

THRILLING WEEKEND AT THE KERRY WAY ULTRA MARATHON

AN AMAZING 200KM NON STOP ENDURANCE RACE ADDITIVE VIEWING FOR 65,000 VIRTUAL FANS

Live Tracking of Athletes who competed in The Kerry Way Ultra Marathon, provided a thrilling weekend of additive viewing for fans and family. The Ultra Marathon is a gruelling 200Km non stop Ultra Marathon. Forty-Six Elite runners departed Killarney town and raced solidly for 40 hours! but in 26 hrs and 36 mins later, Barry Murray, Dublin became the first runner home.

Their epic journey of The Kerry Way, had begun, the runners traversed hills, streams, the mountains of the MacGillycuddy's Reeks, bogs, ancient trails, the magnificent scenery of the Iveragh Peninsula, along the Wild Atlantic Way. Even with torches, their night navigation was helped by friendly banter from the local marshals, guiding them through, Waterville, Caherdaniel, Sneem and Blackwater.

The Athletes had their own support crews at various junctions along the route, so the craic and camaraderie provided a great source of entertainment, especially during the night watch. Athletes from Ireland, England, South Africa, Israel, and Europe, endured the most challenging of ultra marathons in Ireland. The Kerry Way Ultra Marathon has already been awarded 4 points by the prestigious Ultra Trail du Mont Blanc (UTMB) which is a testament to the severity of the race.

"CREDIT UNIONS OFFER SAVINGS **STUDENT LOANS"**

With the latest round of CAO offers out, many parents are now considering their finance options when sending their children to college. A recent survey released from the Irish League of Credit Unions (ILCU) stated that approximately six-out-of-10 parents get into debt to cover college costs.

Killarney Credit Union is more than €400.00 cheaper in interest than the main banks.

The most expensive banks to borrow €11,000 from are KBC Bank, Permanent TSB and Ulster Bank. KBC charges 12.7pc interest on a loan of €11,000 (unless you qualify for its discounted rate of 10.5pc). Borrowing €11,000 over five years at an interest rate of 12.7pc will cost you

€3,687 in interest - almost €1,540 more than

Permanent TSB charges 12.5pc interest on a standard personal loan of €11,000 - which will cost you €3,614 over five years. Killarney Credit Union is by far the cheapest option for educational lending with a rate of 6.2% APR with interest of €1,732.20 over the 5 year term for a loan of €11,000.

In addition, to offering competitive loan rates, Killarney Credit Union is offering an educational bursary of €1,000 to 4 lucky students who are entering 3rd level for the first time. 'BACK TO SCHOOL' ADVICE

The RSA also has the following 'back to school' advice for parents, guardians and children:

TRAVELLING BY CAR

All children should be restrained when travelling in a car;

Select a restraint that is based on your child's weight and height and is suitable for the type of car:

Remember its safer if children travel in the rear of a car:

Never leave children alone in a car.

WALKING TO SCHOOL

Small children should not cross roads alone. They cannot decide how far away a car is or how fast it is going;

Walk the route to school with them in advance:

Children walking on country roads should wear reflective armbands and bright clothing;

If there is no footpath, walk on the righthand side of the road facing oncoming traffic keeping as close as possible to the side of the

Show your child how to cross the road by example. Choose safe places to cross and take time to explain why i.e. footbridges, zebra or pelican crossings, lollipop lady/man or junior school warden patrol.

TRAVELLING BY BUS

Teach children to take special care getting on or off a bus or mini-bus;

While waiting for a bus, children should stand well in off the road;

Before crossing the road they should wait until the bus has moved off and they can see clearly in both directions:

If seatbelts are fitted, they must be worn.

CYCLE SAFETY

Make sure they are highly visible by wearing a reflective belt and bright clothes and wear a bicycle safety helmet on all journeys;

Check that the bicycle's brakes, lights, reflector and bell are in good working order.

- Start off with getting out for a brisk walk 30mins a day for 5 x days, and pick times and days you will stick to eg. After you have dropped the kids off to school. PAST EXPERIENCE CRITICAL FACTOR IN FARM MACHINERY **PURCHASES**

New study finds main non-economic factor in purchase decision is farmer's own experience with a brand or machine

The most important factor in determining what agricultural machine a farmer will purchase is their (and their close friends' and colleagues') own experience, and this was reflected in their loyalty to the leading Irish brands.

