



## **KILLARNEY LEADS THE WAY ONCE AGAIN**

In a first for Ireland, The Heart of Killarney was launched yesterday morning on Main Street and the ribbon was cut by leaving cert student Tom Geaney, who is a cardiac arrest survivor

The brain child of Leo O'Connor and Damien Baker, the project aims to increase the public awareness around the location of the public access AEDs in Killarney. "Historically the phone box played a huge part of Ireland's community's , they were the lifeline that kept families together. Now they can do that again by housing these life saving devices and help the public recognise and remember the locations of the AEDs", Leo told the Killarney Outlook. Killarney as with other heart healthy projects aims to lead this innovative project and there is potential that there will be a national role out over the next few years. The team at Heart Of Killarney have created a template for the project that will be provided on request to other towns on that want to follow with this initiative.

Killarney has 13 public access AEDs which drastically improve the chances of survival of someone who has an out of hospital cardiac arrest. The team at the Heart of Killarney are working with the other groups already in existence in Killarney to strengthen the Chain

of survival . Killarney aims to be the most heart safe town in Ireland, with Community First Responders, Public Access AEDs and Public training initiatives. The Heart of Killarney compliments the existing services in the overall goal of reducing the life's lost to sudden cardiac arrests each year. Leo O'Connor and Damien Baker have spear headed this project working along side Cllr Donal Grady, Kerry County Council and Irish Independent Health foods and many more supporters of the project.

Leo, who is also the Coordinator of the Killarney Cardiac Response Unit would like to thank the people of Killarney for their support in this project and would encourage other towns to follow suit. Damien,a student paramedic in the UK, has paid tribute to the sponsors and supporters for making this possible and would encourage as many as possible to learn CPR and how to use an AED. Killarney is set for a major tourism boost with the announcement from Fáilte Ireland that Ireland has won the bid to host the prestigious and influential social media conference TBEX Europe 2017. The event is set to take place in the INEC and will attract over 650 Top Travel Bloggers with a reach of 300m have potential to make Ireland go viral next year and will see the largest gathering of world travel bloggers, writers, new media content creators, and social media- savvy travel industry professionals. The conference will take place from 3rd -5th October, 2017. A range of pre and post conference farmiliarisation trips are being organised for attendees, who will be in Ireland for an average of nine days. They will experience all that Dublin, Ireland's Ancient East and Wild Atlantic Way has to offer and it is expected that Ireland will go viral as delegates post, tweet and share their experiences. It is expected that TBEX Europe 2017 attendees will primarily come from North America and Europe but there will also be a sizeable contingent present from Asia and the rest of the world.

A film which featured two Killarney residents is in the running for an Oscar in 2017. Older than Ireland features Michael O'Connor from Muckross and the late Jackie "The Farmer" O'Sullivan from Ballaugh. The film takes a look back at 100 years of life through the eyes of thirty Irish centenarians, and charts the history of the country over the last century, all the way back to the 1916 Easter Rising. Older Than Ireland has been shown in New York, as well as other parts of the United States and Canada. ## 'BE SAFE AND BE SEEN' DURING WINTER MONTHS

The Kerry Joint Policing Committee is calling on all road users in Kerry to exercise care over the winter months and to 'Be Safe and Be Seen' on the county's roads. The Committee has encouraged the use of high visibility clothing and is asking all road users to ensure lights are fully functional on their bicycles, motorcycles and vehicles.

Speaking at a meeting of the Kerry Joint Policing Committee to, Chief Superintendent of the Kerry Garda Division, Con Cadogan said: 'An Garda Síochána and Kerry County Council and the members of the Kerry Joint Policing Committee are asking people to wear high visibility clothing at this time of the year when natural light is reduced. You cannot expect other road-users to see you if you are not visible to them – wearing a highvis vest can make a life-saving difference.

'We would also ask motorists to check their lights are working properly as driving with defective lights is both unacceptable and highly dangerous. A survey by the Road Safety Authority found that eight percent of vehicles had at least one defective light. The message is to get it fixed now for your benefit and the benefit of other road users,' he said.

