. A good forward named Donaghy Have you ever heard the likes of it? Donaghy is the first Tyrone player in quite a while that didn't come through their development system. Paudie Clifford is our own equivalent.

Mind you, I do think Kerry has a bit more fluidity and a wider variety of voices in our underage coaching set-ups; Tyrone's was more rigid.

They beat Armagh, which would be predictable enough these days, but they struggled. It was 2-15 to 2-10, and Armagh missed a penalty as well – in that it was saved, calling it a 'miss' is unfair on goalkeepers like Niall Morgan. Darren McCurry was the main scorer, while Mark Bradley was superb off the bench.

They finished with a 0-14 apiece draw with Monaghan. A bit more of a default Tyrone, with a bit more emphasis on numbers in defence. Not quite a reversion, but not quite as adventurous, and that's the approach I'm expecting tomorrow as well. They won't be risking the baby with the bathwater.

If they take a defensive approach, they'll be playing into our hands. Kerry have struggled of late against a high press, and I'd actually hope that Tyrone go for the slightly more risky, but I think much more profitable approach for them. We'd learn more lessons from it. Frankly, this is a nothing game. I have no interest in shared titles in a cobbled-together League of what is really warm-up games.

The significance of this one is how it will stand to us going forward, and I expect Kerry at home to have about three points to spare here at the end of a good game, despite the loss (very harshly, in my opinion) of Tadgh Morley. Kerry have a phenomenal record at the Fitzgerald Stadium. The biggest thing, and Peter Keane has quite rightly made no bones about this right from the start of the competition, is not to pick up any injuries.

There was only one thing we all wanted from this game, and to be honest it wasn't particularly about a win. Like Cian, Leah has represented the county in several codes, including gaelic football (she won the County Cumann na mBunscoil Skills Competition in 2019), soccer, and, of course, basketball.

SOCCKER

Well, whatever shall we talk about?

Yeah, let's start with Andorra.

Ireland 4 Andorra 0

It has roughly the same population as Galway – the city, not the county. Imagine Stephen Kenny's team taking on Galway United? It's well known for its skiing. Soccer? Not so much. Andorra have just three wins in competitive matches, all of them 1-0. I'm not talking about in the recent campaigns. I literally mean they have only won three competitive games in their entire history. Their domestic league is composed of part-timers.

So watching them actually outplay Ireland was....well, we're a bit past the worrying stage, aren't we? Our midfield was very poor, to be honest. We keep hearing about the new tactical approach and keeping it on the ground and linking the passes.....yeah, I'm not seeing it. And our forwards looked even worse. In fairness, Ireland did create more chances. Robbie Keane would have cheerfully completed a hat-trick with consummate ease – Robbie was under-appreciated in his time, but he was always sharp and composed. But it was Andorra who looked the calmer side in possession, and that should be a real concern. Ireland's defence did well for the most part, but the defending for their goal....we have all but one player back defending a free kick, and you let a guy have a free header in the most dangerous position? Ah, lads! I'm not joking when I say you'd be unhappy to see your U11 team do that.

1-0 down to Andorra. I like Stephen Kenny – he's been given an awful hand by the failures of the FAI and I'm appalled at the relentless pressure being put on him, no-one should have to live with that. I also think that no-one should talk about getting rid of him without telling me who is going to replace him and yeah, Denis O'Brien isn't going to donate a huge salary this time. But if we lose to Andorra? I'm afraid even Dundalk FC – who are in the weeds themselves

right now – would think twice about taking him back. In fact, it was a weak Irish team, with a lot of senior players unavailable – I can tell you straight out that if I was the club paying a players' wages, I wouldn't want them called away to play in this kind of meaningless game. Thankfully, we didn't. In fact, Ireland were humming with confidence by the finish. Troy Parrott was Ireland's star on the night and his goal arrived just minutes later to calm the nerves. The pass to him had a touch of luck in taking a deflection, but he still had a lot to do – I actually thought he had delayed the shot too long and wasted the chance, but he picked the perfect spot and neatly fired it in. His second goal arrived again in a few minutes after a good cross by Conor Hourihane. It was a relatively easy one to nod home and Parrott did so. I've thought Parrott a bit overrated – he was yet another young lad suddenly plucked out as our next superstar; we have a bad habit of doing that and I always ask why Premiership clubs aren't interested if that's the case – but they were two decent goals. Andorra's part-timers seemed deflated after the goal and, as very often happens in these games, they ran out of steam against the professionals, with Jason Knight and Daryl Horgan also on target. They were poor goals to give away – but great goals for us, because after our scoring drought, players could leave the pitch with a bit of confidence – it's been a while since that happened!

Ireland 0 Hungary 0

Hungary (ironically, one of the few teams actually beaten by Andorra once upon a time, by coincidence!) have qualified for the Euros. This is a big chance to take that confidence after pretty much doubling the goal tally of Stephen Kenny's reign in close enough to a half hour, and put it up to the kind of team that we once would have been considered favourites against.

No goal on either side. And to be honest, not all that many goal chances, despite RTE trying to inflate potential moments. In fact, one of Ireland's best players on the night had the best chance, and it was none other than John Egan just five minutes in, crashing his header off the crossbar. Let us just whisper it.....I reckon his Dad would have put that in....

Both Irish keepers had to make great saves, no doubt about that, but a couple of the saves that were hailed as miraculous by the commentators as wonderful were fairly bread and butter. Listen, I honestly found the game a bit 'meh', to be honest. Don't misunderstand me – that isn't a criticism. I'm just saying that there were no daring tactical moves, no genius moments of individual skill. There is no moment where you could show it on video and show it to neutral fans of soccer from other countries and they would go "Wow! You should become a you tuber!".

