Six years after undergoing open heart surgery well known leisure club manager Conor O'Leary will be heading to the states to complete the New York City marathon on November 3rd.

This is Conor's second marathon after completing the Dublin marathon last year. Having really enjoyed his experience in Dublin and being fortunate to receive a place in this year's New York event he is delighted to be a part of this iconic run. *"I am fortunate to receive a place in the run so I couldn't let the opportunity go"* Conor told the Killarney Outlook.

Conor's wife Ann has links to New York having lived there for some time and still has family there. Conor's mum Mary O'Leary passed away in December 2011 after a long battle with multiple sclerosis and Conor is delighted to use this opportunity to fundraise for multiple sclerosis South Kerry branch. "The MS society were a huge help to my mum during her illness and if I can use this opportunity to raise some much needed funds I am delighted to do so" he added.

Conor completed the Dublin marathon in 3hrs and 56 minutes and is hoping to complete the NYC run in a similar time.

"I have worked hard in training and am hoping to complete the run in around 4 hours. The course takes you through the 5 boroughs which makes it a great way to see the city. I am really looking forward to the experience"

The New York City marathon is one of the biggest events on the marathon circuit with up to 52000 completing the course last year and up to 2 million spectators lining the route.

Every second counts Learn to Restart A Heart....

Killarney Cardiac Response Unit, whose mission is to give valuable assistance to patients of Heart Attacks, Cardiac Arrests, Choking and Stroke until H.S.E. intervention are holding a life saving skills course at the rear of The Laurels Bar & Restaurant on Wednesday October 16th.

On the day you will learn to do CPR, use an AED along with essential life saving skills. The Killarney Cardiac Response Unit is a voluntary Unit of approximately 40 volunteers, from all sectors of society, who respond to 999/112 emergency Cardiac Phone calls.

They are activated once a Cardiac call is made to Ambulance control and cover an area of 7km from the centre of Killarney Town. The Responders have a Pager/Radio on them which is linked in with a control phone through the National Ambulance Service. We work alongside and under the control of the National Ambulance Service.

"We are not here to replace the Ambulance Service but to complement them by providing care and utilising those vital few minutes as every second counts, until The National Ambulance Service arrive on scene", a member of the KCRU told the Killarney Outlook.

An out of Hospital Cardiac arrest has the worst possible outcome for survival, mainly because resuscitation is often delayed or not given. It is Vital that resuscitation is started as soon as possible following a cardiac arrest.

A sequence of steps has been developed to provide the best possible chance for survival for a patient with a cardiac arrest, these are described as the links in the chain of survival, and like any chain, the chain of survival is only as strong as the weakest link. And so each link is of equal value and importance. This free event will run from 2pm to 8pm.

What's the story? Kerry Way App recognised in Europe

"Kerry Way App" gets European Recognition The Kerry Way Folklore and Heritage App has been recognised at a European level through its inclusion in a new publication highlighting projects in Ireland that have benefited from EU funding over the last 46 years.

The App, which was developed by Bealoideas Chiarraí – Kerry Folklore, providers walkers along the route with the folklore and heritage of the region that they can listen too via the app. It is free to download and was funded through the RDP LEADER programme, operated through South Kerry Development Partnership CLG with financial support from Kerry Group. The initiative was also supported by Kerry County Council and the Department of Employment Affairs & Social Protection, with previous support through INTERREG.

The Kerry Way App is one of 25 stories to feature in the "What's the Story – 25 stories about Ireland and Europe" publication launched by Ceann Comhairle Seán Ó Fearghaíl at an event in the Dáil last week. Speaking at the launch the Ceann Comhairle said that the publication "contains rich personal stories of

the real ways that European cooperation opens the door to economic opportunity and cultural enrichment, both for Irish people and for our fellow Europeans wishing to strengthen ties with Ireland." This was echoed by European Affairs Minister Helen McEntee who added that "the EU spans across the entire continent of Europe and allows us to have endless opportunities, to work, live, study and travel in each-others countries.

The lives of the famous Glenstal Abbey monks in Murroe, Co Limerick have been laid bare to the scrutiny of the world beyond the normally secretive monastery walls. Br Colmán, spent a number of years in the Francisan Friary in Killarney

Daniel O'Mahony a pupil at Glenstal Abbey, is from Rathmore, his parents are MJ and Nora O'Mahony and his uncle is Aidan O'Mahony of Kerry Football fame, while Fr Cuthbert worked in the Dunloe Hotel as Hotel Manager before entering Glenstal Abbey.

Glenstal Abbey - Through the Seasons, Published by Columba Books, is a collection of images chronicled through the seasons by photographer Valerie O'Sullivan, and monks sharing in words, the mysticism and rhythm of their lives, we get a rare insight into the daily life of the community of Benedictine monks.



WHY SHOULD YOU REVIEW YOUR **PENSION?**

BREXIT impact discussed at Budget Lunch

OCKT Ltd, Chartered Accountants & Statutory Audit Firm held a Budget Forum this week to examine impact of Budget 2020 on businesses.

A full house of Killarney Business people attended a Budget Briefing Lunch delivered by OCKT Chartered Accountants at The Great Southern Hotel, Killarney on Wednesday.

Marcus Treacy outlined the threats posed by a hard Brexit and the impact it was going to have on local businesses particularly those engaged in exporting and the tourist sector. He pointed out that whilst the Government had committed \in 40M to defray some of the costs associated with Brexit to the tourist industry, the VAT increase of last year and the Brexit cost could cost the industry close to \in 1B.

He outlined the key changes that effect business taxation and advised particularly on tax reliefs such as pension planning, EIIS Relief as well as options on Retirement and Entrepreneurs Relief and other issues effecting businesses.

DRY EYE

WHAT IS DRY EYE?