Chairman of the Kerry Joint Policing Committee, Cllr Niall Kelleher said the aim of the 'Be Safe and Be Seen' campaign – which is run by An Garda Síochána and the Road Safety Authority – is to reduce road deaths and accidents on the

county's roads. 'Sadly we have had six fatalities so far this year on Kerry roads and we don't want the horror of such an incident to be visited on any more families. Everyone on the road has a role to play in slowing down, driving with care and ultimately reducing road accidents and deaths,' said Cllr Kelleher. Meanwhile, the Kerry Joint Policing Committee is encouraging homeowners to 'Lock Up and Light Up' their homes over the winter period to deter burglars. It's part of a nationwide campaign to encourage homeowners to be more security conscious.

'Burglaries traditionally rise during the longer winter evenings and nights,' said Chief Superintendent Cadogan. A number of

simple measures can help to deter burglars such as using timers on lights if your home is unoccupied, locking all doors and windows, storing keys away from windows and letterboxes and using home alarm systems, he said. 'There has been a fall in the number of burglaries in the Kerry Division – down 59 percent to date this year compared to the same period last year – which is due to a number of factors included the Garda's Operation Thor and increased awareness and vigilance in communities. But we want people to continue to be aware of the risks and take the necessary precautions,' said the Chief Superintendent.

The Guild of Agricultural Journalists hosted its biennial awards and black tie dinner on Friday evening last in Dublin's Castleknock Hotel & Country Club. Supported by FBD Insurance, the awards aim to encourage excellence in the coverage by media of farming, food and rural life on the island of Ireland.

Valerie won Best Photograph for One Girl and Her Dog, which was published Irish Farmers Journal, 13th February 2016.

According to the judging panel "The winner, One Girl and Her Dog, is proof, if it was ever needed, of the old saying that a good picture is worth a thousand words".

'Big Week on the Farm', an Independent Pictures production, broadcast live over five nights by RTÉ television during April 2016, is the overall winner of the Agricultural Journalism Awards for 2016. John Cummins, Independent Pictures, collected the coveted 'Bull' prize, a once-off

the future of tourism in Ireland, international tourism trends, tourism policy in Ireland and what is needed to grow tourism and jobs further, as well as rural tourism and how to spread the tourism wealth around the country. McKenna will be the keynote speaker at lunch. The social itinerary of the conference includes the gala black tie Kerry IHF Christmas Ball at Muckross Park Hotel on Saturday night 26th November hosted by the Kerry IHF Chairman Terence Mulcahy.

When asked why local business should attend these seminars, Sean O' Driscoll, Conference Chairman and SKAL Republic of Ireland President told the Killarney Outlook "Various sectors within the tourism industry have annual conferences to discuss the particular interests and issues involving their specific sector. However, there is no forum for the grassroots of all sectors within tourism to meet, to debate and discuss tourism. Our aim was to create a forum where tourism business owners & managers on the ground can discuss the future of tourism in Ireland and network & share business learnings. Students in 2nd Level schools were invited to submit a poem on the theme

of Humanitarianism. The winning entry in this category came from Donagh McMahon, Mercy Mounthawk in Tralee. The adjudicators considered the standard of entries for 2016 to be of high quality but they unanimously decided that Donagh's poem titled "Man's Achilles Heels", was the clear winner. In their comments they said, "It is the effort and work the poet has put in to finding the right words and the remarkable range and use of vocabulary throughout which makes this poem stand above all the others". The winner will be presented with the "Fr Pat Horgan Perpetual Trophy for Poetry", which was introduced this year to commemorate the late Fr Pat Horgan who was one of the founders and main drivers behind the Hugh O'Flaherty Memorial Society. The Trophy was designed by the O'Flaherty Memorial sculptor, Alan Ryan Hall, from Valentia and includes the words of a tribute poem to Monsignor Hugh, written by Fr Pat Horgan in late 2015.