Farm machinery dealers, on the other hand, took the view that after sales service was the critical factor in the purchase decision. Dealers are the main source of initial information on new machines, but farmers look to their own or their friends' past experience first when making up their mind.

Nevertheless, the research showed that younger farmers are not as brand loyal as their predecessors, and are comfortable buying new brands; their search behaviour is also much more intensive than ever before; they research the market and they want to 'test-drive' or see demonstrations of machines before committing themselves.

This study, just published by Kate Gaynor, MD of paint manufacturer Advanced Coatings, breaks new ground, as no academic or commercial study has ever examined the factors in Ireland that determine a farmer's decision-making process when making a capital purchase of farm machinery.

The most significant structural change in Irish farms has been the increase in farm size and a reduction in numbers employed. It follows that farmers are increasingly dependent on mechanization on the farm and the consistent increase in machinery ownership figures bears this out.

This is a market of key importance, both internationally and nationally. The value of the global market is expected to exceed €196bn (\$220bn) by 2017. The Irish agricultural machinery market is strong, generating exports of over €100m in 2010, and competition is intense among manufacturers and dealers. This study will be of immense value to agrimarketers in helping them to understand purchasing behaviours.

Enterprise Ireland concluded that Irish-made farm machinery 'tends to be more rugged and built to a higher specification' than anywhere in the world - possibly because of the poor quality of land here. As a result products tend to be superior on high quality land in other countries, which is a serious export advantage for Irish manufacturers. It is noteworthy that good quality technology is now expected and taken for granted in this market, making it less of a critical factor in the purchase decision.

"Farmers are complex purchasers who blur the lines between commercial and retail buyers", said Kate Gaynor who carried out the recent study. "Farmers' capital purchase decisions are not necessarily as objective as they are in the industrial world. They are influenced by many psychological and social factors deriving from their own experience".

"Marketers of farm machinery need to engage more with farmers when they are considering a new purchase. Citizens Information

Know Your Rights: CYCLING OFFENCES

QUESTION

I'm a regular cyclist. What are the new cycling offences and what are the fines?

ANSWER

Like other road users, cyclists must obey the existing rules that apply to traffic lights, pedestrian crossings, zebra crossings and cycle traffic lights. You must stop at stop signs and give way at yield signs. There are also rules about the equipment a bicycle must have. These rules are set out in various laws and regulations.

There are no new cycling offences but, since 31 July 2015, certain cycling offences have been declared to be fixed charge offences. The fixed charge system allows you to pay a fixed charge or fine instead of going to court to answer the offence.

The cycling offences to which a fixed charge applies are:

- No front or rear light during lighting-up hours.
- Riding a bicycle without reasonable consideration.
- Failing to stop for a school warden sign.
- Failing to stop at traffic lights when the red lamp is lit.
- Failing to stop at cycle traffic lights when the red lamp is lit.
- Failing to stop at a stop line, barrier or half barrier at a railway level crossing, swing bridge or lifting bridge, when the red lamps are flashing
- Cycling in a pedestrianised street or area.

If you are stopped by a Garda who suspects you have committed a cycling offence you must give your name, address and date of birth when requested.

The fixed charge for a cycling offence is currently €40. If you receive a fixed charge notice, you have 28 days from the date of the issue of the fixed charge notice to pay the fine. If it is not paid within 28 days, the charge is increased by 50%. If it is still unpaid after a further 28 days then court proceedings are initiated. If you pay the fixed charge within the legal time limits and court proceedings are not commenced, you will not have a criminal record in respect of the offence.

- Develop good relationships and nurture them. Learn the art of networking (not just online), understand its value. This is your support system that will come to your help when you need it, besides giving you a sense of assurance.
- · Sleep well: Parties, disco, outing and all is fine, but taking a sufficient sleep helps you in keeping a fit body and sharp mind. A good night's sleep gives you the capability to deal with stressful situations in an appropriate and timely manner. You cannot expect a tired mind to come up with constructive solutions. Besides, lack of sleep lowers efficiency, reduces learning power and blunts the memory, giving you more reasons to be stressed
- Take a balanced view: Teen stress management is also about keeping realistic expectations and keeping in mind your strengths and weaknesses helps. If you commit yourself to too many goals, you are creating a sure recipe for tensions, and anxieties. Be realistic in your expectations and keep some time away for relaxing and enjoyable activities, even if it means spending an hour with other family members.

FLU VACCINATION INFORMATION

WHAT IS INFLUENZA (FLU)?