For the first time in a very long time. I actually saw real, actual positives in this game, far more than the Andorra match. Midfield was a big improvement and a lot more assured. You still don't have a real dominant central midfielder, a pivot. You don't have a willingness to take players on. But they were claiming responsibility



and calling for the ball (a crucial element as far as I am concerned – on the hard days, make sure you are in the thick of it). Knight, a player I have been very sceptical of, stepped up. I'm not saying he's a definite or ready for the big guns, but he is better than I had rated him. Cullen, although still not great, was a lot better. Our defence has actually been fairly decent over the past while; that hasn't been our problem. But McClean, playing with more space (in GAA terms, he was more a wingback than a corner back here), was a massive improvement on recent games. He's one player who does look reinvigorated by confidence and he gave great leadership. Bazunu was still our best player in the first half, though, and that says something to me.

At the same time, Ireland seemed to have a more pragmatic approach to me. And just a personal bugbear, but most soccer commentators have it completely wrong in using 'pragmatism' as the opposite of 'flair'. It isn't. It really isn't. Ireland's approach under O'Neill and McCarthy was solid but no more than that, and we don't have any top quality goalscorers at the moment and I'm sorry, but that really is something no manager can do anything about. So changing it was the right way to go. But it turned out that we really don't have actual ball-carriers of this level. We simply aren't able to do it. It's like picking small forwards and thinking that high balls into the box are your best route of attack. It's not going to work.

The system felt looser here. Not a complete return to the old ways – which, as I say, were not working – but a concession towards it. In other words, a pragmatic decision.

Ireland, even though we got a scare near the end, with Kelliher doing well to save, felt the more likely side to win at that stage. Now, that's not a good sign for Hungary. Are you kidding me? Have you seen who is in their group? Seriously. Let's just say that the Portugal side that includes Bernardo Silva, Bruno Fernandes, Diogo Jota, Joao Felix, Joao Moutinho, Ruben Dias, and some lad called Cristiano Ronaldo, are considered Hungary's best chance for a win. But that's not our problem.

We're in a well, not a good place as a national team, but we felt like a real, competitive team again. That, frankly, hasn't happened in a long time.

BOXING

Aidan and Michaela Walsh, both of whom box with the Monkstown Club in Belfast, made Irish boxing history by becoming the first brother and sister to represent Ireland at the Olympics in the sport. Jessie Barr qualified for the 2012 Olympics in athletics and her brother Thomas qualified four years later and has qualified for this year's competition as well this week along with Michelle Finn. The Hooper brothers Pat and Dick both ran for Ireland at the 1980 Olympics.

Brendan Irvine, Kurt Walker, Aoife O'Rourke, Kellie Harrington (gold medal winner at the Olympic qualifiers in Paris last Tuesday. Though she had already qualified for Tokyo on Saturday), and Emmet Byrne are the other boxers on the Irish team. Boxing has traditionally been our best Olympic sport. Of the 31 medals we have won in total, 16 have been won in boxing. John McNally (silver 1952), Fred Tiedt (silver 1956), Tony 'Socks' Byrne (bronze 1956) John Caldwell (bronze 1956), Freddie Gilroy (1956), Jim

McCourt (bronze, 1964), Hugh Russell (bronze, 1980), Michael Carruth (gold, 1992), Wayne McCullough (silver, 1992), Kenneth Egan (silver, 2008), Darren Sutherland, bronze 2008), Paddy Barnes (bronze in both 2008 and 2012), Katie Taylor (gold, 2012), John Joe Nevin (silver 2012), and Michael Conlan (bronze 2012) all stood on the podium at some stage. Of course, the badly handled departure of Billy Walsh had a severe impact. The judging in the boxing was one of the biggest talking points after the Rio Games (I still say that while Michael Conlan was by far the more aggressive fighter, he didn't actually land as many of those punches as people think) but the reason for Ireland's poor results is a bit more obvious, it seems to me.

I'm afraid I let you all down a bit because I can't comment on the Floyd Mayweather half piggyback/half boxing match – an exhibition bout where one fighter lighter carried the other for most of it. I was going to watch it, but I'm afraid my brain kicked in and absolutely refused point blank to watch that rubbish.

SWIMMING

I'll admit that swimming is not a sport that I give too much attention to – in fact, like most people, I could only have named Michael Phelps, Ian Thorpe, and Killarney's own Niamh O'Sullivan.

But my heart goes out to Ireland's four x 100m mens' relay team. They and the 200m freestyle mens' team were invited by FINA to join the twelve automatically qualified teams. Ireland's 100m team were initially told they had received one of the four remaining spots after their time at the European Championships in Budapest last month, but they have now been told that FINA had overlooked a faster time clocked up by Greece in a meet in Athens afterwards. Switzerland's medley team have been told the same thing.

Look, young people dedicate their lives to reaching the Olympics. God rest the great Murt O'Shea from Kilgarvan, an absolutely lovely man. We would chat for hours about the Olympics. He could name all of Ireland's medallists and name most other Irish participants straight off the top of his head.

To get there is the pinnacle of dreams. But to get there, to qualify for it, and then have that invitation withdrawn because of an error? That's heartbreak. And look, I don't like being the one to say it (believe me, I have made many, many mistakes) but this is disgraceful. Ireland are appealing, and I hope they succeed.