The Competition organisers were delighted with the response this year but would be delighted to see the adjudicator's workload increase by receiving many more entries in




## **CLLR GLEESON CALLS FOR URGENT FUNDING**

"At the most recent Killarney Municipal Area Meeting Councillor Michael Gleeson asked if there has been any indication from Uisce Éireann of an intention to provide the money necessary for the provision of urgently needed new water mains in Clohane, Brewsterfield and Knockanes". Kerry County Council replied that

an application for funding of €570,000 to lay 4.5 km of 75 mm Water Mains to replace the burst prone and inadequate pipes has been made to Irish Water. Councillor Gleeson states that he has been in contact with Irish Water on this important matter and awaits their response. The existing 35 year old pipeline is prone to

breakages at regular intervals and also suffers from lack of adequate pressure, particularly on the higher ground. The installation of a larger sized pipe would significantly improve the service to the approximately 100 households and to the local national school.







#### WHY ESTIMATE YOUR CALORIC NEEDS?

To estimate how many calories you should consume in order to maintain your weight, you'll need to do a little math. By using a simple formula called the Harris-Benedict principle, you can assess your basal metabolic rate - also known as your BMR. (Then, to lose weight, you'll need to cut calories or burn extra calories and shoot for a level lower than the results you get with this formula.)

**Calculate Your BMR.** Your BMR is the amount of energy your body needs to function. We use about 60% of the calories we consume each day for basic bodily functions such as breathing. Other factors that influence your BMR are height, weight, age and sex.

#### Step one is to calculate your BMR with the following formula:

**Women:** 655 + (4.3 x weight in pounds) + (4.7 x height in inches) - (4.7 x age in years)**Men:** 66 + (6.3 x weight in pounds) + (12.9 x height in inches) - (6.8 x age in years)Please note that this formula applies only to adults.

#### Step two is to Calculate Activity.

In order to incorporate activity into your daily caloric needs, do the following calculation:

- If you are sedentary: BMR x 20 percent
- If you are lightly active: BMR x 30 percent
- If you are moderately active (You exercise most days a week.): BMR x 40 percent
- If you are very active (You exercise intensely on a daily basis or for prolonged periods.):
- If you are extra active (You do hard labor or are in athletic training.): BMR x 60 percent Add this number to your BMR.

The result of this formula will be the number of calories you can eat every day and maintain your current weight. In order to lose weight, you'll need to take in fewer calories than this result. As you lose weight, you can re-calculate the formula to assess your new BMR.

## **Know Your Rights:**

## **RESERVING A CAR REGISTRATION NUMBER**

#### **OUESTION**

How do I reserve a particular registration number for a new 2017 car?

#### **ANSWER**

You can only apply to reserve a vehicle registration number on or after 1 November of the year before you intend to bring the vehicle into use. In other words, to use the number in 2017 you can only apply to reserve a number from 1 November 2016 until Revenue's close of business at the end of 2017. An application received prior to 1 November 2016 will be returned un-processed. The number you reserve must be in the normal format and must correspond with the licensing authority area where you normally reside. It must also correspond with the year and half year in which the vehicle is to be first brought into use. For example, 172-D-111 may only be reserved by someone living in Dublin for a vehicle intended to be brought into use in the second half of 2017. The registered owner of the vehicle on which the registration number is to be displayed must be the person in whose name the number was reserved.

All registration numbers are available for reservation, with the exception of the first number of each half year issued in the following cities Cork, Dublin, Limerick and Waterford. These numbers are, for example, 171-C-1, 172-C-1, 171-L-1, 172-L-1. They are reserved for the Mayor or Lord Mayor of each of these cities and are not available for reservation by anyone else. A reserved registration number can only be assigned to a vehicle when it has been reached in the normal sequence. It may not be displayed on a vehicle before it has been formally assigned by Revenue, following the presentation and acceptance of a completed declaration for registration. The fee to reserve a vehicle registration number is €1,000 and should be submitted with the application. The cheque, bank draft or postal order should be made payable to the Collector, Customs and Excise. You apply on Form VRT15A to the Office of the Revenue Commissioners, Registration Section, Central Vehicle Office, Rosslare Harbour, Co. Wexford.




