Influenza is a highly infectious acute respiratory illness caused by the influenza virus. Influenza affects people of all ages. Outbreaks of influenza occur almost every year, usually in winter. This is why it is also known as seasonal flu.

HOW SERIOUS IS FLU?

Flu is often self limiting with most people recovering in 2-7 days. However, flu can be severe and can cause serious illness and death, especially in the very young and in the elderly. Serious respiratory complications can develop, including pneumonia and bronchitis, to which older people and those with certain chronic medical conditions are particularly susceptible. Pregnant women have also been found to be at increased risk of the complications of flu. Some people may need hospital treatment and a number of mainly older people die from influenza each winter.

HOW DO PEOPLE CATCH FLU?

Flu is a highly infectious illness. A person carrying the virus can spread the illness by coughing or sneezing. A person can spread the virus from 1-2 days before they develop symptoms and for up to a week after symptoms develop.

WHO IS MOST AT RISK FROM FLU?

Anyone can get the flu but it is more severe in people aged 65 years and over and anyone with a chronic medical condition. Chronic medical conditions include chronic heart conditions, chronic respiratory disease, diabetes mellitus and immunosupression due to disease or treatment. Pregnant women have also been found to be at increased risk of the complications of flu. These groups of people are targeted for influenza vaccination.

HOW CAN FLU BE PREVENTED?

Flu can be prevented by vaccination. Flu vaccine is a safe, effective way to help prevent flu infection, avoiding hospitalisation, reducing flu related deaths and illnesses.

WHAT IS THE SEASONAL (ANNUAL) FLU VACCINE?

Each year the seasonal (annual) flu vaccine contains three common influenza virus strains. The flu virus changes each year, this is why a new flu vaccine has to be given each year.



RIDDING YOUR HOUSE OF **FLIES**

Just in case the long promised warm spell arrives - when the weather's hot, just like people, flies prefer to go indoors feeding on your food, spreading germs and generally annoying you. These unhygienic nuisances can be killed off with toxic solutions but there are other ways to get rid of flies that ensure your home remains pest free and clean.

 Make an anti-fly potpourri - Having potpourri gives a lovely scent to your home. If you mix the right ingredients, they can also keep the flies away.

Mix together cloves, clover blossoms, eucalyptus and bay leaves in a bowl. You can also place them in a netting bag and hang them in locations where flies often buzz about. To help release new bursts of odour crush the leaves occasionally. Every few months refresh the bowl or net bag with new leaves, spices, and blossoms.

Remove unknown attractants - Make sure your compost buckets are covered so that no flies can swoop in and lay eggs. Maggots can prosper in your well intentioned scrap collection. Similarly, make sure your pets food bowls are not left open when your pet isn't eating. Any uneaten wet food or even dry foods are appealing for flies. Always keep the bowl clean because even crumbs can attract hungry flies.

The next thing to do is make sure your kitchen has no hidden exposed food sources. Flies will linger around the kitchen, waiting if they sense a source of food, so cover any cakes, biscuits or cut fruit. Regularly check the fruit and vegetables you don't refrigerate for bruises or rot. Make sure to scrape leftovers and crumbs into your brown bin (or other closed container if you are feeding the birds etc) straightaway, and instruct all household members to do the same. One person can undo all your hard work by leaving a dirty plate or glass out.

Plants - Some plants have strong odours that flies really dislike. For people, these herbs and plants provide a fragrant scent to the home, so this solution doesn't require you to have foul odoured plants. Place plants such as mint or basil near the entrance to deter flies from coming into the home. It's also a good idea to place these plants at the back entrances. You can also keep crushed mint in your kitchen to keep flies away when you're cooking and preparing a meal.

Flies also dislike sprigs of lavender leaves, tansy, pennyroyal, and rue. If you don't like herbs, tomato plants and castor oil are also known to repel flies. It's more effective when these are crushed because the odours are more airborne.

DEVOTED MOTHER DEER **DEFIES HUNTER'S ATTEMPT** ON HER LIFE

A dedicated mother deer who survived for nearly a year with an arrow lodged in her face has finally gotten the help she so desperately needed.

The doe, named Grace, was first spotted in New Jersey last November carrying that unmistakable relic from a recent near-death experience at the hands of a bow hunter. Incredibly, even after the attempt on her life and the cumbersome arrow it left behind, Grace continued to persevere in the wild, even giving birth to a fawn in her injured state.