People with dry eye either don't make enough normal (lubricating) tears or the ones that they make are of poor quality, causing the tears to dry up too quickly and the front of the eye to become dry and irritated. As a result, dry eye can be uncomfortable and cause the eye to produce the watery type of tears. This only helps for a short time - leaving the eye uncomfortable and gritty. If your eyelids are sore and red, you may also have another condition called blepharitis. Blepharitis is a condition that affects the eyelids making them sore and inflamed. If the eyelid glands become blocked, you may have a condition called meibomian gland dysfunction. It is quite common to have a combination of these conditions.

Dry eye doesn't tend to cause serious damage to the eyes, but it can be very uncomfortable. Severe cases do have a risk of causing long-term damage, but fortunately these are rare. RISK FACTORS

Dry eye is much more common in people over the age of 50. This is often because the glands that make the normal tears, and particularly the oily part of the tears, tend to become less effective as you get older. Also the tears tend to spread across the eye less well with age.

Some general health conditions can cause dry eye as a side effect, such as autoimmune diseases and hormonal changes. The condition is also more common in windy, cold, dry and dusty conditions.

If you're concentrating on your computer or smartphone for long periods of time without a break, this



may also make your eyes feel dry. Air conditioning and central heating can make dry eye worse too, as can some medications and general health problems.

Smoking has also been linked to dry eye as it may both cause the condition and make it worse.

SYMPTOMS

People with dry eye may get some or all of the following symptoms.

• A sandy or gritty feeling

Sore eyes
 Uncomfortable and sometimes painful
 eves

An itching or burning sensation

Short-term blurred vision

Watery eyes, as if you are crying (having watery eyes can mean you are producing poor-quality tears and actually have dry eyes) TREATMENT

Most cases of dry eye tend to be a longterm condition, meaning that you'll need ongoing treatment.

There are lots of different types of drops and gels that can help your eyes feel more comfortable. The best ones don't have preservatives in them, or if they do they contain very gentle preservatives, which helps to reduce irritation. They may also contain an ingredient called sodium hyaluronate, known to be very effective in treating the condition.

It's important to use the correct type of drops. The wrong drops are unlikely to cause any harm, but they won't help as much. If your drops aren't working or you're not sure which drops to use, you're a sight test can help determine the best treatment options.



Still there was to be another goal and it was from the boot of Hartnett whose goal arrived in the third minute of Injury time.





Know Your Rights: Shopping online after Brexit

Question

If the UK leaves the EU, what changes can I expect when shopping online from a UK retailer?

Answer

EU consumer law will not apply to UK sales, including online sales, after it leaves the EU. Therefore, your current consumer rights as provided for under EU consumer law will no longer be available.

For example, if you are in a dispute with a UK-based trader, you may not be able to avail of the European Consumer Centre network or the European Small Claims Procedure. However, consumers in Ireland can take individual action through the Irish courts if they have purchased online from UK traders who do business in the EU.

You should also be aware that following Brexit, you may have to pay certain taxes and duties when buying from the UK. You may have to pay customs duty, excise duty and VAT. These charges are calculated according to the value of the item and can include the transport costs. You can find detailed information about your consumer rights and Brexit on the Competition and Consumer Protection Commission website, ccpc.ie and on your consumer rights in the event of a no-deal Brexit on the europa.eu website.

2009 - Gwyn Roberts began his 347-day, 27,000 mile "Overland in the Sun" adventure, driving an old Landcruiser outfitted with solar power from London to Cape Town.

ARSNIC IS NOT A CURE FROM THESE ROUNDWORMS:

Besides being an otherworldly strain of beautiful, Mono Lake in California is a body of water that is salty and very basic, with a pH of 10 - the equivalent of detergent and in addition has levels of arsenic around six times what is considered safe for drinking. No fish live in the lake, but some animals such as brine shrimp and alkali flies finds a way, to thrive in the toughest conditions Now, another hardy species can be added to Mono Lake's list of aquatic residents—nematodes, including a newly discovered, arsenic-adoring species from the genus Auanema – a roundworm with a couple of unique evolutionary traits, chief among them the capacity to survive more than 500 times the amount of arsenic that is fatal for humans. It has three sexes—female, male, and hermaphrodite which are uniquely suited to trailblazing into new areas, since they reproduce solo. The nematodes are also viviparous, meaning that instead of laying eggs like most nematodes, they have live births.

ROME METRO IS OFFERING TICKETS-FOR-PLASTIC:

Italy's capital is offering travellers a way to exchange their waste plastic bottles for tickets on its public transport system.

For example a standard ticket valid for one metro ride or 100 minutes on all buses allowing transfers costs €1.50 or 30 empty bottles and commuters are enjoying the new way of saving cash.

"The situation is quite disastrous," President of environment group Legambiente, Stefano Ciafani, said. "Rome has failed to create an efficient system for differentiated waste collection and it has not built the recycling plants that are fundamental for a city where three million people live. If the waste treatment plant is closed and no recycling plants are created on the territory, the waste will continue to be exported outside the region as it is today."

The eco-friendly plastic-for-tickets initiative was launched by Rome Mayor Virginia Raggi on behalf of Rome's transport network, Atac. The recycling machines are placed in three metro stations for a 12-month testing phase.

DO YOU EAT YOUR GUINNESS?

Following three years of experiments Mark Zable, debuted his creation of deep fried, ravioli-shaped dough with a dark filling at the Texas State Fair in 2010 and won that year's Most Creative award. He said it would be easy to simply fry a beerbased batter, but doing it his way keeps the brew - Guinness, to be specific - intact while frying the pretzel dough around it. Although he won't reveal the exact recipe, speed is key. Each nugget of stout-filled dough should be deep-fried for no more than 20 seconds to get the full flavour of the warm, rich stout.