## THE IMPORTANCE OF COMMUNICATION

Whether discussing issues in our relationship with a partner or other family member, or with friends or colleagues, we are quite likely to say 'He knows how I feel about this', or 'She knows how difficult I find that', or 'I'm not going to ask them for help because I shouldn't need to ask, they should just know what to do', and so on. Sound familiar?

All this ignores a fundamental reality – we cannot assume other people know what we think, or how we feel, or what we need, unless we tell them. We are all equipped with a degree of intuition, and some people can be very 'tuned in' to the thoughts and feelings of others. But we cannot always rely on intuition alone. For example, someone may long for their partner to open up about a shared difficulty in their lives, while the partner may want exactly the same thing, but feel they 'shouldn't go there' because they think this would be unwelcome. Two people, who long to connect with each other, may grow further apart because of a gap in communication.

Of course we all need, and are entitled to, our privacy. We don't have to wear our heart on our sleeve all the time. What we are thinking about here is building bridges and sustaining connections with the significant people around us, rather than seeing those connections weaken through a lack of communication, with all the misunderstandings, frustrations, conflict, hurt and loneliness that can ensue.

As children, we may have been fortunate enough to have an adult around who tuned in to our feelings and tended to our needs, before we were old enough to put those feelings and needs into words. Even if we don't realise it, perhaps a bit of us still quite naturally longs for that sort of automatic understanding from others. But, as adults, we probably need to play our part in making ourselves known and understood. The counselling process can offer a safe space where we can start putting things into words, gradually find our own voice, and become more confident about making ourselves known to another person.

## TAX Matters with



## **BENEFIT IN KIND**

Benefits-in-kind, such as private use of a company car, free or subsidised accommodation and preferential loans, received from an employer, by an employee whose total remuneration (including benefits-in-kind) is €1,905 or more in a tax year, are taxable (subject to certain exceptions).

Where the employee receiving such benefits is a director of the company concerned, the benefits are taxable regardless of the level of remuneration. The liability to tax also applies in respect of benefits provided by an employer for a member or members of an employee's family or household.

In addition, employees and directors are chargeable to tax in respect of 'perquisites' from their employment, that is, remuneration in non-money form which is convertible into money or money's worth, for example vouchers in various forms, the payment of club subscriptions and medical insurance premiums on an employee's behalf.

#### HOW IS THE CHRISTMAS BONUS TREATED?

A cash bonus at Christmas should be put through the payroll and PAYE/PRSI and USC applied as normal. Where the bonus is in non-cash form with a value not exceeding €500 (€250 prior to 21 October 2015) PAYE/PRSI and USC need not be applied to that benefit (covered by the one off small benefit exclusion).

#### UNUSUAL USES FOR ONIONS

- Clean metal surfaces Prepare a mix of crushed onion and one part water. Then, using a damp cloth, rub the mixture on a metal surface, until it appears shiny and clean.

#### CHRISTIANS MOSQUES ON **MUSLIMS GUARD** CHURCHES ON SUNDAY

Faced with the threat of terrorist attacks in West Africa, Muslims and Christians are protecting every place of prayer, no matter which religion. On Fridays in Cameroon, Christians guard the mosques as Muslims

pray. Muslims return the favour by protecting churches during Sunday services.

The Nigerian militant group Boko Haram is an equal-opportunity destroyer, attacking both churches and mosques while services are in session. The prayerful people inside can't see it coming, but in some small villages, the terrorists are now running into armed patrols. Cameroon has set up volunteer "vigilance committees" to patrol villages and the capital of Yaounde, to watch for possible terrorists. They are armed for self-defence but report any suspicious activity so the police handle it.