Video Footage taken just last month shows Grace continuing to raise her offspring, who appeared well taken care of despite his mother's condition.

Wildlife officials had initially tried to track Grace down to remove the arrow, but their efforts were fruitless. Still, nine months later, the deer's painful plight wasn't forgotten by those who knew she still needed to be helped. A petition was launched on Care2.org urging state Department of Environmental Protection officers to act — and the response was overwhelming. More than 100,000 people from around the world added their signatures on Grace's behalf, an outpouring of support which ultimately spurred officials to take action once and for all.

New Jersey Division of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) have announced that it had succeeded in tracking Grace down and was finally able to help right the wrong she'd been made to endure for so long. After tranquilising her with a dart, experts carefully removed the arrow shaft from her face, opting to leave the arrow head in place since her flesh had healed around it.

Fortunately, both Grace and her fawn were found to be healthy and were released back into the wild. Though her maternal devotion kept her going despite the arrow she'd had to carry, now she can once again thrive - a happy ending made possible because of folks who refused to stop caring.

ELEPHANTSMASHES HOUSE THEN SAVES CRYING BABY

In March 2014 a rampaging elephant smashed a house in an Indian village, but when it heard a crying baby, the animal turned back and carefully removed the debris from the infant's

Dipak Mahato and his wife, Lalita, were eating dinner when they heard cracking and crashing sounds coming from the bedroom.

"We ran over and were shocked to see the wall in pieces and a tusker standing over our baby," Dipak said. "She was crying and there were huge chunks of the wall lying all around and on the cot."

The elephant, which forest officials said had killed three people, pulled the rubble from the 10-month-old and then headed back into the forest.

"I can't believe that the tusker saved my daughter after breaking down the door and smashing a wall." Lalita said. "We watched amazed as it gently removed the debris that had fallen on her. It's a miracle."

The couple took their daughter to the hospital where she was treated for external injuries but otherwise found to be in good health.

Conflict has increased in parts of India in recent years because villages have expanded into land that's part of the elephants' migration

Herds routinely raid farms and destroy houses, but rarely attack people.

"Unless people attack an elephant, these gentle giants do not harm human beings. They only come down here in search of food," said forestry official Purulia Prokash.

Six months earlier villagers from India's Madarihat reported that an elephant herd carefully removed a little girl from harm's way before smashing several houses.

HOW TO MAKE YOUR AND YOUR DOG'S LIVES EASIER

Slow down your dog's fast eating by placing

a ball in their food bowl - Some pups just love to gobble their food at the speed of light, which makes them throw up later. Slow down this habit by placing a ball in the bowl. They'll move it around as they eat and this can slow them down.

- Tweezers for ticks Dog owners all try to protect their pets from ticks, but sometimes they leech onto your dog. When this happens, grab a tweezer and grab the tick with it to pull them off. Twist counter-clock-wise for best results. Your dog's immune system against ticks is strong, but its still wise to rub the bitten area with some rubbing alcohol.
- Get rid of static electricity on your dog's coat with dryer sheets - Humans may not like the rain and loud thunder caused by thunderstorms, but dogs have another worry. They don't enjoy the static building up in their coats. Remove static electricity by rubbing a dryer sheet along their coats. Lots of hugs are also advised.
- Treat diarrhoea with rice and chicken combo - Calm upset dog stomachs by feeding them a simple diet of chicken and rice for 12 hours. If your dog is vomiting, visit the vet, as dogs can become dehydrated very quickly.
- DIY dog toothbrush If you want to really get your dog's teeth clean you can take a clean piece of gauze and wrap it around your finger. Use a paste of baking soda and water in equal amounts as the toothpaste. Don't use human toothpaste as it contains xylitol, which causes canine liver failure.
- Treat bee sting with baking soda paste -Here's what to do if your dog gets stung by a bee: First, remove the stinger by scraping it with a credit card. Then apply a paste of baking soda to the area. If your dog shows signs of an allergic reaction, call your vet.
- And after the miserably cold summer we've had let us just hope this tip will not be necessary - Protect paws with Vaseline -Protect your dog's paws from chapping and cracking in the cold, snowy weather and the salt-lined footpaths. 
"You're cooking too many at once. TOO MANY! Turn them! TURN THEM NOW!"

"WE NEED BUTTER! Are you CRAZY??? Where are we going to get the butter? They're going to stick! HURRY!" The wife runs to the fridge.