The idea of Christians and Muslims protecting each other's worship services is not new to places like Egypt or in Western cultures like France recently or Norway, but it is new to the remote, northern tip of Cameroon where the model is being testing to see if it might be effective elsewhere.

## FIRST DETROIT TINY HOUSE **VILLAGE LETS TENANTS RENT TO OWN**

There are already tiny house neighbourhoods popping up around the United States to house the homeless - but this Detroit initiative will be the first where its residents can rent to own. The nonprofit organisation Cass Community Social Services is building 25 single-family homes from 250 to 400 square feet. Each \$40,000 architectural design is unique to itself - no two finished products look the same.

Each building will be rented to a tenant for one third of their monthly income under a year-long lease. After three years of renewing leases, they have the ability to sign a four-year land contract under which they pay off those collected years. By the end of the total seven years paying rent, they will have essentially bought themselves a house to own.

Since Cass built the first house in September, they expect to have six more built by the end of the year. They have already raised \$800,000 out of their \$1.5 million goal for the project based solely off of private donations.

Half of the tenants are expected to be homeless, with the other half comprising of seniors and college students - and since all the homeowners will be able to decide who moves into the neighbourhood in the future, the community's atmosphere is one of cooperation and support.

#### THOUGH HALLOWEEN PROTECT OVER - HAVE YOU HEARD FRIDAYS, THE SWISHING OF WINGS AND WEIRD SOUNDS LATELY?

If you have and it turns out to be a Barn Owl then you are one of the lucky ones. The Barn Owl is one of Ireland's most threatened species of owl and is 'Red-listed' in the 'Birds of Conservation Concern in Ireland. Found on farmland and in low-lying areas, it nests mainly

in hollowed-out trees, derelict buildings and barns, but will also nest in specially constructed nest boxes. The Barn Owl has beautiful honey and white plumage. It has a large round head and has a heart-shaped face and long legs. Barn Owls can stay with the same partner for life, and the female can lay between 4-7 eggs in late April to late May. This Owl can see in almost complete darkness; coupled with their excellent hearing, this allows them to track down their prey during the night. These nocturnal creatures hunt small mammals such as rats, mice, birds and frogs but will also eat insects. The Barn Owl is threatened in Ireland for a number of reasons including: · Loss of nesting sites and habitats; · Loss of prey species though increased use of pesticides; and · Poisoning from pesticides.

1750 - The F.H.C. Society, also known as the Flat Hat Club, was formed at Raleigh Tavern, Williamsburg, Virginia. It was the first college fraternity.

There, they found seven pups! The beer fund for the party quickly turned into a dog food fund, as the groomsmen made the 4-hour trek into town to buy kibble for the hungry mama and her babies.By the end of the trip, the groomsmen had each picked a puppy to adopt, and Annie the mother went home with a family, too.

## **DOCTOR BROKE THE LAW TO CREATE A BETTER NURSING** HOME

Dr. Bill Thomas is a Harvard-educated physician who in 1991 was transferred from working in a stressful emergency room to being the medical director of a nursing home in upstate New York. The depressing and regimented environment got him thinking on what exactly could improve the residents' conditions. Even though animals in nursing homes were illegal at the time, he took a chance based on a hunch, and brought in two dogs, four cats, hens, rabbits, 100 parakeets, a multitude of plants, a flower garden, and vegetable garden. The change was dramatic. There was a 50% drop in medical prescriptions along with a dramatic decrease in death rates - but most importantly, the residents were simply happier. Dr. Thomas's approach - dubbed the Eden Alternative – has driven nursing homes in Australia, Japan, Canada, and America to allow a more autonomous and creative living space for their elderly. It erases the stereotype that growing old means growing useless, as well as encourages residents to think of their age as an enriching new phase of their life rather than the end of it. Dr. Thomas, now a speaker and author of several books, also created small, independently run residences with their own bedrooms and bathrooms called Green Houses—and he has been preaching a singular message that getting old is not a bad thing.

## MAN CREATES 'SHOES THAT GROW' SO POOR CHILDREN DON'T OUTGROW THEM

When Kenton Lee was working with

barefooted children in Kenya he realised the importance of well-fitting shoes. He also knew that people living in poverty cant afford to pay for shoes every time their child's foot grew. He had the idea that if there was a shoe that could adjust and expand the child would always have a pair of shoes that fitted. Determined to get started, Kenton became the Founder and Executive Director of Because International, a nonprofit organisation headquartered in Nampa, Idaho. The company completed the prototype for their wonder shoe in 2013 which can accommodate children's ever-growing feet by expanding five sizes, making them last up to ten years, and reached out to the world for crowdfunding of their invention. After hand delivering their first shipment of 100 shoes to little ones in Nairobi, Kenya, Kenton is eager to continue production. Like all brilliant ideas - it is so simple, it's just a sandal with a strap is held in place by studs, as the foot grows the strap is loosened to the next stud and the same applies to the sides. Thanks to "The Shoe That Grows", children will no longer be as susceptible to soil-based diseases and infections.

## "BAD" HABITS MAY HAVE SURPRISING BENEFITS FOR CHILDREN

A new study published in the journal Paediatrics shows children who bite their nails and suck their thumbs are about one-third less likely to develop certain allergies. Study author Malcolm Sears, a researcher for the Firestone Institute for Respiratory Health at McMaster University School of Medicine, in Ontario, Canada says "Early exposure to dirt is not a bad thing, cat, grass, house dust mite, and dog allergies were reduced, some significantly."The findings may be another example of what's called the hygiene hypothesis, which asserts that hyper cleanliness in families and avoiding exposure to the microbes in the environment may increase a child's risk of allergies.

"When they suck their thumbs or bite their nails they're exposing themselves to additional microbes or dirt which is stimulating the immune system," Mr. Sears added.

## 87-YEAR-OLD RESCUED **AFTER 4 DAYS IN BATHTUB** THANKS TO CONCERNED WAITRESS

Doreen Mann has been making regular visits into Tomassi's café for the last ten years - so when she didn't show up for her regular cup of tea and slice of cake, Sonia Congrave became worried. As it turned out, Doreen had been taking a bath at her home in Southend when her knees gave out and she became unable to climb out. For four days, the 87-year old drank cold tap water to stay hydrated and had only a towel to keep herself warm. Sonia eventually called the Essex Police and asked them to check on the elderly woman's house to make sure she was okay. The law enforcement officers heard Doreen's cries for help and were able to pull her out of the tub to safety. Doreen and Sonia's close friendship has resulted in the 39-year-old waitress buying her a phone in case she ever finds herself in trouble again. "I'm just glad she's okay, I'm glad nothing bad happened," Sonia says. "I think it would be nice for us all to take a bit of a time-out to remember our neighbours or remember the person down the road who you haven't seen in a few days and just give a knock or a phone call. Just say 'Hey, are you alright?"

think you plant in your garden after the hedging – they can be underplanted afterwards with bulbs and shrubs. Trees are interesting in all four seasons with attractive unfolding of leaves in Spring, full foliage in Summer, good Autumn colour followed decorative bark in the Winter. The first and most important think you need to know when buying a tree is what's the height and spread going to be when it is mature. There are many varieties of trees to choose from and there is a tree suitable for most areas. Trees can be planted all year round but as with hedging, trees can be planted when they are dormant between November and March.

When planting your bare rooted tree, dig the hole big enough that you can spreads out the roots all around the hole. Then drive your stake into the hole roughly about 6 to 8 inches below the bottom of the hole, place your tree and spread the roots out well. If possible place your stake on the side of the prevailing winds as this will ensure that the tree is blown up against the stake when the wind is high. Fill in the soil mixed with compost around the roots and firm in with the heel of your foot. Lastly place your tree ties on - one near the top and one at the bottom with a spacer in between to stop the bark being damaged by the stake.




